Police investigate Sherbrooke's fourth murder this year

Two men aged 19 and 49 were arrested in a residence located at the corner of King Street West and Quebec, in connection with a murder Wednesday night in downtown Sherbrooke.

The death arose as a result of a dispute involving the victim at about 11:30 p.m. on Wednesday in an apartment on Sanborn Street. The young man in his twenties was seriously injured and succumbed to his injuries during the night.

According to preliminary information, only the two suspects arrested were involved in the incident. The suspects and victim knew each other and the attack was apparently not a random event.

The Sûreté du Québec's Crimes Against the Person Division is conducting the investigation in close collaboration with the Sherbrooke Police. The homicide occurred on the third floor of a building at the intersection Gordon and Sanborn Streets.

The two suspects were arrested in mid-morning on Quebec St.

This is the fourth homicide recorded in Sherbrooke since the beginning of the year.

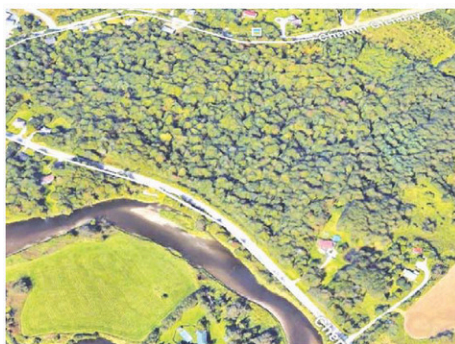
Every summer, students from across the country gather together on the campus of Bishop's University to immerse themselves, for one week, in the world of improvised theatre

Powerful YA Book “The Hate U Give”

LENNOXVILLE LIBRARY

The first time I ever witnessed overt racism was in the 3rd grade. One of my classmates was called the N-word. He locked himself in his locker and cried. It was shocking for me. I didn't know what the word meant, but clearly it was deeply hurtful. In small town, very homogenous Quebec there aren't a lot of black folks. I grew up learning about racism as a distant and foreign thing and as a historical thing. I think a lot of white people get to feel like we have moved beyond racism to a fan-

tasy-like, colour-blind society. The little boy in my third grade class knew that wasn't true and any person living in North America who pays attention to the news knows this isn't true. It might be easy to ignore the experiences of a person who is different from you, but in order to raise kids to respect each other and honour the diversity of our world we need exposure to stories and experiences from those who are marginalized.

The subject of my column this week is a beautiful novel written by a young black woman, Angie Thomas. She was born and raised in Jackson, Mississippi, and holds a BFA in Creative Writing from Belhaven University. *The Hate U Give* is her debut and it is spectacular. This book tells the story of Starr, a gifted 16 year old black girl from the rough part of town who navigates a sort of bipolar existence as she attends a predominantly white suburban prep school. She feels like she is two versions of herself. The Starr at school is a token minority, cool by virtue of listening to the right music and wearing the right sneakers. But she is always on her guard, she never wants to be the “angry black girl”. In her

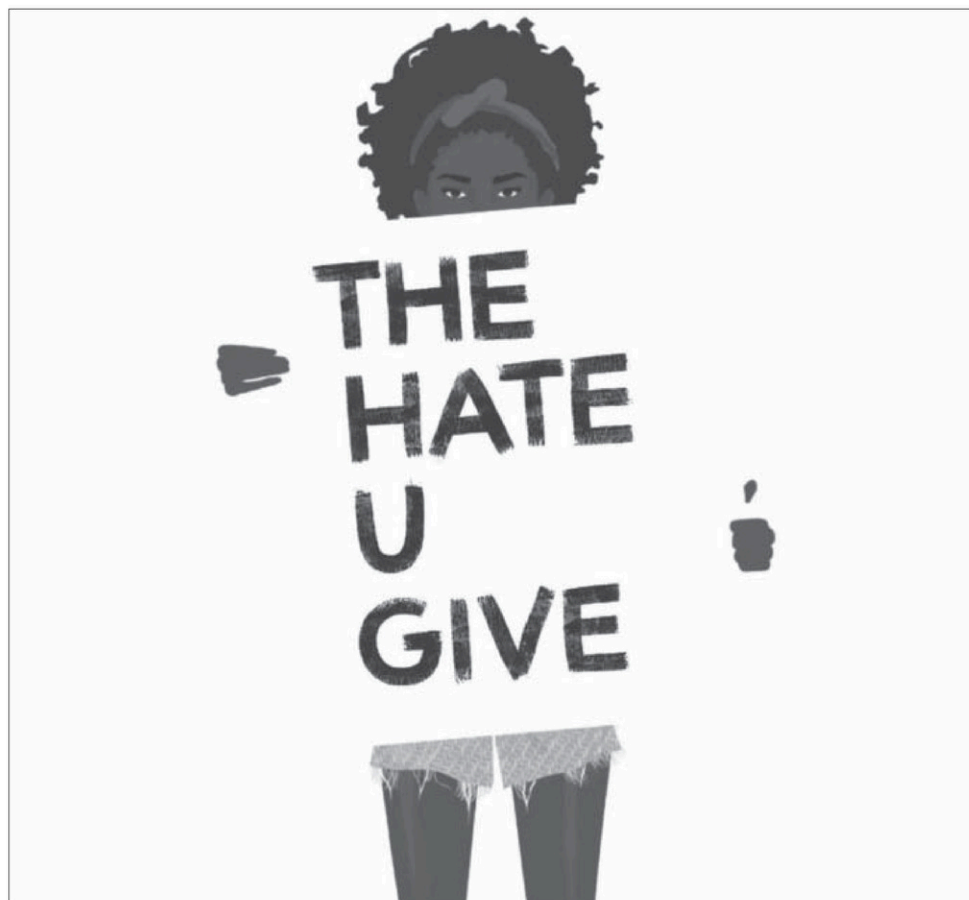
neighborhood she feels disconnected, left out, but also able to let her guard down and talk and act as she wishes. The main plot conflict surrounds Starr's horrific experience of being a bystander to her friend, an unarmed 17 year old boy, being shot by a police officer. It is a gripping story of contemporary race politics and social justice issues, woven into a beautiful personal narrative of a young woman struggling with the drama of high school life. Ultimately this is a story of Starr finding the courage to have a voice in the face of silencing powers.

