The visitor to Italy complains of modern steel girders on the Grand Canal in Venice, and the new-fangled ideas of cleanliness in the streets of Naples and the new quarters in Rome, but the height of the prosaic seems to have been reached with the illumination of the outcamps by electric light.

These outcamps are outside the Fort St. Sabastien, on the magnificent Apennine Way, that the Romans called the Queen road, and near the world renowned tomb of Cecilia Metella. St. Cecilia is not the only prominent martyr of the early Christian era whose name is connected with this burial place.

There is a picture gallery, as from below one looked up at the pilgrims descending and ascending the long, steep flight of stairs, or at the long processions of cowled monks and black-robed nuns showing in vivid contrast to groups of students of the German College in their scarlet gowns, a garb that causes them to be called, in fun, the little cardinals. The corridors responded in echoes to their chants at the different altars, while there was a subdued hum from the less devout sightseers.

The most interesting spot in where St. Cecilia's tomb was found, and where she was originally a Roman noblewoman, was a marble tablet, the inscription on which was originally a Fagan one dedicated to Marcus Aurelius. The Christians utilized the tablet by turning it and writing on the back a new epigraph to Pope St. Damasus.
