AGRICULTURE.

With a view to the encouragement of Agriculture, Societies have been formed in nearly every County of Canada, which the Government have greatly aided by annual grants of funds. Shows of stock, grain, and general produce, with a variety of other objects of industry, are held generally twice a year in each County, besides a Provincial Show annually in each section of the Province, at which are exhibited a great variety of productions of Agriculture, Manufactures, Artistical Industry, &c., and from which the most commendable are selected for prizes. Under the auspices of the Bureau of Agriculture and Statistics, a Department recently

incorporated with the Administration of the Province, Agricultural Associations and Boards of Agriculture have been established for both sections of Canada.

There is a Branch Society in nearly every township of each County, in connection with the County Society. Fairs are held by nearly all the Societies in April or May, and in September or October. The dates are not fixed, except in a very few cases, but vary slightly from year to year, according to decision of the Directors. As a general rule the County Fairs are held at the County Towns, and the Township Fairs at the leading Town or Village of the Township.

Besides the above-mentioned amounts the rewere granted to each Provincial Agricultural Association \$ 4000 ; and the Legislature have granted, for 1857, the like sum to each Association, \$80,000 to the County Agricultural Societies, and \$1000 to each of the two Boards of Arts and Manufactures in Canada East and West.

The following extracts are taken from the last Report of the Minister of Agriculture presented to the Legislature in May, 1857 :—

After alluding to the difficulty of collecting correct statistical information with regard to the agricultural produce of the country, in the absence of any statute supplying or authorising the required machinery—an evil severely felt in England and Scotland, but within the last year partially remedied in Scotland—the Minister makes the following approximate estimate of the agricultural produce of the colony for the year 1856 : and having had, as a guide, the census of 1852 and former years, with the trade exports of grain, cattle, &c., and the extent of home consumption of produce of various kinds, the estimate may be considered *very nearly correct*.

In the articles of wheat and flour the exports of 1856 have been far beyond all precedent, viz. :—

being an increase in one year of very nearly 46½ per cent. in the number of bushels.

Allowing 5¼ bushels for the home consumption of each individual in Canada (viz. 2,500,000 souls), the home consumption would be 14,750,000, which, added to the export 9,391,530, gives 24,141,530, to which add the seed, (one bushel for every ten), and the whole produce of wheat in 1856 amounts to 26,555,684 bushels, of 60 lbs. per bushel, or 10 37-60ths bushels for every soul in the province. By the census of 1851-2 the produce per individual in all Canada was 8 58-60ths bushels. The crop of 1851 was 16,155,946, showing an increase in 5 years of 10,399,738 bushels, being over 64½ per cent. in that period.

In the export of barley and rye there is a still greater increase, viz., from 566,534 bushels in 1855, to 989,447 in 1856, being more than 74½ per cent. in one year.

In Indian corn the increase of export exceeds that of wheat or barley, viz., from 73,066 in 1855, to 164,497 in 1856, being 125 per cent.

The export of Indian corn appears to be increasing in a very rapid ratio. In 1853 there were only 831 bushels exported; in 1854 there were 57,636; in 1855, 73,066; and in 1856, 164,495.

In oats the increase of export has exceeded that of every other grain. In 1855 there were 370,275 bushels exported. In 1856, 1,296,677 bushels, an increase of 250 per cent. in one year.

In the article of hops, too, there has been a very great increase, viz. from 43,275 lbs. to 177,260 lbs. In flax seed from 6,072 bushels to 11,879 bushels; and in tobacco a very considerable increase, from 13,730 lbs. to 17,435 lbs.

These are the chief articles under the head of agricultural produce. The vast annual increase in them attests the rapid progress of the country. The *money value* of the agricultural exports of 1856 exceeded that of 1855 by £485,469, notwithstanding the great reduction in the prices during 1856 below those of 1855. As an example: the average price of wheat during 1856 was 6s. 11¼d., whilst during 1855 it was 9s. 3¼d., per bushel of 60 lbs.; and in other grain there was a like disparity of price in favor of 1855.

IMMIGRATION.

There is no subject which can engage the attention of any one interested in the welfare and future progress of Canada so important as that of the Emigration that annually resort to her shores; for upon the increase of her population must depend the due development of her vast resources and the accomplishment of her destiny as a nation in the van of civilization. To attain to this consummation, her great agricultural capabilities, extensive fisheries, hidden minerals, with her natural aids to the establishment of manufactures, and her constantly improving facilities for commerce, all demand the one essential ingredient—human industry;—to raise from these opportunities that Wealth, without which no country, however otherwise blessed, was ever great or respected among nations. But not only is Immigration thus needed; since, for obvious reasons, it is equally necessary, and the highest policy of our Government, to watch its progress, character, and destination—to regulate as well as encourage it: in short, to adopt for it the best scheme of Colonization, for the good of all, that experience and wisdom can devise. Hence it is deemed that the following Tables, giving the immigration of each year from 1831, and the countries whence it came, must possess a general interest.

