McLaughlin leaving Lennoxville

Mark McLaughlin is stepping down from municipal politics. At the June 25 meeting of Lennoxville's Borough Council the current councillor announced his intention to vacate the position at the end of July, citing challenges in sharing his time between his job in Vancouver and his work for the borough.

"It has been a real privilege working with David and Bill," McLaughlin said, "but also with the community and for the community."

Asked what led to the decision, McLaughlin pointed to the recent sale of his house, as well as challenges in finding work closer to home. He has been split between his duties on the municipal level and work in other cities throughout his term as councillor, initially in Montreal, then later in Vancouver.

"The easy decision would have been to quit a year and a half ago," McLaughlin pointed out, "but I've been able to stay in touch, spending ten days a month still in Lennoxville; being on the phone and on the internet on a daily basis made it workable."

The councillor expressed a great appreciation to his fellow representatives, William Smith and David Price, for their support and flexibility in putting up with an often-complicated schedule.

With classes finished for the summer, many young children in the townships are off to that most traditional of summer activities; sleep-away camp. On the shores of Lake Wallace, situated right on the border

'Lost in The Fifties' concert to benefit Brome Missisquoi Adolescents and Youth Services

On Friday, July 12 at 7 p.m. a concert will be held at the Emmanuel United Church in Cowansville with all proceeds being donated to the Brome Missisquoi Adolescents and Youth Services, Inc. (BMAYS) group home in Cowansville. The theme is music from the 1950's.

The group performing these songs is made up of people of all ages and from all walks of life who just love to sing. Under the enthusiastic and seasoned leadership of musical director's John and Laura Barr, the group has been doing this for a few years now. Each year brings a different theme so there is constant variety and enjoyment in each performance. The group has done many fundraisers for a variety of causes, helping raise money while doing what they love.

Steve Trew, a member of the group also sits as a board member for the Brome Missisquoi Adolescents Youth Services (BMAYS) located in Cowansville and he asked his fellow performers if they would be willing to hold this fundraiser to benefit the group home and the performers agreed.

BMAYS was formed in January 1989 and represented the culmination of four years of lobbying efforts by interested members of the Brome Missisquoi community with the goal of having the Quebec government establish a group home for troubled youth in our area.

The need for a group home for the English speaking youth had been identified in the 1980 Five Year Plan of the Montérégie Regional Health and Social Services Council. The committee received widespread support from all sectors of the community, most notably, the Townshippers' Association.

"The BMAYS home, based in Cowansville can receive eight residents between the ages of 12 to 17. The residents can be male and female. Their stay within our services is generally between several months to a year. Exceptionally, certain residents have remained with us for up to a few years. The residents are referred to our services by the Centre Jeunesse Montérégie. In 2011, Brome Missisquoi Adolescents and youth services expanded by adding a second residential home, Le Tremplin. Also based in Cow-

ansville, this home caters to eight francophone residents between the ages of 12 and 17, boys and girls. Both homes have graciously been donated by the Brome Missisquoi Youth Foundation, said Steve Trew.

In a recent evaluation of the services, the Centre Jeunesse Montérégie wrote in their report the following comment "We believe that one of the strengths of this resource is their capacity to adapt to change, as well as being able to offer a living environment, while having the goal of rehabilitation, they can still provide a family-type ambiance. This context permits abandoned youth, or those that have gone through very difficult situations to establish roots which allow them to develop. In addition, the staff have a lot of experience and are local residents."

President of the Board of the two group homes Steve Kelly recently stated "the quality of residential care given to the youth of our community has been an area that we pride ourselves in. Based on two teams of qualified educators and clinical and administrative directors, BMAYS and Le Tremplin are considered as two of the better Intermediary Resources in the Montérégie."

Second Big Garbage collection coming

The City of Sherbrooke is reminding the public that the latest Big Garbage collection will take place according to the following schedule:

Big Garbage and wood residue

Boroughs of Brompton and Rock Forest-Saint-Élie-Deauville, the week of July 1. Boroughs of Lennoxville and Fleurimont, the week of July 8. Boroughs of Mont-Bellevue, Jacques-Cartier and the downtown area: the week of July 15.

Cartons (pasteboard, cardboard, etc)

Boroughs of Fleurimont, Lennoxville, and Mont-Bellevue, and the downtown area, the first week of July, Boroughs of Brompton Jacques-Cartier, and Rock Forest-Saint-Élie-Deauville, the week of July 8.

Separate into two distinct bundles for bulky waste and wood residue. Place by the curb no later than 8 a.m. on the usual pick-up day. Maintain a maximum volume of one cubic metre for each bundle, the equivalent size to a trailer.

For the collection of cardboard: Disassemble boxes and stack them next to the bins by 8 a.m. on the regular collection day. Each item should be no larger than 90 cm x 90 cm (3 ft. x 3 ft).

"She was a lovely, lovely person."

Cheryl Stroud: 'She lived life to the fullest'

The Sherbrooke community has lost a remarkable lady. Cheryl Stroud passed away on Friday, June 21 following a battle with cancer.

Stroud was a dedicated and passionate musician. In addition to completing a Bachelor's degree in Music at McMaster University and a Graduate Diploma in Advanced Performance Studies from Concordia University, Stroud also held Associateship Diplomas in Performance in both Piano and Voice from the Royal Conservatory of Toronto, where she served as a member of the College of Examiners. She was also an Artist Associate of the Leonardo Project, Concordia University, a program designed to improve performance techniques.

Stroud was director of the Uplands Musical Society, and performed regularly as accompanist, chamber musician and soloist and conductor. She re-

tired several years ago as director of the music program she founded at Champlain Regional College to continue her work at Bishop's University as a piano and voice instructor and accompanist.

Stroud was also a member of the Uplands Chamber Players (clarinet, cello and piano), Sherbrooke's Amadeus Choir and a regularly invited guest pianist with the Estria Woodwind quintet.

"Cheryl loved music," says friend and colleague Pamela Eby. "She always approached learning in a methodical way. I remember when she came to me to learn how to play the organ. The next thing I knew, she had bought organ shoes and soon had an organ job. She already played the violin, French horn and the drum kit, which she argued was the hardest instrument to learn."

As fellow musician Pauline Farrugia explains: "With Cheryl, I started the Uplands chamber music series of concerts. We would often play to-

gether and Cheryl was a talented musician, an excellent chamber musician. She touched a lot of people's souls when she played. She was also a fantastic teacher, spending lots of time with her students."

Stroud's interests extended well beyond music. In addition to being an avid gardener, she was also an instructor in qigong, a Chinese martial arts movement.

Later in life, Cheryl Stroud was called to be a minister. She was ordained as a Deacon in the Anglican Church on May 1, 2013 after completing her theological studies at Bishop's University.

Tom Matthews is a long-time friend. "She was a lovely, lovely person. As a retired teacher, I could always appreciate her skills at teaching. Many students went through her hands," says Matthews. "She was also extremely spiritual. She and I were lay readers at the Anglican Church, but she was already on her way to becoming a priest, in my opinion. She was thought-

ful, sensitive and hard-working."

Matthews took a second to contemplate before saying, "I was visiting her in hospital a few days before she passed away, and a spiritual advisor was doing the rounds, visiting people. When she discovered that Cheryl was a deacon, they started talking. I thought it was amazing that when the advisor mentioned that someone had asked to be served communion, Cheryl offered to do it herself. There she was, with tubes sticking out on all sides, and she was ready to serve communion."

This past winter Stroud and her husband David Dutton went on a cruise. "Since I teach physics at BCS and she worked at Bishop's University, our holidays never coincided. It was grand to be able to take a five-day cruise to Florida and the Caribbean together. We had a good time."

Dutton met his wife in 1972, when they were both studying at McMaster University. "We met at choir," remembers Dut-

ton.

On her last birthday, Stroud flew over the Grand Canyon via helicopter with her sister. "She needed to do and see things she had never done before, and she wanted to really absorb and enjoy life," says Eby. "She had tremendous strength of spirit."

Fellow friend Trish Peacock has fond memories of Cheryl Stroud. "I have known her since 1982, and I would describe her as a very strong, intelligent and generous person. We met at Bishop's College School (BCS), and it was a privilege to work with her. I watched her spiritual self continue to grow. When she was ordained in May 2013, it was a dream come true for her. She lived life to the fullest."

Cheryl Stroud, having passed away at the age of 66, leaves behind her husband David Dutton and two sons, Phil and Bruce.

