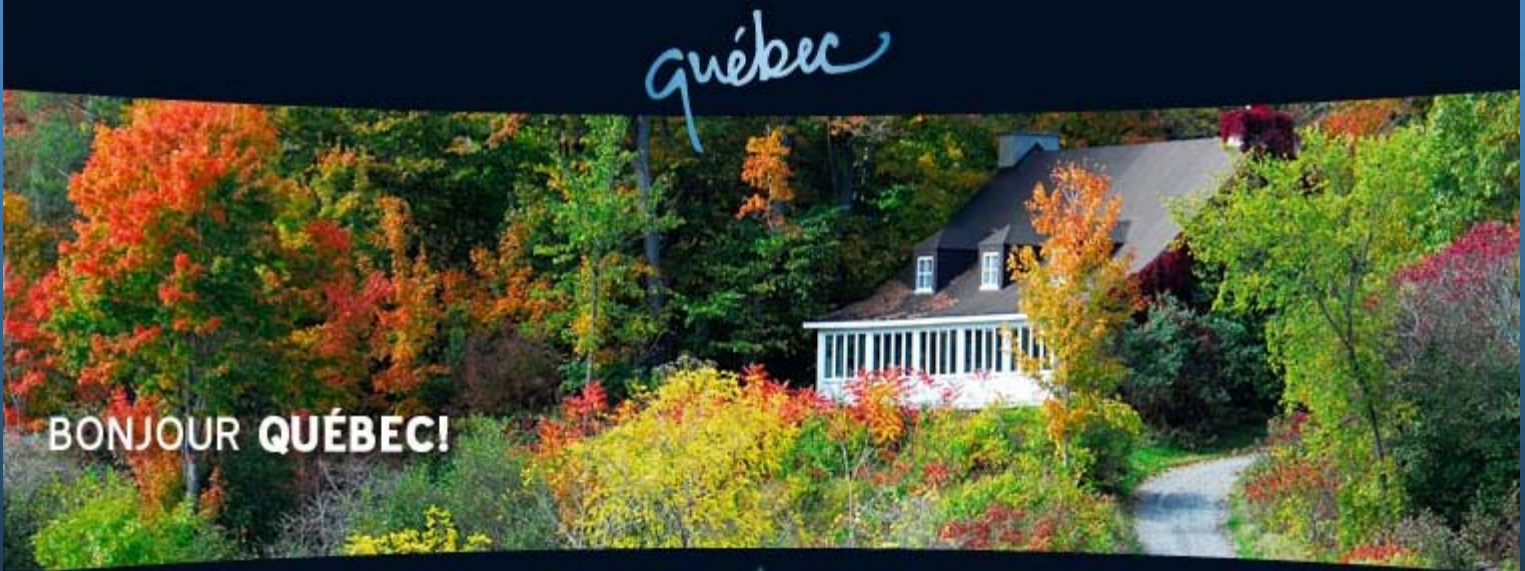

Spectacular. Entertaining. Exciting!



Glamorous places, magical places, Québec's four casinos offer their visitors an exhilarating combination of gaming, entertainment and fine dining. What a great excuse to discover four regions of Québec!

Montréal: a vibrant, glamorous city

Less than ten minutes from downtown, next to the [Parc Jean-Drapeau](#) the [Casino de Montréal](#) is linked by shuttle bus to the [Centre Infotouriste](#). Created in a former 1967 World Fair (Expo 67) pavilion, the Casino boasts the skyline of the metropolis as its vista.



With its 120 gaming tables and more than 3,000 slot machines spread over five floors, it ranks among the world's major casinos. Its Nuances restaurant was granted a rare privilege when it was awarded the [CAA/AAA's](#) Five Diamond rating. The Casino also houses numerous bars and other restaurants. The Cabaret du Casino offers dinner shows that feature variety theatre, comedy and chanson.

Charlevoix: entertainment and natural scenery



A 90-minute drive from [Québec City](#), nestled between the St. Lawrence River and the mountains, the [Casino de Charlevoix](#) distinguishes itself by its leisurely, relaxing atmosphere. In this somewhat private setting, 22 gaming tables and 800 slot machines are yours to discover.

The casino is located on the site of the celebrated [Fairmont Le Manoir Richelieu](#). Superb food is to be enjoyed at any of its three restaurants, whether one feels like tasting gourmet delicacies or eating bistro fare. All this a stone's throw away from one of the country's most spectacular [golf courses](#). [Charlevoix](#), a World Biosphere Reserve, is a highly renowned resort area that offers popular [whale-watching](#) cruises to summer visitors.

