Nous n'avons reçu depuis Jeudi dernier aucune nouvelle d'opérations importantes dans le Haut-Canada.

Des lettres de Montréal disent qu'on y avait reçu un Papier de Boston du 5 du courant, contenant un détail de la prise de Hampton dans le Chesapeake par la force débarquée de notre escadre, après quelque opposition, dans laquelle l'ennemi parait avoir souffert considérablement; la force Anglaise se préparait à aller à Norfolk. On observa que la Brigade de Marine que l'on attendait ici, agit maintenant dans le Chesapeake. On rapporte aussi qu'il avoit été fait une attaque sur New London, où s'étoient réfugiées les Frégates United States et Macedonian.

Les dernières nouvelles de l'armée de Harrison disent qu'elle n'est pas du tout en état d'entreprendre des opérations contre le Général Proctor. Le Général Clay est mort, et la maladie est dans l'armée.

Aux dernières dates, le 4 du courant, la force Américaine dans le Haut Canada étoit restreint au voisinage immédiat du Fort George, où, dit-on, il n'y a pas moins de 1800 hommes dans les Hôpitaux. Environ cinq cents Sauvages du Nord-Ouest avoient joint notre armée.

On a rapporté, mais sans fondement solide, que le Commodore Chauncey étoit parti du Havre de Sacket pour aller au secours de l'ennemi au Fort George. Sir James York étoit à Kingston. La constataion attendue depuis si longtemps sur le lac aura probablement lieu bientôt; et le résultat aura un effet important sur le reste de la Campagne.

MONTRÉAL, 6 Juillet.

Immédiatement après la brillante affaire de nos avant-postes, le 6 du mois passé, le Lieut. Fitzgibbon demanda au Général Vincent d'être employé séparément avec un petit détachement du 49e. et de la manière qu'il jugeroit la plus expédiente. La demande fut accordée; et cette petite bande a toujours travaillé depuis entre les deux armées. Un tel service est naturellement accompagné d'incidents qui seroient fort intéressans; mais il faut nécessairement que nous nous bornions dans nos détails, et nous nous contenterons de rapporter les deux événemens qui sont les plus extraordinaires. Environ le 20 du mois dernier, le Lieut. Il ne jugea pas prudent d'attaquer, et tint son parti caché. Il alla néanmoins à cheval dans le village, habillé en vert, pour reconnaître. Il ne put découvrir l'ennemi. Made. Kirby qui le connaissait courut à lui, et le pria de se retirer, parce qu'il y avoit une troupe ennemie dans une maison peu éloignée. Il vit un cheval à une porte, et supposant qu'il n'y avoit dans la maison que le cavalier, il descendit de cheval et s'en approcha, quand un soldat de pied s'avança sur lui, et lui présenta son fusil; le Lieutenant s'élança sur lui, saisit son fusil, et le somma de se rendre. L'Américain résista et tint bon. Dans ce moment un soldat sortit de la maison avec son fusil rayé qu'il porta à l'épaulé du lieut. F. ainsi délivré ne perdit pas un moment à emmener ses deux prisonniers et le cheval, l'ennemi n'étant qu'à 200 verges, furetant dans une maison au détour du chemin.

