LOMBART CHOCOLATE

In 1760, under Louis XV, Mr. Meunier took up his residence on *Vieilles Etuves Saint-Honoré* Street, near the Du Trahoir Cross, now known as the *Fontaine de l'Arbre-Sec*.

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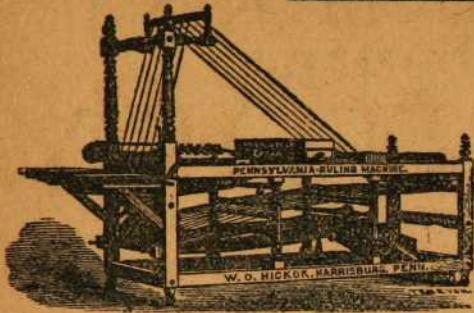
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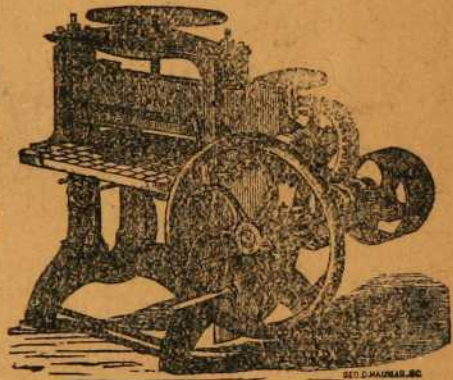
