**LE BRETON FLATS**—The present  
 eastern terminus of the Canada Cen-  
 tral railway, is situated on the Chaudière  
 and Victoria islands, county of Carleton.  
 It forms part of the city of Ottawa, and is  
 a most important place. It contains an  
 extensive foundry and iron work shop,  
 a carding and fulling mill, several flour  
 mills, and eight large saw and planing  
 mills. Hundreds of men are employed in  
 these mills, and millions of feet of lumber  
 are annually sawn. Its water privileges  
 are unsurpassed. The trains of the Canada  
 Central railway now run daily between  
 here and Carleton Place, connecting at  
 the latter station with the Brockville and  
 Ottawa railway. It is intended, however,  
 to extend the road into the city and to  
 erect a depot near the Rideau canal. Dis-  
 tant from the Lower Town of Ottawa 13  
 mile, from Prescott, the junction of the  
 Grand Trunk and St Lawrence and Otta-  
 wa railways, 66 miles, from Brockville 65  
 miles, from Montreal 168 miles, from  
 Toronto 264 miles. Population about 2000.

**LONDON**—The westernmost city in the Dominion of Canada, is beautifully situated on the river Thames, county of Middlesex. It is the chief seat of the county, and honestly boasts a more rapid and prosperous growth than any city in British North America. Forty years ago its present site was a wilderness; now it is a fine city, regularly laid out, having wide streets, well built upon with handsome buildings, and has the best of railway communication with all parts of Canada and the United States. By bestowing on its streets, bridges and surroundings, familiar names to former residents of the metropolis of the world—such as, among others, Pall Mall, Bond, Piccadilly, Oxford, Waterloo, and Clarence streets, Westminster and Blackfriars' bridges, &c.—it endeavors to cluster round it fond recollections of its great namesake. Its situation has justly earned for it the title of the "Forest city." It is surrounded by a rich agricultural district, which furnishes it with a large trade in wheat and other produce. In the city are a number of manufactories, mills, machine shops, foundries and breweries, while immediately outside its limits are very extensive petroleum refineries. These all give employment to a large body of men, and

add greatly to the wealth and importance of the city. Richmond and Dundas are the principal business streets. Some of the buildings on these, as on other streets throughout the city, give evidence of good architectural design and beauty in construction and finish. On Richmond street is the City hall, Post office, Montreal Telegraph Company's office, Custom house, Bank of Montreal, Bank of British North America, Merchants Bank of Canada, Canadian Bank of Commerce, Cronyn hall, St. Peter's church, R. catholic, St. James church (the Kirk), and St. Paul's cathedral. The latter is a handsome brick structure, and possesses a lovely chime of bells, the sound of which must tend to revive the reminiscences of many who lived in the old land. Covent Garden market is situated on King street, the Court house, Gaol and Law offices on Ridout street, and throughout the city are churches of all denominations, schools, colleges, masonic, odd fellows, and temperance lodge rooms, &c. On Great Market street is the Crystal palace, a fine building erected for exhibition purposes, and attached to which are large and well adapted show grounds. On an eminence in the northern part of the city, surrounded by extensive grounds, is Huron college, established in 1863, Hellmuth college, established 1865, and Hellmuth Ladies college, established 1869. These are all fine brick structures, and have at their head the Lord Bishop of Huron. The best of professors are attached to each, and the highest branches of education are taught. To the energy and zeal of the Dean of Huron, Dr. Hellmuth, is this section of the Dominion due for the successful establishment of the two excellent institutions bearing his name. Four railway companies run their trains through the city, the Grand Trunk, Great Western, London and Port Stanley, and New York Central, a third rail having been placed on the Great Western road for the accommodation of the latter. The stations and offices of these companies are situated between York and Bathurst streets. The depot of the Great Western is a large, fine brick building. This company have also extensive workshops here. Opposite their depot, on Richmond street, is the Tecumseh house, one of the largest hotels in the Province. On the corner of Richmond and King streets is the Revere house, and on Dundas street, near Richmond, is Strong's well known hotel. A short distance from these hotels, at the foot of Dundas street, are the White Sulphur Springs, the famed medicinal and health invigorating qualities of which attract large numbers of invalids and tourists during the summer months. London is lighted by gas, is a port of entry, has a Board of Trade, and has three daily, besides several weekly, newspapers. A number of its business men, and others employed in the city, reside in Westminster and Petersville, beautiful districts surrounding the city and situated on the opposite banks of the river Thames. Distant from Port Stanley 24 miles, from Stratford 32 miles, from Chatham 45 miles, from Sarnia 61 miles, from Hamilton 76 miles, from Detroit 110 miles, fare \$3.50; from Toronto 115 miles, fare \$3.00; from Montreal 453 miles, fare \$10. Mails daily. Money Order office and savings bank. Population, of city proper, about 17,000; including suburban districts, about 20,000.

