More like Mardi Gras than social protest

I don't know what it is they say; It doesn't matter anyway, I'm against it, I'm against it!
— Horsefeathers

By nature, I'm a Marxist — Groucho, not Karl. Two weeks ago, I went to Hamilton's Aquarius Theatre for the opening of John Guare's *The House of Blue Leaves* with which someone close to me was involved. I rubbed elbows with the local art patrons, all beautifully barbered, glittering at throat and wrist, oozing self-confidence at every pore. Then a few blocks through this blue-collar town to 'Hamilton's Action Days' — a flexing of union muscle that hadn't been seen since the 30s, as many as 500,000 demonstrators expected.

Busload after busload of R.C.M.P., O.P.P., Toronto Metropolitan Police, Riot Squads, SWAT teams, Storm Troopers and anyone else the government could press into service. Little Sarah Polley, the darling of *Avonlea*, had told how police charged her peaceful demonstration at Ottawa and broke two of her teeth. Canada's Communist Party (Marxist-Leninist—Karl, not Groucho) published a special "Hamilton Shutdown Edition". But the first demonstrator I met was protesting anti-smoking legislation. The next wore a gorilla suit. Another

dressed as a tuna waved a sign declaring "69¢ Tuna Another Tory Lie".

Teachers cried "Cuts hurt kids" and "Save junior kindergarten!" and "These cuts won't heal" while chanting in unison "Hey Hey! Ho Ho! Mike Harris has got to go!" I talked to a militant lesbian feminist who'd been to several demonstrations because she hated what the premier had done to women. She invited all women to 'Shut Down Bay Street' on March 8. "Celebrate International Women's Day by Filling Bay Street with Women Who Won't Obey!"

I talked to a teach who thought secret and sinister forces were manipulating Mike Harris into vengeful and totalitarian legislation like Bills 26

and 31, which gave the government expanded powers while exempting it from responsibility. "Something's going on that is not right!" he said. "It's not right!"

Meanwhile, the Salvation Army was handing out free coffee to demonstrators and people paraded in wheelchairs out of fear for their disability pensions. The public service was set to strike at midnight. Harris has amended the law to allow the hiring of scab labour.

Police were standing about in clusters smiling and talking. Their final instructions before leaving the station had been "Smile. Be nice. Have fun." Some demonstrators had brought their kids along and everybody seemed to be

enjoying themselves. "Hey Hey! Ho Ho! Mike Harris has got to go!" This was more like Mardi Gras than social protest. Groucho's song kept going round and round in my head: "I don't know what it is they want or who commenced it. But I'm against it!"

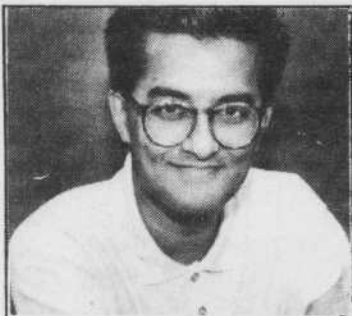
Further down the street, Mike Harris was at the Convention Centre protected by 200 riot police. He has already stated that no amount of protest will affect policy. "Ontario is open for business." Public demonstrations, he said, "are an old-fashioned tactic."

Not to be left out of the festivities, I cast about for a cause and shouted "Ban the bagpipes!"

Nobody noticed.

Zillah Loney: Life begins in the middle

LENNOXVILLE — For visual artist Zillah Loney, a mid-life "crisis" has propelled her on a road to a rich and rewarding career.

"I was getting restless at my job at Bishop's University supervising teachers, so I left to take fine arts at the university," said the 46-year-old printmaker.

The London, Ontario, native had previously studied art history at Queens University and took various art classes throughout the years, but never fully committed herself to following her muse.

"I never had the courage to do what I'm doing now," said Loney, who raised three children and also worked as an elementary school teacher in Toronto and North Hatley as well as an art education lecturer at Bishop's.

Today, Loney is finding success quickly with her bright and boldly colored monoprints that exude warmth and whimsy.

THREE GALLERIES

In the past three weeks alone, her work has been picked up by galleries in Lennoxville, North Hatley and Toronto, Ontario.

"I put together a portfolio and I had a trip to Toronto planned to visit an old friend, and it was always in the back of my mind, I said I'm going to go to a gallery there," Loney said. "Being 46, I had the maturity — or the balls — to go to the top. I went to a very reputable art gallery, the Mitchell Gallery."

