Small bit of silliness looms large

Indian Blood

It's 1946, and young Eddie has been sent home suspended from school. Is his Indian blood to blame? Eddie likes to think so.

"This is a particularly theatrical piece," says long time director Greg Tuck. "It's a play about family. People will be able to recognize themselves in the family on stage."

Indian Blood is a Bishop's University student drama production and is on stage at Lennoxville's Turner Studio.

Tuck likes the scripts of A.R. Gurney, having directed a number of the playwright's pieces in the past, including *The Dining Room* and *Sylvia* at North Hatley's Piggery Theatre. "It's a playwright whose work I know well."

In fact Gurney is one of the most prolific and produced playwrights in North America. He focuses on middle-class American life and has been produced on international stages for more than 40 years. *Indian Blood*, written in 2006, was nominated for the New York Drama Critics Circle as Best American Play and for the Lucille Lortel Award for Best New Play, and won the Outer Critics Circle Award for Best Off-Broadway Play.

"As slight as it is sweet, A. R. Gurney's latest play," wrote a *New York Times* reviewer, "is like a snow globe for the stage, in this case a memento of wintry Buffalo in the mid-1940s. This is not meant unkindly."

"Who can resist the low-tech charm of those friendly knickknacks? Written with delicacy and old-school craftsmanship, *Indian Blood*... is a modest memory play that is endowed with a measure of emotional heft."

And he continues: "How small is the play's scope? Well, consider the dramatic jolt that sets the evening's emotional flurries in motion. In the first scene, calamity befalls the narrator and protagonist, the 16-year-old Eddie, when a

Yummy ketchup

*Sweet, sour
and subtle*

In my pre-reformed food snob existence, ketchup was high on the list of suspicious and dubious ingredients. It was suspect because of its overuse by children and adults who can't eat their food unless they have ketchup with it.

Since wisdom — we all hope — comes with age, I've taken ketchup out of that frame of reference and looked at its flavour, which is sweet and sour. And over the years, I've come across dishes in other cultures that use that flavour to their advantage.

During childhood, I would eat ketchup with eggs, french fries, hot dogs, hamburgers and beef liver. The beef liver always needed a lot of ketchup.

Heading towards my 20s, I still had fries with ketchup, but upon finding out that mayonnaise was way cooler — and tasted better — I cut ketchup out of my diet. That continued until I worked with an incredible Thai chef named Vanipha.

Vanipha's pad Thai was sublime and the secret was ketchup. I could accept that because there were other things like fish sauce, garlic, rice noodles and bean sprouts in the dish, and the ketchup was part of the sauce and not liberally slathered on top. Ketchup was also used in her mee krob, a crispy noodle dish with similar seasoning to pad Thai. Ketchup was a time-saver; you could go through a lot of fiddling with blocks of tamarind, or just reach for a bottle.

I went to Thailand with Vanipha in 1987 and ate traditional pad Thai; her version held its own beside them. One curious thing was seeing "American fried rice" on menus. When I enquired, she said it was fried rice with ketchup. For some reason, ketchup in pad Thai was acceptable, but with rice? Ewww! I couldn't wrap my head around that.

The movie Tampopo also came out in 1987. Fans of the movie can vividly describe their favourite scene.

My favourite was the hero Goro, deftly making a ketchup fried rice omelette for Tampopo's young son. It was flawlessly executed, lovingly assembled and looked delicious — but I was still suspicious.

Ketchup was trying to catch my attention again in the dish I usually ordered at my favourite Vietnamese restaurant, a stew of beef, potatoes and carrots, served over fresh rice noodles and simply called Beef Brisket in Tomato Sauce.

The beef was tender, the sauce rich and smooth, flavoured with star anise

and lemon grass. In the forefront was a sweet and sour tang. I mulled over it for quite a while before realizing that the tang was from ketchup.

SHRIMP PAD THAI

Pad Thai noodles are flat and not round. Erawan is the brand of noodles to use for this dish.

Serves 2 or 4

1/2 pound (250 g) medium-width dried rice noodles, no wider than 1/4-inch (0.6 cm)

2 tablespoons (30 mL) oyster sauce

4 tablespoons (60 mL) ketchup

1 tablespoon (15 mL) molasses

2 tablespoons (30 mL) sugar

2 tablespoons (30 mL) fish sauce

4 tablespoons (60 mL) water

1 teaspoon (5 mL) dried chili flakes

1/4 cup (50 mL) vegetable oil

24 large prawns, peeled and deveined

6 cloves garlic, minced

2 large eggs

2 cups (500 mL) bean sprouts

2 cups (500 mL) Chinese chives or green onions cut into 1-inch (2.5-cm) lengths

4 tablespoons (60 mL) chopped roasted peanuts

cilantro sprigs

lime wedges

Place the rice noodles in a bowl and cover with warm water for 30 minutes.

Combine the oyster sauce, ketchup, molasses, sugar, fish sauce, water and chili flakes in a small bowl and set aside.

