The scene is laid in the island of Trinidad, the Governor of which is expecting, when the play opens, the arrival of his intended bride. As a ruse, for his own purposes, he retires into the country for a few days, deputing *Krakwitz* (Mr. Baker), his Dutch Butler, to act in his stead, and invests him with full authority and his uniform. The lieutenant of the ship which brings the governor's intended to the island has fallen in love with her, and when he hears of the object of her visit, makes a compact with *Corporal Mulcahey* (Mr. Farron), under which the latter impersonates the young lady and successfully deceives the newly-fledged governor, and some funny love passages between them follow. The lady arriving almost immediately is repudiated by *Krak*, who arranged to have a parson on hand that evening to marry *Miss Hulbeck* (the governor's intended), or, in reality, *Corporal Mulcahey*, to himself, thus doing the governor out of his bride. The young lieutenant, however, takes advantage of the presence of the minister, who is come to marry some one, and has the ceremony performed between himself and the real *Miss Hulbeck* before *Krak* knows what has happened. The governor then returns, the duplicity of *Krak* is exposed, and also that of the lieutenant. *Krak* is then claimed in *propria persona* by *Rose*, a waiting-maid, and the corporal is restored to his *Mollie*, a house-maid. There is a very funny duel scene between *Krak* and a fierce old sea captain, and a number of new and original songs, medleys and choruses introduced. *Julius*, a black servant, causes no end of fun. There are also negroes, a guard of honor and brass band introduced in the play.
