A word from the mayor

Dear Citizens,

I am entering my last year as Mayor of the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion. By the time I retire, I will have held this position for a total of 20 years. On October 28, 2005, I was sworn in as mayor of this city—the place where I grew up. At the time, I had no idea that we would be experiencing such rapid growth. My first official event was the groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of the roundabout on Boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes. While our population was 22,087 at the time, we have since grown to nearly 46,000. Over the years, I have rubbed shoulders with many elected officials and civil servants who have greatly contributed to making Vaudreuil-Dorion a welcoming and friendly city.

Since 2005, the entire De la Gare sector as well as the commercial sector on the opposite side of the Saint-Charles viaduct have developed quite a bit. The Harwood-De Lotbinière sector, for its part, is in the process of being revamped. The number of sports fields available in the City has also increased, and we have 11 splash pads (12 very soon) in addition to 58 km of bike paths available throughout our urban areas. Public transit has undergone tremendous development as well. The arena has doubled in size, and Centre multisports André-Chagnon was built. Our purification and filtration plants have been expanded and modernized. We have acquired several green spaces—in fact, we currently have more than 50 parks and green spaces, including Le 405 Park and Harwood Nature Park, which quickly won the hearts of citizens, and we own all of the waterfront property along Vaudreuil Bay. Our cultural life is rich, as evidenced by the Je suis monument, the water tower, the Mozaik Network and the increasing number of events we offer.

It is difficult to summarize 19 years (actually almost 20 years) in just a few lines. Vaudreuil-Dorion has prospered, and our financial health is the envy of many cities—but, most importantly, our City has been enriched by a strong community life. Citizens have access to a multitude of services including a brand-new hospital by the end of 2026. Lastly, our Municipal Hub will soon be opening its doors, providing citizens with access to the new Library, City Hall and a public square. This Hub will be a reflection of our City, and a place of which we will be proud.

Consequently, 2025 will be a year marked by numerous small good-byes as I will undoubtedly catch myself frequently saying, “this is the last time that...” I recently experienced just that during my 19th mayor’s blood drive. After 4,077 blood donations collected since 2005 and the involvement of many generous honorary presidents, I can truly say that I was privileged to experience countless beautiful moments that will remain forever etched in my memory.

May 2025 be marked by happiness, health and peace. I look forward to meeting you at the Municipal Hub.

The Mayor’s blood drive took place on November 7, under the honorary presidency of Romain, age 4, the son of the City’s Assistant General Manager, Mélissa Côté. When he was just seven days old, Romain was diagnosed with severe scaphocephaly, a rare condition that required emergency surgery at Sainte-Justine Hospital. Thanks to the exceptional care of the staff and a blood transfusion, he successfully overcame this challenge. Today, Romain is a young boy who is full of life!

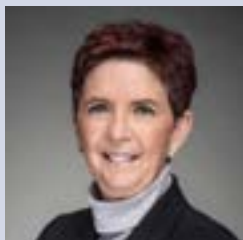

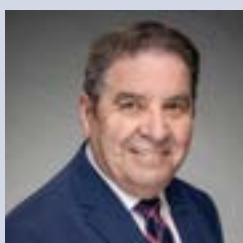

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



Infrastructures

- The redevelopment of Route de Lotbinière, between Boulevard Harwood and Avenue Saint-Jean-Baptiste, is progressing well and will continue in the spring and early summer of 2025. As part of this work, the intersection of Boulevard Harwood and Route de Lotbinière will also be redeveloped. The entrance and exit ramps to Boulevard Harwood will be eliminated to increase pedestrian safety at this intersection. The location of the former east-

bound access ramp will eventually be replaced by a green space. Route de Lotbinière will thus reflect the vision of the Harwood-De Lotbinière PPU. The very large asphalt or concrete surface initially laid down will be transformed to make this area livelier by adding sidewalks, bicycle paths, street lighting, trees and vegetated ditches.

- Work on Phase 2 of the Boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes redevelopment is scheduled for summer 2025, subject

to obtaining the necessary environmental permits. The redevelopment of the boulevard began in 2020 between Rue des Floralties and Rue Jeannotte, up to the intersection with Rue Henry-Ford, with the addition of sidewalks, bike paths and vegetated strips. It should be noted that the roundabouts at the intersections of Rue Henry-Ford and Boulevard de la Gare are planned for the following year, as part of the work to be carried out by the *Ministère des Transports et de la Mobilité durable du Québec*.

