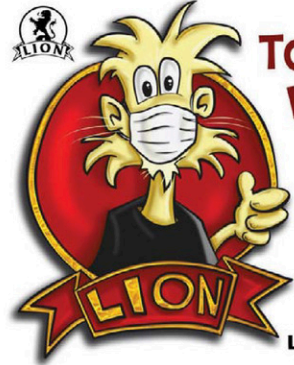

Quebec premier says bars could close following recent increase in COVID 19 cases

Quebec Premier Francois Legault said Thursday he is concerned by the rise in COVID-19 infections as the province reported the highest single-day increase in confirmed cases since mid-June.

Legault said the province's director of public health is analyzing the situation and will make a recommendation soon about whether to close bars and nightclubs following a recent string of outbreaks in the Montreal area linked to those venues.

"At this moment, we haven't ruled out closing the bars," Legault told reporters in Carleton, Que., in the Gaspesie region.

Quebec reported 142 new cases of COVID-19 Thursday, the largest single-day increase since June 12, and 10 new deaths, nine of which occurred in

Bridge issue divides North Hatley

A bridge too far? Residents, politicians and local merchants gathered at three successive meetings Wednesday evening at

North Hatley town hall to hear from experts of the Ministère des Transports du Québec (MTQ) about the coming demolition and reconstruction of the bridge at the centre of town.

The project divides the town in more ways than one. Lake Massawippi

narrows and flows out through the village centre into the Massawippi River, neatly dividing the village in two - with stores, services, residences, parks and recreation facilities on each side of the divide. Local residents cross

The Emperor's Children



GOOD READS

LENOXVILLE LIBRARY

This bestseller, written in 2006 by award-winning author Claire Messud... "Ummm, Clair WHO?" You are probably saying right now. "Why haven't I ever heard of her if she has won awards?" Dunno, because she is a really good writer, inspiring one New York Times Book Review critic to hail her as a writer of "near miraculous perfection." This book, her third, was a New York Times, Los Angeles Times, and Washington Post Best Book of the Year recipient. Her first novel, *When the World Was Steady*, and her book of novellas, *The Hunters*, were both finalists for the PEN/Faulkner Award, and her second novel, *The Last Life*, was a Publishers Weekly Best Book of the Year and Editor's Choice at *The Village Voice*. All four books were named New York Times Notable Books of the Year.

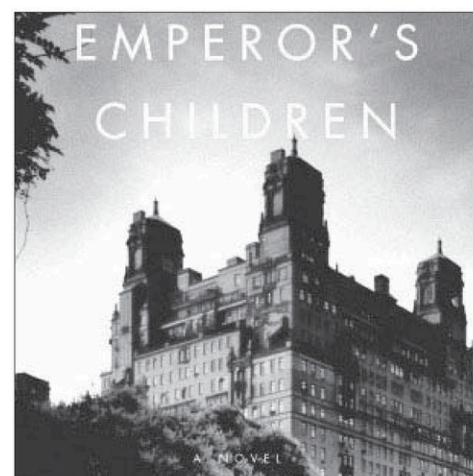
As you can see, her literary pedigree is very solid indeed, and deservedly so. Ms. Messud writes dazzling, dense, often challenging prose, sprinkled with literary references and symbols. It is best read slowly and in large chunks, or you are likely to lose your way navigating the 67 chapters that make up the novel, which spans a 10-month period during in the recent past. This author is particularly well known for her insight into strong female characters, and this is amply demonstrated by the depiction of the two principal players in *The Emperor's Children*. Danielle Minkoff and Marina Thwaite, former college friends both aged 30 and now living in NYC, are trying to establish careers in the arts. Marina, a budding journalist and native New Yorker who has moved home to the upper West Side for financial reasons, is hampered by an overly close relationship with her father, Murray. An odious poseur, Murray Thwaite is a well-respected but shallow and self-absorbed journalist

and general pundit who exemplifies the term "entitled." Danielle, originally from the Midwest, has maintained her close friendship with Marina over the ten years since graduation, and she is hoping to become a TV producer in the broadcast capital of the east coast, but it is no easy task. The third member of this Brown University alumni group is Julius Clarke, a gay Asian-American freelance critic, whose overriding goals in life are to find true love and acceptance, and make enough money to afford life in NY. The three friends are used to relying heavily on one another for support and advice, but find themselves increasingly at an emotional distance as their lives move forward in unexpected ways, and they each tumble into serious—and in two cases—destructive relationships.

Entering this mix is 19-year-old Frederick "Bootie" Tubb, Murray's socially inept nephew, who is living with his widowed mother in upstate Watertown. A college dropout, intellectual snob and unapologetic slob, he is foisted onto the Thwaite household in a misguided effort to get him out of small town suburbia and into a good school. A self-described autodidact, Bootie has no actual ambition to return to school, and has discovered his true calling is to educate himself, and to be "completely honest" in his endeavors, no matter the outcome. In this, he is helped along by Uncle Murray, who, motivated by guilt, gives him a job as his secretary and opens the door, literally, to Bootie's snooping and eventual ill-advised decision to expose his uncle for the fraud that he is.

In the final 10 chapters of the novel, just as the reader has become truly caught up in the trials and tribulations of Murray, Marina, Danielle, Julius and Bootie, the story takes a sharp and unexpected turn into the world events unfolding around them.