Owner David Mitchell was very curt with Loney at the start.

"He said I don't want to see your work, I see artists every day and I'm not interested. I said that's fine, maybe you can just look at it and point me in

the right way. And he looked through it and he got nicer as he looked, and said Yes I like your stuff, and I would like it in my gallery."

Loney left six monoprints at the showplace on Toronto's Scollard St. She returned to the Townships full of confidence.

"Two days later, I thought, well I've always loved Galerie Jeannine Blais in North Hatley and I know some of my work is in the naïf style — she went through my portfolio and she was very encouraging and said she would like to carry my stuff. In particular, she liked the animals, the pigs, chickens and cows. She felt they were creative and fun and whimsical."

UPLANDS MUSEUM

All that happened before last weekend's vernissage of her first solo exhibition at Uplands Museum in Lennoxville, attended by close to 100 people, where Loney sold half of the 18 or 19 monoprints and collages on display. Not bad for someone who just began creating monoprints seriously at the

end of September.

The theme of the exhibit, running through April 14, is "Gardens of Iris and Other Traditions". Much of Loney's work is inspired by the gardening and quilting traditions of her friend Iris Brown.

"I've been friends with Iris maybe about 10 years and she's definitely a Townships personality. She's very well-known for her quilting and gardening," Loney said fondly. "She always has her skirt on, and little black boots and a pearl necklace, and her hair is in a pompadour."

Loney often finds the 76-year-old dynamo on her tractor mowing the lawn, or working on her vegetable garden or flower bed.

But it is for her quilting that Iris is most noted for.

Loney said she is an inspiring influence.

"She's someone that embodies the traditions and the personality of Townshippers. She believes in the work ethic and the traditional method. Everything has to be totally hand-quilted — she's against machine quilting."

She founded the Iris Quilters, a group now known as Lennoxville Quilters.

Loney said there is just something about Iris and her surrounding that begs for it to be captured in her art.

"The picket fence, the setting of the foothills, the garden," Loney said are some of the things that captured her interest.

"She was very embarrassed at first," Loney added. "She said, Don't show my wrinkled old face, but she was quite thrilled and touched by this tribute to her."

Loney was equally inspired by her own surroundings on Lennoxville's Riverview Road.

"Our neighbors, the Fearon family, have cows and sheep and one of them has prize roosters," said Loney, who often takes walking trips around the area.

Loney said credit must be given to Bishop's University professor Ophra Benazon for encouraging her to explore

printmaking.

"She was the one I think who was instrumental and encouraging me to break away from the nest, the cocoon of the university and break out on my own," said Loney. "She suggested I try Atelier Daumier, which is a co-operative printmaking studio run through Galerie Horace in Sherbrooke."

It is here that she is mastering the process of monotype, whereby a single print is produced by applying pressure to transfer an image painted on one surface to another surface.

The image is painted on a smooth surface, such as plexiglass — usually in oil colors diluted with turpentine or linseed oil — then a sheet of paper is placed over the completed image and burnished by hand or run through an etching press.

Keeping these basic techniques, Loney often uses pieces of cut paper for hard, sharp edges, and inked shapes and

textured objects for added color and variety.

Loney can be found four days a week at the studio on Albert Street in downtown Sherbrooke.

"It's a complete change for me because I've always been involved with people," she added. "It's just me here with my presses and I like it a lot. It's very conducive to the creative process. The days pass by very quickly."

Loney received an unusual affirmation of her work during a course she took at Bishop's last year.

"I realized maybe I was onto something when somebody stole my artwork last year and signed her own name," Loney recalled. "I was very upset at the time. I got it back by confronting her, but I promised not to pursue it further."

Although Loney said she would make monoprints even if nobody else was interested in them, she is pleased with her recent success.

"It's very encouraging, and I just feel so right about it," she said. "When you reach mid-point in your life, you re-assess your contribution to society. I never would have had the courage 20 years ago to do this. I used to be so preoccupied with what other people would think, would they like it, and now I know what matters is how I feel about it."

"I get a feeling of accomplishment," added Loney, who discovered at mid-life that the rest of her life was just beginning.