- Following construction of the Municipal Hub, the City plans to permanently connect Rue Toe-Blake and Rue Lorne-Worsley, eliminating the dead ends of both these streets.
- The City continues to invest in the rehabilitation of its wastewater pumping stations. Work is scheduled for the Roche station in 2025. The latter is located at the intersection of Rue Joseph-Carrier and Avenue Saint-Charles.
- In 2025, construction will also begin on the new underground reservoir on Boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes, west of Route Harwood. This reservoir, with a volume of nearly 7,000 m³, will eventually take on the role played by the water tower in the Dorion sector.

Green infrastructure – pilot project

- The Engineering and Environment Department is currently analyzing options other than paving for repairing the parking lot at the municipal building located at 190 Avenue Saint-Charles. The aim is to reduce the amount of asphalt or concrete surface area and thus encourage the infiltration of rainwater. This pilot project will make it possible to test the chosen solution and assess the maintenance and snow-clearing challenges during the following winter season, in order to determine the feasibility of replicating the concept on a larger scale.

Parks, green spaces and sports fields

- Two floodlit basketball courts will be built on the Cité-des-Jeunes campus, near the filtration plant. Work is scheduled to be carried out in 2025.
- Work began this fall on the Parc Paul-Gérin-Lajoie and will continue next spring. Two volleyball courts will be added to the existing ones, and a fitness area will be created (winning project of the 2023 participatory budget). A permanent lighting system will be installed for all areas: skateboard park, volleyball courts and fitness area. Street furniture and a drinking fountain are also among the park's additions.
- Development of the Parc-école des Quatre-Saisons is now complete. Over 200 trees were planted this fall that will eventually create an imposing canopy and a cool island for the area. Interestingly, almost 40% of the trees are conifers, which will help make the space greener, even in the winter.



- The dek field hockey rink has been set up in Parc de la Montée Cadieux. The shelters, built by Public Works staff, will be installed in the spring.

- The 12 pickleball courts at Parc Saint-Jean-Baptiste were installed in the fall. The acrylic surface on the courts located near the parking lot will be completed next spring.

- Work to redevelop the ParcBourget began in late last summer and will continue next spring. The future development will include a bantam baseball field with fencing, bleachers, dugouts and benches, new children's play areas and a splash pad. A path connecting the different areas will wind through the park. A service building and street furniture (picnic tables, benches, drinking fountain, sun shelter, etc.) have been planned. Most of the trees will remain on the site, and a few additional trees will be transplanted. As part of this project, the park also saw the addition of children's playground furniture focused on universal accessibility, which aims to meet a variety of special needs (sensory stimulation and accessibility for people with reduced mobility thanks to a total of three components accessible from the ground).

