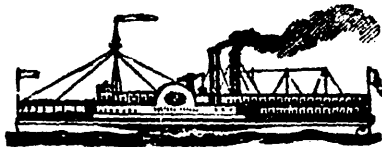

PREFACE

WITH the design of maintaining the utility and efficiency of LOVELL'S MONTREAL DIRECTORY, and of adapting its size and bulk to the convenience of those consulting it, the Publishers continue the printing of the Alphabetical portion in a small but clear type, giving greater prominence than hitherto, by the use of a bold Gothic letter, to the names of Advertisers.

A new feature this year, and one which we believe will commend itself is the substitution of turned commas in place of repeating the name where two or more of the same surname come together.

In presenting to the public this issue of the Directory, the publishers trust that the features above referred to, will meet with general approval, as it enables them more satisfactorily to adapt the book to the demands of our ever increasing population.

It need hardly be said that the same labor and effort to secure accuracy which the Publishers have always put forth have not been withheld in the preparation of the present edition. It has to be taken into account that the whole of the work—compilation, printing and binding—is done within a period of seven weeks, so that some allowance should be made for any errors found in the book.

Some idea of the labor involved in the compilation of the work, and of the difficulties in the way of securing the accuracy of information at which we aim, may be drawn from the fact that in this year's issue, in the City proper, 16,572 new names have been added, 14,740 names taken out, 11,625 alterations made in other names, and 16,816 names remain unchanged, giving a total of 30,273 names (exclusive of the outskirts), for the City proper. This shows an increase as compared with last year of 1882 new names, an addition of about 9000 to our population.

As usual, the book is divided into four parts, viz., (1) The Advertiser's Classified Directory; (2) The Street Directory; (3) The Alphabetical Directory; (4) The Miscellaneous Information.

This book is respectfully dedicated to its generous patrons—THE PUBLIC.