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McCully and Keith-Ryan write mom's guide to Quebec

COWANSVILLE — When Heather Keith-Ryan and Sharon McCully get together, be it on a drive to Montreal's staid anglo institution Centaur Theatre or at a meeting of an advisory board on provincial and national issues, talk invariably turns to the state of anglophones in Quebec, its political problems, the language issue and the misconceptions the rest of the country has about *la belle province*.

After the passage of Bill 178, forbidding English on outdoor signs, anglophones across the country and the United States seem to have an image of Quebec as a cold, unwelcoming land where only French is spoken and turning right on red is illegal.

"Politics may have given a false impression of Quebec after Bill 178," said Keith-Ryan, who owned a bed and breakfast at the time. "Tourists had an impression that nobody could speak English here. Finally, this past referendum was the clinching moment. People need to know what Quebec is about."

Journalist McCully and political activist Keith-Ryan, each a mother of five grown children, decided to do something about the problem. After four years in the making, the result is a new book titled *Quebec: Bonjour, eh?*, a primer to the

province for English speakers everywhere.

BOOK LAUNCH

The "mom's guide" to Quebec, which will have its official launch on March 17 at the Book Nook in Sutton, extends a welcoming hand to people around the country and across the border.

"I really love this province and I'm really sad when I travel outside Quebec and I see people talking about Quebec just from a political point of

view," said McCully, known to *Record* readers as our Brome Lake reporter and editor of the weekly *Brome County News*.

"Ordinary Quebecers are just like ordinary Canadians anywhere, who have goals and values just like any Quebecer."

"We thought it would be great if a lot of English-speaking people came to Quebec to see that Quebecers are the same as they are," added Keith-Ryan.

It is clear what tourists are afraid of — that in Quebec, nobody speaks English and public signs are incomprehensible. They expect everything from taking a bus tour to going to a hospital's emergency room to be a trial.

The authors are proud of their province and want to dispel the illusions others have of Quebecers.

ENGLISH SPEAKERS

Nobody realizes that three million Quebecers speak English, said Keith-Ryan. That's the total population of each of the seven Canadian provinces.

The book outlines the areas where the anglophones are — Montreal, Laval, the Ottawa Valley, the Laurentians, Lanaudière, the Montérégie, the Eastern Townships and the Gaspé. But it does much more than that.

Although written for tourists, *Quebec: Bonjour, eh?* proves to be a useful tool for any anglophone in Quebec, new and longtime residents alike.

"It's basically everything Heather and I know," McCully said with a hearty laugh. "When we started, we thought it was going to be light and airy, but there's so much information in it."

The comprehensive work illustrates all that Quebec has to offer — what to see and do in each area, its cultural diversity, customs, topography, and flora and fauna. It also

translates the cultural and linguistic landscape of the province by revealing what road and hospital signs mean, what to expect if stopped by a policeman, how to use a phone book, read maps (and sift through more than 550 towns named after saints), and just about every other aspect of *québécois* life. To make things easier, there's also a brief language course featuring essential expressions and questions.

The French translations of words are incorporated directly into the text; there's none of this flipping to the back of the book to look up a word.

REAL QUEBECERS

McCully and Keith-Ryan do not deliberately try to be controversial, but they do step into muddy waters with a chapter on politics, where they point out the futility of arguing about who the real Quebecers are since only native people can truly claim first ownership. Then there's the mention of Lucien Bouchard's challenge to women here to have more children to replenish the dwindling population of *québécois*.

"We put it in innocently," said Keith-Ryan. "We tell it like it is, as mothers are apt to do."

There's also a wonderfully abridged and entertaining history of French people in Canada.

"We thought it was important to talk about the evolution to where we are today, and what's led to French-speaking people's desire to separate," said McCully.

Even though there's nothing like it on the market, the two found it difficult to find a publisher willing to take the book on, and eventually decided to publish it themselves with an initial run of 1000 copies, currently being printed by S&P Publishing, owned by Ashley Sheltus and Charlotte Picard. The writers hope to get

it picked up by a publishing house with a second printing.

"Our objective is to make people feel comfortable here. When they come here, the last thing they need is to worry. They could relax, because it's a fun place to come."

QUEBEC ROOTS

With roots firmly planted in the province, McCully and Keith-Ryan know Quebec well.

