helped his owner be the first in history  
to win more than a hundred thousand

when he gave his best in every race.

But he had to work.  
Would up hauling water Grimsby way -

## Michael Moriarty

NEW YORK (AP) — Nobody is suggesting that Michael Moriarty, the actor, quit his day job.

Moriarty, the actor, just resumed production on the second season of NBC's Tuesday night hour-long drama Law and Order. Moriarty, the musician, is a respected pianist in the jazz clubs of New York City who's just finished his third album.

"I'm going to do one a year," says Moriarty, the overachiever, who spent his Fulbright scholarship studying acting at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. He spent a decade in regional and off-Broadway theatre.

Then, in 1973, he starred with Robert De Niro in Bang the Drum Slowly, won his first of two Emmys as the Gentleman Caller in The Glass Menagerie and won a Tony for his work on Broadway in Find Your Way Home.

And yet there's this business with jazz albums.

"One a year," he said, grinning into his post-luncheon decaf, letting a "shucks, Ma" mock earnestness into his voice. "I'm going to make sure that before I leave this earth, I've said what I've got to say. When that old Fulbright-gone-bad retires to that Big Piano in the Sky."

### MANY TALENTS

He also has written three plays, which have been produced professionally. He's a published poet. And, since 1985, he's composed music for chamber orchestra, string quartet, piano and solo violin.


This spring, the Michael Moriarty Jazz Trio — with jazz great Ron Carter on bass and Terry Clarke on percussion — headlined at Fat Tuesday's jazz club, laying down tracks for the new album.

The New York Times has gone so far as to call him "a jazz player of considerable skill, an oddball singer with more than one vocal personality and a writer of eccentric, jivey jazz songs."

Moriarty beamed when a listener cited his "funky-punky" vocals.

"I love jazz singing. It's a part of my nature. I must pay tribute to it. I must honor it or it will beat me around the head," he said.

"Basically, I get up and do this because I have to," he said, slipping into a squinting hipster's hoarse, be-hop drawl. "I am in the grips of a funky muse. She will not let me off the 88s."

## A successful Warebrook Contemporary Music Festival

VERMONT — Hillandale Farm has never heard such beautiful sounds echoing from the hills until the Warebrook Contemporary Music Festival performed their concert at the United Church in Newport.

The first season of the Festival, which ended on Sunday, July 14, was a successful one. Twenty-one musicians from Boston, Montreal and Vermont gave four concerts, playing pieces written by 19 different composers.

Directors Darry Dolezal (cellist) and Sara Doncaster (composer and pianist), put much effort in preparing for the program. Performers rehearsed throughout the day at the farm and at the performance sites in preparation for each evening's concert. Recording engineer Jesse Howes and assistant Wayne Doncaster Jr. were on call for sound checks, and were present throughout

all concerts.

The entire Doncaster family in Vermont graciously housed and served meals to the musicians and composers. Rural Vermont was a feast for visitors from the city; all enjoyed presenting their music in a relaxed atmosphere.

Furthermore, composers and performers were able to exchange ideas for future collaborations.

The success of this year's festival generated excitement for this new venue for contemporary music.

Composer Allen Anderson enjoyed working with five youngsters in his piece entitled *Over the Mountain*. It was a work "which would involve young performers and be about the harshness and beauty of life in Appalachia".

Anderson strove to "capture something of the expressive quality of country fiddling ... to establish a place, a time of life

and a growing sense of one's own surroundings which could happen anywhere".

The children played a number of small percussion instruments and narrated a story on July 11, at Haskell Opera House in Derby Line, Vermont.

Friday's concert featured Oliver Messiaen's *Quartet for the End of Time*, written in 1941 while the composer was in a prison camp during World War II. It was inspired by the Revelation of St. John, specifically the Vision of the Angel in Chapter 10.

The powerful and moving performance was given by Arie Yaacobi, violin; Mark Margolies, clarinet; Darry Dolezal, cello; and Marjorie Atlas, piano. Three of the four players are members of the Ensemble of Boston. Yaacobi, who teaches violin and performs at the Michigan Technological University, extended his vacation in Boston to perform at the

Festival.

Judson Scott, trumpeter, is an active proponent of new music in Boston and presented three works during the course of the weekend: *Parable* by Vincent Persichetti for solo trumpet; *Five poems of Emily Dickinson* by Jay Rizzetto for Trumpet and Narrator (assisted by Wendy Hunter, soprano), and the *Sonata for trumpet and violoncello* by Yves Charbon with Darry Dolezal, cello.

Hunter performed *Three Songs of Charles Ives* in the Haskell Opera House on July 11, accompanied by pianist Marjorie Atlas.

In addition, soprano Pamela Murray and harpist Elizabeth Morse, principal harpist with the Rhode Island Philharmonic, performed Margaret McAllister's *Four Songs from the Separate Rose*.

