Valentine's Day 1989 was full of hate

For the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth.

Genesis

Valentine's Day; hearts and flowers, love and kisses, magic realism and murder:

The story so far: On February 14, 1989, the Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, Supreme Religious Leader of Iran and political leader since the revolution ousted the Shah for his pro-western policies, ordered all good muslims to murder novelist Ahmed Salman Rushdie and his publisher. The crime? The exercise of his imagination in a wonderful work of fiction called *The Satanic Verses*. Had the Ayatollah been less interested in demonstrating his power and more in imaginative literature, he should have known he'd picked on the wrong man. Rushdie is no ordinary novelist.

Born to a well-to-do family in Bombay just as India gained independence and was torn apart by intolerance and religious hatred. Rushdie was sent to England for a private school education at Rugby where he "suffered racial attacks and minor persecutions that felt major at the time". His family moved to Pakistan and he entered King's College, Cambridge where he learned of the fictional technique called 'magic realism' from such masters as James Joyce, Gunter Grass, John Barth and others.

'Magic realism' is an imaginative approach to storytelling which weaves the factual with the fantastical, myth and

dream with reality, historical people and places with surreal events. The technique has even entered pop culture through the successful television series *Twin Peaks* and *Northern Exposure*. But it can create problems for those who insist on one answer for each and every question, certainly over ambiguity — i.e. fundamentalists.

The passages in *The Satanic Verses* which infuriated the Ayatollah, concerned a despotic character who was and was not Muhammed dictating the messages he received from Allah to his scribe named Salman (not coincidentally). Salman believes with all his heart and soul but wants a demonstration of his master's wonderful powers and deliberately makes a small error in the transcription, fully confident his master would spot even the slightest mistake when it was read back to him. When the Prophet failed to notice Salman's alteration in the word of God, the scribe is shaken to the core and now needs his faith restored by a more glaring error — transcribing 'Jew' where 'Christian' is dictated. Again his master fails to notice and the scribe suffers agonies of conscience and flees in fear for his life.

This wasn't Rushdie's first metaphoric 'attack' on his

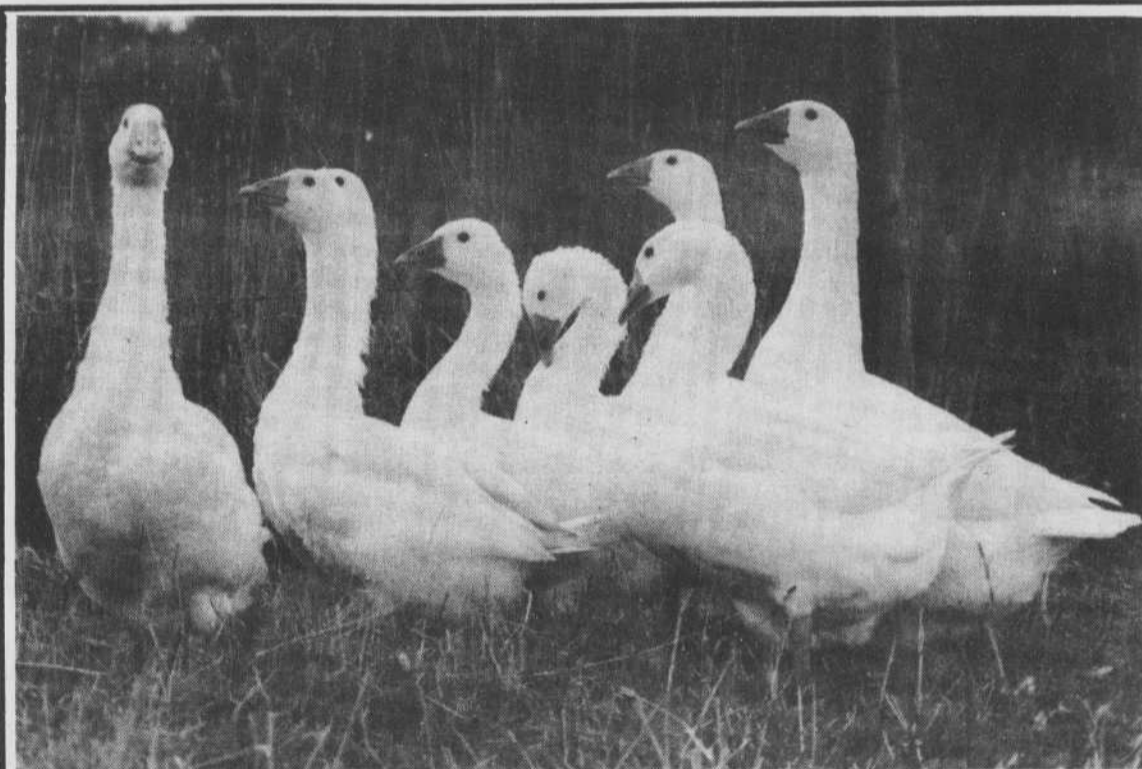
faith. In *Shame* which had won the Booker Award (the Commonwealth's most prestigious literary prize) and established him as a world-class novelist. He had created caricatures of General Zia and Ali Bhutto, and wrote; "So-called 'Islamic fundamentalism' does not spring in Pakistan from the people. It is imposed on them from above. Autocratic regimes find it useful to espouse the rhetoric of faith... That is how religions shore up dictators."

