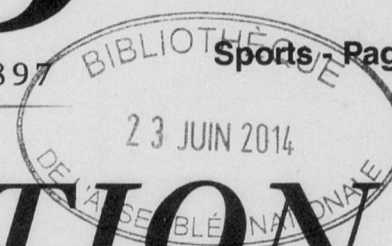

Cowansville
Relay for Life
"Celebrate, re-
member and
fight back"

COWANSVILLE

In its tenth annual edition, the Cowansville Relay for Life has accumulated more than \$45,000 for cancer research and response.

Organizers predict totals of the fundraiser to exceed their anticipated \$70,000 objective in a record-breaking year.

On June 14, over 300 community members will assemble at the Cowansville Nature Centre to participate in the 12-hour overnight walk, a unifying gesture of solidarity to acknowledge the relentless battles fought against cancer.

As per tradition, the walking perimeter will be illuminated by a multitude of "luminaires" to pay tribute and to remember a cancer survivor or a loved one they lost to the disease.

The relay will debut with the survivor's lap, a symbol of hope and life, as individuals who have braved and conquered cancer are invited to initiate the march in honour of cancer patients and survivors.

At 6 a.m., an emblematic tree will be planted, and a commemorative plaque

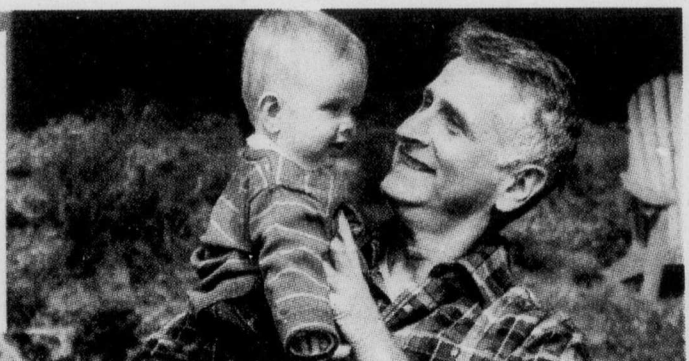

Village Harmony Alumni to visit North Hatley

The Village Harmony Alumni Ensemble, led by Larry Gordon, is coming to North Hatley this Friday night.

Gordon has been the driving force behind the Village Harmony camps for more than 20 years and over the years has attracted numerous talented singers and directors to help put on exciting concerts of world music.

This unique world music vocal ensemble includes 18 college-aged and young adult Village Harmony veterans, many of whom have sung and traveled with Village Harmony for many years.

The program features a large set of Bulgarian and Macedonian songs taught to the group by guest leader Tatiana Sarbinska, American shape-note songs and contemporary compositions, South African songs and dances, traditional songs from Caucasus, Georgia, and a set of renaissance works.

The ensemble is playing 14 dates throughout New England and Quebec during a month-long tour, but Friday is their only appearance in the Townships.

Sarbinska is one of the foremost Bulgarian singing teachers in the U.S. She grew up learning traditional Bulgarian music in the Macedonian village of Rila, near the Pirin Mountains in southwestern Bulgaria. As a student at Academy of Music, Dance and Fine Arts in Plovdiv, Bulgaria, she received degrees in traditional folk music (singing, conducting, composition) and classical and applied musical pedagogy.

For many years she was the featured soloist of the internationally-acclaimed Pirin Ensemble, as well as a conductor. She has taught the group a varied group of songs, both in traditional village style and more complex choral arrangements, some featuring a band of clarinet, accordion and fiddle. The Bulgarian style

features a particularly arresting bright and hard-edged singing style, particularly in the women's voices

This year's ensemble is composed of 18 college-aged young people and these youngsters are the cream of the choralists who have participated in Village Harmony camps in recent years. What you are sure to experience is exciting choral music of a very high calibre.

The concert will take place on Friday evening at the Unitarian Universalist Church, 35 Gagnon, North Hatley, at 7:30 p.m.

The suggested admission price is only \$10 for adults and \$5 for children and seniors. Don't let that low price fool you, however. You will surely realize at the end of the concert that you have experienced a concert which can only be described as priceless.

STS awareness campaign aims to boost bike safety

Anyone who has ever taken their driving test has been made well aware of the fact that there are spaces around any vehicle in which even a careful driver is not able to see what is coming.

In English we call those spaces blind-spots, but the French term, "l'angle mort," ("the angle of death") arguably offers a more serious indication of the consequences involved.

With road safety on the minds of drivers and bicyclists alike in Sherbrooke this week following Monday's fatal accident on the corner of King Street East and Saint Francis Boulevard, a special awareness

campaign was held at the Marché de la Gare Wednesday.

In an effort to indicate to riders and pedestrians how large the "angles of death" are for a city bus, the Sherbrooke Transport Society invited passersby to climb into the driver's seat of one of the city's buses to get a driver's eye view.

The campaign was the result of a collaboration between the STS, Sherbrooke's volunteer bike patrollers, the Société d'Assurance Automobile de Québec, and Contrôle Routier Québec.

"Cyclists will always lose, any time they get hit by a vehicle," explained bike patroller Bruce Porter, pointing to the fact that the sight lines of the bus driver had been marked out on the ground to indicate the vast areas in which a pedestrian, bicycle or car could not be seen.

Porter reflected on the fact that, because the bus is covered with windows, many people assume they can always be seen by the driver when it is actually more likely that they are in a blind spot.

"With a truck it's exactly the same blind spots," added Benoit Labonté of Contrôle Routier Québec, reflecting on Monday's accident, which involved a transport truck rather than a bus. "When they turn right, if they don't see you, they'll cut you in half."

Labonté explained that the STS had planned this campaign prior to the deadly accident, but said that the timing made the message all the more poignant.

Asked if bicycle-related accidents are common in the area, he said he didn't have the exact figures available.

"What I can say is that it doesn't happen often, fortunately, but when it does it's very tragic," the road security officer said.

STS bus driver Richard Bachand, also on site along with supervisor Réal Verpaelst, explained that in his experience 90 per cent of cyclists don't respect the rules of the road.

