**Canada

The federal government says mandatory random testing of travellers arriving at its four main airports will start again next week.

Ottawa paused the random testing of vaccinated travellers entering Canada by air on June 11, while it worked on moving the tests themselves locations outside of airports.

The government now says testing will resume as of July 19 for fully vaccinated travellers arriving at the Vancouver, Calgary, Montreal and Toronto airports.

It says all testing will be completed

**A splash of summer fun**

The City of Sherbrooke officially inaugurated its fourth splash pad on Thursday at the Coeur-Immaculé-de-Marie park in Fleurimont. The new water games take the place of the swimming pool that was closed due to its disrepair last summer, and were installed at a cost of roughly \$550,000

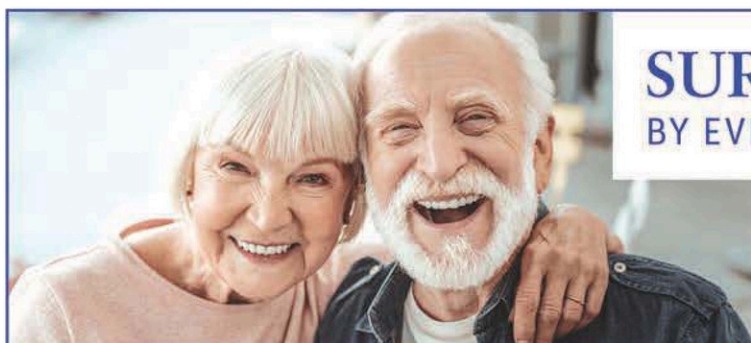
As is the case with the other three splash pads in the city, the new one uses a system that recycles and treats

the water being used to help reduce waste. Although this type of system is more costly than one that simply uses fresh water on a continual basis, Nancy Robichaud, Chairperson of the city's commission for culture, recreation, sports and outdoor activities, said that the decision was made to be in line with Sherbrooke's policies on responsible water use.

"It's not just something we felt like," "it would strange if we were telling people to limit watering their lawns or washing their driveways while wasting

water, ourselves, at the same time."

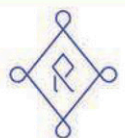
Even with the more expensive water system, Robichaud said that the maintenance cost for a splash pad is in the range of \$8,000 to \$10,000 per year compared to the \$20,000 to \$40,000 spend on the average municipal pool. Noting that the water games also don't require a staff of lifeguards, she argued that the new installation does a good job of meeting the needs of local families for a place to cool off and have fun without costing nearly as much.

# Sometimes a flyin' monkey ain't just a flyin' monkey!

### LENNOXVILLE LIBRARY

If you ask me, *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* should be ranked alongside other American foundational documents such as the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and the Gettysburg address. In terms of popular culture, few other works of fiction have become so ingrained in the American psyche. In its original book form, L. Frank Baum's tale of Dorothy, her wee dog Toto, and the brainless Scarecrow, heartless Tin Woodman, and Cowardly Lion beguiled audiences in the first part of the 20th century. Then, after its film release in 1939, the story grew in its influence in the video culture of the latter part of the century. Baum has been compared to Lewis Carroll (Dorothy does compare in many ways with Alice) but Baum's work is unmistakably American in image, theme, and significance.

Baum claimed that the basic storyline came to him plumb out of the blue, and he humbly offered it as a modern alternative to traditional moralistic fairy tales. He argued that modern education provided moral instruction enough and that children would appreciate pure entertainment, with "horrible and blood-curdling incidents" à la Brothers Grimm left by the wayside.

Methinks, Mr. Baum, thou didst protest too much! If we disregard for a moment the many dismemberments and decapitations that punctuate the action, along with the Wicked Witch of the West's dangerously servile Winkies and whimsically malevolent Flying Monkeys, we are still left with the fact that Baum was in effect holding a mirror up to contemporary American life.

The *Wonderful Wizard of Oz* was, indeed, a product of its times. Baum was born in 1856, so his life spanned the eras of Reconstruction and the Gilded

Age. The population of the United States, in spite of the losses in the Civil War, effectively doubled from 1850 to 1900. Millions of European immigrants flooded into the country to satisfy the growing need for skilled and unskilled labour. Wages increased, along with education levels and literacy. The West was settled and "civilized" in leaps and bounds. New settlers sought gold, land, minerals, and opportunities that were no longer available in Europe and the original colonies.

