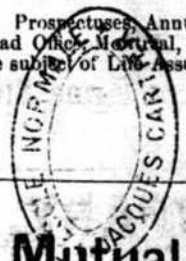

# HISTORY

OF THE

## Administration of the Earl of Dufferin

IN CANADA.

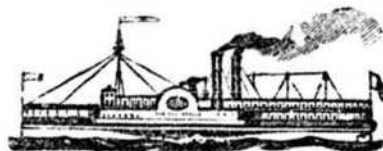