The memorial service will be held Saturday, July 13 at 2 p.m. in the chapel at Bishop's College School.

"They are two very dedicated councillors," he added.

McLaughlin's announcement follows just one month after the news of fellow councillor William Smith's intention not to run in November's municipal election, leaving current Borough President David Price as the only incumbent aiming for re-election. Whereas Smith will serve out the rest of his term, the period from the end of July through the beginning of November will see one

fewer representative in the borough office.

"My understanding, from talking to city hall, is that because we're so close to the November elections there won't be need for a by-election," McLaughlin said. "It's not a busy period."

The outgoing councillor expressed his continued concern for the future wellbeing of the borough, particularly given Mayor Bernard Sévigny's enduring interest in reforming the

city council by centralizing power and reducing the number of councillors.

"Even if he says Lennoxville is off the hook for this next election, and not to be worried, we are worried," McLaughlin said, echoing feelings expressed by Price upon the recent announcement of the president's intention to run for office again. The Borough of Brompton, long-time supporters of Lennoxville according to McLaughlin, have become "tar-

gets for destruction" in the eyes of the city, and that runs the risk of Lennoxville becoming the "next domino to fall."

"If we had known that ten years ago, that that was their plan, we would never have merged," McLaughlin added.

Despite concerns, however, he highlighted several accomplishments within the borough, including the defeat of the initial vote regarding the centralization of power within the city; the creation and con-

tinuation of The Lantern, the borough newsletter; and the development of the Lennoxville Residents' Association (LRA).

"We've always fought to keep Lennoxville on the map," McLaughlin said of the Borough Council, "and we hope that the next councillors will carry that torch... We want to be a strong and vibrant community, not just an annotation in the history books."

McLaughlin will continue in his role until July 23.

Lennoxville youth plant seeds of community at Dixville Home

The youth of Lennoxville have undertaken to build and maintain a community garden in collaboration with the Dixville Home under the guidance and supervision of Matthew Nutbrown, head animator and staff supervisor at the local youth centre. The project, designed to bridge the gap between the borough's youth and those living with intellectual impairments in the home, was inspired by a recent trip to New Orleans.

"The trip to New Orleans was to teach (the youth) that there are opportunities to do community work," said Nutbrown, describing the service project. "We showed them how easy it is in a place that suffered a big loss, but also pointed out to them that there are things to do in your own community as well."

The youth centre worker described the experience of travelling to a low-income community in the Louisiana city earlier this year and discovering a functional community garden maintained by individuals with intellectual impairments.

"We saw that and thought, wow, we could probably do that in Lennoxville," Nutbrown said, speaking to the inspiration and optimism that the experience triggered both in himself and in the youth travelling with him, "We didn't want (the idea) to die when we left New Orleans."

Matthew's father, Robert Nutbrown, is in charge of recreation at the Dixville Home. Upon returning from the trip, Matthew quickly put the idea of collaboration to Robert who, in turn, approached the Dixville Home Foundation. The younger Nutbrown expressed pleased

surprise that setting up the project ended up being very simple.

The garden, situated next to the activity centre of the Dixville Home on the south end of Queen Street, was started in mid-May.

"We had to get all the sod off, work the land a bit, get the rocks out... We planted about three weeks ago," Nutbrown said, pointing out that the work provided an opportunity to work in a concrete, community-oriented way for those who were without summer work.

"It's great to show the community that there are teenagers who are willing to contribute to their community," Nutbrown added, stating that the youth now come on a voluntary basis every Wednesday evening to maintain the garden. This timing lines up with a drop-

in period for clients of the home, allowing the youth to interact with and work alongside those coming to engage in activities should the interest arise. The youth centre worker said that there are three dedicated youth volunteers, along with, "a few floaters who come in every once in a while."

Nutbrown and his father are overseeing the program this year and are treating it as a pilot project. This being the first time a garden has been developed in the space, the young leader emphasized the need to make sure that the location they've chosen works.

"Right now it's looking positive," he said, pointing to the growth and development of tomatoes, beans, radishes, potatoes, mixed greens, peppers, and sunflowers for visual appeal. Nutbrown emphasized that the 25-foot by 25-foot plot is an organic garden with no pesticides and only organic fertilizers being used.

"If it's successful we're hoping this is not the only summer we'll do it. We want to try to continue it every summer," Nutbrown said.

The food grown in the garden will go directly to clients of the Dixville Home Foundation with any surplus being donated to the Cornerstone Food Bank for distribution into the community.

Started in 1986, the Lennoxville Youth Centre is a non-profit charitable organization founded on the concept of fostering a sense of community in the area's young people. The centre runs workshops and activities that balance education, leisure and community involvement, and can be found at 168-B Queen Street in Lennoxville, across from the grocery store. 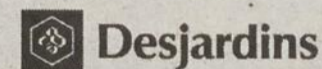

Streets closing for half-marathon

This Saturday, the City of Sherbrooke will be holding its annual half-marathon resulting in the temporary closure of several city streets.

Therefore, the city wishes to advise the public that the following streets in the area surrounding Jacques-Cartier Park will be closed or partially closed during the race, which will attract some 3,500 participants.:

Jacques-Cartier will be closed to all traffic between Denault and King streets, on Friday, June 28 at 10 p.m. until 3 p.m. Saturday, June 29. Access to shops between King Street West and the Jacques-Cartier Bridge will be via one lane from King West.

Marcel Street will be closed to all traffic except for resident access Friday and Saturday for the same time period.

Pacific Street will be closed from Dieppe Street to Claire Jolicoeur, on Sat-

urday at 7:15 a.m.

The Traversée de Lac Memphremagog is back again this year, marking its 35th anniversary, and despite last year's less-than-successful edition, organizers believe their revamped approach will "do the traditional summer highlight proud."

This year's edition will feature an opening night performance by Quebec bad-boy rocker Éric Lapointe, with opening act Rick Hughes on Thursday, Aug. 1, to be followed over the weekend by concerts by Amélie Laroque, Steve Hill, Rodeo Drive, Orange O'Clock, Radio

Radio, and Dany Flanders.

Visitors of all ages will appreciate the show by Cirque Carpe Diem Friday, August 2 at the end of the afternoon.

A new feature this year will be a provincial wakeboarding competition in which participants will compete over a series of obstacles on Merry Point, while providing for a colourful spectacle for spectators.

Another novelty, albeit a negative one, is that there will be no rides on the site this year, as organizers have decided to save both space and money by concentrating on inflatable games for children.

The first Cooperative Youth Services (CJS) of the MRC of Coaticook in Waterville is inviting the public to its official opening at 10 a.m., at the Les Pacifistes: Maison des Jeunes at 200 Depot St., this Tuesday, July 2.

On the menu will be a presentation of the cooperative services offered by the youth centre's 11-17 year-olds as coffee and pastries will be available to guests.

Compton-Stanstead MP Jean Rousseau, René Bessette, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Caisse Desjardins Verts-Sommets-de l'Estrie, and Vincent Boutin, political attaché to Réjean Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, Seniors, the Estrie, and MP for St. Francois, will also all be on hand for the event.

This summer, until Aug. 16, the SJC Waterville will offer services such as lawn mowing, painting, babysitting, pet walking, car washing, window cleaning, moving assistance and much more.

The Waterville CJS is in its first year of operation and is composed of young people who come together to form a work cooperative during the summer. "I'm part of the SJC to have a good work experience to put on my resumé," says Loïck Dumas, a CJS Waterville volunteer, "but also to become more responsible and to make decisions together with other young people."

Cooperative youth are accompanied by a facilitator and supported by community stakeholders, particularly the Maison des Jeunes, the Carrefour jeunesse emploi of the MRC of Coaticook and the Town of Waterville. "The CJS is an incredible opportunity for learning and self-realization for the young and this is consistent with our mission at the youth centre," said Olivier Girondier, the coordinator of the Maison des Jeunes.

Only problem is it takes time, tons of red tape to get from words to action.

Let's hope Obama walks the talk

In a long and elaborate speech at Georgetown University last Tuesday President Obama made a powerful push for his new Climate Action Plan. In typical Obama style he used a host of one-liners too get his message through. He said, with regards to the now infamous Keystone XL pipeline debate, "Our energy strategy must be about more than just producing more oil...and by the way, it's certainly got to be about more than just building another pipeline." He backed this point by stating that the pipeline's effects on our climate will be absolutely critical to determining whether this project will be allowed to go forward.