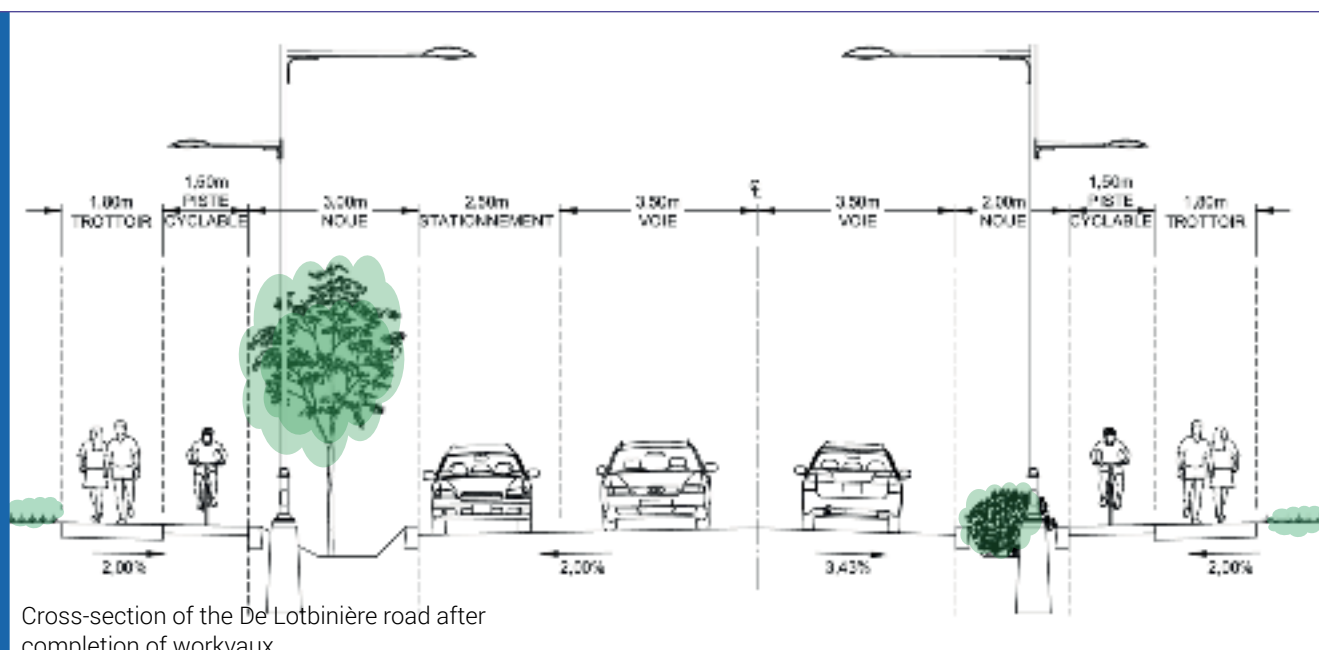

Bike paths and pedestrian facilities

- This fall, the City built a bike path on Chemin des Chenaux, between Chemin Dumberry and the sidewalk leading to Parc des Chenaux and Rue de Versailles, thereby extending the existing lane that stopped at the bottom of the overpass.
- In addition to the bike paths to be built on Boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes and Route de Lotbinière, the implementation of the bike path master plan includes the following work for the 2025 season:
 - New off-road multi-purpose path on Rue Émile-Bouchard ;
 - Phase 2 of the bike path on Rue Valois, between 8th Avenue and Avenue Marier.

The opening of the Municipal Hub is fast approaching! Municipal employees will move in during the first months of 2025. The future Library should be accessible around March. Moving requires a great deal of organization. All of the books and documents, as well as the Lab equipment and Object Library items, have to be moved to the new shelving... **We're talking about over 90,000 documents (books, magazines, objects, CDs, games, etc.)!** And then there's the layout of the spaces to consider: the implementation of the self-service loan and return system, the recording studio as well as the furniture for the rooms and work areas. For this reason, the Jeannotte Street Library will have to close a few weeks before the opening of the new one on Émile-Bouchard. Special measures will be implemented for loaning out materials during this transition period. Library users, rest assured, your wait will be amply rewarded when you enter this new, large and bright space!

By the time you read these lines, the work will have been completed. Here's a few more tidbits of info...

Hub

- Trees: by the end of the project, over 160 trees will have been planted, on a site that previously had around 5.
- Shrubs and plants: over 14,500 shrubs and perennials planted.
- Alongside the building, a pathway encircled by a landscaped embankment provides access between the residential area and the station.
- Several hundred outdoor seats in different environments on the site (bleachers, amphitheatre, embankments, benches, picnic tables).
- 2 outdoor chess tables.
- 70 outdoor bicycle spaces.

Library

- Automated loan and return system
- Children's playground and teen area
- Reader assistance workstations
- Digital creation laboratory with recording studio and musical instruments
- Over 80 seats
- Six teamwork rooms
- Terrace

FIRE SAFETY

Reminder and safety notice

Health Canada has issued a recall concerning Samsung brand built-in electric ranges that can be accidentally activated by humans and even pets. Since 2013, around 250 fires in North America have been caused by this type of stove. A total of 19 Samsung stove models are subject to this recall. Samsung Canada is distributing a free set of covers or latches to owners of affected appliances who request them.

If you own one of the appliances affected by the recall:

- Keep children and pets away from the appliance's control buttons;
- Do not leave any objects on the range when it is not in use;
- Before leaving home or going to sleep, check the positioning of the control buttons on the device;
- Contact Samsung Canada to receive a set of button covers or protective latches for your device.

Dealing with emergency situations in the winter

Winter brings added responsibility when it comes to safety. With this in mind, remember that it's important to clear snow from the entrance to your home at all times, whether it's the main entrance or other exits. That way, in the event of an emergency, you can quickly and safely evacuate and await the arrival of the firefighters. The same applies to basement windows, which need to be unobstructed in order to open and serve as emergency exits, should the need arise. And, while you're at it, why not shovel a path from those windows to the front of the house so you don't get stuck in the snow?

