After a summer hiatus many of us experience a revitalization driving us to renew valued acquaintances.


Regional meetings are being held at this opportune time!

Working in collaboration with your municipal representative and your secretary-treasurer will ensure that your plan will be included in the development of the municipal budget as a whole. In order to complete this budget exercise, it is important to review those of previous years, to add on your new expenses, to reserve an amount for special activities and finally, to take into account inflation for all positions.



CD-ROMS available for Interlibrary loans

We have acquired over a hundred educational cd-roms for both children and adults.

You will find the list in the MultiLIS catalogue by searching by call number and entering: cdr*.

The cd-roms are available only through Interlibrary loans.

Cards and spinal labels

When entering an item, two different situations may occur:

1) Shelf mark with spaces

Usually, when entering a document to the MultiLIS databank, the shelf-code contains spaces. These spaces are used to signal a change of line when recording the information on the spine labels and book cards:

Example:

The shelf mark of this document prints as follows:

690.890222

C758b

VDB

2) Shelf mark with apostrophe«'»

With the introduction of new procedures you will now see records in which the shelfing mark contains apostrophe instead of spaces. The purpose of an apostrophe is the same as a space. It signals a change of line. When a document is added to a record containing an apostrophe it is very important to add an apostrophe before your library identification letters. If you do not add the apostrophe the space will be ignored by the computer and the spine labels and bookcards will not print correctly.

Example:

```

The shelf mark of this document prints as follows:

J

940.1

R735m

VDB

IN SUMMARY

When entering documents to a recording containing spaces, a space is added before typing the library identification letters.

When entering documents with apostrophe, an apostrophe is added before typing the library identification letters.

There is no change in the use of the plus sign * + * at the beginning of the shelf mark. This must remain (with the exception of adult documentaries). **PLEASE NOTE**: as demonstrated in the example above, no space or apostrophe is placed between the * + * and the shelf mark.

Public Library Week is also the ideal time to organize in library activities and events for young and old. It is the perfect time for everyone to discover and enjoy the local library.


Forum on Children's Literature in Ottawa