In addition to carefully crafting her main characters, Messud does an excellent job with her secondary players as well. Murray's wife, the dedicated, socially conscientious lawyer Annabelle, is especially well-drawn, as is Ludovic Seely, the ambitious Australian magazine founder/editor who eventually becomes part of the Thwaite household by marrying Marina. Bootie's long-suffering mother, Judy, relegated to life in Watertown, although a minor player in the story, also comes across as very real and particularly sympathetic. Even Aurora, the Thwaites' housekeeper, is allowed to narrate one chapter of her



own, and in so doing, Messud finds a way to give us a new insight into the workings of the Thwaite household, and of paterfamilias Murray in particular.

Relationships are clearly at the core of this novel: the shifting and transitory nature of lives and loves, makes for excellent reading in the hands of such a skilled story teller as Messud. The human condition is messy, even for those with essentially first-world problems, and the author is masterful in depicting how we deal, for better or for worse, with our complicated interactions with friends, lovers, relatives, and co-workers.

For me, the joy of reading this book stemmed from savoring the writer's stunning way with words, and her nearly complete capture of the heartbeat of New York City. As a former "Jersey girl", I delighted in her ability to return me to my cosmopolitan roots, albeit briefly. A number of readers who posted their own critical reviews on internet sites such as Goodreads, felt otherwise. "Painfully overwritten. You can almost feel Messud pausing at points to thumb through a thesaurus." This seems to be an occupational hazard for highly educated creative writing teachers when they actually put pen to paper, but, frankly, I didn't mind. It just meant that I had to take my time with it, which I did, gladly.

Claire Messud was born in Connecticut, and spent her formative years in Australia and Canada, returning to the U.S. as a teenager. Messud's mother is Canadian, and her father is from Algeria. Educated at Yale and Cambridge University, she now lives near Boston with her husband, British literary critic James Wood, and teaches fiction at Harvard University. Her latest book is *The Burning Girl* (2017).

Quebec's Immigration Minister Nadine Girault is injecting \$65,035 in funding to the Service d'aide aux Néo-Canadiens (SANC) for a project under the Mobilisation-Diversité program.

the bridge in car or on foot up to a dozen times a day doing their daily business. Many people live on one side of town but work, shop, got to school or recreation on the other. Some fear a lengthy detour - 20 km along routes 108 and 143 - just to get from one side of town to the other.

through a visual presentation: they argued the crumbling bridge, built in 1947, is too old to be easily renovated and demolition is the only way forward. Foundations must be laid once again in the riverbed.

They added that extensive detour signage will alert visitors of the dead-end at the town centre.

possibly get from his home on the east side of North Hatley to work in Magog every day. The mayor agreed that would be difficult, but pointed to the parking lots available for leaving his car on the west side overnight.

This explains the close attention paid by the citizenry on Wednesday, with three separate meetings held to accommodate the interest. Two of the meetings were held for the twenty verified residents of the village who turned up - all social distanced and masked, while a third meeting was reserved for issues with local stores and businesses.

All traffic, then, must be halted as of August 3 to give the contractor a full five months to have the bridge ready for traffic again by the Christmas season. The former railway bridge that tourists use as a scenic lookout will be extended by a walkway, for pedestrian and cycle traffic to cross the river. The ministry also highlighted that the construction zone will remain open to boat traffic.

Mayor Michael Page largely concurred with MTQ staff, saying that after long consultations he and town administrators saw no alternative to the five-month lockdown. Page stressed all the accommodations that had been made, including setting aside two large parking lots on each side of the river for citizens to "park and walk" through town on business. Agreements have been made with ambulance and fire services in Ayer's Cliff and Waterville to cover respectively the western and eastern sides of North Hatley.

Final conclusion of the meetings: questions remain, both social and technical, but as of August 3 North Hatley will be a divided town. Perhaps in more ways than one.

Staff from the Sherbrooke office of the MTQ present at the meetings first set out the parameters of the project

The MTQ staff shrugged, however, when asked about ongoing traffic, saying it was simply not possible to maintain vehicle circulation when a bridge is entirely demolished. No temporary structure is possible, they concluded.

The residents' question period was thorough, with issues of signage, tourism, noise abatement, business access, deliveries, emergency services and boat traffic all being raised. One man asked, emotionally, how he could

the past 24 hours. The province has now reported a total of 57,001 COVID-19 cases and 5,646 deaths since the pandemic began. One new case was reported yesterday in the Estrie region for a total of 982.

ing the venues limit capacity to 50 per cent and stop serving alcohol at midnight.

"We tightened the rules," Legault said Thursday. "But yes, I have concerns."

Hospitalizations continue to drop in the province, however. The number of patients being treated in hospital fell by eight, for a total of 277, including 20 people who are in intensive care, the same number as Wednesday.

The government was criticized this week after people said they had to wait several hours to be tested for COVID-19 at drop-in medical centres in Montreal.

Authorities said they conducted 12,887 COVID-19 tests Tuesday, the last day for which data is available.

Quebec said late Wednesday it would increase testing capacity in the city by 1,000 additional tests per day to meet demand.

The rise in infections comes after authorities recently identified at least 30 cases of COVID-19 linked to nine Montreal-area bars, prompting health officials last weekend to instruct anyone who had gone to a bar in the city since July 1 to get tested.

Quebec last week tried to reduce COVID-19 exposure at bars by mandat-

Police suggest missing Quebec father may be alive and seeking shelter

The father of two young girls found dead over the weekend southwest of Quebec City may be desperate and looking for materials to ensure his survival, Quebec provincial police said Thursday, on the eighth day of their manhunt.

Police said they found evidence Wednesday night Martin Carpentier was in a trailer in the area where police have focused their search since the bodies of Norah and Romy Carpentier, aged 11 and 6, were discovered Saturday.

