SPORTING INTELLIGENCE.

THE ACQUIL CLUB'S RACES. The blanketed knights of the Roquet have the MacCallum More dark green tartan as their colors, seem to be on friendly terms with that mythical and much abused gentleman, the clerk of the weather, since their draft upon him was honored by a good day for their races on Saturday afternoon, the only drawback being a cutting wind which kept the spectators stamping about to make the blood circulate.

The half-mile open followed, for which eleven entered and nine started. After the first few laps it was evident that J. G. Ross of the Montreal would have the first place, and all the interest of the spectators was centered on the close struggle between Baird of the Montrealers and McNaughton of St. George for second place. The race finished with J. G. Ross first in two minutes and fifty seconds, with Baird second and McNaughton third by a few inches.

The one mile club was next for which five started, but after the first few laps the field thinned down to John McWood and S. W. Cuthbert and after a very game contest between these two McWood came in first in 7 minutes 16 2/5 seconds with Cuthbert a close second.

The 220 yards race in heats was next and was won after some fine running by J. G. Ross, Montreal, in 31 seconds with A. E. McNaughton of St. Georges second. Mr. Thus Moffatt, the famous professional sprinter, then endeavored to lower the quarter mile record on showboots and after a very pretty piece of running succeeded in doing so by 1/4 of a second, making the quarter of a mile in 62 seconds, the previous record being 70 seconds.

The two mile club race followed this event, and was won by John McWood in 15 minutes and 52 seconds, with John Cuthbert second.

The 120 yards flat man's race, 200 yards and over, followed and caused considerable amusement, the entries being T. Masterson, Argyle, and M. J. O'Loughlin, Emerald. But for a mash up O'Loughlin would have won, for he was considerably in the lead, but as he was nearing the finish he tripped and fell, Masterson passing on and thus winning the race.

Thomas Gallagher, the professional, then ran a mile in the fastest time, making the distance in 7 minutes 7 seconds.

The half mile race, green (in costume) open, followed and was won by Jas. Lumsden, Emerald, in 3 minutes and 5 seconds, W. Ray, Emerald, second, and A. G. Coster, M.A.A.A., third.

The boys' race, under 15 years, quarter mile, was next on the programme and brought out six juvenile aspirants for sporting honors. It was won by J. Turnbull in 1 minute and 44 seconds, with W. Mason second.

ship of the stream, a Boulevard has been made across the river to St. Helens. Taking the left, where this road forks, a short drive leads to the north shore of the island, where, amidst the neglected vestiges of summer gaiety, a hunter's shanty has been erected. It is of pine logs, cedar roofed and wooden fastened. Inside the usual benches are built against the walls; the fire occupies its place upon the old familiar bed of earth raised in the centre of the floor, the smoke ascending to an opening in the roof and thence away through the wooden chimney; a moving arm swings over the fire as the cook may require to put its steaming kettle over it and on the floor is laid a carpet of pine boughs. In such a hut as this the hunter lives when he is fortunate to have such cosy shelter—as often canvas serves his turn—and adjacent to the shanty is a smaller one in which the game, when killed, is stored until the hour of moving is made. By those to whom the woods in winter are unknown, the shanty may perhaps be thought a trifle small for numbers, a hut, a vision of the weather rather than a dwelling, rough, repellent of compound odors, and suggestive of uncomfortable nights, but to those, to most Canadians, perhaps, how different does it all appear under the coloring influence of old associations. How cheerily will it call to mind the excitement of the first big game, the tramp reckless of everything but the wounded animal in hand, the coming snow storm, the thudding woods and darkening sky, the obliterated tracks, the animal at bay, the death and then the utter ignorance of how or where, or whereabouts the salient points, the camp included, of this round world are situated. At such a moment no shanty is pictured to the mind, but such a camp that not Aladdin's palace can compare with it. How does it lay? Where is the north, the east or anything but falling snow? Where is that wretched compass? Gone! lost in a drift! Oh for a glimpse of the way, but no sound of rifle crack and no whistling through the last point of what seemed a dark impenetrable forest, the camp appears in sight what restful satisfaction steals through every vein. "Thought we were lost!" nonsense. "Are we a mope? du lard that we should lose our way, but is there to eat?" For true appetite and eating are things unknown to cities. And then the cook, at once a kindly despot and first minister of man, how generously does he care for us! who speaks of smells! what odour of bleat! Arab's is sweeter than the aromatic pine, the smoking wood and the seductive weed. Each one, or better all combined, encompassed and accentuated by the frosty air puts Lubin, Kimmel, all the odoriferous craft for ever in the shade. What calm contentment lurks within the after-supper, the appetite frizzle for which has been so cunningly exalted by cutting up its sweet contents well rubbed between the palms, "weaving the web desire to snare the bird ledged," as Swinburne says. Set by semi-blazing sticks well-chosen from the fire we puff and modestly recuse on days of bragging. Did we not of our own proper skill—but why relate to envious ears.

