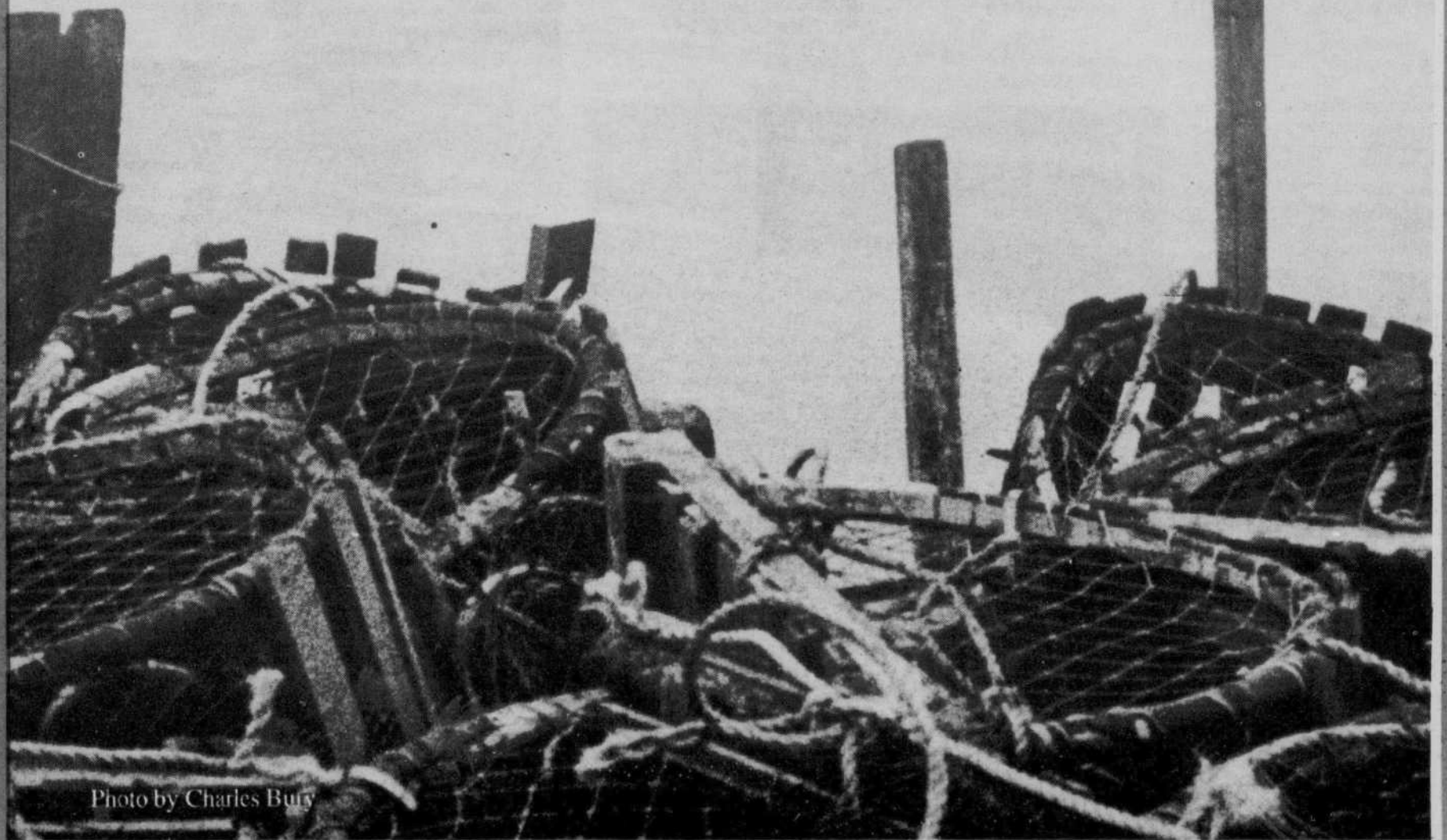

Know your stuff before you order spritzers

The next time you order a wine spritzer, remember the following.

The bartender will appreciate it and you will probably end up with what you wanted.

1. There are white wine spritzers and red wine spritzers.
2. There are dry spritzers and sweet spritzers.
3. Some call for "half and half" - half wine and half soda water.
4. Some call for a slightly altered proportion favoring the wine over the soda.
5. Some spritzers require sparkling mineral water rather than soda.
6. Some even come with a twist of lemon, lime or another fruit.

What I am trying to get across here is that it pays to be specific.

Strictly speaking, a spritzer is generally defined as a drink composed of equal parts white wine, preferably German, and soda water. And although I rarely mix anything with my wine, the art of "blending" has a long and honorable tradition.

In ancient Greece and Rome it was common to add a variety of substances to the evening's wine including pine pitch, spices, boiling water and pepper. Not only did these additives produce a different flavor but they were believed to be essential as preservatives. Remember, the cork hadn't been invented yet.

Wine Bits

In modern times, the practice of flavoring wine can still be seen in the Greek *Retsina* and in the highly popular *Vermouths* of France, Italy and elsewhere. The custom of offering an infant a little red wine with water is also still relatively prevalent in France and Italy and each time you have a glass of *Dubonnet* or *St. Raphael* you are in fact sampling an "aromatized" or flavored wine.

As always, the password here is do what you enjoy. Many cheaper white wines indeed benefit from a little sparkle courtesy of a dash or two of soda water. I caution against the use of citric fruits however, since the acid in the fruit is not conducive to the natural balance the wine maker had intended.

It's a long summer however, and I am sure you will get along just fine. Cheers!

Wildlife themes not unusual

I'm sure you're aware as regular readers, that Charles Bury, editor of the Record, writes a weekly column entitled, On The Wild Side. Most of his writings deal with different species of birds. This gave me the idea for a topical column dealing with wild life on stamps.

One could start with the bird kingdom, splitting the subject up in the following categories, waterfowl, birds of prey, game birds and song birds or other species.

Canada doesn't have an awful lot to offer on the subject but, what there is is quite interesting. Here is a list of Canada's birds on stamps; 1947 airmail 7 cent Canada Goose, 1952 seven cent Canada Goose, 1963 fifteen cent Canada Geese, 1954 fifteen cent Gannet, 1955 five cent Whooping Cranes, 1957 five cent Loon. In 1968 and 1969, four stamps were issued depicting Gray Jays on a 5 cent denomination, the 6 cent shows white throated sparrows, the 10 cent an Ipswich Sparrow and the 25 cent a Hermit Thrush.

It wasn't until 1978 that Canada issued a twelve cent stamp depicting a Peregrine Falcon. This was the beginning of a wild life endangered species series.

The last of the birds to be depicted on Canadian stamps is the 17 cent Prairie Chicken, which was issued in 1980.

The United States has issued many stamps depicting birds. One issue that comes to mind is the fifty stamp sheet showing state birds and flowers. This is a must in any bird or flower topic collection. An assorted selection of owls, American Bald Eagles, ducks and geese may also be found.

Mother and daughter team up for quilting finesse

Tucked away in the quaint village of Trenholm just a few miles outside of Richmond are Mary and Sheila Wintle who are in the business of making quilts for bedspreads and wall decorations.

With the children out of the way and domestic duties at a minimum, Mary Wintle decided to take up quilting nine years ago when her daughter Sheila also became interested.

The Wintles started in the kitchen of their home by making comforters. They spent two years quilting and travelling around the country to workshops and reading manuals to grasp the basics of quilt-making.

"Consumers' buying habits have become more sophisticated," says Sheila Wintle. "They consider quilt-making an art, an investment." The Wintles have sold quilts to corporations in Montreal, as wall décor, and to

many consumers who have since become friends. Since the American Bicentennial in 1976, quilting has made a come-back.

The Wintles fashion five or six full-size quilts each year. A full-size quilt is 110 inches — as large as a king-size bedspread. It takes four months to make one, sometimes working as much as 12 hours a day. "We try to keep strict hours during the weekdays," says Sheila.

Sheila says that she might think of a design for a year before putting it to cloth. The ideas might come from a workshop that the pair have attended, or from nature, tiles and architecture.

To make a quilt natural light is required, which makes the large room on the second floor of their red brick home with bay windows on either side looking out onto a vast field of green a picture-perfect setting.

Once the design for the quilt is made, which requires skills in both mathematics and drafting, pieces of cotton, in a variety of colors and geometrical patterns are appliquéd onto the piece of cotton with a lot of stitching. Anywhere from 2,500 to 4,000 pieces of cotton are sewn onto a quilt.

The worst part of the job says Sheila, "is getting the needle under your nail."

Color coordination is the key to making the perfect quilt. "You're eyes are drawn first by the color, then by the design," says Sheila. "You can't put pastel colors with a bold color." She says they are still learning more about color coordination. "Design is also important so that one design doesn't overpower the other," says Mary.

"The best thing about quiltmaking is that living in the country you are isolated," says Mary. "Quilt-makers are very friendly and out-going people."

