Ballard string blend: Springsteen's British clone?

Russ Ballard INTO THE FIRE (EPIC-CBS)

Since leaving the English heavy-metal outfit, Argent, in 1974, Russ Ballard, a vocalist and lead guitar man has had a few notable, if unspectacular, solo albums. Back to a group concept with INTO THE FIRE, the new sidemen are called the Barnet Dogs — drummer, bassman and two backing vocalists. The addition of the added vocal power is an indication that Ballard is searching for a mellower sound than is generally found in bands he's been associated with. The blend on this album results in a sound similar to that of Brit second-liners such as Wishbone Ash or Thin Lizzy. Russ Ballard still bends the strings with all of the flash and sparks that made Argent so dynamic, and his songwriting in places moves beyond the simplistic three-chorders to even include clever metaphor, as on "Madman", an extended metaphor for the figure of the rock musician. A Stones feel on "Tonight" is coaxed out by the "She's just a dance away" repeat on the chorus, recalling one of Mick & Co.'s big songs from LET IT BLEED, "Gimme Shelter".

"Strangers" is a distinct change of pace — a song that reveals Russ Ballard's writing as having a multitude of influences from Motown to Nashville — all played with the love of the big guitar sound that once identified Argent. If Bruce Springsteen has a clone working Over 'Ome it has to be Russ Ballard.

Doc Holliday (A&M)

Their namesake is a reminder that bands like Doc Holliday are like the old-time gunfighters — they're on the road a lot, each one as good as his current reputation, occasionally they tote twin six-guns, and they all want to blow away the band with the most popularity. Doc Holliday is obviously out to capture the adulation afforded Skynyrd, the Allmans and the other southern despera-

does. They have the required guitar tandem, and lots of the brash savage fare that spells success for the magnolia-rockers. Hailing from Macon, Georgia, Doc Holliday began as a bar band called "Roundhouse" in 1971 and have matured into the current five-man lineup just recently. With five vocalists, the two guitarists and a keyboard man, backed by the customary rhythm complement, Doc Holliday has been touring with Bob Seger and Ted Nugent on their southern swings. The influences of the former's raspy vocals and the latter's guitar madness may be heard on several of Doc Holliday's selections. "The Way You Do" sounds as if the Silver Bullet Band might be doing it, and on a couple of cuts the intertwined guitars owe much to the excitement of Nugent's frantic playing. On the closing track, "I'm A Rocker", we are reminded that even the southern strain of pop music is but a fraction of the whole pie that is rock and roll — Doc Holliday carves out a fair slice of that pie on their debut album.

Nana Mouskouri COME WITH ME (GRAND)

It's a bit like hearing that Pete Seeger has been chosen to play lead banjo with the Rolling Stones, but Nana Mouskouri goes slightly Nashville with the release of her umpteenth album. The internationally-known chanteuse with the pristine, slightly-accented voice, wisely chooses not to adopt a "Hi-y'all" affectation for the 10 selections on COME WITH ME. Songs like the title cut, and the beautiful David Gates song, "If", are treated the way Anne Mur-

ray or Kenny Rogers might approach them. Certainly Mouskouri has pipes that could blast out half-a-dozen country belles vocally, and she works well with such established studio names as Larry Butler (piano and producer), Jerry Carrigan, and Bill Justis doing the string arrangements. The inclusion of an Eric Carmen song, "Love Is All That Matters" shades Mouskouri's work over toward MOR, but the voice that has thrilled so many international audiences is the central focus as usual. This Nashville venture might prove successful in widening the already extensive appeal of Nana Mouskouri.

Human Sexual Response FIGURE 14 (CAPITOL)

The last band out of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts took the name of its largest city and injected the rock business with liberal doses of sophisticated, basement-crafted music. The latest assembly of Bostonians takes a phrase from a sociology book for its name, spices its lyrics with clever comments on humanity and society, while playing in the current mode of New Wave experimentalism. Human Sexual Response is a surprisingly efficient, and musically capable seven-member pop group. Using such elementary foolery as the old Dick and Jane primer they have tongues firmly in cheek as they work through the droll "Dick and Jane" with its cryptic sexual message. The harmonies and the melody of "Jackie Onassis" add to the cynical eye to the news pages owned by Larry Bangor. 1966's raver "Cool Jerk" is wedged in among such bizarre items as "What Does Sex Mean To Me" and "Anne Frank Story". If Human Sexual Response can tone down the esoteric lyric content of their outrageous songs, they will win a far greater audience — for now, they will doubtless have an avid following among the set that favours what David Bowie and his imitators do for rock and roll.

Emotions blend in Smith & Nielsen's Moments

There's a lot of acting in duets featuring a man and a woman. Unless they're lovers, the song's emotional intensity is strictly a matter of performance, not real feelings.

Occasionally a performance becomes reality, because the singers have a personal relationship off stage. Such is the case with R. Harlan Smith and Chris Nielsen.

Smith and Nielsen have successful solo careers, but their duet album, Stolen Moments (Royalty Records; R2000-37), has achieved greater popularity than their solo efforts.

"There's a lot more reason for us to pursue the duo situation right now," says Smith. "Both the industry and the public like what we're doing."

