SHIPPING. No Elections Just Yet

Manitoba Schools. REMEDIAL ORDER PASSED. The Manitoba Government Called Upon to Act.

Parliament Summoned for the 18th April. OTTAWA, March 21.—The Government this afternoon decided to call Parliament together for Thursday, the 18th day of April, and finally adopted a remedial order in the Manitoba School appeal, which was passed in the presence of and signed by the Governor-General.

At three o'clock this afternoon His Excellency arrived at the Privy Council Chamber for the hearing before the Privy Council of the appeal of the Manitoba School appeal, which was passed in the presence of and signed by the Governor-General.

The Order in Council upon which the remedial order is founded is a lengthy document, based upon the minutes of Council drawn up by a Commission of Enquiry, which recites the whole history of the case, the passage of the School Act of 1890 by the Greenway Government, the petitions for redress, the hearing before the Privy Council, and the reference to the Supreme Court and appeal from its finding to the Judicial Committee of the Imperial Privy Council, on the 14th of December, 1894.

The Committee desires to add that their Lordships of the Judicial Committee state in their judgment: "Bearing in mind the circumstances which existed in 1870, it does not appear to the Committee an extravagant proposition that in creating a Legislature for the Province with limited powers, it should have been thought expedient in case either Roman Catholics or Protestants should be in a minority, and rights which had come into existence under different circumstances were interfered with, to give the Dominion Parliament power to legislate upon matters of education so far as was necessary to protect the Protestant or Roman Catholic minority as the case might be." In the opinion of the Committee the Manitoba Act, as construed in regard to the present case by the Judicial Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council, so clearly points to a duty upon Your Excellency in Council, in the event of a no vote, consistent with both the letter and the spirit of the Constitution, other than that recommended. To dismiss this appeal on the ground that the remedial order would not be to deny to the Roman Catholic minority rights substantially guaranteed them under the Constitution of the Province is, in the opinion of the Committee, to do violence to the intention of the Legislature of the Province, and to do violence to the rights of the Roman Catholic minority.
