LAVAL UNIVERSITY.

In 1643 was founded the Quebec Seminary, which afterwards became a regular College, and it had, by successive addition, acquired a high degree of importance, when it was erected, by her Majesty's Royal Charter, into a University, under the style and name of *The Laval Univer-*

sity. By this charter, which bears date December 8th, 1852, no change was effected in the constitution of the Seminary itself; but a Council composed of the Directors of the Institution, and the three senior professors of the several faculties, was empowered to possess and enjoy all the privileges granted to the Universities of the United Kingdom, and especially that of conferring degrees in the Faculties of Divinity, Law, Medicine and Arts. His Grace the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec is, by virtue of his office, Visitor of the University. The Superior of the Seminary, for the time being, holds the office of Rector.

Apparel, wearing, of British Subjects dying abroad, but domiciled in Canada, Articles by and for the use of the Governor General, Articles for the public uses of the Dominion, Articles for the use of foreign Consuls General, Army and Navy for the use of,—Arms, Clothing, Musical instruments for Bands, Military Stores, Settler's Effects of every description, in actual use, not being merchandise, brought by persons making oath that they intend becoming permanent settlers within the Dominion.

UNDER REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS TO BE PRESCRIBED BY THE MINISTER OF CUSTOMS.

Carriages of travellers and carriages laden with merchandise and not to include circus troops, nor hawkers, Locomotives and railway passenger, baggage and freight cars, running upon any line road crossing the frontier, so long as Canadian Locomotives and cars are admitted free under similar circumstances in the United States, Menageries, horses, cattle, carriages and harnesses of, Travellers baggage.

The following goods when the growth and produce of any of the British North American Provinces may be imported free of duty, subject to alteration or regulation, by proclamation, of the Governor in Council, viz :

Animals of all kinds, Fresh, smoked and salt-meats, Green and dried fruits, Fish of all kinds, Products of fish and of all other creatures living in water, Poultry, Butter, Cheese, Lard, Tallow, Timber and lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, but not otherwise manufactured in whole or in part, Fish oil, Gypsum, ground or unground, Hay, Straw, Bran, Seeds of all kinds, Vegetables, (including potatoes and other roots,) Plants, trees and shrubs, Hops.

The following shall be prohibited to be imported under penalty of two hundred dollars together with the forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, viz :

Books, Printed Papers, Drawings, Paintings, Prints and Photographs, of a treasonable or seditious or of an immoral or indecent character, Coin base or counterfeit.

The annual issue of licences commences on the 1st of May, the old licenses expiring on the 30th April.

Those who are in possession of certificates for tavern licenses in the Country, or of permits from the City Clerk, in the City, will have the right, on making applications to this office, and on paying the above taxes, for their licenses, as heretofore.

Those who make applications for shop licenses will be required, as heretofore, to produce a certificate from the city treasurer for \$8 road tax.

In all cases, the above provincial tax is eligible apart from the impost or tax imposed by the local or country councils.

The duty on Tavern, Shop Licenses, Auction, Auction duty, &c., under Confederation, belong to the Local Governments.

Persons infringing the law are liable to a fine of \$50, or to an imprisonment of 3 to 6 months in the common gaol of the district.