Bev Munro's composition, Stolen Moments, reached number one on RPM Magazine's national country chart. Both the single and the album received nominations for last year's Big Country Awards, and Smith & Nielsen were nominated in the Top Duo or Group category. They also received a Juno Award nomination for Country Group of the Year.

"My feelings are that I prefer working as a duo," says Nielsen. "It's more fun. It's where most of our success has been."

Although Smith & Nielsen perform weak renditions of Knee Deep in Loving You, Every Time Two Fools Collide and Lover Please, the contrasting power of Stolen Moments, Meant To Be and You've Got It All Wrong is intriguing.

They not only blend their voices; they blend their emotions. Their singing produces vibrations between the two artists which overcome the impersonal setting of a recording studio. The essence of good country music is reality, and reality is the essence of Smith & Nielsen's performance on those three songs.

"Chris and I enjoy singing together," says 41-year-old Smith. "We enjoy each other in many ways. We feel comfortable together. It's not an unharmonious situation at any level of our lives."

The couple are proud parents of an infant daughter, Cody Nielsen-Smith, so they

face the problem of balancing careers and family life.

"We won't prostitute our personal lives for the sake of our careers," Smith says emphatically. But besides being a singer, he's president of Edmonton's Royalty Records, so his career has variety.

"I'll take Cody on the road," says 25-year-old Nielsen. "But I'm not going to be running around the country playing bars. I don't want to be on the road for great stretches at a time."

Smith is also president of the management company which handles Nielsen's career. He says she'll take worthwhile engagements that pay good money; otherwise, she'll stay home. Nielsen nods in agreement.

"We'll do things that'll be good for us and the (country music) industry," Smith adds. "We'll assess everything from both sides of the coin."

Despite the popularity of the duo, neither entertainer plans to abandon their solo career. Besides a new duet album this year, both artists will record and perform individually.

"Personally, I want to take a crack at just being the best country singer there is," Smith says. "I've been preparing myself mentally and vocally for that push." To that end, he's just released a new single, After the Fire Goes Out, written by Stu Mitchell.

"I don't want anymore children," Nielsen says emphatically. "I wanted one child, but I also want a career."

If Smith & Nielsen get their love for each other into a powerful song, there's every chance they could have a monster hit on their hands.

Bluebell dances across the mind

Trust conquers all fear

When I was young it was not Peter Pan that entranced me but The Little Minister, and all because of Babbie. I could never put this girl out of my adolescent mind and would think again and again of Sir James Barrie's description of her as, "as gleam of color, a gypsy elf, a twig of rowan berries stuck carelessly in her black hair."

During my growing up years I would picture her singing softly, her body swaying gently as she danced up Windyghoul toward the fascinated, bewildered young clergyman. As I matured, she retreated into the recesses of my mind and did not emerge until I saw Bluebell Phillips.

It was early on a June morning, in the cafeteria of Carlton University where I was attending a convention of the Canadian Author's Association, that glancing up from my coffee I saw Bluebell and remembered Babbie. Bluebell almost danced into that dining room, humming a little tune to herself and, in lieu of rowan berries, long pastel earrings hung to her shoulders like a series of colored gumdrops.

There is some parallel to their stories as well as to their appearance. Bluebell Stewart Phillips was born far from the Scottish moors in the village of Rosthern, then the NWT. She grew up to become a school teacher but had taught only a month when she waltzed into the life of the young Gordon Phillips, the Anglican student minister at Big River, nine miles away.

They eloped and were married the following August. They combined their honeymoon with the minister's annual visits to his parishioners who were spread over some hundred miles.

"I rode a pack horse and after 25 miles when we arrived at the forestry cabin where we were to spend the first night, I was in such agony that I cried over the canned beans and bologna Gordon prepared for our honeymoon supper."

She told me that after supper her husband had tucked her most tenderly into

the bottom bunk and climbing wearily into the top one had immediately fallen into an exhausted sleep. "I returned from the honeymoon as virginal as I left," she said with a roguish look.

In 1926 she and her husband came to Montreal where they lived quite happily in a basement apartment. Gordon Phillips attended University and worked in a restaurant on St. Lawrence Main while Bluebell took on a series of random jobs. She played piano for ballet classes, worked briefly at a cosmetic counter and held two positions as church organist, one in Arundel in the Laurentians and the other in Campbell's Bay above Ottawa.

The Reverend Phillips eventually became chaplain at Bordeaux Jail. His wife wryly points out that at that time they spent half of their lives in jail and the other half in church. Both had undaunted faith in their fellow creatures and more often than not, had one or two discharged convicts as guests in their home until these people were able to find a place in the current scheme of things.

As a widow Bluebell's trust still conquers all fear. On one occasion, driving alone from Ottawa to Montreal about midnight, she picked up two bearded and bearded youths hitchhiking their way to Montreal. When I questioned her about the wisdom of such a gesture she told me airily that whenever she attempted to help a fellow traveller she felt that it was up to God to look after her. He always has.

As well as teacher, pianist, organist and short term cosmetic clerk, this lady has for years been a prolific writer of stories for children, poetry and fiction. She is an active member of the Canadian Author's Association and has served as president of its Montreal Branch. She will be well remembered in Sherbrooke for her weekly Book Page presented every Saturday in The Sherbrooke Daily Record some years ago.

