Premier Francois Legault unveils 30 member Quebec cabinet after big election win

Quebec Premier Francois Legault's new cabinet will have 16 men and 14 women in addition to the premier himself.

Legault unveiled his new cabinet today, which includes mostly familiar faces from his party's first mandate and a handful of newly elected members after his Coalition Avenir Quebec won 90 of the legislature's 125 seats in the Oct. 3 provincial election.

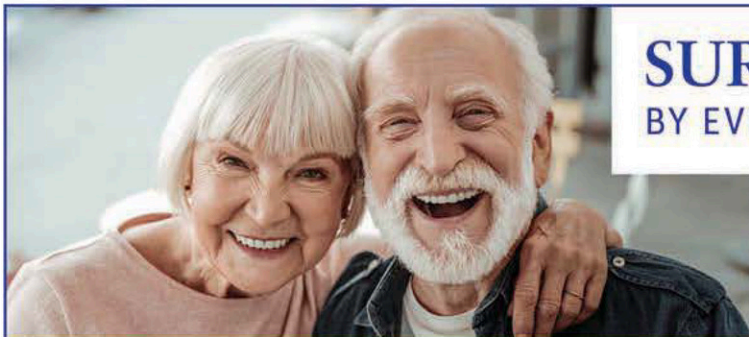
Phelps Helps was presented with a \$25,000 cheque from Canada Post's Community Foundation

through educational and career support. Over the past 10 years since its inception, the organization has grown from one high school tutoring program to six programs that support

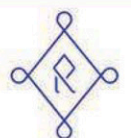

# In praise of quiet books

## Small Pleasures by Clare Chambers

British author Clare Chambers has crafted a small gem of a novel in *Small Pleasures*. Set in 1957 London, this book is described on the dust jacket as “both a mystery and a love story....[It] is a captivating look at the conflict between personal fulfilment and duty, a quintessentially British novel in the style of *The Remains of the Day*, that celebrates the beauty and potential for joy in all things plain and unfashionable.” If you have liked the novels of Ann Patchett (*Bel Canto*) or Tessa Hadley (*Late in the Day*), it is likely that reading *Small Pleasures* will indeed provide you with, at the very least, some small pleasure.

Journalist Jean Swinney is closing in on 40, and leads a life with few if any surprises. At the newspaper where she is employed as a features writer, she contributes items such as the following: “The humble lettuce, if properly dressed can be the foundation of many nutritious family meals. Try serving with baked or fried forcemeat balls for a crisp new touch...” Heady stuff, to be sure. But the day she writes a piece headlined “Men No Longer Needed for Reproduction!” marks the beginning of a new phase in her quiet life. A young woman named Gretchen Tilbury responds to the provocative headline by alerting Jean that she believes her (Gretchen’s) own daughter, aged 10, was the result of a virgin birth, or parthenogenesis. With the blessing of her editor, Jean elects to pursue this story, and heads off to the charming suburb where Gretchen, her daughter Margaret, and Gretchen’s jeweller husband Howard live.

Jean is not expecting much from this visit, but she hopes that it can

flower into a real story. Margaret the daughter is the spitting image of Gretchen the mom, so it seems not totally beyond the realm of the possible that there actually was no father involved in her conception. Another reason for Jean to hope that there is some truth to Gretchen’s claim is her own living situation; she lives with her mother, an embittered and demanding widow, whose only interactions with the wider world involve complaining and disapproval. Jean’s reasoning is that, if she can steer this story beyond the small time, it may signal an end to her own dreary living situation. Fortunately, Gretchen agrees readily to the series of verifying medical tests, largely blood work, for herself and her daughter.

Over a short period, and despite the distance between their homes, Jean and Gretchen form a solid bond, and little Margaret is enfolded into that relationship. But what of Howard, the rather older husband who has totally embraced Margaret as his own? He too fully approves of the quest to find out if Margaret is the product of a virgin birth, and as the mystery is pursued, the four key players soon become more than acquaintances. ‘Nuff said.

This book offers a wonderful, enlightening picture of 50s Britain and its typical middle-class residents during that quieter, rather dull time; however, the book does open with a newspaper account of a devastating train crash that took place in 1957. As the story unfolds, the tie between that incident and the Gretchen/Jean/Howard/Margaret story becomes clear.

This book has been described as a love story/mystery, and I was quite taken up with the facts of the parthenogenesis case. Is this possible? How? What role did Gretchen’s brief sojourn in a hospital as a teenager for treatment of her rheumatic condition play? Jean explores all the possibilities and interviews Gretchen’s hospital roommates and staff members in her hunt for the truth, all the while hoping that a virgin birth did take place: this possibility will both help Gretchen’s situation, and naturally put Jean into the journalistic spotlight.

