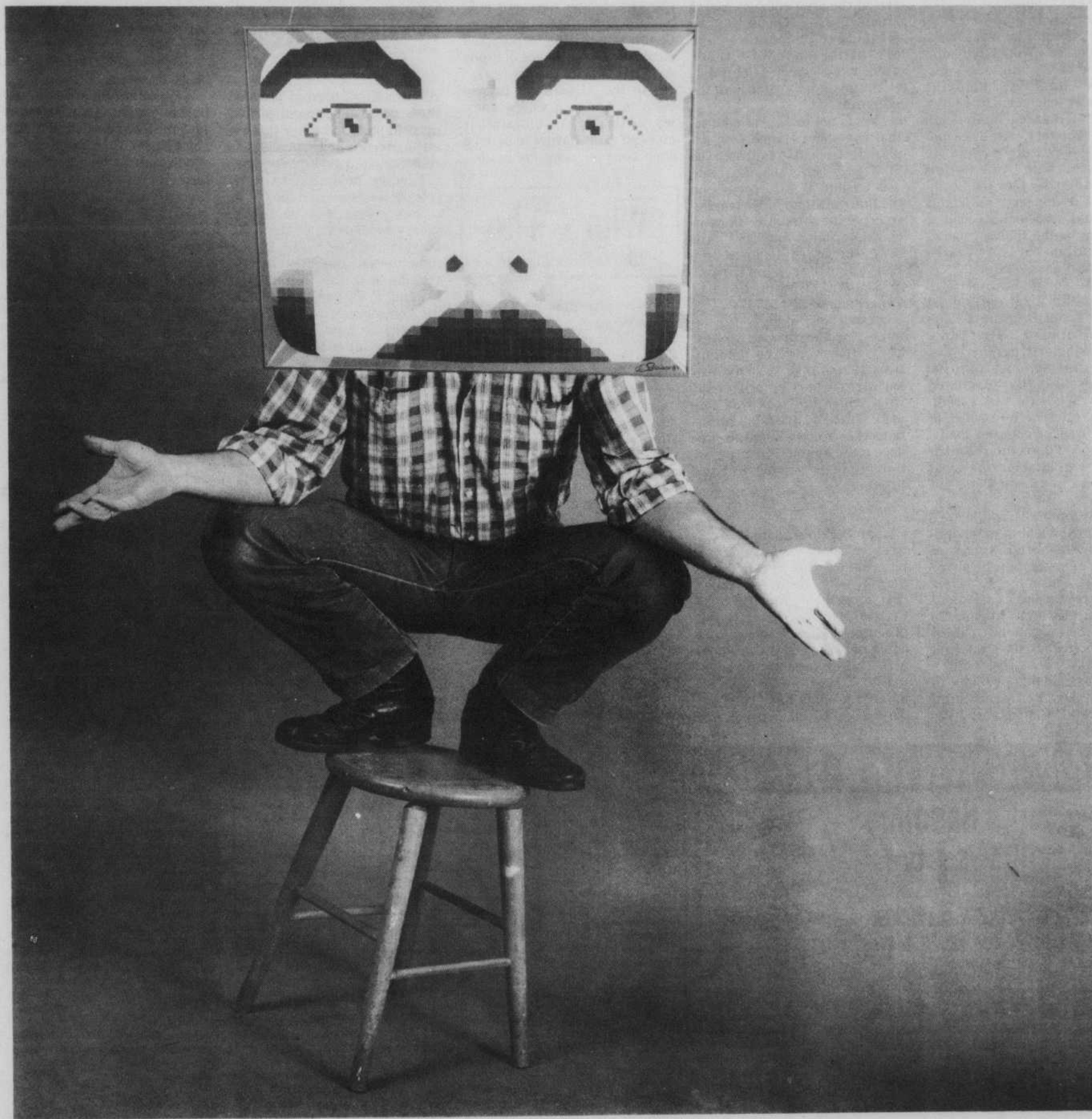

Poor old Columbus was far from first

I have come to believe this is a mighty continent which was hitherto unknown.

Christopher Columbus

Poor old Columbus!

Tomorrow is supposed to be his day, the day he made landfall in the New World, but Amerindians villify him and — despite the 7-hour PBS epic — the politically correct are cautioned to call it an 'encounter' and not a 'discovery'. America had already been discovered by Asians crossing the Bering land bridge, by Lief the Lucky and, as it appears, by lots of Celts and Phoenicians sailing from the same Iberian shores as Columbus but two or three thousand years earlier.

The Musée du Séminaire in Sherbrooke displays a split boulder from Brompton Falls which Harvard's Dr. Barry Fell has declared carries Phoenician inscriptions from 500 B.C. One side he has translated to read "Thus far our expedition travelled in the service of Lord Hiram to conquer land." The other "This is the record of Hanta, who attained the great river, and had these words cut in stone."

Brompton Falls might well have marked a limit of navigation for Phoenician sailors of the day. On the height above the falls where the Beauvoir Sanctuary stands (a logical place for explorers to climb to spy out the land ahead), a third inscription was once found and carefully recorded before being lost again, perhaps to erosion. Dr. Fell translated that to read "Hanno, son of Ta-

mu, reached this mountain landmark."

Hanno is the name of a Phoenician sailor known to have explored the west coast of Africa around 500 B.C. On his way, he must have encountered the prevailing east-west trade winds which carried Columbus from the Canary Islands to the Bahamas.

This is not to say, of course, that the same Hanno who explored Africa also sailed up the St. Francis, only that the name was extant. It also occurs on the Bourne Stone in Massachusetts while a lengthy Phoenician inscription found in Brazil bears the internal date of "the 19th year of the reign of Hiram" or 535 B.C. Hiram, Lord of Tyre, reigned 553-533 B.C.