Although she claims to have been lost in Paris, London, Edinburgh, Trinidad and

Vancouver her present and permanent home is in Montreal. She has two daughters, many grandchildren and one great-grandson.

After meeting Bluebell Phillips it is not her talent and abundant literary output

that remains with one, but the Babbie-like quality with which she dances across the mind, humming, swaying, gumdrop earrings sparkling. I paraphrase the old dominie who wrote of the Egyptian, "To think of her is still to be young."

Paul et Paul take life with a dose of laughter

Paul et Paul get off on the wacky humour of Monty Python. So it comes as no surprise that they emulate the British group's irreverence for social convention.

Like the Pythonic comedy approach, Paul et Paul shows do not leave audiences apathetic. Apparently some find their closing sketch on cancer (in which one of the three Pauls is expected to succumb to

the dread disease) an exercise in bad taste. But as two of the three Pauls made clear in a conversation over Grand Marnier, patate frites and yellow jello earlier this week, the Quebec comedy team chooses to meet life's ups and downs with a slightly bent sense of humour. If they help spectators to a similar vision of the world, fine. But it's a take it or leave it proposition. *See PAUL, Page 4*

Icare: Explosive, complex, inaccurate

In preparation for *Icare*, which was staged at the Centre culturel last Saturday afternoon, our son read and discussed with us stories relating to Theseus, Daedalus, the Labyrinth and Icarus himself. Excited by the tales, he was primed for the show. We had no idea that author Roland Lepage and the Theatre national pour enfants Les Pissenlits would be inventing a story of their own.

Theatrically, the performance by the six-member troupe was fascinating. Wearing black on a blackened stage, four or five of the actors, each carrying two white panels, very successfully conveyed the almost humanly sinister complexity of the Labyrinth, a maze built by Daedalus which constantly changed and blocked his and his son Icarus' escape. The Minotaur appeared explosively as a booming voice and a flash of red light, stage right.

It was a little too frightening for some of the younger children who were carried from the Grande Salle crying, but the older ones were positively electrified. The flight of Icarus was achieved with the black light technique. Luminous wings flew amongst glowing birds, clouds, dancing and singing stars that formed various constellations and finally too close to the sun.

But, in the Lepage version, Icarus' adventures continued after his fall. A huge blue and white sheet, kept constantly in motion, formed the surface of the sea. Icarus awoke to giggling, jumping fish and curious bikinied water spirits. The spirits saved him from a gigantic octopus and, with their help, he was carried back to his father inside the mouth of a squeaky, opaque whale.

If our son hadn't known his classics, he would have been thoroughly delighted. But his skepticism began when the Minotaur threatened to devour Icarus. He knew that Daedalus and Icarus were imprisoned in the Labyrinth after contributing to the Minotaur's death. Although he was impressed by the theatrics, he gave a running

criticism.

"Icarus flew too close to the sun - the sun didn't come too close to him."

"He drowned in the sea." "There wasn't any octopus or whale."

What can you expect from a chip off the old critical block?

Still there is a point to accuracy. These legends are the foundations of western art and literature. Why mess them up in the minds of children? They are surely exciting enough in the original.

Stir Crazy

Stir Crazy, which, due to popular demand, will be staying on for another week at the Capitol, is far from a great film but it's bound to tickle your funny bone. Don't go to see it expecting an airtight story. Bruce Jay Friedman's script is full of logical loopholes, unprepped plot pivots and even dense dialogue. But if you're prepared to forgive and forget these shortcomings, the comic, crazy antics of Gene Wilder and Richard Pryor make it worth while.

Directed by Sidney Poitier, *Stir Crazy* is about a pair of show-biz hopefuls (Wilder is the naive optimistic playwright, Pryor, a street-wise, pessimistic actor) who have had it with the Big Apple and strike out for Hollywood. Stranded in middle America, they get framed for a bank robbery because of their woodpecker costumes (a

publicity gag to make a buck) and end up in the slammer for 125 years. Going crazy in stir, they find an out when Wilder is discovered to have hidden talents as a cowboy. The excitement of a rodeo between two rival prisons provides the

background for their escape.

There's no question that the situations devised by Friedman are themselves ludicrous but what Pryor and Wilder, two masters of improvisation, do with them is amazing.

In their first show, Paul et Paul played the ushers in the theatre; in the second, the emcees. But, worn out by hundreds of performances, two records and a year's sabbatical that saw Serge Theriault free-lancing on kids'

shows and soap operas, Jacques Grise writing (for "Croc", a Quebec humor mag) and painting (his living room pink), and Claude Meunier co-authoring "Les Voisins" and "Broue", their current show is more laid back. Emerging from the hospital, the three basic Pauls

appear on stage in their bathrobes unable to perform. Instead they invite other characters in their midst to fill in for them. The people they create (all three are involved in the writing) are exaggerations of familiar figures invested with the Paulistic perception of underlying contradictions - like the security guard whose authority belies a cowardly streak.


A pair of Pauls, the burly, hairy Jacques and the absent Claude, kicked off their kibbutzing career in college. Serge, who joined them four and a half years ago to capitalize on the free-flowing affluence of Olympic tourists, is still not a full-fledged Paul, Grise jokes. "He's just on an extended audition."

