Mr. Gladstone, no doubt, struck the true keynote in his speech on the motion to erect a national monument to Lord Beaconsfield, when he said that, however widely the policy of the deceased statesman differed from that approved by the House of Commons at present continued, it must not be forgotten that he was raised to power by the free votes of the people, and sustained in favor by a Parliament which owed its existence to the national will.

Mr. Gladstone, no doubt, struck the true keynote in his speech on the motion to erect a national monument to Lord Beaconsfield, when he said that, however widely the policy of the deceased statesman differed from that approved by the House of Commons at present continued, it must not be forgotten that he was raised to power by the free votes of the people, and sustained in favor by a Parliament which owed its existence to the national will. What he had done, therefore, the nation may be said to have done through him as its organ; and it was not just to throw upon him the sole responsibility for acts which, in its present mood, the nation was not disposed to approve.

Mr. Gladstone thought, deuce posthumous honors to one whom in life he had so signally honored with his confidence, and who had devoted a long life and splendid abilities to its service. The arguments did not, it appears, convince such able men as Mr. Bright, Mr. Chamberlain, Sir Charles Dilke or Mr. Courtney, but they, we must say, essentially sound. In a national pantheon men naturally look for metaphors of those who have borne distinguished parts in national affairs, who have been the guiding spirits of their respective epochs, who have helped to mould and develop the national institutions and the national character. Poetry is not inclined to ask whether, upon a rigid estimation of the sum total of a man's achievements, he is to be regarded as, in the fullest sense, a national benefactor; it asks whether he did, or did not, help to make the history of his country. If he did, his monument finds its fitting place among those of the great of all ages, and if it is not there a lack is felt. Every friend and admirer of Mr. Gladstone will be glad that he was able to speak the generous words of his life-long antagonist, who would certainly, had he been the survivor, have spoken not less generously of the Liberal leader.

Mr. John A. Macdonald. That Sir John Macdonald's health is seriously shaken there can be little doubt, and it is therefore quite possible that the very laborious and responsible position which he now occupies may before long have to be filled by some one else. Rumours on the subject have already been rife, but until they gain a little more consistency we hardly care to discuss them. What Sir John Macdonald has been, and still is in Canadian politics, few persons adequately understand. Not all of those who have had readiest personal access to him have been able thoroughly to appreciate his character. Sir John has himself a keen insight into character; but his own character is not worn upon the sleeve, for every political day to peek at. It may be said, however, with a good deal of confidence, that the facility of manners which is one of his leading characteristics, conceals a wonderful tenacity of purpose, and a resolute adherence to what he himself judges to be best. People who think that because Sir John has received them well, and shown a general disposition to meet their views, he is going to give them exactly what they want, are apt to be wonderfully mistaken. To say that the sagacity of the Premier is never yielded to temptation, would be the language of interested partisanship rather than of candid criticism; but it may be said that the point of view habitually occupied by him is that of the public interest. Sir John has had his day has seen multitudes of men come and go; but Canada, the country in which his early honors were achieved, has been ever with him; and Canada is more to him to-day than any number of individual supporters. There is no austerity about Sir John, no ostentatious patriotism, but followers who think he is prepared to sacrifice the public interest to advance their little schemes, find that somehow or other it can't be done. Sir John is very pleasant and wants to oblige them; but there is a stoppage somewhere, and the axe is not ground. What his personal influence upon his followers has been it might be hard to say; but we incline to think he has erred to too habitually assuming that men could only be governed by appeals to their self-interest or their vanity. No doubt he has seen much of evil in his life-time; but he would have been a stronger man to-day, and might have been spared some of the most serious errors into which he has fallen, had he believed more in good and less in evil, and had he taken that higher tone which his own intentions and motives would have authorized him to take. We may say in conclusion that the Premier has always been a man of wide views, and a man who could seize what some one has called "the durable aspect of things." He has been a man of expedients, but at the same time he has always had a distinct end in view; and his policy extending over a period of thirty years bears the marks of continuity of purpose and aim. He has enjoyed a popularity which has fallen to the lot of few men, and this in itself is, in a certain way, a sign of genius. When Sir John Macdonald retires from the political arena he will leave a void that will probably be felt for many a year, and it is very doubtful if, within the next generation, Canada will produce any statesman that will in all points be his equal.