Khomeini may have felt that struck too close to home and chose to make an example of Rushdie with his death sentence which, of course, advertised *The Satanic Verses* beyond any

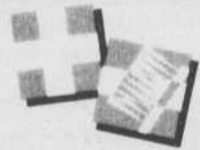
publicist's wildest dreams. It quickly sold over a million hardcover copies in 15 languages. Its publisher received over 5,000 threatening letters, 25 bomb threats and 5 'explosive devices' within the first year. Twenty countries banned the novel. Rioting killed many who'd never come within a mile of it. Tehran broke diplomatic relations with London when the British government refused to condemn the novelist or apologize for his fiction. In Canada, Joe Clark resisted pressure to ban it here and law students in Montreal petitioned Gil Remillard to prosecute Quebec muslims who had called publicly for Rushdie's murder.

"Nobody should be killed for writing a book," said Rushdie, but his Italian translator was stabbed in Milan and the Japanese translator murdered in Tokyo. Under the strain of isolation, Rushdie's marriage collapsed but he continued writing, and writing well. First *Haroun and the Sea of Stories* for his young son, a collection of essays titled *Imaginary Homelands*, then *East West*, a book of short stories in 1994, and *The Moor's Last Sigh* in 1995, which critics are acclaiming his best novel yet. Against all the odds Rushdie is not only still alive, but writing better than ever.

Khomeini is dead.

Champlain short plays festival hits the stage

LENNOXVILLE — Three new student-penned works will be featured at the Champlain Drama Club's second annual festival of short plays this weekend.

Wheat Kings by Kareem Fahmy, *Sorry — We Can't Use You* by Benjamin Lefebvre and *Subway* by Andy Hodge will be performed alongside works by professional playwrights William Saroyan (*Hello Out There*), A.R. Gurney, Jr. (*The Problem*) and Lawrence Langer (*Another Way Out*) when *Thespia* hits the stage at Bishop's University's Studio Theatre on Friday and Saturday.

Lefebvre said the plays illustrate a variety of experiences, although they are all about modern relationships.

His work, *Sorry — We Can't Use You*, charts the relationships that develop among a group of budding amateur actors working as extras on a movie set.

It is loosely based on the playwright's personal experience as an extra — for two days — on the movie *The Amateurs*, partially filmed in the Townships last summer.

"We waited and waited and waited — and we were paid," said Lefebvre, who was eventually used in a bar scene.

"We just sat around the bar and drank non-alcoholized beer and mouthed conversation."

Although it was somewhat tedious, Lefebvre was fascinated by the filmmaking process.

"It was interesting between takes to watch the camera, watch the director, setting up shots, moving equipment."

He was so enthused by it, Lefebvre, along with a few friends from the drama club, are planning to shoot their own video in May.

