REMOVAL OF OBSTRUCTIONS TO NAVIGATION.

We learn that arrangements have been entered into between the Board of Trade and the civic authorities and Col. Strange, by which the latter will endeavor, towards the end of the week, to blow up the ice bridge above the city by means of gun-otton. This design, if successful, will not only have the effect of opening up the channel and preventing the blockade which frequently takes place at Cap Rouge when the lake ice comes down, but the accomplishment of it would be of immense importance in view of any future necessity for operations of the same nature opposite the city, and in this age of powerful explosives we see no reason why the undertaking should not be successful.

HARBOR COMMISSION.

The election of a member of the Harbor Commission to represent the shipping interest of the port takes place, it must be remembered, at eleven o'clock this morning at the office of the Commissioners. It is needless to refer to the importance of making a judicious selection. They know with what and whom they have to deal, and it consequently behooves them to take their precautions, if not to successfully prevent the manipulation of the Board for questionable purposes hereafter, at least to secure some one sufficiently wide-awake to perceive all wrong-doing and fearless enough to publish it to the world. We hear the names of Messrs. R. H. Smith and John Burdett mentioned as those of likely candidates for the post. Both are good men and true, and either would, undoubtedly, be the right man in the right place.
