# Director sees bright future for big-screen 3-D movies

VANCOUVER (CP) — The man who created one of the most popular films at Expo 86 says he doesn't mind if his movie is compared to a pizza.

Colin Low, who directed the stunning 3-D movie *Transitions* on view at the Canadian pavilion, says his son Stephen, also a film-maker, made the pizza comparison.

Low quotes his son as saying: "World's fair films are essentially pizzas. They're made up of small pieces because they're short."

"My answer to him was there's nothing wrong with pizzas if they're hot," Low said in an interview.

And *Transitions* is hot. People wait up to two hours at the Canadian National Imax theatre to see the 21-minute movie depicting Ca-

nadians at work and play, with the emphasis on Expo's theme of transportation and communications. The response, from the oohs and ahs of the audiences to the superlatives of film reviewers, is always positive.

## SCREEN HUGE

A National Film Board production, it is the first to marry the 3-D process with the 70-millimetre Imax format, which projects the movie on to a screen four storeys high.

The result is a spectacularly vivid image in which objects like teddy bears seem to float off the screen while landscapes of lakes and trees fade away in the distance.

It cost \$4 million to bring all the technology together and build the theatre. Costs were shared by Ca-

nadian National Railways, the National Film Board, Imax and Canada Place, site of the Canadian pavilion.

*Transitions* is one of the first 3-D movies that doesn't give people headaches, said Low, a genial, enthusiastic man with thinning grey hair and pale blue eyes.

## GLASSES GOOD

"There's been an enormous amount of skepticism about 3-D," he said. "The skepticism all related to the films that have given people headaches, and this problem of (having to wear special) glasses.

"We've improved the glasses so that they're the best that have ever been made. No one goes out complaining about them, because the optics are correct."

But it's more than the glasses. Low said the improvements started with a special dual-lens camera balanced gyroscopically to eliminate vibration during filming. The crowning touch is the Imax projection system, which provides a large, extremely bright, clear image and moves the film horizontally, eliminating the vertical misalignment that has caused eye

strain with other 3-D movies.

Low, 58, a native of Cardston, Alta., and product of a Mormon background, has been making films with the National Film Board since he was 17. He had successes in the 1950s and '60s with several award-winning documentaries, including *Universe*, which featured such realistic animation it became required viewing for U.S. astronauts.

Low went on to co-direct the multi-screen feature *Labyrinth* for the film board's pavilion at Expo 87 and was a consultant for an animated 3-D film at Expo 85 in Japan.

## U.S. stamps are good for beginners

The stamps of the United States make for inexpensive but interesting collecting. That is, from 1930 onwards. Prior to this period, the cost can get rather high.

The U.S. has, above all other countries, related its history and geography to the world through its postage stamps. If one were to thoroughly research each of the stamps issued, one would need to spend half one's life in the library.

Someone considering a topical collection, need go no further than U.S. stamps to get started. Famous people, parks, waterfalls, famous events, olympics, wildlife, sports, military, vegetation, railroads, etc., etc. It's all there.

Prior to 1930, there is great inexpensive collecting for those interested in varieties. The Washington busts of this era alone provide hours of research.

There are for instance, eleven different types of the Washington bust that was first issued in 1912-1914. The difference in types

might be the shading of a button or toga rope, ribbons with or without shading, watermarks or non watermarks. They are all listed in the catalogue. However, there are the unlisted varieties within these types. These are the ones to look out for. It's hours and hours of work with a magnifying glass, but the results are sometimes very satisfying.

The 1922-1925 issues also lead to much research. You will need a good perforation gauge and a good eye to sort through this lot.

The varieties within the varieties are extensive. You will find varieties of this series up to and including 1931. There are perforation, coil, overprint and imperforate variations. There is very little monetary value in these stamps. However, I think you know by now how I feel about that.

I do believe that this is a very good place for a young person or beginner to start. If you have already begun a Canadian collection, you will have some experience in researching and patience.

More will be appearing on U.S. stamps as time goes on. In the meantime, if you are really serious about U.S. stamps, I would suggest you purchase a Scott's U.S. specialized catalogue.

The United States has issued some beautiful stamps over the years. Once you've started collecting stamps of this country, you'll find it hard to let go.