This remark is very important because it recognizes that the Alberta oil will be mainly channelled down to the Gulf of Mexico for export to world markets. The question no one is asking is how much of this oil would eventually be fed into the US market? If the answer is very little, then the project is dead. Why? Because fugitive methane emissions from a pipeline, emissions that are 22 times more potent than carbon emissions, will be american but the market and the money would be coming from the rest of the world.

There were very promising, yet confusing messages sent: More government support for a doubling of renewables and that would include support for farmers to produce more biofuels to feed...cars! More public land will be made available for solar and wind farms, a good move. Even the Department of Defense, the biggest energy consumer in the country, is going into renewables. Putting an end to tax breaks for big oil companies is another goal, if Congress, a Republican Congress says yes. The Obama administration is making a bold move, by committing the federal administration to reduce it's energy consumption by 20 per cent within the next seven years.

In a direct allusion to China, now the leading nation in greenhouse gas emissions, President Obama called for an end to public financing of coal plants overseas. He actually referred to China twice, thus hinting that some sort of a dialogue is underway with regards to interna-

tional climate negotiations. Pointing to a recent agreement on hydrofluorocarbons, he stated that more of the same is to come. If these two giants get serious about climate change, we could see major moves be made come November in Warsaw.

In a typical U.S. approach to politics it seems that all the solutions are American. The best science, the most efficient cars and so on. Voluntary blindness when recognizing other nations' contribution is too often used as an easy sell to voters. More humility should be in order. The US economy did not get to be the first polluter on the planet by being the best at everything!

Using the presidential powers he has, Obama is mandating the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency), a Republican made office, to go as far as it can, without having to stumble over Congress or the Senate. It's about time! The Republicans never shied away from that kind of strategy while in power. Since the Supreme court has ruled that greenhouse gases can be classified as pollutants and are covered by the powers of the EPA, Obama promised he would use this tool to pass as much regulation as possible.

Only problem is it takes time, tons of red tape to get from words to action. One has to wonder whether this President has enough time left. In 18 months he will have reached his executive orders limits, at least in a political way. What he is counting on, and that was stated over and over this week, is that the american economy will use this necessary transition to re-invent itself.

There are signs of a rebirth with giants like GM, Nike and Walmart making major commitments with regards to energy efficiency. Bringing back jobs to the U.S. from China has been big news as of recently, so there are seeds of economic change on the air.

President Obama made a joke about the Flat-Earth society. He repeatedly pointed to America "being at the centre of it all." He insisted on global commitments. As patriotic as this speech was, only time will tell if he has both the will to pass as much as he promises on his own and the capacity to convince Washington's power elites to back him.

At one point, the location to build the new house was the subject of a very specific dream that came to me one night. Some time later, I received a phone call from Ms. Patricia Gauthier, executive director of the CHUS Fleurimont, asking me to meet with her.

The talks ended with an idea for a new building in front of the CHUS.

You then responded to all my appeals, to my many phone calls, my emails, and my letters, with unparalleled generosity.

The building was an amazing adventure, and my partner, Jean-Paul Longchamps, was the man who was always close to advise me, to give support, to encourage me, to correct me, and to reassure me. I want to tell you today that the project for the new house was a success across the board. Your money was used sparingly, but always in the interest of the present and future seriously ill.

The house is a model of work organization, an example of development in order to make patients comfortable

and ready to take the final steps of their journey. Now we have in the Eastern Townships, a jewel of palliative care.

Thank you to the Agency for Health and Social Services of the Eastern Townships for the important partnership and for their encouragement and support of La Maison Aube-Lumière.

Thank you to the authorities of the CHUS, who have generously welcomed us to their neighborhood.

Thank you to the authorities of the CSSS-IUGS, associated with us through service agreements.

Thank you to the ladies and gentlemen of municipal councils and mayors of the region, for your cooperation and involvement.

Thank you to the media, always faithful to La Maison Aube-Lumière. Thank you for listening, for your patience, and your kindness to me. With every phone call I made, there was a friendly ear that never walked away. Thank you, media, for spreading the word.

Thank you to the entire population of the Eastern Townships and elsewhere, who have answered all my requests to ensure the proper functioning of La Maison Aube-Lumière.

Finally, thank you to all the patients who have helped me grow and helped me become a better person.

Now that the area is assured of a place of excellence in palliative care, a home where you are entering an atmosphere of gentleness, love and serenity, the time has come for me to retire.

I take my leave, not without certain sadness. I see the deep attachment that breaks my heart in leaving the sick, and all of you who have worked so well with your words, your attitude, your laughter, your looks, and of course, your donations, and the concrete actions that were frequently offered.

Thank you for accompanying me during these 18 years, and thank you for giving me energy, encouragement and happiness.

My greatest wish is that this precious home is a human place, a home of peace and compassion for cancer patients, a house where you can always say these words that I really like "Here we understand that life is only the beginning of a great day of light."

Notwithstanding other opinions

We all know that "notwithstanding" is a powerful word that is found in the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. It gives Federal and Provincial governments the possibility of temporarily overriding provisions of the Charter. This provides for a government to enact laws that are known to violate protected principles of personal liberty for up to five years at which time the government may reenact the declaration allowing for the perpetual denial of personal liberties.

Clearly, there was pragmatic reason for this clause to be included. Lawyers are smart after all. For example, in a time of national crisis or war we might need to limit personal liberties. More cynically, in establishing the Charter as law it served to encourage parties to sign on who were leery of the potential effect of personal liberties on government power. We in Quebec are especially conscious of the power of "notwithstanding."

There is another word in the Charter that could be very powerful as well. That is, "whereas." The preamble of the Charter reads thus:

"Whereas Canada is founded upon principles that recognize the supremacy of God and the rule of law."

This preamble was settled upon at a late date of the Charter's drafting. The public was engaged in this too considering whether or not reference to "God" had a place in the document. An earlier version of the preamble was more detailed even than this, but Prime Minister Trudeau questioned whether God cared if he were mentioned in the Constitution at all. In any event, this is the preamble and it is part of our law.

There has been a lot of ongoing debate over the impact of the preamble and its relevance to our rights and free-

doms. Some have attempted to point out that the preamble is contradicted by the provisions of Section 2 related to the guaranteeing the fundamental individual freedoms of conscience, religion, belief and opinion. Thus, they argue it has the power to negate the integrity of the Charter as it is internally self-contradictory.

Others have attempted to argue that the order of the document matters. That is, some have said the preamble sets the foundation from which the rest is to be interpreted. Others have said that the subsequent sections provide the detail out of which the preceding is to understood and applied.

Still others have argued that preambles mean nothing, permitting for a "living" document to be set free from the constraints of earlier points of view and to be interpreted in fresh ways over time. Needless to say, the preamble remains a subject of heated debate especially as it relates to the value we place on God and faith and their role in upholding or destroying fundamental justice. There is little middle ground except the decision to ignore our differences of opinion and try to make the best of it.

I want to suggest that preambles are vital to many constitutions and statements of policy. The Quebec Charter of Human Rights and Freedoms includes five whereas statements. The Quebec Charter doesn't have a "notwithstanding" clause but it does permit for a government to override the Charter as long as it knows it is doing so and says so (Article 52). We love our back doors, don't we?

Having been involved in groups where constitutions and policies are being determined I know that preambles with all their "whereas" statements are critical for their enactment. They provide the background and principles that have been assumed from which the following is meant to be understood. At the time of drafting such documents an attack against the preamble would have the effect of forestalling any enactment of the document until the foundations have been established. Only later interpreters have the luxury of deciding that the preamble doesn't matter for the interpretation of the document.

So what about the preamble of the

Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms? We could, as many do, ignore it as an unfortunate relic of a more restrictive past. We could decide to "notwithstanding" it indefinitely. We could choose to determine that the foundation originally set isn't the foundation at all but that there is some other more important foundational principle behind it. We could leave it to the Supreme Court to decide. In effect, we can decide that the actual original intent doesn't matter nor the meaning of the words when they were carefully selected.

I want to plead for the importance of foundations that don't move when someone or some government presses its weight against it. I remember the excitement and tension when we sold a garage to a neighbour. Hoisting it onto the back of a haywagon with beams extending the wagon's breadth we quickly saw that the garage, cut free from its ancient foundations, had a tendency to spread its walls at the base, weakening

the building's integrity and threatening to have the whole thing collapse into something that used to be a garage. Crossmembers of ropes and cables were required to hold it together as it swayed and twisted on its slow journey to its new home. But a foundation had been readied there so the garage could be useful and hold up against weather, use and time.