Murray also presented the final piece of the Festival, Dr.

Charles Fussell's *Fünf Goethe Lieder*, accompanied by pianist Shiao-Li Ding. Fussell, professor of Theory and Composition at Boston University's School for the Arts, assisted the concert and was pleased.

Plans are already underway for next year's concerts; many performers will be returning. We look forward to bringing the best of Twentieth Century Music to the Northeast Kingdom next summer.

# STAMPS & BOOKS

## Map stamp of 1898 instituted Imperial Penny Postage

I once did an article for a philatelic publication that dealt with Canada's Map Stamp. The editor wasn't sure if he would publish the article. He said that the material had been covered the previous year.

I wish either Fred Tomlinson or Whit Bradley could have read those remarks. It would have made for quite a chuckle. The fact is, one could almost do an article per stamp since each one is so unique.

The Map Stamp of 1898 is sometimes referred to as Canada's first Christmas stamp because it was officially issued on December 25, 1898.

The issuing of this stamp was the culmination of Postmaster General William Mulock's dream, which was to have Imperial Penny Postage instituted between all portions of the

British Empire, at the rate of one penny a letter. A British or Imperial penny was equivalent to two Canadian cents.

There were twenty million stamps ordered, evenly divided in two ocean background colors of blue and green. There were in fact 19,927,500 stamps delivered. The shortage no doubt being attributed to spoilage.

The ocean colors that were supposed to be blue and green, in fact turned out to be five colors with shade variations. The detailed study published reveals the following colors: lavender, light blue, deep blue, very deep blue and bright blue green.

There were five plates laid down for the printing of this stamp. Only four were actually used. Plate four never made it due to the amount of errors. One Ralph Trimble, who is ve-

ry involved in re-entries recently photographed a portion of a sheet of stamps from plate four that is kept in the National Archives in Ottawa. He claims the plate is actually in better condition than anticipated.

If you check out Scott's Volume I, it gives the Map Stamp a very cursory listing. Two ocean colors of lavender and blue and also noting that it comes in a state of imperforation. Scott's Canada Specialized goes a little further by listing two major re-entries and mentioning that a number of re-entries and re-touches exist. The Darnell catalogue listings are much the same. Of course, one can't expect major listings in these catalogues. It would simply be too much.

The first stamp illustrated here is lavender. At first glance, you might say that it's just another map stamp. However, upon closer inspection, one will find several variations from the original design.

First of all, we'll look at the Indian Ocean island group. In the original design there are supposed to be seven islands. In this specimen there are eight.

Off the east coast of Africa, there are two islands. Slightly above and to the left of these islands there is a black dot. It's

not supposed to be there either.

The Island of Gibraltar is at the entrance to the Mediterranean Sea. It is the only British position in that immediate area yet, there is a red dot in Spain and one just below in Africa.

In the laying down of the plates, guide dots were made on the plates. Not all were burnished out in the wiping of the plates. One in particular that helps in the plating of the stamp is the Gulf of Tonkin Dot. It's location in relation to the Islands of Formosa and Hainan are the determining factors.

For some reason or other, the cables surrounding the design of the stamp became very weak because of use. These were constantly being re-touched. This very stamp illustrated shows a strong retouch in the bottom cable with other re-touches in the side cables. If I'm correct, this stamp should be number 97 from plate 3.

This is just one stamp from a plate. Can you imagine how much can be written about the Map Stamp. To study this stamp, I use a 30X illuminated microscope. It's amazing what you will find. The shift of the red printing is very prominent in many stamps. Extra islands will also be found. This is no doubt due to an ink splash or maybe a piece of dust.

If that's not enough, just studying this stamp, someone came up with the bright idea of a research to find how many R.P.O. cancellations appear on the Map Stamp. The R.P.O. study group within the British North America Philatelic Society has an official listing and more are showing up. The second stamp illustrated is cancelled with a Chatham & Walkerville Rwy. P.O. cancellation dated January 8, 1900, just over a year after the stamp first appeared. The cancellation itself was in existence from 1898 to 1904.

## Hank Snow's new autobiography

HALIFAX (CP) — Country music legend Hank Snow says an autobiography he has just written will explore both his Nova Scotia roots and his largely unknown role in the success of Elvis Presley.

Snow and Presley's manager, Col. Tom Parker, operated a talent agency together in the 1950s. Snow claims Parker didn't compensate him fairly for his part in Presley's career.

"He really stole my part of Presley," the 77-year-old singer said in a recent interview from his Nashville office. "That is a story I don't like to comment on."

He suggested reading the book for further insights.

The book, which is being offered to publishers, will "tell the correct and true story" of his relationship with Parker, as well as give details about the rest of his life, he said. It will be peppered with photos from his personal collection, including some from his early childhood.

