BY-LAWS OF THE CORPORATION OF QUEBEC.

A By-law to consolidate the by-laws to provide funds to meet the expenses of the City of Quebec.

1—Be it ordained and enacted, that there be imposed and levied on the proprietor or proprietors of any house, building, ground, lot of ground, wharf or other real property, situate within the limits of the City of Quebec, a rate or tax of one shilling currency in the pound on the assessed annual value of such real property.

2—On every person occupying, as proprietor, any house, building, ground, lot of ground, wharf, or other real property, situate within the limits of the city of Quebec, an additional rate or tax of sixpence currency in the pound on the assessed annual value of such property.

3—On every person occupying, as proprietor, any part of a house, building, ground, lot of ground, wharf, or other real property situate within the limits of the city of Quebec, an additional rate or tax of sixpence currency in the pound, on the amount which should be paid annually for the use and occupation of the premises, if occupied by a tenant.

4—On every person occupying, as tenant, any house, building, ground, lot of ground, wharf, or other real property, or part thereof, situate within the limits of the city of Quebec, a rate or tax of sixpence currency in the pound on the assessed annual value of the property so occupied.

5—On the proprietor of every vacant or unoccupied house, building, ground, lot of ground, wharf, or other real property or any part thereof, within the limits of the city of Quebec, an additional rate or tax of sixpence currency in the pound on the assessed annual value of such property.

6—That an annual duty, in addition to the rates or duties already imposed by law, upon every person or persons keeping a House or place of Public Entertainment, shall be and the same is hereby imposed upon, and shall be paid by every person or firm of persons keeping a House or place of Public Entertainment, or retailing spirituous liquors within the said city, which said duty, shall be levied upon, and be payable by the said keepers of Houses of Public Entertainment, or retailers of spirituous liquors, with reference to the assessed yearly value of the premises occupied and used by such persons or firm of persons for the purposes aforesaid, and in proportion thereto, at the following rates:—

1. The said duty to be so paid shall be rated at Four pounds ten shillings, when the assessed yearly value of the premises used by the person or firm of persons on whom the said duty is levied, shall not exceed forty pounds; 2. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at six pounds, when such value as aforesaid shall ex-

ceed forty pounds, but shall not exceed sixty pounds ; 3. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at seven pounds ten shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed sixty pounds, but shall not exceed eighty pounds ; 4. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at nine pounds, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed eighty pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred pounds ; 5. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at eleven pounds five shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred pounds, and shall not exceed one hundred and twenty-five pounds ; 6. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twelve pounds fifteen shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and twenty-five pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred and fifty pounds ; 7. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at fifteen pounds, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and fifty pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred and seventy-five pounds ; 8. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at sixteen pounds seventeen shillings and six pence, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and seventy-five pounds, but shall not exceed two hundred pounds ; 9. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at eighteen pounds fifteen shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed two hundred pounds, but shall not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds ; 10. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty pounds twelve shillings and sixpence, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed two hundred and fifty pounds, but shall not exceed three hundred pounds ; 11. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty-two pounds ten shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed three hundred pounds, but shall not exceed four hundred pounds ; 12. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty-six pounds five shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed four hundred pounds.

7—That there be imposed and levied on every person or firm of persons, who shall keep any eating house,

coffee house or ordinary in which he or they may give to eat or drink for money, the following taxes or duties, that is to say: when the annual rent or value of the house or premises thus occupied shall not exceed twelve pounds ten shillings currency, a tax or duty of one pound five shillings currency; when the said annual rent or value shall exceed twelve pounds ten shillings currency, but shall not exceed twenty-five pounds currency, a tax or duty of two pounds ten shillings currency; when the said annual rent or value shall exceed twenty-five pounds currency, but shall not exceed seventy-five pounds currency, a tax or duty of three pounds two shillings and six pence currency; when the said annual rent or value shall exceed seventy-five pounds currency, but shall not exceed one hundred pounds currency, a tax or duty of three pounds fifteen shillings currency; and when the said annual rent or value shall exceed and be over one hundred pounds currency, a tax or duty of five pounds currency.