Ottawa sent 'experts' to examine the Sherbrooke stones. They dismissed the inscriptions as marks of the polyupsilon worm in the Cambrian mud from which the rock was formed. Dr. Fell agrees but maintains they were altered to produce a message and preserved by binding the two halves back together.

Near Perkin's landing on the western shore of Lake Memphremagog, the so-called 'Indian Rocks' bear markings that have been identified as Celtic ogam of a sort found throughout New England and dated between 100 B.C. and 400 A.D. Cairns recently discovered near Mansonville with similar markings have been radio-carbon dated between 200

and 500 A.D.

Thor Heyerdahl demonstrated a generation ago that trans-Atlantic crossings in pre-Christian ships were not only possible but highly probable. Given prevailing winds and currents, the presence of Stone Age artifacts on the Azores far out in the Atlantic, of bronze tools in America where there was no tin and a thousand other clues, it is far harder to believe such voyages were *not* made.

Fell postulates accidental voyages as early as 3000 B.C. and deliberate voyages in both directions by 1000 B.C. He believes Iberian Celts colonized Vermont and New Hampshire between 800 and 100 B.C., built villages and temples and ritual stone circles on hilltops, named their colony 'Iargalon', meaning 'Land Beyond the Sunset', left dozens of inscriptions to the sun god Bel (Baal to the Phoenicians), celebrated Beltane and contributed their genes to indigenous populations.

There is an Algonquin tradition that their ancestors came across the Atlantic (and a similar one among Aztecs). Micmacs used hieroglyphics remarkably like those used in Egypt and Abenaki, sharing many physical and linguistic characteristics with Phoenicians, called themselves 'Dawn Land People' or 'Eas-

terners'. Since everybody likes to think of themselves as the center of the universe and everyone else as Easterners or Northerners, it's possible that, too, is a tribal memory of trans-Atlantic crossings.

When Kit Columbus prowled the beaches of Portugal, picked up seed pods and other flotsam strange to his hemisphere, stared westward and dreamed of the Indies, he'd already heard tales of lands beyond the sea. It is likely that Basque fishermen, descendants of those old Iberian Celts, were already fishing the Newfoundland Banks, trading with the Indians and keeping it all under their hats for commercial reasons. Basque graves have been identified even in Pennsylvania.

Cotton Mather was one of many who recorded strange inscriptions in the New World and noted similarities between Indians and Israelites — right down to the practice of circum-

cision among Connecticut tribes. This led to the supposition they were descended from the Lost Tribes of Israel and the inspiration for Vermont-born Joseph Smith's 'Book of Mormon'.

So why isn't all this in the text books?

Well, some folk are still resisting evolution. It wasn't until 1961 that excavation of Viking houses at L'Anse aux Meadows squelched the academic scoffers. It was only in the 1970s that Celtiberian ogam began to be deciphered and in 1986 that new evidence suggested Columbus made landfall on Sanna Cay instead of Watling Island.

And if winds and currents had taken him a few degrees off course, Columbus might have landed on St. Vincent and found carved in a rock at Barouallie a Celtic inscription from about 800 B.C. which says:

"Mabo discovered this remote western isle."

Roseanne claims she was a victim of child abuse

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Roseanne Arnold told a national talk show audience that her father molested her daughter during the comedian's wedding last year.

The star of the ABC hit series Roseanne also said her sister was attacked by her father a decade ago.

Arnold got a hug from alleged incest victims in the audience following Tuesday's

one-hour taping of the Sally Jessy Raphael talk show at CBS Television City. The nationally syndicated show is scheduled to be broadcast Thursday.

Arnold, 38, has publicly accused her parents, Helen and Jerome Barr of Salt Lake City, of sexually molesting and abusing her as an infant and a youngster.

They have denied the allegations, which Arnold first made public last month at a gathering of incest victims in Denver. On Tuesday, she said her father attacked her daughter, Jessica, during Arnold's June 1990 wedding.

The entertainer's husband, Tom Arnold, said Jessica's grandfather "was all over her" after the 14-year-old was left with Barr a few hours after the ceremony while the Arnolds left for their honeymoon.

Jessica revealed the alleged abuse six months later when she was hospitalized for emotional problems, and the couple filed charges against the elder Barr, they said.

The Arnolds did not make clear the outcome of those charges.

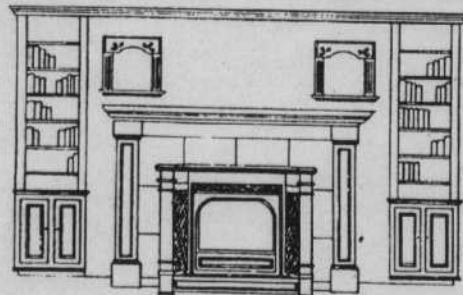

Trépanière: Connecting women with art

SHERBROOKE — Photographer Diane Trépanière says "photography captures and gives back energy."

As much as this statement could be debated, one thing remains true: Trépanière's *Voix Familières V* exhibition at the newly relocated Galerie Horace is a spiritual experience for the artist and those who

come to see it.

Voix Familières V pays tribute to the history of women — especially the silent witnesses to the past.

Diane Trépanière's emancipation began when the musical company *Up With People* came to the Eastern Townships in 1971. The company was searching for dancers so Trépanière signed up for an audition

and was chosen.

"I was so happy that they chose me — it was my way to set myself free," Trépanière said.

FIND IDENTITY

Before this experience, Trépanière was fighting to find her identity as a woman. Feeling trapped behind a secretary's desk, she said she entertained thoughts of contesting society's

dismissal of women.

After her encounter with the company she continued the trek towards self-actualization by working with a women's collective, she said. There she had the opportunity to influence the way women were represented in society, since she was one of the spokesperson for the organization.