"They drive on the sidewalk, they don't stop at stop signs, they cross red lights, they don't

respect crosswalks, they criss-cross the streets," the bus driver said. "The road safety code is not just for those driving heavy vehicles; if everyone respected stop signs, lights and crosswalks, things would be better."

Verpaelst could only recall one case of a bicyclist getting hit by a Sherbrooke bus, which he said took place more than a decade ago. The individual survived, but is now permanently confined to a wheelchair.

"We're very lucky to not have more accidents, given the number of hours we are on the road," the STS supervisor said. "Most often what we see is busses being rear-ended."

Nonetheless, Verpaelst said that the issue of people not being conscious of the blind spots is a serious issue that needs to be addressed.

"If a bike is speeding by and the driver turns, even with the driver checking his mirrors, it only takes a fraction of a second for an accident to happen," he said. "Make sure that the driver has seen you and stay on the

side of the road. Be aware, and back up if needed."

Verpaelst said that many pedestrians do not pay attention to the space a large vehicle needs to turn a tight corner, and said that in intersections like that at King and Alexander streets, it is often nearly impossible to turn a bus without grazing the sidewalk. In that and other tight turns, he said it is potentially life saving to stay back from the edge of the road at least six inches.

Porter explained that the main focus of the campaign had been to reach out to cyclists, and he reported that although the weather had been uncooperative enough to cut the project from two days to one, it was nonetheless drawing a fair amount of attention.

The bike patrollers were handing out copies of the government of Québec's "safe cycling guide," which contains information relating to bicycling from the highway safety code, as well as free bike lights provided by the SAAQ.

Tech makes mountain rescue easier

Getting lost in the woods isn't what it used to be, at least for two teenagers who got lost on a midnight hike to the summit of Mount Orford.

The two were able to use a cell phone to trigger a search that rescued them about an hour after it began.

The two 17-year olds began their adventure at around 9 p.m. when they left Highway 112 in Austin and began walking up Ruisseau-des-chênes trail.

Somewhere between Mount Giroux and Orford, they lost

sight of the trail markers. They used a cell phone to contact their families who then contacted the Memphremagog Police at 1 a.m. to inform them of the situation.

Police called the pair to obtain GPS information. Fifty minutes later, the two were picked up, safe and sound, by a police vehicle, provided with warm clothes, and returned to their families.

The young man and woman had embarked on their middle-of-the-night trek astonishingly ill-equipped, with no flashlight, no warm clothes, and no rain gear. Fortunately, modern technology in the form of a cell

phone and well-trained police officers stepped in to save the day.

Just two days earlier, on Tuesday emergency crews were called in around 10:40 a.m. to rescue a 78-year old Montreal man who was having trouble coming down the mountain via Ruisseau-des-chênes.

He and a friend had started climbing in the afternoon and despite the man being physically fit, the trip proved to be longer and more painful than expected.

The friend who accompanied him went to the nearest house on Route 112 to call emergency services.

City pools to open June 21

The City of Sherbrooke's outdoor pools and beaches will open to the public on Saturday, June 21, with the exception of the pool at Andrew Sangster Park, which will be under renovation.

Outdoor pools are open every day from 12:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. Beaches are open daily from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. unless weather or environmental conditions indicate otherwise. Bathing suits and swim caps are required for all and that children under seven years of age must be accompanied by a person older

than 15. A total of 75 lifeguards are employed by the City to ensure safety.

Meanwhile, the pool at Andrew Sangster Park will open in early July when work on the filtration system is completed.

Children participating in day camps in this area will be directed to other municipal pools during the construction period. All organizations and groups whose members use this pool will be notified shortly to inform them of the situation and give them access to another municipal pool.

recognizing Cowansville's first decade of involvement with the Canadian Cancer Society initiative will be unveiled.

The Relay for Life is a non-competitive, amiable gathering established to accommodate participants of all ages and fitness levels, while providing an opportunity for interactive experiences.

A selection of entertainment and activities will complement the ongoing march: tai chi, music, massages, and midnight snacks, to name a few.

The motto "celebrate, remember, and fight back," is connected

to three aspects of the event.

"Celebrate," refers to the survivor's lap and their victory against cancer, "remember," alludes to the luminaries and the memory of those who passed, and "fight back" indicates the personal commitment made by individuals to surmount the disease in their daily lives.

More than 89 relays happen annually, and each year, hundreds of thousands of dollars are collected to support the cause.

This year, Sherbrooke's Relay for Life, which took place last weekend, gathered \$323,000.

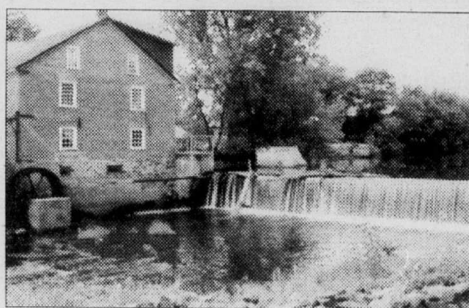

Missisquoi Historical Society wins Richard Evans Award

The Missisquoi Historical Society of Stanbridge East was named the winner of the 2014 Richard Evans Award by the Quebec Anglophone Heritage Network at its recent award gala. The award is presented annually to an organization or group of volunteers who, collectively, have contributed to preserving or promoting their community history, including some aspect of Quebec's Anglophone heritage.

Established in 1899, the MHS is one of the oldest historical societies in Quebec. In the words of Michel Racicot of the Cowansville Historical Society, "we can attest to the tremendous impact the Missisquoi Historical Society has had on the preservation and promotion of Anglophone heritage in Missisquoi and region. For years, the MHS has collected, preserved, researched, exhibited and published items of historical interest focusing on the United Empire Loyalists who settled Missisquoi, on other early settlers from the United States, and on

the history of our region. Over the years, we have always benefitted from the Missisquoi Historical Society's expertise and hard work."

These sentiments were echoed by the Hemmingford Archives, which called the MHS "an inspiring example of community museums at their best."

Established by the Missisquoi Historical Society in 1964, the Missisquoi Museum operates three venues: the original museum in the Cornell Mill on the Pike River (built in 1830); Hodge's General

Store (built in 1841); and most recently, the 12-Sided Walbridge Barn in Mystic (built in 1882), which houses the museum's extensive agricultural collection.