# Neil and Me interesting, but ultimately frustrating read

Neil and Me, by Scott Young (BANTAM-SEAL): \$3.95, 285 pp.

A curious book which appears to be a father's coming to terms with his fragmented family and estranged son the rock star incidentally becomes quite a revealing study of a rock personality revered around the world, but who has a particularly Canadian identity and heritage.

Writer, columnist and television host Scott Young was famous for many years before his son Neil set off for California in a vintage hearse with the hope of becoming a self-supporting musician. Young's book gives the inside story on Neil Young's lucking into the influential group Buffalo Springfield, along with Bruce Palmer, Stephen Stills, and a drummer who called himself Dewey Martin, but whose real name is Dewey Midkiff, hailing from the eastern Ontario hotbed of rock & roll, Smiths Falls. Buffalo Springfield's influence on the music of the late sixties and thereafter is unquestionably immense, and this book by Scott Young adds some insight into the personalities that conspired to create an entire "sound".

But Neil and Me is a rock biography almost by accident, as Papa Young struggles with the family

peculiarities that led to his separation and divorce from Neil's mother, Rassy, and incidentally manages to fill the reader in on the kind of youth that Neil experienced. A lot of reading between the lines is necessary here, but it appears that father Scott was not what you would call an ideal father figure, due to the pressures of his own publishing/broadcasting career, and perhaps his estrangement from Neil was based on the son's innate resentment of the absentee father. Neil's own family life, his marriage and separation from wives Susan Acevedo and Carrie Snodgrass, his current relationship with wife Pegi, and their son Ben, crippled by cerebral palsy, comes in for close journalistic scrutiny by father Scott.

The curious thing about this biography/reminiscence is that father Scott must resort to dating events in Neil's life according to which album was being worked on — this was during the "Harvest" months, or that happening was predicated by Neil's despair over the deaths of Crazy Horse Band member Danny Whitten, and a roadie, victims of heroin overdoses.

The familial ties seem rather tenuous at best, but Scott Young manages to give some idea to the reader of the moody, spontaneous, driven-by-whim existence that Young the rock star lives on his large ranch located south of San Francisco. That much of the information provided about Young's recording career appears to have been gathered at a remove of a continent away detracts from any claims at inside scoops this book could make. But as a chronological tracing of the life of Neil Young, his many bands, wives, rock & roll identities, hobbies such as collecting vintage automobiles or electric train sets, and a means of fixing the Winnipeg/Toronto/rural Ontario lad into the pantheon of rock notables, Neil and Me is an interesting, if ultimately frustrating read.

**You're Only Old Once!** by Theodore Seuss Geisel (RANDOM HOUSE): \$14.95.

Having reached his 82nd birthday in March of this year, the renowned Dr. Seuss, a veteran of publishing 44 children's books, has chosen to make fun of the Golden Years gang that he belongs to, and the result is fun for kid and adult alike.

With **You're Only Old Once!** poised near the top of the bestseller lists, it is obvious that a lot of grown-ups are purchasing this book for their kids, or perhaps just for the light-hearted fun of its satirical commentary about clinics, doctors and old folks. Subtitled "A Book For Obsolete Children", it tells in rhyming couplets of the happenings to a senior citizen who

checks into the Golden Years Clinic on Century Square/ for Spleen Readjustment and Muffler Repair.

The colored illustrations depict the endurance test that the book's beleaguered oldster is subjected to as the Quiz-Docs try to discover how his parts are faring. Running a gamut of tests, with only the goldfish in the waiting room, Norval, to console him, the sad-faced victim of medical marvels meets such characters as "Dr. Pollen, our Allergy Whiz, who knows every sniffle and itch that there is./ Dr. Pollen will find, as he works on your case,/ if the powder's wrong on your stepsister's face." Dr. Seuss's book contains enough goofy rhymes and funny pictures to keep most kids in the four- to eight-years-old range happy, and, judging from the book's popularity, not a few adult readers as well.

### RECORD REVIEWS

#### Bob Dylan KNOCKED OUT LOADES (COLUMBIA)

Bob Dylan's first studio album in about a year kicks off with a breezy rhythm and blues vamp played by T. Bone Burnett's guitar and Al Kooper's keyboards, as he sings a Herman Parker Jr. tune, "You Wanna Ramble", which should really confuse the issue about whether he's currently embracing Christianity or the faith he was born into.