Dividing the total number of Emigrants arrived from 1831 to 1855 inclusive into five quinquennial periods, we obtain the following numbers—for the first period, 167,218; for the second, 82,568; for the third, 139,704; for the fourth, 221,628; and for the last, 191,404; but notwithstanding that there has been a slight improvement on the whole as to the numbers arrived during the last period, we find that the numbers for the last two years, 1855 and 1856, fall far short of the annual average (31,729) of the whole period embraced by the Return—a disproportion, however, very satisfactorily modified by the increased emigration of the present season.

Mr. Buchanan, the Chief Agent for Emigration, states in his Report for 1856, that the result of the working of the Imperial Passenger Act for 1855, “so far, has on the whole been satisfactory, and would appear to have fulfilled the object of its framers; but it is also evident that it has operated unfavorably on the emigration to this Province, and especially from the Irish ports, by enhancing the price of passage, which formerly averaged £3 10s., to £4 and £5; and I should not omit to observe that the masters of several vessels, who have always heretofore brought out a full complement of passengers, have informed me, that their owners preferred to send them out in ballast, rather than subject them to the increased liability imposed by the Act.” He further shows that this decrease of emigration to Canada applies chiefly if not wholly to the poorest class of emigrants, who, with difficulty procuring the smallest amount of means to cross the Atlantic, take passage to ports of the United States at a lower rate than that charged to Quebec: thus we find that the emigration from Ireland to these ports in 1856 has been equal to an advance of 3 per cent., whilst the direct emigration from the same country to Quebec has fallen off nearly 59 per cent.

But any question or argument suggested by the amount of Emigration to Canada becomes of little moment in comparison with the considerations that arise from a knowledge of the fact, that we retain actually only a moderate proportion of the Emigrants that annually arrive in the Province; for it must be observed that besides those who proceed at once through Canada into the United States, many more, necessarily not noticed in the official returns, seek the same ultimate destination in the course of a few months. This is the evil that requires an early and energetic treatment; and hence arises the important question—Does this untoward distribution appertain to us as an inevitable consequence of some condition or state of circumstances that naturally affects us from our position; or is it owing to some adverse influence—some neglect or want of information; and to which remedial measures are possible and applicable?

No official Returns are now made of the Distribution of the Emigrants; but we abstract from one made for 1848, that 27,939 arrived at Quebec, whose distribution, as near as could be ascertained, was as follows:—

There is no reason to believe that the number here stated to have proceeded directly to the States exceeds the fact, nor, from all that can be inferred of the western tendency of our emigration, that this disproportion has not since been constantly increasing.

Of the Emigration that leaves Europe, for this or any other part of North America, more than three-fourths of the male adults are agricultural and common laborers, whose wages range in this country from about \$10 to \$20 per month, with board and lodging—a rate of remuneration considerably higher than prevails in any European country, and nearly if not quite equal to the wages really paid to the same class in the United States. Nor does Canada present any difficulty in the way of the poorest laborer realizing his long-cherished hope of acquiring land of his own; for, besides the fact that cleared farms are frequently sold, in many situations, at from \$8 to \$30 per acre, inclusive of cost of buildings, &c., and that wild lands are procurable at much lower prices, the Government offer free grants of 100 acres to each male adult upon the performance of certain conditions. Another important and very gratifying fact is that the general sanatory statistics obtained from various countries lead necessarily to the conviction that Canada enjoys a specially favorable climate.—These truths, never yet questioned, should forcibly induce settlement in the Province, and still further promote a desire to participate in the substantial advantages of our “Poor Man’s Home”—a title that has been fairly and generally conferred on this country.

The three elements of a nation’s wealth are its labor, skill, and capital, in due proportions, according to the exigencies of the country. Here, from our very abundant resources, we could not, but for a very short period, experience inconvenience from a large accession to our laboring population, even if unaccompanied by such a proportion of capitalists as is ever deemed desirable and necessary; for the former very soon reverse their position by becoming employers themselves, and, unthinkingly, as loud declaimers as any against the high price of labor—to the former prevalence of which, in most cases, they owe their own substantial position in the country. But, although the laborer is thus apparently independent of the capitalist, yet practically there is originally such a degree of helpless dependence as ever to throw the former immediately in the wake of the latter: hence, therefore, may immigration be well described as a tide, which leaves scarcely a sign of its passage in the districts through

which it has flowed. The bulk of it has indeed gone to the "far West," which is by no means a proof of the superiority of its ultimate destination, but rather because the El Dorado has been so colored as to attract the capitalist immigrants, who enhance there the market that all other classes follow and flock to as their natural and only support.

The Government, by their measure of Free Grants, have evinced a laudable desire to induce settlement in Canada; and, probably, the results already ascertained will enable them to form a correct judgment as to the advisableness of continuing the original conditions of these grants, or of so modifying them as to ensure the desideratum of a perfect and enlarged system of colonization. But avoiding, as beyond the proper sphere of this Work, any observations that might be construed into an attempt to propound any new theory upon the subject, it may yet be permitted to call public attention to the above considerations, with a view to such action as the really-vital interests of the Province require.

