Beginning at 7h. 26m. morning,

Middle, at 8h. 47m. ditto

End, at 10h. 9m. ditto

Duration, 2h. 43m., Digits Eclipsed, $9^{\circ} . 2'$ on the Sun's Western Limb.

This Eclipse will central or annular in Mexico, the West Indies, the British Isles, in Denmark, Prussia and Russia.

Twenty-fourth October.—Eclipse of the Moon, invisible at Quebec.

Eighth November.—Eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Quebec, but visible and total in New Holland.

This Tide Table shews the time of high water on any day of the moon's age nearly, and the stream continues to run one hour and a half after high water, or, in the seaman's phrase, it flows "Tide and Quarter Tide," and this is to be observed in every part of the River.

RULE. Having found the age of the moon at the top of each month in the Calendar, look in the left column of the table for the day from new to the full moon then in the right column the day from the full to the new moon, and in the middle column you will find the time when it is high water.

1830

Belgians fail in chusing a king—Regent named—Battle at the gates of Warsaw; Poles arrest the progress of the Russian arms; Revolutions in Switzerland & Italy; the latter occupied by Austrian troops and rebellion arrested. Reform bill read a second time in the English Commons, yeas 302, nays 301. Dissolution of the English Parliament, general election. Dissolution of the French Parliament and elections. Prince Saxe Cobourg accepts the Crown of Belgium with the consent of the powers. Dutch troops invade Belgium. 50,000 French under Gérard, march to the assistance of the Belgians; Dutch retire. The French evacuate Belgium. Warsaw falls; renewed troubles at Paris but suppressed. Cholera Morbus increasing, great alarm for its spreading. Reform bill lost in the Lords. Cholera in England, Ireland and Scotland.

1831

The allies ratify the treaty for the separation of Belgium from Holland—Don Pedro sails from Nantes and lands at Oporto with an expedition, to place the Crown of Portugal in the hands of his daughter Donna Maria. Reform bills for England, Ireland and Scotland, become law.—Resistance to tithes and disturbed state of Ireland. Otho, son of the King of Bavaria placed on the throne of Greece by the allies—new boundaries fixed.—Ibrahim of Egypt takes St. Jean d'Acres and Damaskus.—Unsettled state of Europe continues.—About 6000 souls carried off by the Indian Cholera in Quebec and Montreal, from June to September; ravages in the country parts of the district of Montreal and some parishes in that of Quebec—spreads throughout the United States; great mortality at Charleston and New Orleans from cholera and fever.

1832

First reformed parliament of Great Britain ; Many changes in the laws ; Bank Charter modified ; China Trade opened. Emancipation of Slaves in the West Indies. Martial Law passed for Ireland, enforced in Kilkenny. Cholera re-appeared in London and in Ireland, but not very fatal. Continued negociations on the separation of Holland and Belgium.—Powers interfere to arrest the progress of the Pacha of Egypt. The large fleets evacuate the Bosphorus and the Pacha retires. Don Pedro takes Oporto and Lisbon—Donna Maria is recognised Queen of Portugal by England and France, leaves Paris and London and arrives at Lisbon. Don Miguel driven out of Portugal. Ferdinand of Spain dies ; Queen Regent ; Don Carlos fighting for the throne, and intestine war in the north of Spain. Cholera and yellow fever at New Orleans, Mexico, &c. Mr. Stanley succeeds Lord Goderich as Colonial Minister.

1833

Cholera again at Quebec, from July to November, nearly as fatal in the Province as in 1832 ; Assembly agree to 92 Resolutions insulting the English Government and alledging that they will seek " elsewhere " for redress of their " oppression." General election on national prejudices, and candidates of " British origin," generally expelled the Assembly. Burning of the Castle of St. Lewis in January. Mr. Stanley succeeded by Mr. Rice in the Colonial department ; continued Reforms in Great Britain ; resignation of Earl Grey, and Lord Melbourne Prime Minister ; accidental burning of the Houses of Parliament in London. The Dutch still refuse to settle the Belgium question and Europe quiet. Don Pedro dies and Donna Maria declared Queen of Portugal, and married to the Duke of Leuchtenburg.

1834

Meeting of the Spanish Cortes; Intestine war continues in the North of Spain. Revolts and troubles in Egyptian Syria. Continued intestine troubles in South America. The King calls the Duke of Wellington to form a Ministry; Sir Robert Peel, Premier, the Duke, Secretary for Foreign Affairs. President of the United States threatens reprisals on French commerce for spoliations. Report of Committee of English Commons approving of the Colonial and Lower Canada Governments. Dissolution of the English Parliament. General Election. Report of Committee of the English Commons against the pretensions of the Assembly.

1834

Louis Philippe recalls the French Minister Serrurier from Washington and offers his passports to Mr. Livingston at Paris. Sir Robert Peel's Ministry resign on the Irish Tithe question; Lord Melbourne succeeds as Prime Minister; Mr. C. Grant, Secretary for the Colonies. Prince Leuchtenburg, husband of Donna Maria, of Portugal, dies. Viscount Canterbury, Royal Commissioner to Lower Canada, to settle differences, resigns; and Lord Amherst gazetted, resigns. Three appointed. Lord Gosford and the Commission to enquire into grievances arrive at Quebec 23rd August. Lord Gosford sworn in on the 24th. The French Chambers pass the United States Indemnity Bill with condition of apology; Mr. Livingston returns to the States. The Provincial Parliament meet in February and disperse after reiterating their old claims. Lord Aylmer refuses to advance their contingencies; the Parliament repeatedly called for the dispatch of business in the summer, prorogued and meets: Formation of Constitutional Associations (in 1834) in Lower Canada and Agent dispatched to London, who arrive the 8th May. Lord Aylmer recalled the 6th May, sails on the 17th September. The Parliament meets at Quebec on the 27th October. Great professions of good feeling; but the Assembly renews all its outrages, and the Commission begin to infringe the only rights that can preserve to England a foot on the Continent of America, pays Contingencies contrary to law, includes Roebuck's salary, &c.

1835