As historians Brian Young and Béatrice Kowaliczko wrote in their official nomination of the MHS for this award, "the museum's permanent and annual exhibitions have been central factors in encouraging an understanding of Missisquoi history, and objects from its collection have traveled to exhibitions across Canada."

Over the past years, the historical society has accelerated its involvement in local heritage. In 2010, for example, it erected a panel on the Eccles Hill site of a Fenian Raid. Hodge's Store was redesigned in 2012 and is now equipped with a multimedia system.

Perhaps the historical society's most exciting recent innovation was the installation in 2010 of its agricultural collection at the Walbridge Barn. This marriage of an outstanding agricultural collection with one of the architectural gems of rural Quebec represents per-

fectly the historical society's ongoing commitment to its heritage mission, its capacity to adapt to changing conditions, and its facility in collaborating with other heritage partners. Now in its 116th year, the Missisquoi Historical Society is a fitting recipient of the Richard Evans Award. In a symbolic way, this award is a way to recognize the historical society, its members, its staff, its volunteers, and all those who have contributed to its collections, publications, activities and administration."

MHS president Michel Barrette was on hand to accept the award at QAHN's Annual Awards Ceremony, held this year in Stanbridge East last Saturday. He said that the historical society was pleased and honoured to receive the award, and extended an invitation to all those present to visit the museum, which is currently featuring an exhibition called "50 Objects for 50 Years: Celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Missisquoi Museum."

Louise Hall and Adelaide Lanktree pick up Marion Phelps Award

Louise Hall and Adelaide Lanktree of Farnham were named co-winners of the 2014 Marion Phelps Award by the Quebec Anglophone Heritage Network at its recent awards gala.

The award is presented annually by the QAHN in recognition of outstanding long-term contributions by an individ-

ual to the preservation and promotion of Anglophone heritage in Quebec. This year, QAHN broke with tradition by awarding this honour to two remarkable individuals - in fact, two siblings.

Between them, Louise Hall and Adelaide Lanktree, both retired school teachers, and both icons of the Eastern Townships, have totaled well over a century's worth of outstanding volunteer

contributions to their community and to several heritage organizations.

For more than twenty years, Hall and Lanktree have been active members of the Sir John Johnson Centennial Branch of the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada, an association dedicated to the preservation of the history and heritage of those Loyalists who were the first settlers of the Eastern Townships.

Lanktree was the treasurer of the Sir John Johnson Branch from 1993 to 2003, and president from 2003 to 2007. Hall has been the treasurer since 2003.

Lanktree is the treasurer of La Société de restauration du patrimoine Johnson, a group that has been working diligently towards the restoration of the Sir John Johnson burial vault on Mont Saint-Grégoire which was destroyed in the 1950s.

The vault has now been rebuilt and the remains of the Johnson family will soon be returned to it in a ceremony later this summer. According to UELAC past president Fred Hayward, "without the persistence and patience of Adelaide and Louise, the rededication of the Sir John Johnson Family Burial Vault would not be taking place this summer as part of the centennial events of our Association."

Louise has volunteered at the Brome-Missisquoi Perkins Hospital in Cowansville for 70 years. Since 2002, she has been a member of Le Petit Musée BMP

Heritage, a museum committed to the preservation of the hospital's history.

Both sisters have been longtime members of the Missisquoi Historical Society in Stanbridge East. For over ten years, they have served on the Comité du patrimoine in their hometown of Farnham.

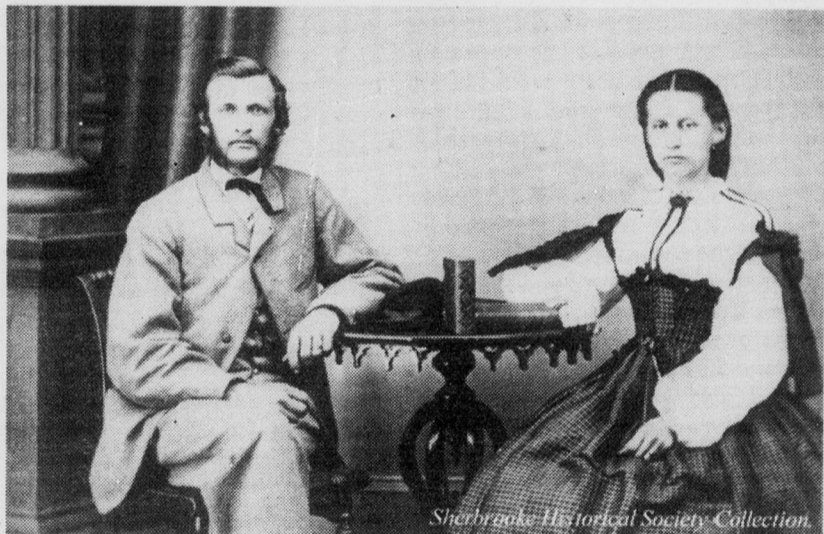
Hall founded the Farnham municipal library, now named the Louise Hall Municipal Library in her honour. They have been supporters of QAHN since the organization's beginnings, as well as the Townshippers' Association, their local United Church, the Order of the Eastern Star, and the Red Cross.

According to nominator Jim Caputo of the QAHN, "No one that I know of more deserves this honour and displays what Marion Phelps stood for."

Michel Racicot, a genealogist with the Sir John Johnson Centennial Branch of the UEL, introduced the sisters at the awards ceremony. He described them as ranking "among the finest examples of true volunteerism."

During their acceptance speech, Lanktree and Hall said that they were surprised and humbled when they heard that they had been chosen for the award. "We knew Marion Phelps personally, and we truly feel very, very honoured," they said. "We have been members of QAHN since it was founded back in 2000," they added, "and we have many happy memories of this wonderful organization."

Langlois gets 5 years, has 40 mos. left

A Magog man has been sentenced to serve five years in prison for his role in the in a drug trafficking network dismantled by police during "Operation Récif" in November 14, 2012.