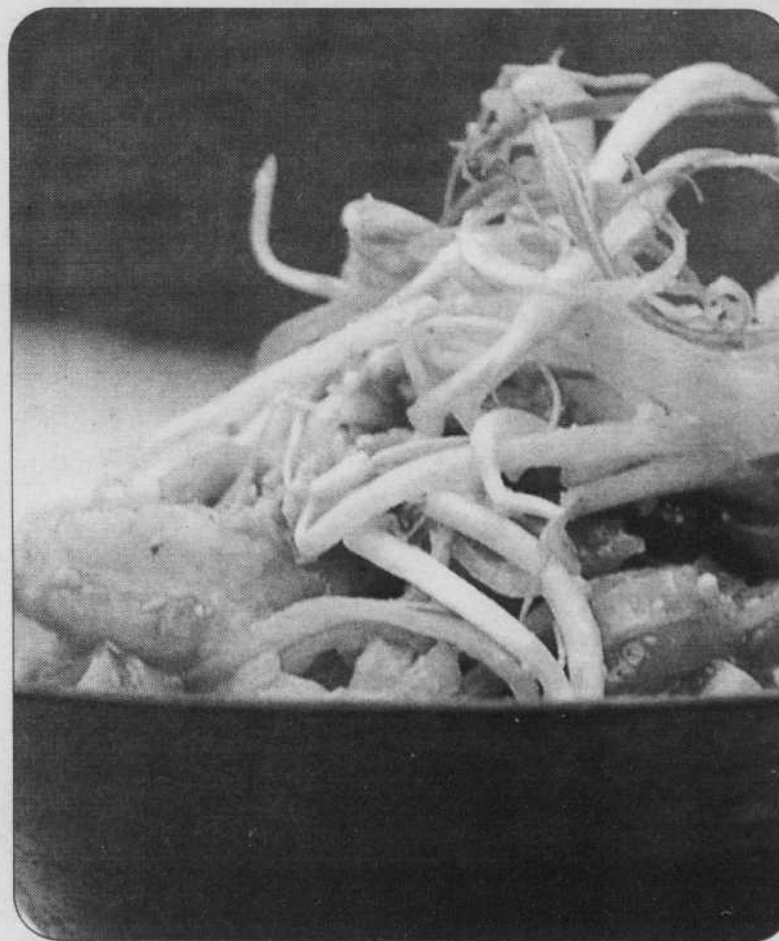
Drain the rice noodles. Heat the vegetable oil in a wok or large frying pan over high heat. Stir-fry the prawns until cooked through, 1 to 2 minutes. Remove from the pan with a slotted spoon.

Add the garlic and stir-fry until golden. Add the eggs and scramble until dry. Add the noodles. Stir-fry until the noodles soften and become shiny and translucent.

This is crucial to the texture of the finished dish. Add the cooked prawns, bean sprouts, chives or green onions and the sauce. Cook until the sauce is absorbed. Turn out onto a platter and garnish with the peanuts and cilantro. Serve with the lime wedges.

OMARAISU - JAPANESE KETCHUP FRIED RICE OMELETTE

The word omuraisu comes from omu - meaning omelette, and raisu - meaning rice. Bacon is not traditional, but I think it tastes good. Leave it out if you

prefer.

Makes 4 servings

1 tablespoon (15 mL) vegetable oil

4 slices bacon, finely chopped

4 cups (1 L) cooked Japanese rice

4 tablespoons (60 mL) ketchup

Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper

4 green onions, thinly sliced

6 large eggs

4 teaspoons (20 mL) vegetable oil

Heat the oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the bacon and cook until crisp. Add the rice and stir-fry until heated through. Add the ketchup and season to taste. Stir in the green onion. Remove from heat.

Beat the eggs and season to taste. In an 8-inch (20 cm) non-stick frying pan or omelette pan, heat 1 teaspoon (5 mL) oil over high heat. Swirl in 1/4 of the egg, tilting the pan to spread it evenly. Spread 1/4 of the rice down the middle and fold the edges of the egg over the rice. Cover the pan with a plate and flip the pan so the omelette drops from the pan onto the plate. Continue with the remaining eggs and rice. Gently slit the top of the omelette lengthwise to allow the rice to poke through. Serve immediately with ketchup on the side.

VIETNAMESE-STYLE BEEF BRISKET

I used to eat this dish over fresh rice noodles at my favourite Vietnamese pho eatery in Toronto. Achieving the subtle sweet-and-sour flavour eluded me until I figured out that the secret ingredient was ketchup.

Serves 4 to 6

2 to 2 1/2 pounds (1 to 1.25 kg) beef brisket

1 tablespoon (15 mL) vegetable oil

1 tablespoon (15 mL) finely chopped garlic

2 1/2-inch (6.5-cm) slice ginger, lightly crushed

2 stalks lemon grass, trimmed, cut into 3-inch (7.5-cm) pieces and lightly crushed

2 whole star anise

8 cups (2 L) water or beef stock

1 cup (250 mL) ketchup

1/2 teaspoon (2 mL) sea salt

2 medium carrots, peeled and cut into 2-inch (5-cm) pieces

2 medium new potatoes, peeled and cut into

quarters

1 tablespoon (15 mL) fish sauce

1 tablespoon (15 mL) oyster sauce

Cut the brisket into 1-inch (2.5-cm) pieces. Place in a pot, cover liberally with cold water and bring to a boil. Simmer for 5 minutes and drain. Rinse under cold water and pat dry.

Heat the vegetable oil in a large pot on medium heat. Brown the beef in batches and remove to a plate. Add the garlic and ginger to the oil and cook, stirring, until the garlic turns pale gold. Add the beef, lemon grass, star anise, water, ketchup and salt. Bring to a boil, then turn down to a low, low, simmer. Cover with a lid and cook for 2 1/2 to 3 hours until tender. The stew should be slightly thickened by this point. If not, cook over medium heat, uncovered, until it thickens.

Turn the heat to medium, add the carrots, potatoes, fish sauce and oyster sauce. Cook, uncovered, for half an hour longer. Taste and adjust the seasoning with salt and fish sauce. Like all stews, this is better if allowed to sit overnight.

Serve over fresh rice noodles, with bean sprouts, cilantro and green onions or with rice or French bread.