Beyond the four principals, whom the reader gets to know quite well, Jean’s needy, cranky mother is very effectively drawn, both fascinating and a bit cringeworthy. It seems that her relationship with Jean is typical of the time, but would likely not be the

same today. I expected—and hoped for—the occurrence of fireworks between the two, but middle-class, middle-aged Londoners simply DID NOT DO that. Any emotion stronger than weak Earl Grey tea was simply squelched. The small pleasures of this life, “—the first cigarette of the day; a glass of sherry before Sunday lunch; a bar of chocolate parceled out to last a week; a newly published library book, still pristine and untouched by other hands; the first hyacinths of spring; a neatly folded pile of ironing, smelling of summer; the garden under snow; an impulsive purchase of stationery —had been encouragement enough.”

At 337 pages, and in slightly-larger-than-normal print, *Small Pleasures* was an easy read, and for me, an enjoyable one. The author depicts her characters, situations, and settings with ease, and her wonderful sense of humour provided some smiles and the occasional giggle along the way. There was no time when I was bored or annoyed with the pace, and it was easy (although frustrating) to relate to Jean’s situation. If you don’t insist on non-stop action and excitement in your novels, this could be the one for you!

Best-selling author Clare Chambers has written 11 novels. In 1999, her novel *Learning to Swim* won the Romantic Novel of the Year Award. She currently lives in Kent, England with her husband and family, and is Professor of Political Philosophy and Fellow of Jesus College at the University of Cambridge, specialising in feminist theory.

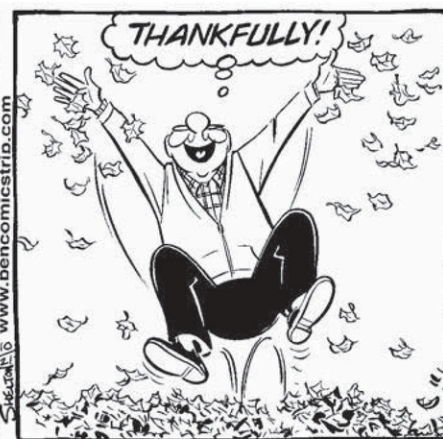
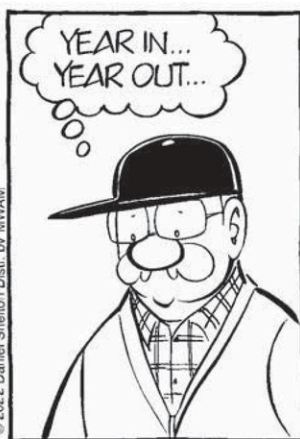

## Empty Bowls looking to fill stomachs once again

This year's edition of the annual empty bowls fundraiser will take place on Saturday Nov 12 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at 37 Moulton Hill in Lennoxville. As has been the case over the last two years, the event will be a simple bowl sale, rather than a community meal.

"It's another edition of empty 'empty bowls,'" Doheny said, explaining that although the origins of the fundraiser come from a movement that pairs potters with a simple meal to combat hunger in the community, the local reality has been that the event does better when people are just invited to come buy the bowls directly.

Doheny estimated that the events have raised close to \$60,000 in the local community since they got

started in 2013, with the 2020 and 2021 bowl sales setting successive records. In 2021, the event sold out of 300 bowls for the first time in its local history, raising around \$8,000 in the process.

"I'm hoping to raise \$10,000 this year if I can get enough bowls finished," the potter said, sharing that Alan Gerrish, Mark Goldberg, and Michael Loomis have also contributed to the overall total. "We're aiming for 400."

Once again, the funds raised will be split between five local causes aimed at helping to combat hunger: Moisson Estrie, The Lennoxville and District Women's Centre, the Cornerstone food bank, the Lennoxville Elementary School breakfast program, and the Bishop's/Champlain food voucher program.

children, teenagers, and adults aged six to thirty. They support 450 people in total, 200 of whom they see weekly. Their success rate is impressive to say the least. Program Director Katie Lowry says, "Of the students who have attended 20 high school sessions with Phelps, we've had zero dropout. That's really encouraging."

Spark is a bilingual program that goes into the classrooms of every elementary school student from grades one to six at the two local elementary schools, Sunnyside Elementary School and l'École primaire du Jardin-des-Frontières, once per month. Phelps' educators run a STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) challenge designed to encourage creative thinking, problem-solving, and innovation. "We use STEM-based education because it lends itself to cross-curricular learning and it's really fun and hands-on," says Lowry. "Students who maybe aren't as strong in traditional academics can have an opportunity to showcase their skill sets and their thinking."