8—That an annual duty in addition to the rates or duties already imposed by law, shall be levied upon and payable by every person or firm of persons retailing Spirituous Liquors, with reference to the assessed yearly value of the premises occupied and used by such person or firm of persons, for the purposes aforesaid, and in proportion thereto, at the following rates:

1. That the said duty to be so paid shall be rated at four pounds ten shillings, when the assessed yearly value of the premises used by the person or firm of persons on whom the said duty is levied, shall not exceed forty pounds; 2. and the said duty to be so paid shall be rated at six pounds, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed forty pounds, but shall not exceed sixty pounds; 3. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at the rate of seven pounds ten shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed sixty pounds, but shall not exceed eighty pounds; 4. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at nine pounds, when such value as aforesaid

shall exceed eighty pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred pounds ; 5. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at eleven pounds five shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred and twenty-five pounds ; 6. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twelve pounds fifteen shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and twenty-five pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred and fifty pounds ; 7. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at fifteen pounds, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and fifty pounds, but shall not exceed one hundred and seventy-five pounds ; 8. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at sixteen pounds seventeen shillings and six pence, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed one hundred and seventy-five pounds, but shall not exceed two hundred pounds ; 9. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at eighteen pounds fifteen shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed two hundred pounds, but shall not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds ; 10. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty pounds twelve shillings and six pence, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed two hundred and fifty pounds, but shall not exceed three hundred pounds ; 11. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty-two pounds ten shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed three hundred pounds, but shall not exceed four hundred pounds ; 12. and the same to be so paid shall be rated at twenty-six pounds five shillings, when such value as aforesaid shall exceed four hundred pounds.

9—That no person, or firm of persons, shall be allowed to give any equestrian performance, or to open a circus, to which the public shall be admitted by paying, without having previously obtained from the Mayor, who is hereby authorised to grant the same, a license or permission so to do, for which there shall be paid by such person, or firm of persons, the sum of twenty-five pounds and without having previously to each performance, paid

an additional tax or duty of five pounds for each and every performance, the whole payable by such person, or firm of persons previous to such performance taking place, or previous to any person or persons whatsoever being admitted.

10—That there be imposed and levied on each and every person exercising or following the business or calling of a Hawker or Pedlar, or itinerant petty chapman, going from place to place for the purpose of selling, or exposing or offering for sale any goods, effects or merchandize, within the limits of the City of Quebec, a tax or duty of three pounds currency, per annum.

11—That there be imposed and levied upon each and every person, or firm of persons, exposing or exhibiting for profit, any caravans of animals, or menageries or public exhibitions or shows of any kind, within the limits of the City, a tax or duty of five pounds currency, to be paid previous to any such exhibition taking place.

12—That there be imposed and levied upon each and every person, or firm of persons, who shall give any exhibition on the slack or tight rope, or of legerdemain performances, gymnastics, or other games or exhibitions of this description, a tax or duty of five pounds currency, payable previous to such exhibition taking place.

13—That an annual tax or duty of twenty-five pounds currency be and is hereby imposed upon each and every Theatre in this City; which said annual tax or duty shall be payable yearly by the proprietor or proprietors of each and every such Theatre over and above the usual assessments on the property; and that the proprietor or proprietors of such Theatre shall in all cases pay in respect of the same the rate imposed by this By-Law on occupant proprietors.

14—That any occupier, lessee, agent, manager or keeper of any such Theatre shall pay before giving any performance therein a duty of five pounds currency, and a further sum of one pound five shillings for each performance.

15—That no person, or firm of persons, shall be allowed to possess, or to keep, within the limits of the City, any Billiard Table, for hire, or gain, or public use, without having previously obtained from the Mayor, who is hereby authorised to grant the same, a license or permission so to do, for which there shall be paid by such person, or firm of persons the sum of fifteen pounds for one table, and five pounds for each table above one table.

16—That no person, or firm of persons, shall be allowed to own, possess, or keep in this City, any Pigeon holes, Bagatelle, Mississippi Board, Nine or Ten pin Alley, or any other public game of chance, or intended for the public use, (Billiard Tables already taxed being excepted,) without having previously obtained from the Mayor, who is hereby authorised to grant the same, a license or permission so to do, for which there shall be paid by such person, or firm of persons, the sum of five pounds.