Trépanière said her desire to see the advancement of women in society while pursuing her artistic career were influenced by her upbringing.

A native of St. Elie d'Orford, Trépanière was one of 10 children born into relative poverty. It was her mother who made the greatest impression on her life.

"I've always had a great appreciation for my mother. We were poor but she would always manage to take virtually nothing and make it into a lot," she said in an interview at Galerie Horace.

INVESTIGATE RELATIONS

Her strong connection with the environment prompted her to investigate the spiritual relation between man and matter.

"I've always had a spiritual connection with the earth and I sought out women who I thought best represented this energy; so the women in my work project what I feel," she said.

According to Trépanière the women (artists and dancers) photographed in her work

create a circle of energy when in contact with matter. She refers to this as a communication of stimulating energy. That is why the artist uses superimposition in her work; the exterior being the physical dimension of the female, the interior being the emotional one.

The artist who says she never took a photography course, said she thinks women are very sensitive but have not always been allowed to express this. This is why many of her photographs include female statues made of stone.

"Women of stone have always been ignored because people believe they are dead and have no soul. But but they do, for they are the silent witnesses of history," she said.

BUMPY ROAD

Like any other artist, Trépanière said the road can sometimes be bumpy but by sincerely believing in what you're doing makes life a less rough.

"The life of an artist is often frustrating and government are very hard to come by, so you have to believe in what you're doing — it's that strong conviction that enables me to be comfortable in what I am doing," she said.

It is that same confidence, that same conviction Trépanière hopes to get across to her audience through her work.

"One has to have courage to live and to believe in what one is doing and that one has something positive to contribute to his life and that of others."

Old Montreal lets its buildings do the talking

MONTREAL (CP) — From "talking houses" it has been a short technological step to talking banks, churches and hotels, thanks to the National Research Council and the Old Montreal Heritage Network.

The technique began as a way for real-estate agents to broadcast 24-hour-a-day sales pitches outside homes.

Now, tourists can stand in a 125-year-old Montreal bank, listening on ordinary portable radios to a broadcaster explain the building's history and architecture, accompanied by music and sound effects.

They learn that the bust above the door of the former Molson's Bank is believed to depict John Molson, who also owned a nearby brewery and introduced steamship navigation to the St. Lawrence River in 1809.

After leaving the building, which now houses offices of the Bank of Montreal, visitors might saunter over to Notre-Dame Basilica.

Again their radios will pick up a 72-second message, relating that the lavishly decorated Roman Catholic church, built between 1823 and 1829, long stood as the largest in North America.

25 SITES

In all, visitors can stop at 25 historical sites in Old Montreal and hear messages in French or English on separate FM frequencies. All they need is a radio and the map inside a guidebook showing the locations of the sites.

A few blocks from Notre-Dame is Rasco's Hotel, where the city's beautiful people once gathered. Among them were luminaries such as Louis-

Hippolyte LaFontaine and Robert Baldwin, joint prime ministers of United Canada in 1842-43.

"Perhaps Rasco's most famous guest as Charles Dickens who stayed here in 1842 while his plays were being performed across the street," recounts the broadcast. Dickens even acted in his Montreal performances.

The Old Montreal Heritage Network is the result of a technological achievement — a computer developed to run a low-power broadcast transmitter, using digitally recorded sound to eliminate moving parts.

Dick Shain, a Montreal entrepreneur and part-owner of the new broadcast system, says the transmitters were originally developed to let house-hunters tune in their car radios to the frequency indicated on a For Sale sign to hear a description of the property.

NRC INVOLVEMENT

One of Shain's two partners in Heritage Network, engineer Marc Parent, helped build a robot-realtor transmitter at the National Research Council in Ottawa.

"Marc called on me a few years back and I wasn't too intrigued by that application, so we developed the idea of this Heritage Network of ours," Shain said in his cluttered third-floor office overlooking St. James Street, once the fi-

nancial centre of Canada.

Besides the technology, the main ingredient in the project was Old Montreal — one of the largest self-contained historic districts in North America.

The 40-hectare area along the St. Lawrence was the site of the original French colony from which explorers spread across the continent.

By 1820, Montreal was the second-largest city in North America. British entrepreneurs based in the city built the fur trade, banks and the continental railways.

The original business area remained largely undisturbed because the downtown core moved north, away from the river, leaving the old buildings standing.

'GAIN INSIGHT'

Shain, an unabashed salesman, says the radio network "is a very pleasant way to gain an insight into four centuries of rather important history that not only affected Montreal but a good deal of the North American continent."

After two years of development, which included securing

broadcast permits, the transmitters began operating in January, 24 hours a day.

Although the messages can be picked up on a car radio, Shain says the project was designed for a walking tour, "because you can see so much more that way."

Shain admits that history "was something I did not give much heed to, but I'm a history buff now. I'm just an entrepreneur with an interest in taking a good idea and commercializing it."

Shain and his partners have invested several hundred thousand dollars — "I'd rather not say how much," he adds with a strained grin.

Startup costs included the purchase of 50 computers and installation near the entrances of the historical sites.

The network will make a profit, Shain hopes, through the sale of commercial time at the end of each message and advertising space in the guidebook.

The booklets are available at newsstands and tourist sites for about \$4.

Poirier finds new ways to look at reality

SHERBROOKE — "Awesome."

"Sexist."

"Imaginative."

Artist Denis Poirier's last exhibit *Une Réalité Imaginée* provoked a myriad of reactions — and the controversial oil painter would not have it any other way.

"Instead of playing on reality, I prefer to escape reality," the artist said in an interview at his home.

"People are too preoccupied with reality."

These words of wisdom were spoken by a man who said he once believed himself to be destined for the world of manual labor.

Denis Poirier grew up in Rosemont a working class neighborhood in Montreal where he worked various odd jobs.