Lowry says the grant will aid in supporting their staff and in purchasing new materials for the program. "Phelps' real strength is its people," she says. "Our support program has a team of three educators because we're in 19 classrooms every month so it will support our

team, primarily." Last year was the pilot year for the program, meaning that it was in fewer classrooms, "So this will enable us to expand to make sure we're with every student and put more resources into it," she said during the cheque presentation. "Also," she adds, "our STEM activities require a lot of materials and when we have a healthy budget for that, we can do even more creative things in the classroom."

Phelps believes that the sooner children start their program, the better. "We build the kids' attachment to us because we want them to come for academic tutoring in high school. If they're attached to us young, they're more likely to join us later," Lowry says. "The reaction to the program has been fantastic so far," she adds. "The parents love it, the kids love it, and the teachers really see the difference."

"Canada Post is thrilled to be giving this money to Phelps Helps. I'm very happy that we're helping children," says Sylvie Ouellette, manager of Canada Post's Rte. Maple location in Stanstead. The Community Foundation has granted \$2.1 million so far this year, she says, and, "...over \$12.3 million to 1,100 projects across Canada" since 2012, according to their website. Lowry expressed the organization's appreciation for the grant by saying, "It's a long haul, but we're not going anywhere thanks to things like this."

Christian Dube in health, Eric Girard in finance and Genevieve Guilbault, who takes on transport while conserving her deputy premier post.

Newcomers entering cabinet include former Parti Quebecois cabinet minister Bernard Drainville in education and Kateri Champagne Jourdain, the first Indigenous woman elected to

the national assembly, as employment minister.

In 2018, Legault announced a 26-member cabinet and achieved gender parity for about three months before a cabinet shuffle.

Legault had said previously his aim was to have a cabinet that would be composed of between 40 and 60 per cent women.

# Open to the Spirit

Today's word: Crossroads

1) As an English teacher, and later as a youth counselor and religious educator, I liked to use Robert Frost's famous poem, *The Road Less Traveled* to speak to the power of making choices. Middle and high school students especially could easily identify with facing a fork in the road, weighing crucial life decisions in the now that could shape their lives for years to come. One day I brought a forked branch to pass around the circle in our youth group discussion, and one by one they each held the branch and spoke about choices they were facing. Line by line we read the poem together, mining it for multiple dimensions of meaning. Decades later one student wrote me about being again at the crossroads.

We all know that feeling of standing at the crossroads; it's not just a once in a lifetime event. I still see so many singing lines that invite deeper reflection. In the deep woods of our lives looking for the path that will take us where we need to go? Hesitant, we're aware we may not be able to come back to change our path, knowing as Frost says, "how way leads onto way." Knowing also

that choosing a path will predicate other choices down the road we can hardly anticipate. New choices will evolve out of previous ones as we make our way further along. And indeed, doesn't every moment pivot on choices large or small? We make countless decisions in the course of a day that we're hardly aware of. Waking up and planning the day, each word we speak, each purchase we make, even what we choose to fix for breakfast.

Frost's poem speaks of a dual choice. Yet so many of life's pivotal choices are not so clearly laid out. Many of the roads less traveled by haven't been forged yet. The poet Antonio Machado speaks of this in *Campos de Castilla*, where he writes: "...wanderer, there is no road, the road is made by walking." Humanity stands now at a crossroads with infinite choices. We know we cannot go back and change the path we chose at the turn of the Industrial Age. We cannot retrace our steps through countless wars and blind ecological decisions we hardly knew we were making, much less their consequences. From where we stand, we need imagination to see that our choices now require all the wisdom and compassion we as a species can muster. Collectively the path we've chosen has led us up to the edge of

a bottomless cliff. I pray we will find a new way we've not invented yet, walking toward not only survival but a new way of being human.

2) The word "crossroads" spoke to me of so many life experiences where I made choices that affected my future. I was tempted to begin sharing a story, but this week I chose to do something different. I used to keep maps in my car for some of my long journeys. If I was lost I would pull over to the side of the road and pause, and look at the map. In most cases there were two or three paths to my journey's end and I would make choices. Do I need a coffee? How much time do I have? Have I ever gone that route, it might be more a more interesting drive? I would then plan my route and start driving. These days we have technology to help us. We listen to the voice of our GPS system, and follow it's directions. Believe me, last month driving around Toronto, I needed that voice on all the multi-lane highways.