Choosing art

Regular folk pick through collection

Yechel Gagnon's Documents, a look at the research and ideas that went into the creation of fully-realized large-scale public artworks, continues at the Bishop's University Foreman Art Gallery. But a new second exhibit, Connections, is an echo of the first.

Positioned on the outside walls of the Foreman, works for this group exhibit were chosen by members of the campus community.

The presentation is part of a series which allows those who aren't trained curators to choose pieces from the university art collection for display. Art is part of everyday life, and is certainly so at Bishop's University, which uses its large public spaces to provide a wonderful background for sculptures and paintings.

While the first pieces of a campus artwork collection were exhibited as early as 1934, the 1st Art Collection Committee was only established in 1979. Its mandate is to make recommendations on the purchase and maintenance of art works.

The first work that you notice as you walk down the hall outside Centennial Theatre is a piece by internationally renowned artist William H. Cripps that's a reproduction, titled Smokehouse Switch. The original was donated to the university by the artist himself in 1968.

It used to hang in MacKinnon Hall in recognition of the opening of this new addition to the university.

Associate English professor Dr. Steven Woodard wonders where the humanity and warmth lies in what the title seems to suggest is a place of interest.

The stark, lino-cut print, with its crude black shapes, unobtrusive shading, and undisturbed scene of tracks, wire switches and smokehouse are reminiscent of the lost past of the Townships, Woodard writes in his notes.

He looks at this style as a sense of crudeness and simplicity that draws us into the world of the present.

He writes that in the present, part-industrial age of digital virtuality and simulation, it is easy to miss the honesty of the world that Cripps depicts. Smokehouse Switch not only mysteriously disappeared from MacKinnon Hall but also appears to have vanished from the campus entirely. The artwork is represented in a photo – a mere trace of the impact that this creation could have.

The second professor who participat-

ed in the exhibition, Robert Brown, in the departments of English and modern languages, chose one with a connection with his own life. This particular artwork, an oil on canvas, was donated by Frederick S. Coburn in 1942. It's a reproduction of On The Logging Road – E.T. 1942.

Brown's acquaintance with this painting goes back more than 30 years to the beginning of his teaching career at Bishop's. He remembers a sense of pleasure and energy from seeing this scene reflected by the mid-morning sun during the summer months, as it hung in the faculty lounge. The sunlight added a radiance to the image – while on duller days, the radiance seemed to come from within the work itself.

Brown grew up in rural North Hatley, enjoying a childhood that was closer to the world that is depicted in the painting (horse-drawn teams, ice-cutters and ice-houses) than the world of today.

Coburn was also a native of the Eastern Townships, being of Melbourne. He was well into middle age when he painted On The Logging Road.

Best known for his landscapes, it was Coburn's skill at drawing faces and human anatomy that led to his being encouraged to study art seriously. (A very good collection of Coburn's work can be found at the Musée des Beaux Arts de Sherbrooke.) His art is looked upon as mirroring the early history of Sherbrooke and the Eastern Townships. His work also comparatively suggests the fusion of the English and the French-Canadian cultures.

To the casual art lover, the multiple photos of the weathervane that, since the 1920s, sits high atop the bell tower of the Johnson Building, is eye-catching.

Yet out in the world, such work is easily overlooked. Dr. Dale Strout, chair of psychology, views the weathercock as a "species of folk-art which he sees as being a vigorous and dynamic art-form that is difficult to define." The significance of the weathercock is important in Quebec and "connects religious observance with a cadence of everyday life."

Usually seen perched atop old churches and barns, the religious significance of the weathercock is Christian: "Peter would deny the Lord three times before the cock crows." The cock serves to remind us that we are forgetful and that there is a cost to our forgetfulness. We are forgetful of the most important things that life has to offer.

Art, writes Strout, connects the community. It always has!

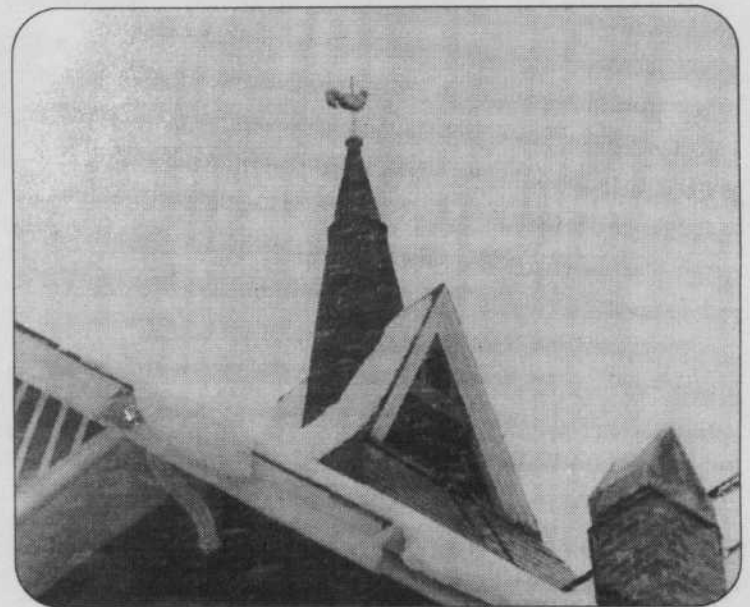
The Bishop's weathercock perches not on a church but on a university building. To think of Bishop's as a business would be to forget that it is also a

university. Universities gather together students and teachers, formalizing ways of remembering the most important things. The meaning behind the photo is that "learning is recollection."

Connections is up until Jan. 19. Documents continues until Nov. 3.

