ST. LAMBERT, a suburban town on the south shore of the St. Lawrence directly opposite Montreal in the county of Chambly, district of Montreal, with a population about 4,500 and growing rapidly. It is an

important railway centre, with an electric railway to Montreal, operated by the Montreal & Southern Counties Railway Co., making 50 trips each way; fare single, 15c. return 25c; ten trips 75c, 55 trips \$2.75; and has an excellent train service by the Grand Trunk railway, with over twenty trains each way daily. Return 25c, single 15c, on suburban trains, return good for day of issue only, 25c; return good for 1 month 35c; single fare on regular train 25c; by commutation tickets, 10 trips for 75c., 55 trips for \$2.75 or 5c. a trip.

The Victoria Jubilee Bridge spans the St. Lawrence here, and all trains to and from the City stop at the railway station. Several lines of railway run here, viz: Grand Trunk for points South, East and West; I.C.R. for Halifax; Central Vermont for Farnham, New York and Boston, Delaware and Hudson for New York; south Shore Railway for Sorel and the Montreal Southern Counties Electric Railway. The distance to Longueuil, the county seat, is three miles; communication, by the electric railway. There are four churches (Roman Catholic, Presbyterian, Methodist and Episcopal), with resident cure and ministers. There is a large academy, conducted by the Protestant School Commissioners, with a staff of eleven teachers.

The Roman Catholic School Commissioners' school is now conducted by the sisters of the Holy names of Jesus and Mary and have a staff of five teachers for girls and two Brothers of the C.S. Viateur for the boys. They have built a convent that has cost \$80,000 to receive boy boarders. There is excellent boating on the river, and the St. Lambert Boat Club is recognized as one of the best clubs in the vicinity of Montreal. The residents are mostly employed in the City, and select it for a suburban home from its favorable situation and excellent means of communication at all seasons with the city. A wall along the river bank gives the Town a fine promenade of over 1,000 feet in length from which the view of Montreal, lighted at night by thousands of electric lights, is magnificent. During the winter months direct communication is had with Montreal by an ice road across the St. Lawrence on which considerable driving is done, and by the bridge. St. Lambert is being rapidly built up, and is destined to become a very

TADOUSAC, a post village and watering place, the capital of Saguenay co. and district, founded in 1599, by Chauvin at the east entrance of the Saguenay River, about 5 miles above its confluence with the St. Lawrence, on a semi-circular terrace at the top of a beautiful bay, with a sandy beach, hemmed in by mountains of solid rock 25 miles across the St. Lawrence from Riviere du Loup, 130 miles from Quebec. It has a good hotel and a number of handsome villas, and is much frequented by tourists and health-seekers during the summer months. Tadousac, apart from its pleasant situation as a watering place is interesting from the circumstance of its having been at an early period the capital of the French settlements, and for a long time one of the chief fur trading posts, as well as the roadstead of French vessels, which anchored here and sent their imports by small boats to Quebec. In 1648, the fur trade of the post gave profits of 40,000 livres on 250,000 livres of fur. It is confidently asserted that here once stood the first stone and mortar building ever erected on the continent of America, the home of father Marquette, who subsequently explored the waters of the Mississippi. The oldest church in Canada is still standing here, and is visited by every tourist who comes to the place. It was built in 1747. Charlevoix, in 1720, thus speaks of it; most of our geographers have placed a town here, where there never was but one French house and some huts of savages, who resorted hither annually to trade with the French when the navigation was free. The missionaries made use of the

opportunity, and when the trade was over, the merchants returned to their homes, the savages to their forests and the Gospel labours followed the last. Tadousac contains 2 churches, 6 stores, 7 boarding houses, and 1 hotel. Salmon and other fish are plentiful in the waters here. It has telephone and telegraph offices. Pop. 611

VALLEYFIELD LA CITE or the **CITY OF SALABERRY DE VALLEYFIELD** is beautifully situated on the south shore of the river St. Lawrence at the head of the Beauharnois canal and the foot of Lake St. Francis. This city was but a few years ago a hamlet; but it now stands as one of the most important manufacturing centres of the Province of Quebec. Incorporated as a town in 1874, the first valuation roll was made in 1875, and it showed a total of \$489,380, with a population of only 3,000 inhabitants, which has steadily increased until, according to census 1911, it has now reached 9,447 inhabitants.

Valleyfield possesses a magnificent water power and many industries of all kinds may be safely built around the city as it offers the capitalist all advantages possible. The city is lit throughout by electricity, and has a first-class water works as well as good local fire and police brigades. On account of the unlimited water power, large mills and manufacturing establishments have been located here. There are several hotels and stores, including two departmental stores. Several lumber mills, gasoline engine works and yacht motors are in operation. The Customs House has large premises in Valleyfield. It is also the judicial seat for the civil and criminal courts for the Judicial District of Beauharnois. It also contains the jail for the same district. It is the seat of the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Salaberry de Valleyfield, and it has a fine Cathedral which is known as L'Eglise de Sainte Cecile de Salaberry de Valleyfield. It also contains a handsome classical and commercial college, several schools, an orphanage or a home for the aged, a kindergarten for the youths, the convent of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, an Ecole Normal, under the tuition of the ladies of the same order, the Hospice Saint Vincent de Paul, also Anglican, Presbyterian and Methodist churches. The Gault Institute, which is situated in Belle-rive Ward, is a fine stone structure. It is used as a high school.

"Le Progres de Valleyfield" is

published weekly and all Montreal newspapers have agencies here. There are two banks, the Hochelaga and La Banque Provinciale du Canada.

The city of Valleyfield has good railway connections to all points by either the Grand Trunk or the New York Central, and in summer market and passenger boats travel to and from Montreal and intermediate points. The Bell Telephone and the Canadian Express as well as the Great North Western Telegraph Co. have offices here. The celebrated Soulanges canal passes but a few miles from Valleyfield.