Snow travelled the backroads of Nova Scotia for years, playing in schoolhouses, community halls and tents to make a living for his family. Times were tough and money was tight through the 1930s and early '40s, even though Snow was the unpaid star of a radio show on

Halifax station CHNS.

"I remember one day we went on city relief in Halifax. We hadn't eaten in three or four days and, in Halifax, if you went on city relief, you got a ticket that would give you \$2.50 for groceries — but you had to work a day in the city streets.

**PICKIN', SHOVELIN'**

"Well, the first place they put me to work was right in front of CHNS. I was wearing an old hat I borrowed from a friend and I don't think any of the announcers even recognized me. There I was, pickin' and shovelin' ice in front of the Lord Nelson Hotel, where CHNS used to be.

"When I got back home I said to my wife, 'Get me a looking glass' and she said, 'Why?' I said, 'We're going to sit here and watch ourselves starve to death because I'll never do that again.'"

He was born Clarence Eugene Snow on May 9, 1914, in Brooklyn, near Liverpool on Nova Scotia's South Shore.

He had a turbulent childhood, which he remembers without fondness. He has said he was physically abused. His parents split up, and he lived with neither. At the age of 12 he became a cabin boy on a freighter. He worked there for four

years.

As a teenager, he spent two weeks unloading a salt ship to earn the \$30 he needed to buy his first guitar.

"We starved to death right up until the time I got married," Snow said. "I was the victim of (my parents') bad marriage, and everything else was poverty."

He married Minnie Blanche Aalders of Kentville, N.S., and they have one son, Jimmy, a preacher near Nashville.

Snow turned professional in 1932. He landed his CHNS radio job in 1935 simply by writing in and asking for an audition. A year later, he signed with RCA Victor, his recording label for nearly four decades.

**'I DESERVED IT'**

He kept trying to break into the U.S. market. In 1950, he got his first hit with 'I'm Movin' On, a song it took him a year to write.

"I wasn't surprised. I had put in many years and, as a matter of fact, I thought I deserved it."

That same year he first appeared on Nashville's Grand Ole Opry, and he has been there ever since.

Snow has become an American citizen and has not been in Nova Scotia since 1986.

## Vicki Tansey innovates the world of dance

**ABERCORN**— After spending 24 years living up to society's expectations, Vicki Tansey realized she had had enough.

It was time she did her own thing.

"I wanted risk, the unknown," she says.

Tansey, one of Montreal's first innovators of alternative dance, spent nine years taking ballet lessons with Eleanor Moore Ashton, attended *Le Grand Ballet Canadien* school in Montreal, danced for Richard Nicolas's company and choreographed dances for a year before her soul yearned for more.

"I was never dancing my story. I was always using someone else's material."

It was one cold February day in 1969 when she performed her second improvised dance in front of her first audience.

"I was four months pregnant, she recalls. I remembered we were in a funky room painted in light pink. It was freezing. I danced while Richard read haikus he had written."

After she married her Concordia English professor Richard Sommer, a poet, they spent a year on West Coast.

### DIFFERENT VISION

While there, Tansey says she met many non-dance artists

who helped her to think and see dance differently.

"Every move I made (until then) was programmed. I wanted to find a language that was less predictable."

For three long years, Tansey struggled to come up with her own philosophy of dance.

"I gradually started to form my own language through improvisation—a 'within the moment' experience. It's a process one goes through in order to be creative."

"For me, it's the process that counts. The spontaneity. The

### OVERCOME FEAR

One thing Tansey noticed during her last workshop was that everyone who attended had a fear of something. During one workshop, she told her students to use common objects to create spirit dolls. When they

Tansey encourages them to "let go of perfection, of the finished product, and focus on the process."

## Dale reflects Olivia Novrak's character in Street Legal

CHARLOTTETOWN, P.E.I. (CP)—Cynthia Dale, one of the stars of the CBC television series Street Legal, looks at her right shoulder out of the corner of her eye. "He's still there," she says.

The actress is speaking of the lucky angel she has decided sits on her shoulder. An angel that has helped guide her career since she got into "the business" at the tender age of five.

"I get to do a show that has a lot of integrity, and I'm really lucky," says the Toronto native over sips of coffee during a recent visit to Charlottetown for a charity function.

"There's not an awful lot of work in Canada right now for actors. My best friends are unemployed. I consider myself very lucky everyday."

After years of dancing, stage productions, the occasional television guest spot and the less occasional movie work, Dale joined the Street Legal cast

three seasons ago as attorney Olivia Novak.

### FIERY CHARACTER

Beautiful, bold and brilliant, the fiery character is to Street Legal what J.R. Ewing would have been to Dallas if he had been drop-dead gorgeous — stepping on toes and hearts in her quest for power and money, pushing the limits of every professional ethical boundary she runs into along the way.

