#### CORRESPONDENCE

#### Names of the facilities

It is very important to properly write the names of the facilities in your correspondence. Pay attention to upper case letters, lower case letters and hyphens. The Lakeshore General Hospital is called Hôpital général du Lakeshore in French. With regard to the other facilities, their proper names remain the same in English and in French: CLSC de Pierrefonds, CLSC du Lac-Saint-Louis and Centre d'hébergement Denis-Benjamin-Viger.

#### Writing phone numbers

For a long time, the area code of telephone numbers was written in brackets, given that it was not always necessary when dialing a phone number (for example, (514) 630-2225). Given that it is now required to dial the area code within all the regions in Quebec, we now have to write the area code without brackets. In French, we simply leave a space between the area code and the rest of the phone number. We also have to insert a hyphen before the last four digits of the phone number (for example, 514 630-2225, 1 888 630-2225). When writing in English, we have to insert a hyphen between the area code and the phone number, as well as before the last four digits of the phone number. (for example, 514-630-2225).

#### Anglicism

In French, the word *extension* means the action of extending or stretching. In the computer field, an extension refers to the extension of the capacity of a computer. When writing in French, do not use the word *extension* when referring to the extension number (For example, Mon extension est le 5127). The correct way to write it is : Mon numéro de **poste** est le 5127.

Correct your electronic signature, your documents and other types of correspondences if necessary.