On this beginning of the Canada Day weekend, I want to remind us all that foundations matter. Destroying the foundation of a building threatens the building. Destroying the foundation of a Charter or constitution puts the integrity of a nation in peril.

We need to exercise grave caution should we decide to remove the assumption of the supremacy of God or the rule of law. Remember this when you sing, "God keep our land glorious and free" this July 1. "Notwithstanding" cannot do the job.

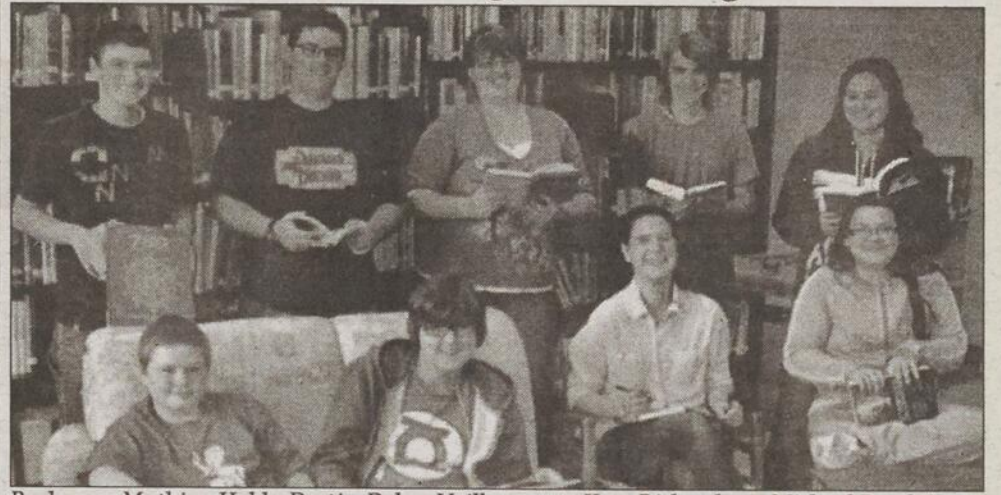
During the official ceremony, Potton

for Leadership Trainees. The majority of the counsellors and adult staff at the camp are, themselves, former campers.

Local Minister Mead Baldwin is the chaplain of the camp, charged with morning watch and vespers, the two worship periods reserved at the beginning and end of each day's schedule. Baldwin goes by the camp-name "Dragon" and takes the time to plan each morning or evening worship with a different cabin group, giving every day's theme a different approach and personality. Outside of those two half-hour blocks of worship, "Dragon" challenges his namesake by being available as a spiritual and emotional support to campers, counsellors and staff.

"I'm really good with names," Baldwin said, "so by the end of the second night I knew the names of the 58 campers. Often the best support is just to walk up to someone and call them by name." The chaplain described his tendency to look after the inevitable homesick or sad campers, finding ways to help them see the joy in camp and connect with the community around them. Having been a counsellor at the camp since 1971, Baldwin clearly empathizes with the young leaders at camp and makes an effort to help them connect with their campers.

Though organized by the church, the camp does not operate on the premise of evangelism that many might be concerned about in looking at a "church camp." The camp's motto "creating a space where the spirit can act" offers a much more informal take on spiritual practices that leaves room for all to find their own comfort level. Baldwin highlighted the relaxed nature of worship at the camp, and said that planning morning watch and vespers with cabin groups and their counsellors is the best part of his camp experience.

"(The campers) see the spiritual in a way that is completely different from

anyone else," Baldwin continued.

Heather Wyche, known to the campers as "Feather" is co-director of the camp along with Jamie Webber, who goes by "Finnn." She spoke to the strength of the community of camp, pointing out that the staff is made up entirely of volunteers coming from different backgrounds and levels of experience. They come to be a part of the camp from places as close as Waterville and as far away as Ottawa, and blend their approaches and outlooks to develop programming that is not just interesting but engaging and beneficial to the lives of the campers in their care.

"It is busy and challenging, but unbelievably fulfilling," Wyche said of the task of directing the camp, "you're exhausted and energized all at the same time."

Denis Ashby, or Turbo, has been helping on the senior campsite since 2008. At 23 years old, this is his fifteenth consecutive summer at the camp, having gone through each one of the age groups and moved on to helping out as part of the all-volunteer adult staff.

"This is a great community," Ashby said, "it feels like family to me."

Speaking with other members of the camp community, it is clear that "Turbo" is a well-known and well-loved part of the camp, having grown up from an often-wild young junior to become a contributing member of the committee that organizes the camp every year.

"The activities are fun, but really it's the people that bring me back here," He added, "it's absolutely made a difference in my life."

Toward the end of a week that has seen a considerable amount of rainfall, the cabins and pathways of Frontier Lodge are filled with campers in good spirits. The sights of smiling faces and children playing are common, showing a positive community that continues to grow and develop year after year.

Pop-ups, fuzzies and wuzzies



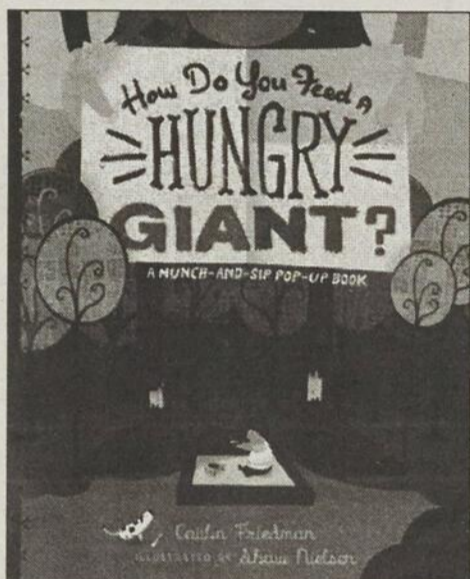
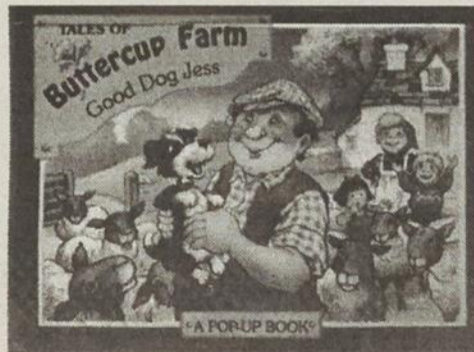

The Baby Looney Tunes book, *A Day On The Farm* (words by Lee Howard, pictures by Adam Devaney, 2010, red dot) also features Baby Tweety, Bugs, Taz and Sylvester doing farm-ish things. 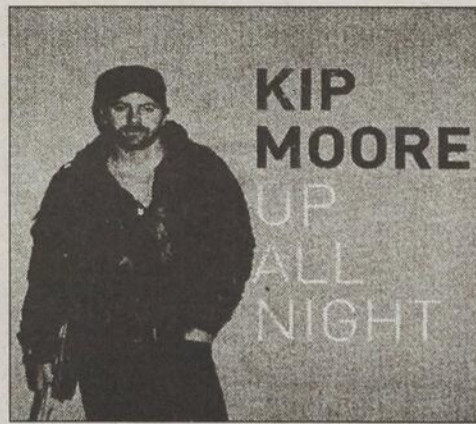

In a previous column I mentioned that Toby Keith and Josh Turner would be the headliners at The Champlain Valley Fair in Essex Junction, Vermont. Both of them have guest artists who will be opening their respective shows.

Because so many of you have been asking, here is the information on the singers who will be opening the show.

Toby Keith will be performing on September 1, 2013 and newcomer Kip Moore



will be opening the show. So let's take a look at the career of the opening act.

Kip Moore is an excellent singer/songwriter. He is signed to MCA Nashville and has released four singles so far, "Mary Was the Marrying Kind," "Some-thing 'Bout a Truck," "Beer Money" and "Hey Pretty Girl." His debut album, *Up All Night*, was released in April 2012.

Moore released the third single, "Hey Pretty Girl," from *Up All Night*, which was the best selling debut album from

any country artist released in 2012. Kip Moore's current Top 10 single "Hey Pretty Girl" and chart-topping "Beer Money" have officially been certified Gold by the RIAA, for sales over 500,000 downloads each.

Moore was born in Tifton, Georgia. He began playing guitar while attending Wallace State Community College in Hanceville, Alabama. After college, he moved to a "little hut" in Hawaii, where he also took up backpacking and surfing.