The Olympic days were a rush. Les trois Pauls found themselves playing Place des Arts. But when those two heady weeks came to an end, they had to pay their dues. They've moved from church basements to small clubs and back to PDA. Before taking the third show on tour, the Pauls had a three-week engagement at Montreal's Comedie Nationale (formerly le Patriote) and are performing at Theatre Arlequin before coming to the Centre culturel next Tuesday.

Because their humour is steeped in verbal associations, Serge and Jacques foresee some obstacles for the non-francophone spectator. But the Pauls feel their absurdist characterizations of everyday types, like the insurance salesman with the speedy sales pitch, are universally understood. And there's an added bonus for those who make the effort - one of their most popular numbers, featuring a short, ugly corporal (Claude Meunier), is actually a five-minute silent striptease.

Genty marionettes make return trip for the younger set

After the splendid, unique presentation of animation and marionette theatre by the Philippe Genty Company just a year ago at the Centennial Theatre, we were not alone in wishing for the puppeteers' speedy return.

It may be of little consolation to the adults among us, but school children in the Townships English sector will be the lucky beneficiaries of a second visit from the four-member troupe next Thursday, thanks to the Cultural Awareness Programme.

Organized and co-ordinated by Ann MacLaren, this programme aims, among other things, to provide English Townships children with exposure to French language and

culture outside the school environment. Usually those invited to give workshop-demonstrations come from Quebec and other parts of Canada. But the undeniable appeal of Genty's art, combined with his clearly spoken French, was sufficient reason to engage the European company which is in the midst of a North American tour.

Genty formed his own company in 1967, after a four-year trip doing research on marionettes the world over, which resulted in a film for UNESCO. The themes for his scenarios are both universal and particular to the individual character - for example, the powerful Pierrot number in which the puppet severs his strings, preferring suicide to manipulation. Slapstick

and satiric humour play a large role too and music is integral to the skits. Using all kinds of puppetry - from stringed marionettes to hand puppets to black light techniques - Genty has created an international language with his art.

Ann MacLaren is particularly pleased that next week's two sessions will take place on the campus of the Universite de Sherbrooke, at the Centre culturel. Its 'grande salle', the Salle Maurice O'Bready, is the major theatre in the Townships but is not regularly frequented by most members of the English community. Ms. MacLaren sees this as an excellent way of introducing a new generation of theatre-goers to facilities available in their own area.

Approximately 2000 students from the Eastern

Townships Regional, St. Francis Elementary and Lennoxville District School Boards will attend the two performances.

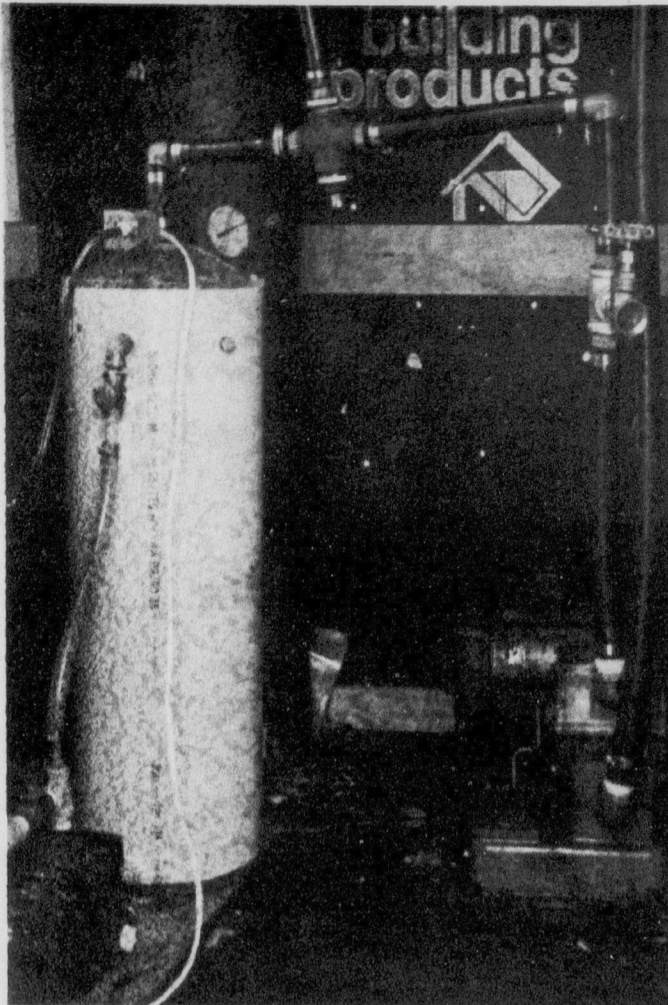

Pipeline vs horses

Syrup taste varies from bush to bush

The assignment was a sweet one... get myself lost among the sugarbushes and steam-clouded sugar shacks nestled throughout these Eastern Townships and don't come back until I have a story on the 1981 season and the old versus the new.

We visited warm slopes where sap was running in a stream and where sugar makers hoped for cool weather to prolong

the season. We clamored up muddy hills and bumped over rocks and through fields and pastures only to find another sugar maker located on a cold slope praying for warmer weather so his pipelines or buckets would finally bear some sap. We visited bucket bushes and pipeline installations, mountainous hillsides where the horses must be half mountain goat to manoeuvre the sugar roads and other

woodlots where the ground is so flat it's like a parkland and squirrels and chipmunks scamper right under your feet.