Granby hosts song festival

GRANBY — A group of young people involved in various aspects of the music industry all across the country have gathered in Granby for five weeks of workshops on musical production.

And at the end of it all, they hope to have put together enough songs to record an album sometime in the fall.

Jean St-Jules, co-ordinator of the *Atelier Chanson* program, says the five-week "school" should give the 15 young artists a good grounding in "what it takes to make a hit".

The program is funded by grants from both the federal and provincial governments for the occasion of International Youth Year, totalling \$55,500. It is sponsored by the *Festival de la chanson de Granby*, which has been promoting francophone music for several years in the Granby area.

Throughout the five weeks, the participants will attend workshops given by about 16 different guest speakers — workshops on writing, production, dance, marketing and other factors in-

involved in making it in the world of popular music.

The participants are mostly semi-professionals with some experience in performing and/or recording.

"Some of them will be using these workshops as a way to find out what the bugs are in their way of operating," said St-Jules.

The participants were chosen from 60 applicants on the basis on videotapes they submitted as examples of the work they're doing.

One of these young artists is Martin Grégoire, 23, of Sherbrooke.

Grégoire has been trying to make a living as a musician in both Sherbrooke and Montreal, and finding it difficult. He thinks the workshops will give him some advantages.

"We'll learn here in five weeks what other people often have to learn through years of work in the field," he said. All this exposure to the tricks of the trade is "a tremendous opportunity", he said.

Grégoire plays the piano and guitar and experiments with "all sorts" of musical styles.

Chantal Morin came all the way from Vancouver, cancelling some engagements to do music workshops at the University of British Columbia, to attend the *Atelier Chanson* in Granby.

At 22, Morin has just produced her own television music show this spring in B.C. and thinks the *Atelier* is the "perfect environment to rethink the concept of the show" and to decide on new directions to take.

The music presented on the show, *Chantal Morin: La Folie*, is about one-third her own composition, and the rest interpretation. The St-Jerome native sings, plays guitar and piano, and describes the content of her show as "new music with a rock influence

and some jazz".

"The workshops will give us lots of chances to look at what we're doing and see what's wrong if we aren't going where we want to go," she said. The emphasis on marketing is important, she said, because "it takes more than just a nice voice and a pretty smile".

The *Atelier* started Monday, and the first few days were filled with workshops on dance, improvisation, relaxation, diction, and marketing, including a seminar Wednesday by recording artist Michel Lemieux dealing with video as a tool for creation as well as for marketing.

He had words of warning to the young artists regarding the costs of video recording and the importance of presenting the right image of themselves.

Co-ordinator St-Jules says the organizers hope to make the school a permanent summer event, and plan to use the album to be recorded this year to convince the governments and industry to help support it. The album will contain the "most marketable" music that comes out of the *Atelier*, as long as it is in keeping with the Youth Year theme.

McCammon brings new talent to mystery genre

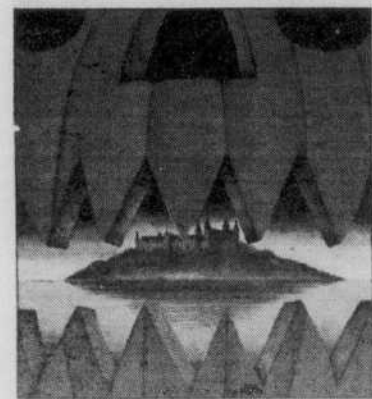
Usher's Passing by Robert R. McCammon (HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON): \$22.95, 401 pp.

Following the themes and creepy crawly mysteries of the American granddaddy of horror fiction, Edgar Allan Poe, **Usher's Passing** is a make-believe continuation of the fortunes of the ill-fated Usher family. If Roderick and Madeline Usher had not expired at the end of "The Fall Of The House Of Usher", what strange familial circumstances might have developed? Newcomer to the horror genre, Robert R. McCammon, makes a leap of a century and more to fuel his contemporary tale of the morbid preoccupations of the Usher heirs, who live in North Carolina in a home like one of the millio-

naire's estates such as "The Breakers" along Rhode Island's famed stretch of coastline.

Usherland is the domain of the current clan of Ushers — father Walen Usher is owner of a 10 billion dollar munitions and arms conglomerate, children Boone and Katt live jetsetter lives of conspicuous desperation, while Rix, the focus for the narrative, struggles to have his vocation as writer allow him to regard the Usher fortune with the disdain of a committed antiwar activist.

With the aging Walen ravaged by the insidious diseases that threatened Poe's creations — here, pathological fear of light of any kind, ultrasensitive hearing in which a whisper becomes an eardrum assaulting crescendo, and ugly dissipation of body and mind — the transfer of power from the Usher patriarch to one of the offspring forms one of the themes of this multi-layered mystery tale.

Son Rix returns to Usherland, with its sinister hunting lodge that has been closed down for years, but which haunts Ushers and locals alike with its morbid properties — it attracts birds and waterfowl, for instance, who fly into its sides dashing their brains out, and meets all of the gothic setting prerequisites as well. Other interesting sidelights to the family saga, include the spectre of a figure known as the Pumpkin Man, who is believed to be capturing and devouring small chil-

dren as some sort of pagan blood rite. The Mountain King is a magical character with supernatural powers who must battle the wicked panther-like creature called 'Greediguts' for the spiritual hold over the North Carolinian backwoods people.

McCammon's skill in keeping the many angles of this gruesome story connected and interesting says much about his achievement in the genre that has seen Stephen King and Peter Straub hold sway in recent years. Robert R. McCammon's addition of the historical link to Poe's masterworks of the macabre forges a new link in the growing horror chain of skilled authors of pop fear.

Elbowing The Seducer by T. Gertler (PENGUIN): \$7.95, 306 pp.

A number of bright fresh hopes in the publishing game are seeing their work made available in fairly cheap, handsome paperback editions, under the imprint of the Penguin Contemporary Fiction series. T. Gertler, whose first published story, "In Case Of Survival" appeared in two story anthologies in 1980, is a New York City writer with a breezy, slick style that celebrates the frantic pace of the Big Apple. **Elbowing The Seducer** focuses on the lives of a small enclave of people caught up in the literary life in a New York City that appears to

have a parochial, small-town quality where everyone seems to know everyone else.

The featured players in Gertler's drama are Dina Reeve, a naive, but not innocent young woman who has written a short story that she is attempting to have published. Her pursuit of the glo-

ry of being in print leads her to the lair of one Howard Ritchie, editor of a small magazine who has a penchant for talent of both a literary and sexual nature. Further complicating this cleverly concocted menage is Vincent Bask, a first novelist of Ritchie's acquaintance, and Newman Sykes, a version of American critic Edmund Wilson, whose acerbity in print is only exceeded by his cutting personal put-downs of authors he encountered during his extensive social calendar rounds.

The book is about creativity and social pressures, as reflected in Dina Reeve's homelife with Larry, her partner who refuses to work — "Larry says all an artist should do is his own work" — "owning stuff is a joke". Their love/hate relationship becomes complicated when Dina begins an affair with Ritchie, the randy editor of **Rosemary**, a forum for new talent. Filled with the rhythms and patterns of daily life in the city, **Elbowing The Seducer** also celebrates the strange sexual rites of Americans caught up in this world on the fringes of the publishing industry.

The writing by Gertler is witty and sharply observant of these characters for whom literature is life and vice-versa. They move from typewriter to tryst with barely a pause to reflect on the consequences to their families — Ritchie and his wife Suzanne are both engaged in affairs with their daughter Matty caught in the middle. Passions aroused by the couplings in this madcap romp become so heightened that the story almost ends in tragedy, although the comic vision has been so consistent that Gertler's climax has the reader waiting for some kind of final comic twist. **Elbowing The Seducer** if proof positive that these Penguin editions will be presenting entertaining and important fiction to readers who might pass on expensive texts from unknown names.

Midnight Oil **RED SAILS IN THE SUNSET** (COLUMBIA)

With a mind-set resembling that of other bands half a world away, such as Split Enz, Men At Work, or Mental As Anything, Australia's Midnight Oil launch both a new album and a North American tour at this very moment. Bringing their #1 album from Aussieland, Midnight Oil is not an unfamiliar entity to rock fans. One look at 6-foot-6 lead singer Peter Garrett in their videos is enough of an indicator that Midnight Oil is not your standard brand rock crew. Their tour covers several New York dates and many in California, which should be a more welcome venue for the



controversial 12 a.m. Oil.

Songs that are provocative in their enigmatic imagery are the order of the day on **RED SAILS IN THE SUNSET** — "Jimmy Sharman's Boxers" seems to be a protest against a homeland practice of matching boxing-gloved kangaroos in a blood sport akin to bullfighting or cock-fighting. The shark lyrics are hammered out against a Pink Floydish conceptualized rock idiom. There's no chance here of material dragging because of its mundane, monotonous direction. Sprinkled in among the arresting songs are bits of nonsense such as "Bakerman", a Purcell-like coda that closes the first side.