Carpentier took items from the trailer, suggesting he may visit other barns, sheds or cottages in the region, police said in a news release.

"We are dealing with an individual who is probably desperate and who must be looking for equipment to ensure his survival," Sgt. Audrey-Anne Bilodeau said in a pre-recorded audio message sent to reporters.

Police asked residents of Lotbinière and surrounding areas west of Quebec City to check their cottages, trailers or buildings for signs of a break-in, such as missing or moved clothing, food, or equipment. Hunters who have set up cameras in the woods are also being asked to check their recordings.

Police are also suggesting worried citizens search in groups or with a police escort and to call 911 with any relevant information.

Sgt. Ann Mathieu, another provincial police spokeswoman, told reporters Thursday there's no evidence to suggest Carpentier poses a danger to the general population.

"It's an individual who is currently, if he is still alive, and the elements we have lead us to believe he is, is looking to ensure his survival and to hide," she said.

Investigators have said the girls and their father were believed to have been in a serious car crash on Highway 20 in the Quebec City suburb of St-Apollinaire July 8, but there was nobody inside the vehicle when they arrived on scene.

An Amber Alert was issued last Thursday but cancelled two days later after the bodies were found.

In recent days police have focused their search on a 50-square-kilometre wooded area around St-Apollinaire, where "items of interest" were found on Sunday.

Autopsies were performed on the two girls, but police said they won't reveal the cause of death until Carpentier is found.

The Big Party

I woke up and ran to my little brothers' room, (my room was a converted closet just large enough for a twin bed), looked out at the summer sun shining through, and breathed a sigh of relief. August 17, 1971, a great day for my first teen party. My first in years actually. My birthday was January 6, too soon after Christmas for a party, and I was a bit of a nerd. Actually, a huge nerd! I read fantasy novels before people knew what they were, and wrote notes to my friends in Elvish. I spent my noon hours in the library, and got straight A's, yet I longed to be different though, to be cool. This was my coming out party, so to speak.

It was the last weekend of our Summer Student exchange, and I was sixteen. I had just graduated from high school and had already experienced a summer of adventures. I had my Driver's license now. I became a camp counselor at the Quebec-Sherbrooke presbytery camp at Cedar Lodge. I spent 10 days in Lethbridge on the first part of the exchange, and was now hosting Paul, from Vermilion, Alberta. I had even gone with some friends to a bar in Montreal. Today was a free day, no field trips or get togethers planned, so I decided to throw a party. Nothing much was organized for the group that day, so I asked my parents if I could use The Point.

The Point was the perfect place, a tiny peninsula of land with a beach sticking out into Lake Lyster. It belonged to my grandfather. There was a big field, a bonfire pit, and a great place to swim. My cousin David had agreed to drive his dad's boat for water skiing. My mom made sandwiches, and I spent most of my money on hotdogs, chips, and pop. I even borrowed every extension cord I could from my curious extended family, and set up the record player on a card table in the middle of the field. This was my chance to be popular, if only people would come.

You see, this was the last free time our group would have; 21 local high school students and their Alberta guests. We had been bussed to Quebec City, and to the Granby Zoo, had visited farms and museums, and even had a dance the weekend before in the Anglican Church Hall in Lennoxville. Maybe people would be too tired to come to the boonies in Baldwin's Mills, I thought. Most of the group had never been here before. I knew I could count on Cliff Sparkes and Danny Vincent, my closest friends. Danny was great with the girls. On the first day in Lethbridge he had asked his billet about the prettiest girl in their group. When told she didn't like to go out

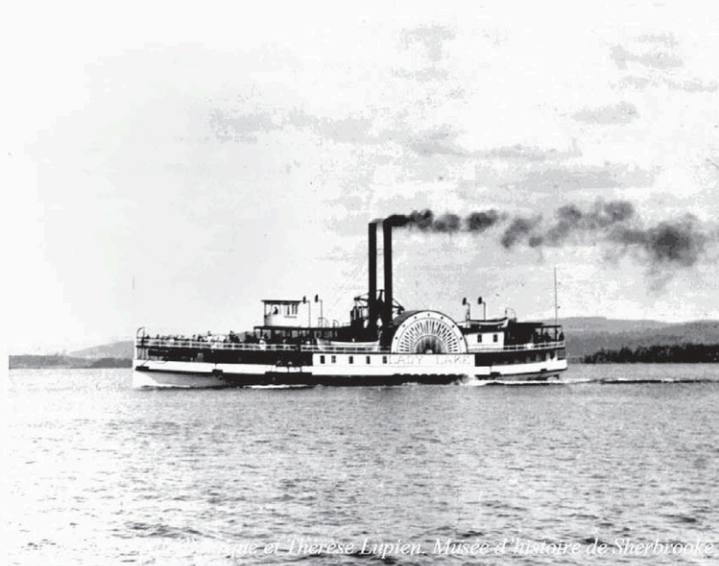
with guys, he made her his personal challenge. Five days later they were inseparable at the Lethbridge dance. Danny was raised with a French father and English mother, so he had that "Je ne sais quoi" that the rest of us envied. Perhaps if Danny was there, some of the girls would come, I hoped.