It would be difficult to make a choice of the best sugar bush or sugar maker in the E.T. Syrup quality depends on weather, cleanliness, and the expertise of an experienced sugar-maker. Taste can vary from neighbor to neighbor, or there may be little difference. There are old-timers who wouldn't have a pipeline in their bush. And more modern makers who swear by the pipeline system.

According Laurent Coiteux of 3B Farms in Cowansville, sugar maker for over 50 years and a pipeline convert, some flavor is lost, especially the first run of sap. "We clean the lines in the spring with a solution of Javex and water, and that first run is generally not fit for the table trade."

Darcy Harrison, located behind Bury at Hardwood Flats, explained the pipeline system was best suited to cooler weather. "As soon as the sun hits those miles of plastic pipe, the quality of the sap begins to deteriorate," he explained. The weather has been good so far for this operation which is a partnership between father and son, Doug. "Another five degrees warmer and the syrup will be darker and the taste will change." The Harrisons tapped 4,500 trees this year and will eventually run the pipelines to 6,000.

Pipeline systems, in which a vacuum pump sucks the sap into holding tanks, are becoming more and more common. But, again, differences in opinion and preference can be side by side in neighboring lots. One operator will run a vacuum at 20 pounds pressure, another at 15 or 16, both claim the same results and neither have seen damage to trees or a diminishing yield of sap.

Evaporator equipment has undergone some drastic changes during the past 20 years as well. Remember the days of the cast iron kettle hung on a tripod of young saplings, the boiling sap flavored with bits of wood and tiny charred embers from the fire? It took some nervous miles and

finger chewing before we found one for this story. But in a corner of the E.T. called Lost Nation, near Sawyerville, Reiner Lowry still has the kettle and uses it for sugar parties. But in the same yard is a spanking new sugar camp, boasting an evaporator system of the latest design. Completed this year, the rig will boil 500 gallons of sap per hour, and when the fire is right and the sap is good, can deliver up to 30 gallons of syrup per day. Evaporator pans, with 20" sides and flues which go down into the fire nearly the same distance, covered with stainless steel pre-heater hoods which help to condense steam and keep the sap hotter, stood about 10 feet high in the camp. Hooked to them by pipelines was a smaller stove where the final boiling occurs. Here was an outfit costing in the neighborhood of \$15,000 and backed up by a pipeline system which will eventually tie in 12,000 trees.

"The systems with the pre-heater hoods have been around about 20 years," Reiner Lowry explained. "We have made sugar at home for a number of years, but the camp was old and the pans not too good so we ended up finishing the syrup at home in the rumpus room. Mymom finally put her foot down this year, so we decided to go whole hog and build a camp and install equipment that would handle as much as we could tap.

"As soon as you install pipelines, your sap yield almost doubles, and if your boiling system was just adequate before, then you're in trouble." Lowry is prepared for any eventuality with a 4,000 gallon holding tank for sap and another tank of the same size planned for next year.

"When you see sap running on the ground because your facilities can't meet the demand, then it's a heartbreaker... the season is so short, cost of setting up so high, you mustn't lose a drop if you're going to make money."

But these are the big boys, who plan on the sugar operation to bolster their annual budget and give them work at a slack time in the farmer's calendar. There are dozens



The snarl of plastic pipeline connects the trees to the pumphouse to boiling systems.

of smaller operators, tapping a few hundred trees, using old-fashioned methods, who sell a few gallons but mainly make syrup enough for their family and friends. Most of these boast of no new equipment, but instead spin yarns of family cooperation in the sugar venture, and tell of the fun and good times they have, camping out and having parties in the old sugar shanty. Equipment can be anything from an old kitchen range rescued from someone's dump to oil drums split in half and a grate installed to hold various shaped pans for the boiling sap. One gentleman near Frelighsburg boils enough syrup on the family barbecue in the backyard to keep his family sweet year round, and sap is carried by father and several sons from trees tapped along the roadside and on his lot. Here, cost is not a factor either in the equipment or the syrup, and the greatest regard is the syrup on the table when the city cousins arrive to taste and compliment.

But the maple syrup industry in the Townships stands tall beside other industries which make up the agricultural economy. Two maple products plants are located in Sherbrooke where syrup is refined, sugared or the maple flavor extracted to be re-bottled and sold off the grocers' shelves. Fancy quality table syrup which meets the very highest standards in color and flavor is a luxury

item found in the best gift shops and at souvenir counters. Here prices can run from \$3.50 for a four-ounce crock to \$14. for the same amount in western Canada. Prices for table syrup in the Townships this year are holding steady at between \$18 and \$24 for a gallon and \$2.25 to \$3.50 for a pint can, which contains approximately 19 ounces. Roadside stands are always a bit more expensive than buying at the camp, and supermarkets are sometimes a little less than the roadside stands.