Vincent Langlois, considered a major player in the ring, has

been incarcerated since his arrest and will therefore have to spend the next 40 months behind bars.

Langlois admitted having been at the head of a network of cocaine, methamphetamine, cannabis, and cannabis resin dealers in bars and on the streets in Magog.

On Wednesday before Judge Conrad Chapdelaine of the Que-

bec Court, he pleaded guilty to charges of conspiracy, possession for the purpose of trafficking and trafficking. He also acknowledged the theft of his stepfather's safe, which contained approximately \$60,000, after having arranged to send him to a hospital.

The organization of that theft had been captured by wiretap while evidence was

being gathered for 'Récif.'

He also pleaded guilty to two charges of possession of cannabis and cannabis oil while inside the Sherbrooke Detention Centre. All these crimes earned him a total sentence of five years in prison with 20 months already served.

"Operation Récif" led to the seizure of 120 grams of cocaine, 420 methamphetamine tablets,

cannabis, \$25,000 in cash, twenty weapons, including some high-caliber, and computer hardware.

The Quebec provincial police-led operation mobilized over 200 police officers from all regional forces and sought to decommission various cells related primarily to cocaine trafficking, including that run by Langlois.

Fatal farm accident had many sources

An accident that took the life of a worker at Ferme Guylin in Barnston West was caused by a series of factors, a CSST report says.

Those factors, including poor stacking of hay at the Barnston West farm, resulted in the death of the worker Ricardo Beaudoin in June 2013.

Nearly a year after the accident and at the beginning of the peak farming season, Committee on Health and Safety

(OHS) has released its investigation report and issued its recommendations.

In June 2013 Ricardo Beaudoin was crushed underneath hay bales weighing about a ton each and his tractor while he was checking the mechanical digger.

There were no witnesses to the accident, which took place between in the late afternoon.

It was Beaudoin's first season performing this task.

"The worker was stacking the bales of hay under a shelter. He had to stop because the bales

had stopped coming. He went to check if there was hay or rocks in his bucket. For some unknown reason, the hay bales collapsed while he was in the way," said CSST inspector Yvon Guay.

According to the CSST, the huge hay bales must meet several criteria to be strong enough to be stacked.

"These are huge, heavy balls that must be made securely. Distortions have to be avoided so that they are stacked neatly. We note in this accident that some bales were deformed and lacked some ropes. Overlapping was

not adequate. In stacking, it is important to have good base, strong, uniform, and solid bales, and especially to not stack deformed bales or those that aren't tied."

CSST engineer Sophie Leclerc says a combination of factors led to this fatal work injury.

"They were five bales high and the stack collapsed at the base. Their strength and how they are stacked have a significant influence. If there is a problem with the strength of bales, the stack height should be altered or access restricted.

This was not the case here," she stated.

Specifically, the CSST report mentions that Beaudoin had received no training in how to stack the huge bales and that there is no requirement in Quebec that this training be provided.

The Commission's report will recommend remedying that.

There are no regulations on stacking hay on farms anywhere in Canada, and the CSST had to use references from Australia and Great Britain in its investigation.

Falsely accused officer ups lawsuit demands

Sherbrooke Police officer Alex Therrien has upped his claims against the City of Sherbrooke and two of his superiors to \$850,000, a massive increase from his original \$325,000 demand, Sherbrooke's La Tribune is reporting.

The new demands are expected to be presented in court on July 7, the paper says.

His suit against the city, Po-

lice Director Gaétan Labbé, and retired professional standards and ethics chief Mario Lebrun demanded compensation for damages resulting from charges of obstruction of justice that were filed in April 2013 but dropped a year later.

He was suspended without pay during this period and remains away from work as the internal disciplinary process unfolds.

Therrien originally demanded \$325,000 in compensa-

tion from the City of Sherbrooke for moral damages, stress, inconvenience, physical damage, financial difficulties, and debt as well as punitive damages.

The original application has been amended to include an additional \$500,000 for loss of future earnings.

In his amended complaint Therrien alleges that the charges halted a career plan that included moving up within the Sherbrooke police force to

become an investigator or even lieutenant.

"Until the false accusations were brought against him, the plaintiff had very good reviews and progressed continuously within the SPS, in line with his career plan," it says.

The document also states that even after charges were dropped, the Sherbrooke department made no effort to apologize or admit that a mistake had been made.

He says his reputation within

the department has been ruined, making it impossible to gain positions that require the trust and confidence of colleagues.

Therrien was essentially accused of being a "mole," and of abusing his position to provide sensitive information to criminal organizations.

Despite the charges being dropped, Therrien believes that he remains "a mole" in the eyes of the public and his fellow officers.

Bringing LGBT realities from out of the grey and unto the light

A new group has formed in the region to promote better understanding of the realities of sexual minorities and to facilitate their integration in the region.

The Groupe régional d'intervention sociale de l'Estrie (GRIS) held their first general meeting on June 4.

According to new president Myriam Pelletier-Gilbert, the creation of the organization is the result of many years of campaigning among organizations in the region. "No Townships body was dedicated to the improvement of living conditions for sexual minorities," she said.

"However, a middle range of services should be available to demystify homosexuality and bisexuality, particularly in schools

and community youth organizations. It's with this perspective that our 20 partners have gotten together since 2012 to work on the creation of GRIS Estrie."

GRIS Estrie interventions will focus on workshops to help demystify sexual minorities, particularly in schools.

Workshops will be free of charge - with voluntary contributions accepted - and conducted by LGBT volunteers who received rigorous training from GRIS Quebec.

Two speakers - one man and one woman - will team up with each intervention team to answer any questions from participants about homosexuality and bisexuality.

Interventions and testimonies are currently offered by IRIS Estrie, a partner in the new grouping, but, sexual minorities are not part of the core mission of

this organization, which can't meet all the demands.

With fundraising efforts underway, GRIS Estrie expects to be able to have its resources and volunteers in place by this fall.

"We have several project ideas in the longer term, such as establishing sponsorship or mentoring service, establishing more direct communications with organizations and businesses explaining the realities experienced by LGBT people as well as offering lectures and adapted training. With partner volunteers coming primarily from health and social services, labor, institutional organizations, and the community, the initiatives that could be taken up by GRIS Estrie are many," Pelletier-Gilbert concluded.