Most likely tired of this easy lifestyle, he moved to Nashville, Tennessee in 2004, where songwriter and producer Brett James helped him get a publishing deal. He spent four years in Music City before signing to a record deal.

Moore released his debut single "Mary Was the Marrying Kind" in early 2011. He also co-wrote two tracks, "All the Way" and "Let's Fight," from Thompson Square's self-titled debut album, which was released in February 2011. He also co-wrote James Wesley's single "Walking Contradiction."

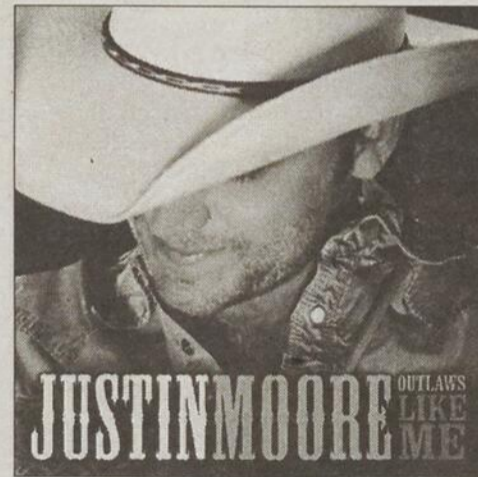
Kip Moore is an energetic and talented young artist and it should be fun to discover what he is all about in a live performance. There is a definite edge to his music but it sounds optimistic.

There's something in Kip Moore's voice that adds credibility to what he sings. His voice offers a balance of hoarseness and tenderness that reminds me of David Lee Murphy and he also has a knack for solid melodies and detail.

He has already sold out dozens of headlining shows this year, sometimes in just minutes. Moore continues to headline his own dates and is also currently opening for superstar Toby Keith through the summer.

Moore, is a singer and songwriter signed to Big Machine Records' imprint of Valory Music Group. Moore has already released two albums for Big Machine Records: Justin Moore in 2009 and *Outlaws Like Me* in 2011.

He has charted six times on the Hot Country Songs charts, including the number one hits "Small Town USA," "If Heaven Wasn't So Far Away," and "Til My Last Day" and the top 10 hit "Backwoods."

He pulls off his brand of twangy, down-on-the-farm roots and rock influences with a country authenticity more skillfully than any other country newcomers at the moment.

One of Moore's musical influences is Hank Williams, Jr., and the song (found on the latest album) "Hank It" is a song about his experience being on tour with Hank Jr. He sings, "A lot of things a country boy learns in life/how to shoot a gun and how to use a knife/But when I pulled into Hershey P-A, and I took my guitar up on the big stage/That night I did the best I could/Me and my band played pretty dern good/And I took myself out and sat in the crowd and learned how Bocephus shakes 'em down/You've got to Hank it." It says a lot about the artist.

Moore began performing during his junior year of high school. After graduating, he joined his uncle's southern rock band and moved to Nashville in 2002.

Through his music attorney Bernie Cahill, he met a young producer in Nashville, Jeremy Stover, who introduced him to Scott Borchetta, an industry executive who was planning to launch The Valory Music Co. Borchetta promised to give him a record deal if he would be patient.

In mid-2008, Moore signed to the Valory Music Group, an imprint of the independent record label Big Machine Records. His first radio single, "Back That Thing Up," was co-written by his producer Jeremy Stover and Universal South Records artist Randy Houser.

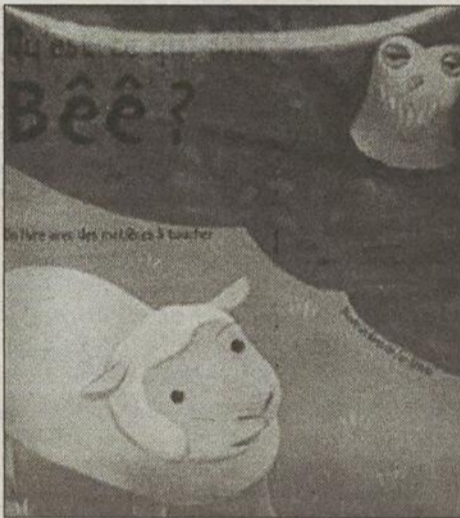
In December 2012, he entered the studio to begin recording his third studio album. "Point At You" is the new single from his forthcoming new album, *Seven Moore Hits*. Concert goers might get a chance to hear some of that new material and discover what that talented artist is like on stage.

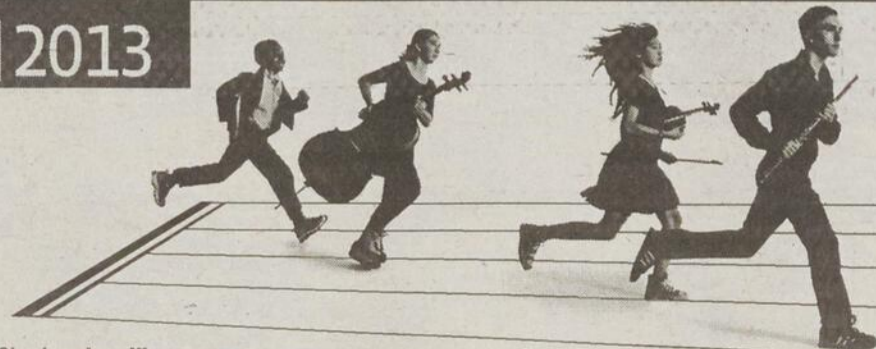

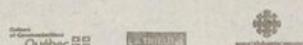

'White House Down' a refreshing throwback to dumb summer fun

Staggeringly implausible, cartoonishly comical, Roland Emmerich's "White House Down" is refreshingly dumb.

Refreshing because carefree action absurdity, once the province of the summer cinema, is on the outs. Solemnity — even for caped, flying men in tight-fitting trousers — is in.

But there's an inarguable, senseless pleasure in watching Jamie Foxx, as the

president of the United States, kicking a terrorist and shouting: "Get your hands off my Jordans!" Hail to the chief, indeed.

"White House Down" follows Antoine Fuqua's "Olympus Has Fallen," released in March, as the second movie this year to imagine an assault on 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. The two films are very similarly plotted, but "White House Down" is notably less serious, more content to loosen the strings and acknowledge its own inherent preposterousness.

This becomes particularly crystalized

ident James Sawyer and his rescuer, Channing Tatum's wannabe secret service agent, are careening across the White House lawn in the president's limo while terrorists shoot in pursuit. Onlookers behind a fence — media, regular people, the Army — merely gape in awe, as if frozen by the idiocy.

"White House Down" is most entertaining when it's a simple, ludicrous buddy movie, with Tatum and Foxx fleeing across the White House grounds, dropping one-liners as they go, eluding a gang of assailants led by a bitter turncoat (James Woods) and his ferocious henchmen (including Jason Clarke, swapping sides in the war on terror following "Zero Dark Thirty").

This is a kind of coronation for Tatum as a movie star. He's now reached the level that he can breeze through a blatantly silly movie and look none the worse for it. He's John Cale (not to be confused with the Velvet Underground musician, although, how could you?), a Silver Star veteran of Afghanistan and a police bodyguard to the speaker of the house (Richard Jenkins).

For his Secret Service interview at the White House, he's brought along his politics-obsessed 11-year-old daughter (the promising Joey King). But it goes poorly, partly because his would-be boss turns out to be an old flame (Maggie Gyllenhaal) who doubts he's grown up. There's some reason to believe her, since Cale (in

the mould of most action heroes) is an absentee, divorced dad.

It's an archetype defined by Bruce Willis in "Die Hard," a movie "White House Down" apes right down to the tank top. When the Capitol dome is detonated and the White House invaded, Cale is separated from his daughter and stumbles into the kidnapping of the president. From there, it's a series of chases through the handsome, recreated halls of the White House, where golden light filters in through venetian blinds but seemingly scant security measures exist.

Emmerich, the director of spectacles like "Independence Day" (a movie he references in "White House Down") and "2012," has made blowing up the White House something of a fetish, having already done it in both of those movies. It's a style of blockbuster that now feels dated, like a '90s kind of big-budget moviemaking that depends on explosions, flashes of comedy and star charisma.

The charm of Tatum — toned but goofy — carries the film. Foxx, a more gifted comic actor, is left off-screen for large chunks. His president is a kind of liberal fantasy version of Barack Obama, boldly removing all troops from the Middle East, thereby sparking the fury of the Beltway's white power

Kick up your legs France's Moulin Rouge casting for Canadian talent

Calling on Canadians who can do the can-can. France's world-renowned Moulin Rouge cabaret will hold castings in three Canadian cities starting this weekend.