McCully was born in New Brunswick (at the same hospital as René Levesque) before moving to the Gaspé, where she was first a reporter then editor of the weekly newspaper *SPEC*. A journalist in Quebec for 18 years, McCully is a former president and current director of the Quebec Community Newspapers Association and a member of the executive of its national counterpart, which represents 680 newspapers. She is also a regular correspondent for CBC radio's *Quebec AM*.

Montreal native Keith-Ryan raised sheep in South Stukely before entering the political arena as a municipal councillor there in 1970. She moved to Mansonville in 1985 and opened a bed and breakfast. She became a licensed real estate agent in 1987, the same year she was elected president of Townshippers' Association. She also ran as an independent candidate in the 1989 provincial election.

Keith-Ryan is also a proud descendant of the Seigneur of Trois Pistoles.

"My grandfather was born in Trois Pistoles," she said enthusiastically. "His first language was French. We're as *pur laine* as anybody else."

But the two concede that a generation ago, it wasn't a priority for anglophones to learn French.

"We led insular lives in the Gaspé and Montreal," said McCully. "There was no need to complicate our lives with a second language. We lived in English, went to school in English, worked in English, we had our social groups. But we're progressive parents. We want more for our kids than we had ourselves."

Quebec's Quiet Revolution and its ensuing language legislation helped change the way the women looked at language and integration into Quebec society.

Today, their children are bilingual beneficiaries of two cultures and the moms wish to pass on the joy of living in a multi-cultural province to people on the outside.

"We think the time is right for this book," said Keith-Ryan, who added they are hoping it will result in new visitors to Quebec this summer.

"If we can get people from Canada to come to Quebec, it can be used in the unity debate," she said.

"We feel we've made a pitch for Canadian unity."

Dangerous women take the stage at Bishop's

LENNOXVILLE — It is fitting that the drama *Dangerous Liaisons* is being staged on this International Woman's Day since women propel the play on-stage and off.

British playwright Christopher Hampton's work of the sexual games and power struggles among 18th-century French aristocracy — based on the novel by Choderlos de Laclos — features six female leading roles. A number of women are also at the helm of the production presented at the Studio Theatre through March 10, including director Ann Hodges, lighting designers Leslie Biles and Veronica Good, and sound designer Lorraine Derocher.

Set in the posh salons and bedrooms of Paris during the late 1700s, *Dangerous Liaisons* follows the unscrupulous Marquise de Merteuil as she attempts to manipulate all those around her. Nothing is precisely as it seems as Merteuil and her idle, decadent court play out games of power, seduction, deceit and honor.

The Bishop's production sports an elegant, multi-panelled set that features paintings and sketches based on works by 18th-century artists Fragonard and Boucher. The pastel-colored atmosphere was designed by Montrealer John Dinning. Luscious costumes were rented from Concordia and McGill universities, as well as the National Theatre School of Canada, and adjusted to fit the actors in the show.

Director Hodges said the play, which spawned the 1988 award-winning film starring Glenn Close, Michelle Pfeiffer

and Uma Thurman, illustrates a diversity of women's roles in society.

"Merteuil plays hardball, Tourvel is trying her best to do what's good and right in the world, Rosemonde is 84 and she's a lively, wise woman. She's the woman who can beat Merteuil in the end. Cecile is the ingénue who goes from innocence to experience, Mme. Volanges is Cecile's mother who is concerned about marrying off her daughter, and questions whether she should marry for love or connections. And Emilie is a prostitute — in the play she's called a courtesan."

Hodges said many of the ways women operated in the

late 18th-century are still true today.

"We all make our choices," said the Winnipeg director. "One of the questions I asked the actors was 'Did their character play within the rules or did they break the rules or bend the rules?' That is still a question in the 20th century."

Hampton wrote the play in the 1980s, using the societal structures and strictures of pre-revolutionary France to comment on the Margaret Thatcher years. The play ends at a significant time in history, before the revolution of the 1790s, and Hampton was also commenting on what the 1990s may bring.

Hodges was attracted to the play's relevance to modern times.

"I liked what it has to say about our world. It's saying a lot about people with power and money and using that to mess up their lives," she said. "We're not far from that in Canada."

Thus, it can serve as a wake-up call.

"A lot of people were very complacent then," said Rose Day, who plays Mme. Volanges. "This is the way society is. We can't change it. A lot of the French nobility was unaware. They didn't know what was going on."

