There are many pleasures for the Raymonds who have been running Les Glissades des Pays d'en Haut for three generations.

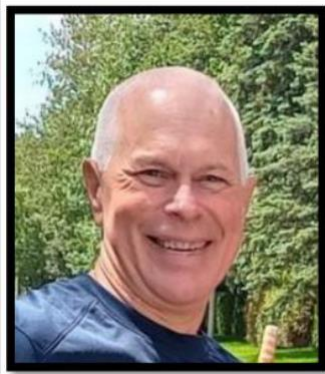

“We have excellent word-of-mouth,” explains Nicolas Raymond, director of operations and co-owner with his father Mercier. “We don’t supply the demand. In fact, we do much less advertising because we are at maximum capacity.”

During the weekdays, the small business founded in 1955 by Arthur and Laurette Raymond mainly receives school groups for sledding, while weekends are more frequented by families.

The sugar shack, which can accommodate about 200 people, is also very popular. "Business has skyrocketed since the pandemic," explains the entrepreneur, who has worked for the company his entire life. "Unfortunately, many sugar shacks closed during the pandemic in the region, so we took advantage of that."

Homemade bobsleighs

Another source of joy for the Raymonds is innovation. The company designs its own bobsleighs. This work fascinates the patriarch, Mercier.

“We have patents,” he explains. “These sleighs are produced by self-molding. We don’t have patents because we want to sell them, but because we want to remain unique. I like inventing things. It’s my greatest pleasure.”



The manufacture of homemade bobsleighs is one of its notable successes. These vehicles are very popular with foreign tourists, whose numbers have increased significantly in recent years. While they accounted for less than 7% of revenue a decade ago, this clientele now represents approximately 20% of income.

Ingenuity is also evident in the solutions for expanding the ski area or improving the slopes and services. "We have snow groomers that we adapt," explains Raymond Mercier. "We're working hard to increase capacity. Retirement is out of the question, even though I'm 75. I can't say I'm working, since I'm having fun. I'm lucky to be with my son. We get along well."

Passing on the passion to employees

The Raymond family tries to pass on this passion to their employees. The two owners constantly emphasize that without their team, success would not be possible.

"From the 2000s onwards, we focused heavily on employee experience," notes Nicolas Raymond. "We reviewed our practices to better accommodate everyone, whether younger or older. Happy employees translate into positive customer satisfaction."

For example, retirees come to work for Les Glissades des Pays d'en Haut a few days a week during the winter. The schedules of students are also adapted to their needs.

"We decided to open a little later in the morning, at 10 a.m.," says Mercier Raymond. "We have a reputation as an employer of choice. We have excellent employees who come back year after year. I call them my treasures, because without them, we are nothing."

The company employs about fifteen people year-round, but around 150 during the peak season, which runs from November to the end of April. Mercier Raymond, who took over the business from their father with his brother in 1979, mentions that the work is intense. "We have a few months to earn our living," he says. "You have to be ready. It's seven days a week. We have a lot of tasks."

However, he believes it's worth the effort. "The key to success is the feeling we give our customers," says Mercier Raymond. "It's not just a snow slide; it's a great time with the family, a chance to let off steam, and a way to forget about the week in Montreal. We're merchants of happiness!"

Family Portrait Jacques Labrosse and his descendany

Jacques Labrosse (009) was born on February 3, 1945, in St-Jérôme, Québec. He was the first child of Jeannette Bertrand and Paul Emile Labrosse. His brother Guy and sister Sylvie (223) were born later. His family moved to Montebello in 1956.