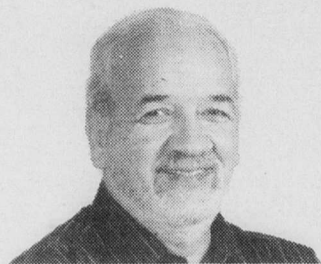

The 'Drive it till it Drops' syndrome

Jacques Cousteau used to say that it made no sense to consider the air, the soil and the oceans as being both dump sites and food sources.

You can hardly expect a polluted landscape to be the source of healthy food.

But without a hint of changing our ongoing collective destruction of the environment, we keep dumping millions of tons of plastics of all sorts into the oceans, we pollute the air we breathe that, in some cases (China comes to mind), is closer to a toxic cocktail than a cleanser for the lungs, and we spill oil and a host of other wordless polluters all over our lands.

This incredible numbness to our environmental failure has those who know better, the scientists and the fishermen and the agricultural communities, wondering whether we really care about this stupid doomsday scenario.

I remember a few years back when I had little money to get around with, all my cars were, well, on the brink of suffering from a fatal meltdown any given day.

A very popular book back then was "Drive it 'till it drops." The author, a seasoned car repairman, pointed to the very basics that could keep your car on the road, no oil change, just add as needed, minimum electricity upkeep, breaks and so on. It all made perfect sense and indeed.

With a minimum-wage income, if you had an old jalopy, the last thing on your mind was losing money to keep it running. So you could go from the "el cheapo" model to the "deal-of-the-year" model while spending as little as possible. Boy, those were the good old days... paying more than \$500 for a car was... well, stupid!

It seems that we have fallen into the "Drive it 'till it Drops" syndrome with regards to the planet. The problem is that

there's only one model going around. We seem to be content to just turn a blind eye to all the alarm signals sent by experts, scientists and the environmental community, as if they were just a fly buzzing around our head.

It will eventually go away, right? More oil? No problem, let's take a look under Anticosti? More gas, no sweat, let's peep under the agricultural lands of the St. Lawrence Valley.

All well and good until the environmental gavel hits us hard. The problem is that by then it will be too late to make up for cumulative neglect. An oil spill from Enbridge's (hey, this name rings a bell...) 6B line on the Kalamazoo River in July 2010 should serve as a warning.

The six-foot opening in the pipeline sent more than one million us gallons of heavy crude oil from the Alberta tar sands in the surrounding ecosystem near Marshall, Mich. Four years and a billion dollars in cleanup costs later, the mess is not yet totally cleaned up. Families were moved and a rural area is still unliveable.

The total fine from the U.S. administration to Enbridge? Less than \$2 million.

This is just one of hundreds of spills that occur on a daily basis all over the continent, Lac Mégantic being our own local worst case scenario. We have no idea of the final societal cost and as for the company, MMA, well, they're getting away with environmental murder.

The bottom line is easy to figure out. Cleaning up the oceans, breathing good air and producing food on unpolluted lands are our only options. Why then are we driving our only planet until it drops? Beats me.

The environmental unbalance is almost beyond hope in many regions.

Most of Southern California is faced with a drought it never imagined and it's made even more intolerable because there are as many Californians as there are Canadians. Two-thirds of the state is currently experiencing extreme or severe drought.

The food produced in Southern California reaches our tables every day, just read the labels. Where do you think Driscoll strawberries come from? If we buy California, we are California.

What is it to us? How are we concerned? Well, we are operating on exactly the same model: industrial size

farms, genetically modified food, monoculture and so on.

Dozens of cities downriver on the St. Lawrence are still emptying their collective sewers directly in the open waters, and our cars produce fifty percent of our airborne pollution.

Mind you, Quebec has made great progress. This province is the only jurisdiction in the Americas to have actually reached the greenhouse gas emissions goal set in the Kyoto Protocol. Our emissions have gone down almost 7% below the 1990 levels, while our GDP rose by a staggering 48%. This is proof that more economy can be linked with environmental responsibility. There is hope.

So before we all have heart attacks over our current budget woes, let's take

this restraint as an occasion to invest in another economy, one that does not need more oil, more water pollution and fewer social services to thrive.

Let's keep Anticosti as it is, or make it better for all without oil. Let's hold arms and block access to Cacouna and the projected Trans-Canada oil terminal and by way of consequence, let's act as if we care by cleaning up our act.

We can start by sharing our cars, using more and more public transportation, getting involved in gardening and buying local produce.

A lot of collective good will come out of it and our chances of having to deal with another major environmental disaster will diminish. There is no other option anyway!

How will we guard against suicide as a solution to health care budgets all in the name of "treating" patient pain and honouring choice?

Death as health policy

We've entered a whole new world in Quebec that I find, frankly, frightening. Quebec's government has voted to enact policy where entering the health care system exposes a person to a government-regulated death machine. Patients will be offered the option of suicide to deal with pain they feel is unremitting and that they are unwilling to face.

The pain is not limited to that which is physical but also emotional. It is this emotional pain that particularly destroys hope even though there are means to care for a hurting person. These that are emotionally most vulnerable will be the ones to whom the medical system will most persistently offer the suicide solution.

People that need hospital care are already vulnerable. In addition to sickness and all the discomfort this entails they are often afraid, uncertain of both their

medical condition and its prognosis and worried that they will be a burden to their families.

Those who don't have the advantage of nearby personal support will have even greater disadvantage. If palliative care isn't available, the terror of pain and the other indignities of ill health will increasingly making suicide more attractive.

We already know there are significant line-ups for treatment. We know that often beds are closed due to lack of funding. How will we guard against suicide as a solution to health care budgets all in the name of "treating" patient pain and honouring choice?

There is nothing in the God-void of our modern society to resist using death as a solution to expensive care.

Moreover, when a society's fundamental beliefs assure us that we are no different from any other organism, the product of mindless accidents, the weak can be discarded in keeping with the survival advantage of the strong without any qualm or worry that a deity might disapprove. Humanity has come a long way hasn't it?