Veronica Good, who plays the upright Tourvel and is the assistant lighting designer, said the play's themes are universal.

"People are still nasty. (Their) actions don't have quite the same stakes now as they did then, adultery is common now, but it still ruins people's lives. We all still play games."

In *Dangerous Liaisons*, Merteuil (played by Alicia Helde) is a master of the game traditionally played by men.

"People who've studied the novel, some say it's a great feminist piece," said Hodges. "We definitely see a woman playing a game as hard as a man does, but that doesn't mean it's a useful game."

Merteuil is an 18th-century Madonna who re-invents herself at every turn and attempts to control everything — and everyone — in her path.

"She has created herself out of necessity because women have been brushed aside and she has created a facade," said Annie Laurie (Mme. Rosemonde). "She didn't want to be brushed aside."

"That's kind of what we're going after," Good said of the direction of the women's movement. "But Merteuil does it in such a devious way, it's kind of hard to call her a feminist. She's such a bitch. Feminism isn't about bitchiness, it's about equality."

This is director Hodges' fourth play at Bishop's, after having helmed *New Anatomies*, *Lion In The Streets* and *Sisters*. The National Theatre

School graduate said women have to work that much harder than men to be taken seriously.

"As a woman, you have to know the lights and sound better than the men, so they won't pull the wool over your eyes," said the Winnipeg-based director.

"There are more and more women coming up the ranks in the last 10 years. I think they are probably more freelance directors and slowly moving into artistic director positions."

Day said the women's movement has certainly come a long way.

"But there's still a long way

to go. Women who take power, when men do it, they are considered strong. Women are called a bitch. When a man vocalizes his opinion, he's strong, she's strident. The attitudes have to change. We have a long way to do, we can't just coast along. There's a lot of work to be done."

Good said society is still the same.

"The upper echelon is still the same. The top stayed the same and women have come up to it, but how far have we come?"

Working as a technician on various theatrical productions in the Townships, Good said she has felt the brunt of oppressive behavior.

"Crews are generally very male and you always get some chauvanistic treatment. A couple of shows that come to Centennial, when they come to the loading dock they say, 'Where's the crew?' I say 'There's a reason why I'm here. I can do the job, hand me the equipment!'," Good remembered. "I'm not a quota, I'm part of the crew."

"It's not even a job bracket. It's just the general treatment person to person. It's humanism."

However, Good said it is up to women to earn respect.

"There's tons of women who call themselves feminists who don't believe in working for their own equal treatment."

Dangerous Liaisons plays at Bishop's University's Centennial Theatre nightly at 8 p.m. through March 10, with matinees on March 8 and 10. Tickets: \$7. For reservations, call (819) 822-9692.

A tribute to the women of country music

Today, people around the world are celebrating International Woman's Day so let's pay the women of country a little tribute.

Last year was a great one for female country artists: They broke through the traditionally male-dominated scene and came into their own.

Women have been breaking sales records, ruling the charts and making history on tour and the word is out that 1996 will go down as the Year of the Woman.

There are multiple examples of this already: Garth Brooks was bumped from the top spot on the country albums chart when Shania Twain's *The Woman In Me* re-claimed the top spot, bypassing both Brooks and Alan Jackson.

Reba McEntire was country's Top Touring Act the past two years and there's no indication that's going to change.

The Country Music Association Album of the Year Award went to Patty Loveless, while Pam Tillis produced her own album, which is a rarity among men or women.

Two major all-female tours were announced, the first one featuring Pam Tillis, Lorrie Morgan and Carlene Carter, while the second one reunited Mary Chapin Carpenter, Trisha Yearwood and Kim Richey.

Alison Kraus, a female fiddler, stunned the industry by walking off with four CMA awards in one night.



Country Connection

What's the explanation for all this? Some women in country music do everything in their power to be different and have their own identity.

If you listen to the radio you can easily tell them apart. They have a totally different sound. On the other hand, it seems many of our country hunks think that sounding alike will get them airplay.

Don't get me wrong, but in this male-oriented world women probably have to work harder in order to get the same credibility and achieve the same goals.

If you look at country music history, there's very few women on the charts before the 70s, and only a handful of them made it big.

In the 90s, the list is getting

impressive and their albums are selling like crazy. Now due to their persistence these performers can afford to be sexy without destroying their image of hard-working, intelligent, innovative and fresh ladies with a career.