America also witnessed a spectacular technological revolution: the rail system expanded and new inventions and scientific discoveries—not least among them electricity, the telephone, improved and standardized means of production—reshaped the industrial landscape. The era was highlighted by the Chicago Exposition of 1893, a World's Fair that outclassed all others in its size, opulence, and audacity. It was the first entirely electrified event, and Baum was thought to have used it as a model for the City of Oz.

Regarding the stories, *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* (original version) differs in some important respects from the more famous 1939 film musical *The Wizard of Oz*. However, the main plotlines and characters are the same, and show the same thematic and allegorical tendencies. For example, what is the yellow brick road but a metaphor for the road taken by every conquistador, prospector, hunter, settler, entrepreneur who came into the new world seeking riches? And it is not too much of a stretch to see Tin Woodman and Scarecrow as metaphors for industrialism and agrarianism. The American Civil war was essentially a conflict between the meritocratic industrial North and the aristocratic agrarian South. Baum's fairy tale suggests that a union of industrialism (with a heart) and agrarianism (with a brain) is essential to American exceptionalism and ascendancy. Moreover, wherever the heroes venture on their quest, they encounter facsimiles of American frontier society—little thriving communities separated by expanses of scary wilderness, and quirky beasts that must be subdued.

("There goes Sheeran again, analysing a perfectly good story to death!" Shhhh! I've only just begun.)

The Cowardly Lion is almost certainly the hollow vestige of British dominion over the colonies, and he must be re-invented and re-invested with courage

as a catalyst to America's progress. Dorothy and Toto? Goodness, pluck, and waywardness in the quest for life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness...

As for the Wizard, he is the epitome of self re-invention. Employed in his youth in a circus as a balloonist, he slipped his moorings and drifted away to Oz. There he constructed his Wizard identity and the City of Oz through the use of ventriloquism, illusions, projections, papier-mâché figures (more elaborate tech in the film!) He is a testament to the enduring American fascination for the snake-oil salesman, the brash con-man (think Elmer Gantry, *The Music Man*, *The Rain Maker* for similar fictional iterations; Donald Trump, Steve Bannon, and Bernie Madoff for real-life examples.) The Wizard, like Baum, has thrown himself into the whirlwind of transformation and competition and built his fortunes through wit and panache. Baum had a try at many different ventures before he struck gold with Oz at the ripe old age of 44. By the time of his death in 1919, there was a veritable Oz industry, and syndicated Oz stories continued for years after.

To those who bridle at such a crass socio-political interpretation of a simple children's story, I would point out that Baum was a journalist for much of his life and never shied away from offering his opinions on current affairs. (His disturbing view on a final solution to the "problem" of Native Americans, for example, will take your breath away!)

Which brings us to the *Flying Monkeys*... I suggest you read the original and draw your own conclusions, but they were certainly in evidence on January 6th, 2020.

The *Wonderful Wizard of Oz* is available through interlibrary loan.

# Residents question Magog's proposed residential development project

A dispute between residents and city council over a proposed residential development is brewing in Magog, as two online petitions to stop the project have gained over 1,000 signatures.

Les Berges Hatley, a real estate project that includes 16 apartment buildings and 96 rental units on Hatley Street and along the Magog River, would cut through a large swath of forest in the city. And it hasn't been sitting well with long time residents, such as Rose Marie Morales.

"The city has really denied us any voice in the sense that they said they will continue negotiating with the promoter to arrive at a project that was good for all of us. And then at the open house, they presented something that, I mean, they took off one building," she said.

Magog held an open house on July 6 to give concerned residents an opportunity to speak to the city council, as well as promoter and land owner Patrick Crépeau. Morales was unsatisfied with the responses given to residents from the people in charge of green lighting the project.

While the project is in its sixth version, the only thing Crépeau changed this time around is bringing the number of apartment buildings down from 17 to 16, Morales explained. He still intends to use the entire forest, she continued, leaving only 10 metres to the riparian strip.

"There's a marsh at the end of this whole system and that marsh has herons, turtles [...] beavers. It's a high importance marsh, so it has to

be preserved, but if you cut the forest down without leaving a 50-metre band, those animals are going to disappear," said Morales.

Morales, who is a member of the development project opposition group and creator of the online petitions, is worried about the impact construction in the forest will have on local fauna. She has been trying to get her hands on an environmental report conducted by the promoter.