A tune called "Who Can Stand In The Way" seems to reflect on the Australian past with the first fleet sailing in filled with convicts, and then in a wink to cast a jaundiced eye on the current scene Down Under: "Now choppers strafe the supermarket sky and people wonder why". Just as quickly Midnight Oil turns to encompass all western society: "But we killed our first born and we slashed and we burned / And we sold off the paddocks and we raped and we gouged / On the wings of a six-pack will we ever learn".

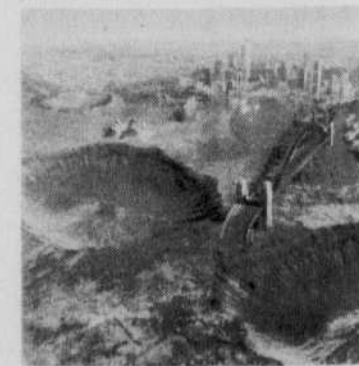
On a track like "Kosciusko" the frame of reference is wholly Australian, so much of the impact of Midnight Oil's message is diminished. But throughout this whimsical, baroque album the creativity of guitarist/keyboard man Jim Mognie is evidence — it's his name that shows up on the composing credits on most tracks, in collaboration with various other Oilers. An album to be reckoned with.

Corey Hart **BOY IN THE BOX** (AQUARIUS-CAPITOL)

Montreal popthrob Corey Hart has been hustled into Le Studio to capitalize on his Grammy and re-

cent single excitement, resulting in **BOY IN THE BOX**. The album is produced by Phil Chapman, Jon Astley and Hart, and features more of the curled upper lip stance that mocks the Elvis/James Dean sullenness that Corey Hart manages to convey even in his music. Only Sting has a more aloof, standoffish manner about his ballads, and here Hart puts much of the sneer to work on several tracks that appear to openly emulate Police's errant solo performer who electrified the Wembley watchers of Live-Aid.

In the beaty portion of this fare, "Silent Talking" is an acrobatic vocal workout with a simple lyric and a hypnotic rhythm section highlighted by Ruce Moffet's percussion. Ditto the title track with its reverberating clanging and strange backing effects, and "Komrade Kieve", a puzzling ditty that weaves images about Mother Russia into a snappy, moody pop song. Current single that has jumped out of this box with jackrabbit swiftness is "Never Surrender", an attempt to make Hart into a Baron Longfellow with gonads. The East's answer to Bryan Adams's rocking seems to be the pouty sensuality of Corey Hart, with both of these Canadian artists making considerable noise in the U.S.



Golod, Brianski combine for excellent Arts Sutton exhibit

SUTTON — Anatole Golod came a long, hard way to exhibit at Arts Sutton through August 4. Don't miss him.

The 49-year-old Golod represents two strong traditions in Russian culture - the haunting, semi-abstract painting style descended from Wassily Kandinsky, and the tradition of self-exile for the sake of creative freedom.

Born in Moscow, Golod has been in Canada only five years. He did exhibit in the Soviet Union, and even achieved some degree of acclaim; but the Kandinsky tradition and indeed all abstract art is suspect to the czars of a culture founded on 'socialist realism.' As recently as the middle 1970s, outdoor exhibitions of abstract art were permitted one day, crushed by bulldozers the next, after official censors found their style and subject matter 'decadent.'

Golod and his wife are engineers for a living, a profession adopted in Golod's case because an abstract painter cannot make a living in the USSR. Today, engineering enables them to travel, borrowing inspiration from places as diverse as Paris and Israel.

But Golod remains clearly and obviously a Russian painter. His moods and colors are dark, his shapes looming, ominous. His version of the much-painted Notre Dame cathedral in Paris is radically different from anything sold along the Left Bank — a tortured gaze upward at a fascinating ruin, that seems to bring a whole civilization down with it.

As might be expected of an engineer, Golod most often focusses upon architecture. Sometimes he offers just a roofline, sometimes a whole street, but always, the shapes of the buildings dominate. Open areas are few and cramped. His human figures could all be prisoners.

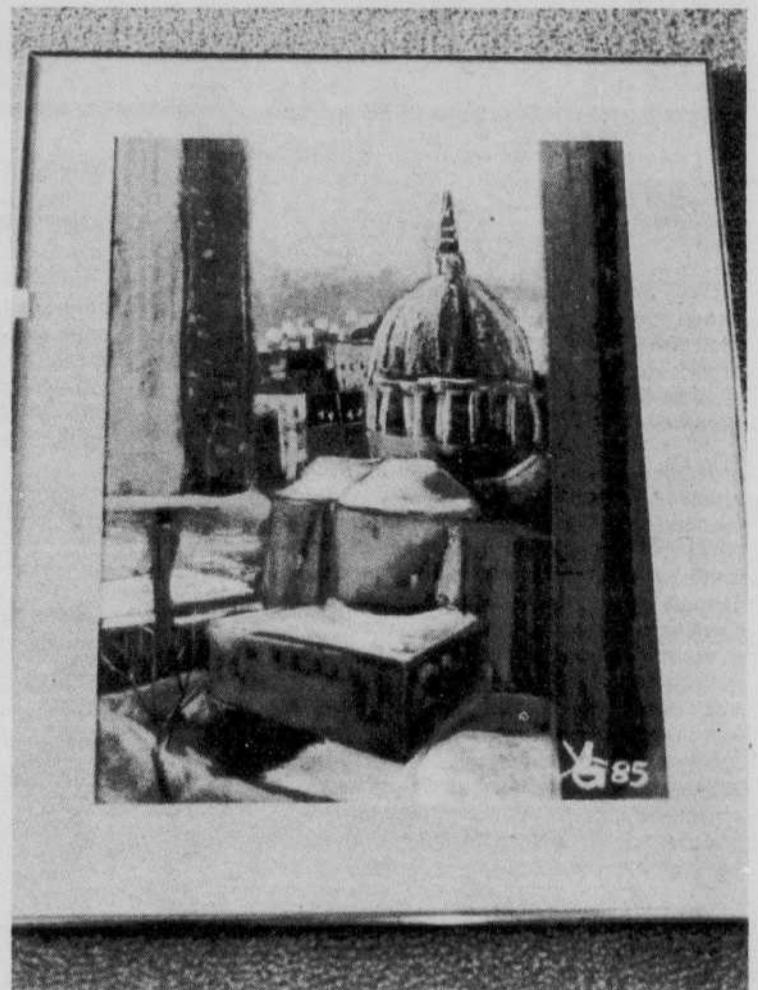
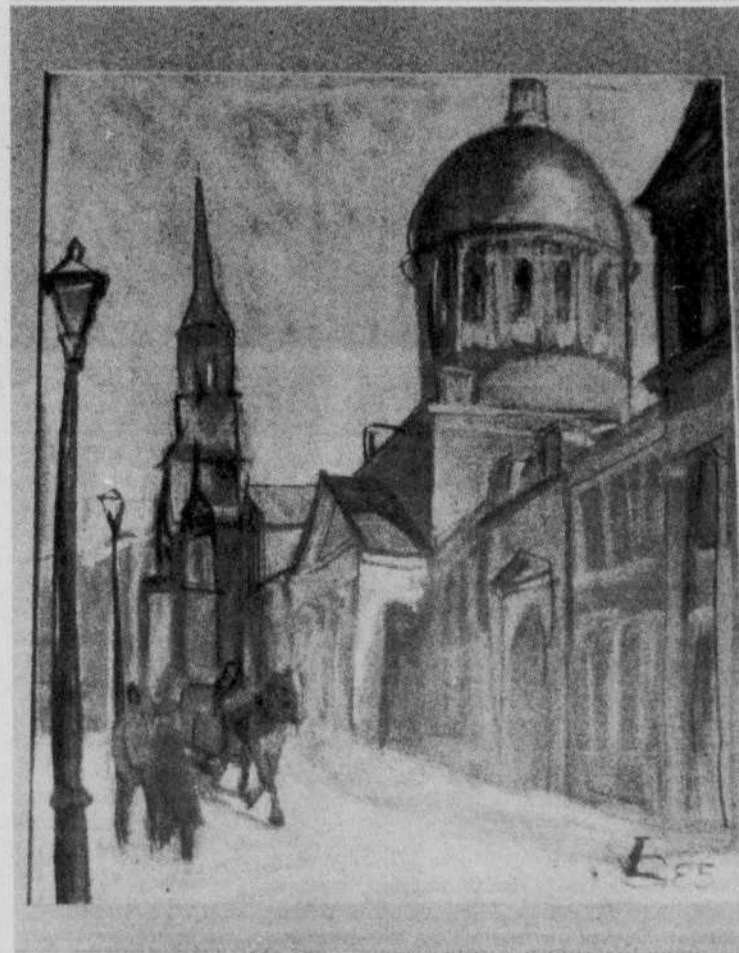
Depressing? Perhaps — but Golod is still alive himself, free at last. The optimistic element in his work is that it exists at all. It's strong stuff, worth collecting not only for itself, but also as symbol and reminder that the veneer of the Soviet state and the culture carried on beneath it are often two different matters.

