When it comes, and if it comes, it will find me ready." There is no one who ever heard her who does not wish that a message would be again given her.—Boston Herald.

**How to Shake Hands.**

A man and a woman meet and both burst into a smile of welcome. Then the woman swings her right arm, which is perfectly rigid, straight out from the shoulder and directly in front of her. When the hand has reached the height of her chin she holds it there, with the thumb toward the face and the palm turned slightly outward. The man who has been approaching her gently takes hold of the hand a good deal as one might grasp the rung of a ladder. He bows slightly, as though intending to press his lips to the lady's hand, and then lets go abruptly and drops his hand to his side. Then the woman drops her stiffened arm and the ceremony is over. This is English.—Brooklyn Eagle.

**The Best Fuel.**

Soft coal makes a cheap and hot fire. It is dirty; a filter attached to the cistern is a necessity if soft coal is used. It is better than poor wood.  
 Hard coal is excellent to cook on in winter if the stove is made to burn it. Patience is an important requisite when learning to make, keep and use a hard coal fire. It seems easy and is, when one learns how; one of the first things to learn is to leave it alone.—Good Housekeeping.

**SCIENCE AND PROGRESS.**

**POPULAR SCIENTIFIC RECREATION AND VALUABLE KNOWLEDGE.**

An Ingenious Little Toy That Puzzles and Amuses the Uninitiated and Illustrates the Ease with Which Optical Illusions May Be Produced.

Our cut shows a curious little toy called the magic cash box. It affords an entertaining instance of deception of the eyes. Viewed from the front through the glass forming one of its sides (A), it appears to be simply an empty box, covered on the interior with white cloth or paper. Now, if a coin is dropped into it through the slit in the top, it immediately vanishes; the box is apparently as empty as before, and the question printed at the back, *Ou est passe la monnaie?* (Where has the money gone?) becomes a very pertinent one.



THE MAGIC CASH BOX.

The mystery is solved by removing the back of the box (B) and examining the interior. We then find that the box is not really empty, but contains two mirrors, placed together at an angle of 45 degs., with the apex of the angle facing the front of the box. These mirrors reflect the sides of the box, and produce the illusion that one is looking directly at the back, when, in reality, it is the reflection of the sides that we see, and the money dropped into the box is concealed in the space behind the mirrors.

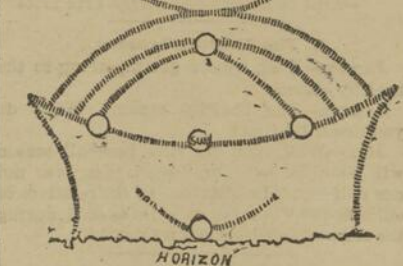
Popular Science News, from which is taken the foregoing description of this ingenious toy, originally illustrated in *La Nature*, says that it can easily be made by anyone with two pieces of looking glass cut to the proper size. Care must be taken to have the cloth or paper covering the inside of the box perfectly white and clean, with no marks or figures to be reflected. The mirrors must be placed at an angle of exactly 45 degs., and the edge where they come together is concealed by a narrow strip of card bearing the legend noted above.

**Boilers for High Pressure.**

Power-Steam tells that an English engineer proposes to make boilers capable of withstanding greatly increased pressures by constructing them of two shells and maintaining a pressure in the space between them. A boiler, to work safely under a pressure of 250 pounds, would consist of an inner shell capable of withstanding a pressure of 150, surrounded by a shell whose safe working pressure was 100. Reducing valves allow sufficient steam to pass from the inner boiler to the space between the shells to maintain the required pressure, and the inner shell is thus subjected to an unbalanced pressure of only 100 pounds, although containing steam at 250. Each compartment is of course provided with safety valves.

**Solar Halos.**

An example of the curious phenomenon of solar halos in a cloudless sky occurred in southwestern Arkansas in the forenoon of March 2. J. C. Branner, of the geological survey, has sent to Science the following description and diagram by one of his assistants, who witnessed the remarkable sight:



**SECONDARY SUNS AND RAINBOWS.**

"At 8:30 there was not a cloud in sight, but the eastern sky had a hazy appearance. The sun was shining with full brilliancy, and on the right and left of it, and above it at equal distances, three other suns appeared, shining almost as brightly as the sun proper. The figure called for a fourth secondary sun, but it was too near the horizon for this to be seen. Radiating from these suns were brilliant rainbows forming regular spirals of angles. The brightness of the suns and bows lasted but a few minutes, and then began gradually to fade. Within fifteen minutes, however, the sun had risen high enough to bring the fourth secondary sun to view, but by this time the rainbow lines with it were very indistinct. By 10 o'clock the whole spectacle had faded away."

**A Test for Oleo in Butter.**

The following method of discovering oleo in butter is proposed by Dr. Taylor, of the department of agriculture: Dissolve in 20 cubic centimeters of petroleum benzine 140 grains of a mixture of oleo and butter. Heat slightly to secure a perfect solution of the fats. Caseine and animal tissues may be readily removed by passing the liquid while warm through fine muslin. Fill a test tube with the solution and place in ice water. In about twenty minutes the oleo fat will separate from the butter fat and fall to the bottom of the tube, being insoluble in cold benzine, while the butter fat will remain in solution in the benzine. Separate the oleo fat from the liquid butter fat by filtration. The fat recovered may be solidified by mechanical pressure, placing it between several layers of bibulous paper to absorb the remaining benzine, after which the sheet of solid oleo may be removed from the paper with a palette knife. The butter may be recovered by evaporating the benzine by means of a sand bath.