Quality and flavor depend in large part on the expertise of the sugar-maker but variations can be caused when old, dark-colored buckets are used, evaporator pans have been burned or even so slight a thing as a gathering tub not properly cleaned from the previous year. Cleanliness is at the top of the list of importance but quality can be affected by holding the sap too long before boiling, a sudden rise in the temperature or as some experts explain, a change in the barometric pressure, the altitude above sea level of the bush, the amount of moisture in the ground and the sweetness of the sap. The sap must be boiled quickly once in the pans, and dilly-dallying by the fireman could change the quality and flavor. As for any difference in the quality of the flavor, oldtimers who gather sap in buckets and use the older-type pans claim theirs is best. Modern sugar operations where pipe lines and pre-

heater hoods are used claim their quality is better. The sugar-maker on the cold side of the mountain will argue his syrup is better than his neighbor's on the warm side, but these arguments are more traditional than accurate. Precise attention to every detail and the expertise that comes with age and experience make the best sugar-makers.

So my tour comes to an end. Precipitous hills, covered with mushy snow and ice, ruts through mudholes much too deep for

the average passenger car, and too much tasting resulting in the annual spring purge running on for a week or more and a half eaten jar of sour pickles on the seat of the car all attest to the vigor and enthusiasm this story was given. But, difficulties aside, the sound of sap dripping into a bucket, and the muted thunder of boiling sap in an evaporator is the music of a new spring. Maple syrup is the first crop the farmer takes from his land each year and how sweet it is.

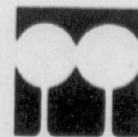

Music

Speaking of STARMANIA, this rock opera comes to the Centre culturel March 28 and 29, with two shows for each date. A collaboration by French composer Michel Berger and well-known Quebec lyricist Luc Plamondon (he pens most of Workman's and Diane Dufresne's songs), Starmania was first a hit in Paris before its revitalization in Montreal recently. Three of the original stars - Louise Forestier, Gilles Valiquette and France Castel - will be in the touring edition. Olivier Reichenbach, a theatrical director whose most recent credit is the Opera de Montreal's staging of *Così fan Tutte*, is responsible for the direction in this Quebec version. The story concerns a street gang called "Les Etoiles Noires" and their target, a politically influential businessman. A number of subplots provide the background for Starmania's by now well-known songs (like "Blues du Businessman", "Underground Cafe", "Le Monde Est Stone"). If you are thinking about attending this popular show, don't put off your decision too long, you'll have to settle for poor seats or none at all. Tickets are \$14, \$15 and \$16.

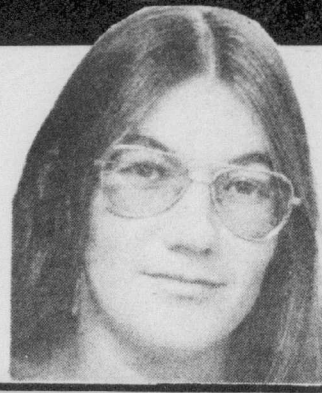

One of the greatest plays in the contemporary French-language repertoire *LES BONNES* (THE MAIDS), written by the legendary author Jean Genet, is at Place des Arts' theatre-cafe de la place to April 24. Inspired by a notorious incident which took place in a small French provincial town, *Les Bonnes* concerns two sisters (Louise Marleau and Christiane Raymond) both model servants who, consumed by a raging fury, murder their employer (Helen Loiselle, who appeared in *Les Voisins* recently.)

Les Bonnes, Genet's first play, contained so strong a denunciation of society that it created quite a scandal when it was first staged in 1942. It will be presented in French Monday to Thursday at 20:30 (\$5), Friday and Saturday at 19:30 and 22:00 (\$6) until April 24.

As part of the "Canada in the 30s: Culture and Politics" symposium, several prominent writers will speak on a number of interesting topics like "Social Theatre in the '30s". Exhibitions

CONTEMPORARY AMERICAN DRAWINGS, an impressive collection of 51 works from the Smithsonian Institute in Washington (chosen from over 1000 submissions by about 500 American artists), fill the Grand Hall of the Centre culturel until March 22. These drawings reflect all the styles employed by U.S. artists today, from figurative and realistic to experimental abstract works. The Grand Hall is accessible Monday to Saturday, 9:00 to

22:00 and Sunday from 13:00 to 22:00.

The engravings and drawings of ROBERT SAVOIE, done between 1975 and 1980, are in the Galerie d'art du Centre culturel for the same period. The Galerie is open Monday to Friday from 12:30 to 17:00 and Tuesday, Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 20:00 to 22:00.

Artifacts representing the culture of the NASKAPI PEOPLE (from a collection of Lynn Ross's in Magog) will be on exhibit at the Bishop's-Champlain Art Gallery until March 24. The Naskapi people are in transition from a nomadic life in the sub-arctic climate of northern Quebec to life near the modern iron-ore mining community of Schefferville where they have been since 1956. The display introduces visitors to the artistic ability of a proud people in producing articles still used today (such as bone scrapers in preparing caribou hides). Hours at the gallery (in the Marjorie Donald Building) are Monday to Friday from 10:00 to 15:00 and Wednesday evening from 19:00 to 22:00.

The Centre d'exposition Leon Marcotte (222 Frontenac) has on display part of the Musee du Seminaire art collection. Among the works to be seen are a series of prints by RODOLPHE DUGUAY (1891-1973), drawings by EDMOND J. MASSICOTTE (1875-1938), who was illustrator for "Le Monde Illustre", an early 20th century paper, and an oil painting entitled "Montreal" by ADRIEN HEBERT (1890-1967). Hours at the Centre Marcotte are Tuesday to Sunday, 12:30 to 17:00 with extended hours to 21:00 on Wednesday. There's a token admission of 50 cents for adults, 25 cents for students. Admission is free on Saturdays. The exhibit ends April 5.