"I was doing metal transfor-

ming, cabinet making and I even worked in the country so I could become a farmer," Poirier remembered.

"I was always painting, but it was not my occupation. I was doing it for the fun."

Luckily Poirier's brother took notice of his artistic potential and encouraged him to explore the possibility.

"My brother told me I had what it took to enter the field of arts. I didn't come from a creative milieu — we were all destined to be laborers."

Armed with talent, confidence and his brother's encouragement, Poirier entered *l'École des Beaux Arts* in Montreal and graduated with a degree in fine arts. He later refined his skills by taking courses in computer assisted drawing at *l'Université de Sherbrooke* and airbrushing at Bishop's University.

"I went to school out of curio-

sity," he said.

"Before attending *l'École des Beaux Arts* I was painting for pleasure only and not because I believed I had talent."

While studying at art school, Poirier learned that although a creative potential may be innate, becoming an artist is not. **DEVELOP SENSITIVITY.**

"One must have an artistic feel. You have to love what you're doing. It's a kind of sensitivity that must be developed," he claimed.

Artists also have to take a sacred oath to devote their attention to their craft, he said.

"You cannot divert your attention to two things."

The artist said each painting he produces takes one month to one month and one half to complete. He creates about four to five canvasses a year which are all unique in the sense that he paints only one copy of each painting; it's a

question of feeling.

"Each painting has an emotional attachment to it that would be impossible to reproduce," he said.

A Poirier creation starts long before his hand ever touches the paper. Intense research is required to build around an idea. A woman's face, a cat by a window are all taken out of reality and transported into Poirier's world.

Then the drawing starts.

MANIPULATING SKETCHES

"I start with a drawing so I can see where the colors are going to be put. I then redraw over it with the use of tracing paper — that way I don't have to redo the whole thing and have the option of manipulating the sketch till it's perfect," he explained.

He then enters the drawing into his computer so he can manipulate the drawing again as well as the color.

"You get to experiment — which I love — and if you don't like it it's OK"

Then he goes back to his canvass to begin painting.

The *dry brush* technique probably resembles Poirier's style the most though he's quick to insist that he's developing the technique.

"I dip the brush in oil paint very lightly and then wipe off the excess. I then make some sort of dots on the canvas. This allows the paint to dry faster as well as it allows to mix colors and create a softness that could not be had with any other technique. Many people have told me that my paintings look airbrushed because of this," he said.

LIKES LEGS

Softness is why Poirier uses a lot of women — especially their legs — in his work.

"I like women's legs," Poirier said candidly.

"Their lines are much smoother and delicate and the soft pastel colors I use just bring out this softness."

The painter admits being surprised at accusations of sexism by certain art observers.

As well as his appreciation for the female form Poirier also enjoys searching for beauty in the most unexpected places.

In works entitled "Bonjour M. Magritte", "La fenêtre" and "Chat sous pli", the gifted realist uses plywood to bring out surrealism.

"I want to get out something aesthetic from something that isn't," Poirier reasoned.

Through his work Poirier said he hopes people will be able to free their imagination and come up with their own ideas about his work.

"I am not trying to transmit a specific idea. I do not want to direct people's imagination because I want them to draw their own conclusions — I like being a little humorous, not too serious."

That's why one of his favorite paintings is "La Critique". In this painting he uses plywood and a lot of greys to illustrate how people perceive and critique a piece of art.

"I love getting feedback from the public," Poirier conceded.

One thing that bothers Poirier is the inaccessibility of art. He said he believes art is very important in society more than most care to admit, like for example the media. However, on a day to day basis art is usually confined to the rich. That's why in order to make ends meet, Poirier sometimes works on a commission basis — which may compromise his artistic beliefs.

"I put a lot of importance on the quality of my paintings out of respect for the public. I do not try to delude the public," he said.