In some ways Dale reflects her character, or perhaps it's the other way around. No, she isn't manipulative, and no, she doesn't twist your heart between bites of her bran muffin, but she is businesslike and direct, speaking promptly and honestly about her opinions.

"She's like most lawyers, very aggressive," she says of Olivia Novak. "And her morals are like a lot of lawyers."

She protests that she doesn't see the character as the manipulative bitch most viewers perceive her to be.

"I don't only see her as a bitch, that's a really easy label

to put on the character. The basic underlying thing of her character is that she's driven and aggressive and does things the only way she knows how. Besides," she adds, "if she was a man, she would never be called the 'a' word."

### LOSING STREAK

She admits the character was fairly one-dimensional in her first season on the show. But since then, she has been shown as a vulnerable and occasionally sensitive personality.

This season, the usually-successful Olivia goes "on a real losing streak, spiralling towards the bottom," becoming involved with a powerful lawyer along the way.

Street Legal has become one of the CBC's few shining jewels. The characters are stylish and sharp, combining quality acting with well-written storylines that have managed to attract quite a following in six years.

"It's a legal show and people sort of complain sometimes that there's not enough legal," Dale says.

"But people really don't want to sit and watch lawyers only do legal things all the time. It's what happens when they go home and how the legal things affect them personally that's interesting. That's what makes people watch."

### LONG DAYS

It takes eight months to shoot a season's worth (18 episodes) of the show, from the end of

April to the end of December. For Dale, that means eight months of workdays that start at 5:30 a.m. and don't end until 7 p.m.

"I'm in bed when it's still light outside most of the time," she confesses. "Weekends are incredibly important to me. They're sacred. I need that time to regenerate."

Shot in Toronto, each episode takes nine days to make. But while it may be hard work, it's also something she adores doing.

"It's wonderful, because you're making an impression on people. God knows, I don't think you should take a TV show like a religion and get too obsessed with it, but it's nice when people identify with you," she says.

"I watch TV shows. I was devastated when Thirty-something was cancelled because I loved those people. I said 'What about Melissa, she's got to get back with her painter!' and all that stuff."

### RUNS IN FAMILY

Dale was born Cynthia Ciurluni, the third of four children, three of whom are now actors. Another sibling is involved in the production end of the business.

Her last name was changed to Dale by an agent when she first started acting as a child.

"Ciurluni doesn't fit on a marquee very well. Mind you Dale hasn't had to lately either," she laughs.

Her early years were spent attending acting, dancing and singing lessons and a couple of years of ballet school. Between auditions and performing, she admits that she spent more time out of grade school than she spent in it.

"I was challenged on an artistic level as a child much before I was challenged on a mental, academic level. And for me it was the best, I happened to be born one of those children that needed that nurturing."

She doesn't feel she missed anything as a child.

"Why would I be missing anything? I was doing something I loved."

Being in the business was not the hard part.

"When I was out there I was respected. Kids are respected on a film set because they have to learn their lines, be on time, hit their marks and be disciplined."

### BACK TO SCHOOL

The problems came when the work was over and she returned to school.

"The hard part was going back to school and being treated like a child by teachers and talked down to because I was nine or 11, or 14. Being treated like I didn't understand or know things, being condescended to. In the other world, I was never treated like that — it was school that was hard."

She says it wasn't until later in life that she realized this, finally understanding why she hadn't been happy at grade school.

"Being in the business as a child was the best thing I could have done as a child — for me. I think there are a lot of children that have artistic sides and they are not nurtured in the academics of the school system. That's why we now have schools for the performing arts."

Dale feels that actors are not made, they're born. It's an internal calling, which is why she wouldn't want to do anything else.

"People aren't only actors because it's fun — people are actors because it's what they are inside. I don't know too many people that go into acting that go 'Oh, I think I'm going to become an actor and become a millionaire.' You never will become a millionaire unless you're living in Hollywood and you're Julia Roberts."

## Stevenson's Treasure Island plays at Stratford

STRATFORD, Ont. (CP) — Not all people envision swarthy pirates, lost treasure and lusty adventure when they think of Scottish writer Robert Louis Stevenson, even though he's best known for a classic tale made up of precisely those elements.

Instead, some folks, like the Irish novelist George Moore, believed the author to be a, well, less hearty writer.

"I think of Mr. Stevenson as a consumptive youth weaving garlands of sad flowers with pale, weak hands," Moore wrote in 1888, "or leaning to a large plate-glass window, and scratching thereon exquisite profiles with a diamond pencil."

Was he writing about the same guy who several years earlier wrote the boyhood adventure story *Treasure Island* — the fellow who penned the immortal pirate phrase, "Yo-ho-ho, and a bottle of rum?"

