American wine industry not limited to California

One of the delightful things about the North American wine industry is its relative newness. Admittedly, grapes have been grown here and wine made for several hundred years but the development of a multi-million dollar industry is a phenomenon that dates more or less from the end of the last war.

Spurred on by increased consumption — which means increased sales — wine makers are rediscovering many traditional grape growing regions as well as pioneering new vineyards in corners of the continent hitherto thought unsuitable.

For example, most of us are familiar with the two major grape-growing regions of the United States, California and New York State, but few among us probably realize that Ohio was the largest producer of grapes prior to the Civil War. Today, thanks to a renewed interest in wine, Ohio boasts over forty wineries producing a variety of wines from native labrusca and European vinifera grapes.

And don't forget the Pacific Northwest. Both Oregon and Washington boast areas with climates similar to various European regions and both are producing wines of quality. Washington, in particular, seems to have a very bright future and with its huge production (over 20,000 acres of vines; third largest in the U.S.) it could one day conceivably challenge California as the premier wine producing region of North America.

Closer to home, Canadian wineries including the industry giants Brights, Andres and Chateau Gai have been looking with increasing interest at the North Shore of Lake Erie. And they are no more than Johnny-Come-Latelys. Traditionally tobacco and fruit country, this region with its temperate climate and the moderating influence of the nearby lake, has been the home of several independent wineries for a number years now.

Today there are wineries in Alberta, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, Oklahoma, Michigan and Pennsylvania. In short, where the soil and weather are good, someone is trying to make wine.

And why shouldn't they? The excellent Californian Cabernet Sauvignons, Chardonnays and Pinot Noirs have proved to the entire world that the traditional wine nations of Europe do not hold a monopoly on quality. So the next time you are faced with a bottle of Ozark Mountain White or Cuvée Annapolis Valley, don't curl your lip in disdain, you just might be missing something. Cheers!

'Old times' of folk coming back to Newport folk festival

NEWPORT, R.I. (AP) — Like captives on the carousel of time, folk singers have come full circle with their ballads of love and songs of discontent.

More than two dozen performers will fill this New England sea town Saturday and Sunday at the first Newport Folk Festival in 16 years.

Joan Baez, Judy Collins, Arlo Guthrie and others will sing the old songs, add some new ones and decide whether folk music can still draw crowds the way it once did.

Producer George Wein, who founded the Newport Jazz Festival in 1954 and started the folk festival five years later, is banking on just this revival. Without a corporate sponsor, Wein has personally bankrolled a \$150,000-\$200,000 budget.

Peter, Paul and Mary: Still going strong 25 years later

NEW YORK (AP) — Two decades ago, Peter, Paul and Mary performed in Greenwich Village coffee houses with Judy Collins, Richie Havens, Tom Paxton and Bob Dylan, harmonizing the angst of an era.

"We were all poor and loved folk music and had enthusiasm and could stay up all night and sing," Mary Travers said.

"We still love music and have enthusiasm. I'm not sure we could stay up all night, though."

Peter, Paul and Mary recently celebrated the 25th anniversary of their beginning as one of folk music's most enduring acts by performing again at the Bitter End. They first appeared at the Greenwich Village club in 1961.

Travers, Peter Yarrow and Paul Stookey gave a benefit concert to raise money for a elementary school syllabus for the study of folk music. It's in memory of the late Charity Bailey, the schoolteacher who introduced Travers to folk music when she lived in Greenwich Village as a child.

About half of their concerts in August feature "suppers with the artists" tickets (about \$75) to raise money to oppose intervention by the United States in El Sal-

vador. Last summer they raised \$500,000 with similar suppers for 30 political candidates. In the fall, they're considering going to El Salvador and Nicaragua.

Peter, Paul and Mary have been crusading for causes throughout their career. Now they're reaching new generations with their protest songs and political statements.

"We've never seen our music as just good-timey music or entertainment," Yarrow said in an interview.

FEELS POWERFUL
"Folk music is a connection to people and in a sense it is empowering music. When you've sung it, you feel like you can do something and if you feel that way, you can."

"That's what we felt in the '60s, that each person could play a part in making what was wrong right. It's still part of the air we breathe."

He recently visited El Salvador, where he sang Stookey's song, El Salvador.

"All the songs I've written since 1968 really have emanated from a reborn, positive, Christian concern," the 49-year-old Stookey said.

"El Salvador (the song) was born out of first-hand reports from people in Central America, in Sojourners, a Christian publi-

town.

"I don't think people should get their hopes up that they could repeat 1960," Baez said. "But there is still an audience in the world for real music, not amplified music, I guess."

Folk music is acoustic and usually does not rely on amplification. It has its roots in American Indians, black storytelling, Appalachian mountain songs and New England sea chanteys. From the 1940s to the '60s, it was spearheaded by such artists as Leadbelly, Pete Seeger, Jean Richie, Woody Guthrie, Josh White and Burl Ives.

A younger crowd evolved in the '60s and made folk music commercial show biz: the Kingston Trio, Peter Paul and Mary, the Brothers Four. Folk music peaked, "hootenanny" became a buzz word and the Newport Folk Festival reigned supreme.