When the fire department is called, every second counts and can make all the difference. That's why we ask you not to bury hydrants under snow when clearing your property. When hydrants are covered in snow, it complicates the work of firefighters and could cost them precious minutes.

Emergencies, disasters and natural hazards: taking appropriate action

When it comes to civil protection, the City's role is to prevent risks, plan emergency measures and coordinate a response in the event of a disaster. The City has developed an emergency measures plan that is updated regularly and identifies the risk factors in the territory and contains the measures to be taken to deal with an emergency or disaster situation.

The increasing frequency of extreme weather events requires everyone to be well prepared to deal with them when the time comes. Recent years have confirmed that no one is immune: power outages, ice storms, strong winds, floods... What actions can be taken going forward to limit inconvenience and ensure self-sufficiency when an emergency occurs?

Be prepared!

In an emergency, you need to be prepared for the first 72 hours. It may take some time for rescue teams to reach your neighbourhood. This means that you are primarily responsible for your own safety.

Make a family emergency plan

- Draw up a list of emergency contacts.
- Create an evacuation plan for your home, agree on a gathering place, and conduct evacuation drills.
- Make sure you know how to turn off water, electricity and gas, if applicable.
- Plan a route to leave your neighbourhood in the event of an evacuation. Plan a second route in case roads are impassable.
- Take an inventory of your belongings, with proof of purchase, photos or videos. Keep these documents and a copy of your home and auto insurance policies outside your home in a safe place.
- Contact your insurer to verify your home insurance coverage.

Prepare a home emergency kit

Prepare to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. In the event of a disaster or natural disaster, you will need some essential items. You may have to manage without a power source or running water. It is your responsibility to start gathering the basics and thinking about what your family will need for at least 72 hours in an emergency.

8 essential items:

- Drinking water (six litres per person)
- Non-perishable food (for at least three days)

- Manual can opener
- Battery-operated radio (with spare batteries)
- Cell phone portable charger
- Headlamp or flashlight (spare batteries or crank lamp)
- Lighter or matches and candles
- First aid kit: antiseptics, analgesics, adhesive bandages, sterile gauze pads, scissors, etc.

The Get Ready website (Government of Canada) and the Red Cross website provide comprehensive lists of emergency kits to help you prepare properly.



Make sure you stay informed

During an emergency in Vaudreuil-Dorion, the City quickly communicates with citizens through a calling system. It's important to sign up for the emergency list and make sure your contact information is up to date. When moving, consider changing your address since calls can be sent to specific areas, depending on the type of emergency.

In addition to the calling system, in the event of an emergency, the City uses various tools to share important information, including its website, Facebook page, citizen portal, and electronic billboards.



Prevent flooding, check the condition of your fixtures

Make sure your plumbing systems comply with building standards: sump pump, check valve, etc. When in doubt,

consult a plumber. Make sure that water runs out of downspouts far enough from the foundations so that it flows away from the house. Have an extra pump on hand, which can help you drain the water if your basement floods.

What should you do in the event of a power outage?

Hydro-Québec's self-service tool *Info-pannes* (pannes.hydroquebec.com) remains the main source of information in the event of a power outage. Updated regularly, it informs you of any developments in the situation in real time. If your outage is not indicated as being a planned outage, report it online or at 1-800-790-2424. If you witness a situation that poses an immediate risk to the health or safety of the public (e.g., fallen electrical wires, fire, etc.), call 911 immediately.

If you use a generator, make sure you respect the rules of installation and use. Be sure to place it outdoors, in a ventilated area and away from doors and windows (not in a garage). That way, you will prevent the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning by keeping exhaust gases from entering your home.

Ensuring the compliance of protective equipment

About 20 City of Vaudreuil-Dorion staff members met on October 1st for training delivered by a firm specialized in water resource management on how to carry out inspections to ensure the compliance of water backup protection equipment, in compliance with municipal by-laws. The objective of the training was to help municipal employees develop their expertise in order to be able to support citizens in protecting their homes during extreme weather events such as the torrential rains that we experienced on August 9. To this end, remember that a permit (free of charge) is required for any work that is done in the basement following these floods. This allows inspectors to ensure that the work complies with by-laws and that any health problems (mould) or issues related to the safety of the building (risk of fire or flooding) are avoided.