It is this kind of keen interest in the dramatic arts that the extra-curricular club nurtures.

Lefebvre said more and more students are participating in the club, particularly after the success of its first theatre festival, *Dramatix*, an ambitious venture which saw eight short plays presented in one night last year.

"And practically none of us are studying theatre. We're doing this because we want to," said Lefebvre.

The rest of the lineup also deal with the various aspects of love.

Hodge's *Subway* revolves around a young woman and the mysterious hooded figure she falls for after meeting him in a subway.

In his play *Wheat Kings*, Fahmy deals with issues such as young love, peer acceptance, divorce and self-doubt.

An unusual situation is presented in the comedy *The Problem*, by A.R. Gurney, Jr., when a husband only notices his wife's pregnancy in its final stages.

Although written in 1916, the farce *Another Way Out* seems to serve as a reflection of our times.

"It's about two people living together who are not married, but people act like are and they don't want to be respected, so they find people on the side," said Lefebvre.

Fahmy said the students in the club are continuously striving for excellence, using the players in the William Saroyan play he directs, *Hello Out There*, as examples.

"Benjamin (Tabah) and Karine (Bibeau) are young actors, they don't have a lot of experience, but they've taken the script beyond belief. They

perform at a level of excellency that amazes me," said Fahmy, adding the actors are required to express a range of emotions from light humor to desperation in the story of a young man imprisoned in a prison cell and the innocent girl he falls in love with.

Fahmy said he and the others in the cast have been planning to do this play for about a year.

"It's two lonely characters who come together and find take away their loneliness, which touches me," he said.

Nancy Catchpaw, who appears in *Another Way Out* and *Hello Out There* and directs *Subway*, said she has gained a great deal of experience being part of *Thespia*.

"I love theatre and it makes me develop more of myself," said Catchpaw, who also teaches theatre to elementary school children in Omerville.

Fahmy said one of the most gratifying aspects of being part of the club are the relationships that develop between its members.

"We started out as strangers and now we've become friends and confidantes," he said, adding the students are proud of the work being done at the festival.

"It's due to a level of commitment," Fahmy summed up. "It's a commitment you make for no other reason than it makes you feel good about yourself."

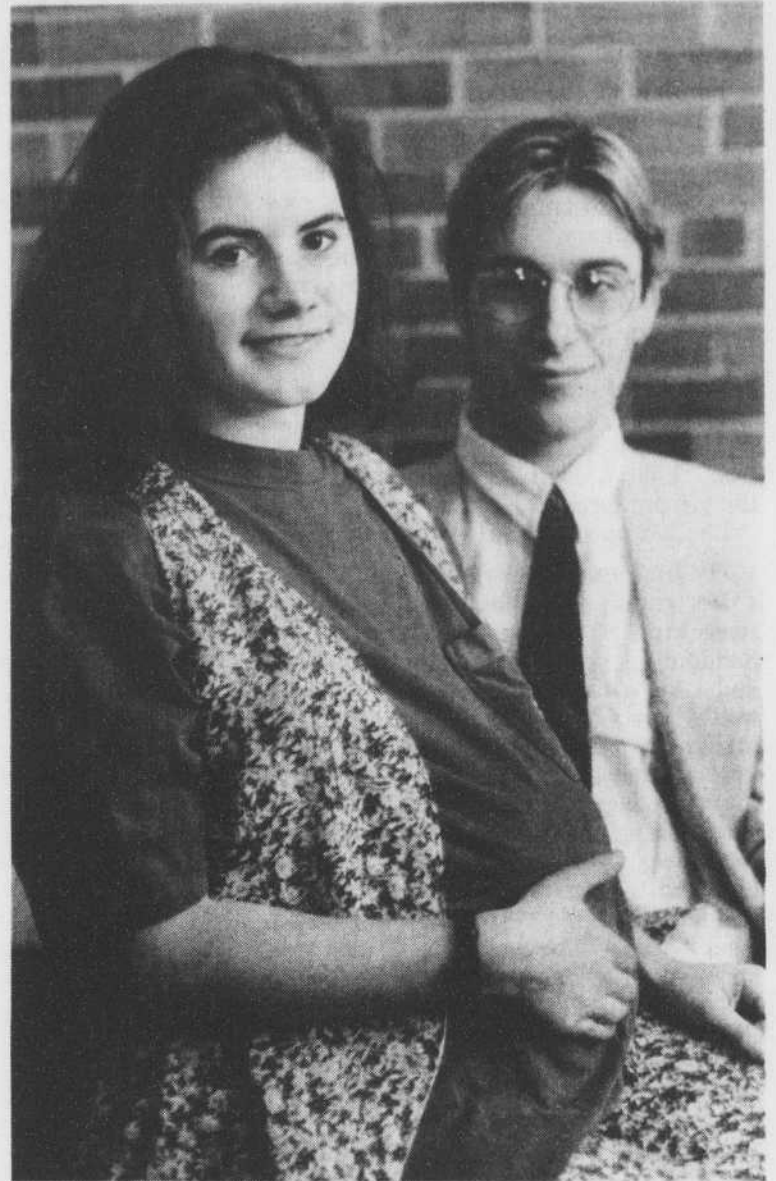
Fahmy and a couple of other students are hoping to take their love of theatre to the next level when they audition for the National Theatre School in a few weeks.