Religion hasn't quite the role it has played on recent Dylan albums here, with the exception, perhaps, of a rendition of Kris Kristofferson's "They Killed Him", and a gospel chanted song written by Dylan, "Precious Memories". The latter, with its repetitive chorus sung by the five backing vocalists who get a lot of work on this album, has a weird blend of gospel and steel drums, creating perhaps yet a new genre in rock — regghymn.

Collaborations are the order of the day on this one, with Tom Petty helping Dylan write the rocker "Got My Mind Made Up", one of the songs which must be a showstopper on the current True Confessions tour that Dylan is on with Pet-

ty's Heartbreakers. Mike Campbell's guitar work on this piece is first rate, turning it into a grinding, savage bit of rock and roll, the likes of which Dylan hasn't approached since his mid-sixties stuff like "Just Like A Woman" or "Like A Rolling Stone", or the work with the incomparable Robbie Robertson and the Band. Over twelve minutes of side two is devoted to a Dylan & Sam Shepard hook-up, on which the playwright and the rock poet tell the story of "Brownsville Girl", a rambling, imagistic story-song which begins with a reminiscence of an old Gregory Peck western movie and branches out into several storylines.

Perhaps the only thing that really fails to work well on this umpteenth Dylan set is a song he wrote with Carole Bayer Sager, "Under Your Spell", which requires a voice much smoother than Dylan's to pull off the love ballad style of number.

The eight tracks on **KNOCKED OUT LOADED** will provide endless fodder for the analysts who wonder just where Bob Dylan is heading with his music in the mid-eighties. As ever, he is elusive, allusive and offers only illusory glimpses of the rock poet who has matured into one of the seminal figures in rock history, preferring as usual to let the music speak for itself, which it does.

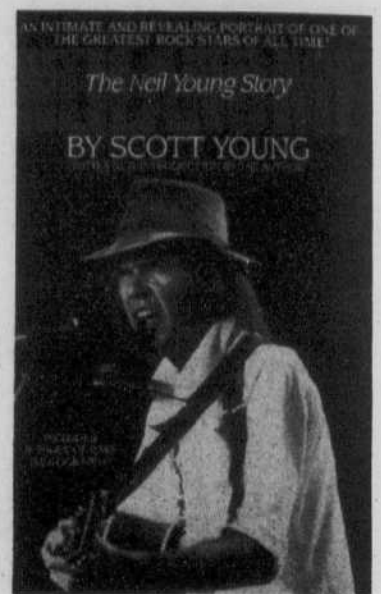
#### Crowded House CROWDED HOUSE (CAPITOL)

When Split Enz dissolved into the misty past of rock and roll, Tim Finn turned to solo albums and doing soundtracks for such films as **Puberty Blues**, and that looked like the end of the whole New Zealand sound. But, wondrous surprise, here's the other Finn brother, Neil, the voice in such Enz pieces as "One Step Ahead", fronting a trio called Crowded House, and debuting an album that is arguably superior to any of the Split Enz projects.

What a treat this record is for anyone steeped in the middle period of the Beatles, just before psychedelia thrust their music into new pitches and a lot of yaw, yaw, yaw. Crowded House joins Neil Finn to drummer Paul Hester, another Enz-mate, and Nick Seymour on bass, and the emphasis is on big songs with Neil up front singing the paint off walls with his bold, infectious voicings. And talk about songs. Take your pick of about 7 of the 10 here which could easily make successful assaults on British or U.S. top 40s. "Now We're Getting Somewhere" is a driving, building tune that lets Jim Keltner sit in at the drumkit, and Elvis's most recent and best bassist, Jerry Scheff adds a throbbing bass beat to a lively, energized song.

**CROWDED HOUSE** just rocks you with song after song that is piled on, tunes with the kind of choruses that have you wanting to join in on first hearing, like the opener, "World Where You Live", which let Neil Finn's distinctive, pleasant voice echo out on the seven tunes he wrote exclusively, with collaborators on three others.

Finn's songs take chances with



unexpected, unorthodox chord changes and melody lines that keep you on your toes wondering which twist will come next. Nothing boring about Crowded House, whether you like story songs, love songs or grinders & shouters, this incredible trio goes a long way toward rendering Split Enz just a pleasant memory.