THE EVENT OF AUGUST 9, 2024 IN SHORT

- 219 mm of rain received over a period of 20 hours
- 2,450 homes affected by torrential rains (21% of the city)
- Over 4,000 calls received by 911 during peak period (35 calls per second)
- 2,700 homes affected by power outages
- Several impassable streets, a collapsed street and a landslide
- Mobilization of the Municipal Civil Security Organization: assessment of the City's infrastructures, establishment of an emergency hotline, preparation of services for citizens and deployment of the Fire Department Mission within the territory to rescue people and secure buildings
- Mobilization of 100 or so City employees during the flooding period of August 9 and during the weekend for the implementation of safety measures and collection
- 500 interventions by Fire Department personnel (securing residences, avoiding fire risks, cutting off the electricity supply)
- Debris collection: around 3,000 tonnes over a period of one month
- Cost to the City of collecting, transporting and disposing of debris: approximately \$1 million
- Free basement renovation permits following August 9: 552 permits requested as of October 18



Snow clearing and parking during the winter season

Conducting snow-clearing operations across the entire territory requires several hours depending on the amount and type of precipitation received. The operations are complex and require the collaboration of all to be carried out effectively and safely.

Some good behaviours to adopt to facilitate snow clearing

- Do not park your vehicle on the street until the street has been cleared of snow, and avoid having cars parked on both sides of the street at the same time.
- On collection days, make sure your wheeled bins are placed in your entrance and take them out only if necessary.
- When shoveling, place the snow on your property, not on the street.
- Avoid covering hydrants with snow, whether they are on your property or not. Make sure they are visible in case emergency services are required.
- If possible, clear your street manhole to avoid water accumulation caused by periods of freezing and thawing.

Street parking

Although parking is prohibited from November 15 to April 1, between midnight and 7 a.m., the winter parking hotline, 450 455-3372, aims to help alleviate by-laws in accordance with weather conditions. Every day, starting at 5 p.m., the hotline's message is updated to let you

know if parking is permitted or prohibited starting at midnight on the same day. The decision to allow or prohibit parking depends on weather conditions as well as the snow removal operations in progress.

You can also be notified of parking bans by subscribing to receive notifications through the City's Citizen Portal. You have the option of receiving notifications by email, text or mobile notification. **Please note that the winter parking hotline remains the most reliable source of information, particularly when it comes to any legal recourse.** It should therefore be prioritized as your main source for this particular information.

Some exceptions apply, so be attentive! Any signage prohibiting parking takes precedence over the telephone hotline message. In the event that parking is prohibited, it is possible to park your vehicle in an alternative parking lot, a list of which can be found on the City's website under Services to Residents/Roads, Water and Sewers Systems/Parking section.

Finally, in the event that the City needs to tow a car that would interfere with snow removal operations, the car will be moved either to another location on the same street, to a nearby street, to Centre multisports André-Chagnon, in the area that is under video surveillance, or on the snow disposal site (Rue du Voiturier) accessible via Rang Saint-Antoine. In this case, citizens are invited to call 311 to find out where their vehicle has been towed to.



A second accomplishment as part of the exterior signage plan



The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion took advantage of the completion of renovations at Jean-Marc-Ducharme Community Centre to identify the building in accordance with the Exterior Signage Plan. This is the second major task completed, following the Lotbinière Fire Station.

Recall that this plan gives precise guidelines on how to identify municipal infrastructure in a coherent and harmonized manner, namely buildings, City entrances, streets, parks and neighbourhoods, outdoor signage, directional and regulatory signs. Signage is implemented gradually, focusing on new buildings, unidentified locations and infrastructures, and damaged elements that need to be replaced.

Four *fleurons* for Vaudreuil-Dorion

The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion maintained its four *fleurons* status during the 19th edition of *Fleurons du Québec* awards ceremony held in Saint-Hyacinthe on November 21. This distinction reflects the City's ongoing efforts to provide a pleasant, green and well-maintained environment for its citizens.

