CHEMIN OLMSTED: Climb the mountain slowly as you follow this this trail dotted with stunning landscapes. This is how the park's designer, Frederick Law Olmsted, imagined the experience. Starts at Sir George-Étienne Cartier monument. Easy to intermediate trail • 90 minutes • 4.4 km to the Boucle du Sommet BOUCLE DU SOMMET: Chemin Olmsted loops around behind the Chalet du Mont-Royal, offering views of the three summits and taking you to the Croix du mont Royal. LE SERPENTIN AND THE STAIRCASE: From the very top of Rue Peel, take Chemin le Serpentin to Chemin Olmsted. Head to your right and climb the 256 stairs up the escarpment, taking you directly to the

SENTIER DE L'ESCARPEMENT: Outside the Chalet du Mont-Royal, turn left onto the Sentier de l'Escarpement along the side of the mountain and enjoy the fabulous views of the city. Intermediate trail, not appropriate for baby strollers • 40 minutes • 0.9 km
