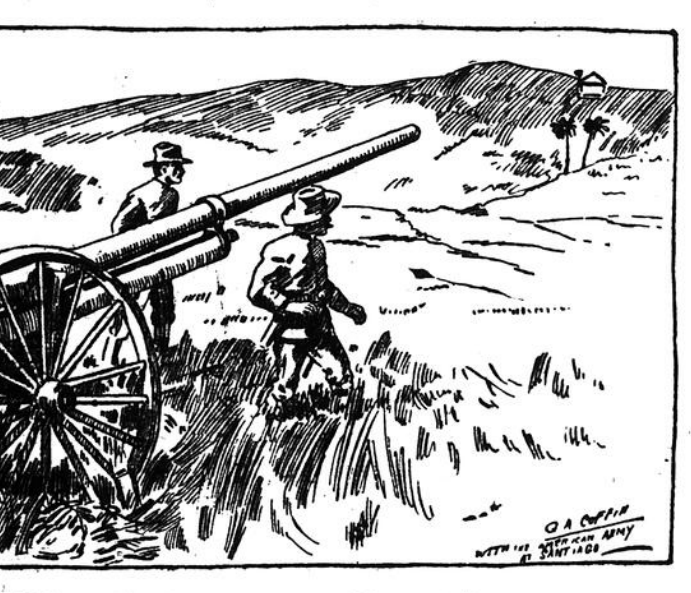

WORLD'S RECORDS BROKEN.

No Less Than Twenty-eight Records Established by Linton and Taylor.

PHILADELPHIA, July 6.—Twenty-eight new world's records were established last night in the 30 mile match bicycle race at Willow Grove between Edouard Taylor, champion of France, and Tom Linton, the Welsh wheelman, as a result of a quibbling feature of the night, the little Frenchman succeeded in lowering the world's record for the 30 mile match race by defeating Linton in the match race.

At the second of the records began to go Taylor still leading. Stocks at the Crystal Park, London, Sept. 27, 1891.