17—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed and levied on each and every person who shall own, or possess, occupy or keep any shop, store, counting-house, stand, tannery, or other premises within the limits of this city, for the purpose of therein selling or exposing, exhibiting or offering for sale, by retail only, any goods, merchandize, wares, commodities, leather or provisions of any kind whatsoever; and also on all persons keeping a livery stable for the purpose of letting horses for hire, (persons selling by wholesale as well as auctioneers, tavern keepers, and retailers of spirituous liquors always excepted,) which said tax or duty shall be of seven pounds ten shillings currency for every one hundred pounds currency, of assessed yearly value of each and every premises occupied as aforesaid.

18—That there be imposed on each and every person residing and doing business in person within the city of Quebec, selling, trading or dealing, alone or in partnership with others, in any Goods, Wares or Merchandise whatsoever, by wholesale or by wholesale and re-

tail, within the limits of this City, or having therein any office, counting-house, warehouse, store or other premises, in which he or they may carry on any trade or dealing by wholesale or by wholesale and retail, ten pounds currency each partner in the firm when in partnership, and twelve pounds ten shillings, when alone, and each such person, or firm of persons shall pay over and above the said tax a tax or duty of ten per cent on the assessed annual value of the premises so occupied by them for the purposes of their trade—when such value shall not exceed one hundred pounds, and when such annual value shall exceed one hundred pounds, then an annual tax of ten per cent on the first hundred, and five per cent on every amount over one hundred pounds.

19—That an annual tax or duty of two hundred pounds currency shall be and is hereby imposed and shall be yearly paid by all and every Bank, branch Bank, Bank Agency or Agent of Bankers or Banks, and by all and every persons or society of persons, body corporate, association or institution being, forming and constituting a Bank of discounts and deposits, and doing and transacting business as such in the said City of Quebec.

20—That an annual tax or duty of one hundred pounds shall be and is hereby imposed and shall be yearly paid by all and every Savings Bank and by all and every persons or society of persons, body corporate, association or institution being, forming and constituting a Savings Bank, and doing and transacting business as such in the said City of Quebec.

21—That an annual tax or duty of fifty pounds shall be and is hereby imposed, and shall be yearly paid by all Banks or Bankers who shall have an agency established in the City of Quebec for the transaction of Banking business but not for discount and deposit; and the said tax may be levied either on such Banks or Bankers or on their Agents.

22—That a tax or duty of one hundred and twenty-five pounds, be and is hereby imposed upon and shall

be yearly payable by all and every Fire Insurance Company, or Agency of any Fire, Marine, or Inland Insurance Company, and by any other Insurance company in this city, (Life Insurance Companies excepted) : and by each and every person, firm of persons, corporate body, or society carrying on the business of Insurance against loss by fire, or against the risks of the sea, or the risks of inland navigation, in this city ; and also by the Agent or Agents in this city of all and every Insurance Company, or Agency of Fire, Marine, or Inland Navigation Insurance Company, and of all and every person, firm of persons, body corporate, or Society carrying on the business of Insurers against loss by fire or against the risks of the sea, or of the inland navigation in foreign parts, or established elsewhere than in this city, but acting as such and doing and transacting business of Insurers, and Insuring in this city through any agency therein ; the said tax or duty of one hundred and twenty-five pounds currency to be payable by the said agent or agents, and that separately and distinctly for each and every such Insurance Company, or Insurance Company Agency, and for each and every such person, firm of persons, corporate body or association for which they shall act as Agent or Agents as aforesaid.

23—That no Life Insurance Company shall transact business in the City of Quebec, nor shall any person, or firm of persons, act as agent for any Life Insurance Co., without having first obtained a license from the Mayor, for which they shall pay the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings currency, and whenever any person, or firm of persons shall act as agent for more than one such company, such person or firm of persons, shall be bound to take a license for each Company for which he or they may act as agent.

24— That no Insurance Company, or persons associated for the purpose of carrying on the business of Insurers, nor any agent for such Insurance Company, or association of persons shall transact any business as

such Insurers, or agent of Insurers in the City of Quebec, until they shall have obtained a license from the Mayor, which he is hereby authorised to give and for which such Insurance Company, association of persons or agent shall pay the sum of five pounds currency.