Montreal artist Rita Brianski provides counterpoint good cheer with numerous figure-drawings. Technically, Brianski can draw with anyone. What's more, she works with real love for her subjects. If Golod avoids the human, Brianski emphasizes human vulnerability. Her women are good-looking and naked without being self-conscious sex-symbols — but as two of them walk away, one remembers that they could be pursued, and somehow thinks of

refugees. Her guitar-player seems to make a cocoon of her music.

Seldom has Art Sutton mounted as strong an exhibition, with two

featured artists so well contrasting and complementing. The doors will be open Wednesday through Friday for the next two weeks, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Okay folks, here we go. I hope you enjoy this one cause now I'm gone — on holiday actually — so for the next two weeks you won't have ol' Mikey to kick around anymore. However, there's all kinds of things happening in the music world around here these days and here's some of it.

At the Orford Arts Centre, another week of marvelous musical events are lined up beginning tonight with a **Festival Choral de la Francophonie**. Three choral groups — from France, Belgium and Switzerland — are performing at the **Salle Gilles Lefebvre** beginning at 8 p.m. Tomorrow, the **Jeunesse Musicale World Orchestra**, under the direction of **Michael Tabachnik** will perform in concert beginning at 8 p.m. Featured selections will include work by **Tchaikovsky, Villa-Lobos and Bernstein**. Entrance fees for both the above shows are \$10. Exhibitions/Events

The **Piggery Theatre** enjoys the return of **Renée Papineau-Christie**, a veteran artist who has exhibited extensively in both Canada and England. **Papineau-Christie** will be exhibiting until August 3 in the lobby of the theatre.

Next Friday, July 26, by the way, is the annual **Sherbrooke Hospital Benefit Theatre Night**, so if you are planning to drop by the theatre and would like to help out, that's the time to do it. The play, **What I Did last Summer** is a good one.

Out at **Arts Sutton** the Slavic connection is in full view as painter **Anatole Golod** and etching artist **Rita Brianski** open tomorrow. **Golod** is a Soviet exile whose abstract style put him in artistic limbo in his homeland. **Brianski**, presently teaching at the **Sadye Bronfman Centre**, has studied in Montreal and New York and has exhibited widely in Canada, the United States and Europe. At the **Arts Sutton Summer School**, the workshops underway this week include: **Drawing for Beginners** on July 20-21, featuring **Rosalyn Swartzman**, who will start folks off with all the necessary basics. On July 22-24 **Swartzman** takes a group out for an **Outdoor Sketching Trip**. July 25-26 features a **piano workshop** featuring **William Stevens** a concert pianist who has performed at **Carnegie Hall** as well as in **London, Paris and New Zealand**. He is the former host of **CBC's Let's Talk Music** show and regularly leads workshops in **Ontario, Quebec and the U.S.** July 25-27, **Rita Brianski** leads a workshop on **Landscape Painting**. Finally, over at the **Beaulne Museum** in **Coaticook**, the work of **Jeannine Bourret** continues to delight with its whimsical look at the world of nature.

Movies

Over at the **Cinema Capitol** the wonderfully entertaining **Back to the Future** is being held over for one more week and I'm not surprised. It is a wonderful bit of fantasy. **Michael J. Fox** proves his comedic abilities in this story of a modern kid accidentally sent back in time to when his parents were boppers and somehow manages to screw up their first meeting — thereby threatening his own existence. Meanwhile, his young and delicious looking mom has the hots for him in a very big way. The movie is very silly, but my Lord what a good time it is! Masterful performances by **Fox, Christopher Lloyd** as the mad scientist, **Lea Thompson** as young mom and **Crispin Glover** as the incredibly nerdy father make this flie a real delight.

Mad Max — Beyond Thunderdome returns for another week at the **Carrefour**.

Nothing new over to **Cowansville** way either as **Roger Moore** and **Grace Jones** star in the James Bond thriller **A View to a Kill** as the main feature with **Steve King's Cat's Eye** kicking things off a 7:15.

Down at the **Merril's Showplace Cinemas**, they're finally getting rid of the stuff that's been kicking around all this time. What they have instead is **Mad Max — Beyond Thunderdome** with an emotionless **Mel Gibson** as the hero and a dynamic **Tina Turner** as the power-hungry antagonist. WHAT'S ON

Television

Well, I don't know about you, but I'm impressed as hell with what I saw on that *Live-Aid* marathon last week, and while I don't want to overlook the incredible contributions of some extremely gifted artists, I think it's fair to point out that scores of faceless, tireless technicians were ultimately responsible for bringing us what must rank as the greatest TV event in history. What a show! It will be a long time before we see its like again, I'm afraid.

Anyway, back to the routine world of summer television.

Tomorrow afternoon at 2, Vermont ETV brings us a real cute little British comedy in the form of *The Trouble with Angels* starring Hayley Mills and Rosalind Russell in a story of the antics of the inmates of a private Catholic girls school.

Later that evening at 9, Audrey Hepburn is featured in her Oscar-winning performance as a dissatisfied princess in *Roman Holiday*. While in Rome incognito, a young princess yearns for a more normal life and meets and falls in love with a lowly newspaperman (Gregory Peck).

Also at 9, on Radio-Québec, *L'histoire en jugement* takes a look at General Maxime Weygand, the French hero of the First World War whose brilliant career was marred by the horrible debacle proceeding the French surrender to Nazi Germany in 1940.

At midnight, Olivia Newton-John stars in a silly bit of fluff called *Xanadu*, wherein the Australian songstress plays a Muse, one of Zeus' daughters who descends to earth to make people's fantasies come true. Hmm!

On Sunday at 8, one of Canadian TV's best shows *Seeing Things* returns to the CBC with Louis Del Grande portraying the klutzy, clairvoyant newsman who always finds himself involved with murder and mayhem. If you haven't already made this show a habit, now's a good time to start.

At 9, still on CBC David Suzuki's *A Planet for the Taking* takes a look at *The Mythmakers* — the incredible diversity of religious beliefs that man has come up with to help explain the world around him. Suzuki also traces the history of western science and explores its deep roots in the Judeo-Christian tradition.

Also at 9 on Channel 12, Merete Van Kamp stars in the two-part dramatization of Judith Krantz's best-selling soap epic *Princess Daisy*. The conclusion airs Monday at 9. This is romantic nonsense at its best/worst with a story of the difficult life of a beautiful young woman — the daughter of a Russian jet-setter prince and an American movie star.

On Monday, Vermont ETV's *The Heart of the Dragon* presents its final episode. Tonight's show is called *Trading*, and it deals with recent attempts in China to encourage and develop trade both internally and externally even to the point of encouraging a little private enterprise — something that would have been considered heretical only a few years back.

At 9, Smithsonian World presents *The Last Flower*, a look at the attempt now underway to restore Leonardo Da Vinci's fading masterpiece *The Last Supper*.

At midnight, on channel 12, Natalie Wood, Rita Moreno and George Chakeris star in *West Side Story*, the musical hit about rival New York street gangs and how the conflict between them spoils a young romance.

At midnight on Channel 6, James Cagney, Humphrey Bogart and Pat O'Brien head a superior cast in *Angels with Dirty Faces*, a 1938 morality play about two friends, one of whom becomes a gangster and the other a priest. The two men compete for the hearts and minds of an impressionable group of boys who have come to idolize the gangster.

On Tuesday, Vermont ETV's NOVA looks at *Edgerton and His Incredible Seeing Machines*. This is a charming and informative portrait of Dr. Harold Edgerton, the man who invented the electronic strobe enabling mankind to see the previously unseeable.

On Wednesday, still on Vermont ETV, the National Geographic Special presents *Born of Fire*, a look at the science of plate tectonics, which explains how the slowly shifting surface of the earth is broken into 12 'plates' which constantly exert pressures on each other and can build mountains, cause earthquakes and

otherwise generally contribute to all kinds of commotion.

At 11, John Wayne and Lauren Bacall star in *Blood Alley*, the story of two Americans trying to escape from the Chinese via a river that leads to Hong Kong.

At midnight on CBC, the Lane Sisters, Claude Rains and John Garfield star in a fun, believable yarn about *Four Daughters*, their father and growing up.

On Thursday at 11, Kirk Douglas stars as *Spartacus* in the epic tale about the Roman slave who led a rebellion against the empire. Laurence Olivier also stars.

Finally, at midnight, Channel 12 presents *Billy Dee Williams as Scott Joplin: King of Ragtime* in a grim tale of the composer's life from the early days in southern cat-houses to his tragic death.

Radio

At 6:30 tonight, on CBC Stereo, journalist and big mouth Barbara Amiel spends an hour playing some of her favourite music for us in a continuation of that ridiculous *Music in My Life* series. It appears that Canada's prettiest fascist likes Chopin, Beethoven and Paul Robeson — but Babs, Robeson was a dirty little commie, remember.