“Sometimes you can do everything right and things will still go wrong. The key is to never stop doing right.”

This story is written very much from the perspective of the black community and it sheds light on a lot of the subtle and institutionally racist things people say and do. It explores the complexities of police violence and racial profiling as well as the violent backlashes which sometimes happen in communities when people are killed. It also explores the media's spin on a story, turning a victim into a drug dealer, or a gang member in an attempt to dehumanize. This book is raw and powerful and makes the reader feel both intense empathy and connection, but also uncomfortable. The discomfort I felt, as I encountered my own privilege, was striking. That type of discomfort is important. It is part of how people connect to stories that are different from our own and gain the wisdom to be good allies. The books I read in high school about racism all felt historical. This book is very now. Stories like Starr's are taking place in real life across America. I think this book is important for young people to read; but equally important, if not more important, parents need to read this book. Not only does it have important insights on the challenges and emotional strife that high school causes on its best day, it has excellent parenting lessons about trust, love and the responsibility we give to our kids.

I am a firm believer in reading a book before seeing the movie equivalent. I was very excited to learn after reading this deeply cinematic story that it would be coming to theatres in October of this year. Before hitting the local cinema, come to the Lennoxville Library and borrow this great book.

Cookshire-Eaton municipal employees set to strike Monday

The Central Council of the Estrie CSN and the Town of Cookshire-Eaton released a communiqué Wednesday announcing that municipal workers will go on an indefinite strike beginning Monday.

The unlimited strike, which begins at 7 a.m. Monday, comes during negotiations for a collective agreement and both the City and the union have agreed on the maintenance of essential services, including all emergency work on the water system as well as on public roads if the safety of citizens is deemed to be in danger.

A special agreement was also reached for the day camp and day care service that will remain in effect for the week of July 23 to 27 to limit the impact of the

strike on parents, leaving them an extra week to find alternative care, should the strike continue beyond July 27.

Town General Manager Martin Tremblay remains positive about the situation and is hopeful that the situation will be settled over the next week.

"There are two points on which it all hangs. The issue of pension plans is the most important, followed by that of wages. We will do everything we can to resolve the impasse next week to prevent the dispute from dragging on," he said.

Residential garbage collection will be carried out every four weeks and commercial waste collection every two weeks for the duration of the conflict. In case of disaster or exceptional situations endangering the lives of citizens, workers will be available.

Police concerned about safety of missing teen

Sherbrooke Police are urgently looking for a 15-year old Sherbrooke girl who has been missing since Tuesday.

Éléona Rivard-Whissell left the home in which she was staying on July 17 and has not been heard from since. Police and her family are concerned about her physical and psychological well-being and, particularly, that some people could be taking advantage of her vulnerability.

She is described as a 15-year-old Caucasian girl with black hair and brown eyes. She is French-speaking, weighs 45 kg (99 lbs) and stands about 1.73 m (5'2"). She was last seen wearing a black sweater with black shorts.

Undercover SQ highway operation targets cell phone use

On Wednesday, July 18, a team of a dozen Sûreté du Québec officers from the Montérégie and Estrie / Center-du-Québec regions took part in a surveillance operation on roads target-

ing, among other things, drivers using their cell phones while at the wheel.

The operation began Wednesday morning and involved undercover officers in a minibus accompanied by regular cars making a loop from St-Hubert to Sherbrooke, then Drummondville, and

back to St-Hubert. The route was designed to ensure an increased police presence on the busier highways in high-density areas, namely highways 10, 55, 20 and 30.

Police are reminding the public that the use of cell phones while driving is an

offense that results in a total fine of \$484 and five demerit points.

At the end of the day: 41 tickets were issued; 21 tickets for cell phone use, six for failure to wear seat belts, 10 for speeding, and four other miscellaneous offences.

Marion is one of 49 students at the summer program this year, although camp director Jenn Ferris, says that registration has gone as high as 70 in the past.

"We're an improv summer camp for students in high schools," Ferris said, explaining that the camp is organized by the Canadian Improv games as one of two summer programs, one in the east and one in the west. "We have campers from across Canada: Saskatchewan to Newfoundland and everywhere in between."

The camp coordinator shared that this is either the eighth or ninth year that the program has run. The Canadian Improv Games as a whole, meanwhile, celebrated 40 years this year.

"I think we are the largest geographical theatre festival in Canada, we have 14 different regions that go from Newfoundland to Vancouver Island," Ferris said.

Although the games themselves provide an opportunity for improv teams from different schools to face off against each other and test their skills at unscripted theatre, Ferris said that the summer programs offer students the opportunity to hone their skills and take a look at how Improv works outside the world of the games.

"Basically we're just learning everything you would want to know about improvisation and improvised theatre, and having a lot of fun," Marion said, adding that beyond the world of acting, he feels improvisation skills are useful for life in general

Sarah Workman who, along with Marion, is a part of the camp's leadership program for more experienced members, said that although the annual camp is only one week long, it leads to the formation of very intense friendships.

"Being on stage with these people, you have to rely on them to help you make everything up," she said. "You form really close bonds."

"You really do have to be close to people to do it," Marion added. "Every year it surprises me how close you can get to people over the span of a few days."

Asked about the work of the leadership program, Workman and Marion said that it offers the chance to take on more challenging roles and responsibilities including making sure younger participants are up and read for the day, and staying up after others have gone to bed to ensure that all is well.