According to Morales, Crépeau's environmental report was done in 2021. She wants to look at the report to see if there were any recommendations regarding contamination or endangered species. However, the city has no control over this, she said, the findings belong to Crépeau.

When Morales asked Crépeau to release the report to the public, he flat out said no, she told The Record. And it has raised suspicion within the community. He has every right to deny the request, Morales noted, but, she added, if he has nothing to hide, then he should release it.

"We're very suspicious that obviously why does he want to deny us access? If there's nothing incriminating in the report that kind of puts his project in question, the way he wants to develop, occupying the whole forest, then why wouldn't he just give us access," she asked.

Morales also realizes that although the petitions have combined for over 1,000 signatures, not everyone signing the petition is a Magog resident. It's a public petition, open to anyone, but it doesn't take away from the fact that a significant number of people want to protect the forest.

"We have two petitions and there's a total of more than 1,000. For sure when you put a petition online like that you have people not just from Magog answering, right? But I mean a lot of them could be visitors, after all, Magog is a very touristic town and their voice counts too," she said.

And while Crépeau plans to keep the bicycle path slicing through the forest, Morales only sees it as a minor victory overall. There aren't many places in the city for old folks, families, cyclists and people with reduced mobility to enjoy nature, she said, and this would eliminate an option.

Morales added that city green spaces are an important part of combating the climate crisis. They help reduce climate change, she explained, adding environmental experts at the open house said if the forest were to disappear, it would impact the temperature and pollution.

"I've been finding out that our laws in Quebec stink. Public access to information is very limited. Our environmental laws are the strictest minimum, so it's up to municipalities to impose stricter measures because the Ministère de l'Environnement covers very little," said Morales.

Magog Mayor Nathalie Pelletier told The Record that she has listened to the concerned citizens. However, she believes they're in the minority. In a phone interview Thursday, Pelletier said the project is largely supported by the council and the greater Magog population.

The opposition group isn't against housing initiatives, though. Morales simply wants to find common ground with Crépeau and Magog to protect

the forest's ecosystem. She suggests the city and promoter find another location for the project. But Pelletier is backing the promoter.

And the mayor told The Record that the apartments will be strictly residential, not another Airbnb. She said the development is also subject to the Plan d'implantation et d'intégration architecturale (PIIA), which gives Magog the ability to ensure the quality of the buildings.


Crépeau has also reduced the number of parking spaces, Pelletier added, and both the promoter and the city are working in tandem to ensure the project doesn't turn into an urban heat island. Magog needs housing, she continued, and this is a viable option for the city.

"It's in the urban perimeter. We need housing, the territory belongs to him, and he is on his sixth version of the plan, and he always wants to make it better, but at the same time he wants to start building, and he's allowed to build because he's the property owner," said Pelletier.

outside of airports for unvaccinated people as well as those who are fully or partially vaccinated.

The government initially paused the tests while facing a barrage of criticism from tourism and air travel industry groups that felt federal public health measures were responsible for the chaotic state of Canada's airports.

At the time, The Canadian Travel and Tourism Roundtable all but begged federal ministers to lift the test requirement permanently, claiming the "outdated rules" were causing serious delays at customs, missed flights, hours-long lineups and soured Canada's reputation.

Airport chaos has continued in the weeks since the testing was suspended.

Deputy chief public health officer Dr. Howard Njoo said Thursday the random tests are an important part of Canada's strategy to detect new variants coming in to the country.

"It's important to know about this in order to formulate other recommendations," Njoo said in French at a press conference where he announced the approval of a pediatric COVID-19 vaccine.

Chief public health officer Dr. Theresa Tam has said in the past that the airport tests act as an "early warning system,"

for new variants.

The testing will be completed either at an in-person appointment at select testing locations or via a virtual appointment for a swab test.

Travellers who are not fully vaccinated must test on both the first and eighth days of their mandatory 14-day quarantine, unless exempt.

Fully vaccinated travellers will be randomly selected for testing upon arrival at the four biggest airports, and sent to an off-site location for the test to be completed.

## Not pulling any punches

Immediate action is needed to save life on Earth

There are many conversations about how to reduce your individual carbon footprint. The usual ways, such as having a plant-based diet, flying far less, going car-free, buying green energy, driving an electric car, using a clothes line and of course recycling, all help, but one thing is leaps and bounds beyond any of these actions.