I told people that the party started at 2 p.m. That gave me time to set up tables, get the music ready, prepare the food, and become incredibly nervous and insecure. I tried to get my little brothers, ten and 11 that summer, to go home, but they decided to stick around and be pests instead. I was actually glad to have their company, but I would never admit that to them. The first car arrived at 2:10, just late enough to feed my anxiety, but my map had worked, and soon the field was full of people, enjoying the August sun. The afternoon was a bit of a blur. The water was great for swimming, and girlwatching. We had a pickup softball game. Frisbees flew everywhere. The biggest hit was the waterskiing. Most had never tried it. I went first and I think I looked competent enough. David took some of the teens on the boat, and after a few nervous dunks in the water, most of them got the hang of it. Danny looked after the music. He brought his own records, thank goodness; Mashmakan, Guess Who, Steppenwolf, Andy Kim. My collection was pretty lame.

And the girls came! There were 12 girls from the Townships, and their 12 Alberta counterparts. I got to show them around, teach them about waterskiing, and generally have the best day of my life. You see, I had never been good at talking to girls. I would try to show off and embarrass myself, or say something stupid. I even took my cousin Nancy to the Prom. I had asked one girl, but her parents were very religious and wouldn't let her go. That's what she said anyway, though I sensed that she was relieved.

By the time of the bonfire, some of the group had left, but most were still there. Two teens brought guitars, and we were sharing songs. The Alberta bunch taught us "Four Strong Winds". The marshmallows were a hit. John Greer, the teacher who organized the Student exchange, got everyone to give me a round of applause. (John was 26, had long hair, and was the coolest teacher in the school). I stayed by myself after everyone left, and watched the embers glow in the dark. I had promised my dad to look after the fire, but mostly I was still too excited to go home. The party was a big hit. This was my rite of passage, from being a kid, to becoming a real teenager. It felt good.

GLIMPSES OF THE PAST



The Lady of the Lake steamboat travelled on Lake Memphremagog between 1867 and 1915. It was essentially a pleasure boat that ferried between Magog and Newport vacationers eager to take advantage of lakeside living during the summer months. This famous steamboat used technology associated with paddlewheel boats that are mainly used for transportation on lakes and rivers. This paddle propulsion technology, fine-tuned during the 18th and 19th centuries, is much older than one would think. Stanstead residents cry fowl over urban chicken restrictions

The great chicken debate is taking over the Town of Stanstead after it was discovered a resident in a designated urban zone had dozens of chickens and several pigs on their property.

A concerned citizen brought forward a complaint to the town council and a Société protectrice des animaux de l'Estrie (SPA) inspector was sent to the property to evaluate the situation.

Angered by the sudden visit from the SPA, the resident in question divulged that many people in town are harbouring chickens. The animal protection organization subsequently asked that everyone get rid of his or her

animals, or face hefty fines.

"I had no clue there was a law in place that we weren't allowed chickens and I really don't see the problem of having chickens," said Stanstead resident Julie Cloutier.

Cloutier and her husband set up a coop three weeks ago not knowing that a law exists forbidding residents in urban 'gray zones' from owning the flightless birds. She has always been an animal person and chickens were on her radar for a while.

"We've been talking about it, doing our research, what they like, their food, how to take care of them, winter, so we did all that research before we actually got them," she said.

The 33-year-old is one of the residents now fighting to change a law that has been around for over two decades. She showed up to a public consultation at Pat Burns Arena on Wednesday evening with 386 signatures from pro-chicken current and former residents.

Chickens are very therapeutic, she explained, which was also an argument made by one of the 25 or so citizens at the consultation. It's relaxing to watch them bob their heads up and down and, Cloutier added, they make for genuinely entertaining pets.

Another resident who spoke at the meeting said that chickens are not only valuable for their eggs, but for what they can teach children about organization and nature. Cloutier agreed with her.

"It's good for kids that have anxiety issues, it relaxes them and it also teaches kids to live off the grid kind of, you know, not to rely always on groceries because eventually you never know a grocery store might not have supplies," she said.

Stanstead Mayor Philippe Dutil, who led the discussion Wednesday, said the town is still gathering information before they decide to amend the law. He

reminded folks that there aren't many places in Quebec that allow chickens in urban areas.

"What I explained is that out of 1200 municipalities in Quebec there's only 50 that allows chickens; that's only 4 per cent," he said.

The town council explained that people can refer to the municipal website if they want help understanding the zones. They also added that if they enact a new law permitting chickens there would be extra costs, like hiring and training a chicken catcher.

Dutil said that he knows people with chickens on their land, but they live in green zones, or rural areas, which allows more animals. The council

is also concerned about predators infesting the town.

Cloutier, however, doesn't believe this will be an issue for residents. She sees foxes, coyotes and raccoons all the time, but it isn't because of chickens, she said. Stanstead is borderline country, she explained, it's normal that we're going to have wildlife.

"I think that animals are having a hard time in forests to find food, so they know that we have garbage. They smell it, so they're attracted," Cloutier said. "Is it because of the chickens? I don't think so. I just think they're looking for food."

Say hello to NEOWISE, the brightest comet in over 20 years

A rare spectacle will be visible to the naked eye during the late evening for the next week or so as the comet NEOWISE approaches its closest point to the sun. People in both hemispheres will be treated to a view that hasn't been seen since the Hale-Bopp comet shot by the Earth in 1996.

The comet gets its name from the mission that discovered it on March 27 of this year, the NEOWISE space telescope, a satellite on an extended mission in the emerging field of studying near-earth objects.

"This is probably the most spectacular [astronomical] occurrence this

year," said Dr Lorne Nelson, professor of physics and astronomy at Bishop's University, during an interview. While the comet is pretty average as far as balls of rock and ice in space go, scientists are using the rare opportunity of one passing so close to gain extra insight on its composition.