Lac-Leamy: sparkling light, glass and water



Less than two hours from Montréal and a five-minute drive from downtown Gatineau (Hull), the [Gatineau \(Hull\)](#), the [Casino du Lac-Leamy](#) offers a dramatic environment with its gaming areas surrounded by fountains, waterfalls and a bamboo forest. It shares its site with the Hilton Lac-Leamy, a luxurious and ultramodern hotel.

machines. But people also go there for the festive ambience of its bars; its performance hall, which features world-renowned artists; and its high-quality catering. The restaurant Le Baccara, which puts on one of Québec's nicest tables, boasts a CAA/AAA Five Diamond rating.

Mont-Tremblant: relax and enjoy

The most recent addition to Québec's casinos is the facility at Mont-Tremblant, tucked away at the entrance to the famous [Tremblant](#) tourist complex in the [Laurentides](#) region. Visitors to this facility, which was built using natural materials (stone, wood and leather) and is enhanced with various works of art, can enjoy splendid views of its natural surroundings at the foot of one of the highest peaks in the Laurentians, not far from the [parc national du Mont-Tremblant](#).



The gaming equipment (slot machines, gaming and Texas Hold'em poker tables) are spread over four floors. The building, which was designed and built in compliance with sustainable development principles, is connected to the resort's south side by a gondola lift! Keep in mind that the Mont-Tremblant Resort is a 90-minute drive from Montréal and only 35 km (a little over 20 miles) away from the [Mont Tremblant International Airport](#), which welcomes winter glide enthusiasts from Canada and the U.S.

The Rivers' Road

Welcome to our water!



The Rivers' Road (Route des Rivières) snakes along or across approximately ten waterways in the Mauricie region, including the emblematic Saint-Maurice. Whether meandering out in the country, among wooded hillsides or the forest, with a slow current or rushing torrent, each of these rivers reveal a page in the history of their region. Passionate discoveries await you just around the bend!

From the St. Lawrence to the Shawinigan Falls

The Rivers' Road leads you first into the Maskinongé county. From Autoroute 40, head to Sainte-Ursule, where you will discover the picturesque Domaine de la carrière and its ancestral watermill. At the end of the village you can enjoy a picnic at the superb [Parc des chutes de Sainte-Ursule](#), at a height of 73 m/ 240 ft), before continuing on to Saint-Paulin. One-of-a-kind, the [Théâtre en rivière](#) presents an historical play along Rivière du Loup!



In Shawinigan, the [Cité de l'énergie](#) retraces the industrial history of this city that was known as one of the cradles of hydroelectricity. An observation tower, multimedia show and exhibitions are just some of the attractions of this captivating theme park. Not far away, the [Parc de l'Île-Melville](#) is a recreational spot known for its water activities and its adventure circuit. Religious art lovers will not want to miss the works of painter Ozias Leduc that embellish [Notre-Dame-de-la-Présentation church](#).

Heading up the Saint-Maurice

The route continues northward along the rivière Saint-Maurice. At Grandes-Piles, the [Musée du bûcheron](#) provides a real-life example of the rough life of lumberjacks working at the turn of the 20th century. Further north, at the gates of [La Mauricie National Park](#), the [Centre d'aventure Mattawin](#) in Trois-Rives offers a variety of watersport activities on the Saint-Maurice, Mattawin, Dunbar and Mékinac rivers. The [Parc des chutes de la Petite rivière Bostonnais](#) (35 m / 115 ft) La Tuque, will shed more light on the regional history, in a remarkable natural setting.

Your itinerary

The 250 km (155 mi) Rivers' Road links Maskinongé (100 km / 60 mi) from Montréal and 175 km / 110 mi from Québec City) to La Bostonnais, north of La Tuque,

passing through Shawinigan. The last 100 km (60 mi) on Route 155, along the Saint-Maurice, offer some of the most beautiful panoramic routes.