The club is also promoting the artistic collaboration of Champlain College and Bishop's University with several Bishop's students serving as

actors, directors and technicians in the festival this year.

Michelle MacCarthy and Christopher Forrest in *The Problem*.

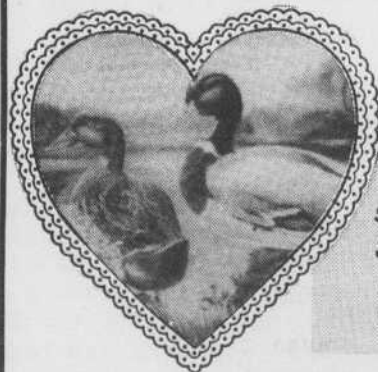

Lennoxville musicians reach for the stars

LENNOXVILLE — The concerto's the thing.

Two Lennoxville musicians are hitting new heights in their careers and their vehicle is the concerto.

Composer Andrew P. MacDonald is nominated for a Juno Award, honoring the best in Canadian music, for his work "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra", the centerpiece of the album *Canadian Music For Chamber Orchestra* performed by the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra as conducted by Simon Streatfeild.

Harpist Mary O'Keeffe is tackling one of the most technically challenging works written for her instrument — J.S. Bach's "Brandenburg Concerto no. 5" — as part of the *Orchestre de chambre de l'Estrie's Concertos and Divertissements* concert conducted by Claude Lapalme on Saturday night at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Sherbrooke.

Both musicians are at the peak of their art and both are characteristically modest about their accomplishments.

On Monday, it took Andrew P. MacDonald some time to realize why he had just been congratulated.

"Oh, oh the Juno," he said a few seconds later and laughed heartily. "The whole Juno thing hasn't hit me yet."

By Wednesday, the news had finally sunk in.

"It hit me, 'Yeah, this is kind of important'. I'm really quite pleased," he said. "Now the plan is to go down to the ceremony — and see who wins."

MacDonald is nominated for his first Juno in the category of Best Classical Composition. His piece, the 27-minute "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra", was written for violinist and concertmaster of the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra David Stewart, the featured soloist on the recording. It had its world premiere in Winnipeg in December, 1991.

MacDonald said he tried to infuse the work with a sense of fantasy.

"A typical concerto is three movements, but here each one is connected by cadenzas — wild virtuoso display passages of violin," MacDonald said. "So you have a sense of one big movement."

The composer alludes to the Quebec folk song "A la claire fontaine" in the second movement of the piece, hoping to stir up the emotions felt by Samuel de Champlain and his men when they sang it at the first meetings of the *Ordre de Bon temps* in 1608.

The album, MacDonald's fourth featuring his music, available in 35 countries on the prestigious Stockholm-based BIS label. It also features pieces by Newfoundland native

Michael Matthews, and the late Moscow-born composer Sophie-Carmen Eckhardt-Gramatté.