25—That an annual tax or duty of ten pounds currency, be and is hereby imposed upon, and shall be payable yearly by each and every broker, or money changer, and by each and every person or firm of persons acting as brokers or money changers in this city.

26—That an annual tax or duty of twenty-five pounds currency be and is hereby imposed upon, and shall be payable yearly by each and every Pawnbroker, and by each and every person or firm of persons acting as Pawnbrokers in this city.

27—That an annual tax or duty of twenty-five pounds currency be and is hereby imposed upon, and shall be payable yearly by each and every Agent or Agents in this city of any Merchant or Merchants residing in any other city or place in this province or elsewhere.

28—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed upon each and every Brewer, Brewery, or Brewery Agency, in the city of Quebec, and upon the Agent or Agents of each and every Brewer, Brewery, or Brewery Agency in the said city of Quebec; which said tax or duty shall be of fifteen pounds currency for every one hundred pounds of the assessed yearly value of each and every said Brewery or Brewery Agency; or shall be calculated at the same rate if the said value is above or under one hundred pounds currency, and shall be payable yearly by such Brewer or by the proprietor or proprietors, agent or agents, of each and every such Brewery or Brewery Agency.

29—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed upon each and every Distiller, Distillery or Distillery Agency, in the city of Quebec, and upon the Agent or Agents of each and every Distiller, Distillery, or Distillery Agency, in the said city of Quebec; which said

tax or duty shall be of twenty pounds currency, for every one hundred pounds currency of the assessed yearly value of all and every such Distillery or Distillery Agency, or shall be calculated at and after the same rate, if the said value is above or under one hundred pounds currency, and shall be payable yearly by such distiller, or by the proprietor or proprietors, agent or agents of each and every such distillery or distillery agency.

30—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed upon each and every foundry in the city of Quebec, which said tax or duty shall be of seven pounds ten shillings currency for every one hundred pounds currency of the yearly assessed value of each and every such said Foundry, or shall be calculated at the same rate if the said value is above or under one hundred pounds currency, and shall be payable yearly, by the proprietor or proprietors of each and every such said Foundry.

31—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed upon each and every Manufactory in which shall be an engine moved by steam or water in the city of Quebec (the Breweries, Distilleries and Foundries already taxed by the sixth, seventh, and eighth sections of this By-Law, excepted) which said tax or duty shall be of seven pounds ten shillings currency for every one hundred pounds currency of the assessed yearly value of each and every such said Manufactory and place where the same shall be erected, and at and after the same rate if the said value is above or under one hundred pounds currency; and shall be payable yearly by the proprietor or proprietors of each and every such Manufactory.

32—That an annual tax or duty be and is hereby imposed upon each and every Woodyard or Lumber yard in the city of Quebec, which said tax or duty shall be of seven pounds ten shillings currency for every one hundred pounds currency of the assessed yearly value of

each and every such said Woodyard or Lumber yard, and at and after the same rate, if the said value is above or under one hundred pounds currency ; and shall be payable yearly by the proprietor or proprietors, keeper or keepers of each and every such Woodyard or Lumber yard aforesaid.

33—That an annual tax or duty of five hundred pounds be and is hereby imposed upon each and every gas company in the city of Quebec.

34—That an annual tax or duty of one hundred pounds currency be and is hereby imposed upon each and every telegraph company, and upon the agent or agents of each and every telegraph company in the said city of Quebec.

35—That there be imposed and levied upon every person or firm of persons carrying on the business of forwarders and having their office or place of business in the city of Quebec, and upon all persons or firm of persons who shall act as agents for forwarders or forwarding merchants in the city of Quebec an annual tax or duty of two pounds ten shillings.

36—That there be imposed and levied upon all persons or firm of persons being proprietors or occupants of Cement or Plaster manufactories an annual tax or duty of twelve pounds ten shillings currency, and that the same tax be imposed and levied upon all persons or firm of persons who shall act as agents for the sale of plaster and cement in the said city.