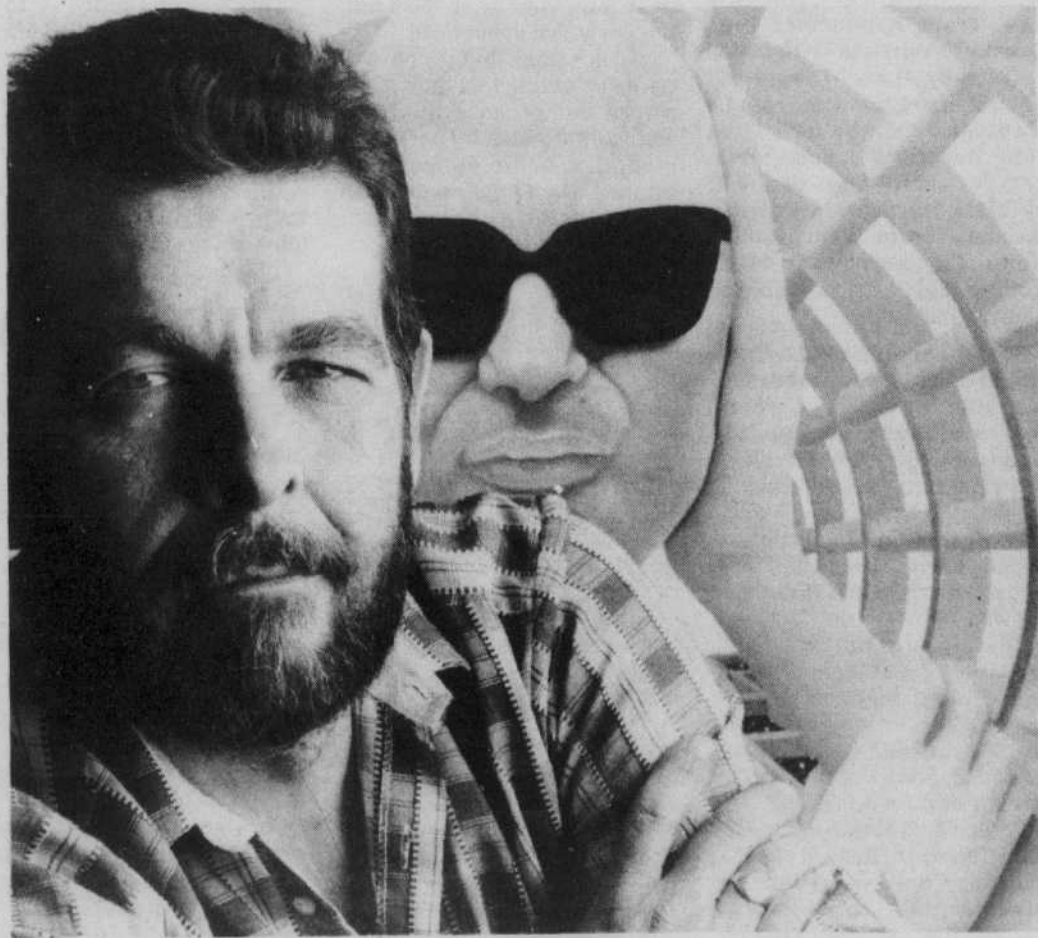
AFRAID OF FAME

Poirier is also weary of fame because he's convinced that his love for painting could turn to a love for money if society ever saw fit to make him a celebrity.

What the artist would like however is to have an agent who would take care of the commercial aspect.

"I would like to have an agent to take care of sales, but for now I want to put the importance on getting the public acquainted with my name and my work," the artist said.

Poirier is back to work on new tableaux that are scheduled to appear in an exposition in 1993 so keep an eye out because this dynamic artist plans to please, surprise and enlighten his audience like never before.

Black Robe tops Genie nomination list

TORONTO (CP) — Black Robe, an epic movie about a Jesuit missionary among Indians in 17th-century New France, has won a pack-leading 10 nominations for the 1991 Genie Awards for excellence in Canadian film-making.

The brutally elegant movie, which drew big at the box office in Montreal and Toronto last weekend, will arrive in theatres across the country this month.

Black Robe's nominations were announced Wednesday by

the Academy of Canadian Cinema and Television.

Audience favorites The Company of Strangers, about seven elderly women stranded in the Quebec countryside, and Amoureux fou (Love Crazy), a comic tale of adultery, received six nods each for Canada's version of the Oscars.

Eight other films, including the problem-plagued Bethune: The Making of a Hero, garnered four mentions apiece.

METHOD CHANGED

The Genie awards have changed their nomination pro-

cedure from one that involved all the academy's 2,500 members to a system that uses 130 select jurors.

Jurors nominated only within their craft — writers nominated writers, for example — with the exception that all could nominate in best picture category.

The same system will apply on a larger scale to the final vote. All academy members will be able to vote within their craft, plus have a say in the winner of the best picture race.

But the new nomination

method resulted in some acclaimed films failing to win expected mentions in certain categories.

For example, of the five films nominated for best picture — Black Robe, The Company of Strangers, Une Histoire inventée (An Imaginary Tale), Perfectly Normal and the soon-to-be-released Chaineance — only two had their directors nominated.

Those were Black Robe's Bruce Beresford of Australia and Une Histoire inventée's Andre Forcier.

Most conspicuous by its absence of multiple nominations, however, was The Adjuster, a festival favorite about loss and loneliness that only won a mention for its director Atom Egoyan.

The film's exemplary performances and stunning artistic and technical work were passed over by nominators.

"It's not a public vote, it's not a popular vote, it's not a critics' vote — it's peer group voting," Maria Topalovich, the academy's executive director, said in an interview after the nominations were announced.

"I don't think that people will be disappointed at how they turned out because the films were adjudicated by peers looking at specific elements of films — like direction and editing — using very detailed, craft-oriented criteria."

FAVORITE PERFORMERS

Favorite performers of the year were, undoubtedly, the seven delightful elderly women featured in The Company of Strangers.

Four of them won nominations for the 12th annual Genies.

Alice Diabo, a 74-year-old Mohawk Indian, and Cissy Meddings, a 76-year-old transplanted Englishwoman, are both up for the best actress prize.

Winifred Holden and Catherine Roche, meanwhile, are nominated for their supporting performances.

Also up for best actress are Kate Nelligan for White Room, Pascale Montpetit for H and teenager Nina Petronzio for Vincent and Me.

Competing for best actor honors are Remy Girard and Jean Rochefort, both for Amoureux fou, Matthias Habich for La Demoiselle sauvage (The Wild Young Woman), American Brad Dourif for Chaineance and India-born Saeed Jaffrey for Masala.

This year's Genies — to be presented in a live CBC television broadcast from Toronto's Pantages Theatre on Nov. 26 — are actually being given out for nearly two years of Canadian film-making.

The last ceremony was in the spring of 1990 and honored films released in 1989.

Fisher King tops Box Office hits

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Fisher King held onto the top spot at the weekend box office despite a strong showing from the debuting Ricochet.

The latest Top 10 list was notable for what it didn't include: The \$197 million-US-grossing blockbuster Terminator 2: Judgment Day finally fell off, as did Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves, which has grossed \$160 million.

The Fisher King, a Holy Grail allegory starring Robin Williams as a homeless lunatic and Jeff Bridges as an abrasive talk-show host, grossed \$6.1 million Friday through Sunday, according to figures released Monday by Entertainment Data Inc.

That's a 14 per cent drop from the \$7.1 million it took in

the previous weekend.

Ricochet, a tale of vengeance starring John Lithgow as an obsessed criminal and Denzel Washington as the district attorney he targets, debuted in second place with \$4.8 million.