In life, what inner voice speaks to you when you are at a crossroads? Jesus in his ministry often had choices to make. Do I remain a carpenter, or become a preacher? Do I travel to Jerusalem where the Roman army is, or stay safe in Galilee? When I visit the Temple do I speak my truth or choose to remain silent when I see sacrilege? Do I speak only to my own community or reach out to the Gentiles as well? For each decision he made bold choice. Fear was never a part of it. In fact, he used the expression "Fear not" many many times in his preaching.

We find ourselves often in life facing difficult choices, both as individuals and as a society. How do we deal with climate change? How do we deal with racism and violence? How can we help the victims of war? Wouldn't it be nice to have a GPS to tell us what to do? If take the time to do a deep search, I believe we all actually do have an inner voice that invites us to choose the path of love and hope. Don't let fear guide you at the crossroads in life.

3) "Two roads diverged in a wood... I took the road less traveled and that has made all the difference." I suppose when Robert Frost penned these famous words he must have been quite a long ways down the road he chose, in order to recognize the impact of the choice he had made. Crossroads are like that. They may seem rather insignificant at the time, but their repercussions may last a lifetime. When we reach a crossroad there are always questions posed. Do we follow our hearts or our heads? Do we play it safe or do we risk failure? Do I have what it takes? Has anyone else ever done this?

One thing we learn when we begin to take risks is that failure is not the end of the world. Strength and resiliency is built up when life is not too easy. Failure encourages greater appreciation for our good fortune when it arrives, for we know what it is to be hungry, unemployed or sick. Failure also breeds humility

and compassion for the misfortune of others. This may be what Jesus was getting at when we called those who were suffering misfortunes "blessed." Indeed there is much to be gained from daring to risk following the road less traveled. Mary Oliver says it best "Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon? Tell me, what is it you plan to do. With your one wild and precious life?" Best wishes on your journey.

# Leadership, experience, and maturity keys to Bishop's women's hockey

Despite a challenging inaugural season in U SPORTS last year, the Bishop's University Gaiters women's ice hockey team are eager to prove doubters wrong, and they made a statement on opening night, defeating the Carleton Ravens 2-1 to kick off the 2022-2023 campaign.

The Gaiters finished at the bottom of the Réseau du sport étudiant du Québec (RSEQ) division last year with three wins and 12 losses. The team also lost several veteran players during the off-season. But after a strong recruitment class and intense training camp, the team is ready.

"The training camp has been great and all of the recruits, we had like seven new recruits helping the team, five now, but that hasn't changed the lineup. Also we lost only four players, so it means the majority, the core, has stayed," said Bishop's head coach Dominic Desmarais.

While two of the new recruits dropped out to focus on academics, according to Desmarais, the rest have already shot up in the lineup. There are two currently slotted in a top six forward role, he explained, and one of them has established themselves as a bonafide top-three defender.

And while the new recruits are standing out early in the season, Desmarais noted one of the major changes compared to last season is there is more depth on the squad. Not only are the players from last year's team more experienced, he told The Record, but they're also wiser.

"We haven't done anything very different compared to previous years. It's just that the maturity of the team is there and the leadership is better because they're older and they know what to expect. And so for a new recruit, it is very easy to come into the room," Desmarais said.

And the maturity of the squad is already paying off. The Gaiters

started their season on the road in Carleton, where they pummeled the Ravens with roughly 77 shot attempts, according to Desmarais. Bishop's ended up outshooting their opponents with 38 shots on goal to 19.

First-year forward Justine Turcotte opened the scoring for the Gaiters midway through the second period — her first career goal in U SPORTS. Meanwhile, Neleh Vigneau Sargeant, the team's Rookie of the Year last season, notched the game winning goal late in the third period.

"Since I've been here, like the last five years, we have been working on core values and more on concepts than like strategy or x's and o's, so we haven't changed anything in the last year. We're just going in with the same aspect and the players just took charge," said Desmarais.

The Gaiters will continue to play on the road for the next three games, facing off against McGill on Friday, Concordia on Oct. 30, and the Université de Montréal on Nov. 4. They only return to Lennoxville on Nov. 6 when they play the University of Ottawa at Jane and Eric Molson Arena.

"The first four games that we play is the other team's homecoming, so that's good for us to face that kind of challenge, especially with a young group. We want to have that kind of challenge," said Desmarais, adding Concordia and McGill, while tough, are also younger now.

There is no doubt that Concordia, for example, will be a difficult opponent, he continued, sharing their recruitment class was also very strong, but he has instructed his team to keep things simple on the ice. He wants them to forget about the noise, and instead focus on effort.