And an incredible opportunity it is, given that the orbit of NEOWISE takes it on a detour deep into the outskirts of the solar system only once every 6,800 years. At the peak of its orbit, the comet is over 20 times further away from the sun than Pluto.

"We plan on observing the comet ourselves," Nelson explained, referring to the team running the observatory on the roof of the university. The im-

ages taken by the team will be visible to the public for free on the Bishop's website via this link: physics.ubishops.ca/observatory/index.php

In the meantime, though, Nelson encourages readers to look out for the comet themselves in the evening sky. The comet will be at its most visible at 10 p.m. just a few hours after sunset, about 10 degrees above the horizon. In order to find it in the night sky, Nelson suggests looking first for the bottom most star in the pan of the big dipper, outstretching your arm, then looking three fist lengths down and slightly to the right. The comet's bright trail will look like a tiny cloud to the naked eye, but more detail should be visible with just a pair of binoculars.

On opening and reopening L'Horloge Cassée

As is the case with so many other restaurants that are slowly reopening in the wake of the COVID pandemic, L'Horloge Cassée in Melbourne is doing so with certain changes.

"For the time being, we are only opening on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays," said Annie Labrecque, who owns and operates L'Horloge Cassée along with her partner, Gabriel Leblond-Fontaine. The 32-seat restaurant and a bed & breakfast is housed in a century-old structure that, prior to its recent makeover, served for more than half a century as the Richmond County Historical Society Museum.

In the days before the closure of eateries and other businesses nationwide, Labrecque and Leblond-Fontaine were serving noon-hour and evening meals five days a week. The Bed and Breakfast—small and quaint and able to sleep six—was always open.

Perhaps fittingly, their first post-pandemic client was an overnight guest who booked into the B & B the evening before the restaurant re-opened its doors on July 9.

While neither Labrecque nor Leblond-Fontaine has formal training in the hospitality industry, both have practical experience.

"I worked as a waitress when I was a university student, including stints at Hovey Manor and Café Massawippi," said Labrecque, a practicing social worker by profession.

"I waited on tables as well," added Leblond-Fontaine, who has a degree in business administration, "but I also worked in the kitchens of small cafés where the menu wasn't much more than salads and sandwiches."

"Cooking has always been a passion of mine," he continued, "perhaps because of my upbringing. My parents always liked good food, so I was introduced to it early. When I was still quite young, my uncle brought me to the Gaspé one summer where we went on a "tour du terroir" stopping at nice little restaurants that offered good food made from local produce."

The couple met in the Gaspé and lived for a year in the Quebec City area before relocating to the Townships. Gabriel is originally from Lévis while Annie is from East Angus. Their decision to launch their family enterprise on Route 243 in Melbourne stemmed from several factors.

"I knew I wanted to open something in the general Sherbrooke area," Leblond-Fontaine said, "and when I was driving from Lévis to Sherbrooke, I always thought that the stretch between Drummondville and Sherbrooke could use a restaurant offering a cuisine based on local foods."

"We lived for a year in St-François-Xavier-de-Brompton," Labrecque continued, "and when we drove around here we fell in love with the area, and with this place: the greenery, the river, the view. We thought it had great potential because, unlike the area around Magog or Compton, the area is relatively undeveloped, and there really aren't many restaurants of this genre."

"Our aim," she explained, "is to offer good food in a casual, informal setting."

The couple bought the old RCHS Museum in June of 2016, and immediately undertook a major renovating project.

"We began by working at the back of the house, which is the section we set aside as our own living quarters," Leblond-Fontaine explained. "The main floor is our living room and upstairs we have one large bedroom for ourselves and two smaller rooms for our two children, Jade (now three), and Yann (now 17 months). We hired a contractor but I worked with him levelling two by fours and putting up gyprock."

Work on the restaurant and B & B (which comprises a bit more than two thirds of the building) didn't start until the fall of 2018, because of the zoning changes that had to be approved by three levels of government.

"Our plans had to be approved by the municipality," Labrecque noted, "but also by the MRC du Val-St-François. As it turned out, the MRC brought our project to the province as at least two ministries had to sign off on it, including the Ministry of Transportation and the Ministry of the Environment."

The renovation work on the building was extensive, and not rendered easier by the decision to keep at least some of the elements and cachet of the late 19th century house.

"We opened on June 6, 2019," Leblond-Fontaine recalled. "There was no fanfare or grand opening. We had a web site and we were on Facebook, but otherwise we didn't do any advertising. In fact, we've placed only one ad in the time we've been open, and that was in the local guaranteed circulation

weekly."

What the Horloge Cassée was getting was a lot of word-of-mouth referrals.

"The first week was very quiet," Leblond-Fontaine said. "But our numbers kept climbing. One day, in the third or fourth week, we served over 50 lunches. We were overwhelmed."

"At the very beginning quite a number of our customers seemed to be coming from the Drummondville area," Labrecque noted, "and then from the Victoriaville area. We realized that it was customers who were mentioning us to their friends and family."

"We have a mixture in terms of our clientele," she continued. "We have quite a few customers from the immediate area and then others from slightly further afield, like Valcourt and Racine. But we're now also drawing people from Sherbrooke as well as Drummondville. There's something of a hidden clientele in the area, and these are people who have summer homes here, or people who rent a chalet or country house for a holiday."

"We adapted our operation according to demand," she added. "Originally we were trying to operate like a coffee shop, but we soon realized that there was no demand for that. What worked well was serving lunch and dinner and running the B & B as a complement to the restaurant."

