IT is now a long time since public opinion
has been drawn to one of the most impor-
tant interests of commerce and industry in
this country, and which, up to the present
day, has remained almost unexplored, or at
least, has not been fully developed. A small
portion of that wealth which is to be derived
from the fisheries in the midst of our popu-
lation, this fruitful mine is nothing else

already employed there; some have invented

made so far, in this country to explore the

our country possesses.

Every one is firmly convinced, neverthe-
less, that those Fisheries explored by men,
strangers to the country, contribute to lead
them in the way of great prosperity and to
establish elsewhere commercial houses which
defeat the crisis and movements of all other
branches of industry, and which, in the way
still more ready, contribute to establish in the
midst of us a commerce, the profits of which
would be incalculable.
The matter of exploring this resource has
been already designated in the press of the
country speaks of it and recommends it strongly.
The experience of the inhabitants of other
countries, who prosper largely on this industry
teaches us every day the means of it. "An association"
—the association of small capital which
permits those who care little by their pro-
duction in the form part and to place their

All Shareholders will have the privilege of

may have accumulated, to any other person.
The first dividend will be paid at the end of
the fifth year.
The Society will be dissolved after 50 years
existence.