"We pre-scout, we do our homework, but at the same time, we don't want to give too much information. We want our group to play light, and even if they're making mistakes, we don't really care right now. We want them to

play loose, play light," Desmarais told The Record.

Since joining the Gaiters in 2018, Desmarais has always preached patience and living in the moment. He wants Bishop's to be the hardest working team in the league because the only way they will put up a fight with giants like Concordia and McGill

is by matching their intensity.

"Yes, we changed a few things, but at the end, the experience helped us to build our team identity and we're just like, not rebuilding, but we're just keeping the same path that we started last year and it's going faster now," Desmarais shared in a phone interview on Wednesday.

We have some serious issues to address in this province, and I think they should take priority over the language in which we address them.

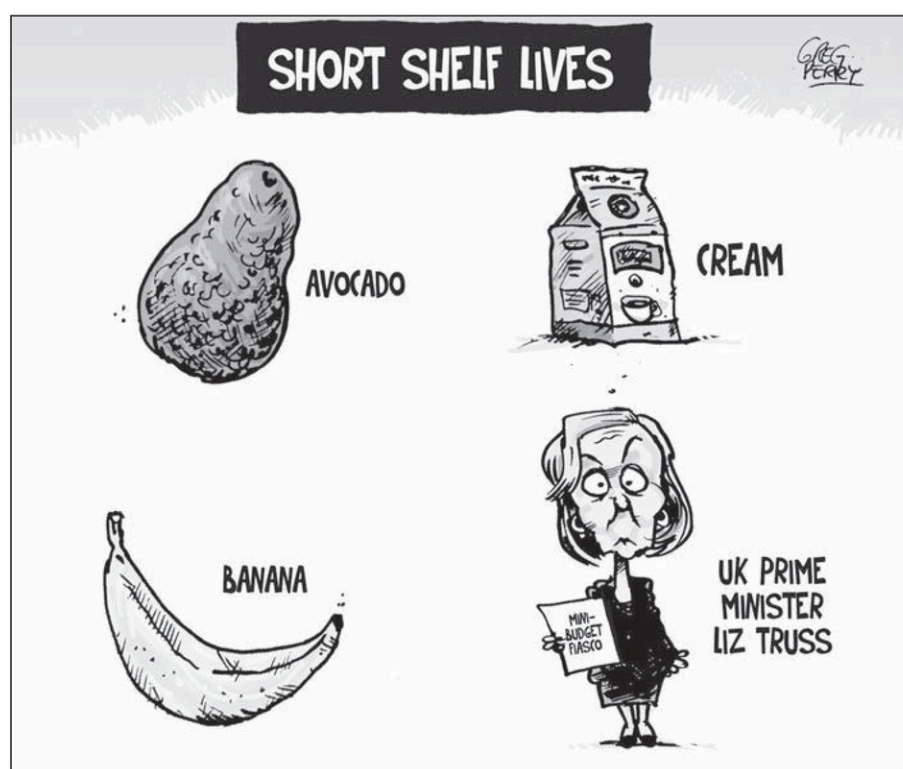
Oh wait, that's not true. I guess it really is important that seniors in CHSLDs be able to beg for a bath in French.

# Sherbrooke tattoo shop uses ink to raise \$7,348 for Canadian Cancer Society

As part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Pink Tattoo, a tattoo and piercing shop in Sherbrooke, held a special fundraiser on Wednesday for the Canadian Cancer Society.

Amélie Dostie, a co-owner of Pink Tattoo, told The Record that one of her colleagues proposed the idea last April. The entire team, six full time artists and several support staff, eagerly jumped on board in support of breast cancer awareness and the Canadian Cancer Society.

The event, which they called Pink Ribbon Day, brought in 63 clients, Dostie shared. She said tattoo artists normally see between one to five clients every day. On Wednesday, Dostie personally inked 17 clients, noting it was a rewarding, albeit exhausting, day of tattooing.

"We had an objective of \$4,000 and we didn't think we'd be able to fill up our schedules, but after about an hour of putting up the event, my schedule filled up and everyone else quickly followed, it was really a great success," Dostie said, adding they managed to shatter their goal.

The tattoo shop raised a total of \$7,348 for cancer research. Clients were asked to contact their artist of choice to book an appointment. The tattoo artists each provided unique designs for a flash sale incorporating the pink ribbon synonymous with breast cancer awareness.

According to Dostie, it was a long day, but the artists buckled down and gave a full effort to fulfill each clients' desired tattoo. She added that 100 per cent of the proceeds from the fundraiser — the payments for the tattoos — will be given to the Canadian Cancer Society.