From the beginning, L'Horloge Cassée remained closed on Sundays.

"We've been asked about serving brunches on Sundays," Labrecque said, "but we want to keep it as a day set aside for us as a family. We're conscious of the need to find a good balance between work and play, and of paying attention to our mental health."

The COVID-19 pandemic was a serious setback for the fledgling enterprise.

While there were government programs available to small businesses, L'Horloge Cassée fell through the cracks. They had not yet been in operation for a full year, nor did they have employees. In fact, they had not yet even started paying themselves salaries.

Both were able to fall back on the jobs from which they'd taken leaves of absence to launch their business. The pandemic made them question what they were doing but ultimately they decided that the shut down meant a pause in their operations, and not an end.

Still, re-opening did mean starting over, and with a new set of parameters. In addition to new health regulations, the couple are dealing with other constraints.

"For the time being," said Leblond-Fontaine, "we'll be open three days a week because both of us will now be juggling our day jobs with the running of the restaurant. As well, we'll no longer have, as we did before, the help of my parents who looked after our toddlers while we were serving meals. But we're now open again and we'll see how things go."

Interestingly, the pandemic did not go un-noticed by Jade, the couple's three-year old.

"Our children are sociable by nature, and from infancy they've been accustomed to having lots of people around, first when we were in the middle of construction and then with the restaurant and the B & B," Leblond-Fontaine shared. "Shortly after we closed in March, one day Jade asked me, where are all the people?"

With luck, Jade, many of them will be back soon.

Mae Sot Education Project issues emergency appeal

Due to the unique circumstances, the MSEP is unable to send volunteers to Mae Sot this year, but members are instead working on a small project to offer some of the older migrant students English language enrichment through the Zoom videoconferencing program.

A number of former volunteers and members of the project committee are participating, and the MSEP is covering the cost of using the software for the students.

"The project is critical in keeping children and their parents engaged in the larger project of education at a time when they are isolated and stressed by multiple forms of hardship that make meeting the most basic needs challenging," the organization adds.

In order to help support home-based education, the MSEP is seeking help in raising money for teacher stipends, transportation, materials and protection from the rain during the local rainy season, working around an estimated monthly recurring cost of nearly \$57,000.

Anyone interested in knowing more about the issues facing the MSEP or contributing to the work of the organization is encouraged to visit the organization's website, <https://maesot.ubishops.ca/>.

The Mae Sot Education Project (MSEP) has put out an emergency appeal for support to try to help fill educational gaps for migrant children in the communities they usually work with in Thailand. Given that the Covid-19 pandemic has disrupted the lives of people all over the world, the organization is asking for help, pointing out that even a temporary loss of school for children already living in unstable circumstances leaves a lot of uncertainty about their educational futures.

In its most recent newsletter, the organization shared that although Migrant learning centers (MLCs) are preparing to open in October, there are currently very few projects available to support migrant children or their families at home.

"With migrant learning centers unable to collect even small fees from student families this year and many donors having decreased or withdrawn their commitments, financial uncertainty looms for migrant education in the Mae Sot area," the letter reads. "Emergency support is needed to bridge the gap until MLCs are able to open and parents able once again to contribute."

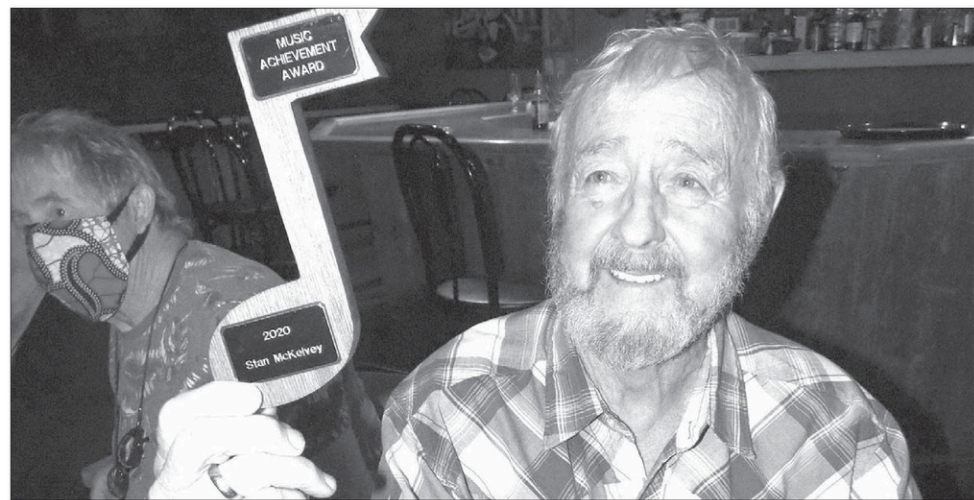
the A.N.A.F. Unit # 318 and he was determined. He kept plugging away and up came the Music Achievement Awards," remembered Pat Neil.

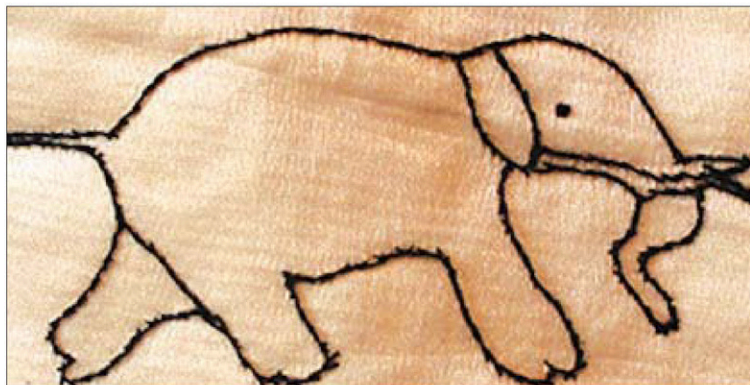
An exhibition about animals at the Colby-Curtis Museum

Coping with the loss of a loved one while social distancing

Coping with the loss of a loved one can be challenging in the best of times, but many people have had to confront such challenges at a time that is unlike any other in modern history.