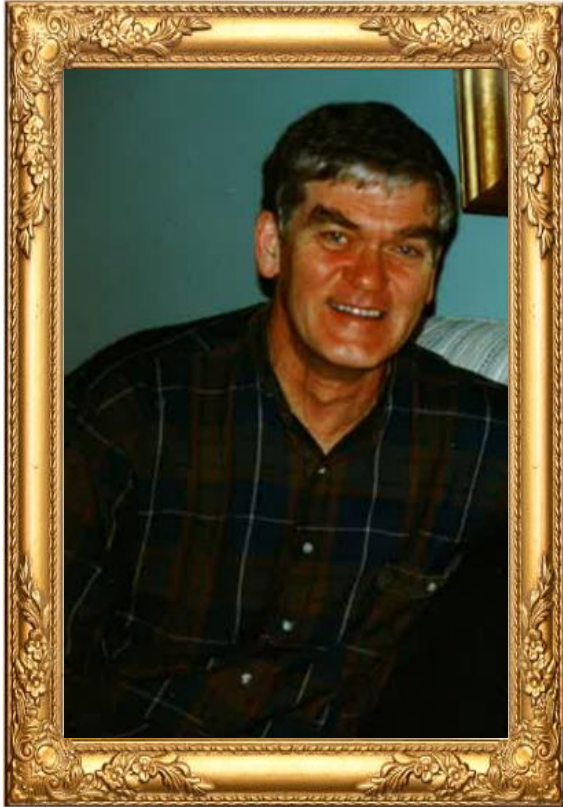

Young Jacques left his village of Montebello to study in Hull (now Gatineau) in the 1960s in order to obtain his teaching certificate (certificate "A") at the École Normale de Hull.

At the age of 23, Jacques married Hélène Latrémouille on July 6, 1968, in the parish of Notre-Dame-de-Grâce, in Hull. Two children were born from this union: Julie and Martin.

After teaching for five years at the elementary level at École Jean XXIII (Gatineau), he became assistant principal at École Labelle (Gatineau) for a few years, then principal, still at the elementary level, in Gatineau, at École Équipage and École Massé.

In 1970-71, Jacques even went to teach for a full year in Bordeaux, France. He also played hockey in that same city as well as in several other cities during his stay in France.

During his career as a school principal, Jacques interacted with thousands of students and hundreds of teachers. He notably established a music program at École Massé in Gatineau. This project was very dear to him: all the children, from kindergarten to grade 6, learned the violin. It was a large-scale project!

Music played a significant role in Jacques' life. During his secondary school studies, he sang in a choir called "Les gais ménestrels". Eventually, this choir became "La génération qui chante", of which Jacques was an active member for several years. Later, in retirement, some of the members of "La génération qui chante" formed the choir "La boîte à chansons", in which Jacques and his daughter Julie participated. With him, any occasion was a good one to sing.

In his second marriage, Jacques married Andrée Careau. He died in Quebec City on March 11, 2023. He was buried in Montebello in the family grave where his father and mother are buried, along with his brother Guy and his sister Sylvie.



Jacques and H el ene's eldest child, Julie Latr emouille Labrosse, was born on September 7, 1973. After completing her primary, secondary, and college studies in her native region, Julie obtained a bachelor's degree with a specialization in psychology from the University of Ottawa (1993-1996), followed by a clinical master's degree in psychology (M.Ps) from Laval University, in Quebec city (1996-1998).

Julie initially worked as a therapist at Maison Fraternit e in Ottawa, with drug-addicted teenagers and their families (2001-2004). Since then, she has been a school psychologist at the elementary and secondary levels at the Centre de services scolaires des Portages de l'Outaouais. A music enthusiast like her father Jacques, Julie sang with the troupe "Intersection" (1990-1995) and later directed for the troupe (1999). She also sang with her father for two years with "La bo te   chansons" in the early 2000s. Finally, Julie married Jos e Gratton on July 7, 2017.

As for Martin, Jacques and H el ene's second son, he was born on March 10, 1976. He studied journalism at the Universit e du Qu ebec   Montr al and has been a television and radio journalist for 25 years. Martin began his career in the Outaouais region, notably working on regional news bulletins for TVA and TQS stations. He then worked on various news programs for the TQS network in Montreal. In 2008, he joined the Radio-Canada newsroom in Montreal.

In 2010, he was asked to lend a hand to Radio-Canada's sports department. His stay was only supposed to last a few weeks. Then, one thing led to another, and he was called upon to cover the Montreal Canadiens playoffs and other sporting events. Since the 2014 Sochi Olympics, Martin has served as lead anchor for the Games. The 2026 Milan-Cortina Winter Olympics were his seventh.

Martin is the father of two sons, Émile Cardinal Labrosse, born on May 17, 2007, and Laurent Cardinal Labrosse, born on September 6, 2010. Like his father and sister, Martin also has a passion for music. He sang in the "Intersection" troupe from 1993 to 1995 with his sister Julie and participated in competitions such as “Cégep en spectacle” and “Ma première place des arts”.

