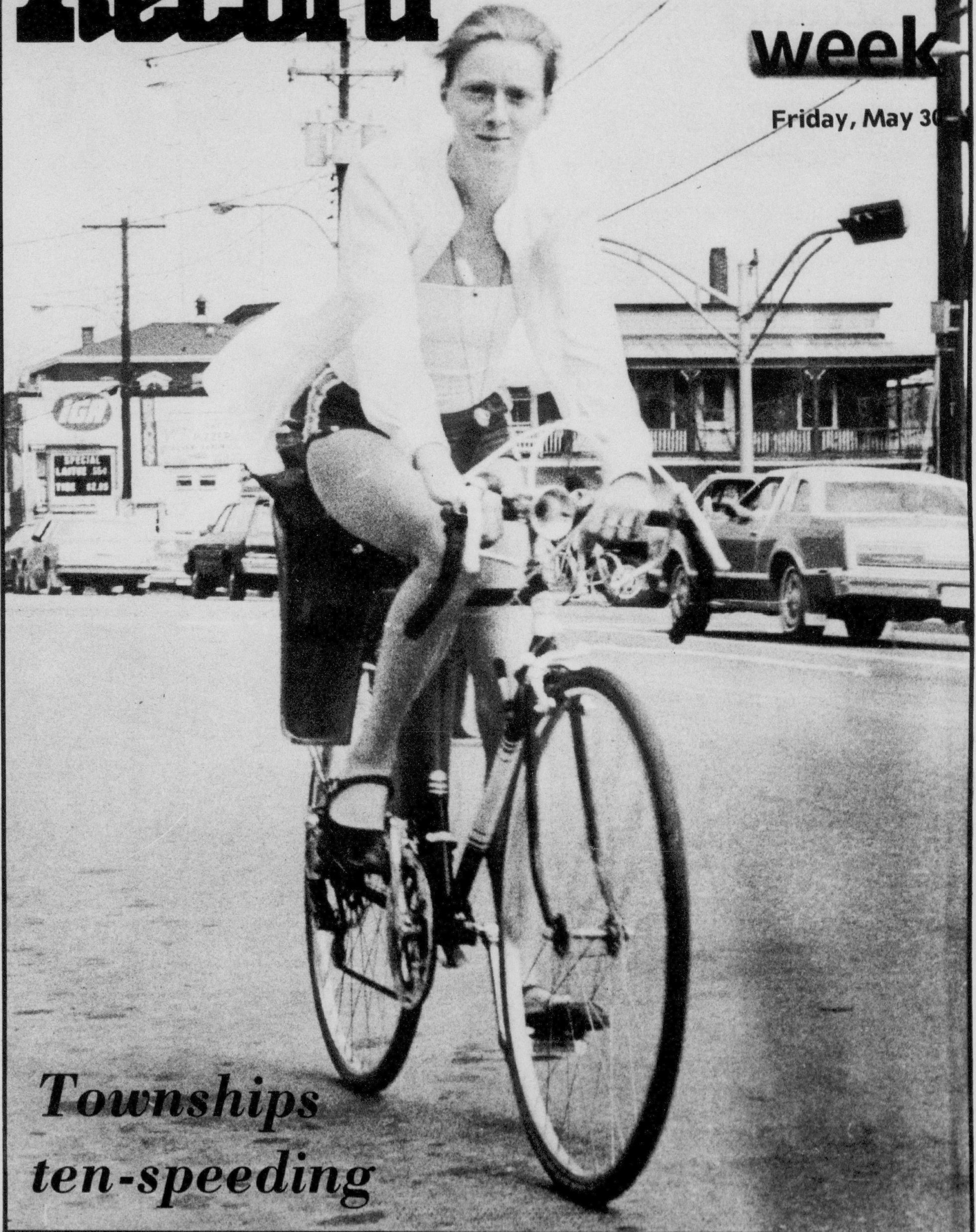

John Prine: Writing is hard work



Country music

"I hate writing songs."

Now do I jump right in here and tell you who said that, or let you think about it for a while. Well, if there's a picture with this column, or his name's in the headline, then you already know.

The words come from John Prine; probably one of the top 10 contemporary writers in country music. Such a statement from Prine, whose songs will quite likely outlive most of what is being written today, is equivalent to having Gordie Howe say he hates scoring goals.

"I like it when I'm done," Prine continues, "but writing is hard work. Lots of times I'd rather go for a drive, or to a baseball game; anything."

Since 1971 that hard work has produced such gems as *Illegal Smile*, *Spanish Pipedream*, *Hello in There*, *Sam Stone*, *Paradise*, *Dear Abby*, *Your Flag Decal Won't Get You Into Heaven Anymore*, *Sweet Revenge*, *Sabu Visits the Twin Cities Alone*, *There She Goes*, *That's the Way the World Goes 'Round*, *Automobile*, *How Lucky* and a host of others.

Prine's songs are often about being out of step with society, and trying to survive in a world full of pressures to get in step. Part of his appeal is the humor and dog-tired perseverance with which he approaches life.

He differs from most singer-songwriters in that anyone else doing his material can't have the same impact. That's because Prine's lyrics are written to suit his vocal style. While half the message is in the words, the other half is very much in his tone and phrasing.

Of course, lots of people don't regard Prine as country but he is. In fact, Prine is truer to the essence of genuine country, than are most mainline country acts today.

"I got a steel (guitar) in my band, a fiddle, and I sing through my nose," Prine says, "and if that ain't country, I don't know what is. I listen to Ray Price, Carl Smith, Lefty Frizzell, George Jones, and I like some of the new Wave a bit. I think country-rock should be more country. I like music that bounces."

On stage, Prine and his five-piece band bounce, occasionally with a rock'n'roll emphasis, sometimes blues, but always with a country base. There is no John Prine show, however. It's one song after another, with the occasional off-the-cuff comment to the audience. The songs and music stand on their own, without the need of any showbiz support.

Prine's artistic integrity has kept him from superstar status. He says he still makes more money touring with his band than he does selling records. "I don't think about selling records when I'm making them," he says. "I'm thinking about the music."

The 33-year-old native of Maywood, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago, was a mailman in 1971, when he got on stage at a Chicago club and wowed the audience with his songs. Five albums and four years later Prine was a professional success, but personally zapped trying to cope with the transition from mailman to the new Bob Dylan label.

He quit. He wasn't even sure he ever wanted to record again. But in the liner notes of his current album, *(Pink Cadillac*;

Elektra-Asylum Records; Q6E-222), there's a thank you note to Jack Clement for the summer of '77. Clement is a Nashville producer.

"When I first started back, after signing with Elektra-Asylum, I was real tired of fighting people," Prine explains. "I spent five months at Jack's, just having fun playing music. He got me interested in playing music again, and I figured his help deserved a thanks."

Prine is very easy-going, unpretentious, and he says that as far as the future is concerned, he just wants to "keep the whole thing going."

Country albums

Heart & Soul; Conway Twitty; MCA Records; MCA-3210.