Auditions will be held at the National Ballet School in Toronto this Saturday at noon Eastern.

The next casting will be at Studio Bizz, Mont-Royal in Montreal on July 4 at noon, followed by Vancouver's Harbour Dance Centre on July 13 at 11 a.m.

Organizers say this is just the second time the Paris company is travelling to Canada to look for talent.

Moulin Rouge associate artistic director Janet Pharaoh will oversee the scouting process with resident choreographer Erik Sorensen.

A statement says women must also have a "well-balanced figure but also and mainly the personality, the charisma and the capacity to assimilate choreographies with class and distinction. And for the boys, a well-proportioned muscled body."

Canadians already dancing at the Moulin Rouge include Cara Lee from Vancouver and Katelyn Adams from Toronto.

players.

If "White House Down" had pushed the farce further, Emmerich's overlong romp could have been something special. But the comedy in James Vanderbilt's screenplay only comes in spurts.

Many of its biggest laughs don't come when they're cued up, but at the film's attempts at emotion. Woods, for example, gravely announces: "Killing Ted Hope was the second hardest thing I've had to do in my life." If stripped of its production value, "White House Down" would make one hysterical off-Broadway one-act.

"White House Down," a Columbia Pictures release, is rated PG-13 for prolonged sequences of action and violence including intense gunfire and explosions, some language and a brief sexual image. Running time: 137 minutes. Two stars out of four.

Seven Gaiters start 2013 season on CFL rosters

The Canadian Football League is set to kick off on Thursday night in Winnipeg. Once again there will be a strong connection to Lennoxville. Seven former Bishop's University Gaiters will don CFL colours in 2013.

The BC Lions perennially seem to be Bishop's west. This year Tim Cronk (Kingston, Ont.) enters his third CFL season, Kyle Jones (Mississauga, Ont.) is in his fifth year and Shawn Gore is entering his fourth season.

The most recent Gaiters graduate and reigning Brian Morley Gaiters Defensive

Player of the Year, Elie N'Goyi (Sherbrooke) cracked a spot on the Edmonton roster in his rookie season. The sixth-round draft pick is now teamed up with former Gaiters all-Canadian and head coach Leroy Blugh. Blugh is coaching the Eskimos' defensive line.

Junior Turner (Toronto) enters his third campaign with the Calgary Stampeders. James Yurichuk (Brampton, Ont.) will make his Toronto Argonauts debut in his fifth CFL season. Dan West (Ajax, Ont.) starts his second CFL season on Thursday night when his Blue Bombers host the Alouettes.

"It's great to see so many BU guys in the CFL," said Gaiters head coach Kevin Mackey. "All of them are great people with tremendous dedication and com-

mitment. I have no doubt that Bishop's played a huge part in developing them not only as football players but as people too. We are very proud of them."

Sherbrooke Extreme try to keep first-round bye hopes alive this weekend

After a come-from-behind win over the Windsor Eagles last Sunday, the Sherbrooke Extreme face a pair of games this weekend and need to win both to keep their faint hopes of a first-round bye alive.

With four games left, Sherbrooke sits in third place with a 6-5 record. They are six points back of Windsor (9-3) and ten back of the league leaders Longueuil (11-2). In order for Sherbrooke to finish second in the league, and avoid the single-game quarterfinal round, the Extreme must win all their remaining games and Windsor must lose all of theirs.

The Extreme host the struggling Magog Memphrés (3-9) on Friday night at 8 p.m. Friday's game will be played at the Ivan Dugré arena on Galt West, as the Extreme's regular home floor is unavailable due to the Pif Classic softball tournament. On Sunday afternoon, the Extreme travel to Longueuil to face the league leaders, who are undefeated on home floor.

Last Sunday, the Extreme were 20 minutes away from being shunted to the quarterfinal round, as they trailed Windsor 7-3 after two periods but scored five unanswered goals, including the game-winner with just over five minutes left, to edge Windsor 8-7. Jean-Simon Demers, the Extreme's leading scorer, scored seven points (four goals, three assists), while Paul Lehmann had a pair of goals, including the game-winner.

Friday's opponent, the Magog Memphrés, have lost three straight and six of their last seven. However, the teams' last matchup, on

June 9 in Magog, was one of the league's most exciting games this season, as Sherbrooke held off a late Memphrés comeback to win 11-10 in overtime. While Magog has found a home for any potential playoff games, having struck a deal with the Coaticook Arena this week, it remains to be seen if any will be played. The Memphrés will need to pass East Angus (5-7) in the last two weeks to move into fourth place and host a quarterfinal game.

On Sunday, the Extreme will run into the Longueuil Patriotes, who have rebounded from a 1-2 start to rattle off ten straight victories. The teams met twice early in the year, with Sherbrooke winning 8-6 at home on May 3, and Longueuil picking up a 9-6 home win on May 19.

In other games on Friday, Windsor travels to Trois-Rivières to play Mauricie (2-10), while Longueuil visits East Angus, with both games starting at 8 p.m. On Sunday, in addition to the Longueuil-Sherbrooke tilt, Mauricie travels to Windsor for a 7 p.m. game.

Bettman says future of the Coyotes up to Glendale

NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman says the future of the Phoenix Coyotes is up to the Glendale city council and out of the league's immediate control.

The board of governors discussed the Coyotes' situation at Thursday's meeting, but nothing was voted on.

If Glendale does not approve a deal with Renaissance Sports & Entertainment, the Coyotes could move in time for the 2013-14 season, Bettman and deputy commissioner Bill Daly said.

Daly said there were multiple relocation options available but declined to elaborate. Asked specifically about Seattle and the viability of Key Arena, Daly said it could house an NHL team.

Bettman said the league hasn't "ironed out or put into effect a plan B" if the Coyotes deal is not approved.

Meanwhile, Bettman received approval from the board to make an agreement to send NHL players to the Olympics. He is hoping that gets done at a meeting Monday.

Bettman did not give an update on proposed rule changes such as mandatory visors for incoming players and hybrid icing. He deferred to the NHLPA, which has its executive meetings next week.



Harry Jerome International Track Meet celebrates 30 years on Canada Day

This year on Canada's birthday marks the 30th anniversary of the Vancouver Sun Harry Jerome International Track Classic - part of the NTL - National Track League series. It is Canada's oldest and most prestigious track and field meet that will take place at Swangard Stadium in Burnaby, B.C.

No matter what the weather forecast predicts on July 1, get ready, set, and watch as there will be some gut wrenching performances both on and off the track. The Jerome meet will feature more than 40 Olympians from more than 12 countries, who will be competing to qualify for the IAAF World Championships set for Moscow, Russia from August 10 to 18.

If you're visiting the Vancouver area, come show your Canadian spirit and support by cheering on these high performance track and field athletes where 30-year-old, Canadian record holder, Olympian Kelsie Hendry of Saskatoon will face a strong field of pole vaulters from the US.

Some other highlights, doubtless, will

include 32-year-old Canadian Olympic shot putter Dylan Armstrong. According to an article by Gary Kingston of the Vancouver Sun, "Organizers of the Vancouver Sun Harry Jerome Track Classic are planning to celebrate Armstrong being bumped up to a medal position - bronze medal - for the 2008 Beijing Olympics, although a formal awarding of an Olympic bronze may take a couple of months. The medal is the first-ever won in a throwing event by a Canadian athlete at the Olympics."

Watch for 33-year-old Canadian Olympic hurdler Angela Whyte, now residing in Moscow, Idaho, to compete against 31-year-old compatriot and rival Canadian Olympian Jessica Zelinka in the 100-metre hurdles. Zelinka, who placed seventh at 100-metre hurdles in 12.65 at the London Games, will focus primarily on the 100-metre hurdles, despite owning the Canadian record for the heptathlon.

In a recent e-mail interview, meet directors and former Olympians Dr. Doug and Diane Clement said: "One of the highlights will be a world record at-

tempt for Duane Solomon in the 600-metre - to break his coach Johnny Gray's record." Solomon, the newly minted American 800-metre champion from Lompoc, CA, will certainly heat up the track, rain or not - and the forecast is good. This concept is the brainchild of Gray, the middle distance coach at UCLA. Gray, a four-time Olympian and 1992 Olympic bronze medal winner in Barcelona, might know something about records as he holds the Jerome Classic 800-metre record of 1:43.70 set in 1988 as well as the world record in the 600-metre with the time of 1:12.21. The now 53-year-old Gray set the American record of 1:42.60 in 1985. The 600-metre is the distance Gray wants his protégé, Solomon, to tackle on Canada Day at Swangard Stadium.