In his Juno category, MacDonald is nominated alongside well-known Canadian composers Chan Ka Nin ("I Think That I Shall Never See..."), Alexina Louie ("Music for Heaven and Earth"), Glenn Buhr ("Piano Concerto") and Harry Freedman ("Touchings").

"I'm honored to be included with that group of composers," said MacDonald, who recognizes how much work it has taken to get there. "That's the group I belong in now. I've been doing it for 20 years."

Born in Guelph, Ontario, MacDonald has won numerous national and international composition contests and has heard his work performed in England, Norway, France, the United States and Canada. He is a music professor at Bishop's University and co-founded the Townships contemporary music group Ensemble Musica Nova.

While his "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra" has yet to be performed in the area, another of MacDonald's works will receive its Quebec premiere at a Lennoxville concert.

The Gryphon Trio, composed of pianist Jamie Parker, violinist Annalee Patipatanikoon and cellist Roman Borys, will perform "In The Eagle's Eye" as part of their show at Centennial Theatre on April 20.

"I explored the ideas of distance in terms of an eagle flying high in the sky and zeros in on something in his vision and magnifies that in his mind," MacDonald said of his piece. "I was playing around with taking a motif and magnifying it."

Another MacDonald first

will take place in the fall. This time it's the world premiere of a new piano concerto played by the CBC Vancouver Orchestra.

It seems MacDonald simply never stops working. How does he do it?

"I make sure I get regular exercise and to get a good night's sleep ... That takes more time doesn't it?"

Harpist Mary O'Keeffe plays down the challenge of performing J.S. Bach's "Brandenburg Concerto no. 5".

When she saw the work performed in France a few years ago, O'Keeffe said she simply thought it would be a fun work to play.

But just as actors work towards performing great roles, musicians dream about playing challenging compositions, and there are few works of the style and scope of Bach's fifth "Brandenburg Concerto".

O'Keeffe is one of the featured soloists who will perform the concerto along with the group she co-founded in 1989, the *Orchestre de chambre de l'Estrie*, on Saturday at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Sherbrooke. The program will also feature "Divertissement for String Orchestra" by Pierre Mercure, "Concerto Grosso no. 1" by Ernest Bloch and the "Siegfried Idyll" by Richard Wagner.

O'Keeffe said the "Brandenburg Concerto" stands out because typically in baroque music, the harpsichord was written to be either an accompaniment or featured in a solo concerto.

"Here, Bach wrote in the accompanying role of the harpsichord and a solo role," said O'Keeffe while rehearsing on a concert harpsichord modelled after the French 18th-century style instrument at the Bis-

The Townships musicians joining O'Keeffe as soloists are flautist Marie Bergeron and violinist Marc Bélanger.

O'Keeffe said she enjoys the diversity in her work. She plays baroque music with the *Orchestre de chambre*, contemporary music with the *Ensemble Musica Nova*, she teaches music and also serves as the general manager of *Les Concerts Symphoniques de Sherbrooke*, the governing body of the *Orchestre de chambre*, the *Sherbrooke Symphony*, and the *Ensemble à vents de Sherbrooke*.

The Irish-born O'Keeffe said she did not appreciate Bach's music as a child, only growing to love it later in life.

"I like Bach and I like Germanic music on the whole, it's more abstract. Intellectually, it's so well-written. He also managed convey all sorts of styles, religious, secular, and he wrote music for almost every instrument ever invented."

O'Keeffe said she truly appreciates the sense of joy and optimism Bach infuses in his work.

"Even if it's a crucifixion scene, it's so beautifully written. You're not thinking of the emotion, 'It's so sad', etc., but 'Oh, what beautiful music'."

Canadian Music For Chamber Orchestra, featuring "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra" by Andrew P. MacDonald, is available at the Bishop's University bookstore and Archambault Music.

never for the glory or the wealth.