Like his last album, *Cross Winds* (MCA Records; MCA-3086), *Heart & Soul* contains more of Conway Twitty's supposedly "new direction". But it isn't really "new"; it's simply a powerhouse-country album, showing one development of one of the music's most interesting and creative mainline artists.

Heart & Soul is an appropriate title, since Twitty's heart-wrenching and soulful baritone arouses your emotions in every song. David Barnes' musical arrangements are tasteful and complementary.

Twitty is an artist who moves with the times, without letting the times overpower his personality. Superb country!

Iris Larratt; same; RCA Records; KKL1-0364.

Most of the songs on this album are mediocre. Iris Larratt takes them a notch or two above mediocrity. With two of the songs, *Until You Let Me Love You* and *Sad Eyes* (not the Neil Sedaka composition), she turns in extremely good performances. Larratt hints at an interpretive ability, which simply lacks substantial lyrics to interpret.

Producer Andy Di Martino plays it safe: straight down the middle, so the album is enjoyable, but far from consuming your attention. Just the same, Larratt's singing shows considerable potential, but she needs better songs and an adventurous producer.

Straight from Texas; Johnny Duncan; Columbia Records; 36260.

Absolutely boring. Johnny Duncan has a smooth, pleasant voice, reminiscent of Jim Reeves, but without Reeves' ability to evoke warm feelings through precise phrasing.

Duncan sings as if he's a journalist reporting a story, but remaining detached from it. That's commendable for a journalist, but disastrous for a singer. He softens every word, levelling off any hint at passion. It's "nice" music; that's how bad it is.

A Sketch in Country; David Thompson; Citation Records; CIT-1-80.

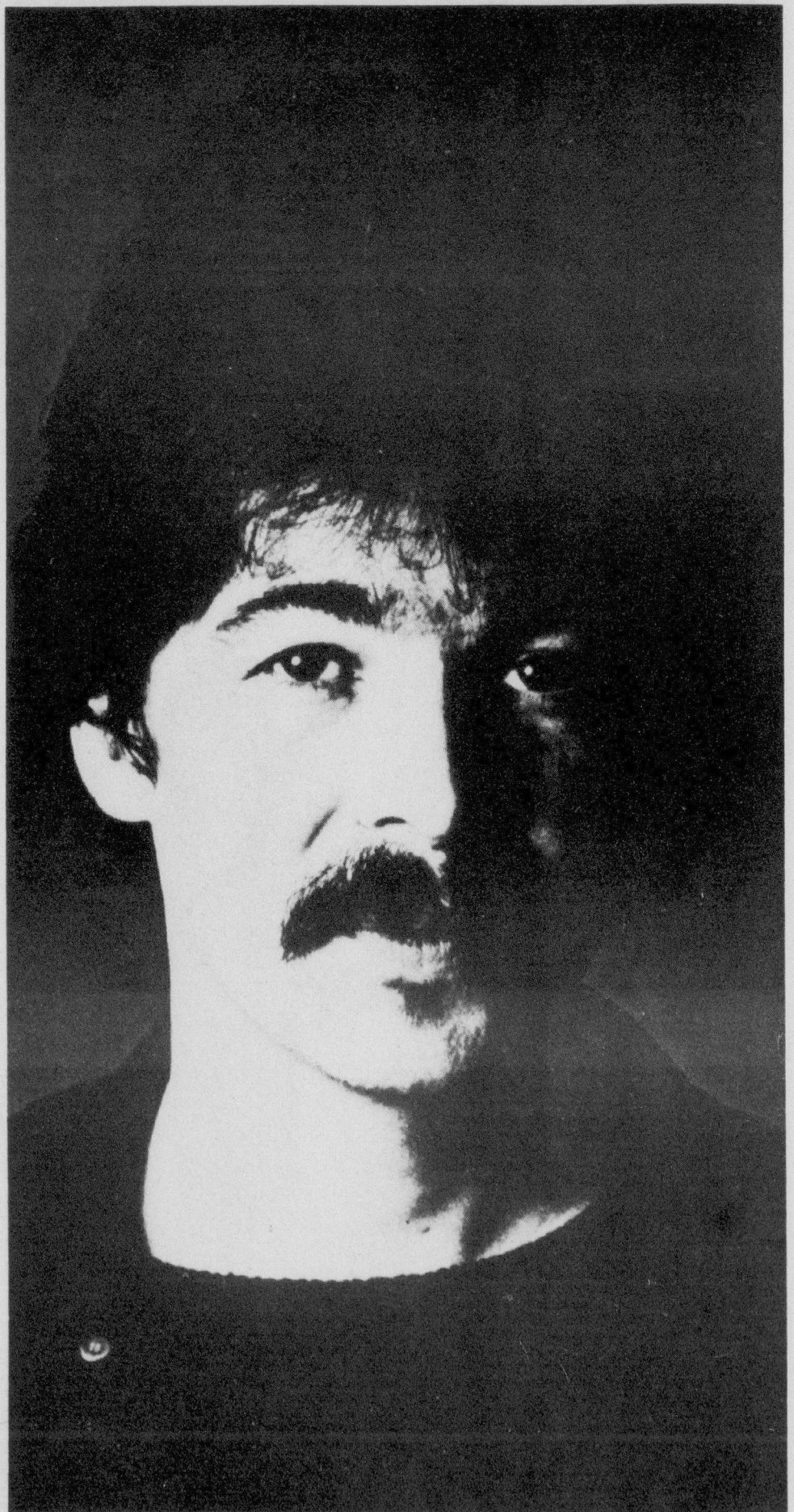
David Thompson has one of the really great new voices in country music. The 10 songs on this album show that he knows how to use it.

The tremelo or wash board effect in Thompson's baritone gives his tone a touch of blues; a hint at being just on the edge of breaking down, but mustering the strength to carry on.

The lyrics to these songs are fine, but it's Thompson's powerful singing that gives them a depth and dimension they don't have on their own. As with any really good singer, Thompson sings the feeling of the words, not just their literal meaning. Dynamic country!

Nashville Mirrors; Bill Anderson; MCA Records; MCA-3214.

Thank goodness! Bill Anderson is still very much into contemporary country, but he's moved away from the inanity of disco that ruined his last album, *Ladies'*

Choice (MCA Records; MCA-3075).

Unfortunately, despite his "today" approach, Anderson's tone and lyrics reflect a chauvinistic attitude towards women. But at least it's honest. Women know where they stand with him.

The songs on *Nashville Mirrors* have interesting stories, and Buddy Killen's production keeps Anderson's cool, sophisticated style up front.

Memories; Ray McAuley; RCA Records; KKL1-0358.

Ray McAuley died of a cerebral hemorrhage in April, 1978. He was 33 years old. This album is a tribute from people who worked with him.

The songs range from his first, weak recordings to very strong numbers. Ed Molyski wrote the songs McAuley recorded, as well as playing lead guitar in his band and producing him in the studio. Molyski introduces most of the 12 songs,

explaining their place in McAuley's recording career. Memories will be treasured by Ray McAuley fans.

Ian Robb and Hang the Piper; same; Folk-Legacy Records; FSI-71.

