

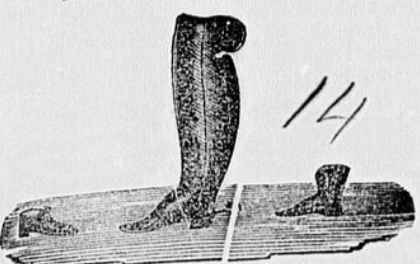

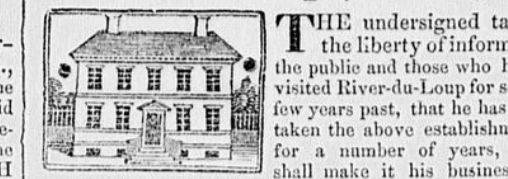

A CURIOUS PIECE OF CLOCK WORK,

INVENTED and executed by ANTOINE ROUSSEAU, residing in Saint Joseph Street, Saint Roch.
It is a monster Clock, with five Dials, four of which will show the time outside, and one in the interior: each of the Dials is four feet in diameter, except the inside one, which is two feet. It will strike the hours, half-hours, and quarters, and before striking will play tunes. It will of itself ring the *Angelus* at the prescribed hours, as the Church bells. It will also strike correctly the day of the month, and will ring an alarm bell when required, in case of fire in the City or Suburbs. The mechanism is 6 feet long, by 3 1/2 broad, and 5 1/2 high. It weighs 750 pounds, and the weights 850. It contains 9 bells, weighing to gether 86 pounds. It will go 40 days without being wound up.
The exhibition of this very curious piece of workmanship, is now on exhibition at the Parliament Buildings, Quebec, 9th May, 1849.