Folk songs may have inspired a generation or two. But record company officials say those times have paid more dividends in memories than in cash. Industry officials say sales of folk albums are up for the 1980s, but far off the pace set 20 years before. Wein is not concerned. "I'm not in the record game," he said. "I'm in the music game, and this is going to be two days of wonderful music."

cation out of Washington."

Travers, 48, went with 17 other Americans on a fact-finding trip to El Salvador in 1983.

"I went down as Mary did, to observe, talk and find out what is happening, because it is such a pivotal time and circumstances," Yarrow said.

"I came back traumatized, uplifted, frightened and ashamed."

Peter, Paul and Mary broke up in 1970. When they reunited in 1978, they began scheduling trio concerts for part of each year, leaving ample time for individual endeavors.

The best reward the trio receives, the 48-year-old Yarrow said, "is people coming backstage sometimes and saying, 'I was very moved by something you said seven years ago.' That's part of the real success of what we do, to have a glimpse that what we've contributed has made a difference in somebody's life."

Said Travers: "It is really amazing to look at the family, our own and the audience. Looking down from the stage, we may see three or four generations and they're all singing Puff (Puff the Magic Dragon) or Blowin' in the Wind. It is not the kind of award you hang on the wall, but it's the best kind."

Caricatures, miniature carving fill retirement

NORTH HATLEY — Maurice Biron took up wood carving relatively late in life, but when he did he attacked it with vigor.

Two walls in his North Hatley home attest to his ingenuity and hours of patient labor.

Thirty-five carved caricatures of some of his favorite faces form a real rogues' gallery on those walls, and each of these faces, ranging from about three to six inches in height, represents about 75 hours of work, said Biron.

He has the faces of such illustrious and notorious characters as Pierre Trudeau, René Lévesque, Richard Nixon, Rudolph Nureyev, Mordecai Richler and even Mother Theresa immortalized in pine.

Nobody taught him how to carve, he said; "It's just something that you sort of pick up and figure out."

"You can learn it," Biron said, "but it's just like learning the piano — you can be a good pianist, and you can be a so-so pianist."

"The big thing it takes is patience," he said. "You can't be in a hurry with these things."

Biron may not hurry, but he sure manages to get things done. In addition to the caricatures, he has carved a collection of about 16 miniature wooden sleighs (6 to 12 inches long), complete with horses and riders.

LITTLE HISTORY

Biron has memories to go with almost all of the sleighs, he says. "That's why I call it my 'little history of Sherbrooke'," he said.

One sleigh has the name of Magog House painted on its side. It is

a model of one used to trolley train passengers from the station to the hotel. Biron says he can still hear the drivers of the sleighs from each of the three hotels in Sherbrooke calling out the hotel names as passengers got off the train.

One says F.H. Hébert on the side — the name of a grocery store owner who later became mayor of Sherbrooke.

A little red bob-sled brings back memories of Saturday nights in the twenties, says Biron.

"I remember when Saturday evenings around 7:00 we boys and girls — about seven or ten of us — would drag our sled up King Hill East all the way to Stoke Hill (now Côte des Quatorze)," he said. "We left at 7:00 to get there by 9:00, for one ride down. We'd get as far as the bridge. Then we'd go to one of the girl's places for hot chocolate."

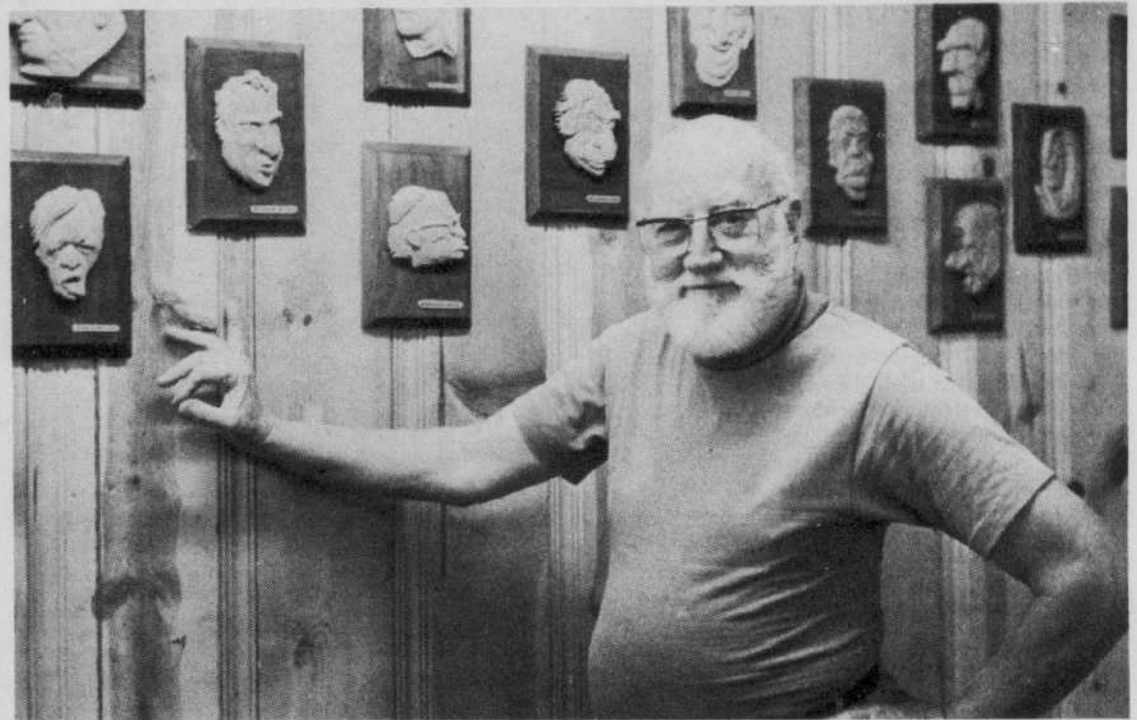
One sleigh, with the name of the Sherbrooke Railway and Power Company on the side, might puzzle anyone who doesn't remember Sherbrooke having a trolley system. A ladder and platform rising up from the sleigh were for repairing the trolley lines above the tracks.