By the start of the second full week of May 2020, the World Health Organization reported that roughly 279,000 people across the globe had died from the novel coronavirus COVID-19. Many of the 215 countries, areas or territories that reported cases of COVID-19 implemented social distancing measures in an effort to reduce the spread of the virus. While such efforts no doubt saved lives, they also left many people without traditional means of grieving their deceased loved ones. For example, in March the Church of England limited the number of people who could attend funerals to immediate family members only, while restrictions on gatherings in the United States made it difficult if not impossible for more than 10 people to grieve together in person.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that grief is a normal response to losing a loved one. In addition, the American Psychological Association says that research has shown that social support can help people recover from such losses.

Though traditional funerals and family gatherings may not be possible as the world responds to the COVID-19 outbreak, those who have lost loved ones can embrace various strategies to cope with their loss even while stay-at-home orders remain in place.

• **Host calls with family members and friends.** The videotelephone and chat service Zoom has helped millions of people stay connected with loved ones while social distancing. Schools and

universities even employed the service when in-person classroom sessions were canceled to stop the spread of the virus. The CDC recommends grieving families employ such technology to connect with each other in the wake of a loved one's death.

• **Share stories.** Grieving family members are urged to share stories and pictures much like they would during wakes and funerals. Share them during group conference calls and/or via social media, emails or other modern modes of communications. Connecting in such ways can ensure no one is forced to grieve alone.

• **Seek support from your community.** The CDC recommends seeking support from faith-based organizations or other trusted community leaders and friends. While in-person church services may not be available, many local religious leaders have made themselves available to congregants and even non-congregants who may need help grieving. Local community organizations may have grief counselors available to help people cope with loss.

• **Take part in an activity that meant something to you and your deceased loved one.** The CDC notes that doing something in memory of a loved one can help people cope. For example, plant flowers in honor of a deceased parent with whom you shared a love of gardening.

Confronting the loss of a loved one during the COVID-19 outbreak can be challenging. But families can still overcome this challenge even if they cannot gather together in person.

Shade-tolerant plants help to complete landscapes

Plants need sunlight to thrive and grow, but some need less sunlight than others. People who find their landscapes are less supportive to sun-loving plants can choose from a variety of shade-tolerant plants, shrubs and trees.

Shade tolerance refers to a plant's ability to withstand low levels of light. Certain plants have adapted this feature to survive in the wild. Plants that grow at the base of forest floors, for example, will get less sunlight than others outside of the tree canopy. Such adaptations enable a wide variety of foliage to grow even though they are not exposed to much sunlight.

While sun-loving plants often have broad leaves and expend significant energy to capture sunlight for photosynthesis, shade-tolerant plants expend less energy and tend to be more efficient consumers of soil nutrients and sunlight.

Penn State Extension's Plant and Pests division says the amount of shade a plant is growing under will directly affect the density of the foliage and the plant's flowering and fruiting characteristics. Blending shade-tolerant plants into the landscape can be an effective use of space. Before choosing plants for an existing landscape, it's important to assess the level of shade or sun the plants will receive.

- **Heavy shade:** Heavy shade is when no direct sunlight reaches a plant. This occurs at the base of northern-facing walls or beneath thick tree canopies.
- **Full sun:** Areas that receive full

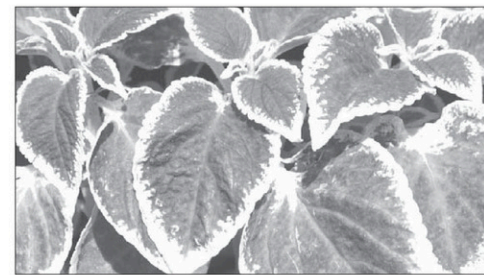
sun enjoy direct sunlight between six and eight hours per day.

- **Moderate shade:** These sites have reflected sunlight that may come off of water features.
- **Light shade:** Plants in these areas will get partially filtered or dappled sunlight.

Once homeowners understand which type of shade they are dealing with, they can then visit plant nurseries and select their plants. Most greenery comes with care instructions that include recommendations regarding the amount of shade/sunlight the plant will need to do well. If further assistance is needed, a knowledgeable employee can make suggestions based on landscape needs.

Those who are looking for some preliminary guidance when it comes to selecting shade-tolerant shrubs, plants or trees can consult the following list.

- **Bleeding heart:** Bleeding heart, or Dicentra spectabilis, is typically found in woodlands. It's a perennial in the poppy family that produces mounded foliage and arching vine-like stems of heart-shaped flowers in the spring.
- **Amethyst flower:** Browallia hybrids offer star-shaped blooms of blue and violet. These plants will billow out of hanging baskets or containers, and they prefer warm shade or filtered sunlight.
- **Coleus:** The coleus, Solenostemon scutellarioides, is another perennial that can have a variety of different leaf colors and striations.
- **Witch hazels:** These are a genus

in the family Hamamelidaceae, which has four different species in North America. This shrub or small tree features arching branches with dense, multi-stemmed clumps. Witch hazel produces flowers in the late autumn when most other plants are sparse.