Beginning Sunday, the Musee Beaulne in Coaticook presents an exhibit relating to pontifical zouaves entitled, "Aime Dieu et va ton chemin". This French corps organized at Rome in 1860 to defend the Pope was disbanded 11 years later. On display right through to July 10 will be photographs, uniforms and documents.

The sketches of BRUNO COTE, done during a trip to western Canada, can be seen in the lobby of the Rothman's Building near the King Shopping Centre until April 11. Hours are weekdays from 8:30 to noon and 13:30 to 16:30.

RICHARD SYLVESTRE, who caused a bit of local flurry with his last exhibition because of some Dali prints, has another "expo-vente" going at the Auberge Cheribourg near Mont Orford until March 31. Some 15 paintings are being displayed but only 13 of these are for sale — the other two are headed for an international art 'grand prix' in Montreux, Switzerland.

The paintings of LUC ST-JACQUES can be seen in the reading room of the Bibliotheque municipale until March 27. Hours are 10 to 12 and 13:00 to 17:30, Monday to Friday as well as 19:00 to 21:00 on Monday, Thursday and Friday nights and 9 to 16:00 on Saturdays.

Movies

STIR CRAZY and THE MOUNTAIN MEN are held over for a second week at the Capitol Theatre. See review for details.

If you enjoyed the French comedy hit *LA CAGE AUX FOLLES*, chances are you'll be delighted with its sequel, *CAGE II*, beginning at the Cinema du Carrefour this week. Unlike most sequels, this one apparently does justice to its predecessor. Ugo Tognazzi and Michel Serrault again portray the French-Italian aging homosexual couple. Only this time domestic capers take a back seat to comic intrigue, with secret agents and Italian peasants providing a macho contrast to the lovable gays.

It's certainly a better alternative than *MY BLOODY VALENTINE*, the English movie at the Carrefour this week. Using the same tired formula, Valentine is the latest 'Canadian' attempt to capitalize on the gratuitous-violence-against-helpless-women film market. The best way to discourage the production of more of these films is to boycott those already in circulation.

Wacky Robin Williams stars as POPEYE, the one-eyed spinach-eating sailor, in Robert Altman's latest film. Popeye's stringy sweetheart is portrayed by a fine actress, Shelley Duvall, and Sweet Pea by Altman's grandson. Written by Jules Pfeiffer, this carved-in-the-flesh comedy based on cartoon characters engaged in an interesting struggle between good and evil is as entertaining for adults as children. It is played at the Newport Cinema this week. Remember to call the border theatre (802-334-2749) in case of last-minute changes, as happened last week. There are matinees on the weekend at 13:30, shows at 19:00 and 21:00 tonight to Sunday and a 19:30 from Monday to Thursday.

LE TAMBOUR, the French version of *THE TIN DRUM*, is an extraordinary coup of cinematography and acting. Golden Palm award winner as best foreign film at the 1980 Cannes Festival, Volken Schloendorff's cinematic version of the famous Gunter Grass novel also shared the top prize at the 1979 World Film Festival in Montreal. 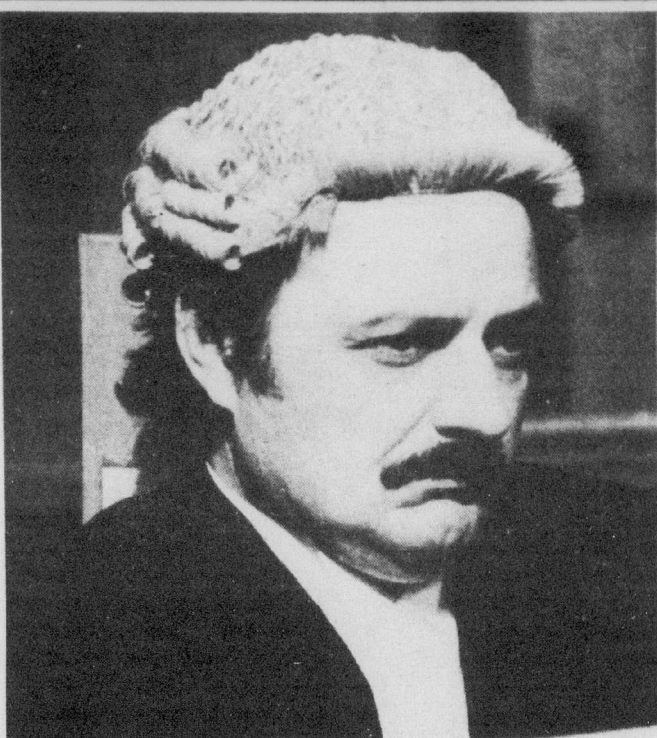

1980 Piggery season successful

NORTH HATLEY — The Piggery Theatre's 1980 season was the most successful to date, treasurer Roger Robert told the playhouse annual general meeting on Saturday, February 28. Robert's financial statement and auditor's report indicated total audience of 9,400 people attended presentations of Rogers and Hart, *Catch Me If You Can*, *Sarah Binks*, and *The Divine Sarah*. The greatly increased box-office, accompanied by the concerted fund raising efforts of the board have helped to place the Piggery in a very healthy financial position. Continued community support will be required in 1981 to sustain these efforts.