From the hunters camp the road goes round the island; a charming drive too little known even in Montreal, and half way around the drive here is THE NATURAL SLIDE. This of itself is under the drive. How many are there, and how magnificent! To get down the artificial slide, but who still cast a lingering look behind at their tobogganing joys and boast that in their day the mountain was their slide. To such, they say, you have the chance of a lifetime, show your joy that tobogganing means. There is no stick, no board, nor hill but such as nature made; a short, steep, power-giving bank and then the broad St. Lawrence. It is but a moderate tramp to reach it, a short and pleasant drive, and Mr. Corriveau has taken pains to have provided hangers where necessary, and for the use of strangers there may be a spare toboggan with skifflet feet to guide it, and for the cold and hungry a cup of fluid beef, and, perhaps, of other fluid too. Such things are done.

The Group in Victoria Park.

Mr. R. Bardorf's plaster-of-Paris group in the Victoria Skating Rink is an allegorical subject intended to show that even the two natural elements of the Carnival, ice and snow, are loyal to the Sovereign of this country. The group consists of a bust of Her Majesty elevated upon a pedestal at some height above two young persons, a lady and gentleman, seated at the base. The female figure represents Ice, and has been so treated by Mr. Bardorf's art as to possess that glittering appearance which is symbolical, if it does not precisely resemble, frozen water. The male figure has a dead white appearance, and is intended to represent snow. He has his hand towards the bust, indicating thereby that there stands the counterpart presentation of the lady to whom he and his companion give their allegiance. It was at first proposed that this or some other similar group should be in the real snow, but the inopportune thaw which for a short time made the snow a thing of tradition coupled with other difficulties and considerations, induced the abandonment of the idea and the substitution of that which we now see.

THE TOBOGGAN CLUBS.

The first to be taken up is the parent slide, the Montreal, situated at the west end of Sherbrooke street, in the most fashionable suburb of the city. This is the oldest slide in the city, and the longest. This club consists of our *haut tons*, and is the most fashionable in the city. The next in order is the Park slide, situated at the top of old Mount Royal. This slide compares in attractiveness with the Montreal, a great inducement being the exhilarating walk and the fine view to be enjoyed from the top of the mountain. It is much patronized by snowshoers and has been greatly improved and otherwise benefited for this season. Visitors to the Carnival should not fail to visit the Park slide.

Then comes the Tuque Bleu slide, the first artificial slide in the city. It was organized in 1883-84 by the members of the M.A.A.A., and is one of the affiliated clubs of that association. This slide, from its central position on St. Catherine street, west, making it easy of access, is drawing a large share of patronage. Then comes the Lansdowne, partly artificial and partly natural, situated on Fletcher's Field, at the top of Park avenue. This slide is a great favorite with the residents in that vicinity, and also draws a large membership from other parts of the city. It has also been improved this year, having been changed from the west to the east side of Park avenue, and thus having the advantage of two hills instead of one.

The next in the ranks is the slide organized by the members of the Trappist Snowshoe Club, which is situated on the corner of St. Denis and Sherbrooke streets. This slide is a novelty, being built on the Russian plan, which means that you slide down one hill and half way up another, thus dispensing with a considerable walk. This club is composed principally of our French Canadian fellow citizens, who will no doubt welcome visitors during carnival week with true French politeness. Then follows the Beaver slide, situated in Hochelaga, the Pastime slide, composed of residents in Point St. Charles, and the natural slide on St. Helen's Island, which has been specially erected for carnival week and is free to all. Lastly comes the children's slide on St. Catherine street, opposite the Tuque Bleu, which is the slide patronized by our juvenile tobogganers.

Meeting of Executive Committee on Saturday Night.

The Executive Committee met at the Windsor Hotel on Saturday night, R. D. McGibbon in the chair. The badges were delivered to the members of the Executive, and are in the form of a shield, with a class of toboggan on the committee of which the wearer is the representative. Music will be arranged for by the committee to be present at the attack and defence of the ice palace on Wednesday evening at 8.30. Dominion Square will be cleared of vehicles at 7 p.m. The Royal Electric Co. will arrange for 32 arc lights, instead of 22, as per their contract. The palace will be illuminated each night at 7.30.

The City Yesterday.

The city yesterday presented a lively appearance, fully 3,000 strangers having arrived on the previous night and during the morning. One of the trains was late a couple of hours owing to a broken axle. The Windsor received a large number, and the St. Lawrence Hall a fair proportion. The other hotels also gathered in their quota, and a great many went to private houses. Many of these were seen in the streets walking or driving, and added to these the citizens themselves turned out in all sorts of family sleighs, swelling the number of Sunday pleasure seekers to an unusual extent. Dominion square and the vicinity of the Ice Palace were filled by sight-seers coming and going, all of whom minutely inspected the structure. The visitors seemed struck by its beauty, although the general effect was somewhat marred by the derricks and unsightly debris lying around. The trains on Saturday night were very much crowded, but the ordinary traffic yesterday morning when the ordinary trains from the south were crowded to excess. The special train via the Central Vermont had 15 coaches, and the special on the Delaware and Hudson some 12 coaches. There was no special train from the west. The ordinary trains, however, brought in a considerable number of visitors from the Western States. There will be a special train to-day by the C.P.R. and another by the G. T. R. which will have six sleepers attached. According to advices received it is estimated that 6,000 strangers will arrive to-day.
