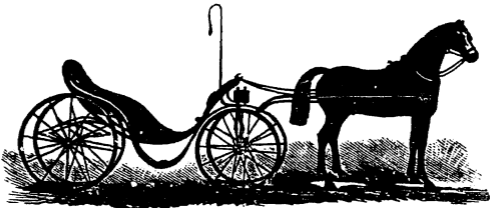

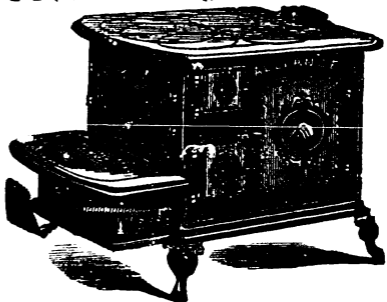

In 1760, under Louis XV, M. MEUNIER first established himself in the rue des Vieilles Etuves-Saint-Honoré, near to the *Croix du Trahoir*, now known as the *Fontaine de l'Arbre Sec*.

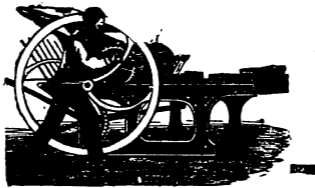

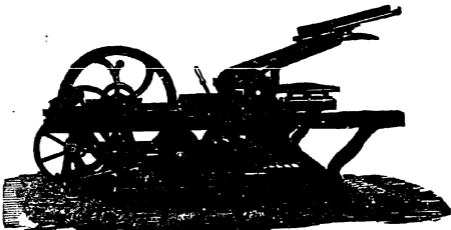