In accordance with Article 65 of the current Quebec government regulations, the name of the Townships Playhouse Guild was officially changed to Le Theatre Piggery Inc.-The Piggery Theatre Inc.

Following this the Board of Directors for 1981 was nominated. Directors are: Jeanne Mulhall, president; Sally Provencher and Marlis Wehr, vice-presidents; Carole Gattiker, recording secretary; Emily LeBaron, corresponding secretary; Roger Robert, secretary, Joey LeBaron, Iris Hunting, John Dawson, Gill Cote, Anne Beaulieu, Michel Krauss, Sigrid Wehr, Doug Martin, Andrew Fleming and Lewis Evans.

In her annual report, Jeanne Mulhall, president, thanked on behalf of the board Charles Murdoch, past artistic director and Claire Hopkinson, past general manager for their tireless efforts during their tenure at the Piggery. Both are now resident in Toronto, involved in the theatre community there.

Mulhall then commented on the proposed dining room

expansion programme at the Piggery. Mary Robinson's country suppers have long been an attraction of the theatre. A most generous donation of funds slated expressly for expansion of the dining room facilities was made to the theatre in 1980. An architect's plan was secured, but zoning by-laws for the space grew so complicated, that the proposal was eventually abandoned.

John Corbett, a native of Knowlton, and founder of a repertory theatre in Mexico, was introduced as artistic director. His plans for the 1981 season begin with *Deathtrap*, Ira Levin's hit thriller. Corbett hopes to present the best in theatre to the Piggery audiences, and plans to premier an English translation of a Quebec play each summer, in conjunction with the French speaking theatres of the Eastern Townships.

Jane Buss, who until recently was director of public relations with Festival Lennoxville, has been appointed as general manager, and spoke briefly concerning the 1981 budget, and the Piggery's status regarding funding from Quebec. Although the Piggery has never been funded by the province, meetings are currently in session with the Conseil de la culture de l'estrie, and every effort is being made to fulfill the requirements of this programme.

Richard Gillam of the North Hatley Curling Club, and a member of the general public in attendance at the meeting, spoke to the meeting of the need of community inter-involvement, a feeling strongly endorsed by all members present. As a community based theatre, the Piggery resolved to pursue all avenues to keep community involvement alive and flourishing.

New career beckons Jaclyn Smith

New York—After five glorious years on-the-air, 'Charlie's Angels' took a giant step closer to syndication when ABC announced recently that the show would be removed from the schedule and put on 'hiatus.' The sexy private-eye series plummeted in the ratings due to a combination of inferior scripting and bad scheduling. Which is all well and good as far as Jaclyn Smith is concerned. Charlie's last original 'Angel' had told producers Aaron Spelling and Leonard Goldberg months ago that this would be her last year with the show, no matter what transpired.

Being the classy lady she is, Jaclyn praised Tanya Roberts, the newest and perhaps the last 'Angel' ever, and defended the show's content. "Tanya fits in well and is a very honest person. She doesn't say something just to fit into your lifestyle. We may be at opposite poles in how we approach things, but I like her very much," Jaclyn said. She added, "I only wish people would stop and look at our shows because they have some substance. We are given the opportunity to take chances and explore our characterizations. If we mess up, we usually have a few more takes to work things out."

Bright future

While Jaclyn is committed to lensing a few more episodes before her contractual obligations to the show are fulfilled, she is already sifting ever-so-carefully through a plethora of scripts, one or more of which could make her a motion picture star.

Is Jackie looking for work in a specific film genre? "I'd love to do a love story or a comedy. I've never done one of those before. Although, I'm happy I did make 'Nightkill,' which was a dramatic role, because I had to experience every emotion. I'm scheduled to make a movie based on the life of Gene Tierney and the script is being rewritten at the moment. Quite frankly, I'd like to take two months off before I do anything," Jaclyn remarked, alluding to the grueling pace associated with making 'Charlie's Angels.' Jackie also mentioned that she'd like to do a Broadway musical, make more TV flicks and maybe even another TV series, perhaps a sit-com, somewhere down the line.

Although she has the opportunity to make feature films, Jaclyn admits that many of the roles are reflections of her 'Angels' character, Kelly Garrett. Jaclyn offered, "Yes, I've been typecast, but I'm an optimist. And I hope that I never think that I lost out on something because I



was an 'Angel.' Sure, I have some insecurities as an actress, but I'd like to keep growing."

The gorgeous star is also very self-conscious about her image. Despite some of the negative things that have been written about her as of late, Miss Smith still believes that most of her fans see her as being old-fashioned. "I think they do perceive of me, of who I am... conservative and old-fashioned. I think they also see me as a homebody... not outspoken either. Physically? It's hard to say. I guess sophisticated. That's the way I'll look in

my 'Epris' [a new scent she's pushing for Max Factor] commercials," Jaclyn speculated.

Toward the end, when asked what kind of things she likes to do in her spare time, Jackie pointed out that she enjoys staying at home, decorating her new home, and watching movies.

So there you have it—the real Jaclyn Smith is a sincere, hard working, glamour girl from down Texas-way who is about to make the great leap into motion pictures.