**Musical Flames.**

The well known experiment of making sounds by holding a tube over a jet of burning gas (usually hydrogen) is often omitted in chemistry classes because no suitable tubing is at hand. A fact noted by Mr. T. B. Smith in *Popular Science News* is that a bottle will serve in place of a tube. A "philosopher's candle," properly burning, will yield a fine sound if capped by a wide mouthed bottle, as a quinine bottle or large test tube.

**The Creeping of Salts on Batteries.**

A French scientist announces an easy way of preventing the annoying creeping of salts on batteries. It is to apply a thin coating of vaseline to the surfaces to be preserved. The vaseline is unchangeable by air, is not attacked by most chemicals, is easily applied, keeps in place, and does not cover up from sight the parts to be protected.

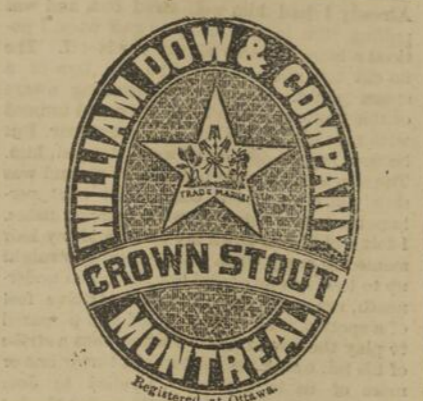

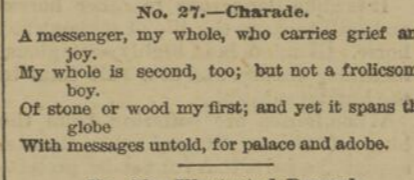
A Much Admired Garment is the Comfortable Tailor Tailor Jacket That Replaces the Tailor Made Bodice Worn Through the Day.

CATCHING THE TARPON.

A Story of a Day's Sport with Rod and Line Near the Coast of Florida.

Just before sunset we arrived at Blanco and anchored in shore in about four feet of water. I have always found that the tarpon bite best in shallow water. Putting off baits I cast them from the sailboat, using both my rods, intending to land from the large boat only. Hardly ten minutes had passed when the men were preparing supper when, above the magnificent tarpon tail appeared immediately over one of my baits. This was followed by a sudden swirl which almost caused my two men to fall overboard with excitement. Seizing my rod I pulled off and gave the rapidly moving fish some thirty feet more of slack line, then waiting till my line was taut, I gave a good strike. There was a mighty leap, a fierce shake of the head, and whizz went my reel. "Thank heaven, he's hooked," I gasped.

Getting into the rowboat I followed the leader. Now and then from the sailboat came encouraging remarks from my excited cook. Supper, I need hardly say, suffered sadly from want of attention. Meanwhile I was going through the ordinary evolutions of catching a tarpon, enjoying its exciting rushes and beautiful leaps as they took place under the reddish glow of the fading sunset. Already I had him well tined out, and was pulling him in gradually to gaff when I noticed a huge fin some eighty yards off. The fin cut the glassy water like the bow of a steam yacht. The tarpon, becoming aware of this immense shark's presence and imbued with new life, shot off in his intense fear. But he was fagged out, and I soon stopped him. The shark meanwhile had slowed up and was slowly circling about tarpon and boat, perhaps hesitating between two appetizing dishes. I felt a chill run down my back and my hair seemed to creep when slowly coming straight up to the boat he passed not three feet underneath, revealing not more than twelve feet of a spotted back. He doubled and purred to play the same trick. Feeling that a strike of his tail under the boat might throw one or more of us in the water, I yelled to Joe: "Strike him in the jaw with an oar!" Joe gave him a powerful blow that caused him to swerve aside for a moment, but in an instant, turning on his side, he made a vicious snap at the oar.

Joe, nothing daunted, was about to hit him again. "Leave him alone!" I cried. "You are only making matters worse. Let us gaff the tarpon and get him in the boat, and we will get a revolver." Meanwhile, standing in the bow, my mind was divided between my fear of falling in the water, where the shark might interview me, and losing my tarpon. The tarpon, by the way, all this time had been acting in a most eccentric way, evidently frightened crazy by the presence of this large shark. The latter, however, ceased his attentions to us, and began to circle around the tarpon, who made frantic efforts to get away, while I, realizing that it was my only chance, took the shark and I as to who would get that tarpon, risked all the strength I dared on my line, and tried to get the fish within gaffing distance. I had succeeded in getting him within twenty feet of the boat, and seeing him come in belly up, bleeding greatly from the gills, was beginning to flatter myself I had added one more to my record. Suddenly fierce lightning, with a clearing the water like lightning, with a roar, the shark made for him. There was a horrible splashing—I saw the tarpon lifted clear of the water, while the spot became blackened with blood. For a moment I was dazed, not to say scared, by the sudden turn matters had taken.

Joe, too, was kneeling in the bottom of the boat, his eyes starting out of his head. He finally said, his voice gradually rising into a shriek, "Well, if I ever saw anything like that, I'm shot!" Recovering myself I wound in my line, feeling nothing but a dead weight attached to it. As I pulled this came to the surface, the water gurgling round and round through it. With a shout of laughter Joe screamed out, "Well, you have got his head anyhow!" Sure enough, there was the tarpon's head, with shreds of skin hanging from it. But Joe spoke rather than acted, for the twisting mass was suddenly seized and dragged beneath, while my line snapped. Throwing the rod down in the boat and uttering a strong curse word, I seized the oars and rowed silently back to the boat. Here we were accosted by the cook, who had taken in the whole thing from the boat, and was in a frenzied condition of excitement which almost equalled ours. Supper and even to sweat at the cook. The tarpon so far as I could judge, would have weighed between 120 and 130 pounds, and measured from 6 feet 2 inches to 6 feet 4 inches in length. The shark was of the species known as "leopard shark" on the coast.—Outing.