## Y4Y Quebec building a bilingual human library in Sherbrooke

Next Tuesday, Oct 25, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., Y4Y Quebec is hoping to transform the Bistro Kaapeh on Frontenac Street in Sherbrooke into a living library for the first of three

Meet Your Neighbour / Salut les voisins gatherings the organization has planned over the next few months across the province.

"It's an adaptation of the Human Library Project," said Gabe Steinbach, who has been coordinating the new project along with Adela Kwok. Steinbach clarified that the Y4Y project has no formal link to the storytelling project that came out of Denmark in the early 2000s, but was inspired by their approach. "What we're doing is adapting that concept by making it focused on bilingualism."

Kwok explained that the basic idea is to have a series of "human books" available for conversation at the event; people who can share perspectives and

experience that might be different from what the "readers" — participants, may have lived in their own lives. In the case of the Y4Y gatherings, there is a specific goal of reaching across linguistic communities, although the coordinators also said that the selection committee was tasked with finding a diverse and challenging set of people to work with.

"You sign up and pick which stories you would like to engage with," Kwok said, explaining that each of the up to 25-30 participants should be able to talk with a few of the speakers on a rotating basis, with time in between for refreshments. "We want to build a space that is cozy enough to host conversations like the ones we're going to have."

The coordinators said that although the event is built around trying to generate positive cross-cultural and intergenerational exchanges, they were also conscious in planning that some of the stories shared might touch on sensitive subject matter.

"We've been very sensitive with trying to make sure that our human book participants are looked after," Steinbach said, adding that part of the purpose of having people sign up in advance was to help make sure that everyone coming is aware of the community guidelines. "There is a storytelling focus, but there is a lot that could be related to trauma."

Kwok, meanwhile, pointed out that although there might be an inclination on the part of some people to avoid discomfort or challenging topics, the selection committee also felt like there is value and possibility in encouraging intersection between people who have lived very different lives.

"This is exactly the kind of work that Y4Y Quebec should be doing," said Adrienne Winrow, the organization's Executive Director, sharing that she considers the upcoming Sherbrooke event a trial run not just for the events to come at the start of next year in Montreal and Quebec City, but also possibly for future gatherings

of the same kind. "We think we've created a really great event here that has the potential to allow people to encounter perspective that they may not otherwise."

Winrow said that there are still a number of spots available for the Sherbrooke event.

"It is a fun and free chance to build community," she said, encouraging anyone interested to register at <https://www.y4yquebec.org> and check out more information on the five "human books" who will be available for conversation next week.

"These are people from the community that we're hosting the event in," Kwok said, explaining that in Sherbrooke, many of the connections were made in connection with the local artistic and slam poetry community through Le Tremplin 16-30.

"(They) brought us a very interesting and eclectic group of applicants that we never would have had otherwise," she said.

interview.

Comeau joined the church choir when she was 10 years old and loved every minute of it. It was her first step in becoming an entertainer. She taught herself to play bass and guitar and a little drum. It was easy for her to learn to play by ear.

"When I was a teenager, I thought that it was so cool to have a mother who was a singer in bars and dance halls. I loved singing with her when she was rehearsing.

I was young but I was learning everything I could and taking it in" she shared.

Comeau's grandfather, the late Len Cormier, took her to see her mother perform as often as he could and as soon as she was of age, they both followed Sonia Cormier's career.

She said that her grandad did some country line dancing with her so she always had a good dance

partner for these nights out. He was also there to support her when she decided she was ready for the stage. She loved him very much and they had a great relationship.

"My first experiences in front of a public came with entering talent contests. I was 19. The first one was at Bar Chez Helene and winning made it more real to me. It was motivating. I also entered many of these talent shows. There was one in Bury on Canada Day and many others," she said, laughing.

Comeau was 20 when she first started being asked to replace singers in bands. She also replaced Sonia Bisson playing with Stephane Fortin and with every gig she honed her skills and gained confidence.

After a while she started working full time as a duo with Steve Dusseault locally known for his Elvis impersonation. They played the bar circuit and special events and it lasted quite a while.

She has been performing many

musical genres but her heart belongs to country music. She feels that when she sings country music it is easier to find the right emotion.

She also explained it is harder for her to play her instrument while she sings. The concentration required to play makes it more difficult to get into the songs she sings but she's working hard to achieve doing both. Songwriting is also something she wants to keep tackling.

"I have written so many songs. I write all the time and I find it easier to do it in English because the same lyrics can apply to different situations. It is up to people to understand the songs the way they want to as opposed to French with words so precise it leaves no room to the imagination" she stressed.

She told me there's no music to her songs yet and she's waiting for the right person to collaborate with. She added that she deplores that in Quebec you have to make records in French if you want to make it and

be a performer at all the summer events.