Deceived, a thriller with Goldie Hawn as a wife uncovering her husband's dark secrets, remained in third place with \$4.76 million in ticket sales.

The football comedy Necessary Roughness was fourth with a take of \$4.5 million — a 31 per cent drop from the week before.

The Super, a comedy starring Joe Pesci as a New York slumlord sentenced to live in his own rundown apartment house, made \$3.7 million in its debut to occupy fifth place.

Festival offers latest trends in New Music

SHERBROOKE—A 15-piece chamber orchestra from Quebec, *Nouvel Ensemble Moderne* opened the ninth edition of the Victoriaville International Festival of New Music last night.

Covering a wide spectrum of new music, the annual festival draws hundreds of visitors from the Townships, Montreal, Quebec City and across Canada.

Artistic director Michel Levasseur says 20 per cent of the festival's audience comes from Boston, New York, Chicago and the West Coast of the States.

He says 120 artists from 11 countries will be participating in the festival this year, "including for the first time (in North America), Poland, Lithuania and Russia."

Certainly a fine spin-off of *glasnost!*

Some 25 concerts on three stages are planned for the prestigious five-day event, including two world premieres, eight North American premieres and nine Canadian premieres.

But what exactly is "new music" or "musique actuelle"?

"It's music that doesn't real-

ly fit into any category," says Levasseur.

"It's neither jazz, neither contemporary, but...actuelle."

It might not be easy to describe, but much of it is certainly easy to listen to.

FOUR TRENDS

Since the organizing committee needed to group the concerts into some sort of category for the public's sake, they've divided the shows into four basic stylistic musical trends: contemporary music, jazz, avant-garde rock and free improvisation.

A highlight in the contemporary music section is a trio of Polish musicians who call themselves *Harmonia Viva* and play surprisingly diverse music on accordions.

Harmonia Viva take the stage at the CEGEP Sunday at 5.

Jazz music at the Victoriaville fest not only focuses on the African-American approach to the genre, but extends itself to the folk-inspired sounds coming from Eastern Europe.

The Anthony Davis Group from the States is known for mastering the techniques of both classical and jazz avant-garde styles, making music that is both lyrical and ro-

mantic.

The group, under the direction of composer Davis, plays the Canadian premiere of his new works on Sunday night at 10 at Grand Café.

Whether avant-garde rock bands originate from Quebec, the States, France or Japan, they offer uncompromising music that's on the cutting edge of the style.

IMAGINATIVE

One example is French bassist Ferdinand Richard, who, with his band, *les Philosophes*, will serve up some wildly imaginative rock tonight at midnight at the CEGEP.

Japan's *After Dinner* plays the final concert of the festival, Monday, Oct. 14 at 10 p.m. at the Grand Café. Fusing elements of progressive and avant-garde music with those of their own traditions, the ensemble tries to convey in modern terms the very heart of Japanese soul.

After Dinner brings the festival to a close with a touch of mystery from the Orient!

Improvised music, stemming for the most part from European frontiers, has its place at this year's festival.

Pop star Mitsou will be a no-show at ADISQ awards

MONTREAL (CP)—Don't look for pop star Mitsou at the annual gala of ADISQ, Quebec's recording industry association.

Mitsou, whose video *Dis-moi, Dis-moi* (Tell Me, Tell Me) was too steamy for the MuchMusic channel, doesn't want to know about it.

This time the issue isn't just how much flesh a 20-year-old has the right to show. It's about politics in Quebec's music world.

The singer's manager, Pierre Gendron, is opposed to the industry association's \$640 annual membership fee. And he doesn't like the way the organization is run.

Gendron said his refusal to pay the fee is a matter of principle, explaining in the last year he has never had any need for ADISQ's services.

But "it's not surprising that Mitsou is entered in only one category, for (Pop-Rock) Show of the Year."

The winners are to be announced Sunday night at Place

des arts but Gendron promised, "Mitsou won't be there. The important thing for her is the music. She agrees with me. And I won't be there either."

SEATTLE (AP)—Rockers Ann and Nancy Wilson have joined with a high school friend to build a recording studio to be used by classical musicians as well as their own band, Heart.

The \$2.2 million studio, nicknamed *Bad Animals* after one of Heart's albums, will open in January. The *Seattle Times* reported Monday.

The Wilsons are building the studio with Steve Lawson, a friend from *Sammamish* high school in suburban Bellevue.

Ed Birdwell, managing director of the *Seattle Symphony*, said he expects chamber-music groups to use the studio, which is about twice the size of a typical recording room.

NEW YORK (AP)—Sinead O'Connor says she and her siblings were victims of daily beatings while growing up.

"I was beaten up every day ... very, very badly. I lived my life in a state of terror," the Irish-born singer said in the November issue of *Spin* magazine.

"Merely the sound of my mother's feet on the hearth ceiling were enough to send us into spasms of complete terror."

Music Notes

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Bob Dylan has two pieces of advice for songwriters: make your songs meaningful and get some music education.

"If nobody wrote any songs from this day on, the world ain't gonna suffer for it ... unless someone's gonna come along with a pure heart and has something to say," he said in an interview to be published in the October issue of *SongTalk*.

"You're better off learning

some music theory ... if you want to write songs, rather than just take a hillbilly twang and try to base it all on that."

OTTAWA (CP)—These days, things are looking pretty rosy for *The Grapes of Wrath*.

The West Coast band, which played in Ottawa recently, has slowly carved its way into mainstream success on the strength of solid recordings and endless touring.

Guitarist Kevin Kane agrees the *Grapes* are on the move. But he's a little hesitant about calling it an overnight success.

"We've taken the stairs to the top instead of the elevator, but it's falling together," he jokes.

Their latest disc *These Days*—recorded in the *Abbey Road Studios*—exemplifies the band's leaning toward tight harmonies and solid pop lyrics.