Hang the Piper plays with authority and feeling on these 13 pieces of English and Irish traditional, folk music. Ian Robb's voice is well suited to relating the story-songs. There's a mixture of ballads, jigs, hornpipes, a reel and two mazurkas, which originated as dances in Poland, before moving into the British Isles in the middle of the 1700s.

The album jacket contains a much-appreciated booklet, giving information on the group, a bit of historical information on the songs, and lyrics of the ballads. The music is earthy, infectious and soothing.

Country fans who would like to hear the music from which country music derived would enjoy this fine album.

Animation troupes combine

The Festival des Cantons organizers have labelled it "Creation Theatre", a fit name for the grouping of three of the best animation troupes in the Sherbrooke area.

What is animation theatre? Known elsewhere as street theatre or guerrilla theatre, here in Quebec, thanks to the government's largesse towards promoters of social change, it has become respectable and does not often operate in the street. It is even institutionalized at the Universite de Sherbrooke's French Department where the option-theatre program is devoted to the genre. Above all, it is concerned with individual and social transformation and intervenes in various ways to bring about change. At worst, it can be boringly didactic; at best, stimulating and fun.

Three different styles are represented by the troupes regrouped as "Creation Theatre". Theatre de la Poursuite's presentation, "Couvre-feux", is surreal, making great use of symbolism. Satirically, it examines inertia and the fear of change, confronting large social barriers like marriage, religion and private property as well as the physical and psychological barriers of the individual. In the words of a group member, they "have only tried to understand the reason for the paralyzing lethargy which seems to have infiltrated the western world."

La Poursuite does not offer solutions. It merely formulates questions.

On the other hand, Theatre du Cent Neuf, or Sang Neuf as they now prefer to be known, does offer solutions. Not content to ask questions, the members of Sang Neuf believe their function is to provide a vehicle to educate the public. Despite modest equipment and a skeleton cast,

they attempt a more realistic approach, although some reliance on easily identifiable symbols is inevitable. "De la vie a deux, ou moi j'suis moi, toi t'es toi" is based on the personal experiences of the actors. It concerns the relations between men and women, dealing with the couple in society, the complications children often bring, sexuality, possessiveness, exclusiveness, subordination and domination.

Like Theatre Sang-Neuf, La Bebelles is interested in popular education but they take the problems less seriously. What else could one expect from a troupe of clowns? Complete with funny costumes, painted faces and rubber noses, they confront the relations between individuals in "La Bebelles aux gars dormants". Shyness, fear, solitude, force and competition are treated with comic pathos. La Bebelles is running a related skit at an earlier hour for children, ages eight to 11. "Me prends-tu pour un heros?", explores similar matters in relations between children.

At first the groups had made a proposal to the Festival des Cantons for street theatre animation, but due to budgetary considerations, this approach was not accepted. This year, all of the activities have to be self-financing hence "Creation Theatre" has been forced into a more traditional setting. But because the prime interest is exposure to the greatest number of people, the price has been kept about as low as movie tickets.

Don't expect elaborate sets. These are touring companies ready to set up anywhere at the drop of an invitation. They do wonders with limited props, giving performances of one of the plays in their repertoire or, in the case of Sang Neuf and La Bebelles, creating something

especially for the occasion. Popular groups like the Association Co-operative d'Economie Familiale or the Conservateurs des Cantons have commissioned skits from these groups to get their message across.

What you can expect is a provoking and entertaining attempt to communicate. Creation Theatre should prove of interest

to anyone concerned with the propagation of ideas as it offers the opportunity to compare the effectiveness of three popular troupes dedicated to theatre as a medium for the message.

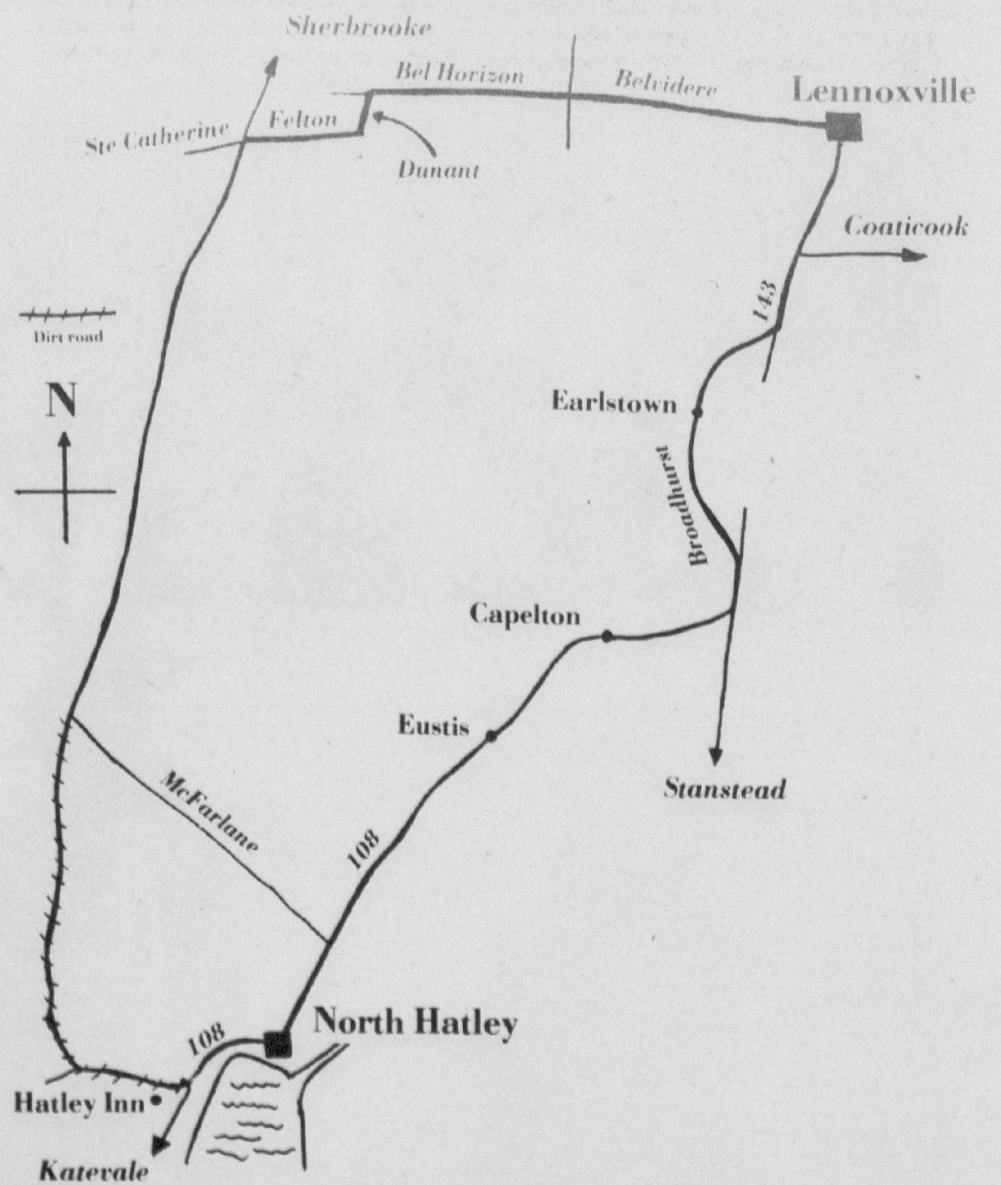

Into cycle tours this summer?