Pour paroître vouloir lui couper la retraite, le Lieut. F. traversa son front au pas de charge, pour gagner l'autre flanc, étant exposé au feu de ses canons, quoiqu'il n'eût que son front pas le moindre mal. Il se posta derrière quelques arbres, et vit que les Sauvages faisoient peu d'impression sur l'ennemi, et que c'étoit en folie en lui de les attendre en rase campagne avec 44 hommes de pied, qui pouvoient être si aisément aperçus. Plusieurs des Sauvages se retirant, il pensa à faire sa retraite. Il espérait néanmoins que le Col. De Haren le rejoindroit bientôt, mais craignant que l'ennemi ne le forçât ou ne fit sa retraite il se détermina à recourir à la ruse, et de sommer l'ennemi de se rendre. Il éleva son mouchoir et s'avança en battant la chamade avec sa corne à mûse, un capitaine d'artillerie nommé McDougal lui envoya un pavillon blanc. Le Lieut. F. dit qu'il étoit envoyé par le Col. De Haren pour les sommer de se rendre, et pour leur offrir sa protection contre les Sauvages, ajoutant qu'il étoit venu un grand nombre du Nord-Ouest qui n'étoit pas possible de gouverner, et son désir étoit d'empêcher l'effusion du sang. Le capitaine retourna vers son officier commandant le Lieut. Col. Eoester, et revint peu après disant, que le Col. B. ne se considérait pas comme vaincu, et ne pouvoit se rendre. Le Lieut. F. fit proposer au Col. B. d'envoyer un officier à la force du Col. De Haren où il seroit plus en état de juger de la nécessité de se rendre. L'officier Américain revint bientôt proposer de la part du Col. B. qu'on la lui montrât, ajoutant que s'il trouvoit leur force capable de justifier la reddition, il se rendroit. La dessus le Lieut. F. répondit qu'il retourneroit vers le Col. De Haren pour lui porter les propositions du Col. B. Il n'eût pas dans l'intention de montrer notre petite force à l'officier de l'ennemi, mais il fallut sauver les apparences, pour soutenir la force. Le Lieut. F. trouva à son retour le capt. Hall qui venoit d'arriver avec 2 dragons, il lui communiqua ce qui s'étoit passé, et aussitôt le capt. Hall prit le rang de Colonel pour l'occasion. Le Lieut. F. retourna et dit que le Col. Hall étoit le plus ancien officier sur le lieu, il ne croyoit pas qu'il fût dans les règles de laisser voir sa force à l'ennemi, mais qu'elle étoit assez grande pour le forcer à se rendre, et que par des motifs d'humanité on lui accorderoit cinq minutes pour délibérer, et que si on hésitoit, les hostilités recommenceroient au bout de 5 m. Le Col. B. consentit à se rendre à condition que les officiers garderoient leurs chevaux, leurs armes et leur bagage, et que quelques miliciens et volontaires parmi lesquels étoient le Dr. Chapin et ses maraudes, auroient permission de retourner dans les Etats sur parole. Quand on considéra quelle étoit notre force, on ne sera pas étonné qu'on ait accordé ces conditions immédiatement. Par bonheur pour le Lieut. F. le Col. Clarke arriva en ce moment au galop de Chippawa, et se mit à l'aider à désarmer l'ennemi, le Colonel Hallen, pouvant se montrer, et le seul officier qu'il étoit devant rester avec les hommes. Le Colonel De Haren parut immédiatement après avec les compagnies de flanc du 103e Rég. et l'affaire fut bientôt terminée, en mettant dans nos mains 26 officiers, un canon de 12 lbs. et un de 6, 2 caissons, 2 charriots, et plus de 500 prisonniers, y compris 20 dragons. Si le Col. De Haren ne fut pas arrivé dans cet instant ce grand nombre d'ennemis seroit rendu à 43 soldats du 49e. rég. car tous les arrangements étoient faits avant l'arrivée de cet officier. Les Sauvages se conduisirent bien, ils tuèrent ou blessèrent à l'ennemi durant les escarmouches environ 60 hommes. Nous sommes informés qu'à ce moment que la sommation fut faite, plusieurs des ennemis s'étoient retirés. Le nombre des Sauvages engagés ne passoit pas 50. Ainsi est terminée une victoire où il n'y a pas eu de sang répandu de notre côté. Si l'officier choisi pour être prisonnier des dépêches annonçant la défaite de l'ennemi, doit s'attendre à être promu et récompensé, nous ne pouvons douter que l'auteur de ce brillant exploit ne reçoive de son souverain la faveur à laquelle ses services lui donnent un si juste droit, lui qui, comme nous croyons, n'a pour protecteur que son mérite distingué.