Survival in the almanac trenches

Etc.

Almanacs have been part of the North American landscape for so long, keeping them from the grasp of irrelevancy is not a challenge for the faint of heart.

Just ask John Pierce, Canadian publisher of the oldest one on the continent, *The Old Farmer's Almanac*.

The fact his almanac — which sprouted in the late 1700s to serve the needs of a mostly rural North American population — has arrived on bookshelves every fall for 215 years, speaks for itself about success.

In the interim, hundreds of almanacs have faltered and folded. The *Old Farmer's Almanac*, founded by a determined Robert B. Thomas in 1792, has soldiered on.

But survival in the almanac trenches is no accident. The appearance of the *Dublin, New Hampshire* publication on the shelves each year like a true harbinger of fall is the result of a carefully scripted editorial plan, a mission as it were.

Pierce will tell you relevancy is the magazine's watchword. Two centuries ago, almanacs like his were the only practical source of information for a large segment of the population engaged in farming and fishing.

"They needed to know sunrise, sunset, phases of the moon and tides, so almanacs were indispensable," Pierce says.

But times changed and as society evolved and populations shifted, "our almanac changed too and became more general-interest, following the development of the demographics."

The demographics the publisher is talking about was a population shift which saw rural residents (the bulk of his almanac's customers) migrating into the cities, leaving only a fraction behind to eke out a living on the land.

The fact his magazine, with hole-punched corner to allow for outhouse installation, is still welcomed "like an old friend each fall," speaks well of the almanac's survival instincts.

The *Old Farmer's Almanac* still does

have a core fan base but it also is building new bases, says Pierce, as it tilts its focus toward such areas as trends, style and children's interests, yet all the while retaining such popular departments as weather, tides, astronomy, astrology, household tips, folklore and seasonal essays — those classic, yet brief, monthly overviews by New England author Castle Freeman.

Weather history and astronomy are the two dominant areas of interest on the *Almanac's* popular website (Almanac.com), another readership evolution that has, in Pierce's view, helped cement the magazine's reputation as the leading authority on the Internet.

Pierce says his almanac tries to shape its core content "to help people no matter where they live."

"Even if you live in the city and you're the kind of person who is interested in the outside world, you'll pay attention to the changing seasons, the rising and setting of the sun, so an almanac will always be useful."

In the latest *Almanac*, most of the gardening features focus on growing things in small spaces "because we recognize two things — people have less time, so even if they live in the suburbs and can have a quarter-acre garden, they're not going to do that. They're going to have a smaller garden, that takes less time. If you live in the city you can easily grow something in a pot on the patio."

Secondly, people he says, are becoming a lot more green-conscious, "switching their focus to smaller, more energy efficient, but still very friendly, houses."

Pierce also attributes the magazine's success to the fact "our almanac has remained true to its mission, which is first and foremost to be a calendar to the heavens."

As one of its most popular features, it has also invested heavily in its weather forecasts, Pierce says.

"We have a solar scientist and a meteorologist. And we pay them a princely sum to develop forecasts based on our methodology."

The *Almanac* also has an astronomer (who teaches at Yale) and an astrologer

on the payroll.

What that produces is a 72- to 73-per cent accuracy rate in the *Almanac's* weather forecasts, which in an age of connected forces, such as El Nino and La Nina, is, in fact, a remarkable accuracy rate.

Pierce is quick to confess, though, that last year's predictions — skewed by volcanic eruptions in parts of Russia that affected the jet stream — "was the worst we've had in the last 10 years." But, in way of small comfort, virtually no other forecaster nailed it correctly either.

To help secure its future *The Old Farmer's Almanac* has, for the second

year, produced a special issue for kids, a similarly sized magazine for ages eight and up that's stuffed with child-friendly projects and information, from growing indoor vegetable forests to understanding star art, the evolution of the bicycle, and even a monthly calendar of the unusual.

As Pierce explains, the *Almanac* had to find a way to engage another generation in the magazine's subject matter. And a repackaged, now bestselling, *Almanac for Kids*, he says, has been the answer to that little quandary for Yankee Publishing's gracefully aging publication.

Our community is the land, the area that we live in, and we only speak English because it's still a convenient form of communication, while others speak other languages. That's it, and that's all there is to it.

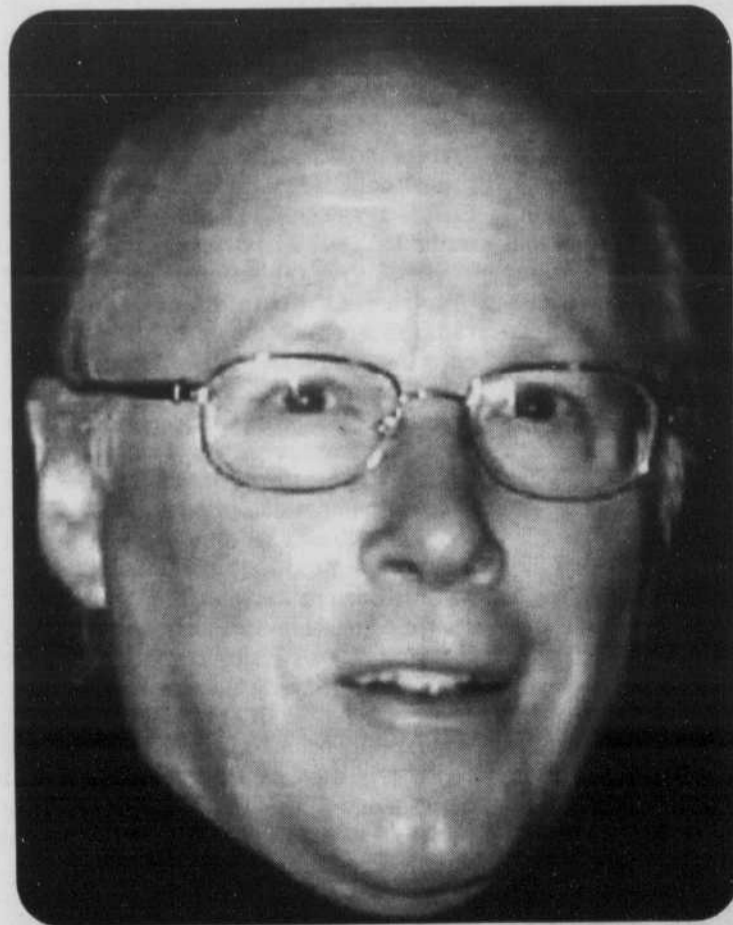
Two: the act of developing the intellectual and moral faculties, especially by education. We as an English-speaking community have our own educational system, so as a result, can we claim