The best class of Emigrants we can receive, and that we should encourage with every possible facility, especially for the occupation of the Free Grants, is that which combines, as it were, the capitalist and the laborer in the same individual—those who can commence with means amply sufficient to sustain themselves for at least fifteen or eighteen months, while they have their whole labor at command to clear land, raise their first crops, and especially perfect to the utmost the means of ingress and egress of their occupation. Upon the latter point immigrants cannot be too particularly advised, if they would avert the risk of utter failure of settlement upon a Bush farm. Such a result too often happens, which has for its effect the wide-spread representation of the hardships and privations *hitherto* incidental to a bush-life, and the deterring of many immigrants, despite their original intentions and long-cherished hopes, from attempting such a plan of settlement, especially if they have the means to purchase some one of the many run-out farms that are constantly offered for sale; while, under proper arrangements and a *judicious* outlay of their capital, their location upon wild land may be made to afford them the surest permanent benefit and ultimate independence. The mass of timber upon a lot of wild land that too frequently frightens a settler to rush to the western prairies, where he may find none, not even sufficient for fencing, would under certain circumstances be a source of much comfort, and probably profit, according to his proximity to a mill to convert it into marketable value.

Mr. T. P. French, the Agent for the Settlement of the Ottawa and Opeongo Road, and the author of a pamphlet abounding with useful information, has given £56 2s. 1d. as the requisite outlay for one year for a man his wife, and three young children, located upon one of the Free Grants, assuming, of course, that the parties should be characterized by strict sobriety and untiring industry: but it should be observed upon this point (for it is one of great importance), that the success or failure of such undertakings is much less dependent upon the amount of capital possessed by the parties than upon their personal qualifications; which indeed, are more frequently exhibited by those inured to indigence than by those who have become habituated to even only the commonest indulgences of life: hence the apparent anomaly, that many of the former rise to some of the highest positions in society, while the latter too frequently retrograde in circumstances and social status. Even were there not this probable consequence of previous influences upon character, the sufficiency or otherwise of any given sum is so dependent on various other circumstances that very great caution should be used in acting on any estimate. Under some favorable circumstances much less than Mr. French's estimate might suffice to bring a family of the number and description he has supposed through their difficulties; but there are also very probable exigencies, such for instance as a very bad road, that would render a much larger sum actually indispensable to mere existence. A settler, especially if newly arrived in the country, and about to avail himself of a Government grant, should, in the first place, guard himself from a too implicit trust to his own preconceived notions of the country and the requirements demanded of him; but rather seek and act upon the advice of experienced and disinterested persons, particularly as to choice of location and some other matters connected with his settlement: secondly, he should most determinedly change any habit that might interfere with an observance of the strictest frugality—at least, for the first few years of his forest life; since nothing but an undignified dependence upon friends (if he have such), or neighbours, can compensate for the pecuniary detriment he would otherwise inflict upon his family: and, thirdly, he should accommodate his manners to promote an interchange of civilities and services with his neighbours; for, positively, not only his comfort but every chance of success in the "Bush" would be destroyed by a demeanour betraying the least semblance to pride, austerity, or ill-will. A particular attention to these points of general advice, directed as they are to intrinsic rather than extrinsic requirements, will effect much in enabling a settler to accomplish the one great object of his emigration.

Of the Canadian ocean steamers Mr. Buchanan very encouragingly reports that "the successful and satisfactory manner in which the 'Montreal Ocean Steamship Company' have carried out their contract with the Provincial Government has called forth a spontaneous feeling of approbation, from one end of the Province to the other. These vessels have proved themselves admirably adapted for this trade; combining together not only safety and comfort, but securing a more rapid diffusion of the benefits of commerce; and I am happy to observe, that these are greatly enhanced by the high testimonials which the passengers have at all times borne, with regard to the kindness and attention of the officers, added to the excellence of the accommodations, as well as the treatment and fare they received, while on board of these steamers.

"The successful establishment of this line cannot fail of exercising an important and beneficial influence on the Province generally, by attracting a large number of the better and more wealthy class of emigrants by this route; who in the absence of such facilities have heretofore been obliged to take that by Boston or New York. These ships made 14 voyages between April and November, bringing out 1033 cabin, and 1669 steerage passengers, and performing the passage out in an average of 12 days."

But a very important advantage, in connection with these steamers, claims particular notice; while, as we see by the above, that they have performed the passage on an average in 12 days, the sailing-vessels from the same country have taken on an average 44 days—a difference of more than a month; the wages of which time in Canada, to a working man, would go far to make up the difference in cost of passage-money, especially if the greater liberality of the steamers' scale of provisions be taken into account.

It is also gratifying to notice in Mr. Buchanan's Report, that the per-centage of deaths on the passage was only 0.43; but still more so that on the emigrants' first residence in Canada (referring particularly to those passengers it was deemed necessary to receive at Grosse Isle) the mortality was only 0.09 per cent.—a practical testimony to the salubrity of the climate, even under circumstances otherwise especially unfavorable.

The following Returns have been furnished by the Chief Agent for Emigration.—It should be borne in mind, in regard to any general conclusions to be deduced from these statistics, that the emigration of the memorable year of 1847 was exceptional in almost every respect.