Yes, he was.

Because although Stevenson

had a great sense of fun and flourish — as his pirate-filled folly and other novels proved — he also had a delicate touch when it came to capturing the sensations of childhood.

Unfortunately, neither the author's ache for adventure nor his sensitive handling of youth comes through in a new stage adaptation of *Treasure Island* that had its world premiere at the Stratford Festival on Thursday night.

### STORY PLODS ON

The thrilling story of how young Jim Hawkins sails the high seas and outsmarts the one-legged pirate Long John Silver to claim a chest filled with gold and silver has been transformed into a plod toward boredom.

And the sad part is, that didn't need to be the case — especially since the production has so many of the ingredients necessary for success.

There are several outstanding performances — including those of fresh-faced Geoffrey Brumlik as Jim, scarily

snarly Leon Pownall as Long John Silver and especially Edward Atienza as Ben Gunn, a slightly starkers sailor marooned on an island for three years.

As well, a huge chunk of money was obviously poured into the production to allow designer Debra Hanson to instantly remake the Festival Theatre's thrust stage into such things as a sea-going ship and a tropical island.

But while the actors and designer do their best to suggest the exciting and dangerous journey experienced by Jim in the novel, the book's adaptor and the production's director seemed to have taken a more solemn approach.

### FUN MISSING

In fairness, adaptor Elliott Hayes and director David Williams have put a workmanlike version of the adventure classic on stage.

They forgot one thing, however — the fun.

## Miller's latest drama premieres in London this fall

LONDON (AP) — The world premiere of Arthur Miller's latest drama heads an impressive line-up of new London shows this fall.

Miller's *The Ride Down Mt. Morgan*, starring Tom Conti, opens Oct. 23 at Wyndham's Theatre. It's the first work by the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of *Death Of A Salesman*

to be premiered outside his native United States. And it's the first play in five years for Miller, who turns 76 on Oct. 17.

The premiere dominates a busy fall that promises a much-needed antidote to a summer season marked by a slump in tourists and too much mindless fare like *Sex Please, We're Italian!*

In a telephone interview from New York, Miller said he was pleased to be opening the play overseas.

"There's more of a theatre culture (in London)," said the playwright, whose *After the Fall* and *The Crucible* were seen in repertory last year at the Royal National Theatre. "It's also easier to get and keep actors of a certain calibre."

### IN GOOD COMPANY

Miller is in esteemed British company this fall, with new plays by Harold Pinter, Alan Ayckbourn, Alan Bennett and John Osborne.

Pinter's *Party Time*, opening Nov. 6 at the Almeida, has a running time of more than an hour. That may seem elephantine to viewers of his last two plays, which ran a total of 28 minutes.

By contrast, Ayckbourn's *The Revengers' Comedies*, starring Griff Rhys Jones and Joanna Lumley, runs in two

parts over 5½ hours. As a result, the black comedy, first seen two years ago in Scarborough, north Yorkshire, has two opening nights, Oct. 16 and 17.

It's the 37th play by Britain's most prolific contemporary dramatist.

Nov. 28 sees the National Theatre bow of Bennett's *The Madness of George III*, directed by Nicholas Hytner (*Miss Saigon*). This is the first new play by Bennett since his scintillating 1988 *Single Spies*, which cast Prunella Scales as Queen Elizabeth.

Osborne's *Deja Vu*, due on the West End in November at a theatre to be announced, continues the story of Jimmy Porter, the angry young renegade at the centre of Osborne's celebrated 1956 *Look Back In Anger*. Peter O'Toole will star.

Several other familiar Broadway names are resurfacing with new works.

### FAMILIAR BASE

Timbgrlake Wertebaker, whose *Our Country's Good* received six Tony nominations in June, returns to her familiar base, the Royal Court Theatre, with *Three Birds Alighting In A Field*, opening Sept. 10.

Hugh Whitmore, whose plays *Breaking the Code* and *Pack of Lies* both ran on

Broadway, has a new show, *It's Ralph*, opening Oct. 28. Timothy West and Jack Shepherd head the cast.

Admirers of the classics are catered to in Sir Peter Hall's new production of Moliere's *Tartuffe*, opening Oct. 22 at the Playhouse. Felicity Kendal and Paul Eddington co-star.

A revival of Jean Anouilh's *Becket*, opening Oct. 3 at the Theatre Royal, Haymarket, pairs two Tony-winning performers, Derek Jacobi (*Much Ado About Nothing*) as St. Thomas Becket and Robert Lindsay (*Me and My Girl*) as his adversary, King Henry II.

Thornton Wilder's much-loved American play *Our Town* opens a limited engagement Sept. 5 at the Shaftesbury Theatre. Alan Alda and Robert Sean Leonard (*Dead Poets Society*) make their British stage debuts in the production, directed by a third American, Robert Allan Ackerman.