- **Bayberry:** Myrica pensylvanica can grow in partial shade as a hedge or natural property divider. The leaves of this shrub are aromatic when crushed. The shrub will produce tiny, gray/white fruits in late summer.
- **English Ivy:** Also known as Hedera helix, this trailing plant is widely cultivated as an ornamental plant. It will spread easily and can become invasive.

Those searching for shade-tolerant trees can choose among Sugar maple, Black alder, Flowering dogwood, and White spruce, among others.

Shade-tolerant plants can make welcome additions to the landscape, offering greenery and color in the darker areas of a property. (Metro Creative)

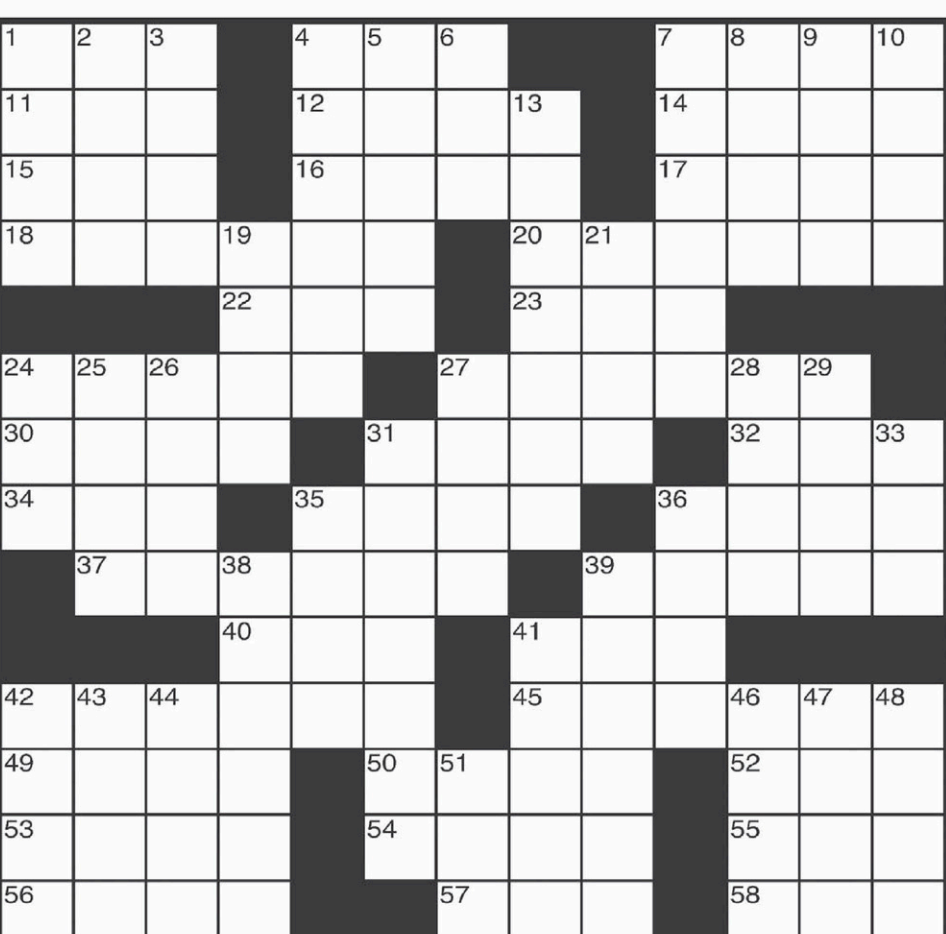

Keep analyzing for success

Peter Drucker, who was an influential thinker about management, wrote, "Management' means, in the last analysis, the substitution of thought for brawn and muscle, of knowledge for folklore and superstition, and of cooperation for force."

Say the word "analysis" to most people, and they think of psychiatry. Someone defined psychiatry as the care of the id by the odd. Mention analysis to most bridge players, and they smile. "Yes," they say, "I analyze every deal carefully." Is that the care of the id by the ego?

East analyzed today's deal correctly. Lie on the couch and look at only the North and East hands. Against four spades, West leads the heart four: five, king, three. How should East continue?

In the auction, South's three-club bid was New Minor Forcing.

Most players would cash the heart ace and shift to a diamond. They would hope to collect two black-suit tricks. But, as you can see, declarer immediately claims 10 tricks: five spades and five diamonds.

This East paused to assess the prospects. He had 13 points, there were 18 in the dummy, and declarer rated to have at least 6. That left at most three for West.

East could see four potential tricks, two in hearts and two in clubs, if he could get his partner on play for a club lead through dummy's king. How could that be achieved? Well, West had led a low heart, which guaranteed an honor in the suit. At trick two, East returned the heart seven. West won with his queen and had no trouble in finding the killing club switch. Well defended!

Dear At a Loss: Please accept my heartfelt condolences for the loss of your father-in-law.

Grief can make it impossible to think clearly, but that doesn't make it acceptable to mistreat our partners. Your wife could benefit from seeing a

therapist who specializes in grief. I'd also recommend attending therapy together, even if just for one or two sessions. You might also look into grief support groups in your area; if your wife isn't ready for that yet, you can go on your own.

Keep trying to be as patient as possible, but let her know that you will keep in contact with your father. It's not just the right thing to do for you and him but also what's best for your marriage in the long-term. If you miss spending this precious time with your dad now, you might always resent your wife for it.