"I think we've really captured a feel this time around," said Kane. "People have always told us we're better live

than on record and we wanted to take the live energy and put it across in the studio. I believe it's happened this time."

And Kane agrees the *Grapes*

PETERBOROUGH, Ont. (CP)—Hagood Hardy's piano may add a musical spark of life to the city's cultural community.

Weird wins big for TV hit Eerie, Indiana

LOS ANGELES (CP) — For sheer creativity, the runaway winner in the new network TV season is Eerie, Indiana.

The NBC series, airing Sundays, is a delightful, innovative, hard-to-pigeonhole series about two teenage boys who believe their seemingly perfect suburb is actually "the centre of weirdness on the planet."

Each week, the boys are drawn into a creepy encounter that only provides more evidence — which they dutifully store in their tin locker, for that

day when they can finally break out of Eerie and prove their case to the world.

Call it Twin Peaks for kids, or Tom Sawyer meets the Twilight Zone. Just take two recent storylines, for example:

—In the premiere, series star Omri Katz, playing 13-year-old Marshall Teller, discovered the neighborhood kitchenware club is more like a tribe of voodoo headshrinkers.

—The following week, one of Marshall's friends went to an orthodontist and ended up with a retainer in his mouth that let him hear what dogs are thin-

king.

—In an episode called The Jolly Rogers, Marshall discovers there are pirates in town hunting for buried treasure. They're seventh-generation buccaneers, as it turns out, but they're now landlocked in a Winnebago.

—Marshall notices that a lot of objects and personal effects are getting lost, so he and his sidekick Simon Holmes — a real little scene-stealer named Justin Shenkarow — decide to investigate.

"Marshall gets inside a piece of luggage and they take it to the bus depot, figuring luggage is something that will get lost for sure," says executive producer Karl Schaefer says.

"And sure enough, he does become lost and winds up in the World of Lost Stuff, which is this gigantic warehouse underneath Eerie, Indiana, where all the lost things in the world go."

"It's explained to him that they have to lose all this stuff, because if they don't, the whole economy will grind to a halt."

—Home alone, as it were, the boys try to get Simon's baby brother to do "something stupid or dangerous" for America's Funniest Home Videos.

The tot won't co-operate, so they give up and start watching a mummy movie on TV.

Suddenly, the infant bites the remote control — and ends up in the movie.

"Now wait a minute," Schaefer says. "If the baby's in the mummy movie, where's the mummy?"

Yes, he's in the house, and "mischief ensues as the mummy trashes their house and they've got to somehow get the mummy back into the TV and

the baby out before Mom comes home."

Storylines like this just tumble off the tongue of Schaefer, who created the series with Jose Rivera and also enlisted Joe Dante, of Gremlins fame, as a creative consultant and occasional director.

Television as TV executives see it

LOS ANGELES (CP) — Here's an idea for a new cable channel: Chatterbox TV, an all-talk network where the sole subject of conversation is TV shows, TV business and TV in general.

It wouldn't cost much to make: the network could just run footage from the TV critics' "press tour" — a semi-annual promotional blitz in which TV stars and executives are trotted out to hype their new programs.

If such a channel existed, of course, it would be loaded with self-serving pap.

But occasionally viewers would hear some funny and revealing insights about the perplexing, frustrating and fascinating medium of television.

Here's a sampling of remarks, heard at the recent press event in Los Angeles:

Toronto native Lorne Michaels, producer of Saturday Night Live, tried to explain the CBC to Americans.

"It's a system which is run by the government," he said. "You can do almost anything in social satire, but it's very difficult when you start to deal with political matters."

"There's basically two forms of game shows," said CBS executive Rod Perth. "Humiliation and greed."

James Brooks, executive producer of The Simpsons, said a successful TV series has to be protected from outside interference and political pressure groups.

"Everybody wants to get their hand on the lever with television," he said. "And your job, when you're doing a show is just: nobody's hand gets on

it, stay true to the characters, give them the throttle as much as you can.

"That's where the integrity lies."

Tube Talk

Vince Manze, a vice-president of advertising at NBC, described the level of self-deception needed to promote network shows for a living.

"They're all terrific shows to us ... the best shows we ever saw," Manze said. "We make no distinction."

"Because otherwise, the promotion really sucks."

As they fight to cut costs and hold viewers, the major

networks have been dropping their standards and turning to "reality TV."

"All three networks are struggling now with their desire to put on live executions," said veteran producer Gary David Goldberg. "The big difference is that Fox will put on naked live executions."

Do people really use all those channels on their TV set?

Not really, said ABC research head Alan Wurtzel.

"The average (U.S.) home receives 27 channels but actually watches only nine," Wurtzel said. "The fact of the matter is that people really try to reduce the complexity of life."

Aside from his new ABC and CTV series Home Improvement, producer Matt Williams

also helped create The Cosby Show and Roseanne, two of the biggest hits in recent years.

So is he a TV fan?

"I don't watch much television, to be honest," Williams said. "I want to get away from it, because I live it day in and day out."

TV advertisers often make news when they pull out of TV programs, citing scenes that are risqué, violent or politically sensitive.

Dick Wolf, executive producer of Law and Order, said such objections can be just a smokescreen.

"If you're an advertising manager in the third quarter and you're saying 'Wow, did I have a bad quarter, I can get \$350,000 by pulling out of six shows,' you're going to do it."