"You also produce, direct, and do tech for your own show that you put on during the week," Workman added, explaining that directing an improvised show is all about training your teams skills and helping to provide structures within which they can improvise compelling stories. "It's really about preparing your actors for the show; leading them through warm-ups and activities that pump them up."

Because of the nature of the camp and its intent to create a safe, inclusive, and fun environment, Ferris said that there are no public

performances associated with Improv U, but Marion and Workman both encouraged the public to seek out improve shows wherever possible.

"Find shows wherever you live and go see them," Marion said. "There are probably some pretty cool people involved."

This year's batch of improvisers heads home tomorrow.

Recyc-Québec helps Plastimum expand its plastics recovery plant

Sherbrooke-based recycling company Plastimum will introduce an innovative packaging line for plastic film and mixed plastics at its Pépin St. plant in the Regional Industrial Park, thanks to support from Recyc-Québec.

The Sherbrooke company was one of seven projects selected by the Crown corporation as part of its latest call for projects to increase the quality of recyclable materials by local businesses. An official announcement of a \$500,000 grant was made Wednesday by Isabelle Melançon, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change.

Founded in 2011, Plastimum recovers and packages plastic waste from sorting centers to add value and divert it from landfill. This enhancement produces high quality plastic for local processing

industries. By upgrading its existing plant and implementing a sorting and packaging line for bags, films and mixed plastics, Plastimum is responding to an existing need to offer a nearby exit market for sorting out and overcoming Quebec's lack of quality plastic supplies for processors.

"In recent years, Plastimum has developed extensive expertise in plastic recycling, thanks to our equipment suppliers," said company president, Manon Tremblay. "We mainly buy Quebec plastics and the finished products are all sold in the province. This allows excellent traceability of our plastics and contributes to the circular economy."

With this new line, the construction of which represents a total investment of \$1 million, Plastimum estimates it will be able to package an additional 4,000 tonnes annual and increase the hourly tonnage of its overall production.

Plastics sorted and packaged will be included in extrusion mixes according to customer requirements and / or sold in

flake form. The new facilities are expected to come into operation during the summer.

René-Lévesque Blvd now open to traffic

The City of Sherbrooke officially announced the opening of the new René-Lévesque Blvd Wednesday. The 2.75 km stretch will open for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians will beginning this (Thursday) morning.

Built at a cost of \$20 million, René-

Lévesque Blvd follows the extension of Portland Blvd. and connects the industrial and Portland Blvd roundabout to Henri-Labonne St and includes one lane in each direction. Roundabouts have been constructed at Magnelli / St. Clair, Matisse and Henri-Labonne streets.

"This new Blvd has been designed to promote traffic fluidity and active trans-

portation," said Sherbrooke Mayor Steve Lussier. "It includes a multifunctional trail and sidewalks. Improvements have also been made to promote the safe crossing of pedestrians and cyclists around the three roundabouts. Sherbrookers have something to be proud of with these new urban developments."

The development of René-Lévesque Blvd began in May 2017 when the Commission scolaire de la Région de Sherbrooke took the opportunity to build a new 21-class elementary school near the roundabout on Matisse. La Croisée School will open at the next school year. A large urban park is also planned near this school. Eventually, René-Lévesque Blvd will allow the construction of approximately 1,600 housing units.

This new Blvd has been anticipated for a number of years. It aims to improve the flow of traffic in Sherbrooke's western sector. Residents of the Mi-Valon neighborhood will now be able to take a route other than Blvd du Mi-Valon to get to or leave their area.

"This is good news since the new boulevard will finally relieve the pressure on Blvd du Mi-Vallon and in front of the Maisonne school," added Rock Forest District Councillor Annie Godbout. "However, I urge motorists and residents alike to be extra careful in the coming weeks as traffic patterns in the area will be changing significantly."

Residents of the Faubourg neighborhood will now be able to access their homes other than by taking Saint-Jacques.

The final section of René-Lévesque Blvd, a distance of about 1 km, will extend to Bourque Blvd at the Rue du Haut-Bois Nord. Preparatory studies are underway to determine the optimal route and the number of buildings to be acquired by the City. The design of the plans and specifications, acquisitions, as well as construction will follow as funds are made available by the municipal council.

GLIMPSES OF THE PAST

In 1900, Wellington North was the definitive commercial activity centre of Sherbrooke. Stocked full of ambitious hotels, the street had the widest variety of shoes available in the area in addition to offering a multitude of specialized retailers. The sustained growth of Wellington North Street has its roots in the opening of the Depot station in 1852. Travellers had to inevitably pass by Wellington Street to get to the city hall or Haute-ville. Additionally, King Street's steep slope caused many cautious drivers to diverge to the north. With the launch of the streetcar in November 1897, Wellington North established itself as the centre of Sherbrooke's economy.

Experimental approach to Emerald Ash Borer has an Eastern Townships root

An experimental measure to control the Emerald Ash Borer that is currently being employed at several sites across Quebec and Ontario has an important link to the Eastern Townships. According to Dr. Robert Lavallée, an entomologist with the Canadian Forestry Service who specializes in the development of biological control methods for insect pests, new traps that have been set up with the goal of helping to control the spread of the Ash-tree-destroying beetle contain a strain of fungus first catalogued at a pine tree plantation in Cookshire.

"It's something we're really proud of," Lavallée said, explaining that the discovery dates back to 2002 when he was doing research on the pine shoot beetle. "I was working on a plantation in Cookshire and pulling off the bark from some infested trees when we found some adults of these pine shoot beetles covered in white stuff."