An article in the journal *Science* spells out the various reductions for

your carbon footprint from doing the kinds of thing I've listed above, but the title, "The best way to reduce your carbon footprint is the one your government is not telling you about," concerns having fewer children. [<https://tinyurl.com/science-best-way>]

I should strongly emphasize that having fewer children in North America contributes far more towards mitigating climate breakdown and biodiversity loss than in places like Tanzania or Burma, whose people by and large never take planes, use a dryer for their clothes or eat large quantities of meat. In other words over-consumption doesn't plague their societies, but it certainly does ours: generally speaking, each child born in the west goes on to have a large carbon footprint. This is why the global south wants the global north to help it out as it fights climate breakdown, and this has been a huge point of contention between G20 countries and other, non-industrialized ones. It isn't a subject that is popular with the Republicans or

the US Supreme Court, which recently told the Environmental Protection Agency that it cannot regulate carbon emissions from US coal energy power stations. But Canada – and particularly the US, as well as much of the rest of the world – needs to have those discussions regarding population, inequality and climate/biodiversity justice, and this must stop being a taboo subject.

This brings me to World Population Day, held each July 11 since 1987, when the human population reached 5 billion. The UN Population Fund had this to say about the 2022 figure of 8 billion: "Focusing only on population numbers and growth rates often leads to coercive and counterproductive measures and the erosion of human rights, for example, to women being pressured to have children or prevented from doing so. It can deepen already acute inequalities, such as through policies shutting down reproductive health care or denying adequate pensions for the elderly, further marginalizing the most disenfranchised."

It is not global population numbers, then, that are key to turning around climate and biodiversity crises, but rather how governments have refused to enact laws that reduce greenhouse gas emissions or protect Nature. Although rich countries love to say that births are below replacement levels in their countries, pollution keeps rising. Extreme consumerism exploits poor people, mining destroys their native lands and pollutes rivers for gold, and cutting rare trees for export always leaves a trail of tragedy.

Either regulatory agencies in governments are not enforcing their own regulations, or they refuse to legislate powerful laws that can then rein in over-consumption. Let's take cruise ships as an example of excessive grotesque overconsumption and Canada's poor regulations to protect British Columbia's coastal inhabitants. According to a new report, US cruise ships leave their west coast waters to dump their toilet sludge and highly toxic chemicals into Canadian waters and then return to Alaska, where such activities are illegal. Marine life is constantly being put at risk because the Canadian government can't get its act together. [<https://tinyurl.com/canada-cruise-ship-pollution>]

Two weeks ago, in my article "Critical UN biodiversity summit comes to Montreal," I pointed out how important it is for us all to work together to stop biodiversity loss. Collaboration is the only way forward. There must be high-level political leadership in the fight to save Nature. With this in mind, a new UN report by the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) makes it very clear

that many of the world's populations rely directly on a healthy ecosystem. One in five people, it concludes, rely on wild species for income and food, more than 10,000 wild species are harvested directly for food, and 2.4 billion (1 in 3) people depend on fuel wood for cooking. [<https://tinyurl.com/IPBES-wild-species>]

Inger Andersen, executive director of the UN Environment Programme, commented on the report: "Today one million species are at risk of extinction, and the unsustainable, illegal and unregulated use of species is a large part of the problem. For example, the illegal wildlife trade is a \$23 billion annual business that lines the deep pockets of a few unscrupulous individuals. These people get rich at the expense of Nature and ecosystems."

Both the 2019 and the May 2022 IPBES reports are critical for negotiations at the Montreal COP15 biodiversity summit in December this year as they set out the sustainable use of plants and animals in the face of the exploitation and outright extinction of many species. Illegal fishing and wildlife trade, along with certification of forests, must include recognizing Indigenous people's rights to the land, and acknowledgement of their proven ability to be ecological stewards of wilderness.

Strict individual carbon budgets that limit a rich North American's capability to destroy this planet's ecological balance are essential. Clearly we don't have the capacity to forgo our increasing desires that ultimately trash the planet. Most of us by the age of 45 will have used up that budget in order to go on cruise ships or airplanes. There is no other choice but to regulate people's selfish destructive consumerism. An individual carbon budget would also get smaller and smaller as the human population grows, leaving a more equitable share of the world budget for all people.