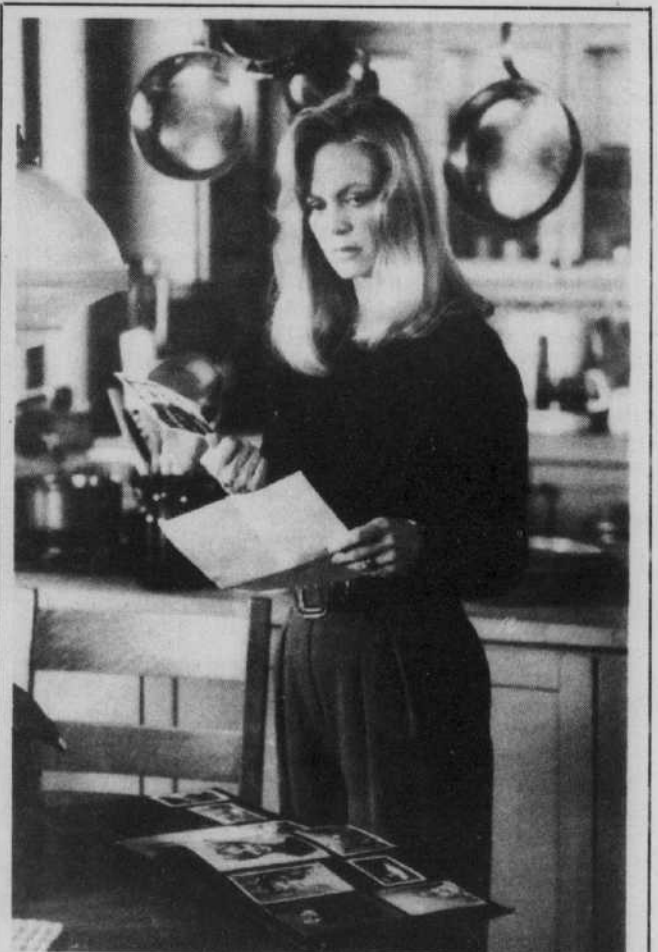

For Kennedy, a long journey to 'Homefront'

Mimi Kennedy has had a curious career.

In her first series, "3 Girls 3" (1977), she was one of the three lucky unknowns selected to share the show's lead and was hyped (along with Debbie

Allen and Ellen Foley) as a future mega-star. Now, she can be found playing the hard-edged and very proper Ruth Sloan in the ABC Tuesday-night drama "Homefront."

And in between? Well, she appeared in several TV movies, had roles in a number of TV series that "crashed and burned kind of early," and worked as the story editor on "Knots Landing."

Whoa. A story editor? "When I had my children (a son and daughter, Cisco and Molly), I lost interest in trying to be the kind of cute, perky person that I had been typecast as for the most part," Kennedy says. "It's a grueling process of auditioning and maintaining a certain image, and I couldn't maintain that energy anymore. I wanted to stay home with my children, and in doing that my creative output took a more personal bent and I did a lot of writing."

She showed some of her work to "Knots Landing" producers Lynn Marie Latham and Bernard Lechowick, whom she had met through her daughter's preschool. Later, they hired her as story editor. Then Latham and Lechowick created "Homefront," which examines life in a Midwestern town at the end of World War II. When they showed the script to Kennedy, one role stood out: WASPy, judgmental Mrs. Sloan.

"I thought, 'If I were to go back to acting, if I were to work on this project with them instead of staying on "Knots," this is my way out,'" Kennedy recalls. "After many years of acting, you start to recognize what roles you can do without much of a fight. And Mrs. Sloan was one of them."

Doing a period piece has meant extensive research. "I'm stirred and inspired by photos, scenes in novels that have the '40s in them," she says. "But I also carry it with me. I was born in '48, and I carry with me the memory of my mother and father as young people. This particular period is our parents' romances, our parents' lives. It's where we came from, in essence. And there is a need to go back to this period to answer questions we have about our lives."

As for her own life, Kennedy now feels that her roller-coaster beginnings with "3 Girls 3" worked out for the best.

"People remember that show, which is always very good in Hollywood," she laughs. "And people love to resurrect a career that they found promising then couldn't find at all."

Updated 'Olympiad' still earns high marks

These days, it's easy to develop a cynical attitude toward athletics. Witness the procession of black eyes:

Professional boxer Mike Tyson, owner of a long and checkered rap sheet, is indicted in Indianapolis for rape. Otis Nixon, with his team in the middle of a hotly contested division title race, is suspended from baseball for drug-use.

Isiah Thomas is passed over by the selection committee for the U.S. Olympic basketball team, allegedly due to a feud with Michael Jordan.

Filmmaker Bud Greenspan addressed the media's preoccupation with such negativity recently when he spoke at a screening of selected portions of "The Olympiad," his Emmy-winning 22-part documentary series on the quadrennial athletic competitions. "Everyone knows about the 10 percent that is bad in sports," said Greenspan, "but we wanted to focus on the 90 percent that is good when we made 'The Olympiad.'"

ESPN began rebroadcasting the wonderfully evocative documentary on Oct. 7, and the all-sports network will run a one-hour episode each week through the beginning of the 1992 Summer Olympics next July in Barcelona, Spain. (Check weekly listings; episodes will not always air on the same night or in the same time slot.)

Like the event it portrays, Greenspan's masterpiece is truly a living, growing creation. "The Olympiad" first aired before the 1976 games as a 10-hour, 10-part PBS series. It was dramatically expanded to 22 one-hour episodes before it ran on ABC prior to the 1984 Olympics, and it has been further updated since the 1984 and 1988 games.

Episodes of "The Olympiad" focus on a variety of topics, among them, "The Marathon," "The Persistent Ones," "The Soviet Athlete," "The Fastest Men in the World" and "The Big Ones That Got Away," which airs Monday, Oct. 14, and includes highlights of the controversial 1972 gold-medal basketball game between the United States and the Soviet Union.

Two-time Olympic gold medal-winning swimmer Donna de Varona, who also spoke briefly at the screening, praised Greenspan's work, thanking him for capturing "the spirit of the athlete, for putting it into context."

In doing so, she spoke for us, as well.