TAKE LESS TIME

The sleighs take less time than doing faces, says Biron, at about 40 hours each. But sometimes details have to be redone. "It doesn't take much to get one slightly off," he said.

"Sometimes you just can't get one right," he said. "It's like a slump in batting."

There's just one more he'd like to add to his collection, he said, "because it's part of life and it's

also the last journey" — a hearse. He has yet to find the model for it though.

He has had some offers to buy parts of both his caricature and his sleigh collection, but for now, it stays with him.

"The more you have, the more you like them," he said. "You hate to do the same one twice, and your collection is not improving if you sell or give them away."

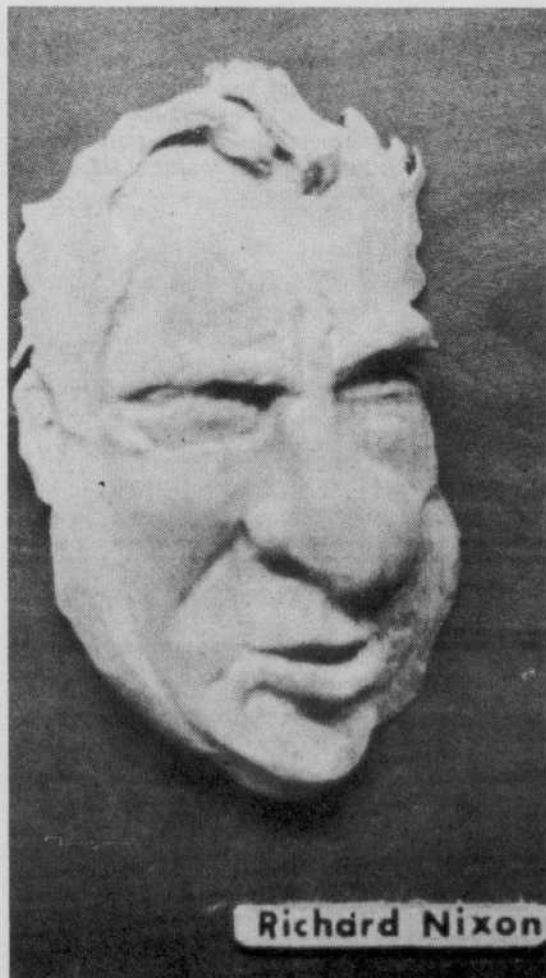
Both collections will eventually go to the Sherbrooke museum, he says.

At 75, Biron has some advice for anyone within ten years of retirement: start planning for it

now.

"When you retire you have 35 or 40 extra hours a week," he said. "You can't play golf 35 hours a

week, 52 weeks a year. You've got to ask yourself a lot of questions about what you want to do with your time."

Better to see aunt Matilda's work than Walker's

KNOWLTON — From the hype surrounding the Galerie Lac Brome's Jo Walker exhibit on this week and next, one might legitimately expect a direct artistic descendent of the Group of Seven.

At the very least, one should expect a reasonably competent and imaginative painter. After all, line two of the Galerie's flak-sheet tells that "as a child her interest in art was fostered and encouraged by Group of Seven founder A.Y. Jackson, who was to remain a great influence and close friend for the rest of his life."

And *Record* columnist Brian Timmins, the Galerie Lac Brome proprietor, only last Friday wrote that the Walker exhibit would be "the next major attraction in Knowlton." Piling it even deeper, Timmins added that it "promises to be the premiere one-person show in the Townships this summer," without mentioning his own connection.

OWES APOLOGY?

Timmins should know better. He should also apologize to a long line of Townships artists, beginning with Mary Martin of Dunham. Martin's one-woman show at the Brome County Historical Society last month made Walker's look like the 'Gong Show' on a bad day.

Further, the Galerie flak-sheet concludes of Walker that "her paintings have become synonymous with the Quebec countryside," a claim only Martin among locals could conceivably sustain, and Martin has better sense than to make it.

(But again, manure is synonymous with the Quebec countryside during certain seasons.)



In short, for the second time in a month, the Galerie Lac Brome is staging an exhibition under false pretenses. Like athlete-artist Rhoda Eaves who preceded her, Walker presents stereotypical scenes of local sugar-shacks, round barns and swamps, rendered in muddy colors, dull composition and me-

diocre drawing.