We've seen for years now the killing of babies for reasons of psychic pain that often is translated into dollars. It often isn't long before "cost to society" of an unwanted child, or a woman's risk of entering poverty as a single mom or loss of

a profitable career due to childbirth become included in the list of reasons for abortion.

Now we have the same scenario at the other end of life where financial burden to family and cost of expensive health care will be used to justify inexpensive suicide so as to divert funds and medical resources to those that are healthier.

Hospitals will become death factories with specially trained professionals dutifully dispatching people in the name of choice. Today, we're not allowed to permit faith considerations to be part of ethical decisions or public policy.

There isn't much left for us to offset the cold hard facts of money to determine how energetically a health care service will strive for the health, happiness and comfort of its clients. And with governments funds in short supply we've seen strict limitations to certain expensive treatments and medications for some who need them.

Unfortunately, the tools for suicide are very cheap. This will be the final solution to excessive medical cost for a conscienceless bureaucracy that only minds the bottom line and cold words on a page. I wonder if tax credits will be offered to the families of survivors for saving the system so much money?

This is going to cause soul-upheaval for a great many care professionals. Doctors, nurses and others who entered

medicine because they valued human lives will be required to make available the death option.

Health services that were begun by people and organizations that believe in a God who commanded, "Thou shalt not kill" will be required to act against their convictions.

Care facilities, nursing homes and care givers will be forced to close because they won't have a choice but to aid and abet suicide. Either that or the pressure to keep business flowing and income coming will compel them to change their soul's most precious principles. Again, dollars will win.

"Right to die," we call it. Of course we have the right to die. We're all going to, don't worry about that. The trouble is that this new world of ours that seems to champion individual choice will actually see the growth of a societal pressure and compulsion to die. Those who choose life will be perceived as odd balls and as expensive inconveniences to society and families. This is happening now with regard to women choosing to give birth to children in situations of disadvantage. Such caring moms are accused of being selfish in too many occasions. A time is coming when those who want to live longer and be cared for will be considered to be selfish and antisocial. Death for the good of society is coming to a hospital near you.

Thank you, Mike McDevitt, for making the connection between a young killer in Moncton and others around the world who bear the label "terrorist."

Much commentary on the Moncton killer points to psychiatric causes - he's unbalanced, he's lost his reason - but Mike's editorial in Wednesday's paper asks us to take another look.

We tend to think a person who's mentally ill can't be held accountable for his actions. If he's mentally ill that says it all, and we don't need to look for causes.

In this way we excuse not only the offender, but also the society from which the offender springs. In persuading ourselves that that young man wasn't responsible for his actions, we could be avoiding the question, "Is there something we should have done?"

In the same week as Moncton was torn apart, the TV news brought us the story of five young men in Calgary who'd gone off to be trained in terrorism in the Middle East.

They followed a pattern: turning in on themselves, withdrawing from

friends and family, taking their reading of the world from radical websites, becoming disciples of people as alienated as they were.

With an imam pleading for action to stop them, we could see that their alienation has nothing to do with Islam, and everything to do with the breakdown of their network of relationships.

Terrorism has causes, and every society has to wonder about them. Why do some people feel cut off from society? How did they come to lose their fellow-feeling for those they now would harm? How can we draw them back into the circle, and restore to them a sense of belonging? They need help from the whole community to restore their humanity.

Everything we do to support others in their journey contributes to the health of the whole community. The volunteers who deliver meals-on-wheels, or coach kids' sports, or pick up their neighbour's mail for them, or sit on a committee that provides services to others are all of them reminding us we're part of a community, and that assurance helps keep all of us sane - and safe.

BRP to tap into growth in Chinese market with joint venture

BRP Inc., the former recreational products division of Bombardier Inc. that makes Ski-Doos and off-road vehicles, is pursuing growth in China by setting up a joint venture with its long-time distributor.

"We sell all our product lines in China and see good potential for Can-Am off-road vehicles and for Sea-Doo watercraft," stated CEO Jose Boisjoli.

The company has operated in China for 14 years and has seen its sales grow more than 30 per cent annually in the last three years.

BRP said the investment with Smooth Marine Equipment Ltd. effective next February will strengthen its presence and accelerate the expansion of its dealer network to 30 within two years from 19 currently in place. It established a regional office in Shanghai in 2012.

The Canadian company will control 80 per cent of the joint venture, which was announced Thursday ahead of the manufacturer's first annual meeting as a public company and the release of its first-quarter results.

BRP is maintaining its guidance for the fiscal year despite getting off to rough start by reporting a substantial drop in adjusted profits in the first quarter.

It earned \$16.6 million in adjusted net income or 14 cents per diluted share for the period ended April 30. That's down from \$53.4 million or 51 cents per share a year earlier.

Including one-time items, its net profit increased to \$28 million from \$25.7 million.

Revenues decreased six per cent to \$758.6 million from \$804.3 million in the same quarter of fiscal 2014. The decrease was due to lower sales of year-round and seasonal products, offset by a \$49-million currency benefit caused by the lower Canadian dollar.

BRP was expected to post nine cents per share in adjusted earnings per share on \$752.3 million of revenues in the quarter, beating analysts' expectations.

"Our financial results for the first quarter were as expected and consistent with our outlook," CEO Jose Boisjoli said in a news release.

He said sales in international markets increased four per cent in the quarter despite political unrest in Russia, which was offset by the impact of a long winter that increased sales of snow machines and off-road vehicles.

BRP anticipates a stronger second half of the year due to strong spring snowmobile orders the introduction of the Can-Am Outlander L ATV, the restart of the Sea-Doo Spark manufacturing in Queretaro, Mexico and upcoming product launches.