of all of the above.

The English-speaking community, a group of people with a common characteristic or interest living together within a larger society, tend to use the term "culture" loosely, as does every other community, and most of the time we think it refers to the arts. Because our arts speak English, doesn't mean that they represent a unique English-language culture. After all, French-speaking people are able to enjoy reading Shakespeare in their own language if they wish to do so, as much as we may choose to read Molière in English if we want to.

Culturally, through all of the things we do in our lives, the English-speaking community within its community has to be more active if it wants to be recognized, because that's what culture is. It's what we all do together in the same place that counts, and if it's English-language theatre, music or literature, then so be it. But it can also be what we do at work, in our homes and on the streets. In other words, whatever activity that's contained within our geographical environment. This is our community. And it's also community radio.

Culture is neither the music we listen to, nor the plays that we see at the local theatre. It's the action we take in order to experience and produce works of art in our every day life. It's what we want to do with ourselves. What do you want to do?

I know that there would never be an English-speaking or French-speaking com-

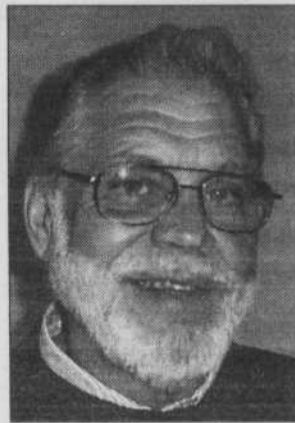
munity if it weren't for the land. I find it interesting that when our society talks of "land rights" though, it usually refers to indigenous peoples only. This in itself is a statement. It says that we as newcomers have no respect for the land. Why don't we feel we have rights to it as well? Maybe because we stole it? Sure, our laws give us title, but why don't we relate to it and feel the same way about it as the First Nations do?

When looking for people to take part in its musical production Chickasaw (based on the novel "Raid From Hell" by Donald Davison, a resident of Foster), the community theatre group Knowlton Players (at knowltonplayers.com) was called upon by the show's writers. The play partly takes place in the Eastern Townships. And, once again, the English-speaking community of the Townships (the wild apples), have heeded the call to arms and come forward to entertain.

Donald Patriquin, well known Townships composer (most recently for Sunshine Theater's 2005 Louisa's Story and also composer of works performed at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa) stepped up to the plate and added a musical direction to Graham Hardman's lyrics.

"An amateur musical is possibly the most demanding stage work in terms of what is required from the community producing it," says Patriquin, "and an original musical coming out of that community is even more demanding."

This is certainly the case with Chickasaw (created by Roger de la Mare, Hardman, Davison, director Vesta Jorgensen and Patriquin). "All but one of the writers is a Townshipper," adds Patriquin, "and the cast and crew are, to a person, Townshippers."

The cultural identity of the Townships becomes more visible yet again, thanks to its English-speaking community. If we want to be noticed we have to "act", and that is exactly what Burn Purdon is doing in the Chickasaw production.

"As a lover of both music and poetry," says Purdon, "I am delighted to be cast in one of the lead roles, that of John Rumsey, a destitute British solicitor

who has been banished to Canada. This character is based on a real man, who lived in the mid-nineteenth century. As a way of getting into his skin, so to speak, I spent part of the summer reading his actual diaries which have been passed down in Don Davison's family."

Purdon and his wife moved to the Townships 35 years ago intending to stay no more than three or four years. "We quickly learned that this region had a lot to offer," adds Purdon, "and we are still here. It is where our three children were born and grew up. It is where I have served a number of congregations in the Yamaska region in my professional role as a clergyman."

How does a United Church minister go from the pulpit to the stage? I'll let Purdon explain: "When I retired four years ago... there were so many opportunities here for continued community involvement, life-long learning pursuits, and outlets for my creative energies."

"Rumsey often quoted poetry and Scripture in his daily writings. I found that I could identify with this man on many counts. First and foremost, he was a family man who loved his children dearly. I can imagine what it must have been like for him to be separated from them, and still grieving the tragic early demise of his wife. Secondly, under the surface, he was a man of principle, who was ready to learn from his mistakes, and who genuinely cared about the welfare of others."

Caring about others and participating in community events is what it's all about, and the local theatre production of Chickasaw is a shining example of this. Patriquin explains that "Knowlton Players are outstanding in their support of the larger community that nourishes them and every year give generously back to the community through the proceeds of their presentations."

Just as theatre in the Townships promotes and supports the community, so does the CIDI community radio project, and even more so when it will be up and running with a broadcast tower and transmitter.