With the Harry Jerome now celebrating a milestone anniversary, the Clements said, "The 30th anniversary - where have the years gone? We are excited to honour Canada's and B.C.'s Harry Jerome on the 30th anniversary of our Achilles Society International Track Classic. Over the 30 years we have had

Olympians from around the world compete, and have set the stage for our own Canadian athletes to pursue their dream of representing Canada and B.C. in the Olympic and Commonwealth Games, and to be 'the best they can be' to pursue their goals in sports and life."

Lots of track and field action you don't want to miss. It starts at 1 p.m. followed by the opening ceremonies at 2 p.m.

Tickets for the NTL event on July 1 are \$10 for general admission and \$25 for finish line.

The Harry Jerome Track meet was named after Harry Jerome (1940-1982), who is regarded as one of Canada's greatest Olympians, competing in the 1960, 1964, and 1968 Summer Olympics, winning 100-metre bronze in 1964 at the Tokyo games. Harry Jerome, (1940-1982)

Bergevin faces extra heat going into second draft as Habs' GM

Holding the third overall draft pick made things relatively simple for Marc Bergevin a year ago at his first NHL draft as general manager of the Montreal Canadiens.

This time may be trickier, as Bergevin and his staff go into Sunday's draft holding the 25th overall pick. However, having six picks in the first three rounds could make it interesting.

"Last year we only had two picks before ours and we had a good idea of what we were going to do," said Bergevin, who selected forward Alex Galchenyuk. "This year, it's completely different."

And this time there is unexpected extra pressure on Bergevin in the form of centre Vincent Lecavalier.

Montreal fans are pushing hard for the Canadiens to sign Lecavalier, who entered the unrestricted free agent market on Thursday when the Tampa Bay Lightning announced they were buying out 33-year-old's hefty contract.

The Canadiens have not had a French-Canadian star in many years, and Lecavalier would fit that bill. They also want to get bigger up front, and Lecavalier is six-foot-four. And, with 20 players signed and \$9 million in salary cap space open, they should be able to afford him.

Even Mathieu Darche, a former Cana-

dien and Lightning, urged Bergevin on his blog for RDS to sign the slick centre who scored 52 goals in 2006-07.

The temptation to make a play for his former teammate in Tampa would have to be enormous, even if it seems to go against Bergevin's philosophy.

Only a week ago, Bergevin said he was leery of using free agency for anything but acquiring role players to fill gaps in the roster, as he did last summer with Brandon Prust and Colby Armstrong.

"To me, free agency is a tool, but it's not a way to make your team a top team," he said. "It's overplayed. You have

to be really careful with free agency."

He does not rule out making a deal to move up in the draft, however. The Canadiens have three second round picks, including the 34th and 36th overall from previous deals, as well as their own 55th pick. They also draft 71st and 86th overall in the third round.

"I can say we're always looking to improve our position, but there's a price to pay," he said.

"You don't build a team through free agency or trades, you build it through the draft. And you need to be patient with these guys. Look at the teams that have success, like Chicago. The core of their players, most of them came through the draft. And it took years for them to become the elite team they are now. It's not a secret recipe, how to build a hockey team."

He gave no indication on what sort of players he and scouting director Trevor Timmins are looking for.

After his smaller-than-average team was eliminated in the first round of play-offs by Ottawa, he said he would like more "balance" between big and small players. So they may look for some bigger bodies.

The organization is also thin on goalies, having not drafted one since they took Petteri Simla 211th overall in 2009. They have selected only two since they got Carey Price fifth overall in 2005.

So they may be tempted by Halifax Mooseheads goalie Zach Fucale.

There are a handful of other prospects from Quebec who may be available if that is a consideration, including defenceman Samuel Morin and forwards Laurent Dauphin, Anthony Mantha and perhaps Frederik Gauthier.

The flashy Jonathan Drouin, expected to go in the top five, is likely out of their reach. Bergevin said it would take more than offering a first and second round pick to move up that high.

"It's not just to draft the players available, but to draft the players you like," he said. "If you can move up and get that player, and it comes at a price you feel is not too steep, then I will do that."

What he has to offer is other draft picks.

"Especially in the early second (round)," he said. "The 34th and 36th. Those are really good picks. They're appealing picks."

Montreal has its best collection of picks since it had five in the top 73 in 2007. That year, they got Ryan McDonagh (now a New York Ranger) 12th, Max Pacioretty 22nd, Norris Trophy winner P.K. Subban 43rd and defenceman Yannick Weber 73rd.

Their off-season moves so far include buying out rearguard Tomas Kaberle and signing depth defenceman Davis Drewiske to a new deal.

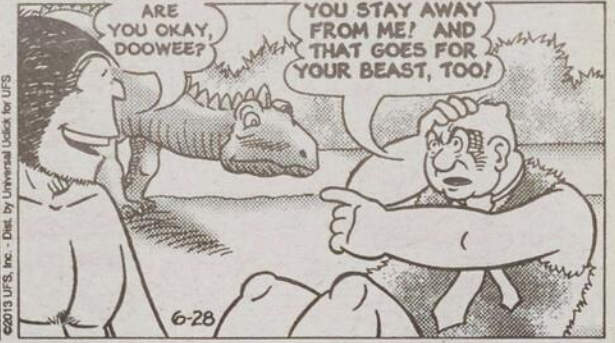

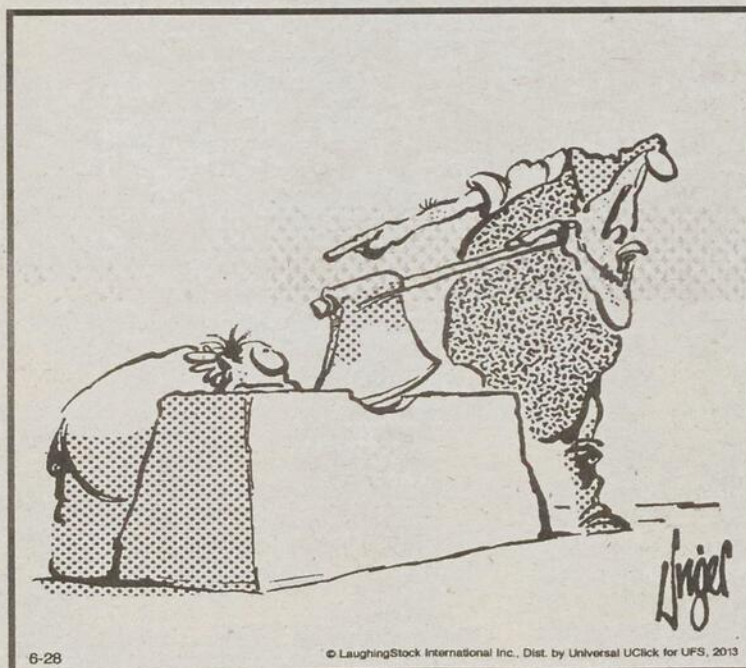

Dear Annie: I've been trying to write a novel for a year. The problem is, I have no support from my family. My wife and friends always groan when I ask them to read what I've written. I'm trying to be considerate of their level of interest and don't want them to be annoyed with me, but I need some feedback on my writing.

That being said, would you know where I could send my pages for review? I'd like to know if my story is interesting the way I'm writing it, or if I need to develop it better. — Amateur Author in El Paso, Texas

Dear Author: There are various ways to get your written material in front of an audience. You can ask writing teachers to look at it. You can search for a writers workshop or try meetup.com for a writing group that critiques members' work. You can self-publish (you are responsible for all costs), put it in a blog or on an Internet site for free (you will get myriad comments, many

worthless, and you'd better have a thick skin), enter a writing contest, or submit a short version to a magazine. You also can go to the nearest library and find a listing of literary agents. An agent will help get your book into the hands of a reputable publisher or reviewer. Getting published is not easy, but if you have talent and skill, it is possible.

Dear Annie: Our daughter was asked to be the maid of honor at her friend's wedding. She was very excited about it. We planned a small shower for her closest friends and family. Now the bride and her mother have given us a list of 78 women to invite. I checked the etiquette book and found no encouragement for such a large event. The 78 women are also invited to the wedding reception.