\* **NIAGARA FALLS**—This, the most  
 stupendous cataract on the face of the  
 globe, is situated on the Niagara river  
 between Lakes Erie and Ontario, in the  
 township of Stamford, county of Welland.  
 It is a great resort of the tourist and in-  
 valid, and is annually visited by thou-  
 sands from all parts of the earth. It  
 presents a scene of marvellous grandeur.  
 For a mile above the Falls, the river gra-  
 dually descends some fifty feet, then  
 plunges 165 feet perpendicularly and rushes  
 onward through a narrow gorge until it  
 reaches Queenston, a distance of seven  
 miles: from here it glides peacefully into  
 Lake Ontario. About a mile below the  
 falls, spanning the mighty chasm of Ni-  
 agara, uniting the territories of two dif-  
 ferent governments, sustaining the great  
 railroad traffic of Canada and the United  
 States, 250 feet above a flood of water  
 which man has never yet been able to  
 fathom, stands the Niagara Railway Sus-  
 pension bridge, one of the grandest  
 achievements of art in the world. Delicate  
 as lace work, and seemingly light and  
 airy, it hangs there, high between heaven  
 and the boiling flood below, more solid  
 than the earth beds of adjacent railways.  
 The concussion of fast moving trains are  
 sensibly felt miles off through solid  
 rocky soil, but a freight train travers-  
 ing the Nigara Suspension bridge, at  
 the speed of five miles an hour, commu-  
 nicates no jar to passengers walking upon  
 the carriage way below. The land cables  
 of the bridge do not tremble under it—  
 the slight concussions of the superstruc-  
 tion do not go over the summits of the  
 towers. Fast anchored with stone, and  
 rooted in solid rock cut down to the depth  
 of twenty-five feet, the great cables are  
 immovable by any mechanical force inci-  
 dental to the use of the bridge, or the  
 natural influences it is subject to. The  
 ultimate strength of these cables is 12,400

tons. The total weight of the material of  
 the bridge, and of the traffic to which it  
 will ordinarily be subjected is 2,262 tons,  
 to sustain which the engineer has pro-  
 vided in his beautiful and scientific struc-  
 ture, a strength of 12,400 tons. So solid is  
 this bridge in its weight, its stiffness, and  
 its staying, that not the slightest motion  
 is communicated to it by the severest  
 gales of wind that blow up through the  
 narrow gorge which its spans. The fol-  
 lowing are some interesting particulars in  
 regard to the structure:—Length of span  
 from centre to centre of towers 822 feet;  
 height of tower above rock on American  
 side 88 feet; height of tower above rock,  
 Canada side, 78 feet; height of tower  
 above floor of railway, 60 feet; number of  
 wire cables 4; diameter of each cable 10  
 inches; number of No. 9 wires in each  
 cable 3,569; ultimate aggregate strength of  
 cables 12,400 tons; weight of superstruc-  
 ture 750 tons; weight of superstructure  
 and maximum loads 1,250 tons; ultimate  
 supporting strength 730 tons; height of  
 track above water 250 feet; base of towers  
 16 feet square; top of towers 8 feet  
 square; length of each upper cable  
 1,256½ feet; length of each lower cable  
 1,190 feet; depth of anchor pits below  
 surface of rock 30 feet; number of sus-  
 penders 624 feet; ultimate strength of sus-  
 penders 18,720 tons; number of overfloor  
 stays 64 tons; aggregate strength of  
 stays 1,920 tons; number of river stays  
 56½ aggregate strength of stays 1,680; eleva-  
 tion of railway track above middle stage  
 of river 245 feet; total length of wires  
 4,090 miles. The weights of the materials  
 in the bridge are as follows: Timber  
 919,130 lbs; wrought iron and suspen-  
 ders 113,120 lbs; castings 44,332; rails  
 66,740; cables (between towers) 535,400 lbs;  
 total 1,687,722 lbs. While crossing the  
 Niagara river a view of the stupendous  
 falls can be obtained, as also of the rushing  
 waters immediately beneath the bridge,  
 which at this point are broken up by  
 rocks, and rise in foaming waves to turbu-  
 lence extreme.