At best, she's about as good as your Aunt Matilda, who graduated from paint-by-numbers after taking a night-school course. Any resemblance to the Group of Seven is more apparent from viewing the backs of the paintings than the fronts. Like Jackson, Walker paints rural Canadian scenes in oils on canvas, her style could be called semi-abstract — semi-something, anyway — and her finished works do appear in frames.

Your Aunt Matilda wouldn't get a blitzing like this because, after all she's a nice old lady. So was Eaves a nice old lady and so, undoubtedly, is Walker. Her relatives responsible for this fiasco are certainly hospitable enough. But the Galerie Lac Brome, Timmins, et al, have not invited us to view the hobby-painting of a nice old lady. They've invited us to weigh her as a serious artist — cruelty, however well-intentioned, to the lady, and downright embarrassing to everyone else.

This is not the way a fairly new gallery builds a good reputation. Better to present quality exhibits by complete unknowns than to promote works and people unable to live up to inflated billing. As during the Eaves show, there are good paintings in the Galerie. This week, those of John Ballantyne and Rhonda Prince merit note. But they're tucked away in corners, where only those trying not to see the featured attraction will find them.

Meet Larry and his brothers Darryl 1 & 2

PHOENIX, Ariz. (CP) — The thermometer by the pool reads 115. Americans love their Fahrenheit, but on days like these, even the most patriotic among them might find 46 C more comforting.

Comfort is a constant companion, at least, to the patrons of the plush Arizona Biltmore resort hotel, tucked away in air-conditioned splendor from the main drags of this city of sand-blasted heat. And so, when three scruffy, raggedy men saunter in from the sun and linger in the lobby, they carry with them disquieting, dangerously out-of-place attributes. Spray cans in the Louvre.

William Sanderson, John Voldstad and Tony Papenfuss — clothes dirty, matted, shredding — just hang out and wait, smiling casually as guests gawk, pass and probably wonder if their valuables are secure in their rooms.

By this time, in most respected hotels, the police would have escorted the transient-looking gents out the door and perhaps the district. But the concierge has been tipped about who they are. He won't be calling the cops.

STAY IN ROLES

A few moments later, laughter and applause greet Sanderson, Voldstad and Papenfuss — offbeat Larry and ever-silent Darryl and Darryl of CBS's Newhart series, also seen on CBC-TV — as they befuddledly shuffle at a snail's pace into the suite of television critics for questioning.

They were written into the show originally as three simple guys to haul away a body found in the basement of Dick Loudon's inn. From those humble beginnings, they today command a sizable slice of the show's attention and cheers from the studio audience when they enter scenes.

That one appearance has led to a guarantee of 12 each year in the series, which enters its fourth year this fall as a bona fide hit.

On this day, true to the program's form, only Larry speaks. Two days of stubble, a blue tuque, a green plaid jacket and a quarter in his right ear make him a decisive fashion risk.

Nondescript Papenfuss, Darryl No. 1, and curly blonde Voldstad, Darryl No. 2, look on, expressing answers only through their eloquent faces.

They are under strict orders from the show's producer not to shatter the mystique and speak. Questions for them surface, anyway, and it is left to Sanderson — er, Larry — to translate their gestures to sentences.

BLAME IT ON MOM

Why were they both named Darryl?

"I think it has something to do with the mother's lack of imagination," says Sanderson, an accomplished, soft-spoken Tennessean, whose film credits include Blade Runner, Fletch and a forthcoming movie with Tommy Lee Jones called Black Moon Rising.

Do they receive fan mail?

"I don't know if our fans can write," Larry says.

Are they upset they cannot speak publicly?

"I think they're comfortable, but I don't want to put words in their mouth."

Are they interested in films or other work? Papenfuss, a veteran of more than 100 acting roles, leans and whispers into Sanderson's ear.

"We're up for anything," Larry says. "The irony is that these guys can do just about any dialect."

Why do the three seem slow on the show? Isn't that a bit of an Appalachian slur?

"I know more by what I read (about the characters) than hear," he says. "You'll read it's the product of in-breeding."

For a moment, Larry switches to Sanderson.

"I think they're honorable, beautiful people — they're just rural," he says.

Nominees don't always make it

WASHINGTON (AP) — Elvis Presley and Marilyn Monroe are candidates. So are Jack Benny, Louis Armstrong, The Marx Brothers, The Three Stooges and Laurel and Hardy.

All are nominated to be honored on U.S. postage stamps.

A team of stamp collectors, historians, artists and museum directors gathered in Washington last week to try to get the list of candidates down to a manageable few. The final decision will be made by the U.S. postmaster general.

From 400 to 500 subjects are under consideration. About 1,500 suggestions come in from the American public each year, but only 15 to 20 will make it to the postmaster general's desk.

"We don't like to say anything is rejected because it could always come up again," says Joe Brockert, the U.S. Postal Service employee assigned to help the Citizens Stamp Advisory Committee.

There is a major campaign for Laurel and Hardy, previously rejected for the honor.

Larry Harmon, the original Bozo the Clown, says he promised a dying Stan Laurel the world never forget the comedy team.

Harmon would like to see a stamp issued in 1986, the 60th anniversary of Laurel and Hardy's first film together.