Last weekend she performed at Bar La Cachette with Noemi Goulet and Chantal Marois. But her music life has been kind of quiet lately. She said it was alright for now.

"I have a five-month-old baby so I had to slow down quite a bit. It is fine with me even if I miss terribly being on stage. I suppose this time off gives me the opportunity to learn more songs and to be with my kids" she added.

She agrees to do some gigs once in a while and specially if they are country music events. Her love for country music is genuine. She has a beautiful voice just like her mother and if her daughter follows her footsteps like she did, it will be three generation of great singers/entertainers.

I keep thinking that the late Lennoxville barber Len Cormier must be so proud of his daughter and granddaughter.

# La Station Cheese Factory inaugurates new Farmhouse Cheese Economuseum

The five members of the Routhier-Bolduc family, co-owners of La Station Cheese Factory, gathered together this week for the inauguration of their Farm Cheese Economuseum, a new touristic feature for the business.

According to a press release, several activities are now in place to enhance a visit to the cheese factory, including an immersive room, which allows visitors to feel the exact temperature and humidity required to create the proper conditions for aging cheese. Visitors can also test their sense of smell to detect elements found on the farm and in the cheeses. Visitors can try to recognize the different scents and then make associations during the cheese tasting.

With this new project, which required several months of work, the owners wanted to improve the customer experience by creating a discovery path where visitors can better follow all the steps of cheese making, from grazing to packaging. The tour ends with a breathtaking view of the aging rooms, thanks to a glass wall. After the tour, visitors can shop at the store, which offers organic cheeses, as well as some favorites from regional artisans.

“Meeting visitors has always been at the heart of our mission and we wanted to offer an authentic experience that would communicate our craft, our history and the artisanal process of our cheese production,” Simon-Pierre Bolduc, general manager and co-owner of La Station explained in a press release.

The company is in the process of obtaining certification for its Farmhouse Cheese designation. A farmer’s cheese is made by a producer-cheesemaker according to traditional techniques from milk coming only from their farm. It is the first Quebec term to be authorized by the Conseil

des appellations réservées et des termes valorisants (CARTV).

La Station Cheese Factory is a family business that has been involved in agriculture, food processing and tourism for four generations. In 2008, the Bolduc sons officially joined the company as co-owners.

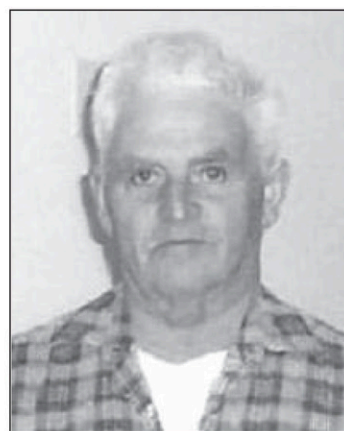

Apple pie! Pumpkin spice! Buttered rum! This is how we embrace autumn at our home bar.

Despite the drop in temperatures, cocktails flavored for fall don't need to taste deep, brooding or heavy. There are plenty of ways to harness the ingredients we associate with the season to craft cocktails that remain light and bright, yet also richly satisfying.

It's also an excellent opportunity to explore liquors you might not normally be drawn to. One of the fascinating aspects of cocktails is the unexpected ways that liquors can be transformed depending on how and with what they are mixed.

These transformations give us the space to experiment and discover drinks we never knew we would enjoy. This is where "I don't like rum" becomes "I like rum when..."

### PUMPKIN SPICE MARTINI

This is your pumpkin spice latte of cocktails. A quick reduction of apple cider provides sweet and tangy notes that play perfectly with pumpkin pie spices. Naturally sweet bourbon is excellent in this cocktail, but vodka also is an excellent choice. Keep a close eye on the cider during the final five minutes of simmering. As it reduces to a syrup, it can quickly go from thick and delicious to burned and smoking. The

combination of chocolate and orange bitters is wonderful, but if you only have one, the cocktail still will be delicious.

- 1 cup apple cider
- 1/8 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 3 ounces vodka
- Dash chocolate bitters
- Dash orange bitters
- 6 to 10 granules kosher salt
- Ice cubes

In a saucepan over low, simmer the cider and pumpkin pie spice until thick and reduced to 2 tablespoons, 10 to 15 minutes. Cool completely, then pour into a cocktail shaker (use a silicone spatula to scrape the pan to get all of the syrup). Add the bourbon or vodka, chocolate bitters, orange bitters and salt. Shake with ice cubes. Strain into a coupe.