Perhaps the season's oddest show, *The Hunting of the Snark*, opens Oct. 24 at the Prince Edward Theatre. Based on the 1876 nonsense poem by Lewis Carroll, the \$3.7 million US musical features music, lyrics and book by one Mike Batt, who's also credited as director and designer.

## Temples, Palaces, Arts Draw Tourists to Yogyakarta

**YOGYAKARTA, Indonesia (PN)** — Despite the surrounding cacophony of birds, a huge bat sleeps peacefully in the noonday sun, hanging upside down in a cage.

"Some people like to keep them as pets," explains a local in Yogyakarta's bustling, noisy bird market.

For Java's many bird lovers, the Pasar Ngasem market is the place to go to haggle over parrots, cockatoos, thrushes, parakeets and exotic songbirds from the neighboring island of Sumatra.

Among the rows of cages, there are even roosters that sing, not to mention squirring platters of worms — bird food — and a few monkeys.

In a country where most things are dirt cheap and the average salary is far below Canada's, some songbirds sell for thousands of dollars.

The market is among the more unusual pleasures in this central Java city, one of the cultural centres of Indonesia.

It's a perfect jumping-off point for some of the country's fabulous religious monuments, including the Buddhist Borobudur and the Hindu Prambanan.

Yogyakarta is where you can hear the haunting sounds of the gamelan orchestra — a complex percussion orchestra — and watch the mysterious Javanese wayang shadow puppets enact tales from age-old Hindu epics.

Yogyakarta is easy to reach by bus or train from the Indonesian capital of Jakarta or the island of Bali, a popular tourist destination.

### STILL REGAL HOME

The first stop for most tourists is the Kraton, a two-century-old palace that stands in the heart of the city and still serves as home to sultans.

Traditionally, the Kraton consisted of the sultan's residence, private ceremonial chambers, a magnificent throne hall, several performance pavilions, a mosque, gardens, stables, foundry and barracks — all within a walled

compound. Today, the innermost compound is considered part of the Kraton, while the rest has been integrated into the city.

You can take a guided tour of the Kraton, including the museum, as part of the adult admission fee of just over \$1 Cdn.

Just behind the Kraton stands the ruins of the royal pleasure gardens, constructed in the 18th century and then abruptly — curiously — abandoned.

Before you leave the area, stroll through the bird market and the batik artists' colony. Don't worry about finding the shops because the salesmen will find you. Bargain hard, stand firm and be wary of touts telling you about student art exhibitions that "are only in town for a few more hours."

You should also stroll down Yogyakarta's main street — Jalan Malioboro — which begins north of the Kraton and ends two kilometres to the north at a shrine dedicated to the local guardian spirit. It was

laid out in the 18th century as a ceremonial boulevard.

### AVENUE BUSTLES

Today, Malioboro is a bustling avenue lined with shops selling everything from leather goods and silver to wooden puppets.

At night, you can see the heart of Javanese culture in action, including dance and puppet performances.

The dalang — puppet play

leader — is actor, historian, stage hand and storyteller rolled into one. As the dalang manipulates puppets representing Hindu gods and goddesses, a bright light shines from behind him, casting shadows on the other side of a white screen. A gamelan orchestra and chorus of women singers provide dramatic accompaniment. A full shadow play is an all-night experience.

## Mysterious and powerful Korean Cheju Do Island

**CHEJU, South Korea (PN)** — Called the Island of the Gods, Cheju Do is the most famous of South Korea's 3,300 islands.

It wasn't long ago that people 100 kilometres away on the mainland referred to it as "that island over there," but today it's Asia's honeymoon capital.

And it's also high on the list of westerners wanting more from paradise than swaying palms and a sunny beach.

The sense of magic and mystery is strong on Cheju Do, perhaps because the legends surrounding it are more than mere words.

On the north side of this 65-kilometre-long island province is Samsonghyol Meadow, where visitors can see the three small holes from which three demigods are said to have emerged to inhabit the area.

And clearly, Snake Cave is big enough to house the giant demon serpent that in tales devoured beautiful virgins.

Making up the island's landscape are more than 150 extinct volcanoes, massive caves, thundering waterfalls and beautiful white beaches trimmed with streams of crushed black lava rock.

### VOLCANO IN PARK

At the island's centre is the 1,950-metre-high Mount Hallasan volcano, the republic's tallest and the heart of a national park.

Not far away is Manjanggal Cave, which stretches 10 kilometres into the rock to make it one of the most impressive caves in the world.

Travelling around the island,

visitors will see 600-year-old nutmeg forests and row upon row of tangerine groves. Carved stone pillars resemble dragons and generals, but watch for squatter figures.