But, if they are recommended this time, the announcement will not be made until 1988 or 1989,

when the stamp-issuing program for 1990 is announced. That year would be Stan Laurel's 100th birth anniversary. The Postal Service prefers to commemorate people on a birthday divisible by 50.

Elvis won't be eligible until at least 1987 because of loose guidelines that require someone be dead 10 years before they are honored on a stamp. Presley would have been 50 this year and 100 in 2035.

Black Robe a fast-moving tale of Jesuits' ordeals

Black Robe by Brian Moore (McCLELLAND & STEWART): \$20.95, 246 pp.

Canadian history books are full of the tales of the Jesuit martyrs who went out among the savages in the North American wilderness to proselytize them in the ways of Christianity. Brian Moore's latest novel tells of the reception that one such Jesuit priest, Father Laforgue, had as he made his way through the Algonkin Indians along the St. Lawrence River. **Black Robe** is a fictional outgrowth of author Moore's reading of **The Jesuits in North America** by American historian Francis Parkman, and the **Relations** which comprised the detailed letters the Jesuits sent back to their supporters in France.

The result is a depiction of the savages, as they were called, ("Les Sauvages"), remarkably unlike anything offered in conventional historical renderings. The Algonkin and particularly the Iroquois Indians in **Black Robe** are unbelievably cruel, haughty toward their intrusive guests from France, and totally scornful of these sorcerers who keep the dead body of their

god locked in a small box and partake of the body and the blood of their spiritual leader on occasion.

When Father Laforgue attempts to take up a mission on the shores of Lake Superior, he must travel with Algonkins on the inland journey. Along the way, he and his young companion Daniel are captured by ruthless Iroquois braves and subjected to inhuman treatment, including cannibalism, torture and sexual abuse. Moore's narrative is punctuated by an attempt to recreate the Indian dialects which were loaded with bantering obscenities and mocking distaste for everything about the Jesuits from France.

Black Robe is a fast-moving story of the obstacles the Jesuits had to face, as well as an interesting perspective on the clash of two cultures. In spite of the hostile cruelty of the savages, **Black Robe** attempts to enter the na-



tives' psyche to understand the resentment aroused by these intruders with their strange ways and strange gods.

Lightning by Ed McBain (AVON): \$4.95, 312 pp.

Thriller writer Ed McBain again throws open the precinct doors of the 87th for this riveting read in the police procedurals

genre. **Lightning** weaves together two unrelated cases that have young women as victims, while turning loose the quirky copshop full of personalities that must have helped inspire the Hill Street Blues series. A man who has a fixation on young, athletic female runners has worked out a diabolical ruse to stalk and then brutally break the necks of his quarry, but it is what he does to the bodies that has the 87th boys really riled. The broken bodies are suspended from the overhanging lamp-post yardarms by hangman's ropes, leaving a particularly gruesome calling card of this psychopath's criminal mind.

In the other investigation carried out simultaneously, a female member of the Rape Squad is masquerading as a victim in an ongoing sequence of crimes that involve rape at knifepoint, with an odd twist to the perpetrator's m.o. The culprit in these rape cases, with nine strikes against women against him, subjects his quarry to multiple rapes — that is, he has visited the same woman as many as three or four times in a repetitive pattern that has a peculiar kind of calendar justification. Policewoman Eileen Burke takes on the identity of the rapist's most recent target, only to have the set-up backfire on her.

Unfolding these complicated investigations with his usual crisp, no-nonsense prose, McBain makes the drudgery of on-the-beat interrogations jump into life with the humorous banter of the cops and their hilarious inter-precinct rivalries. In **Lightning** the psychology of the criminals' minds shares the page with the always fast-paced ride along an emotional rollercoaster that characterizes an Ed McBain mystery.

Cheap Trick **STANDING ON THE EDGE** (EPIC-COLUMBIA)

Jack Douglas, the producer who turned it all around for John Lennon (**DOUBLE FANTASY**) just before the former Beatle was fatally shot in 1980, sits in at the control board for Cheap Trick and seems to have rejuvenated his troublesome band. They cause listeners to fret about the potential that they have for absolute greatness which seemingly gets thrown away in the interests of teeny-bopper excesses. Douglas makes them purr on a super-track like 'Tonight It's You', but then trades in the big Beach Boys vocal sound on the very next cut for a junky thing that may go big in Japan, but is too jangly for anything but the most frantic Top 40 market. The Trick's vocalist Robin Zander gets a workout on 'Love Comes', as close as these guys ever get to a genuine ballad. This one is aimed at Foreigner or Wham's musical bullseye.

The title track is an attempt to be a punkish badass outfit that

Cheap Trick posits from time to time, but despite the wall of sound laid down behind Zander's pouting, it fails to come off — a Jagger he is not. When Cheap Trick's lead vocalist steps back into the group sound as he does on 'This Time Around', things go much more smoothly. 'Rock All Night' is the usual audience participation sop to heavy metal, guaranteed to get the seething concert masses exercised, with a simple, easily parroted chorus hook. On 'Cover Girl' you start to get the idea that Cheap Trick are the Three Stooges of rock 'n' roll, always going for the zany, whether it's Rick Nielsen's eccentric guitar fills or just the raunchy lyrics that make up every song. These guys are so wierd that Bun E. Carlos, Cheap Trick's drummer, still thinks it's cool to adorn every one of the four cover and liner notes with a stinking ciggybutt — far out!