On *Variety Tonight* this evening at 7:30 on CBC Radio, the great Quebec fusion group Uzeb is featured in a concert from Vancouver that was rated one of the ten best in that city in 1984, ranking up their with shows by the likes of Bruce Springsteen.

At 8:05 *Friday Night Pops* brings us a special treat in the form of a performance by the 'great Dane' Victor Borge. Borge is one of the wittiest and enjoyable entertainers in the business and this program includes some classic Borge sketches as well as new material.

At 11:30 on CBC Stereo, *Vanishing Point* presents *Sticks* based on a story by Karl Edward Wagner. A young couple discover an abandoned old farm house in upstate New York that is surrounded by intricate sculptures made of twisted sticks in the shape of crucifixes and other intriguing symbols. It seems the house sits on top of an ancient burial chamber built by a prehistoric cult that practiced human sacrifice. While exploring the basement, the couple learns the cult may still be around.

Richard Wagner's *Ring* cycle continues this *Saturday Afternoon at the Opera* with *Siegfried*, the son of Siegmund and Sieglinde who slays the dragon, retrieves the ring and sets off to rescue the lovely Brunnhilde. The opera is performed by the San Francisco Ope-

ra under the capable direction of the wonderful Edo de Waart beginning at 1 p.m. on CBC Stereo.

At 10:10 on CBC Radio, *Anthology* offers a portrait of Canadian poet P.K. Page who first began publishing in the mid-40s in small magazines and has churned out an enviable reputation. A world traveller, Page has lived in Australia, Brazil and Mexico, where her husband served as Canadian ambassador.

On Sunday at 1:30 p.m. *The Entertainers* looks at women in music with host Sylvia Tyson interviewing such stars as Sheena Easton, Joan Baez, Loretta Lynn and Martha Reeves. Women dominate the pop charts in a way they never have before and in recent years have been able to control virtually all aspects of their careers. Tyson discusses the implications with these people.

At 4:05 on CBC Radio *Sunday Matinée* presents *The House on the Hill* by Paul King. On Good Friday, 1962 Edmonton golf pro Frank Willey disappeared and was never seen or heard from again. Despite the lack of a body, two men soon faced murder charges in connection with the case.

At 7:05 on CBC Stereo, *The Scales of Justice* takes a look at the death of American comedian John Belushi in *The Extradition of Cathy Smith*. If ever there was a loser in this world, Cathy Smith has to rank right up there. In an interview with the National Enquirer, of all things, Smith told reporters she had injected Belushi with his fatal dose of heroin and cocaine thus implicating herself in a murder. The program looks at the extradition hearing and at the international wheeling and dealing that went on just beneath the surface.

At 8:05 on *Testament* freelance journalist J.J. McColl interviews ex-priests and nuns who discuss why *Leaving the Order* was necessary for their personal salvation. Soon after the dramatic winds of change that swept through the Catholic Church after the Vatican II Council, the forces of reaction began to make headway once again in the Church. Many young, idealistic and socially-committed religious people soon found that their commitment was not being shared by the hierarchic authorities. As one man puts it, 'the Church left us.'

On *Booktime* starting Monday at 10:17 on CBC Radio, Danish author Karen Blixen, who wrote under the name Isak Dinesen is featured with a reading of her best-known work *Out of Africa*, reminiscences of her 13 years on a coffee plantation in Africa. The book will be read in 15 parts by Betty Phillips.

At 10:32 Canadian conductor and author Harvey Sachs takes a look at the life and times of one of this century's most influential musicians, Arturo Toscanini. This is the first of a five-part series.

Barachois town's 18th-century style restored

PASPEBIAC — Over 200 years ago the first Baie des Chaleurs harbor villages were built on and around permanent rivermouth sandbars the settlers called *Barachois*, where they could easily drag their tiny boats above the tideline on the beach.

Today one of the biggest urban sandbars, Paspebiac Bank, is gradually being restored to its early appearance as an 18th century fishing port, while the adjacent modern harbor is home to a busy 20th century fishery.

Housed in some of the original Jersey-Islanders' fishing companies' buildings, the Paspebiac Bank Historic Site is owned by the Quebec Ministry of Cultural Affairs and operated by the town. The interpretation centre welcomes summer visitors for a glimpse at fishing as a way of life both then and now.

Visited for centuries by Basques and Normans after the

wealth of cod and other fish, Paspebiac was one of the first Gaspé Peninsula towns settled by the Europeans, with the first permanent residents setting up homesteads along the bank in the 1750s.

CHANNEL ISLANDERS

Many of the early Gaspé settlers were from the Channel Islands of Jersey and Guernsey at the mouth of the North Sea between England and France. It was two families of Jerseymen, the Leboutilliers and Robins, who created the Gaspé's — and perhaps Canada's — first one-company villages. They became barons in the eyes of industry and robbers in the eyes of the villagers.

Those perceptions remain, as does one of the companies, now called Robin, Jones. Indeed, mention the name Robin to René Lévesque, a native of the nearby Robin town of New Carlisle, and he will look at you sideways and

not talk to you all evening. It happened to me once.

The premier remembers because the Jersey fish companies had a hold on the 'coasters' so tight it got passed on from generation to generation. Sons would inherit their fathers' company bills along with the family boat and dog. Here's how the system worked:

THE COMPANY STORE

The company had the only store in town so anything bought came from them. They also had a local monopoly on fish buying, processing and selling. Everyone had to buy and sell at the company store. When money ran low — oftener then than now — the company extended credit.

When the fish came in, the harvest was turned over to the

company at its warehouse next to the store and the fisherman "settled up" his account. Settling up usually meant bringing the debt down a bit, but since the company both held the monopolies and kept the books, it was nearly impossible to get clear once and for all. And if you did, a bad fishing year would put you right back in.

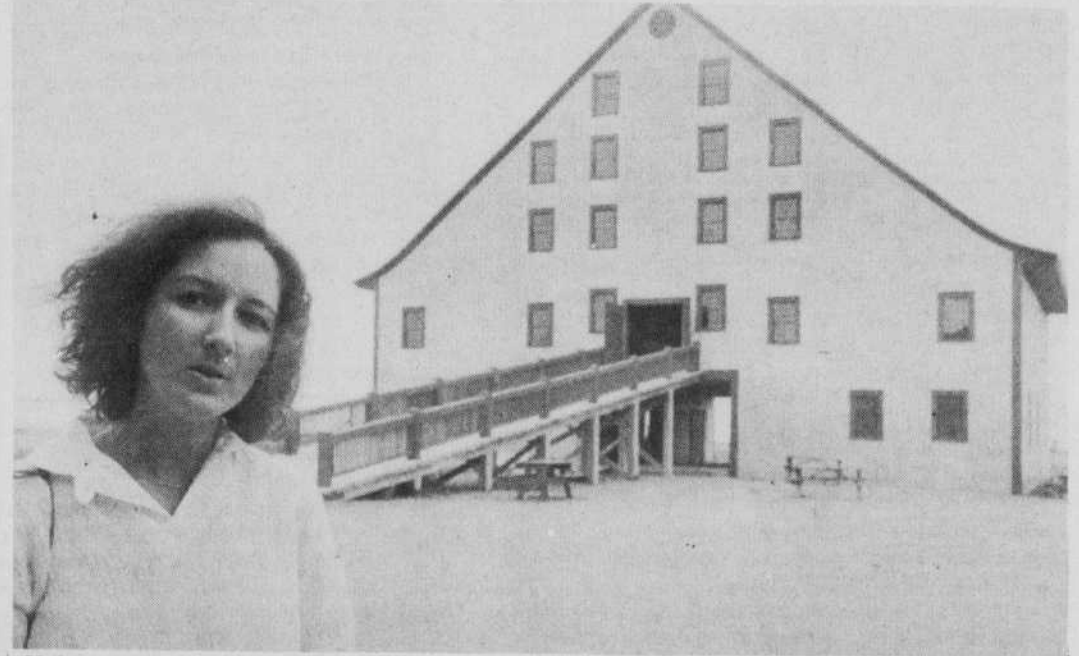
BILINGUAL GUIDES

At Paspebiac Bank, bilingual guides will explain all this and much more about the old ways and the old days. In the Leboutillier Brothers main building (*Le BB*, the locals curiously call it) are displays of the fisherman's methods then and now; there are more displays and a modest souvenir and handicrafts shop beside it in a Robin building (somewhere along the line Paspe-

biac got big enough to support two scarcely-competing monopolies, although that seems like it should be a contradiction in terms).

Alongside the historic displays stand exhibits of the new fishing ways. Hooks and lines aren't enough any more; today's commercial fisherman can use any of a dozen net and trap systems and may have radar, sonar, a depth sounder and a high-tech satellite-earth navigation system to keep off the rocks and beaches.

Only a few steps from the fisheries museum stands the modern harbor of Paspebiac. There, on the right day, a visitor can watch the modern men and boats. And on any day, you can gaze at the sky and dream of any era, past or future.