The "white stuff," the researcher explained, turned out to be a fungus known as *Beauveria bassiana*. Although well known as a fungus with pesticidal properties, Lavallée explained that every different strain of *beauveria* is dangerous only to certain species of insects as the fungus needs to have specific enzymes to pass through the insect's shell.

Having once found this strain to which the pine shoot beetle was susceptible, the researcher said that it sparked an idea when it came time to look for solutions to the emerald ash borer, which he referred to as the EAB.

"When the EAB arrived here in Quebec, we had it in mind to try these fungi

against the Emerald Ash borer," he said, adding that the fungus proved very virulent. "It could kill the EAB in five days."

Working with Claude Guertin of the Institut Armand Frappier in Laval, Lavallée then started working on developing strategies to put this new knowledge to the test. The result of that work is a specialized trap that can now be seen hanging in Sherbrooke's Olivier-Chauveau Park, among other places.

"When the beetle is attracted by the trap, he falls down to the bottom where there are openings that allow the insect to escape," the researcher said, explaining that the trap is about 2 feet long and made of interconnected green funnels and a pheromone lure. "Before escaping, the beetle has to walk over a special pouch we developed, me and my colleague, that the *Beauveria bassiana* is growing on."

The hope, according to Lavallée, is that male borers will pick up the fungus, and then spread it to multiple females over the next five days.

"It's called horizontal transmission," he said, explaining that the desired result has been achieved in laboratory tests just over two years ago.

At this point, Lavallée said, his work on that project has stopped because the research has been picked up by Trois-Rivières based company GDG Environnement who are working to get the trap system approved by Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency for use as a mass market approach to control of the insect. That does not mean, however, that his research regarding the EAB is finished.

"This insect is very difficult to find," Lavallée said, pointing out the irony of

the fact that although the EAB is apparently everywhere in infested zones, it is very difficult to gather specimens for lab work. "It is a very tough insect; in all my career I've never seen anything like it. This insect is tough to control but it is also tough to work with in laboratory conditions."

That in mind, Lavallée and a team of four other scientists are now at work not just on finding other biological management tools, but also better ways to detect the insect and its larvae.

"If your tree is losing foliage or bark or there is new shoot growth at the base of the trunk, probably they are infested, but when you see those symptoms and signs you are three years too late," he said, adding that in that time, the adult beetles have had a lot of time to disperse. "We always detect the insect too late."

Lavallée said that one of the greatest tools needs to be put to use in order to help counter the insidious spread of the pest is awareness.

"I'm always surprised that people are not aware about this insect and the impact that moving wood could have," the researcher said. "It's camping time, and people like to bring their wood with them from home to save a few dollars, but it can have a dramatic impact."

The EAB, he explained, rarely flies more than a few metres to a new tree because food is so abundant and their range is so limited. That being the case, when an infestation comes to a previously untouched area, it is often because of accidental human help.

Looking to the future, Lavallée said that he sees hope in biological control methods like the traps, but he warned that people thinking about fighting the

EAB need to think about, "management," and not, "control."

"When you're running your car you are in control, you can stop, go left, or go right," he said. "With the EAB you follow the train."

Making the comparison to Elm trees that were largely wiped out by disease and insects of their own, Lavallée said that people need to be ready to see most local Ash trees die in the coming years.

"The elm trees slowly disappeared, there are still some but they have been killed off by two insects and a disease. In the case of the EAB we have only one insect that is doing great damage, but they can kill a tree relatively rapidly," he said.

In Sherbrooke the progress of the emerald ash borer is being tracked by the city, but through a system that is relying on the help of citizens reporting their trees. Although only available in French, the details of the city's program, including an interactive map where residents can report the location of suspected ash trees for inspection and check for the location of nearby confirmed infestations is available at <http://sherbrooke.ca/agrile>.

Lucien-Blanchard beach closed due to poor water quality

The Lucien-Blanchard Park beach in the Mont-Bellevue borough has had to be closed again, the City of Sher-

brooke has announced, due to its having been given a 'D' rating after an analysis of the water taken on Wednesday.

Since the beginning of the season, the

beach has had to close six times after heavy rains.

The beach at the Deauville municipal park, meanwhile, remains open.

Elsewhere in the Estrie region, the

water sampled at beaches tested received "A" or "B" ratings, either "Excellent" or "Good".

TO THE VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION:

Memphremagog Conservation Inc. (MCI), based in Magog, Québec, is a volunteer organization that has been operating for more than 50 years with a membership of over 600 households. Our mission is to protect the health of the waters and watershed of Lake Memphremagog. A few days ago, we found out that the Agency was holding a public consultation regarding a Draft Certification and Fact Sheet issuing to New England Waste Services of Vermont Inc. (NEWSVT) for the landfill facility located in Coventry. With this letter, MCI wants to express his strong opposition to the expansion of NEWSVT's solid waste disposal plant in Coventry, near Newport. Operated by Casella Waste Systems, the Coventry landfill site is the largest waste management facility in the State of Vermont. It is located adjacent to Black River, the principal tributary of Lake Memphremagog. Over the years MCI has watched with alarm as the operations of NEWSVT have gradually increased. Its starting capacity of 270,000 tonnes per year was raised to 370,000 by 2005 and to 600,000 tonnes per year by 2013. Casella is now applying for a 51-acre footprint expansion of the landfill, which would allow it to bury 500,000 tons a year of waste there, estimated to be the equivalent of 71 000 trucks a year¹, for 22 additional years. Located as it is upstream from approximately 185,000 people in Quebec who depend on the watershed for drinking water, MCI believes that the facility represents a real and potential danger and should

never have been permitted to exist. Casella buries not only municipal solid waste, but sewage sludge, asbestos, ash, and contaminated soil at Coventry Landfill. Municipal solid waste, the waste from homes, businesses and institutions, contains more than 85,000 contaminants, including heavy metals, volatile organic compounds, pharmaceuticals, and other contaminants of emerging concern.

