It is a station on the C.P.R., and has 4 churches (2 Roman Catholic and 2 Protestant), 149 stores, 15 hotels, 2 lumber mills, 5 factories (pulp and paper, woolen, furniture, etc.), 3 banks, 1 printing and 3 newspaper offices ("Hull City Advance," "Gatineau Beacon" and "Le Spectateur"), besides 1 pork packing house, express, telephone and telegraph offices. Pop. 15,737.