Known as "stone grandfather" statues since they look like kindly old men, the Tolharubang figures add their own mystery to Cheju Do's diverse terrain.

Made from the island's black basalt, the whimsical figures are nearly life-size and resemble the famed statues of Easter Island. No one knows when these fixtures first appeared.

Adopted by the islanders as mascots, the stone grandfathers today stand guard in rural groves and village squares, wearing nothing but a silly grin and what looks like a stone bowler hat.

### SEE FOLK MUSEUM

Others can be seen in the Folk and Natural History Museum in Cheju City, the largest city and the island's capital.

Elsewhere are traditional villages, the grass-roofed houses built as they were in the 19th century. Remnants of 13th-century temples can be seen, though little more than foundations remain.

Cheju Do is also known as

Samda, which roughly translates to "three abundances" — referring to rocks, wind and women.

Not just any women, but Haenyo. Year-round, these "sea women" aged from 15 to 70 dive to incredible depths to harvest abalone, octopus and seaweed, all without breathing gear.

There are two major centres on the island, and old meets new in Cheju City on the north coast and Sogwip'o City on the south coast.

In their traditional open-air markets are stalls piled high with pig heads, dried eels, garlic, ginger, steaming pots of dumpling soup and mountains of unfamiliar vegetables and seafood.

Traffic is frantic, the motorists wild. Streets are either crooked, dark and narrow, or garish, straight and wide — both in sharp contrast to tidy, tranquil settings of the luxury hotels on the outskirts.

With the influx of tourists growing over recent years, many locals fear the island's atmosphere will change.

On the island's west side, the steep steps to the hilltop Sanbang Grotto Temple are often crowded with tourists going to see the seated Buddha gazing serenely over the ocean.