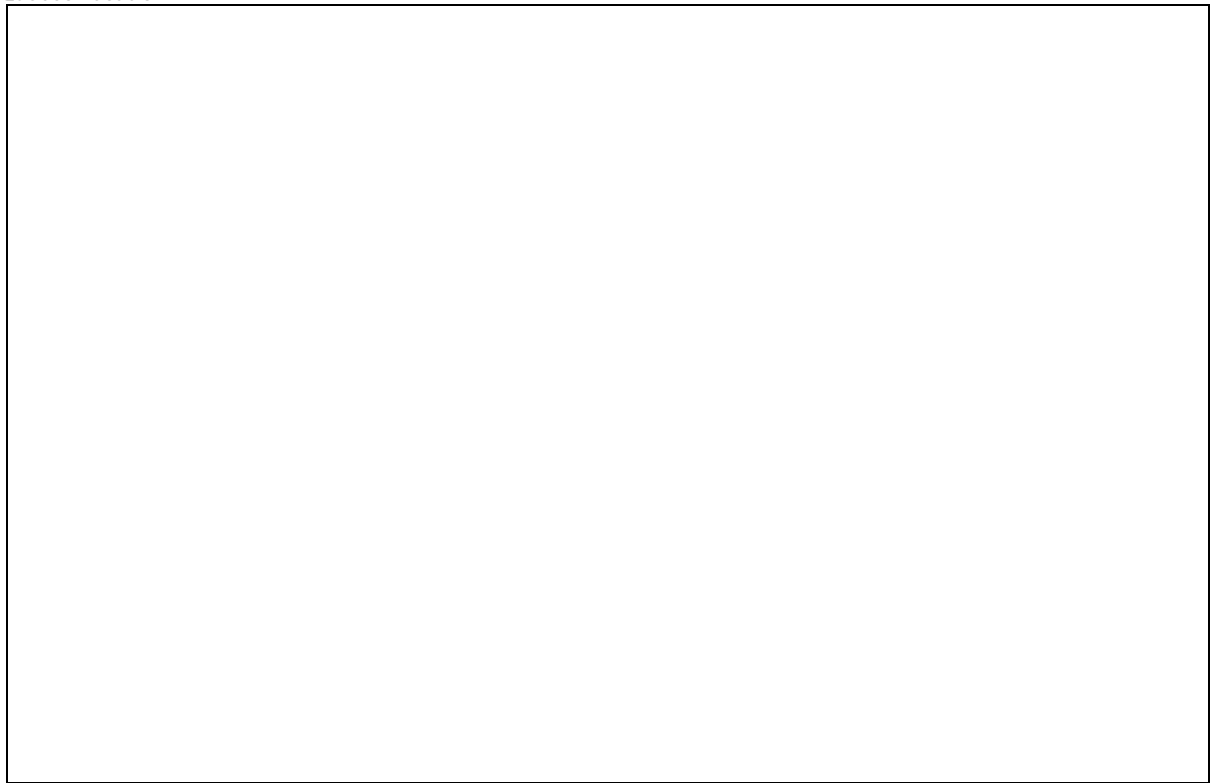

Take a hike!

These boots were made for walking...



Whether you're an avid adventurer or someone who just loves walking, a sports enthusiast or a curious visitor, take a walk amid Québec's most breathtaking scenery, only accessible on foot. Québec is literally covered with trails for everyone, from the casual walker to the seasoned hiker. You'll find over 6,000 km (3,725 mi.) of trails accessible to hikers, with close to 40% located in the Gaspé Peninsula, the Laurentides and the Eastern Townships. Stroll alongside a sinuous river, wander into an imposing pine forest, and enter the enchantment of [Québec's natural](#) wonders at your own pace!

Choose your own path

Regional parks, national parks, wildlife reserves as well as many private networks offer a wide variety of trails and a wealth of landscapes. A choice of accommodations (cottages, shelters and rustic campgrounds) is usually found along the longer hiking trails. Most of the larger [ski resorts](#) will also let you hike up their slopes.

Looking for a challenge?

Follow these paths to great adventure:

- ▶ [Parc national de la Gaspésie](#). With its 25 summits over 1,000 metres, you'd think you were in a sea of mountains! Hikers enjoy the diverse flora, stunning scenery and the possibility of a chance meeting with caribou, moose or white-tailed deer.
- ▶ [International Appalachian Trail](#) (IAT). Originating in the United States, this trail runs along the crest of the Appalachian Mountains to the Gaspé Peninsula. You can ascend several summits, among them Mont Jacques-Cartier, Mont Albert and Mont Logan. Part of this scenic route hugs the Gaspé Peninsula, providing you with superb vistas on the St. Lawrence River, and ends at [Forillon National Park of Canada](#). The Québec portion of the Appalachian Trail encompasses over 650 km of paths with 35,000 markers (it is possible to obtain a detailed map). Hikers have access to 24 shelters (with room for 8 in each), astutely located in the heart of the mountains, or 33 campground sites dotting the entire path.
- ▶ [Sentiers de l'Estrie](#). 175 km of trails criss-cross the Eastern Townships, through verdant valleys and the Appalachian mountain range (among them Mont Orford, Mont Glen and Mont Sutton). A map is necessary to navigate through certain areas.
- ▶ [National Trail](#). The pan Canadian trail currently under construction is designed for hiking and snowshoeing, with some parts also designed for cross country skiing. Over half of the 1500 km (930 mi) planned for Québec is already accessible, passing through the wildlands of eight regions, from the Outaouais in the West to the [Bas-Saint-Laurent](#) in the East.
- ▶ [Traversée de Charlevoix](#). With 100 km of marked trails crossing mountains, this beautiful and entrancing walking path is part of the National Trail. No