The proposed Coventry Landfill expansion would be required to have a two liner composite system. The liners often develop holes during installation, and they develop holes and stress cracks over time. Because Lake Memphremagog is a drinking water reservoir, MCI believes that the precaution principle must be applied. The last landfill on the Canadian side of Lake Memphremagog watershed closed many years ago. If Lake Memphremagog was recognized as a drinking water reservoir by the Government of Vermont, the establishment of new Waste management zones would be prohibited following the Vermont Water Quality Standards².

MCI also asks for a stop to the treatment of the leachate from the site at the Newport sewage wastewater plant. The Newport wastewater treatment plant was designed to treat municipal wastewater, not landfill leachate. The last Whole Effluent Toxicity (WET) Test required at the Newport plant outlet was in 2008 and Casella has treated leachate at the plant since 2009. The WET test is used in Vermont and Quebec wastewater treatment plants to determine whether a wastewater discharge will have toxic effects on the organisms in the receiving



water. The fate of leachate contaminants throughout the wastewater treatment process and the cumulative effects in Lake Memphremagog are unknown. If Lake Memphremagog was recognized as a drinking water reservoir by the Government of Vermont, the discharge of wastes would be prohibited regardless of the degree of treatment provided following the Vermont Water Quality Standards 3.

Also, the water quality of the Lake has not improved over the last decade and with more than 4000 boats on the Lake, the construction of many golf clubs and residential developments, Lake Memphremagog continues to be sensitive to

anthropogenic pollution.

In closing, we reiterate our strong opposition to the expansion of NEWSVT's solid waste disposal plant in Coventry, to the leachate treatment in Newport's wastewater plant, and our desire to see Lake Memphremagog be recognized by Vermont as a drinking water reservoir, even though all drinking water intakes are located on the Canadian side of the border.

Combine school and municipal taxes

DEAR EDITOR,

Allow me a few words on the July 19, 2018, Sherbrooke Record article: "School tax bill hits Christmas in July."

As a result of Bill 166, "an act to reform Quebec's school tax system," passed in the National Assembly in March, Quebec property owners are now "enjoying" a decrease in their school tax bills.

Recall the backward system which allowed property owners without children attending school, to choose a school board with a lower tax rate to pay their taxes.

Consider over the past two years in the Outaouais region, 18,400 taxpayers left the four French school boards to pay their tax bill to the English school board, which resulted in losses of income that had to be offset by tax rate increases. Basically, the opposite was reported in the

Laval region.

That said, there were eleven (11) briefs submitted to the Committee on Culture and Education studying the bill. Understandably, French and English school boards and their associations made up the bulk accompanied by three other groups and one citizen. It seemed no one was really happy with the present system.

An example is the Montreal Island School Tax Committee, which is known by its French acronym CGTSIM. It watches over the taxes of Montreal's five school boards (three French; two English). This committee is manned by ten school commissioners (two for each board) and two government employees.

It wanted to suspend the adoption of Bill 166, to create another committee comprised of government and Montreal school tax committee members, combined with other school board people, to further study the idea.

The submission by the Quebec English School Boards Association was predictable. The Association was pleased and applauded the proposed Bill but it recommended the government set up a committee to monitor progress to consider a more comprehensive reform of

school taxation. As usual, the QESBA said this was "to protect our ('minority') rights by virtue of the Constitution." What silliness.

Here is a better idea which considers the wishes of the majority of taxpayers because it will possibly save them more money.

Why have two bodies - municipal and school board - collecting taxes for one property? Look at jurisdictions in BC, Alberta and Manitoba. Essentially, there they collect an education tax, remit the taxes to the province, which in turn distributes to school districts, based on a per student formula.

I am the citizen who submitted a brief, calling for the government to get school boards completely out of the tax-collecting business and follow up on a system in which municipalities take over. Besides saving money, I believe this way would ensure better accountability and openness, which are essential for public confidence.

Sandra Oh delves into female psyche with 'Killing Eve'

Sandra Oh likes untangling the minds of complicated characters who are driven by factors they don't understand.

As Dr. Cristina Yang on "Grey's Anatomy," the Ottawa-born actress moved audiences for 10 seasons by peeling away the seemingly impenetrable layers of a cutthroat character who was ultimately vulnerable.

Now, with her Emmy-nominated role as an MI5 operative hunting down a female assassin on BBC America's "Killing Eve," she says she's enjoying digging into a psyche she's still trying to figure out.

"As Eve hunts Villanelle, I really feel like she's hunting the parts of herself," the Korean-Canadian star said in a recent phone interview, conducted just days before she was named as an Emmy contender for lead actress in a drama series for "Killing Eve." The nod makes her the first Asian woman to be nominated in that category.

Not that Eve is aware she's doing that.

As Canadian viewers will see when "Killing Eve" premieres Sunday on Bravo, Oh's titular character starts the series in a slump of sorts. She's sharp-minded and has ambitions of being a spy but is bored with her desk job.

Enter Villanelle, a psychopathic contract killer played by Jodie Comer, whose

brazen murders intrigue Eve and ignite something within as she tries to find her.

"Here we find a woman who is in her mid-life, who has kind of plateaued ... in her job that's she's fine at, and in her marriage, which is a fine and lovely marriage," Oh said of Eve.

"She's not really curious, she's not really paying attention and she's not a really vital person," Oh continued from London, where she's shooting season 2 of the series.

"But the fascination of a female assassin, let's say metaphorically ... here is a person who is committing the biggest transgression, and the style of this one person ... is with flair, is without remorse, is with freedom, is with style.

"Those are the qualities that I felt were missing from Eve and I liked playing that."

"Killing Eve" is based on the novellas by Luke Jennings.