37.—That no person or firm of persons shall sell or offer for sale any gunpowder in the said city without having first obtained a license from the Mayor for which there shall be paid the sum of five pounds currency and the said licenses shall be renewed on the first day of May in each year.

38—That there be imposed and levied upon every person or firm of persons who shall occupy or be the proprietor of any soap or candle manufactory within the said city an additional rate or tax of seven and a

half per cent on the assessed annual value of the property used as such manufactory.

39—That there be imposed and levied upon all persons carrying on business as wholesale merchants within the city of Quebec having an office, counting-house or place of business therein, either by themselves or in partnership with others and who do not reside within the limits of the said city, an annual rate or tax of fifteen pounds currency over and above all other taxes to which they may be liable in virtue of this or any other By-Law.

40—That no person shall sell bread within the limits of the said city without having first obtained a license from the Mayor which shall expire and may be renewed on the first day of May in each year; and for which license there shall be paid by each such person who resides within the limits of the city the sum of one pound five shillings, and by each such person residing without the said limits the sum of five pounds currency.

41— That there be imposed and levied on each and every person or firm of persons, following or exercising the trade or calling of an auctioneer by wholesale only, or by wholesale and retail, within the limits of this city, an annual tax or duty of fifteen pounds currency; and on every person or firm of persons, following or exercising the trade or calling of an auctioneer by retail only, or following or exercising the trade or calling of a pawnbroker, an annual tax or duty of seven pounds ten shillings currency.

42—That there be imposed and levied upon each and every person (save and except Carters and persons who keep horses for hire or for agricultural purposes) who shall own or keep one or more Horses, Geldings or Mares within the limits of this city, a tax or duty of twenty shillings currency for each and every such horse, gelding or mare he shall own or keep as aforesaid.

43—That no person residing within this city shall follow the occupation or business of a carter for gain or hire

in this city, without having previously obtained a license for that purpose from the City Clerk ; and unless such person shall pay to the said City Treasurer, to form part of the funds of the corporation, a duty or tax for such license of one pound five shillings currency for each or every horse, gelding or mare, that such carter or owner shall own or keep, the said sum of one pound five shillings to include the amount payable for inscription and also the annual tax for the horse.

44—That no person or persons residing without the limits of the city of Quebec, shall follow the occupation of Carter in the said city of Quebec, without having previously obtained a license for that purpose from the City Clerk ; for which license shall be paid the annual sum of one pound fifteen shillings currency.

45—That no person shall exercise or follow the trade or calling of a Butcher within the limits of the city without having previously obtained a license for that purpose signed by the Mayor of the said city and attested by the City Clerk, and no person applying for such license shall obtain the same until he or she shall have paid to the City Treasurer the following sums, namely : when such person shall reside in the city and occupy a stall in the public markets the sum of one pound currency ;—when such person shall not reside in the city but shall occupy a stall in the public markets, the sum of five pounds currency, when such person shall not reside in the city nor occupy a stall in the public markets, the sum of seven pounds ten shillings currency.

46—That there be imposed and levied over and above any tax or assessment imposed by the said By-Law of the twenty-second day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, upon each and every person exercising the trade of a Carter, or who shall have or possess one or several vehicles for hire within the limits of the city of Quebec, the following annual taxes or assessments, that is to say :

For each and every waggon drawn by two horses, two pounds ten shillings currency.

For each and every Omnibus, two pounds ten shillings currency.

For each and every four wheel carriage, drawn by two horses, two pounds ten shillings currency.

For each and every four wheel carriage drawn by one horse only, one pound ten shillings currency.

For each and every waggon drawn by one horse only, one pound ten shillings currency.

For each and every hearse, one pound currency.

For each and every cab, one pound currency.

For each and every covered vehicle, fifteen shillings currency.

For each and every uncovered caleche, ten shillings currency.

For each and every covered gig [cabriolet], fifteen shillings currency.

For each and every uncovered gig [cabriolet], ten shillings currency.

For each and every cart and for each and every truck, five shillings currency.

47—That there be imposed and levied upon every person [not being a carter,] who shall own or possess a working vehicle on two wheels, a tax of five shillings, and for each working vehicle on four wheels, ten shillings, and for every omnibus two pounds ten shillings.