Townships ten-speeding

Over the next few weeks, we'll be mapping out different scenic bike routes of about 40 to 48 kilometres in various regions of the Eastern Townships.

This column will be directed towards the novice biker who enjoys riding for the pure pleasure of ten-speeding. The accent will also be on the scenery of the Townships.

Also in this debut article we list some equipment that is a must for trips of this duration, as well as a few tips on maintenance for your bicycle.

First of all you will need a small backpack, (about \$3.95), a patch kit (about \$1.25), an all-purpose bike wrench (about \$2), and also some type of water bottle or wineskin. Once you have these items you are ready to check your bicycle for such things as brakes, brake and speed cables, as well as tire pressure and pedals. And we're off!

For this particular route, an easy 25-kilometre jaunt which is mapped out for you it would be advantageous to pack a light lunch.

Departing from the corner of Queen and Belvidere in Lennoxville, you will soon find yourself in the midst of grassy farmland. After you pass the Huntingville turn-off, there is Broadhurst Road, which is a pleasant break from the fast pace of the highway, the combination of the trees and the river makes you forget about the highway for a moment, but before you know it you're on the highway again. Fortunately,

not for long.

Once on the Capelton Road you will soon find an old covered bridge, a true relic from the past. The next stretch of road resembles a roller coaster, up and down, up and down. Despite the ups and downs it is actually quite picturesque, lots of rolling hills, and a few herds of cows here and there.

As you're heading down the hill towards North Hatley you catch a good view of Lake Massawippi.

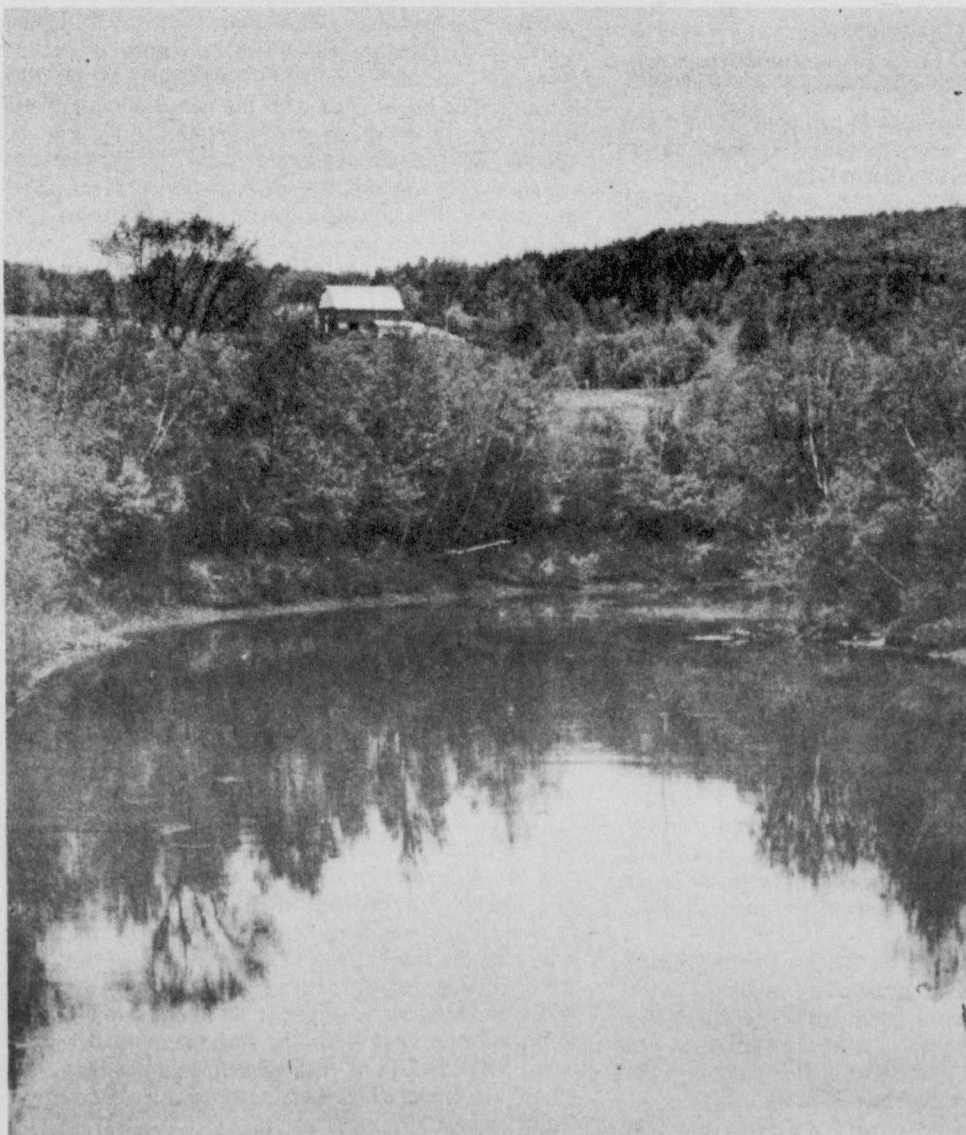
With the breeze rolling in off the lake on to the park in North Hatley this provides a relaxing break point.

After this break, the difficult part of the route begins; the dirt road to the Hatley Inn takes you up about a 700-foot climb to the top, about three-quarters of the way up you'll come to a gate, at which there is a breathtaking view of Lake Massawippi. Once you're at the top it stays fairly level until you get close to the outskirts of Sherbrooke. Along the way you'll probably be lucky enough to see a little wildlife (sheep, horses, etc.).

The final leg of the route is also pretty well devoted to rolling green farmland.

The high point of the trip is definitely the finale for more reasons than one. First of all the incredible speed that you can attain coming down Belvidere hill into Lennoxville, and secondly, the realization that your journey has come to an end!

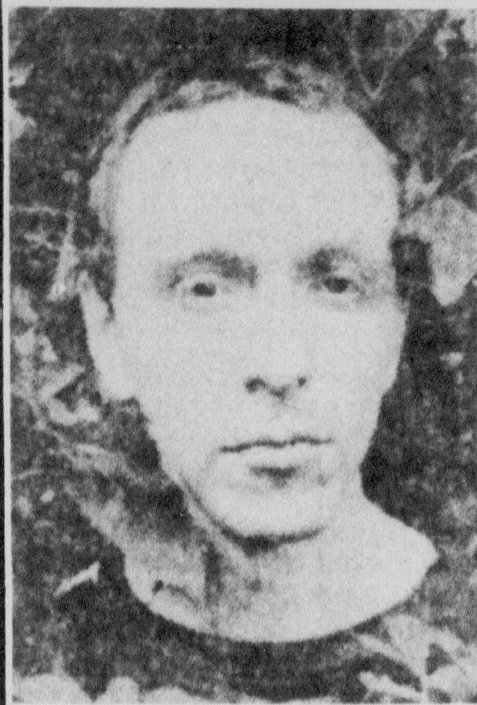

Cure for the referendum blues

... 'exclusive' performance

Those who were not nursing their referendum wounds were celebrating in front of their TVs as the Flyers met the Islanders. La Poupee was virtually deserted for the Stephen Barry Band in the first of their two-night engagement last week.