Marillion **MISPLACED CHILDHOOD** (CAPITOL-EMI)

They consistently break into the British LP top 10 (currently **MISPLACED CHILDHOOD** sits at #2), but Marillion has up till now failed to generate any singles record success. Their Al Stewart style love song to a lady named 'Kayleigh' may just break the long jinx for the latest manifestation of Yes's classically influenced rock. Marillion's **MISPLACED CHILDHOOD** features a lineup of songs that will allow pieces to be lifted from it, such as the current single, without upsetting the essential unity of this album. Songs flow into one another, and occasional voice-overs remind a listener of early Moody Blues, although enigmatic lyrics set Marillion apart from other groups.

Several longer concept songs make up **MISPLACED CHILDHOOD** — a song like 'Blind Curve' features five segments which change musical styles and drift in and out of themes with Pink Floydish eeriness. Part v) 'Threshold', for instance, casts a critical eye over the world and its accepted atrocities from Vietnam "Heroes in black plastic body-dags under nations' flags", to contemporary cityscapes: "I see black flags on factories / Soup ladies poised on the lips of the poor / I see children with vacant stares / Destined for rape in the alleyways".

Marillion is one of these British bands for whom a lyric sheet is indispensable, the images packed into the more than 20 minutes on each side of the record conjuring up a host of ideas gloved in some of the most progressive rock being produced today. Although they toured Canada in support of their second album venture **FUGAZI**, Marillion has yet to grip the northern rocker in the way that other British acts like The Police and Supertramp have, but this consistency in fine album output suggests it's only a matter of time.

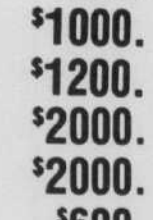

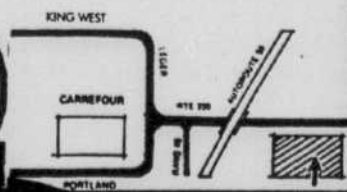

The future looks very bright for CBC television

The near future seems bright for CBC-TV: 10 new series in the coming season, 120 hours of much-needed drama, more children's shows and a greater number of regionally made programs.

But what of the season beyond this one? Will the impact of the recent CEC budget cuts start to show? Will it be possible for CBC to continue to Canadianize its prime time schedule? Or will more money — directly or indirectly — be needed from the federal government to support CBC's Canadian productions?

Denis Harvey, CBC's vice-president for English TV and the man most responsible for the network's programming, doesn't profess to have all the answers at this moment. He'd rather cross one bridge at a time.

For the network, the 1985-86 schedule represents a fairly big step forward at a fairly important time. As the number of TV choices increases, and the impact of video-cassette recorders becomes more profound on home entertainment, CBC is working harder and harder to stand out as a clear-cut Canadian choice on the dial.

Carving out such a distinct identity may be its only chance for survival.

The drive continues by the all-purpose public broadcaster to reduce the number of foreign shows in prime evening viewing hours and to attract larger audiences for Canadian drama.

NOT SHOWN

What CBC has in store this season hasn't been shown yet to TV writers but Harvey sounds confident in his assessment of the

schedule. It isn't just that the number of Canadian shows are increasing, he says.

"We're making a major breakthrough in quality."

Among the new shows are:

— Four children's programs: a 15-minute pre-school show with singer Fred Penner; a 30-minute entertainment series with performer Bob Schneider; a 20-part series from the publishers of *Owl* magazine; and a 13-part natural science series filmed in the Soviet Union. A fifth show, *The Raccoons*, is a family-oriented animation series, but it should draw a largely young audience.

— Two programs that reflect the country's regions: *The Way We Are*, a 14-part series of regionally made programs; and *Gzowski and Co.*, an 18-part program with Peter Gzowski of CBC Radio's *Morningside* and former CBC late-night TV host.

— Two situation comedies: *The Frantics*, about the Toronto comedy troupe already successful on radio; and *Goosebumps*, about a newspaper columnist and her teenage daughter.

— An ambitious performing arts program with an unambitious title, *CBC Thursday Night*. It's a 26-part series of profiles on highbrow Canadian talent.

Five mini-series, seven movies and nearly 20 specials are scheduled and more may be added. The National news on Sunday nights is being shifted to 10 p.m. from 11 p.m. and will be followed at 10:30 by *Venture*, a promising business series that fared poorly in an early Monday evening time slot.

TALENT STAYING

Harvey says there are some great ideas in the production community right now.

"And we're having fair success at keeping talent in Canada," he says.

What this means for Canadian TV viewers is that a new generation of behind-the-scenes talent — particularly in the independent sector — is beginning to flourish.

About half of CBC's drama will come from independent producers in the coming year, due mainly to assistance from the federal broadcast fund, established in 1983 and overseen by Telefilm Canada.

CBC's nearly \$900-million federal appropriation was trimmed \$75 million in the year that began April 1 and a reasonably sized chunk of that was believed to have been taken from the \$200-million budget of the English TV network.