Fur trade returns to Montreal in seven exhibits

LACHINE (CP) — The fur trade has not attracted so much attention in the Montreal area since 1821 when the Northwest and Hudson Bay companies merged and the last of the big canoe brigades left the former outpost of Lachine, now a Montreal suburb, for the Lakehead.

But this summer, the fur trade returns to the limelight and is the subject of seven local exhibits to be shown throughout the summer.

Much public interest was aroused at a recent McGill University gathering of fur-trade historians — the largest-ever — and the arrival in late May of scores of young people in canoes from Quebec and Ontario.

They were among hundreds who belong to groups dedicated to reliving the drama of the fur trade, an industry that resulted in the discovery of much of

the North American interior, altered the commercial structures of the world and decimated many Indian tribes in the process.

PADDLED CANOES
Central to the drama were the *voyageurs* — mainly French-Canadians and Mohawks, who paddled the massive *maitres*, or Montreal canoes, for the Northwest Company.

When the fur brigades left Montreal for '*le pays d'en haut*' — literally up-country — they were heading anywhere from the head waters of the Mississippi to the Lakehead and Northwest Territories.

Eight to 10 voyageurs were crammed in each 11-metre, 225-kilogram canoe. They paddled 35 to 40 strokes a minute, 16 hours a day for weeks at a time, carrying the canoes with tonnes of supplies over dozens of portages en route.

DIED YOUNG
Many died young from overwork. Yet

one man, old at 54, wrote proudly:

"I could carry, paddle, walk and sing with any man I ever saw.

"I have been 24 years a canoeman and 41 in service.

"I could sing 50 songs. I have saved the lives of 10 voyageurs. I have had 12 wives and six racing dogs.

"I spent all my money on pleasure and if I were young again I would spend my life the same way. There is no life as happy as the *voyageur's*."

They sounded like giant men, but at a new Parks Canada Fur Trade Museum in Lachine one exhibit reveals that voyageurs could not be taller than five feet seven inches, or weigh more than 145 pounds. Bigger men would take up too much space in the canoe.

BUSINESS RISKY
It was a risky business for the traders, too. It took up to four years to show a profit on an initial investment if all went well — and a lot could go wrong.

In a special exhibit at Place Youville in Old Montreal is a game which is a kind of fur trader's roulette. Spin of the wheel of fortune and it may stop at: "Your canoe overturns in the rapids. You lose a year's supply in furs."

Or: "A hungry wolverine has eaten all the food in your cache."

Yet another spin, and: "Freeze-up came early. You can't get supplies to your post."

The, you win: "Tail winds speed you early to your destination."

PROFITS SIZABLE

And perhaps: "One of your rival's voyageurs gets drunk and insults the chief. The band now does business only with you."

The profits could be impressive.

The Chateau de Ramezay, near City Hall, was once the Montreal offices of *La Compagnie des indes*, the French company which controlled the fur trade until France was driven from the continent in 1763. Inside is a panelled salon which would not be out of place in a European palace.

There is more documentation on *La Compagnie des indes* in a special display at McGill University's McLennan Library. The display is devoted to company founder John Law, an 18th-century Scottish financial genius who financed long-term commercial ventures

with the sale of shares and lotteries.

FOUNDED MCGILL
McGill University was founded, incidentally, with a fortune left by fur trader James McGill.

At the Quebec national archives on Notre Dame street, another exhibit includes a letter from La Salle to Cadillac, French governor at Niagara and founder of Detroit, asking for supplies for an expedition to the Mississippi and a 1728 deed in which Philippe Dagneau ceded Toronto to his brother.

At the Old Fort on St. Helen's Island, a major exhibition of early maps shows how discoveries by the fur traders expanded knowledge about the continent.

SHOWS ARTIFACTS

There is an excellent display of native artifacts at McGill's McCord Museum, as well as a special exhibit of photographs of northern Canada between 1904 and 1931 by Bert Coward of Reveillon Freres Trading Company, giving a down-to-earth view of fur traders.

Guided tours of Old Montreal visit places associated with the fur trade and Betty Guernsey's excellent guidebook, *Montreal on Foot*, highlights other sights around Lachine, one of the prettiest suburbs on Montreal Island.

And for a thoroughly commercial, but fun re-enactment of a fur trade banquet, there is *Le Festin des gouverneurs* at the Old Fort on St. Helen's Island.

The various events — tours, exhibits and banquet — continue all summer in Montreal.

Tourist industry begins to tap seniors market

OTTAWA (CP) — The tourism industry is slowly waking up to a new potential growth market — senior travellers.

They're people like Stuart Cranston, 65, who got the travel bug after her four children, including Canadian figure skating champion Toller Cranston, grew up.

Or Claire MacDonald, 62, now retired as a National Film Board photo librarian.

"Seniors may not be taking as many trips as the rest of the population, but they tend to go on longer trips and to far-away destinations," says Gordon Taylor, manager of research and analysis for Tourism Canada.

Cranston has visited Mexico, Lebanon, Greece and Afghanistan. She says she and husband, Monte, 71, have "no desire to go down to Florida for six

months; we're interested in seeing different places."

MacDonald's travel list includes Hawaii, Aruba, Tokyo, New Zealand and Norway. She's also sailed down China's Yangtze River, travelled through the Canadian Arctic, and last year saw the Passion Play in Oberammergau, West Germany.

EXPECTS INCREASE

While Taylor doesn't expect a real boom, he says there is bound to be a steady increase in seniors travelling as the overall population ages.

About 2.5 million Canadians are 65 or older, and it's estimated that by the year 2000, seniors will make up 18 to 20 per cent of Canada's population.

Special prices for seniors are encouraging the growth of the market segment.

Airlines, bus companies, hotels and railways across Canada and the United States offer them all sorts of discounts — sometimes as much as 70 per cent off regular rates.

In the United States, the American Association of Retired Persons lists about 18 million members 50 or older. It runs its own travel service, offering substantial discounts on tours designed for the elderly.

Association spokesman Hal Norvell says tour operators are beginning to realize senior travellers have a wide range of interests and budgets, and are flexible with their time.

They can take advantage of travel opportunities ranging from fully escorted motorcoach tours to cruises and special New Year's Eve tours.

Programs where seniors can combine travel and educational courses are also popular.

New York's Grand Circle Travel Co. is perhaps the pioneer in the senior travel field.

It organized its first senior-citizen trip in 1958 and has since been

doing nothing but, restricting its clientele to the over-55 set.

"We don't see huge peaks and valleys in the seniors' market, as compared with other segments of the population," says Raymond Tannebaum, Grand Circle's president.

"It's not a market

that is directly affected by the economic conditions as are other travellers."

Tannebaum believes many of his clients are catching up on the travel experience they might have missed when they were busy raising a family, or returning to places they

visited briefly in the past.

"When they do return, they see it like they never did before," he says.

"They have more time to enjoy the atmosphere and take in the recreational and cultural activities of the area."

Hawaii ready after long air strike

KIHEI, Hawaii (CP)

— Tourists seeking a Hawaiian getaway this summer or early autumn may stumble on the bargain of their lives as the popular resort islands recover from the effects of a month-long airline strike.

The 29-day United Airlines strike cut by more than eight per cent the number of visitors to Honolulu and Waikiki on the island of Oahu, Hawaiian tourism officials say.

On the island of Maui, known as the Valley Isle, hotels, condominiums, restaurants and shops are slashing prices up to 50 per cent off regular season rates. Car rental wars have cut the price of a compact with unlimited mileage for a week to \$70 or less.

Most of the local airlines have deals that include round-trip airfare between Honolulu and Maui, a car and a hotel or condominium for incredibly low

prices.

Mid-Pacific Air, a major commuter airline, is offering one-way fares from \$28 and a six-trip coupon booklet can cut the cost even further.

BOOKINGS DOWN

And with the number of bookings down drastically, even the top hotels are featuring family plans where children stay free with their parents, often in a room of their own.

For the traveller hoping to spend a week or two relaxing in tropical sunshine, Maui has plenty to offer.

The trade winds blow almost constantly so even a blistering day on the vast stretches of clean, sandy beaches near Kihei, about 12 kilometres from the airport, is cool and comfortable.

The climate is essentially the same as southern Ontario or Quebec, but without the often sweltering humidity and hardly any rain.

With a base at the old

whaling port of Lahaina, the beaches of Kihei or the more urban Kaanapali or Kahului, you can easily escape the crowds completely or dine in some of the best restaurants Hawaii has to offer after a day of first-class shopping.

The Hana Highway around the most rugged end of the island winds through 75 kilometres of desert, tropical rain forest and black volcanic beaches — some of the most spectacular sights in the Pacific.

The drive along 60 twisting kilometres from the airport to the top of dormant volcano Haleakala begins in the midst of massive sugar-cane fields planted almost at sea level, through tropical forest, eucalyptus groves and pine forests to a stark alpine landscape and then the brilliant moonscape of volcanic mounds in the crater itself, 3,055 metres above sea level.

For the adventurous, several tour companies offer bike trips that take cyclists most of a day to coast down from the crater.