The drama's dark moments of violence are contrasted with dry humour and Eve's funny, down-to-Earth quirks that stand out when she's with her stodgy colleagues.

"I hope ... you can see the spark of life in her," said Oh, whose film credits include the wine-country dramedy "Sideways" and last year's Canadian family tale "Meditation Park."

"She herself might not be aware or engaged in her own self, so that's where we

find her ... at the beginning not very confident in her instinct and not really committing to her own instinct, her own passion."

English writer-actress Phoebe Waller-Bridge created the series and was a big lure for Oh.

"The most important points were the voice of the show, Phoebe Waller-Bridge's take on the show, the writing, and the second one is the fact that we're delving deeply into a piece about female psychology," Oh said.

"What is more interesting to me is

seeing two human beings embroiled in a relationship that they can't define or let go of."

Eve realizes she's deeply enmeshed in that relationship during a devastating incident at the end of the first episode, when Oh's acting chops are in full force.

"Eve is very naive, she's doing down a really dark pathway but she's skipping down it until that scene happens," Oh said.

"Then as you go along in the episodes, it gets darker and darker."

Kinnear's Mills 10th annual Celtic Festival

“People come from far and wide,” said James Allen, one of the organizers of the Kinnear’s Mills Celtic Festival.

“Now we’re kind of on the circuit,” he explained, for those regularly on the hunt for a fix of traditional music.

While the festival is now in its tenth year, Allen said that there has been a Celtic celebration of one kind or another in the town for at least the last 25 years, but it was usually a one-day event

Allen, in addition to helping to organize the festival, is also participating. He is a piano player, and also a square dance caller. He will call a dance happening Saturday night at 8:30 p.m. at the local school.

On Sunday, there will be a bagpipe and drums performance, followed by a bagpipe competition.

According to Allen, several groups will compete, and continue on the circuit to other competitions held later in

the year in Montreal and Quebec City. The winners are announced and awarded with the cup the following year, he said.

The opening bagpipe performance will be done by the Black Watch Pipe Band, regulars at the festival for the past several years.

In addition to the celebration of Celtic traditions, festival attendees can also enjoy guided tours of four local

churches, as well as an exhibition in town on agriculture in the 19th century in the area.

Kinnear’s Mills is approximately one hour from Quebec City (about an hour-and-a-half from Sherbrooke.)

Bruce Springsteen surprises audience at Billy Joel concert

Bruce Springsteen propped himself on top of Billy Joel's piano to sing a duet with The Piano Man, who was celebrating his 100th concert at Madison

Square Garden on Wednesday night.

Joel told the energetic crowd he had a guest coming onstage who has won a Grammy, Oscar and Tony. Springsteen emerged, surprising the feverish and fanatic audience, who loudly cheered “BRUCE.”

“Congratulations Billy on your 100th show,” Springsteen yelled.

“Ready, Billy?” he asked, as Joel began to play while sitting at the piano.

Springsteen encouraged the crowd to cheer louder and then sang “Tenth Avenue Freeze-Out.” He jumped onto Joel's piano _ making it on his second try _ and sat on it while Joel played and the piano slowly spun. Springsteen then rocked his guitar for “Born to Run.”

Joel, 69, and Springsteen, 68, hugged after their two-song performance, and The Boss

kissed Joel on his head as he walked offstage.

A banner celebrating Joel's 100th performance at MSG rose to the ceiling near the top of the two-hour-plus concert. Joel started performing a monthly residency at the arena in 2014. No artist has performed at the famed venue more than Joel.

“Good evening to you New York City,” said Joel, whose 2-year-old daughter, Della Rose Joel, sat on his lap. “I want to thank you all for coming to our show.”

Joel was excited throughout his set, going from piano to harmonica to guitar. He put on his sunglasses while he passionately sang “New York State of Mind” and twirled his microphone stand in the air and danced happily after singing “Uptown Girl.”

He said he had to think of a special song to sing to celebrate his new milestone, and then performed “This Is the Time.”

“Maybe it’ll hit me later,” he said of his new feat.

Earlier on Wednesday, Governor Andrew Cuomo proclaimed July 18, 2018, as “Billy Joel Day.” Joel, who was born in the Bronx, first performed at MSG on December 14, 1978. His piano is on display in front of the venue.

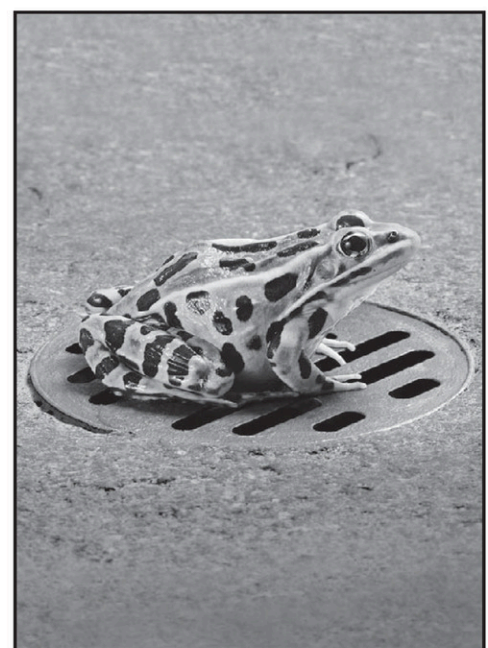

Top Five Tips for running safe in hot summer conditions

Running in hot weather can cause heat related illnesses, zap your energy and diminish your performance if you are not properly aware of the dos and don'ts before heading out. The consequences of being ill prepared for the heat could lead to permanent brain damage or even death due to se-

vere heat stroke and dehydration. To keep you safe in hotter than normal conditions, here are my top five running tips:

1. Best time to run - Everyone has different levels of tolerance for running in hot and humid conditions. If your run is negatively affected by the heat, try to avoid running in the hottest part of the day, which is from 11am to 4pm. If there isn't an option, try to choose routes in the trails where shade from the trees will keep you cool.

