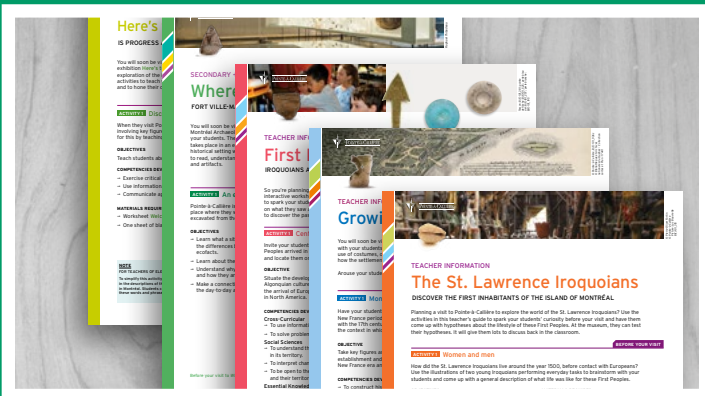

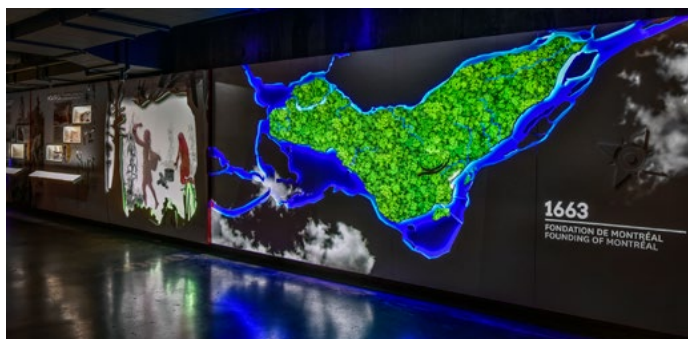

ARCHÆO-ADVENTURE

Elementary cycles 2 and 3 **Secondary cycle 1**

This workshop provides a perfect opportunity to find out what archaeologists do. Under the supervision of a chief archaeologist (interpreter-guide), students use a scientific approach to conduct an investigation. By digging in the ground, they'll find traces of occupancy from the prehistoric era to the days of the British regime, analyzing their findings in a lab and learning how people lived in the past.

FIRST PEOPLES ON THE POINT

Elementary cycle 2 **Secondary**

For centuries, so much has happened at Callière's point, where travellers were forced to make a stop to bypass the Lachine Rapids. First Peoples spent some time here, at first taking advantage of the generous natural resources, and later attending the annual fur fair with the French and signing the Great Peace of Montréal in 1701. With the help of models, artifacts, and the remains, your students will explore the site's indigenous past.

Long before the Europeans arrived, the St. Lawrence Iroquoians built villages of longhouses on the island of Montréal and all along the river. See how they lived from day to day: how they used the furs and bones of the animals they hunted, how they prepared their daily meals, and more. Students will be fascinated by the ingenuity and know-how of this aboriginal nation! Can they show themselves to be just as handy?

Elementary cycle 3 Secondary cycle 1

19th century Montréal. British leaders have embarked on some spectacular projects! The industrial revolution is in full swing and there is much to be done: paving the way for business, building wharves, digging a canal to get around the rapids, installing the aqueduct, replacing sailing ships with steamships, and more. But what exactly does "progress" mean? Through a guided tour, a roleplaying exercise, and the exploration of a new interactive fresco, students will learn about the huge British contribution to the evolution of Montréal society.

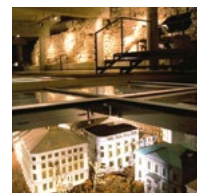

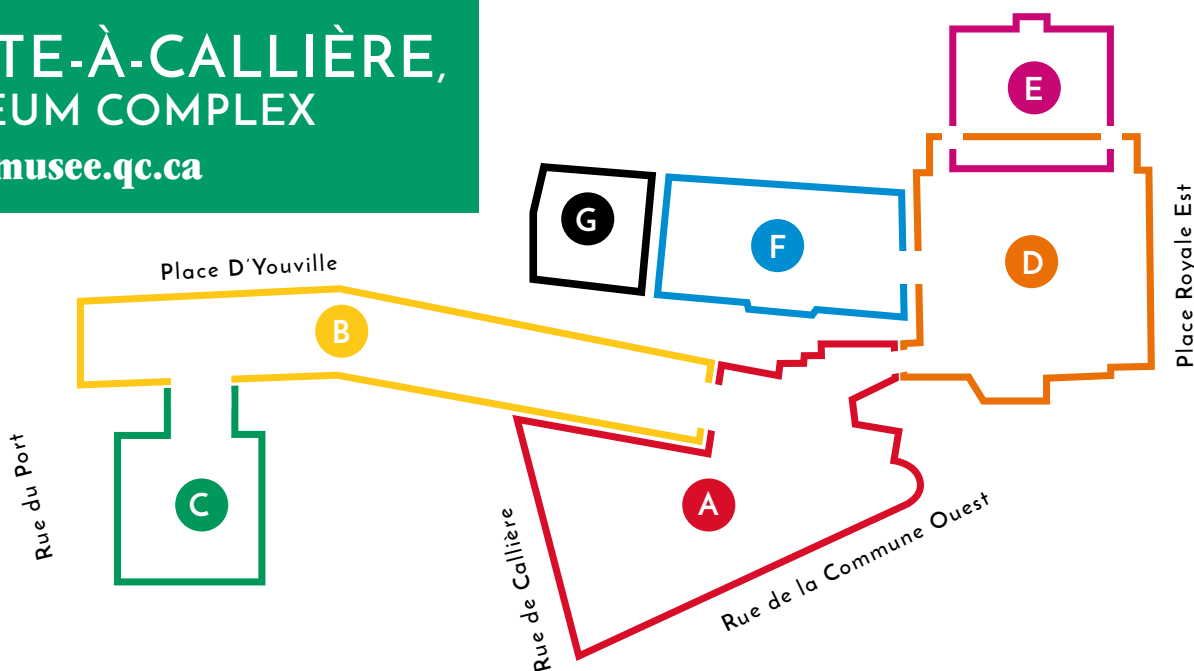

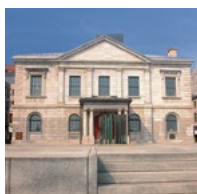

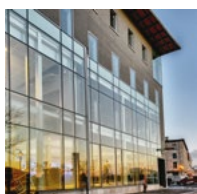