The lady's not for burning

How to outsmart a pogrom (or two)



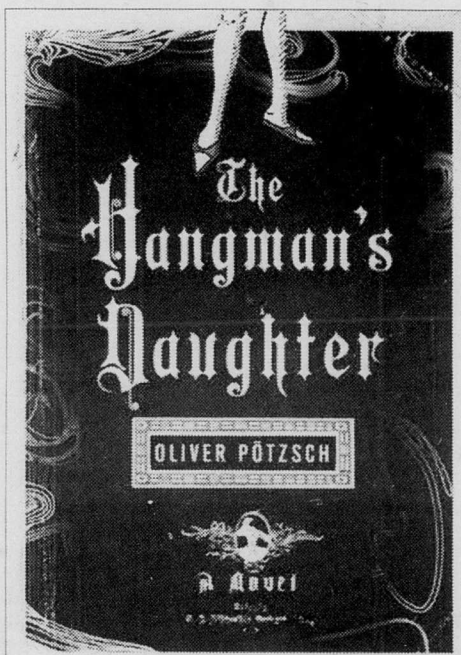

In the Western tradition, witches were condemned around-and-about the year 560 BC. That's the date scholars believe Leviticus and Exodus were written, by the same person ("Thou shalt not suffer a witch to live"). The academic Douglas Linder has written that "The word 'witch' in Exodus is a translation of the Hebrew word 'kashaph,' which comes from the root meaning 'to whisper.' The word as used in Exodus probably thus meant 'one who whispers a spell.' In context, the Exodus passage probably was intended to urge Jews to adhere to their own religious practices and not those of surrounding tribes."

A while later, St. Augustine sniffed at the very idea of witches. Augustine "argued in the early 400s that God alone could suspend the normal laws of the universe. In his view, neither Satan nor witches had supernatural powers or were capable of effectively invoking magic of any sort. It was the 'error of the pagans' to believe in 'some other divine power than the one God.' Of course, if witches are indeed powerless, the Church need not overly concern itself with their spells or other attempts at mischief."

Unfortunately Augustine's ideas were



never taken to heart. In the 1400s, witchcraft trials became a big deal in Europe. When tortured, you'd admit to all sorts of crimes. Pope Innocent VIII fed the fear, and hysteria and mass executions - usually of women - continued for two centuries (the last witch to be executed in England died in 1682).

Towns had executioners charged with killing, and the job was often handed down from father to son. Contemporary German author Oliver Potzsch can trace his lineage back to the Kuisl family, and "the Kuisl executioner dynasty had been one of the most famous of such dynasties in Bavaria." This delightful bit of personal history appears in the postscript to his 2008 novel, *The Hangman's Daughter* (published in 2010 in English, and translated by Lee Chadeayne).

"Supposedly more than 60 executions were carried out by my bloodstained ancestor during the Schongau witch trials of 1589 alone."

And with this, Potzsch mixed medieval fact and fiction in a fun and suspenseful novel.

Unsurprisingly, the Schongau town fathers were none too pleased, some 70 years later, to discover another witch. A dead child is dragged out of the river, stabbed multiple times and sporting a strange mark, in some sort of ink, on his shoulder. What could it be but the mark of a witch?

The year is 1659, and the mob convicts the midwife and healer, her home filled with pots covered in strange symbols and forbidden herbs.

Kuisl the executioner is also the town torturer, and he is ordered to elicit a confession.

But what, asks the moralistic killer, if the woman is not a witch? In response, the town clerk knows the woman's innocence is irrelevant: "His town was on fire! Johann Lechner could almost see how fear and hatred were eating their way from the outskirts to the very center of Schongau. There had been whispering in the inns last night already.... People were talking about devil worship, witches' Sabbaths, and ritual murder. After all the plagues, wars and storms, the situation was explosive. The city was a powder keg, and [the midwife] could be the fuse."

She must be found guilty, and quickly, or a full-scale panic and purge of women would erupt.

Kuisl hopes to somehow avoid a miscarriage of justice. But while he investigates, he still must torture the midwife. It's his job.

Kuisl is joined in his investigation by a young physician, Simon, an upstart who thinks there might be something to this newfangled idea that blood circulates through the body. (His father, also a physician, thinks the idea ridiculous.) Along the way, Simon is enchanted by

Kuisl's daughter.

Their love is doomed: She is promised to the son of another hangman. Because to be a hangman is to be an outcast, and so it is for the children of the hangman, as well.

In the meantime, another child turns up dead. He too, bears the mark of the witch.

This is a book (and an eventual series!) recommended by the Lennoxville Library's Donna Berwick. "Fascinating reading," she promises.

Now let's skip forward another two centuries, and move northeast. To 1890s Russia, and to Sister Pelagia, whose wimple is always askew, a shock of red hair likely peeking out. She is, frankly, an embarrassment. "She was really not cut out to be a nun: she was too lively, fidgety, curious, and undignified in her movements.... A walking disaster with freckles."

Russian writer Boris Akunin's *Sister Pelagia And The White Bulldog* (2007, translated by Andrew Bromfield, the first in a trilogy) comes recommended by the many, many patrons who've signed it out.

The bulldog has been poisoned, although it takes a bit of time to meet the beast's sad corpse.

Pelagia is a somewhat bucolic novel of suspense, as Akunin meanders about with his characters, offering us personal stories, tales of daily life, history, and a small mystery. And the beginnings of a pogrom.

If you enjoy digression and dry wit, you'll enjoy *Sister Pelagia*.

An inquisitor from the Holy Synod needs to make a name for himself. The bishop seeks to protect his people. And Pelagia must discover who's murdered the pup, the end result of decades of inbreeding. The dog (and its siblings) are

the bishop's great-aunt's only remaining connection to her beloved late spouse.

The word "pogrom," by the way, was adopted from the Russian, and means a violent attack by a mob. The attacks would be condoned by authorities, and were, in those days, against Jews.

As Pelagia wanders over to the great-aunt's, she comes across two brutally decapitated travellers... but must be off, as she has far more urgent business.

The inquisitor, however, pleased by his good fortune, whips up fear directed at the Zyts people, who are, obviously, pagan murderers.

Akunin manages to bring these diverse plot threads together. But in both books, justice is a slippery concept.

Nicolas Boulay looking for serious playing time in 2014

LENNOXVILLE

In his second season with the Montreal Alouettes, Magog native Nicolas Boulay is aspiring to further his utility beyond the special teams, and achieve a role in the defensive alignment at the middle linebacker position.

"I've gained the fraction-of-a-second that is the determinant at the professional level," commented Boulay. "The hesitation that I experienced as a rookie is gone and I'm much more comfortable with the system, and faster in its application."