Too bad, because they might have provided some relief from the referendum blues although it is doubtful whether they could have matched the excitement of the Flyers' temporary comeback.

Playing almost exclusively for a table of eight, the four-piece Montreal band treated its performance as a rehearsal for the album (its second) which the members are currently cutting at a small independent studio in Montreal. According to guitarist Andrew Cowan, they will be able to think of little else until its release in September.

Three guitarists and a drummer make up the band. The guitarists, Cowan, John Reissner and Stephen Barry himself - have known each other since their McGill days in the late '60s. The drummer, Paul

Paquette, played with Barry in an earlier band but all four have been playing together for only two and half years.

They have been labelled a blues band, but the varied repertoire covers a mix of rock styles, jazz, country and western as well as blues. Each member has his particular heroes and each gets a chance to pay homage to them.

John Reissner's voice is very reminiscent of Dylan, although he would prefer a comparison with Mark Knopfler of Dire Straits (a case of imitating the imitator?). His taste in music is definitely closer to urban blues. Other band members also share this love of city rock as the Jaggeresque song by Barry, **BACK IN NEW YORK CITY** or Paquette's interpretation of **GOT MY MOJO WORKING** attest. But blues is still the main line.

Cowan is a devotee of Muddy Waters' rough brand of Chicago blues although his voice is his own. His fondness for the slide guitar of Elmore James showed in **WONDER WHY THE WATER IS RUNNING UP THE HILL** Paquette's voice is like marble-mouthed Leon Redbone but he only got one chance to sport it. His

drumming is clean and authoritative without being intrusive.

Each musician does his own thing but Steve ties it all together, not only with his Mingus-like marking of rhythm but with his eclectic tastes. He can switch from blues to rock, from country to jazz or mix them in various ways with equal virtuosity.

The band's original material, although derivative, is as good as the real thing. It's not difficult to imagine the Stones recording **BACK IN NEW YORK** or a blues great doing **DON'T HAVE TO WORRY**, but no song they performed is different enough to carry them to stardom. Thing is, I'm not sure the band is looking for that. Like so many musicians who have passed the 30-year mark, they seem to be content just to get paid for doing what they enjoy.

Their more unusual qualities emerge when they cut loose and jazz up familiar material. As Stephen Barry said after finishing an instrumental piece, "I don't think we've ever done it that way before". Or ever again, chances are. So the next time they're in the area, be sure to catch the show while you can.

Richler's 'Joshua': Man as social animal

Joshua Then and Now by Mordecai Richler (McCLELLAND & STEWART): \$16.95, 435 pp.

In his latest novel Mordecai Richler takes his curious blend of Jewish-Canadians, denizens of the Main, and motley Montrealers up a few notches in the social scale, moving them from the St. Urbain's urban jungle up onto the hallowed slopes of Westmount. Richler presents us with a complex, at times humorous personality in Joshua Shapiro who is a minor dabbler in the literary arts. Shapiro is the socially mobile son of an ex-Canadian lightweight boxing contender, Ruby Shapiro, and a mother, known as Esty Blossom, former stripper and presently managing a massage parlour in Winnipeg called "Oral Is Beautiful".

In the present of this multi-layered time frame, Shapiro lives in Westmount, writes columns, sports stories, and features for such magazines as Playboy and Maclean's, and has written a study of the 1936 war in Spain — it is the late 1970s, and Richler's book uses all of the political confusion that this setting in time affords him. The Parti Quebecois victory in 1976, the Trudeau years, Wacky Margaret, the aftermath of Watergate, all become incidents that Richler occasionally uses with amusing results. The narrator, through Joshua's point of view, makes the following wry observation about newly-elected Premier Rene Levesque's accident on Cote-des-Neiges Road, when a derelict was struck by his car and killed. "Montreal's intrepid police, who used to gleefully crack Separatist skulls with riot sticks... quickly adjusted to the new power structure. On the spot almost instantly, they assessed the situation and grasped where their duty lay. Then tenderly escorted the distressed premier and his mistress from the scene, out of sight of obnoxious reporters, and booked the offending corpse, removing it to the hospital for a blood test, to establish whether or not it had been drunk".

But an even more famous Canadian is also the butt of some rather scabrous attacks on his person and lifestyles. William Lyon Mackenzie King is dragged from his final resting place and mercilessly lampooned, cudgelled and ridiculed. In the shifting time frame, we move from the thirties, as Joshua is growing up in the ethnic atmosphere of Montreal, to the early fifties, through the turbulent sixties, on up to the disastrous seventies, while Joshua is haunted by the past. Shapiro is a family man, married to Pauline Hornby, daughter of a Canadian Senator, and he's the father of three children.

The settings change with ease from Westmount to the Shapiro summer home on Lake Memphremagog to Spain (the island of Ibiza) to Ottawa, and the Chateau Laurier's hosting of the ribald meetings of the W.L. Mackenzie King Memorial Society dinners. London and Paris also come in for a fair share of the creation of the novel's atmosphere, but it is as a thoroughly Canadian book that **JOSHUA THEN AND NOW** will be acclaimed. Richler has loaded this book with conversations, episodes, and a flood of subplots which drive home the distinctly Canadian nature of the tale he tells. It is more than the references to the Rocket, or the big Boston-Canadiens hockey encounters, or

the absurd politics of this land that create the fascinating reading for a Canadian. Richler has already proved his merit in the literary jousts with **DUDDY KRAVITZ** or **ST. URBAIN'S HORSEMAN**, but with "Joshua" he returns to the lovable, eccentric characters of the Main, and the love-hate relationship between Jew and Gentile, flavoring even that overworked plot with a distinctly Canadian tang in throwing in the French-English conflicts.

It is the kind of rambling, brawling novel, where the sub-plots often threaten to overpower the main action. Richler in fact, admits to "Joshua" being a much-edited, often painstakingly rewritten book. He cut 30,000 words

from the Ibiza plot, which brings in romance, a Nazi encounter and a Hemingwayesque attempt to seize a cause in a quiet time between the two World Wars.

JOSHUA THEN AND NOW sparkles with wit, satire and shrewd observations about man as a social animal. The dialogue is spiced with the language of the streets (and the boardroom, or Oval Office), and there is an almost Dickensian parade of minor characters which keeps the novel flowing briskly along. Academics may find many structural weaknesses in "Joshua" but it is a comical, rambling romp through five decades of Canadian society with our tour guide the always-entertaining Mordecai Richler.

"Freddy's Book" by John Gardner (KNOPF-RANDOM HOUSE): \$12.50, 246 pp.

