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Family support subsidies

This table shows the amounts paid out under the Family Support program. The maximum annual subsidy covers caregiving, respite care and assistance with daily tasks.

Characteristics	Maximum annual subsidy*
Child requiring little care or attention	\$2 220
Child requiring considerable care and attention	\$4 380

It should be noted that these are the maximum amounts and that actual subsidies may vary depending on the CSSS. To apply for a subsidy or obtain more information on the program, please contact your local **CSSS (CLSC)**.

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^{*} The amounts may change depending on the budget envelope allocated to the Family Support program.



The presence of a disabled child or adult within a family makes for additional responsibilities, which can cause considerable stress and even lead to burnout.

Perhaps you, too, feel powerless given the lack of services in your area. You may wonder what the future holds and even, sometimes, feel like giving up.

If you are in such a situation and you don't know who to turn to, you should contact your **CSSS (CLSC)**. If the disabled person you are caring for receives services from a **rehabilitation centre**, people there may be able to help you as well.

In the event of an emergency, call the **Info-Santé** service of the CSSS (CLSC) or dial **911**.

A number of associations for parents of disabled persons also offer a help line and support services. For more on these services, please see the section entitled "Associations".



Support for parents

Parents who have just learned that their child has a disability can receive support and information from a number of associations. These parental support associations allow them to meet other parents who have gone through a similar situation and to share their experiences.

Childcare services

Choosing childcare services

To enrol your child in day care, contact the childcare centre, day care centre or home childcare provider of your choice. Many childcare centres accept children with disabilities. Choosing childcare services (cont.)

Subsidies

Childcare services are also eligible for subsidies to facilitate the inclusion of disabled children. Two types of subsidies are available:

- The allowance for childcare establishments receiving children with a disability can be obtained once the child's impairment has been confirmed;
- the exceptional integration assistance measure is designed to facilitate or maintain the integration of disabled children with significant needs into childcare services.

It is the responsibility of the childcare services, with the consent of the parents, to apply to the Ministère de la Famille, des Aînés et de la Condition féminine for these subsidies.



Support for integration

Most rehabilitation centres offer services to help disabled children integrate into day care centres. They can also help these centres make their activities more inclusive.

Childcare services in schools

Many schools offer childcare services; ask about them when enrolling your child. If the **school** is unable to offer them, it can refer you to another day care service that will better meet your child's special needs.

<u>Subsidies</u>

Childcare services receive a subsidy when they accept children with disabilities (who are enrolled and present in the school on September 30 of the year in question). It is up to the school to apply for the subsidy to the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport through the school board.

Support for integration

As part of the individualized education plan, childcare services can specify their needs in order to obtain assistance from other resource people in the community.

The project Integration sociale des enfants handicapés en milieu scolaire offers services in various regions of Québec in order to facilitate the integration of disabled children into day care services. The request must be made by the day care service or the school, but you as a parent can also obtain information by telephone or e-mail.

Income

Child assistance measure

Families with dependent children under 18 may be eligible for the child assistance payment, the amount of which varies depending on the family's income and circumstances. Contact the **Régie des rentes du Québec**.

Allowance for handicapped children

Regardless of their income, families with a disabled child can apply for the allowance for handicapped children. All families receive the same amount. Contact the **Régie des rentes du Québec**.

Child Disability Benefit (CDB)

The Child Disability Benefit (CDB) is a tax-free benefit, paid by the government of Canada, to low- or middle-income families who care for a child under age 18 with a severe and prolonged impairment in mental or physical functions. The CDB is added to the monthly Canada Child Tax Benefit payment.

Once your child turns 18, you are no longer entitled to the family allowance. However, he or she may be eligible for benefits under the Employment-Assistance Program. Contact your **local employment centre** (CLE) for more information.

Physical health

Equipment and supplies

You may be entitled to a subsidy for special equipment and medical supplies (to cover, for example, the cost of diapers for children over three years of age). You must apply for this subsidy to your **CSSS (CLSC)** or to your **local employment centre** if you or your child receive benefits under the Employment-Assistance Program.

As a last resort, the association Ressource d'aide aux personnes handicapées du Bas-St-Laurent/ Gaspésie/Îles-de-la-Madeleine can provide its members with assistance for special equipment or needs.

<u>Transportation expenses</u>

You may claim expenses for transportation, parking and accommodation if you are required to travel, **frequently and on a regular basis**, in order for your child to receive medical treatment (for example, dialysis) or rehabilitation services. Contact your local **CSSS (CLSC)**.

In addition, if you or your child receive benefits under the Employment-Assistance Program, you may be entitled to a refund of a portion of the travel expenses you incur for medical reasons. Contact your **local employment centre**.



Living environment

Home support program

You may obtain home support services or a home support subsidy if your child requires physical assistance (for example, bathing a child who has become too heavy to lift up). Contact your local **CSSS (CLSC)**.

Residential Adaptation Assistance Program

You may be entitled to a subsidy to adapt your home (house or apartment) in order to make it barrier-free for your child. You may require a wheelchair ramp, wider doors, or an adapted bathroom.

Free admission for personal attendants

Services that allow personal attendants free admission to tourist attractions or recreational activities vary depending on the municipality. Contact the **recreational department of your municipality**.



Service programs

Preparing a service program allows your child's needs to be properly evaluated **in different areas of activity** (childcare services, school, work, recreation, transportation, etc.). It can also help determine your family support needs. The same evaluation can subsequently be used to organize the services required with the cooperation of the resource people involved. Here is how to obtain a service program.

For children with intellectual impairments or pervasive developmental disorders:

- if your child receives services from a **rehabilitation centre**, you must apply there;
- ▶ if he or she does not receive services from a rehabilitation centre, you must contact your local CSSS (CLSC).

For children with other types of impairments, you must contact the appropriate rehabilitation centre.

The Office des personnes handicapées du Québec can also help you take steps to have a service program prepared, regardless of your child's impairment. You can also obtain, free of charge, a copy of the guide entitled "Je commence son plan de services" to help you identify your child's needs.

Your right to object

If you are not satisfied with the services offered or received, or you do not agree with a decision made concerning your family, you must use the review and complaints procedure provided by the organizations concerned.

You must submit any complaints in writing, clearly explaining the reasons for your dissatisfaction and specifying the names of the people you contacted. Keep a copy of the letters and documents that you send.

In the case of a health and social services establishment, the **Centre d'assistance et d'accompagnement aux plaintes – Bas-Saint-Laurent** can help you express your complaint and provide other assistance.