Transgressing planetary boundaries, whether that be related to climate, biodiversity, freshwater use or ocean acidification, to name just a few critical aspects of planetary limits if we are to live safely on the Earth, has brought humanity to an alarming juncture: societal collapse is now more than an abstract possibility. The UN's Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction report in May this year determined that we must drastically reduce our risks. A strong positive response to the COP15 summit from all nations, corporations and individuals will reduce those risks. We live close by. Give a helping hand in Montreal this December.

Noam Chomsky put it succinctly: "The challenge ahead is beyond anything humans have ever faced. The fate of life on the planet is now at hand."

Neil opened Sherbrooke Steam Laundry—the first commercial laundry service in Sherbrooke—on King Street in 1890. In 1894, he moved his business to Frontenac Street and, in 1902, sold it to E.M. Terry and A.R. Smith. In 1920, the business was once again sold to E.A. Lothrop, who owned competing laundry businesses in Sherbrooke. The business changed names several times after its acquisition by Lothrop: Sherbrooke Laundry & Dry Cleaners Ltd. in 1927, Sherbrooke Laundry Inc. in 1967, Buanderie Sherbrooke Laundry Inc. in 1969, and Buanderie Sherbrooke Inc. in 1991.

# Fever Fest returns to Maysen Manor

**F**ever Fest returns to Maysen Manor this summer on July 23 and 24, starting each day at 1 p.m.

Its host John Maysenhoelder, AKA Johnny Fever, has been running the event in his backyard for over ten years now, and is starting it up again after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic.

The music festival for charity features a party and live performances throughout the day with every dollar raised going towards various non-profits.

“At one point it was just a party, but it started to get really big. We decided if we’re going to do this much work it should be for the benefit of something. We started putting a bucket in front of the stage and the bucket got filled,” said Maysenhoelder.

Since then, he’s held it year after year with all the artists volunteering their acts, and he provides the venue.

“The fun thing about this, especially with having that many bands in a short amount of time, is I have all the equipment. I put out a 10,000-watt power fountain, the backline is all there, people just come with their guitars, plug in and start playing. I make it easy for the musicians and that’s what they appreciate.”

This year has 13 bands with some, like Gypsy Soul, having played every single event Maysenhoelder ever held, coming back year after year to jam out

for a good cause.

“I pass the word around April/May: who wants to play? This year it took about five minutes and all the slots were full because nobody has played for two years; people are itching.”

This year donations along with raffles and food all have their profits going towards the Lennoxville Pet Connection, Alzheimer’s Society and Red Cross.

“The backyard can fit 200 to 300 people no problem, plenty of parking, and it’s all for charity. The bands all play for free and whatever money we can generate, we give it all to the three charities. Usually, we do two but with everything going on in Europe we added the Red Cross.”

Maysenhoelder said people are encouraged to bring their chairs and that whatever drinks they have should be in cans.

“One year we did have a food truck and I’ll never do that again because it essentially took all the money that was going to be donated! A poutine is like \$14 so instead of putting \$20 in the bin they’d put \$5 in and have a poutine. So this year we’re going to have a big barbecue with hotdogs. It’s a huge commercial barbecue so if you bring your own meat, I’ll cook that for you too.”

Despite the crowd, cans, and food, Maysenhoelder said he’s had no issues with the event over the years.

“It’s funny, at the end of the night on Saturday, it’s a pretty raunchy

night with beer cans everywhere, but by the end of the night at 11 there’s not a single can or piece of garbage on the ground; everyone picks up after themselves. It’s my backyard, people realize that!”

When asked where the name ‘Johnny Fever’ came from, Maysenhoelder responded with a laugh: “That’s a name that stuck to me probably about 30 years ago. I was a young kid playing guitar and my older brother’s friends were like ‘ah you’re Johnny Fever, WKRP;’ it just kind of stuck like that.

I use it on Facebook to separate it from myself but everyone knows who I am anyways!”

The event, despite not being commercially advertised is a public one with Mr. Fever only encouraging a charity donation for those thinking of showing up.

“It’s always been more or less ‘do I know you and do you know somebody I know.’ I’m not advertising at large, I’m advertising in my circle, but all people are welcome to come.”

## Local hidden gems: The Pioneer Trail

**W**hen I asked my friend to join me in exploring the life-size silhouette character cut-outs in the Coaticook, Memphremagog, and New Hampshire regions, she was immediately interested. “To be completely honest, I’ve drove around here for years but I never knew what those characters were about,” said Renee Rosteius, who lives in Sherbrooke but often travels throughout the Townships due to work.