Chickasaw takes place in a time when the Townships were young and pioneers were the people of the day.

Our forefathers built the Townships community by creating their own institutions for strength and support, and it is CIDI's belief that we, as residents of the Townships, have a similar task ahead of us if we want to strengthen and preserve what we have today. In a modern-day context, community radio in Brome-Missisquoi and Shefford counties is a pioneer institution and will, through its programming, incorporate all existing organizations within our community (artistic, educational, etc.), providing us with the necessary support and confidence needed to move forward.

"Chickasaw," says Purdon, "is a comedy. There is a great cast and we have a lot of fun together."

The musical play, based on the book *Raid From Hell*, will premiere at Arts Knowlton (at 9 Mont Echo Road, Knowlton), on Thursday, Oct. 25 and plays through Nov. 11. (Thursday, Friday and Saturday performances are at 8 p.m., and Sunday matinees at 2 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 25, is a benefit for the Brome-Missisquoi Perkins Hospital Foundation and Saturday, Oct. 27 is a gala evening with wine and munchies following the show, and an opportunity to meet the cast). Don't be disappointed, reserve early! Adults \$15, Townshippers' Association members \$13, students \$12, children \$8. Tickets and information: 450-263-1061. Books

The printed word's survival

The first years of the 21st century have not been good ones for traditional media. As more people, especially the young, flock online to get their information and their entertainment digitally, real-world TV and radio outlets, filmmakers and distributors, newspapers and the record industry have lost clients in droves and millions, if not billions, of dollars of business.

Case in point: digital piracy is shaving 12 to 13 per cent off the United States' total movie industry revenue, a real-world value of \$20.5 billion, writes Andrew Keen, author of *The Cult of the Amateur: How Today's Internet is Killing our Culture*.

Yet, this Web 2.0 revolution has yet to totally savage the oldest of old-school media: books.

Spending on books in Canada actually increased by 23 per cent between 1997 and 2001, translating into an impressive \$1.1 billion annually. Statistics also show people in their teens, 20s and 30s — the folks quickest to jump on the web and/or new media bandwagon — are still getting out there and buying books, graphic novels and other book-like media.

Furthermore, young North Americans are continuing to be fascinated by the whole spectrum of book culture, says Robert Desmarais, assistant special collections librarian with the University of Alberta's Bruce Peel library.

"Books-arts programs (courses in everything from book design, how to make paper, and how to run a letterpress) are enjoying a renaissance all over the place, even in high-tech centres like Seattle," he says.

In large part, this trend has everything to do with the historic fetish appeal that books hold over us as "must-own, must-hold" objects.

In an era when the younger generation of consumers is increasingly moving to the digital world, the appeal of lush, exotic books and comic book products continues to grow.

For example, go



into any well-stocked bookstore and you'll see an increasingly large number of design-forward books aiming to delight, from adult pop-up books, to lush photo and art tomes, to all those fun and playful McSweeney's and Griffin & Sabine collage-influenced books that buy into the book-as-object reality.

"A book engages all the senses," says Desmarais, a passionate book collector as well as a professional librarian.

"I love the feel of a book, the weight of a quality paper and the feel of deckle-edged pages under my fingertips. And I love the smell of a book, the smell of the paper, the leather, even the dust of a novel has a smell. It can be very intoxicating."

According to Desmarais, physical books — particularly first editions — hold a great power over people in that they are a direct connection to the historical era and the people who created the volume.

Recent reportage of the re-dedication of the University of Alberta's rare copy of a first edition of Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice* (one of only

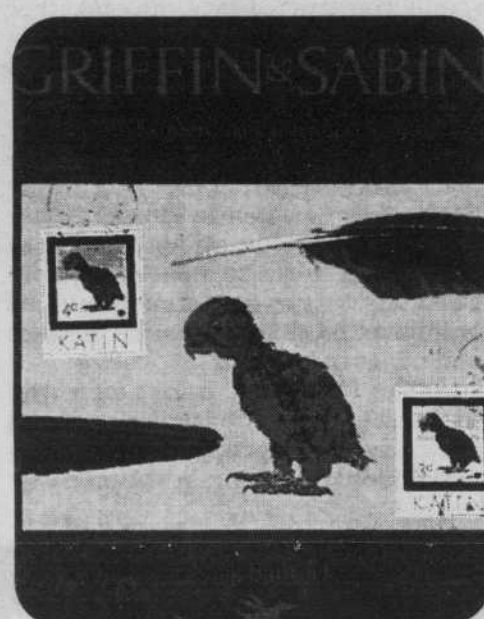

two copies known to reside in Canada) has attracted scores of undergraduates, he says.

"Holding this book instantly brings you back to when it was hot off the presses."

Book publishers, says Desmarais, are quick to embrace the book-as-beautiful-object mindset, and are eager to create ever-more-delightful

products in part because they've always been doing it.

To prove his point, Desmarais has curated a show of books published by the Golden Cockerel Press between

1920 and 1961.

One of the great British private presses of the early twentieth century, Golden Cockerel books pushed the esthetic envelope of the era in the creation of their hand-wrought books.

Golden Cockerel tomes — most aimed at the affluent-collector market — boast sublime original woodcuts, rich leather bindings, only the highest quality paper, and a plethora of illustrations including naughty (for the era) nude engravings.

"They (the erotic etchings) are mild by our standards, but could have easily gotten the publishers jailed at the time."