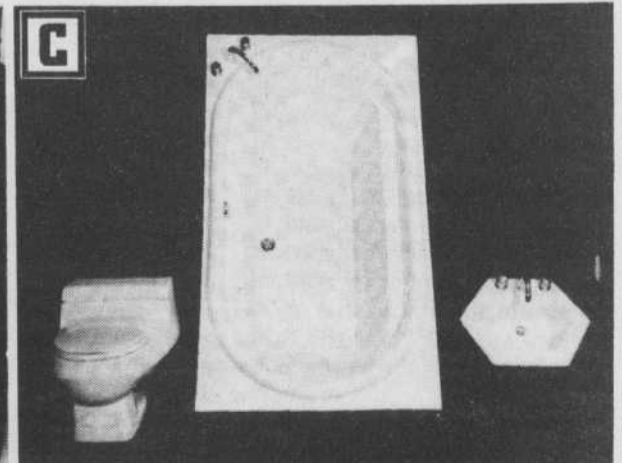
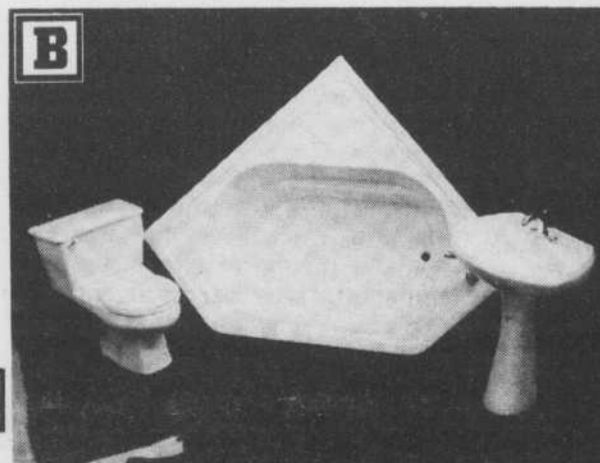
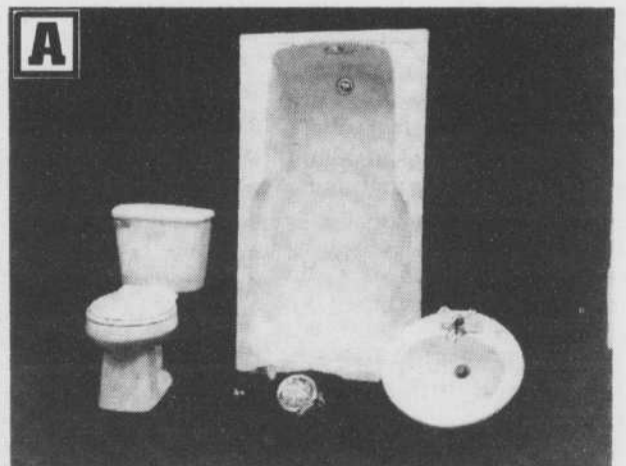

Exhibit to raise funds for women's shelter

COWANSVILLE — A group of Townships artists are helping raise funds for an organization dedicated to providing emergency food and shelter to women and children in difficulty.

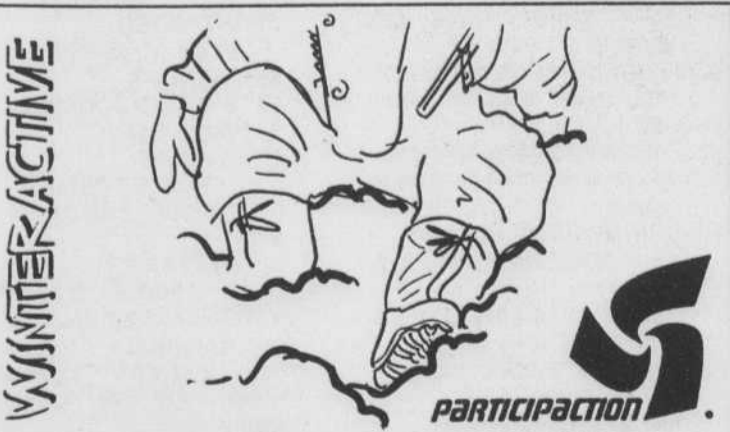