With local gas prices finally dropping to under \$2/litre, she agreed to accompany me to learn about the mysterious figures. A colleague from The Record informed me they are part of the Pioneer Trail, a 230km historical circuit that features 25 sculptures portraying people who have left their mark on the area.

Using the map provided on the Table de concertation Culturelle de la MRC de Coaticook website, we decided that our first stop would be at the Parc des Lions de Compton. We were met with an empty seating area surrounding the silhouette along with a clean, well-maintained garden.

We pressed the “English” button located on the Corten steel plate of the silhouette, and began to hear the words of voice actresses portraying Marie-Ange Vaillancourt-Genest (1901-1997) and Estelle Bureau (1922-2007).

“Now remind us, how many years

was it that you were the organist at St. Thomas Aquinas?,” said Bureau’s voice actress. “Oh my dear child,” said Vaillancourt-Genest’s voice actress, “I played the organ for 30 years and I was the choir leader. We had some fine voices in the parish.”

The pair chatted for about five minutes about their impressive lives and the history of the area. Both women were involved in the community and the economic development of Compton at a time where women of their generation led lives more removed from public view. We learned that Bureau was a community nurse, school-board-counselor, and member of the board of directors of many organizations in Compton including the Credit Union and the Agricultural Cooperative. Along with being an organist, Vaillancourt-Genest joined her husband in creating Compton Credit Union, which she was also a manager of.

Afterwards, we followed the map and went down the road to “meet” the silhouette of Matthew Henry Cochrane. This was one of our favourite stops of the circuit in terms of landscape, as the sculpture stood in front of picturesque rolling hills.

“Glad to see you in Compton. It is a beautiful area, and I am proud to have contributed to its development,” Cochrane’s voice actor began. I won’t spoil too much of the history—you’ll have to figure that out yourself!

Our time spent visiting sculptures

went smoothly, the only hitch being that the sound on George Gale’s sculpture in Waterville did not seem to be working, although that may have been a user error. We were satisfied, though, when we discovered pictures and information about Gale on the Table de concertation Culturelle de la MRC de Coaticook website, which provided us with the knowledge we were looking for and added an extra visual element.

One thing we agreed on was the

beauty of the drive, as getting from one point to another was a delight. Discovering familiar towns in a new way amounted to a great time to spend the evening. Although we did not complete the entire circuit, we will return for more!

She was born in St-Mathias de Bonneterre and she could sing before she could walk or talk. This might be a tad bit exaggerated, but the truth is that Nancy Perusse is one talented songstress.

# Plenty happening at the Centre des arts de Stanstead

July is a busy month at the Centre des arts de Stanstead, with a double exhibition happening at Ye Old Blacksmith's (Vieux Forgeron) Art Gallery and a play scheduled for the end of the month at the Stone Circle Park.

Running until July 24 is a show featuring the watercolours and oil paintings of Alexandra MacDougall entitled *Flashed of Light*, happening alongside a photo exhibition, *Sacred Journey of the Heart: Ireland*, by Kim Prangley.

Alexandra MacDougall's *Flashes of Light* is her most recent series of paintings based on her observations of nature in the countryside near her home in the Eastern Townships. ## Work to keep him off the lead

Some card combinations are as safe as Fort Knox if one opponent attacks the suit but are like a leaky boat if the other opponent leads it. One simple example is king-doubleton opposite two low cards. With a lead around to the king, you must win a trick. With a lead through the king, you are only 50-50.

Some of these positions are less obvious, though. In this deal, how should South play in three no-trump after West leads a fourth-highest heart four?

South’s opening bid was slightly eccentric, but he knew his partnership had a way to show a long club suit if his partner used a Stayman inquiry - which is exactly what happened.

The suit that is most troublesome to South is spades. If East leads a spade, South should be held to one trick only. West will win the first round with the queen, and the defenders will duck the second round to declarer’s now-bare ace. However, if West leads a spade, declarer is guaranteed two tricks. So, trying to keep East off the lead, declarer called for dummy’s heart jack rather than running the lead around to his 10. When it held, declarer immediately led dummy’s club. When East played low, South finessed his 10. (Note that it

would not have helped East to split his honors.)

With the actual distribution, this was remarkably successful. Declarer continued clubs, establishing nine tricks: one spade, two hearts, one diamond and five clubs. However, even if the club finesse had lost, declarer still would have been in a good position to make his contract.

Always fight to keep the danger hand off the lead.