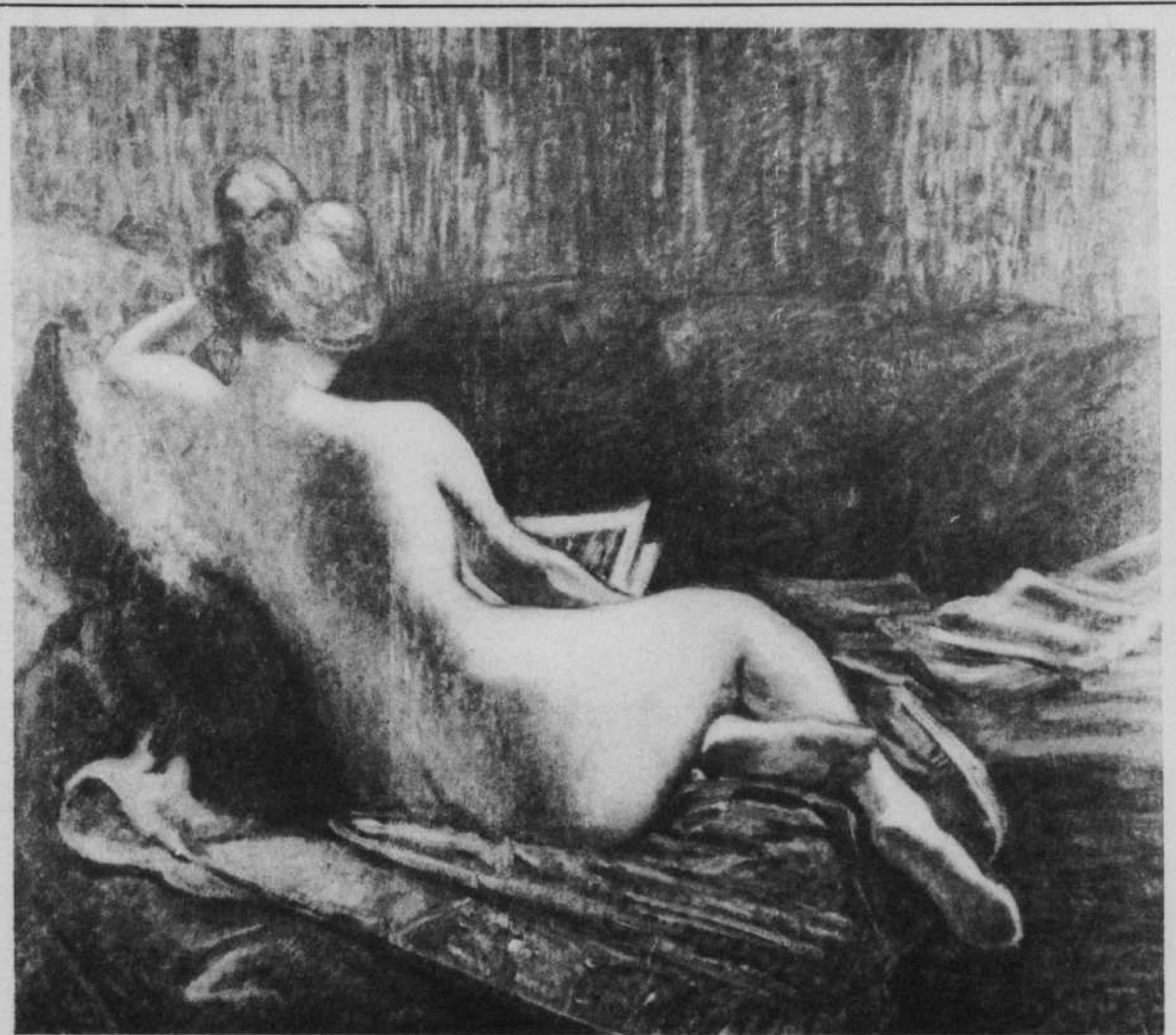

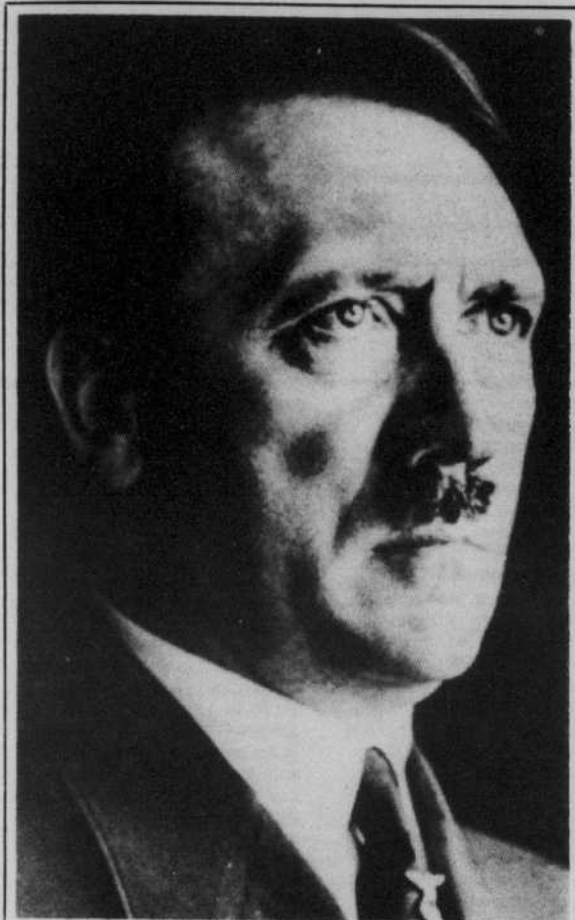

### Going through ceiling no high point to Ruttan

During the five years that Susan Ruttan has played Roxanne Melman on "L.A. Law" (airing Thursdays on NBC), fans have bombarded her with one question: "When are you and Arnie going to get

together?"

On the season finale last May, it finally happened. Arnold Becker (Corbin Bernsen), his marriage in ruins, realized that he had been ignoring the only person in his life who truly understood him: Roxanne, until recently his longtime, long-suffering legal secretary. He made a pass at her, they moved to a more secluded spot, and, what with all the construction going on in the firm's offices, crashed through the ceiling.

"I'm reading the script," Ruttan recalls. "I get to this part and I go, 'What? Wait! Through the ceiling?'"

It wasn't, obviously, the easiest scene to film.

"When you're on camera with very few clothes on—that's not been my experience in acting," says Ruttan. "So the whole thing I found to be truly embarrassing. Your clothes are sort of flying up in the air

—what few you have on."

But Arnie, for the time being anyway, belongs to Roxanne. So guess what Ruttan's fans have been telling her this summer?

"They finally get together and everybody's going, 'How could you fall for that bum?'" she says with a laugh.

Actually, Ruttan isn't about to argue with that assessment. "I absolutely agree that she should never have had an affair with Arnie," she says. "I think she would have learned that by now."

But in spite of all that, she admits to feeling a bit pleased for Roxanne.

"There's a certain satisfaction," she says. "She is the right person for him, really. She's the one who understands him, yet at this point in her life is unwilling to tolerate any bull from him."

Memorable as getting together with Arnie was, Ruttan doesn't see it as the high point of her years on "L.A. Law." For her, the high point will always be the first season, when what she thought would be a small guest role on the pilot turned into a featured role on the hottest series on television.

"I remember the first night after the pilot had aired standing in a restaurant waiting to be seated. I looked around and saw people looking at me. I said to my friend, 'Is there something wrong with me?' Then someone walked up and said, 'We saw "L.A. Law" and just want to tell you how great it was.'"

"It was exhausting and exhilarating and terrifying and loads of fun—getting to go places you'd never think in your life you'd be invited to."