After a successful lecture he has delivered on "The Psycho-politics of the Late Welsh Fairytale: Fee, Fie, Foe-Revolution", a Professor Winesap is being lionized in the kitchen of his host in Madison, Wisconsin. Not a particularly novel opening for a book, but when Professor Sven Agaard confides in Winesap, telling him he has a son who is a monster, the reader is tempted to learn of what import this startling revelation may be to John Gardner's strange tale. Actually, the first quarter of the book is devoted to Winesap's curious trip to the outskirts of Madison, his being strangely entertained by Professor Agaard, and the subsequent revelations about Freddy. Deformed but near-genius in his mental capacities, Freddy, it seems, has written a book, 180 pages of which constitute the bulk of Gardner's medieval-modern flight of fancy.

Freddy's book is the story of "King Gustav & The Devil", set in sixteenth century Sweden. Involved in this morality play are Lars-Goren, a giant of a Swedish knight, eight feet high, and three feet wide at the shoulders, and his King, Gustavus I. In a rather complex drama, Lars-Goren and Gustav roam the Swedish countryside, attempting to get the best of the Devil — a particularly foxy

devil, who uses all of his powers of shape-changing, and his cunning in attempting to show confusion and deceit in the ranks of the Swedes.

The story laid out in Freddy's book is interesting enough, exploring an era and a locale in European history which is not very well known. It is heavily laden with symbolism, religious overtones, and broad moral gestures which are second nature to John Gardner, whose lifework has been, aside from his novels, the study of Chaucer and the medieval time-frame. This is not the first of Gardner's novels to employ the favourite device of eighteenth century English writers — the "found document". "October Light" was devoted to a novel within a novel as well.

The problem for most readers of "Freddy's Book" will be that the Swedish tale seems a let down after the engrossing narrative about the historians, Winesap and Agaard, and the perplexing phenomenon of Freddy himself. The novel ends with the conclusion of Freddy's book, with no framing portion either reflecting on the significance of the inserted story, or exploring the reaction by Professor Winesap. We are left to speculate about Freddy Agaard's expertise in this arcane history, and about the reasons why he stole down the Winesap's room to leave him the manuscript for perusal. It would appear that Gardner has utilized a medieval story about good and evil to create some kind of allegory for our own time — most of us, lacking the training in the intricacies of the period, may find the connections difficult to establish. But for one quarter of his novel, Gardner has us as hooked as any crime novelist ever does.

"The Tragic Tale of the Dog Who Killed Himself" by Richard W. Jennings (BANTAM): \$3.00, 43 pp.

It is hard to tell when Jennings is being maudlin, tongue-in-cheek, or both, in this short excursion into the always romanticized, magic region of a boy and his dog. In this case the dog is an exceptionally rare breed (a Schipperke, popular in Belgium, where they ride on barges and are called "little captains"). His owner is a first-grader who narrates the story to us in the persona of a six-year-old imbued with the hindsight and superior knowledge of an adult.

The result is the confusing, somewhat stylized text that deals with the breakup of the boy's parents' marriage, and the (supposedly related) subsequent suicide of the dog. The Schipperke leaps to death in the flood waters of a rain-swollen creek. Both the flip way in which the story is told, and the description of the neurotic father, detract from the true tragedy about the death of the Schipperke. When the tale ends we don't know whether to laugh at the informed innocence of the boy's narration, or to truly shed a tear over the fate of the poor dog. Jennings tries to have it both ways, and as a result fails to either sincerely move us, or to casually entertain us.

Grass still high on McCartney's list

Keeping up

Paul McCartney says he has no hard feelings about his arrest in Tokyo last January after customs officials found marijuana in his luggage, but admits the experience jolted him.

He has not, however, given up the drug.

"I still don't think that grass is that dangerous a drug," he said in an interview. "I wish the medical people would get together and make up their minds what it is.

"I know that scotch is worse for you than grass — it is for me anyway," said the 37-year-old former Beatle, who has had several scrapes with the law over his use of marijuana.

In San Antonio, Tex., country singer **Barbara Mandrell** finally got her wish — a ride in a U.S. Air Force jet.

"I don't have a big enough vocabulary to describe what I just went through," she said after her flight with the force's Thunderbirds precision flying team.

"There was nothing romantic involved whatsoever," she said of the Trudeau dinner. "It was just a normal dinner that I would have had with anyone else. Nice dinner, nice conversation."

The daughter of **Cliff Scotton**, a former national secretary of the New Democratic Party, she is an editorial writer for a Toronto newspaper.

Jenner happy with silver screen debut

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "It's no Oscar-winning performance," Bruce Jenner says of his movie debut in *Can't Stop The Music*, "but for a first try, I think it was pretty good."

But you get the impression that negative reviews won't matter to Bruce Jenner. The self-assessment is what counts. That was true during his grueling four-year training for the 1976 Olympic Games and the same kind of control has gone into his post-Olympics career.

Can't Stop The Music is no mere walk-on for Jenner. He plays the role of a lawyer who becomes involved with **Valerie Perrine**, romantically as well as financially, in her scheme to promote a new singing group, the Village People.

It has been almost four years since Jenner won the decathlon with a

record 8,618 points at the Montreal games. Since then he has been visible as sports commentator, first for ABC and now NBC; as TV pitchman for a breakfast cereal, camera and sports clothes; as highly-paid speaker at conventions; as author of an autobiography *Decathlon Challenge: Bruce Jenner's Story*; as a sponsor of the Special Olympics and other causes.

"I thought it would be a great idea to combine these wild and crazy guys with conservative, all-American Bruce Jenner," said the athlete.

"It was a good part for me, starting out as a naive, klutzy guy with his hair parted on one side and wearing a three-piece suit, then becoming a streetsmart person who is in control of the situation."

Theatre

One of the major events beginning at the Festival des Cantons this evening is the first of a three-pronged theatrical blitz. Theatre Sang Neuf will do a revised version of *DE LA VIE A DEUX OU MOI J'SUIS MOI, TOI T'ES TOI* at 20:30 with repeated performances tomorrow and Sunday at 22:30 as well as next Thursday and Friday, June 5 and 6 at 20:00. This play focuses on a popular theme, the couple.

COUVRE-FEUX, which is concerned with a broader range of social relationships affected by religion, job pressures and other factors that prevent the individual from striving to greater heights, will be staged by the Theatre de la Poursuite tomorrow and Sunday at 20:00, as well as next Thursday and Friday at 22:30.

It deals comically with the stereotype roles traditionally assigned to male and female. The production geared to adults (at 22:30 on the same nights) is called *LA BEBELLE AU GARS DORMANTS* and gives insight into meaningful relationships amongst men between the laughs. Admission for each of the three adult plays is \$3.75 and all are being staged at the comfortable auditorium in Pavillon 2 of the CEGEP de Sherbrooke. While music predominates at the boite a chanson *l'Ephemere*, there will be puppet shows tomorrow and next Saturday afternoon (13:00). See music section for location details.