A fascinating human mosaic



Chinatown

Cheek-by-jowl with downtown Montréal, immense multicoloured archways that hearken back to Imperial China welcome you to our own little slice of Asia. Montréal's Chinatown provides a welcome change of scene with its pedestrian mall lined with Asian businesses, restaurants and food markets. Everything works to reinforce the impression of exotic new surroundings: the perfumes of the Orient, the ornate street lights and engraved bronze paving stones that bedeck Rue de La Gauchetière, the park commemorating Sun Yat-Sen, and the pagoda-topped hotel.

The "underground city"

Montréal offers shoppers a sweet deal with its "underground city." A 30-km (18.5-mi.) network of shopping malls and corridors connects major stores, restaurants, hotels, museums, cinemas and theatres and provides access to metro, train and bus stations. The network brings 2,000 businesses in contact with dozens of residential complexes and office buildings. Nearly 500,000 people walk these subterranean corridors each day, where they are sheltered from the inclemencies of weather.



Quartier international (international district)



Rubbing elbows with Old Montréal, this new and resolutely modern urban space harbours a great many activities with distinctly international leanings. Its sculptures, fountains and public spaces highlight the stone and glass façades and create an inviting setting for a leisurely stroll. The neighbourhood extends from the imposing [Palais des congrès](#) to the ICAO headquarters and includes the Tour de la Bourse (Stock Exchange Tower), designed by the great Italian architect P. L. Nervi.

The Latin Quarter



Located around the Université du Québec à Montréal, this small student quarter teems with life and action. The popular Rue Saint-Denis is chock-a-block with bars, cafés, bistros, bookstores and boutiques of all kinds. Various cinemas and theatres, along with the [Bibliothèque nationale du Québec](#), the [Cinémathèque québécoise](#) and the [National Film Board of Canada](#), make the area one of the city's favourite cultural haunts.

The Gay Village

The “Village,” as it is commonly known, is an urban neighbourhood that presents one of the world’s highest concentrations of stores and establishments serving the gay community. A stone’s throw from downtown, the Village extends along both sides of Rue Sainte-Catherine (the area’s main commercial artery) to the south end of Parc Lafontaine. Known for openness, liveliness and a touch of eccentricity—not to mention great restaurants—the Village helps make Montréal a truly extraordinary destination!



The Plateau Mont-Royal



Favoured for its proximity to downtown, the Plateau is a human-scale neighbourhood popular for its intense cultural life, trendy restaurants and urban, friendly lifestyle. A favourite with the artistic community, the neighbourhood begins just east of Mont Royal and converges around Parc Lafontaine. 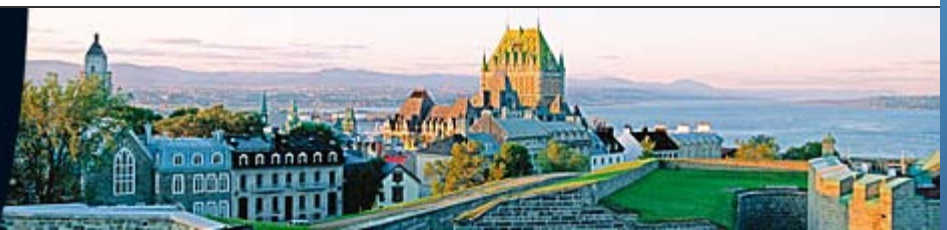

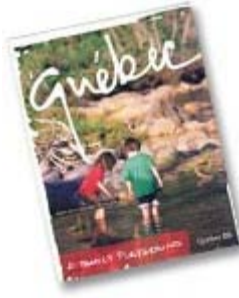

Hotels



A hotel offers lodging in one or several adjacent buildings that make up a single establishment (0 to 5 stars).

Bed & Breakfast



A private home operated as an accommodation establishment. It may have up to five rooms, and the price includes breakfast served on site (0 to 5 stars).

Tourist home



This term covers furnished cottages, houses or apartments equipped with a kitchenette and one or more bedrooms (0 to 5 stars).

Wilderness lodge



An outfitter establishment offering accommodations, dining, activities and services in a forest setting (0 to 5 stars).

Resort



An establishment offering lodging, meals or cooking facilities, as well as recreational activities and equipment (0 to 5 stars).

Youth hostel



An establishment offering accommodations in dormitories or private rooms, as well as meals or cooking facilities (0 to 5 stars).

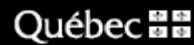