There is also a horseback trek through the crater itself, where the cool temperature is a refreshing blast of supernatural air-conditioning.

Sunrises and sunsets viewed from the area are particularly spectacular this year because of a recent volcanic eruption on the big island of Hawaii.

SURF AND SAIL

Maui also has surfing lessons, board sailing, parasailing, sailing, sunset cruises, snorkelling at Molokini — a marine preserve just offshore where the fish literally eat out of your hand — and great sun-tanning.

Food on Maui ranges from Hawaiian luau fare and fresh seafood to French cooking that attracts residents of other islands just for dinner.

Almost every spot on the island features tropical drinks guaranteed to make a sunset sparkle, even if one skips the champagne cruises that several sailing and power-boat firms offer every evening.

On Hawaii, Molokai and the Garden Isle of Kauai, the summer has similar delights and the intrepid can visit every one of them for low package fares offered by local airlines.

Waiting for the coldest week in February to visit Hawaii may seem reasonable in the heat of summer, but the delights, at nearly half the price, are waiting right now.

Vacation travel

Travellers must learn to cope with tighter security

MONTREAL (CP) — Some so-called temporary security measures decreed by world governments in the wake of recent aircraft hijackings and bombings will, in all likelihood, become permanent fixtures.

For many travellers, that will mean adjusting to new realities such as learning to travel as light as possible and arriving at airports even earlier than previously recommended.

In the days following the June 23 Air-India disaster, in which 329 people were killed, and the fatal bombing at Tokyo's Narita Airport, added security for international

flights caused delays of up to five hours at some airports.

Although nobody expects such delays to persist, experts warn that as a general rule it will take more time to board an international flight. How much more time most won't say.

The level of extra security will depend largely on whether hijackings and bombings continue.

"We have the feeling that it is not just a single occurrence, that there is likely to be more," says Gordon Lindsay, vice-president of government affairs for the Air Transport Association of Canada.

WILLING TO DIE
Tough action by the

world international community caused the number of hijackings to fall from 87 in 1969 to only 24 last year. But now, a new generation of terrorists, more sophisticated in tactics and weaponry and more willing to die for their cause, has come to the fore.

The airline industry is increasingly concerned that arms or explosive devices could be planted by somebody infiltrating an airline catering firm or ground crew. So all aspects of security — not just screenings of luggage and passengers — are likely to be tightened.

Canadians don't appear to be changing travel plans because of

recent terrorist incidents. Jon Bowman, president of the Alliance of Canadian Travel Agents, says that aside from a few cancellations and destination changes, most people are following their original plans.

The industry is crossing its fingers that the full brunt of the extra security push — especially for checked luggage — isn't extended to domestic flights, which would lead to institutionalized chaos at Canadian airports.

CHECKS WILL STAY
But industry officials expect the inspection, either visual or electronic, of all luggage destined for international flights will continue indefinitely.

Luggage on a domestic flight being transferred to an international flight will also be inspected instead of checked through, as was the practice in Canada before the Air-India tragedy and Tokyo airport explosion.

The traveller connecting from a domestic to an international flight should allow for generous margins in scheduling connections — just in case. There is no saying how generous. It will vary from airport to airport and from airline to airline.

For example, El Al, the Israeli airline, has the Cadillac of security systems. It hasn't had a major incident in 17 years. But it also won't

put up with last-second check-ins and other short-cuts you used to be able to get away with at some airlines.

Since any luggage arousing suspicion may be opened — and some countries will rely on visual inspections rather than pay huge sums for X-ray or other scanning equipment — it will be wise to ensure bags are packed to be quickly opened and closed.

Most of us try to get as much as possible into a suitcase. Airline officials tell of travellers who even pack their clothing wet to squeeze more into the bag. Some people strap bags shut with ropes or belts, especially if bags have broken locks or

latches.

Be forewarned: If you are required to open your suitcases for inspection, you'll almost certainly have to close them yourself, and perhaps in crowded conditions or when your flight is boarding.

Think twice about carrying anything that could raise a security alarm — such as a gun or knife — even if it's perfectly legal or registered. By the time you're questioned about it, your flight may have left without you.

And if an electronic inspection raises suspicions about a suitcase, all the bags on a flight might be pulled for another look.

Wagon Train holiday an unusual trip

TOMPKINS, Sask. (CP) — The creak of saddle leather and the whoosh of the Saskatchewan wind are among the ingredients that make the week-long journey of the Pioneer Wagon Train an unusual vacation.

June 28, at Fox Valley, Sask., 170 people clambered aboard 30 wagons and dozens of horses to start a 130-kilometre trek across the Great Sand Hills of southwestern Saskatchewan.

It was not the only wagon train that will rumble across sections

of the West this year but it's one of the most popular and is fully booked months in advance.

All the riders are supplying their own essentials this year, but that's a matter of choice. Rental wagons are available.

"They bring their own wagons, their own teams and their own food," said Joan Dimmock, secretary of Pioneer Wagon Train, the firm that organizes the rides. "They live out of their wagons the entire trip."

Pioneer Wagon Train supplies trucks that haul feed, deliver water and transport the portable toilets set up at campsites each night.

The cost is \$50 a person, which Dimmock says covers the costs of the non-profit organization.

The Pioneer Wagon Train travels through the Great Sand Hills, an isolated area devoted almost entirely to cattle grazing. It consists of grassy dunes and patches of sand up to 30 metres deep in some places.

The wagons roll over sections where cars and trucks might become hopelessly stuck.

The trips grew out of a 1982 wagon trek from Moose Jaw to Saskatoon to commemorate Saskatchewan's 75th anniversary. Some people enjoyed the trip so much they wanted more, and a scaled-down version was developed.

This year the wagon train will cover between 20 and 24 kilometres a day, travelling a total of 130 kilometres.

"The whole trip will

feature the Great Sand Hills, Dimmock said. "We'll be travelling the whole length of them."

"The bulk of our day is spent travelling, but after supper we have friendship circles. There's always people that have musical instruments and some of the fellows have long recitations that thrill everybody."

Wall Drug an oasis for South Dakota tourists

WALL, S.D. (AP) — Wall Drug is an oasis offering ice-water for parched vacationers travelling through the sun-baked moonscape of South Dakota's Badlands.

Wall Drug is a trinket heaven for tourists. Wall Drug is the Old West come alive for kids who can pose for pictures next to a cast-iron sculpture of Annie Oakley, shoot it out with a bad guy for 25 cents or put a coin in a slot and watch a hanging re-enacted.

Wall Drug is also a nickel coffee stop offering a two-egg breakfast and hot beef

sandwich lunch at low prices.

And, believe it or not, Wall Drug can still fill your prescription.

"We're pharmacists; you've got to be pharmacists to run a drugstore," said Bill Husted, who now operates the multimillion-dollar tourist attraction just off Interstate Highway 90 in western South Dakota.

BOUGHT IN 1931

It was only a drugstore when Ted and Dorothy Husted bought it in 1931, picking the sparsely populated prairie town of Wall for their business over 14 others they had considered.

Ted Husted, now 83, recalls those early years.

"When we came here, all we had in mind was to make a living."

A few years later, unable to sleep from traffic noise on a hot summer Sunday afternoon, Mrs. Husted had an idea that would become the ingenious marketing trademark of Wall Drug.

"She came back to the front of the store and said there was a lot of traffic out there ... zing, zing, zing," said Ted Husted. "She said they were probably thirsty and we should offer free ice-

water.

"Well, before I got back to town from putting up signs, people were already starting to pull into the store."

BECAME LEGEND

That was 1937. The next year Ted Husted hired eight people to serve the customers. The Hustedes now employ more than 150 people each summer. The making of Wall Drug is now legend.

Signs in rhyme exploring motorists not to miss Wall Drug quickly dotted South Dakota's roads. Those signs have been carried to three wars. Soldiers left the signs across Europe in the Second World War, and they sprouted again in Korea and Vietnam. Other people have taken the signs and planted them in Guam, Shanghai and the South Pole.

Photographs of people holding Wall Drug signs in faraway

corners of the world line the drugstore's walls, with the signs telling people how far it is from where they are to Wall Drug.

But the Hustedes don't rely solely on other people carrying their business message. They have bought advertising space in Amsterdam, Paris and London, where signs on double-decker buses this year will tell the British how far it is to Wall Drug.

Bill Husted, who now runs the business even though his father, Ted, comes to work regularly, grits his teeth over those who consider Wall Drug a gaudy tourist trap.

"We get few complaints. And why should we? People can come in here and get entertained without spending a dime, but for a nickel they can get a darn good cup of coffee.

"A tourist trap is where you get people in with false promises.

We don't do that."

THOUSANDS VISIT
If 1985 is an average year, and Bill Husted expects it to be at least that, Wall Drug will amass staggering retail figures for a drugstore in a town of 800 residents.

About 10,000 people will come to the store each day during the summer, and Wall Drug will gross more than \$5 million.

During the year, the Hustedes will give away more than one million glasses of ice-water and pay the city about \$7,300 in water

bills — a drop in the bucket compared with the sales that will grow from the free water.