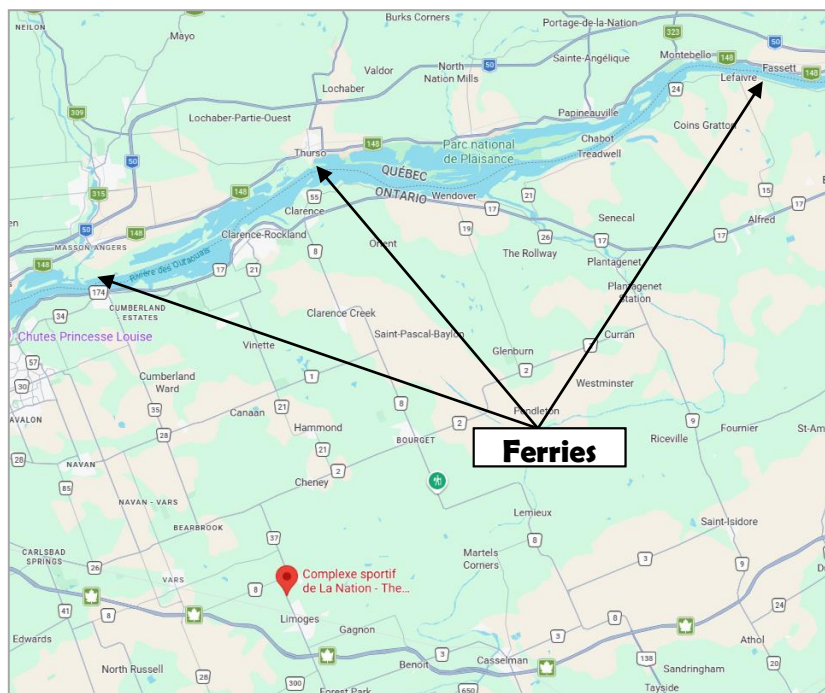
From the Ottawa-Gatineau region:

From the Laurentians and the Outaouais:

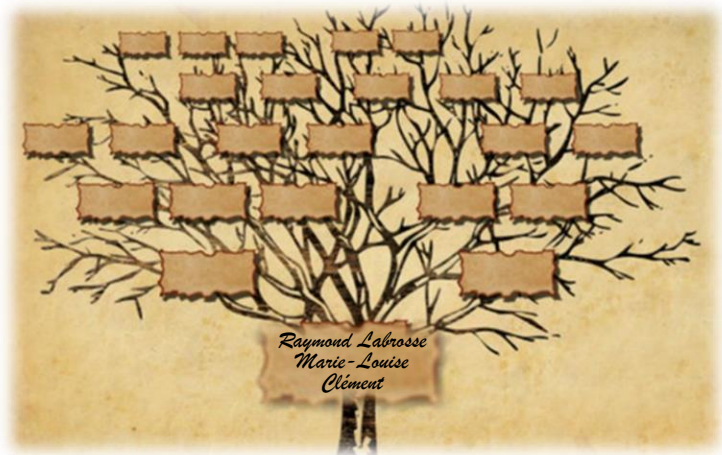

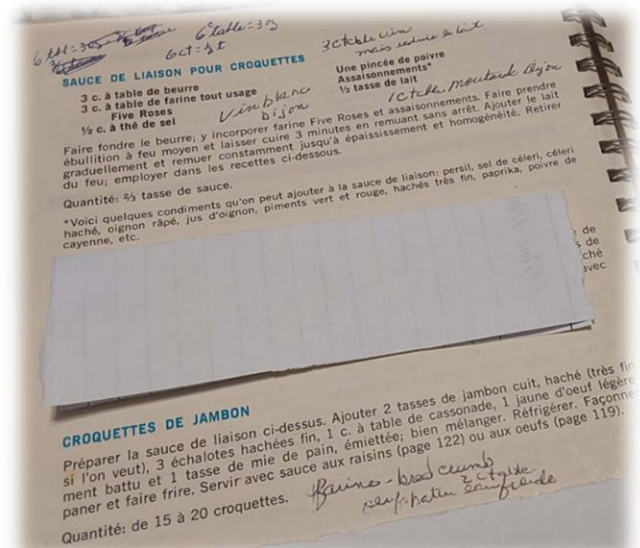
Five Rose Ham Croquettes
