MELBOURNE.

AN incorporated village on the St. Francis river, opposite Richmond, with which it is connected by a bridge 750 feet long, built by the Government in 1848, at a cost of about \$7000. The village consists of two parts, the Lower being incorporated. The land in the vicinity is remarkable for its fertility, especially for grazing, and stock raising is extensively engaged in; copper and slate abound in the Township, and the river affords excellent water-power, that is not yet to any degree utilized. It contains four churches, several stores, a chair factory, bark factory, saw mill, tannery, etc. There are valuable copper mines and slate quarries in the vicinity. Distant from Richmond Junction, (station G.T.R.,) about 1 mile, and from Montreal 77 miles. Population of village 292, and its assessed value \$61,000. Melbourne Township population 2,415, assessed value \$404,000. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here.