2. Clothing - Wear sweat-wicking fabrics to help keep you dry and comfortable. Try to avoid moisture-absorbing fabrics like cotton in anything from socks to shorts and tee shirts. The lighter the garment, the better off you will be. Wear sunglasses and running cap to protect your eyes from the sun year round. Your cap will help shield

you from the sun's ultraviolet rays while preventing your scalp from getting burned. It comes in handy on rainy days too if you're not a fan of the wet stuff beating down on your eyes.

3. Sun block - To protect your skin from sun damage and prevent skin cancer, apply sunscreen before your run. A very pleasant side benefit to protecting your exposed skin is it slows down the natural aging process. Wear the right SPF according to the pigmentation of your skin.

4. Hydration - Drink plenty of fluids. Drink at least two to three liters of water a day. Runners should drink at least two cups of water two hours prior to running and another cup thirty minutes before. Invest in a water bottle to carry with you or plan your route where you know of multiple sources of water. Anytime you feel the heat, take a few sips of water as

needed.

5. Slow the pace when running or cross training in the heat - Pool running is a great alternative to running. It can be done with or without flotation vest and should mimic the running motion in deep water. Another option is the treadmill, the advantage being if you need to stop early you'll still be back where you started. Many gyms provide fans and water fountains. If you feel more tired from the heat than normal, you should stop and try again tomorrow.

After your run, drink plenty of water or a sport drink to replenish lost electrolytes. Some cooling foods that help include watermelon and cantaloupe.

Remember to listen to your body as this is your guide to stay within the boundaries of not overdoing it. Being a good listener could save your life.

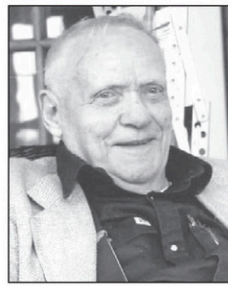

Women's likelihood of bladder prolapse increases with age

Dear Doctor: I am a woman in my early 70s who has been diagnosed with a bladder prolapse. I have no symptoms and was told I don't need surgery until symptoms appear. I have since learned that this condition is quite prevalent among women, but seldom discussed or written about. Should I seek surgery, which could lead to serious complications, even though my case is mild?

Dear Reader: You're correct that your condition — and thus your worry — is shared by many women. Before we explore the options, let's begin with an explainer: Bladder prolapse, or a cystocele, is one type of pelvic organ prolapse, which is a protrusion of pelvic organs into the vaginal region. In a cystocele, the front portion of the vaginal wall becomes weak, allowing the bladder to bulge down into the vaginal region.

The prevalence of pelvic organ prolapse is unclear. In 2003, about 200,000 women had surgery for symptomatic prolapse, with the majority of these surgeries due to a cystocele. However, many people go about their lives not even knowing they have a prolapse. A 2008 study described the symptoms of pelvic organ prolapse to 1,961 women over the

age of 20 and asked whether they had those symptoms; 2.9 percent answered that they did.

The likelihood of a cystocele or other type of pelvic organ prolapse increases with age. A 2002 study assessed the presence of prolapse in 27,342 women, ages 50 to 79, based on vaginal exams. As you're aware, cystoceles were much more common than people realized. In women with a uterus, the prevalence of a cystocele was 34.3 percent; in those whose uterus had been removed, the prevalence was 32.9 percent.

One major risk factor for a cystocele is having had children. The more children a woman has, the greater the risk of a cystocele. Compared to the risk of women without children, the risk of pelvic organ prolapse is four-fold greater with the first child, eight-fold greater with the second, nine-fold greater with the third and 10-fold greater with the fourth. The theory is that pregnancy and delivery injure the muscles and nerves in the pelvic region, allowing for herniations in the vaginal area. The risk of pelvic organ prolapse also increases with prolonged labor, having a high-birthweight infant and having a first pregnancy before the age of 25.

Another risk factor for cystocele is increasing age. The majority of patients who seek treatment for symptomatic

pelvic organ prolapse are in their 60s and 70s. Obesity also increases the risk of cystocele, with obese women having a 47 percent increased risk of prolapse.

Many patients with cystoceles feel the bulge of the bladder into the vaginal region, as if something has dropped into the vaginal area. In addition, women can have increased frequency, urgency and urinary incontinence with cystoceles. All of these symptoms may decrease the desire for sexual intercourse.

Women with urinary symptoms or pelvic discomfort can consider a pessary, a device inserted into the vagina to support the bladder, or surgery to lift the bladder and tighten the pelvic floor ligaments and muscles. But because you're not having any symptoms of cystocele, I wouldn't recommend surgical or medical treatment, which always poses some risk — even if small.

For now, try pelvic floor muscle training exercises to prevent the cystocele from getting worse. Vaginal estrogen or the osteoporosis medication raloxifene might help as well. Although they haven't been studied extensively for this use, they have the potential to strengthen the vaginal tissues.

The way to grill eggplant without it being a leathery mess

By America'S Test Kitchen

Grilling is a popular way to prepare eggplant in Greece, Italy, Turkey and beyond, since eggplant's creamy, tender flesh takes well to smoke and char. Unfortunately, grilled eggplant can easily turn out leathery or spongy.

After a series of tests, we found that 1/4-inch-thick rounds worked best; the interiors became tender by the time the exteriors were nicely grill marked. Since it was necessary to brush the rounds with olive oil so they didn't stick to the grill, we infused that oil with minced garlic and red pepper flakes.

Microwaving the garlic and pepper flakes in the oil bloomed and enhanced their flavours. We strained the oil, reserving the garlic mixture to sprinkle over the finished dish.