We simply cannot afford such a large shower, and the bride's parents know it. I do not understand how they could expect us to handle such a large event. Our daughter doesn't want to lose the bride's friendship. Should she bow out of the wedding? — Anxious Parent

Dear Anxious: No bride should demand such extravagant favors. 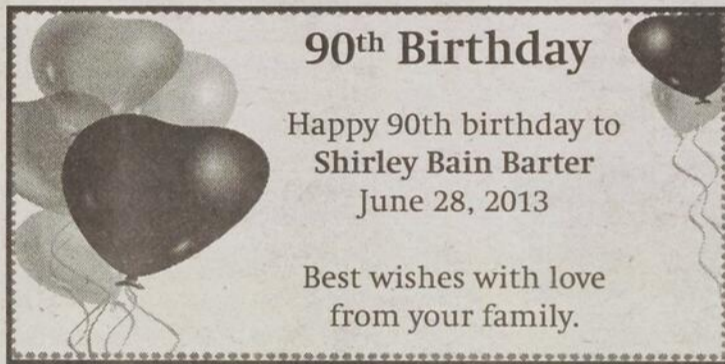
Dear Annie: Your answer to "Parents at Wits' End," whose bipolar son would not take his meds, exemplifies the dilemma posed by mental illness in this country, namely that without the patient's cooperation matters may quickly grow hopeless.

My wife had severe bipolar disorder. It was only luck that kept her aggressive driving from killing all of us and enabled her to keep her job. A friend urged me to leave with my children, but I knew my kids would be devastated, and I worried that my wife would kill herself.

My wife saw a doctor who prescribed an antidepressant, but she did not want a mood stabilizer. The antidepressant by itself sent her spiraling, as she knew it would. The doctor's nurse later told me, "We knew something was wrong, but she wouldn't talk about it when she came in." Less than a year later, my wife committed suicide, breaking all of our hearts.

If a bipolar person cannot cooperate, the family can do nothing but pray. — Wiser in Tennessee

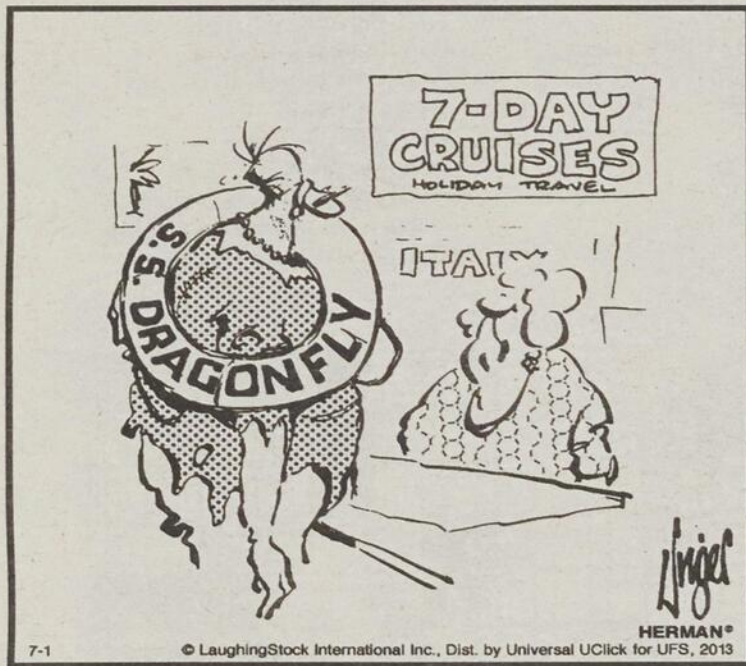

You have points but no good bid

E.J. Smith, the future captain of the Titanic, certainly tempted fate by saying, "When anyone asks me how I can best describe my experience in nearly 40 years at sea, I merely say, uneventful. I never saw a wreck ... nor was I ever in any predicament that threatened to end in disaster of any sort."

When you are in a predicament at the bridge table, consider the various sensible options and decide between them.

Look at the North hand in today's diagram. East opens two diamonds, weak; South makes a takeout double; and West raises to three diamonds. What should North do?

He clearly has enough strength to act, but to force to game with a four-diamond cue-bid would be overstating his hand, especially since the diamond king is probably worthless. And he would prefer not to guess which major to bid.

The answer is to double. It is called responsive and says, "I have enough strength to act but no suitable bid available." South, with such a strong hand, should jump to four spades.

West leads the diamond queen. The defenders take two tricks in the suit, then play a club. How should South continue?

In danger of losing one spade, one heart and two diamonds, he should assume a favorable layout. Here, he wins the fourth trick, draws two rounds of trumps, cashes the two top hearts and plays on clubs. Whether East ruffs in or discards and is then endplayed with his trump winner, he must concede a ruff-and-sluff, on which South's last heart disappears.

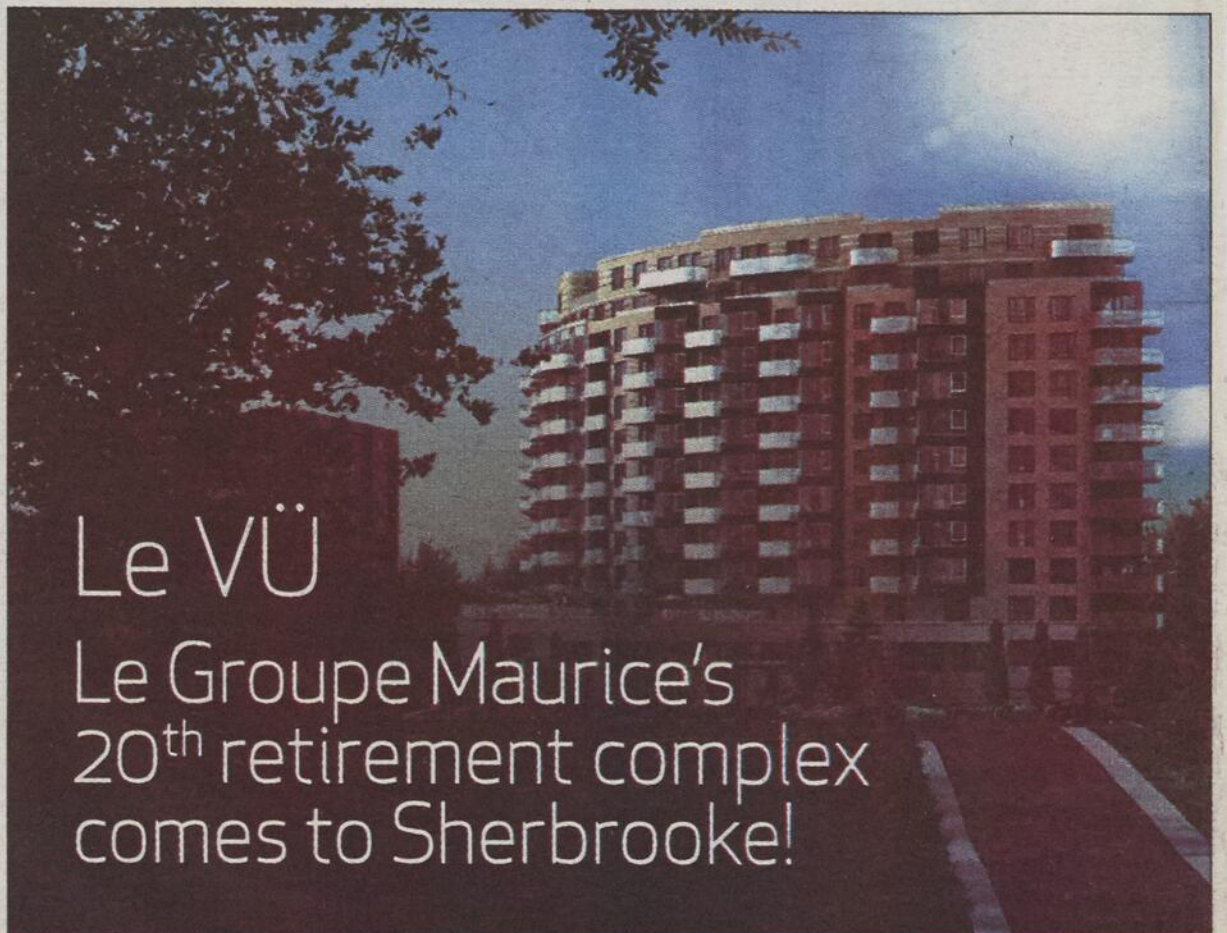
