Le Carrefour

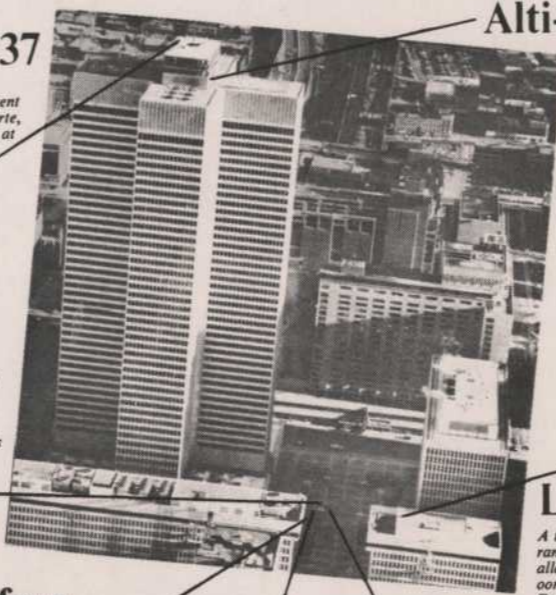