Theatre de l'Atelier unveiled its production of *THE CARETAKER* or *LE GARDIEN* last weekend. Harold Pinter's masterpiece of kitchen-sink drama, funny despite its overall serious import, has been reset in Sherbrooke, with liberal references to Lennoxville and local landmarks. Artistic director Pierre Gobeil, Jacques Thisdale and Benoit Dumont star in this gem of absurdist theatre which makes fun of social pretensions in an atmosphere of material and spiritual poverty. There are shows Tuesday to Saturday at 20:30 until June 21. Tickets are \$5 to \$7, depending on the day of the week. Students pay \$4. As a member of the Atelier, further savings are possible. In Montreal, you may want to check out the Centaur's latest gamble. *THE LEONARD COHEN SHOW*, created by Barrie Lee Wexler and Catherine Latraverse. It combines the engaging poetry and music of the well-known Montreal poet-singer with a script specially commissioned by the Montreal theatre. The composers of eight chosen works, to be announced at the conclusion of the concert, will share a \$2500 prize. Tickets are \$3, \$4 and \$5.

EARL "FATHA" HINES, whom Count Basie called "the greatest piano player in the world" finishes off his club date at the Rising Sun this Sunday. *ALBERT COLLINS* then takes over at the Montreal jazz club on Tuesday, June 8. One of the most exciting visual acts in the blues, Collins' live performances are legendary. High-powered, energetic guitar work easily gives way to sweet, slow blues sometimes punctuated by a hilarious tale about his home life. His individualistic style has won over John Lee Hooker and Albert King as well as audiences at New York's Bottom Line, The Whiskey in L.A. and the Monterey Jazz Festival.

ISLAM, THE VEIL AND THE FUTURE follows on Vermont ETV at 21:30. Nancy Dickerson presides over a session of American and Islamic women exploring the vast differences in their lifestyles.

JAZZ AT THE MAINTENANCE SHOP (Channel 33 again) features "Phil Woods Quartet (no. 1)". Down Beat's 1979 alto sax player of the year performs with Steve Gilmore (bass), Mike Mellimo (piano) and Bill Goodwin (drummer). This first in a series of intimate jazz concerts is repeated at midnight.

THIS LAND, a series of 13 shows focussing on Canada's natural living resources, returns to CBC Mondays at 22:30 with Don Francks as narrator. For the debut show, Francks, brother of the Cree people, went back to Saskatchewan's Red Pheasant Reserve, where he and his family had lived, with a CBC film crew to capture the reunion with its ritual dances and story-telling ceremonies. Sub-titled "Ghost Herds", this show looks at the history of the bison and its significance to the native Indian people.

NOVA, Tuesday, June 3 on Channel 33 (20:00) examines the pros and cons of the chemical industry in "A Plague on Our Children".

ROSE'S HOUSE is a special documenting the harsh reality of working class life to be shown Tuesday at 21:00 on Channel 6. It's the story of a Maritimer and her husband who move to Toronto in search of "the good life".

Like thousands of displaced easterners, Rose settled into Cabbagetown, largely populated by blue collar workers, where she opened her boarding house. This film, produced and directed by her son, Clay Borris, in association with the NFB, focuses on Rose's earthy philosophy, compassion and ferocity towards "the system".

Tuesday at 22:00, **SOUNDSTAGE** presents the "Sixth Anniversary Show", updated from last year with added guests Ella Fitzgerald, Count Basie, The Doobie Brothers, The Temptations and Gordon Lightfoot. (Channel 33).

TANNHAUSER FROM BAYREUTH, the first telecast of a complete opera from the Festspielhaus of the annual Wagner summer festival in Bayreuth, Germany, is this week's "Great Performances", Wednesday at 20:00 on Channel 33.

CAMERA THREE (Thursday at 21:30 on the same channel) presents Duro Laidpo's National Theatre of Nigeria in "Oba Koso" (The King Did Not Hang). An old popular folk legend about the conflict between a leader and his warriors, the drama combines music, acting and singing.

'10': A liberating comedy

The rebellious sixties presented the world with two new values - young is beautiful and what's fun is good - making even more difficult the process of aging and human relationships. '10' faces both of these head on. It is a film about the male menopause. The film seems to take the view that although women have a biological crisis, emotionally men's mid-life transitional period is far worse. Of course this statement, uttered by the homosexual in the movie, should be taken with a grain of salt.

The protagonist, George Webber (Dudley Moore), is a successful songwriter but a writer of what the younger generation calls elevator music. And it is the younger generation which George, in his 42nd year, wishes to emulate or at least in whose promiscuity he wishes to participate. Tantalized by a voyeuristic relationship with a younger neighbour whose life is full of x-rated escapades, George allows himself to become infatuated with a stunning newlywed. Catching a glimpse of her on her way to the wedding, he chases her from Hollywood to Mexico and from one calamity to another. Unlike most, he finally manages to flesh out his fantasy only to come to grips with his own romanticism.

Although the film touches on the problem of self-fulfilment through work, that is not really George's problem. He is loved, appreciated and well-rewarded for what he does. It is difficult at times to feel sorry for this jet-set Beverly Hills resident who chug-a-lugs double cognacs to make it through life at the top. Of course that's what makes it a comedy, or at least why we can laugh at this silly middle-aged man's calamitous pursuit of youth.

The movie is funniest when it sticks close to reality - the believable accident or a response justified by the circumstance. Unfortunately, this is not generally the case. Although other critics have praised its humour, we cannot help but feel that Blake Edwards' slapstick style, appropriate in the Pink Panther series, at times gets in the way of this comi-drama. The scene of the much-promoted tumble down one of Beverly's Hills is an example. Aside from providing a timely laugh, how does it relate to the theme of the picture? Are we to think of George as a total klutz a la Jerry Lewis? Certainly not. He is a sensitive and gifted composer, a man facing an existential crisis. There is clearly a conflict between the serious personal questions being explored and the humour.

The only other filmmaker who risks this syncretic combination is Woody Allen. But even Allen's pratfall humour is integral to the plot. Besides, it has taken him years to build up the required image, an image which would not work in '10' because of its reliance

on pathos. The weakness is not so much Edwards' physical humour versus Allen's more intellectual brand as it is the lack of a sense of balance within the concept of the story. In a film which is supposed to take the process of aging seriously, the senility of the minister's housekeeper is carelessly exploited in Laugh-In fashion. Given the need for pathos in '10', wouldn't it have been more natural to go for the laugh that is inspired by juxtaposing one's illusions with reality? For example, rather than belabouring the ridiculous spectacle of George using towels to move across the hot sand on the beach, more emphasis might have been placed on the difference in height between short George and the blond Amazonian object of his desires.

Dudley Moore does an excellent job with a difficult part that never quite succeeds in its dual burden - portraying an inarticulate but sensitive hero who is also required to act like an idiot. Bo Derek, a new sex object, deserves everything she gets. Robert Webber, a well-known TV heavy, plays George's lyricist and friend, who also happens to be a homosexual, a part he carries off with dignity and warmth. The best performance in the film is turned in by Julie Andrews (it helps

being married to the director). In contrast to her Mary Poppins image, she comes across as a strong-willed and, in the best sense, liberated woman.

The worst part of the film is its misleading title. '10' refers to the peak of the scale by which some men measure a woman's appeal. Interestingly enough, it is George's psychiatrist who chooses this sexist objectification of women when George runs to him for help. Raised to a level of importance as a title, it reduces the picture's broader dimensions to the realm of sexploitation. The promoters also chose to extract the worst of the humour for the ad campaign, leading people to expect Pink Panther pranks. Shame. Shame.