Here's a couple of reviews of albums recorded by women who are doing just great:

Chely Wright: Right In The Middle of It (Polydor)

For her first album, *Woman In The Moon*, Wright won the Academy of Country Music Award for Top New Female Vocalist.

Now album number two puts her right in the middle of a very promising career and proves that she fully deserved her award.

Since her debut, Wright has evolved and matured. She wrote three songs on this new album. "Right In The Middle Of It" is traditional country marked with fiddling and a buoyant two-step bounce.

"The Other Woman" describes the feelings of a married man's mistress with lyrics such as "You don't have to hate the other woman, she'll do it herself".

Finally, "Gotta Get Good at Givin' Again" makes it clear

that in life you can't just take, you have to give. With these three songs, Wright proves to be a composer of stunning depth and maturity.

The first single, "Listenin' To The Radio", is an happy up-tempo number already doing fine on the charts. It's also the album opener and from there it'll take us on a stylistically diverse route, sometimes with a more contemporary feel but always back to the traditional.

Wright's talent should put her right in the middle of country music success.

Patty Loveless: The Trouble With The Truth (Epic/Sony)

Not many people will have trouble with this truth: Patty Loveless is one of the great female singers of this era.

With every new album, she redefines the emotional possibilities of both traditional and contemporary country music with a grace that comes from looking inside and accepting oneself.

The Trouble With The Truth comes after Loveless recently won the CMA Album of the Year Award, and she returns with a retro-style recording,

somehow different from her past albums but brilliantly produced as usual.

The well-crafted material includes the upbeat first single, "You Can Feel Bad", the catchy "Tear-Stained Letter", which includes a great fiddle riff, and "I Miss Who I Was (With You)", a pining ballad that will remind you of the vintage "Nothin' But The Wheel". Loveless has the perfect vocal instrument when it comes to delivering slow, mournful ballads such as "I Miss Who I Was" and "A Thousand Times A Day".

There's also the blues-flavored "Everybody's Equal In The Eyes Of Love".

Loveless possesses a remarkably strong voice that lets her perform up-tempo material and heartbreaking ballads equally well.

The truth about Loveless is that album after album she remains one of today's top entertainers.

On the local scene, there's one hard-working woman many people ask me about. She's a teenager who is already very involved with country music as the technician of my radio show, *Country Club*.

You guessed it, it's my daughter Annie Plante, who will turn 17 on March 10. Annie has been involved with the radio show for almost two years now. She loves country music and she knows her material too, making her an huge asset to the show.

But there's more because I can also count on her to replace me as host of the show, where she does an excellent job in both English and French.

Annie will finish high school this year where she's also president of the student council. Her next step, most likely, will be to study communications to be able to keep on working in the field.

Good luck Annie. Happy Birthday and thank you very much for your help.

We all deserve to celebrate today, so let's all spoil ourselves.

Morissette can count prescience as one of her talents

Canadian rocker Alanis Morissette can count clairvoyance as one of her talents.

"A lot of people say I'll be thrown to the wolves when I go to the states. But I'm not really scared. I'm looking forward to it," Morissette said in 1991, when she was still a perm-haired, teenaged dance starlet.

Despite predictions by naysayers, Morissette was hardly devoured when she ventured south of the border to advance her musical career.

Indeed, since releasing her U.S. debut *Jagged Little Pill* last June, the Ottawa-born singer has emerged an international success story.

Her album has sold eight million copies, held the No. 1 position on Billboard's trend-setting Top 200 albums chart and cracked the Top 10 in the United Kingdom and Australia.

Last fall, Morissette appeared simultaneously on the covers of rival *Rolling Stone* and *Spin* magazines, a first for any artist.

There have been dozens of

sell-out shows where Morissette whips her trademark mane around. The critical acclaim culminated with her four-statue win at the 38th Grammy Awards in Los Angeles, among them awards for best rock album for *Jagged Little Pill*, and best rock song and best female rock vocal performance for "You Oughta Know".

Morissette returns to Canada this weekend to appear on the Juno stage in Hamilton on March 10, where she is nominated for a whopping six awards — album, female vocalist, single, songwriter and entertainer of the year, as well as best rock album.