48—That no person or firm of persons not having a residence, office, counting house or place of business within the limits of the city, shall follow, exercise or do any trade, traffic or business, by wholesale or retail within the limits of the city, or sell or offer for sale by sample within the same, without having first obtained a license from the City Clerk, for which license there shall be paid the sum of five pounds currency.

49—That there shall be paid for each dog by the proprietor thereof the annual tax of seven shillings and six pence currency; and the proprietor of each dog shall be required to place upon him a collar upon which shall be inserted the owner's name and address, and every

dog found in the streets without such collar shall be destroyed in such manner as the Police Committee may direct.

50—That there be imposed and levied upon every person [Carters and others who keep Horses or Vehicles for hire excepted,] who shall own or keep and use for pleasure, within the limits of this City, any carriage, Caleche or other Vehicle of that description, the following taxes and duties, that is to say: on each and every such Carriage or Caleche having two wheels, twelve shillings and six pence currency—on each open or uncovered Carriage or waggon, having four wheels, one pound ten shillings currency—on each half-covered Carriage or waggon, having four wheels, forty shillings currency—on each closed or full Carriage or waggon, having four wheels, sixty shillings currency—and on each and every winter carriage the sum of twenty shillings currency, when the owner or keeper thereof shall not have been already taxed a like or higher sum for summer carriage used for pleasure, in which case no tax shall be levied for a winter carriage.

51—That any person who shall own or keep, or who shall have owned or kept during two entire months between the first of January last and the thirty-first of December next, or between those two days of any subsequent year, any horse, gelding, mare, carriage, caleche, or vehicle of that description, or dog subject and liable to the taxes or duties imposed by this By-Law, shall be liable to pay the said duties or taxes.

52—That there be imposed and levied upon each and every male person of the age of twenty-one years, and also upon each and every person above the age of twenty-one years, residing within the limits of this City, who may not be subject to any other tax or duty, as proprietor or tenant of any real property within the limits of this said City, imposed by the present By-Law, a capitation tax of five shillings currency per annum.

53—That the licenses required to be taken in accord-

ance to this By-Law shall be in force for one year only and shall be taken or renewed between the first and the fifteenth day of May of every year; but for the present year they shall be taken before the first June next.

54—That any person who shall offend against or infringe or violate any of the provisions of this By-Law, or any part or clause thereof, shall, for each and every such offence, infringement or violation, incur and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds currency or be imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty days.

55—That any part of any By-Law now in force and which may be inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this By-Law or any part thereof, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

56—That this By-Law shall be considered as forming part of such By-Laws as are hereby amended.

A BY-LAW TO AMEND THE ABOVE.

1. That so much of the twenty-second section of the said By-Law as refers to Marine Insurance Companies and Inland Navigation Insurance Companies be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That no Marine or Inland Navigation Insurance Company shall transact business in the city of Quebec, nor shall any person or firm of persons act as agent for any such Company without having first obtained a license from the Mayor for which they shall pay the sum of Twelve pounds ten shillings, and whenever any person or firm of persons shall act as agent for more than one such Company, such person or firm of persons shall be bound to take a license for each Company for which he or they may act as agent.

3. That any person or firm of persons infringing this By-Law shall incur a penalty of five pounds currency.

This faculty, when completely organized, will be composed of eleven professors. Three only have as yet been appointed.

In 1663 was founded the Quebec Seminary, which afterwards became a regular College; and it had, by successive additions, acquired a high degree of importance, when it was erected, by Her Majesty's Royal Charter, into a University, under the style and name of *The Laval University*. By this charter, which bears date December 8th, 1852, no change was effected in the constitution of the Seminary itself; but a Council composed of the directors of the Institution, and the three senior professors of the several faculties, was empowered to possess and enjoy all the privileges granted to the Universities of the United Kingdom, and especially that of conferring degrees in the Faculties of Divinity, Law, Medicine and Arts. His Grace the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec is, by virtue of his office, Visitor of the University. The superior of the Seminary, for the time being, holds the office of Rector.

The *Collegiate Department* is the Seminary as it was till 1852, and is under the control of a board composed of a Superior and at least four Directors. It is divided into two parts, called the *Grand* and the *Minor Seminary*.