Despite the hype, the film raises and deals with many important sexual issues - aging and maturing, sex for pleasure and love, romanticism and realism, selfishness and friendship, heterosexuality and homosexuality, virility and impotence, relations between and within generations, voyeurism and wish fulfilment - offering a resolution without moralizing. Any film that can provide this and comedy too deserves to be seen.

THE RECORD INDUSTRY, AND SPECIFICALLY A&M Records, is now touting a new line of records called Superdiscs which are basically records with a super dynamic range and virtually no tape hiss or surface noise. Under the name The Audiophile Series, A&M Records of Canada, who initiated this type of disc in Canada, has now released five more titles to bring the number to twelve now available to the public. The records include Supertramp's Crime Of the Century, Even In the Quietest Moments, Breakfast In America and Crisis. What Crisis? Other albums included are The Grand Illusion by Styx; Cat Steven's Greatest Hits; Feels So Good by Chuck Mangione; Brother To Brother by Gino Vannelli; Spanish Train by Chris de Burgh; Cornerstone by Styx; Rise by Herb Alpert; and Reggatta de Blanc by Police. What's the difference between these 'Superdiscs' and other records? Basically, the records are mastered at half-speed in Japan, allowing infinitely greater care to be taken in the delicate stage of cutting the mother disc which is the master from which all the other copies are pressed. The actual discs presented to retailers are pressed on a high grade virgin vinyl using graphite that can withstand multiple-playing. A&M Records indicates that "The Audiophile Series is virtually fingerprint free when it arrives in the consumer's living room, carefully shipped and packed to ensure that the superdisc is in super condition from the moment it comes off the press in Japan to the time it is purchased at a retail store in Canada." We hope that similar care is taken with the 'Ordinary discs' that we pay over \$8 for these days.

In March the set reached the number six position on the album charts there which reflects Elvis' enormous popularity in that corner of the world where, according to a RCA Records spokesman he has been very hot since the release of his first single Heartbreak Hotel in 1956.

Cheap Trick headlined its first concert ever at New York's Madison Square Garden on May 12.

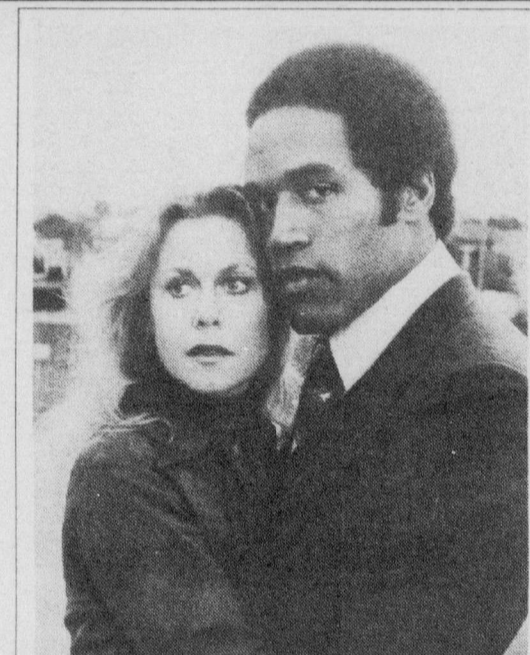

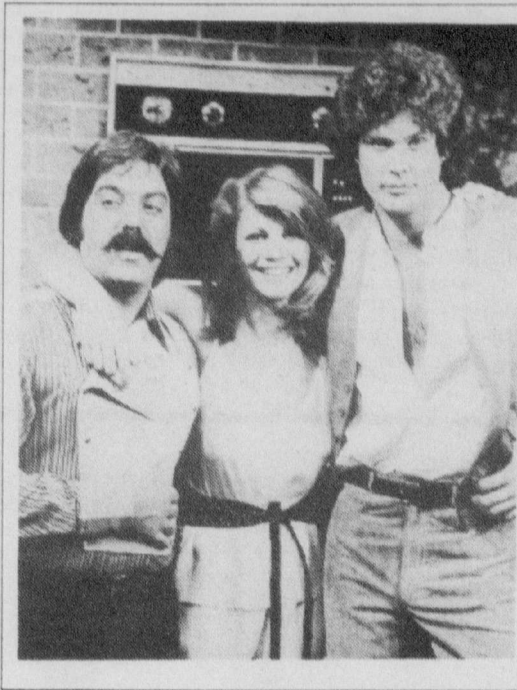

RATHER PSYCHED FOR JOB

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS's 60 Minutes was the highest-rated prime-time program last season, and correspondent Dan Rather knows he has "a helluva job, in many ways the best job in television news."

Since the first of the year, 60 Minutes has taken Rather undercover to Afghanistan and into a open, though ultimately one-sided, confrontation

with Henry Kissinger.

But Dan Rather is preparing to leave all of that a year from now to succeed Walter Cronkite as anchorman for CBS Evening News.

For Rather, who's covered dozens of major stories for CBS News from the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in 1963, the decision to leave 60 Minutes could not

have been a easy one, though he will make a reported \$1.6 million a year in the new assignment.

"If you want to know what the Evening News is going to be like, you've got to look at what I've done in the past."

PURSUED STORY

That last remark suggests Rather's recent trek, in native dress, into the mountains of Af-

ghanistan. "If that is instructive at all," he says, "it was a good story, about which not much was known, and we went after it."

"I'll take all of that kind of reporting I can get. It's difficult, and there's no way you can do that kind of story every night. And that's not to say there is one iota of difference between Walter and I on

that. He would take every story of that kind he could get."

For Rather's boss, CBS News President Bill Leonard, selecting Cronkite's successor was no easy task. In the end, it meant passing over Roger Mudd, and Leonard to this day is trying to keep the veteran correspondent at CBS.

Rather, raised in Texas, joined CBS News in Dallas in 1962. He was transferred to the White House in 1964, and served there until September 1974, with nearly two years out in 1965 and 1966 as chief of CBS' London bureau.

He came to New York as chief correspondent for CBS Reports in 1974, and moved over to 60 Minutes in October 1975.

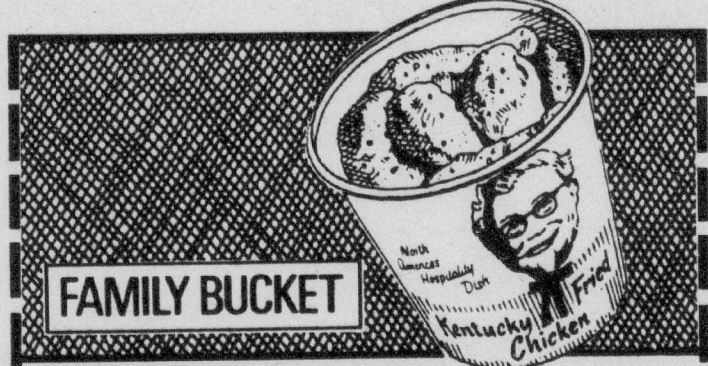