Her phenomenal success has made her the subject of intense scrutiny, particularly because she clicked with such a huge audience by exorcising her demons in hook-laden songs about betrayal, religion and lust.

"There's a 21-year-old kid saying 'Hey I got shafted on a personal level, a business level, an emotional level and I'm cheesed off about it,'" says

Keith Sharp, editor of *Access* magazine.

"And when she sings about it people say 'I can relate to that.'"

Others are a tad more jaded about her appeal, including this week's *Newsweek* magazine, which dismisses her as a mere record company invention.

But few critics suggest Morissette is somehow disingenuous when she expresses her torment, possibly because she has been quite candid about her past.

She was born in Ottawa on June 1, 1974 to a Hungarian-born teacher named Georgia and French-Canadian father, Alan, who worked as a high school principal.

She has a twin, Wade, and an older brother Chad.

Morissette dreamed of being a performer at an early age, dancing at age seven and writing her first song at nine.

Her career in the entertainment business began when she auditioned for a Canadian cable TV show when she was 10.

Within months, she saved her wages and released a homemade single "Fate Stay With Me", issued on an independent label set up by her parents.

By the time she was 14, Morissette signed with MCA

Records where she cut two dance albums.

Her debut album, *Alanis*, sold more than 100,000 copies and earned her a Juno Award as most promising female artist. Her follow-up, *Now is the Time*, sold 50,000 copies, a respectable number in Canada.



The Hostess With The Mostess: Arguably Canada's most beloved songbird, Anne Murray is the perfect host of the 25th annual Juno Awards, honoring excellence in Canadian music. The lady whose first album was released in 1968 has won 25 Junos herself and has maintained a constant presence on the world stage. This year, women are at the forefront of the field, with Ottawa's Alanis Morissette and Timmins' Shania Twain both delivering smash successes. But Murray did it first and has to date sold 24 million albums worldwide. Now she's working on her 30th! Murray certainly has no problem keeping up with the up-and-comers. The Junos will be broadcast live from Hamilton, Ontario, on CBC-TV Sunday, March 10, at 8 p.m. — Sunil Mahtani.



Afternoon Delight: Jacquie Czernin is a familiar voice to Townshippers, and residents across Quebec, as the bubbly and effusive host of CBC Radio's *Breakaway*, a light-hearted current affairs show heard weekday afternoons from 4 to 6 p.m. on the Quebec Community Network. 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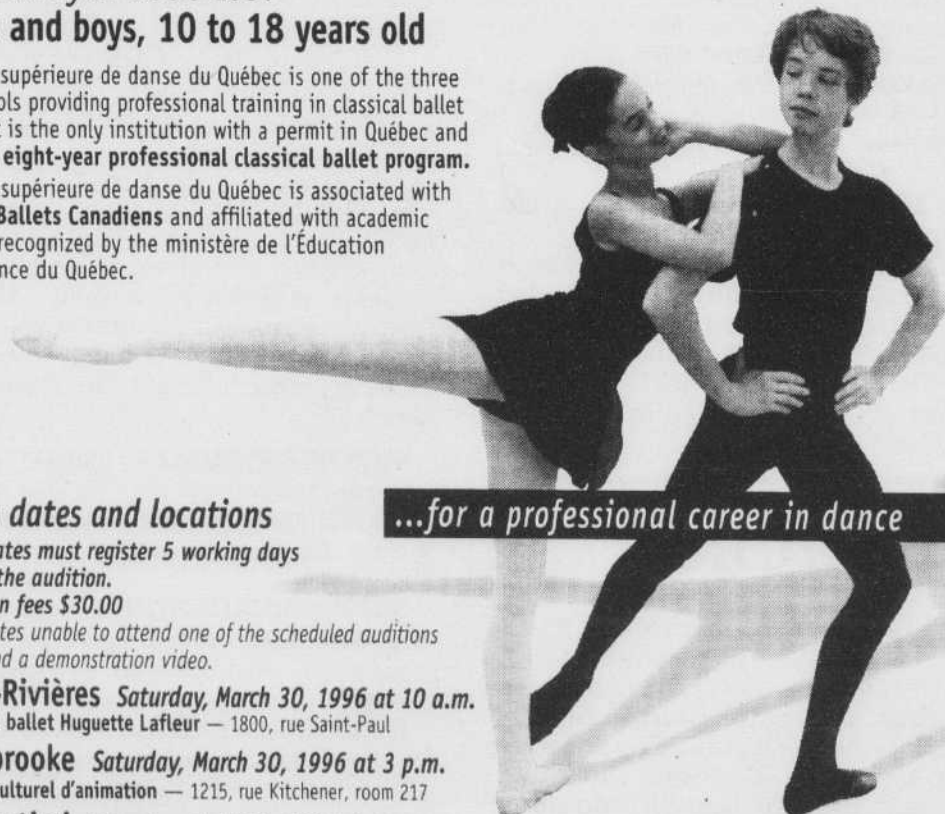