The Montreal Alouettes recruited the 24-year-old Boulay from the University of Sherbrooke in the fourth round (30th overall) of the 2013 Canadian College Draft. In his rookie season, Boulay suited up for all 18 games and recorded eight special teams tackles.

"It's been a good camp so far, the only element that I can control is my individual performance, the rest is out of my hands," said Boulay. "I'm injecting all of my heart and my energy into my performance, and I think it's being noticed," added the six-foot, 220-pound linebacker.

Despite the alleged weight and height limitations that interfered with Boulay's development earlier in his ca-

reer, the tenacious player has overcome adversity and suspicions and carved a place for himself in the professional

ranks.

"I've often been told that I was too small or too short, but my work ethic and perseverance allowed me to move beyond the uncertainties and make it to the CFL."

During his last season with the Sherbrooke Vert & Or in 2012, Boulay was named the team's defensive player of the year, recording 55 tackles, ranking him fourth overall in the Quebec conference, and sixth in the country. He was also named as the team's defensive captain that year.

Boulay's first preseason game comes this Saturday, as the Als visit the Hamilton Tiger-Cats. The game will be played at McMaster's Ron Joyce Stadium, as Tim Horton Field (née Ivor Wynne Stadium) is still being redeveloped.

The Als return to Lennoxville next week to conclude training camp and close out the preseason on June 20 against the Ottawa Redblacks.

In other training camp news, the Alouettes announced that Ryan Dinwiddie, a former CFL quarterback and the team's current quarterback coach would handle the play-calling duties, after the earlier dismissal of offensive co-ordinator Rick Worman.

Relive the Miracle Mile at Harry Jerome Track Classic in Vancouver



A RUNNER'S MIND

Imagine running a sub four minute mile. It was a miracle... It happened in the summer of '54 and marked a special sporting moment at the British Empire Games in Vancouver which resonated across the globe.

With an estimated 100 million-plus listeners worldwide and a sold-out Empire Stadium crowd of 35,000 on hand to see it live, the unthinkable happened: Roger Bannister and John Landy had just become the first two men in history to break the four minute mile in the same race.

The cover of the first-ever edition of Sports Illustrated featured the "Miracle Mile" combatants, Bannister of England

and Australia's Landy, capturing the moment on a perfect summer day, August 7, 1954.

All of those fortunate enough to be there would absorb a human feat that many believed to be impossible. A year before, on May 29, 1953, New Zealand's Sir Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Tenzing Norgay became the first people to reach the summit of Mount Everest, a feat which many experts believed to be unattainable.

And then Bannister and Landy showed the world their version of "getting it done."

To celebrate the occasion, there is a life-sized bronze statue at the main entrance of Vancouver's Pacific National Exhibition which depicts the exact moment Bannister made his move on Landy, who looked the wrong way left as Bannister blew past him on the right. Bannister won in 3:58.8, followed by Landy in 3:59.6. And the rest, they say, is history, until...

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Miracle Mile and the Harry Jerome Track Classic plans to honor the occasion with an invitational mile event that will feature no less than seven men who've run well under the four-minute

barrier.

Bannister was first to go under four minutes on May 6, 1954, Landy running 3:58.0 just 46 days later to lower the world record.

It was promoted as, "The Race of the Century" but even that didn't do it justice once it happened. Vancouver Sun photographer, Charlie Warner took the famous photo where Bannister passes Landy.

On July 10, the best Canadian milers will compete against a strong field of international athletes in a tribute to the Miracle Mile, with \$15,000 in prize money for that event.

At the press conference to announce the race at the B.C. Sports Hall of Fame, several Canadian men who broke the sub four-minute barrier were in attendance, including former Olympian and Vancouverite Carey Nelson (3:58.28), and Allan Klassen of Vancouver with a time of 3:57.31.

Watch for Luc Bruchet, who ran a blistering 3:54 this indoor season and will attempt to break the barrier again at the Miracle Mile. These days, more athletes than ever before are capable of running the sub-four minute mile but somebody had to do it first, and that somebody was

Sir Roger Bannister.

Can you imagine if he were to make the trek to Vancouver to relive the moment? Just a thought...

If you are passionate about track and field you will not want to miss July 10 at Swangard Stadium, hosted by the Achilles Track and Field Society.

The annual Harry Jerome Track Classic will not only host the Miracle Mile, it will bring athletes from over 15 countries competing in track and field events.

Dr. Doug Clement, Chair of the Achilles Society says, "This experience is invaluable in the preparation of Canadian athletes who aspire to represent our country at the Olympic, Commonwealth and Pan American Games."

It's anticipated the 60th Anniversary of the Miracle Mile presented by Northern Gateway will produce a bevy of sub-four-minute milers, hopefully re-creating such an inspirational moment as did Bannister and Landy.

If he errs, take advantage

Jef Mallett, the "Frazz" cartoonist, said, "Writing well means never having to say, 'I guess you had to be there.'"

When the defenders play perfectly, declarer is sometimes unable to make his contract. On other deals, though, a defender will fail to find the killing play. Then declarer needs to take full benefit.

In this deal, West cashes three club tricks against four hearts. He then shifts to a diamond. How should South continue?

A four-heart opening bid usually indicates an eight-card suit. However, South decided to tell a small white lie because he was nonvulnerable and the opponents were vulnerable. West wondered if his side could do well, but he had too few points to act at the four-level. North and East had easy passes.

When West had to guess which suit to lead at trick four, he decided that South would be more likely to pre-empt when very short in the other major. Hence his diamond lead. (As you can see, a spade switch would have been lethal.)

Now let's look at South's predicament. He needs to take three pointed-suit tricks to go with his seven trump winners. Should he finesse in spades or in diamonds?

Either is a pure guess. But he can slightly improve his chances. He should win with dummy's diamond ace, ruff a diamond in his hand, cash the heart ace, play a heart to dummy's nine and ruff another diamond.

Here, the king comes tumbling down. So South can draw trumps and claim. But if the diamond king does not appear, declarer can run his trumps, planning to fall back on the spade finesse.