According to the *Corporation des Fleurons du Québec*, the City was able to preserve its four *fleurons* due to the quality of its mosaics, the impeccable condition of the public roads and bike paths, community initiatives as well as the perfect ratings received for some of its parks and municipal buildings. More specifically, the evaluator praised the developments of Le 405 and Félix-Leclerc parks, and those of Maison Valois, Opticentre St-Jean-Baptiste and the Jean-Marc-Ducharme Community Centre. These welcoming places illustrate the care the City lends to its public spaces. The abundance and diversity of green spaces remain major assets for Vaudreuil-Dorion, which is why the City makes it a priority to maintain and enhance them.

Note that the residential and institutional sectors also received four *fleurons* while the business and industry sectors obtained three *fleurons*, ranking them in line with the average Québec municipality.

Congratulations to the Public Works team for their hard work !



ENVIRONMENT

More than 50 bird species listed in parc de l'Île-Bray

As part of the development of Île-Bray Park, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion, in collaboration with Club ornithologique Vaudreuil-Soulanges, carried out an inventory of the birds present on this natural site this past fall. On September 4, a total of 13 passionate members of the club took part in this outing, observing many species in this unique setting that offers a direct view over the Ottawa River. A total of 53 species of birds were identified.

This activity marks an important step in the development of

the park, made possible thanks to the \$10,000 in financial assistance provided by the Foundation of Greater Montréal and Nature-Action. Note that this step is essential to obtaining additional grants and continuing efforts to restore the natural environment. Observations are available on the eBird web platform.

Sans auto solo challenge: Vaudreuil-Dorion stands out in the Montérégie area

The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion recently won the *Défi sans auto solo* challenge (no single-driver car challenge) in the medium-sized business category, for the Montérégie area. Between September 1 and 30, employees saved 2,007 kg in greenhouse gases by covering 10,643 km using sustainable transportation (cycling, walking, electric car, carpooling). This victory reflects the City's commitment to sustainable mobility and reducing its carbon footprint. Thank you to the teams for their participation and determination in choosing more responsible modes of transportation.

About *Défi sans auto solo*

Défi sans auto solo is a friendly competition among companies and institutions from across Québec. To set themselves apart, participating organizations are encouraging their staff and student community to reduce the amount of single-person car travel they do. Whether through active transportation, public transit or even telecommuting, the Challenge is an opportunity for participants to discover sustainable mobility, or to become ambassadors of their preferred mode of sustainable transportation among their colleagues.

Textiles in the spotlight at the Réparathon event

Over 150 people came to Centre multisports André-Chagnon on October 26 to take part in the fifth edition of the Réparathon event. This year's event focused on textile reuse, repair and recycling. A workshop, conference, pop-up thrift shop and repair shop were offered free of charge to visitors.

This event is organized every year to coincide with Québec's Waste Reduction Week, which aims to raise awareness and encourage everyone to reduce waste and consume more responsibly.

Vaudreuil-Dorion signs the Lake of Two Mountains Charter of Commitment

On October 1, some 50 representatives from the municipal, environmental and recreation-tourism sectors gathered at Le Littoral Services Center in Oka National Park to launch the Lake of Two Mountains Charter of Commitment. Oriana Farina, Head of the Environment Division, was on site representing the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion, the first City to sign the Charter. Coordinated by the Conseil régional de l'environnement (CRÉ) de Montréal, the CRÉ de Laval, the CRÉ des Laurentides and the CRÉ de la Montérégie, the Charter's ambitious aim is to unite all organizations, from

one shore of the lake to the other, in order to protect this precious reservoir of fresh water.

The Lake of Two Mountains is a site of vital importance due to its proximity to the metropolitan population and its role as a source of drinking water for over a million people. However, the extent and diversity of its uses threaten the balance of its ecosystem and the maintenance of the ecological services it provides.

The Charter of Commitment sets out a shared vision and six collective ambitions, including ensuring water quality and availability, protecting natural environments, ensuring governance, and adapting to climate change. These priorities address the key issues facing the region and will guide future actions.

By signing the Charter, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion recognizes how important this body of water is to the health of populations and ecosystems.

Wheeled bins: 2024 assessment of material sorting

Once again this summer, environmental awareness officers inspected wheeled bins in the Vaudreuil-Dorion area to promote better sorting of materials. The information gathered is used to target the awareness-raising and information activities best adapted to local realities in order to achieve the objectives related to reducing the amount of waste that ends up in the landfill.