A history of pretty books

- Prior to the development of the codex (manuscript-format books invented by the Romans), written text and drawn images were preserved on scrolls constructed by gluing together large sheets of papyrus. Scrolls were hard to handle, read, transport and archive. The modern codex format — which originated in the second century A.D. — was not only easier to manipulate and store (using easily accessible open shelves as opposed to the cubby-hole-style spaces needed to store scrolls), but they also allowed for more rapid perusing and skimming, and led to innovations like pagination, indexes and tables of contents.

- The first "art" books were the highly illustrated, hand-written and drawn manuscripts produced by medieval monks working in the monastic

scriptoria of Europe. These totally hand-made ancient books — even the most meanly illustrated and bound volumes — were incredibly time-consuming to make, wildly expensive and super-rare, making them both highly desired and occasionally out-and-out fetishized. Even the wealthiest of nobles were unlikely to own more than a couple hundred books (which went far to explain the higher-than-high levels of illiteracy in Europe of the Middle Ages), making a moderately stocked private library the ultimate status symbol.

- Mass production of books had to await the invention of movable type.

Invented in 13th-century Korea, movable metal type was perfected by Johann Gutenberg of Mainz, Germany in the mid-15th century. After Gutenberg's revolution, book production developed very rapidly, producing some wildly sophisticated tomes by the mid-16th century. Standards started to decline in the 17th century though, a process that continued until the late 19th century, when William Morris — a major force in the esthetic-forward Arts and Crafts movement in England — restored the concept of high-art beauty to the revitalized craft of book-making.

- Following in the much older footsteps of medieval monks, contemporary visual- and book-artists are deconstructing the idea of "book" via their creation of handmade "artists' books" (also called bookworks). The University of Alberta's Bruce Peel Special Collection owns one of Canada's largest collections of international and domestic art books, says Jeannine Green, the university's special collections librarian. These alternative, hand-produced works are generally

made with an eye to rethinking the whole idea of book culture and the function of the codex-bound text, breaking all the "rules" of book construction. Artists' books at the U of A include Gaza Bowen's Red Shoe Reader (pictured) — a provocative feminist take on the history of footwear/foot fetish, featuring an actual red shoe as part of its design — and Linda Smith's House of Cods, a tome commenting on the fragile fishing industry that features a foldout fishing boat made from playing cards.

- One of the reasons books have continued to fare well against the onslaught of the digital barbarian hordes has to do with the physical book's enviable readability and stability. At the moment, no electronic format is easier on the eyes and more readable than crisp black type on a bleached white page.

As for stability, while the National Archives and Records Administration of the United States estimates preservation of electronic material — even over the next 10 years — is a "global" concern, the original Domesday Book (a record of the value and ownership of the lands in England compiled in 1086 at the order of William the Conqueror) — as well as a plethora of other medieval manuscripts and early letter-press printed tomes — is still completely readable more than 900 years after it was originally produced.

naughty drawing he whipped up to entertain the boys in the back row in Latin class falls into the hands of his teacher. Grave consequences ensue...

"They are still ensuing some 90 minutes later, when the play concludes on the same wistfully nostalgic note it struck in the opening moments."

The play has a cast of eight, all of them students in Tuck's Direction 1 class.

"It's nice to work with a smaller company of actors," Tuck says. "The play is witty and funny, but it's not a comedy in the sense of a television sit-com, and it's also touching."

In the Bishop's University production, costume designer Helen Rainbird, formerly of Montreal and now residing in Knowlton, joins the crew. Rainbird taught costuming at the National Theatre School for 12 years and has been the resident costumer designer at Theatre Lac Brome for the past 15 years. Her objective is to recreate the authentic Buffalo, New York of 1946 — which is Gurney's hometown.

is mixed up.

The album offers only half of her hits. Classics like 'Let's Go To Vegas', 'I Can't Do That Anymore', 'You Can't Lose Me', 'Take Me As I Am' and 'If My Heart Had Wings' are not there.

Finally, the packaging is a lot cheaper than buyers could have expected. You can see the lack of effort put into the release of this album. Hill's fans will most likely support her through this, hoping her next effort will be better.

What happened here is hard to figure out, but I know that the release of The Hits had been postponed for a while. But I know this is not the way Hill has always treated her fans. Is the record company to blame for the lack of care?

There are few liner notes. All we get

is the production credits, no message from Faith or other notables, there's not even a single thank you. In my opinion, Hill is suffering from poor advice.

Hill is an amazing female vocalist whose musical roots are based in the country music genre. Her music is definitely infused with pop, rhythm and blues and soul — and that's fine. You can easily feel that what she does comes from the heart. Not every country record can be traditional.

Today's country has evolved from the three-chord pattern found in the past and Faith Hill has brought new fans to the music, because she was able to try different paths. Bottom line, The Hits has its flaws but the music is still good

A diva and her crown

Silver-screen queens

While royalty has always placed a premium on male heirs, it has often been members of the fairer sex who have risen to be the most impressive monarchs. Similarly, on-screen portrayals of queens have often been the most fascinating. As Cate Blanchett reprises her role as England's greatest ever monarch in *Elizabeth: The Golden Age*, it's an ideal time to take stock of great cinematic performances of regal women. So grab some scones, tea and cucumber sandwiches and enjoy the complexities of these crown-wearing divas.

1. Helen Mirren in *The Queen*: You'd think to play a living breathing monarch would be a tad bit stifling but Mirren — who won an Oscar for her performance — brings a warmth and generosity to the role that makes you want to reach out across the pond and give the real Queen a big hug. Well... sort of. Mirren portrays Queen Elizabeth II at her most watched and most vulnerable time, when expectations ran high for her long-awaited public reaction to the death of beloved Princess Di. Mirren plays it with self-contained dignity. And many tweed outfits.