But, at almost the same time, rules were relaxed concerning the Telefilm fund to allow independent TV producers to get 49 per cent of their budgets from the government. Until the rule change, Telefilm would only pay one-third of the funds.

TELEFILM CREDITED

What the change does is reduce CBC's share of the load and allow it to spread its money much further.

"No doubt about it, the Telefilm money is responsible for a lot of what we're going to be doing this season," Harvey says.

But what of the future? It will take more money to increase the number of Canadian programs on CBC, and the Telefilm fund is being stretched to its limit. CBC won't get the money directly — the Conservative government has made that clear — but it's obviously going to need indirect

help through Telefilm, and more of it.

Harvey won't discuss the issue, but his silence speaks volumes.

The broadcast fund, \$200 million over five years, doesn't go far enough to do what most people believe needs to be done to produce Canadian shows that can

consistently measure up to their American and European counterparts.

It's almost certain the government will be pressured to put more money in the kitty for Canadian TV. CBC's quiet lobby is worth monitoring. The future of Canadian TV could be at stake.

It's all said in one name and four words: **Steven Spielberg and Back to the Future**

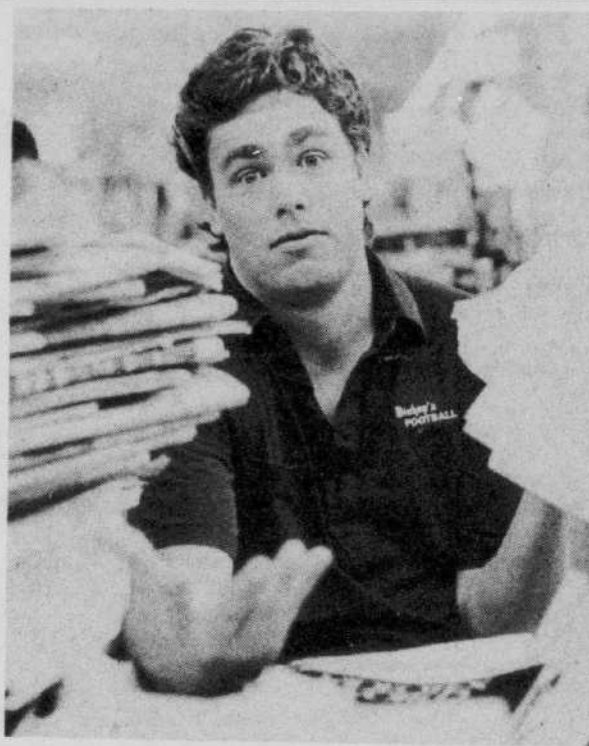

In a move to assert my independence from such ridiculous trends, I'm planning to stay up 'til the not so wee hours of the morning sampling the veritable cornucopia of entertainment possibilities the tube affords. (In other words, there are a couple of promising items in the TV listings.)

First, the highlight of my week, the incomparable **Saturday Night Live** on Channel 5 (NBC) at 11:30. SNL hasn't been coming through too well for the past few weeks, providing an overdose of reruns, and no, there won't be anything new this week either. But this week we have one of those "Best of" shows, which usually includes the kind of stuff you don't mind seeing twice. **The Best of SNL '84-'85** is supposed to have appearances by Jesse Jackson, Eddy Murphy, Ed Asner and Christopher Reeve among others, so don't miss it.

After that you can catch the tail end of a 1939 **Sherlock Holmes** mystery **The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes** with **Basil Rathbone** and **Nigel Bruce**, on channel 12, directly followed by **The Hound of the Baskervilles** at 1:40. All you real **Sherlock Holmes** fans can tune in every night next week at midnight for two, count them, two **Sherlock Holmes** flicks.

An alternative to **Holmes** early Sunday morning is a 1956 **Burt Lancaster** and **Katherine Hepburn** movie at 12:30 on channel 6, **The Rainmaker**, about a con man posing as a rainmaker who somehow ends a drought in a southwestern U.S. town and brings romance and confidence to a spinster.

Sunday afternoon, I challenge you to find me something other than sports to watch. I'll be eternally grateful.

Sunday night at 9 Vermont ETV's **Evening at the Pops** features folk singer **Joan Baez** who will perform some of her own compositions, such as **Diamonds and Rust** and **Recently** and some other unoriginal, but undoubtedly good stuff. If you miss it the first time, or are a die-hard folkie, you can catch it again at 1 a.m.

If anything can make the phony violence for violence's sake of current TV and movies more sickening it's the occasional jolting documentary that deals intelligently with real violence. At 8 p.m. Tuesday, Vermont ETV will be marking the 40th anniversary of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima with **Hiroshima Remembered**. It is sure to make you wonder how, with the kind of pain and bloodshed inflicted in the nuclear holocaust of 1945, we could ever derive pleasure from watching actors play at killing and maiming. It certainly won't be pleasant viewing, but it might remind us of something we should never forget.

Not that I want to make you feel too guilty to watch what sounds like an intriguing movie at 11, also on Vermont ETV. **The Bad Seed**, a 1956 drama starring **Nancy Kelly** and **Patty McCormack** is about a mother who discovers that her six-year-old daughter is a murderer.