At the end of the summer season, the awareness officers drew up a list of the most frequent sorting errors observed in wheeled bins. The findings are as follows:

- The presence of organic materials, such as green and food waste as well recyclables in garbage bins.
- It should be noted that citizens who take part in the organic waste collection program put the right materials in their bins. At the same time, plastic bags are still being used, even though they are prohibited for organic waste. This applies even when the packaging of said bags indicates that they are biodegradable or

compostable.

- Final waste disposed of in recycling bins.

A number of the bins found to be non-compliant in 2023 were re-inspected in 2024. While most garbage bins were still non-compliant, over 70% of recycling and organic waste bins no longer had sorting errors. This observation suggests that households resistant to participating in organic waste and recycling collections remain unaffected by awareness-raising activities, whereas those already participating are integrating the proper way of doing things and improving the way they sort their materials.

The 2024 report on the study of wheeled bin contents can be consulted on the City's website, in the Collections and Schedules section.

Une chanson à l'école project

On September 27, some 4,000 children from 17 elementary schools within the Centre de services scolaires des Trois-Lacs school board (including 8 from Vaudreuil-Dorion), as well as special education students from Cité-des-Jeunes high school, gathered on the Cité-des-Jeunes turf to perform *Plus je sais, mieux je suis*, accompanied by the Alfa Rococo duo, 78 musicians from the Harmonie de la Cité-des-Jeunes band and 5 musicians from Orchestre symphonique de Montréal. This initiative by music teacher Andréanne Allard, from Cité-des-Jeunes high school, was part of the *Une chanson à l'école* project.

This marked the second year such a gathering was held in Vaudreuil-Dorion, launching the Journées de la culture event. Last year, nearly 900 young people got the opportunity to unite their voices with those of singer-songwriter Fanny Bloom at Parc de la Maison-Valois.

Kolab artist Fluke joined forces with young citizen Alexandria Diardichuk-Marinakis to create an ambitious art project on two of the filtration plant's walls. The majestic mural completed last October is the realization of the project submitted by Alexandria in the youth section of the 2023 participatory budget. She wanted to highlight the beauty of the City, its parks and landscaping through the eyes of young artists, and to use art a means to bring together diverse cultures. The project was indeed a success! Passers-by can now admire the incredible *Paysages en fleurs* mural either on Chemin Paul-Gérin-Lajoie and Avenue Saint-Charles, facing Vaudreuil Bay.

As part of their creative process, at the end of July, Alexandria and Fluke held a creative horticultural activity with youngsters from the teen club of the Animation Jeunesse day camp, accompanied by Patrick Legault, Foreman - Horticulture and Urban Forestry for the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion. The mural is a representation of the different flowers that can be found within the territory. It is now listed as part of the Mozaïk art circuit.

It should be noted that the budget initially allocated to the project was increased through the 2021–2024 cultural development agreement between the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion and the *Ministère de la Culture et des Communications du Québec*.

Camp Franco-Fun receive top honours once again

On October 3, Camp Franco-fun was awarded the Association québécoise du loisir municipal's OTIUM trophy in the Municipalities or Boroughs with 25,000 to 74,999 inhabitants category during the Prix Excellence Ceremony held at the Bonaventure Hotel in Montréal. This recognition follows that received in June at the Nomina Gala, which celebrates excellence and innovation in recreation and sport in the Montréal area.

Offered for the first time in 2022, Camp Franco-fun is a day camp program designed for allophone children in Vaudreuil-Dorion, enabling them to continue developing their French language skills during the summer months, through a

specialty dedicated day camp. It is a tool that enables social and linguistic integration through leisure activities, and creates strong ties within the community, facilitating access to local resources and helping immigrant families to put down roots. This program is the fruit of a collaborative effort between the City, Animation Jeunesse and the Centre de services scolaires des Trois-Lacs. Two other partners joined the project in 2024: Réseaux and the Fondation des enfants de Vaudreuil-Soulanges.

In the summer of 2024, 50 young people ages 5 to 12 took part in this two-week program.

Community Forum: daring to take action for a sustainable future



On November 14, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion held the fourth edition of its community forum around the theme entitled *Le pouvoir d'agir local pour un avenir durable—Osons l'action!* (local empowerment for a sustainable future—let's dare to take action!). Some 100 participants from the community, environment, health, education and public safety sectors, Vaudreuil MNA Marie-Claude Nichols, as well as City employees, elected officials and citizens gathered at Centre multisports André-Chagnon to develop concrete solutions for building a greener future.