British Bomb: When Emma Stevens hit Knowlton, the cultural life of Brome Lake went through a remarkable transformation. The theatrical tidal wave founded Theatre Lac Brome, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary this year, before moving on to form Echo Art, which has spawned a creative theatre camp for kids, ambitious community musicals, a new venue for professional English-language theatre and, most recently, a talent agency for kids — all with no government subsidies. Stevens has also delighted audiences with her portrayals of Shirley Valentine and Julie in *Pizza Man*. The Echo Art team is now preparing an original musical based on the story of French heroine Joan of Arc and Stevens herself will direct the play *Never Judge A Book By Its Cover* this spring. It is a risky business, this theatre thing, but Stevens has one firm goal in mind: the longterm survival of English-language theatre in Quebec. Stevens keeps a sunny disposition even in these economically challenged times, with a lack of financial support for theatre. She receives lots of volunteer support from the community, though. The citizens of Brome Lake know a good thing when they see it. — Sunil Mahtani.



Beauty and the Bronze: North Hatley sculptor Nicole Taillon is one of the most gifted artists working in Canada today. With a wistful enthusiasm, Taillon brings her imaginary world to life in her bronze characters. Playing with colors and textures, Taillon creates magical works that shine, providing an emotional rescue from today's hectic world. The beauty of Taillon's works are a reflection of the beauty of the village in which she lives. They are a personal statement of the mystical energy that exists just below the surface. Her work is permanently on display at Galerie Jeannine Blais in North Hatley. It seems galleries are no longer big enough to contain Taillon's talent: One of her larger pieces was displayed on her front lawn last summer, and another is currently on tour. (SM)



You Little Devil: One of the most beloved residents of the Lennoxville community is painter Kay Kinsman, and it's easy to see why from the moment you meet her. The 86-year-old is a first-class cut-up who speaks her mind, spicing her opinions with humor and warmth. She is a magnet who attracts people wherever she goes, be it to Bishop's University, where she has regularly taken courses and inspired students and professors alike, or simply to the bank. She continues to delight young and old through her bright, humorous paintings. She's come a long way from her first drawing at four years of age, of a parish priest on a toilet, but that devilish streak has never left her — or let her down. (SM)



Hot Doc: Tomifobia documentary photographer and filmmaker Louise Abbott (seen here with her pal Kiwi) has been spending her career capturing the stories of isolated minorities fighting to preserve their way of life. Her latest project is *Le Filet Vide (The Empty Net)*, a one-hour documentary about the causes and consequences of the collapse of the Canadian east coast cod fishery. Abbott wrote the script and conducted the interviews for the film, which has been nominated for best science documentary at the Canadian documentary film festival Hot Docs, to be held in Toronto in two weeks. *Le Filet Vide* will be broadcast on Radio Quebec on April 18. Closer to home, Abbott's NFB documentary *The Pinnacle and the Poet* charted the seven-year struggle of residents around Pinnacle Mountain, near Sutton, to save it from private development. The film, which featured close to 200 of her photos, was well-received by those in and outside the Townships. Abbott continues to be an important contributor in helping to preserve a rural way of life. (SM)



Colorful Curator: This is Jeannine Blais doing what she loves to do — take in naif art. Blais is simply in heaven at her art gallery in North Hatley, the only one of its kind in Canada. Naif artists look at the world with an optimistic childlike vision that is as warm as it is colorful. The bespectacled Blais is currently preparing her third annual naif art competition, the only one of its kind in North America, where 100 artists from around the world descend on the village for the ultimate art show. Blais recently published a book on one of her favorite artists, Dragan Mihailovic of Serbia, whose magical and wistful paintings created even in wartime, exemplify everything Blais loves about naif art — and her love is infectious.