Except for **Sherlock Holmes**, the rest of the week looks pretty barren. Try reading, maybe.

Lineups well worth the wait at Disney's playground

ANAHEIM, Calif. (CP) — At Disneyland it seems everyone is going to, coming from or standing in a lineup for everything from the high-speed monorail that drops you at the park to the fantasy world attractions and, regrettably, lunch.

But to most children, waiting in lines for rides is standard fare. They will measure the value of the wait against the attraction. And there are dozens to choose from, ranging from Sleeping Beauty's castle to Mark Twain's steamboat. More than anyone could cover in a day.

Six-year-old twins Jennifer and Roberta Dadey of Calgary found during their recent visit to movie-maker Walt Disney's amusement park that a 50-minute wait for a one-minute ride on Dumbo the Flying Elephant was perfectly reasonable. Dumbo is the 1941 animated film elephant who discovered after drinking champagne that his huge ears, a source of deep embarrassment, could help him fly.

One attraction — It's a Small World — was so good that the Dadey girls were willing to stand in line three times to see it over and over again. The joyful music of this ride rings in your ears long after it's over.

REPRESENT WORLD

The theme of the ride is world unity and it features nearly 300 singing and dancing dolls representing most regions of the world. There are mermaids and skaters and cancan girls and a comic wooden Mountie representing Canada.

On the other hand, the twins were not impressed by a leisurely boat cruise through the canals of Storybook Land — a miniaturized version of famous classic scenes from Disney cartoons. The one-hour lineup that preceded it did not seem to color their judgment. It was just plain disappointing.

Not to an adult, however. The

Disney devotion to authentic detail in Storybook Land is delightful. There is real stained glass in a tiny church and White Rabbit has his own teeny mailbox in the Old English Village of Alice in Wonderland.

ENCHANTS KIDS

Few things in the Magic Kingdom are ultimately disappointing. In general, the attractions are on a fabulous scale, enchanting children and adults alike. The special effects in The Haunted House are every movie-goer's dream.

The designs of many rides, such as Peter Pan's flight to Never Never Land through the twinkling stars above a miniature London, are dazzling. Great care is taken to conceal from little eyes the electronics, the fibre optics and the real people behind the illusions of fantasy.

And the entire place, spruced up for Disneyland's 30th anniversary, is clean and feels safe.

With a map and friendly student guides to help, it's hard to get lost in the park. It is divided into seven worlds: Fantasyland, Tomorrowland, Adventureland, Bear Country, New Orleans Square and Main Street.

For those who don't like crowds, there are tips on when to go and not to go in Steve Birnbaum's official guide to Disneyland, published this year. Mid-June through the third week in August is the high season when as many as 70,000 people pass through the turnstiles each day.

MEET VISITORS

For those who dread lineups, there are ways to make the best of them. You can meet people from all over the world standing next to you: Mexican and Japanese tourists in particular, populate the park.

At some lineups, there are Disney-inspired diversions. While waiting for Peter Pan's flight, you might catch the evil Queen peeking through the red velvet



curtains of her gothic castle window across the street. Waiting for the Jungle Cruise you can hear just enough wild animal groans and primitive drum beats to make you stay.

However, the lunch lineups can be unbearable, no matter how hungry the customer. There is just no way to make a cold hamburger, wilted fries and burnt coffee in a Styrofoam cup enjoyable after a one-hour wait that features whining toddlers, gripping parents and stale food fumes from those eating nearby.

Decent food is available at some sit-down restaurants at the park, but if you want a quick and

healthy lunch, bring your own sandwiches and fruit and have a picnic at one of the garden squares. Chances are the kids will spot Mickey Mouse or Donald Duck strolling by and that's a better memory to take home.

THINGS TO KNOW

If you go: Anaheim, the community where Disneyland is located, is an hour-long bus ride from the Los Angeles International Airport. The big hotels have shuttle services to pick up guests.

Admission to Disneyland, including one-day use of all attractions, is \$16.50 for adults and \$10.50 for children.

Disneyland is surrounded by hotels and motels within walking distance of the park. Prices range from about \$100 per day for a double at luxurious high-rise hotels to \$30 for a double at a more modest motel off-season.

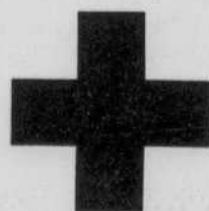
Many of the hotels and motels have swimming pools. Double rooms in many hotels are large enough for a family. Children are free at some; at others small fees of about \$6 are added for use of a cot.

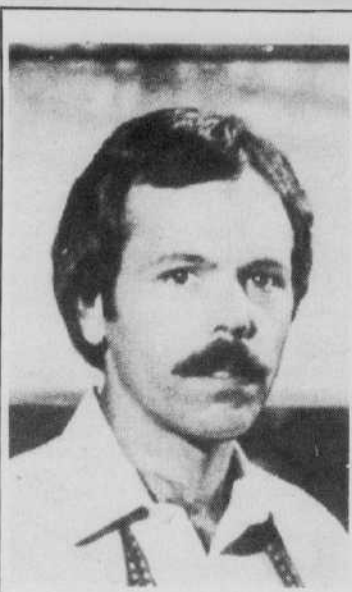