2. Greta Garbo in *Queen Christina*: Movie star royalty in her own right, Garbo delivers an elegant performance as a 17th-century Swedish monarch who falls in love with a charming Spanish envoy in Rouben Mamoulian's 1933 costume drama *Queen Christina*. Said by many to be one of Garbo's finest performances, the actress pulls off a powerful and at the same time delicate characterization of a woman torn between love and public duty. "It had been so enchanting to be a woman, not a queen. Just a woman in a man's arms," *Queen Christina* (Garbo) whispers to her lover, and we are reminded that life can be difficult, even for a queen.

3. Cate Blanchett in *Elizabeth I*: Blanchett's first go at the Virgin Queen was so spellbinding it's hard to imagine her outdoing herself in the sequel. Shekhar Kapur's *Elizabeth* tells the coming-of-age story of the Virgin Queen, and Blanchett's performance doesn't disappoint. (And let's face it, those sharp cheekbones of hers scream aristocracy.) The actress doesn't shy away from showing the Queen's emotional ups and downs as a woman finding herself in the public spotlight.

As Blanchett's witty and determined Elizabeth struggles to gain the faith of her people (in the face of common everyday obstacles such as stuffy rude courtiers and the treachery of those dearest), we see through her a Queen who is an all-powerful public figure but at the same time a human being. Blanchett's thrilling performance garnered her an Academy Award nomination and opened the door to an international career. When Blanchett's Elizabeth boldly pronounces "I am my father's daughter. I am not afraid of anything," you can almost feel the ghost of Henry VIII giving her a thumbs up.

4. Judi Dench in *Shakespeare In Love*: She may only have eight minutes of screen time in John Madden's award-winning romantic comedy, but it's what Dench does with it that makes her the queen-scene stealer in a cast that includes Gwyneth Paltrow and Geoffrey Rush.

Dench puts on more of a show in a quick cameo as the Virgin Queen than many actors do in an entire movie. Proof that there can be magic in a role with few lines, it's worth the watch to see Dench's expressive rolls of the eyes and big, stuffy regal presence. When Dench is onscreen she clearly is the woman in the room to please but ends up being the crowd pleaser herself.

"She's been plucked since I last saw her," Dench's character says to Colin Firth about his wife-to-be (played by Gwyneth Paltrow) and we are reminded Paltrow is in the movie. Dench's eight-minute effort won her an Academy



Award.

5. Kirsten Dunst in *Marie Antoinette*: Despite the distractions of cake, candy and more cake in this pink-themed feast for the eyes, Dunst still manages to make her sugar-coated mark as Marie Antoinette. Sophia Coppola's biopic of the iconic French queen follows Antoinette from her marriage to Louis XVI as a teenager to the end of her reign and the ultimate fall of Versailles.

Dunst brings out the fun and frivolity in Antoinette's excessive, rock-star lifestyle but she also shows her youth and naivete as a young, sheltered Austrian princess carted off to France to begin her life with an indifferent husband.

Wearing sky-high wigs and at the same time eating lots of decadent cake, Dunst's character becomes a towering, ridiculous figure. The film, shot mainly in the Palace of Versailles, is jam-packed with lavish, frilly, fabulous scenes — a movie truly fit for a queen.

Other Notable Performances

• Katherine Hepburn in *The Trojan Women*: Well, of course Hepburn had to make it on this list — with her nasal delivery and aristocratic airs someone eventually had to give her a shot at playing queen. Hepburn tackles the role of the lamenting Queen Hecuba, a woman carrying the weight of a fallen empire — with such vivid sorrow and dramatic breathiness it leaves you wishing there was a Queen Lear she could have sunk her teeth into.

• Glenn Close in Mel Gibson's *Hamlet*: Close's young Queen Gertrude in *Hamlet* shows the complex feelings a mother can feel towards her son... (especially when the son is out to kill her husband to avenge his father, her murdered first husband.)

• Julie Andrews in *The Princess Diaries*: Andrews plays the elegant and delightfully clueless Queen Clarisse Renaldi of the fictional country Genovia. The way she clips her T's and rolls her R's gives her an unmatched authenticity as an empress. It becomes hard to remember she's not really a queen.

• Patrick Swayze in *To Wong Foo Thanks for Everything, Julie Newmar*: Swayze plays a different sort of queen in this movie about three transvestites who embark on an ill-fated cross-country road trip. But it's no less entertaining than performances of the royal kind.

• The Alien Queen in *Alien*: The most ambitious (and possibly the most monstrous-looking) of all onscreen queens, she not only protects her territory, she wants control of everything around her in Ridley Scott's 1979 sci-fi horror flick. You won't catch richly draped robes on this queen (played by a well-constructed mechanical beast) — she resembles something more out of a swamp in the Midlands than Buckingham Palace.

Faith Hill is one of the most honest, beautiful artists in country music today. She first appeared on the scene 15 years ago and she is still going strong. If you are a new Hill fan, this album is a good place to start, as it showcases all her style changes throughout the years.

It is great that Hill finally has a greatest hits album, after so many years in the music business. But while this is a good album, fans certainly expected more.

First, we thought there would be four new songs but really, there are only two: 'Red Umbrella' and 'Lost', since the live version of 'Stronger' is new but the song itself is not.

The fourth one, 'I Need You' is on husband Tim McGraw's album Let It Go, so this is a song that fans already knew.



On the other hand, so many great hits are not included and this is very disappointing. 'Take Me as I Am', 'I Can't Do This Any More', 'Just To You Say That You Love Me', 'Like We Never Loved At All' and 'Where Are You Christmas' are missing.