### SPICED APPLE COCKTAIL

Slices of fresh apple add both flavorful juice and gentle sweetness to this bourbon-based cocktail. Use apples with high acidity and lots of flavor, such as Honeycrisp or Macoun. Licor 43 is a Spanish liqueur with vanilla notes, while Ancho Reyes has mild chili heat. The combination creates a sweet, savory and gently spicy cocktail.

- 2 large, thin slices fresh apple
- 1/4 ounce agave or simple syrup
- 2 ounces bourbon
- 1/4 ounce Licor 43
- 1/4 ounce Ancho Reyes
- Dash orange bitters
- 6 to 10 granules kosher salt
- Ice, cubes and crushed

In a stirring glass, aggressively muddle the apple slices and syrup. Add the bourbon, Licor 43, Ancho Reyes, bitters and salt. Stir with ice cubes, then double strain into a coupe filled halfway with crushed ice.

### BUTTERED RUM

Traditionally, a Buttered Rum is a warm cocktail in which a pat of butter is melted into a heated blend of rum, apple cider and spices. To give this wonderful flavor combination year-round appeal, I borrowed a technique often used with whiskey - fat washing. This involves adding a flavorful fatty ingredient, such as bacon or butter, to a liquor. After a brief infusion, it is chilled so the fat is easily strained out, leaving only its flavor behind. In this case, the result is buttery-rich rum, the perfect foil for bright hard apple cider.

- 2 ounces aged rum
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 1/4 ounce orange liqueur
- 1/4 ounce agave or simple syrup
- Pinch grated nutmeg
- Ice cubes

1 ounce hard apple cider  
In a small glass, stir together the rum and butter. Let sit for 5 minutes, then place in the freezer for 10 minutes. Line a mesh cocktail strainer with cheesecloth, then pour the butter-rum mixture through it and into a cocktail shaker. Discard the butter. Add the orange liqueur, syrup and nutmeg, then shake with ice cubes. Strain into a coupe, then top with the cider.

**Dear Terrified:** You need to contact the National Domestic Violence Hotline at 800-799-7233 immediately. They will counsel you on how to proceed and how to talk your friend into getting the help that she needs.

Ideally, your friend would be contacting them herself, but it sounds like she is unwilling to do so at this point. Good for you for keeping your friend safe.

**Dear Annie:** A small group of "friends" from work has been cultivated over the past one to two years. We are all in our 40s-50s. We've bonded through some after-work events and activities. At first, I was really happy with this development because I felt like I had finally found my people. However, as time wears on, I realize that I'm the background friend.

## Remember the past, plan for the future

Mark Twain said, "If you tell the truth, you don't have to remember anything."

Putting that into a bridge context, is it true that if we bid accurately, we don't have to remember anything else? Of course not! When playing a bridge deal, it is important to remember the past – the bidding – when planning for the future – the making or breaking of the contract.

In today's deal, South is in four spades. West leads the heart king. Which 10 tricks should South have his eyes on?

South's opening bid was a classic weak two: a good six-card suit and some 6-10 high-card points. Despite having such a strong hand, North knew that a slam was unlikely.

When the dummy came down, South saw 10 tricks: six spades, one heart, one diamond and two clubs. Without further ado, he said, "Ace, please." However, his jaw dropped onto the table when East produced a trump. Suddenly, 10 tricks had shrunk to nine.

South, as always at trick one, should have taken a moment to wonder what might go wrong. If he had recalled the

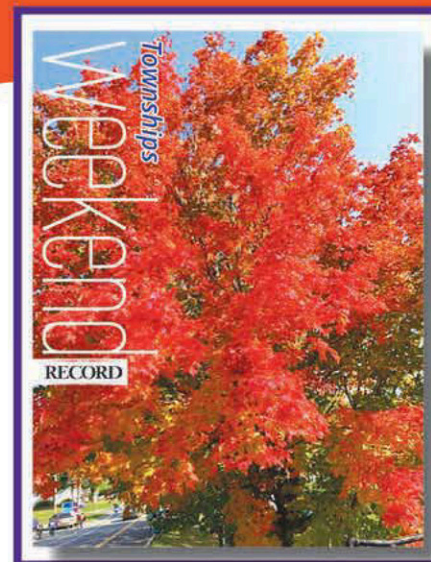
auction, he would have realized that a 7-0 heart split was a danger, especially given the prevailing vulnerability. The heart two should have been played from the dummy at trick one, not the ace. As it doesn't help West to switch, he continues with top hearts. South ruffs the third, draws trumps and finally cashes the heart ace in safety.

If there are no trumps left, a winner at trick one will still be a winner at trick 13.