The day began with a talk by Jérôme Dupras, environmentalist, university researcher and professor, also known as the bassist of music group Cowboys Fringants, on environmental involvement at the community level. In his presentation, he began by outlining the current pressures, known as global change, facing human and natural systems. Using examples from research carried out on Québec's urban ecosystems, Jérôme Dupras demonstrated how to develop effective strategies to protect nature in order to counter the effects of these global changes.



Manon Giri, Development and Partnerships Coordinator at Solon, respectively shared their experiences related to environmental empowerment.

Célia Corriveau of Pôle d'économie sociale Vallée-du-Haut-Saint-Laurent led three action-oriented workshops designed to motivate participants to take concrete measures with regard to environmental issues, and to support existing local initiatives by designing tools and projects to mobilize them.

Leading by example

To inspire the community, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion is committed to applying the principles of ecoresponsibility to the organization of its event. More specifically, it reduced waste production by limiting document printing and using compostable food packaging. To limit the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions produced by transporting participants to Centre multisports André-Chagnon, the City created a car-pooling platform and a competition to promote the use of sustainable transport (walking, cycling, etc.). Participants were also invited to bring their own reusable coffee cups and water bottles to encourage individual action.

The 35th edition of *La Nuit des sans-abri* took place on October 18, under the theme *L'itinérance : 100 visages* (100 faces of homelessness). In Vaudreuil-Dorion, the annual event was held at L'Aiguillage on Rue Chicoine. La Nuit des sans abri aims to raise public awareness of the situation of homelessness, poverty and social alienation that is affecting more and more people across Québec. As part of the activity, people spend the night on the streets to show their solidarity with those living in precarious conditions. The activity also gives a voice to the homeless, demystifying realities and deconstructing prejudice.



BUDGETING WORKSHOPS WITH ARC-EN-CIEL VAUDREUIL-SOULANGES

Poverty, the housing crisis and the rising cost of food is a concern for everyone. Taking care of your mental health can be difficult when you're facing such challenges. That's why Arc-en-ciel, with the support of the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion, recently offered budgeting workshops for all citizens, regardless of age, family status or background. Around ten people have attended each of the training sessions to learn how to apply personalized budgeting concepts in a laid-back, reassuring and open setting focused on sharing. Sandra Lavoratore knew how to make a challenging subject easy to understand and communicate information without judgment. Congratulations to the organization for this highly relevant initiative, and thank you to all the participants!

THE PRENATAL AND YOUNG FAMILY CENTRE CELEBRATES 10 YEARS!

Over 140 people gathered at Opticentre St-Jean-Baptiste on September 21 to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Vaudreuil-Soulanges Prenatal and Young Family Centre. Founded in 2014 by Chantal Darcy and Christina Maurice, the Centre has since welcomed 9,031 families and over 19,400 children. What began as a small local initiative has become a unique organization in the Vaudreuil-Soulanges region, dedicated to supporting families from pregnancy to kindergarten. Thanks to a wide range of workshops and adapted services, the Prenatal and Young Family Centre offers comprehensive support for parents and toddlers, meeting their needs at every stage of this important period. In addition to offering services that meet the needs of the population, the Centre's team has also gone beyond its primary mission over the years by getting involved in the community through structuring projects, particularly with seniors, in collaboration with other local organizations and partners.

Congratulations to all the staff and volunteers at the Prenatal and Young Families Centre, and happy 10th anniversary!

A FIRST HARVEST FESTIVAL FOR L'ATELIER PAYSAN

Since its creation in 2021, L'Atelier Paysan has aimed to offer a unique market-gardening experience to young people in Vaudreuil-Soulanges: hosting groups at the urban farm, educational workshops and school projects. In 2023, the organization made a worrying observation: although participants are taught to grow their own vegetables, they don't always know what to do with them. And so began the process of building an outdoor kitchen, with the intention of providing additional learning opportunities, including processing, cooking and preserving harvested produce. As a result, L'Atelier Paysan has been welcoming groups for culinary workshops since the end of summer 2024.

Last fall, the organization held its very first harvest festival, offering workshops on how to preserve garden fruits during this period of abundance. Lacto-fermentation, tomato sauce, compote and jam were all part of the program.



To finance its educational activities, L'Atelier Paysan relies in part on the sale of vegetables. To produce these vegetables, they count on volunteers who have an interest in gardening.