Nearly 26,000 T-shirts will be sold in 1985, and cooks will use thousands of eggs and up to 90 kilograms of beef each day.

Also, more than 10,000 signs and 109,000 bumper stickers will be given away to carry the Wall Drug story across the United States, not to mention the free word-of-mouth advertising provided by the thousands of visitors.

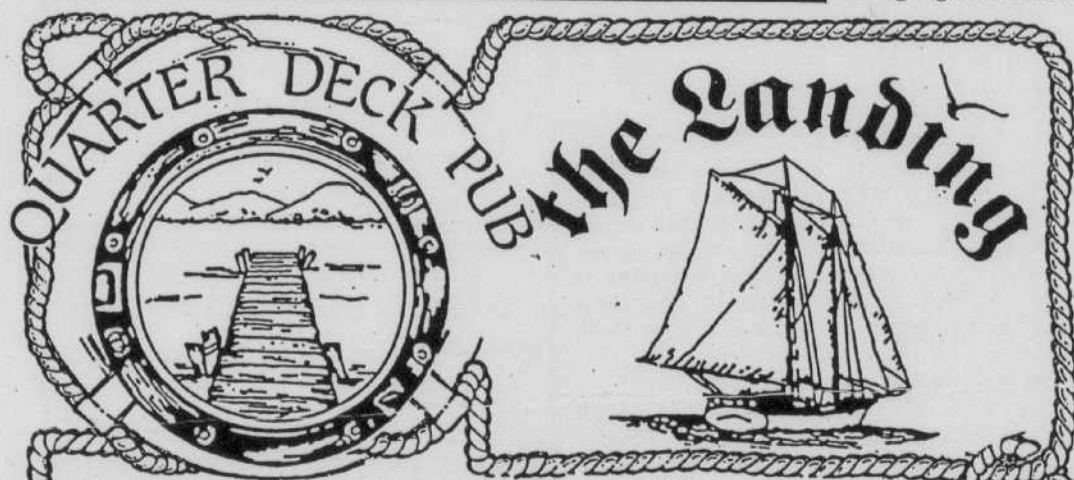

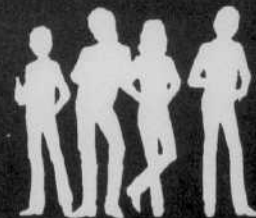

Assateague Island offers serenity in nature setting

CHINCOTEAGUE, Va. (CP) — The plaster statue of a woman clad in a painted blue and yellow polka-dot bikini stands tall over the town's water slide, a symbol of the turn this once serene fishing village has taken over the years.

Don't be turned off by the auburn-haired statue or the seemingly endless array of billboards sprouting out of the marsh as you drive across the causeway linking Virginia's eastern shore to Chincoteague Island.

Endure the commercial strip along Beach Road — with its motels, sub shops, T-shirt outlets and salt-water taffy stands — until you get to a second causeway that will take you to a mini-paradise called Assateague Island.

The 53-kilometre-long federally-protected island, which is split between Maryland and Virginia, offers beaches, dunes, carefully planned campsites, wild ponies and deer.

The 4,000-hectare Chincoteague wildlife refuge on Assateague

Island is a popular stopping spot for Canada geese as they migrate north in the spring and south in the fall.

The Canada geese are among some 260 species of birds that have been recorded along the beaches, marshes, woodland and protected waters that make the island a bird-lovers' delight.

ABANDON CARS

A day of fishing, swimming, beachcombing or hiking to the sound of Atlantic waves lapping at the shore can be had for the cost of the lunch you pack. Visitors park their cars soon after reaching the island and set out on foot or bicycle.

On one recent trip, the ponies made famous by Marguerite Henry's novel *Misty of Chincoteague* could only be seen grazing in distant fields. However, other visitors suggested the ponies are not as wild as their reputation.

They said the ponies have apparently become so jaded by the million tourists who flock to the island each year that they are not the least bit skittish or

anti-social.

That was certainly true of three deer found nibbling on the lush grass by the side of the main road. They simply look bored when a visitor scrambled out of the car and snapped their picture at close range.

Folklore about how the ponies came to the island abounds. The tourist brochures don't even pretend to offer a definite account, although that's probably just good marketing. A little mystery adds to the appeal.

One legend is that the ponies came ashore from a Spanish vessel that ran aground off the coast. Another is that they were put ashore to graze by pirates who sailed the coastal waters.

AUCTION HELD

Regardless, they are there and the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Department has been staging annual roundups in the last week of July since 1924. The ponies rounded up are made to swim from Assateague to Chincoteague, where they are put up for auction. The proceeds are used to buy and maintain fire equipment and to help

with other community projects.

The fire department owns all the ponies living within the refuge, but not the herd living on the Maryland end of

the island.

Those unlucky enough to miss the ponies during their island wandering can always head back to Chincoteague and pay \$1.50 to

see the real Misty, who is stuffed and mounted for display at the Miniature Pony Farm.

Once back in Chincoteague, the trick is to get off the beaten track

and explore some of the sandy lanes that wind through the residential section of this town of 3,500, which was first settled in the 1670s by sailors and herders.

Richmond still Dixie's showcase

RICHMOND, Va. (CP) — One hundred and twenty years after the end of the American Civil War and the demise of Confederacy, this historic Virginian capital remains a showcase for southern pride in that ill-fated dream.

The pinnacle of the Confederate vision may have been several hundred kilometres north at Gettysburg,

Pa., and the bane of the dream may have been several hundred kilometres to the south where Union Gen. Ulysses Grant carved a corridor of destruction through Georgia to the sea. But the heart of the Confederacy was in Richmond.

From 1861 to 1865, it was the capital of the Confederate States of America. Today's residents, displaying a zest for history and a hearty appetite for tourist

dollars, maintain the flavor with style.

For visitors with more than the Civil War on their minds, there are the attractions of a bustling and friendly manufacturing city that sprawls along the banks of the James River. American literature buffs can visit Edgar Allan Poe House where the master of the macabre created many of his masterpieces.

But the true allure of

Richmond rests with its history.

The State house, open daily for tours, was designed by Thomas Jefferson almost a century before the war broke out. Marked by a magnificent statue of George Washington, it housed Confederate President Jefferson Davis and the elected legislators creating a political base for the new nation they were bent on establishing in the South.

Cuba to boost tourist industry with new plans

HAVANA (Reuter)—Cuba has unveiled ambitious plans that could soon see tourism challenging sugar as the island's main source of hard currency.

"By 1990 we expect to bring in about 300 million pesos (dollars) from tourism through investing about 500 million pesos over the next five years," Jorge Debasa, head of the state firm Cubatur, told a foreign travel agents' convention in Havana.

Cuba's earnings from the glutted world sugar market slumped to \$250 million last year and diplomats say Fidel Castro's government has decided that tourism offers the quickest solution to its dire lack of hard currency.

Officials expect tourism to earn Cuba more than \$100 million this year, up from \$80 million in 1984, and are confident the expansion plans will enable it

to double its annual total of visitors to 400,000 by 1990.

Today's tourists come from Canada, Mexico, South America and Western Europe, drawn by low prices, a tropical climate and the different atmosphere of a communist country where street crime is virtually unknown.

NO AMERICANS

Before the 1959 revolution, up to 300,000 Americans a year flocked to Cuba's then-famous casinos, clubs and brothels. But now the U.S. government does not allow its citizens to visit Cuba as tourists.

Cuban plans to expand tourism include construction of eight 200-room hotels in the resort of Varadero, a favorite with visitors because of its long, white beaches and nearby international airport.

Shops, restaurants and nightspots will be improved and new self-

contained villas are planned along the narrow peninsula connecting the resort with the rest of Cuba.

Cayo Largo, an unspoiled coral island ideal for snorkeling enthusiasts, is also earmarked for hotel development. The Cubans eventually hope to turn it into a duty-free resort geared to foreign tourists who will be able to fly there direc-

tly when an existing runway is extended.

The Cuban state tourist board has opened offices in most major West European countries and charters fly to Havana every week during the peak northern winter season.

At the tourism convention, contracts were signed with travel agents from Argentina, Brazil, Venezuela and Colombia, in part a

reflection of Cuba's improved political ties with its fellow Latin American nations.

"The beauty of tourism for Cuba is that it offers a quick source of dollars without having to build an entirely new industry," one European diplomat said.

Cuba plans to double its current tourist-class room capacity of 15,000 and has laun-

ched a campaign to woo locals away from seaside vacations in order to make more space for the "dollar tourists."

Officials reject suggestions that resorts like Cayo Largo, out of bounds for ordinary Cubans, and proliferating dollar-only stores violate Cuba's self-proclaimed "people's sovereignty."

But a few Cubans complain of being treated like second-class citizens in their own country.

"It is almost like the pre-revolutionary days to see youngsters pressing their noses against the windows of shops they cannot enter," said one middle-aged man, a firm supporter of the Castro government.