Finally, we prepared a flavourful Turkish-inspired sauce, mixing tangy yogurt with lemon juice and zest, cumin, mint, and a bit of the garlic oil. It is important to slice the eggplant thin so that the slices will cook through by the time the exterior is browned.

GRILLED EGGPLANT WITH YOGURT SAUCE

Servings: 4-6
Start to finish: 45 minutes

- 6 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 5 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/8 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1/2 cup plain whole-milk yogurt
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh mint
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest plus 2 teaspoons juice
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- Salt and pepper
- 2 pounds eggplant, sliced into 1/4-inch-thick rounds

Combine oil, garlic, and pepper flakes in bowl. Microwave until garlic is golden brown and crisp, about 2 minutes. Strain garlic oil through fine-mesh strainer into small bowl. Reserve garlic oil and garlic separately.

Whisk 1 tablespoon garlic oil, yogurt, mint, lemon zest and juice, cumin, and 1/4 teaspoon salt together in separate bowl; set aside for serving.

- **For a charcoal grill:** Open bottom vent completely. Light large chimney starter filled with charcoal briquettes (6 quarts). When top coals are partially

covered with ash, pour evenly over grill. Set cooking grate in place, cover, and open lid vent completely. Heat grill until hot, about 5 minutes.

- **For a gas grill:** Turn all burners to high, cover, and heat grill until hot, about 15 minutes. Turn all burners to medium-high.

Clean and oil cooking grate. Brush eggplant with remaining garlic oil and season with salt and pepper. Place half of eggplant on grill and cook (covered if using gas) until browned and tender, about 4 minutes per side; transfer to serving platter. Repeat with remaining eggplant; transfer to platter. Drizzle yogurt sauce over eggplant and sprinkle with garlic. Serve.

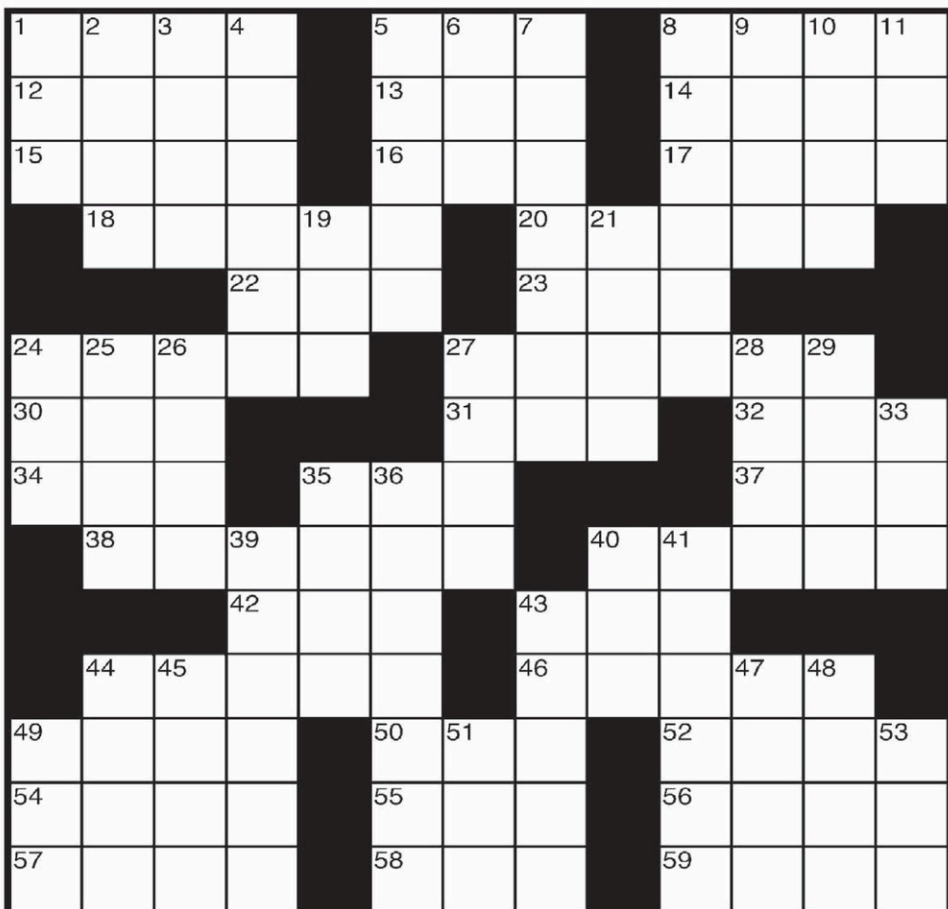

The opponent needs a gentle nudge

Ring Lardner, a sports columnist and short-story writer known for his satirical pen, wrote, "A good many young writers make the mistake of enclosing a stamped, self-addressed envelope, big enough for the manuscript to come back in. This is too much of a temptation to the editor."

In this deal, declarer must tempt East into error. South is in four spades. West cashes the top three hearts, everyone following, then shifts to the club seven (here, top of nothing). How should South continue?

Some pairs lead the queen from ace-king-queen (and partner signals count if he can read the lead, which usually means that either dummy or third hand holds the jack). This has the advantage that when an ace is led at trick one, third hand knows his partner has only the ace and king.

South was right to bid game with such a good fit and a side-suit singleton.

Declarer must draw trumps safely. If they are 2-1, there will be no problems. But just in case East has all three, South should cross to the board with a diamond and lead specifically the spade jack, tempting East to cover with the

queen. Here, if he does, declarer makes his contract, finessing East out of his spade 10. Or East may think for some time, giving the game away. But if East plays low smoothly, South will win with his ace, not risking going down when West has a singleton or doubleton queen.

If declarer leads an unsupported honor from the dummy and you have that card surrounded (with at least one more low card), it is (almost always) wrong to cover.