### VIDEO SCREENINGS

#### SPIES LIKE US (WARNER HOME VIDEO)

That wacky pair of funsters from the realms of TV comedy, Chevy Chase and Dan Aykroyd, play a couple of low level U.S. government clerks who get shanghied into the Foreign Service as operatives on a secret mission to Afghanistan. The boys are merely decoys, however, in this purported comedy which is apparently supposed to spoof the James Bond genre. But a film that needs a Bob Hope cameo in the middle of the desert, playing through a golf ball inside an Afghan tent, is indeed in dire trouble, and **SPIES LIKE US** is neither convincing comedy nor an exciting adventure film.

Directed by John Landis, who brought us that hilarious howler "ANIMAL HOUSE", this film tries desperately to wring laughs out of situations. When Chevy and Dan encounter a group of legitimate doctors in the hills near Kabul, they impersonate medics themselves and there follows a long, overdone bit of business wherein they nod heads and keep exchanging "doctor, doctor, doctor" greetings with the real docs. But Landis thinks it's funny that they do this about 10 times in a row, and then come back to the dull gimmick a few minutes later.

So goes the hilarity in this bubbling, sketchily written, very unfunny mini-epic. Aykroyd showed his flair for comedy in **GHOSTBUSTERS** and Chase was fairly effective in **FLETCH**, but in **SPIES LIKE US** this dynamic duo fails to develop any comedy rapport, and their feeble attempts at verbal humor only underline the absolute genius of the Marx Brothers who would have turned this Afghan fiasco into a comic delight! 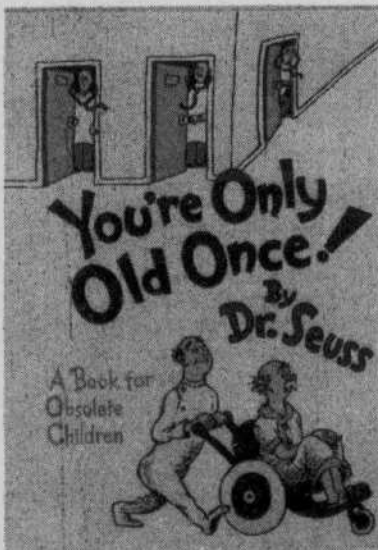

# Local duck with identity crisis inspired children's book

SHERBROOKE — A celebrity of the border area near Stanstead has been immortalized in a children's book.

Horatio the duck is "sort of a semi-famous duck locally," says author John Mahoney.

Mahoney, the editor-publisher of Pigwidgeon Press, first met Horatio when he went to do some carpentry work on the home of Muriel Hall.

Horatio was adopted by Hall and her two dogs Dougal and Tiny Morsel when he was about two days old. Horatio has always been thoroughly convinced that he is a dog.

"I saw him — he really does," says Mahoney. "I drove up in the car and dogs came out barking and the duck came out flapping its wings and quacking and it thinks it's barking."

"He won't go near water when the dogs are around and he doesn't fly if anybody's watching him," he continues. Once, he saw Hall place

the duck in a small wading pool. "He spluttered and jumped right out. He didn't want anything to do with it," he said. "It sounds funny but it's true."

## PUBLISHED IN JUNE

From this experience came the book, *The Adventures of Horatio, The Duck Who Thought He Was A Dog*, published by Pigwidgeon Press in mid-June.

The large print book, illustrated by Shimon Ash, features 12 chapters following Horatio from his birth to the day he discovers who he is and heads south for the winter with a flock of wild geese.

Among his adventures are an encounter with Slyly Fox, his discovery of swimming and flying (which he does secretly) and an episode in which he saves Little Dog's life.

The book is full of local references beginning with the opening sentence: "Once upon a time not so very long ago and much closer to your house than you think, there lived on a neat, small farm near Lake Memphremagog a most unusual duck..."

The characters are loosely based on people Mahoney knows, sometimes even using their names, although Farmer John is not meant to be him, he insists.

## NO EXAGGERATION

Muriel Hall says the story of Horatio is no exaggeration. "He's exactly what John explains," she said. "He's even more extreme than in the book."

"He really thinks he is a dog," she says. "He eats dog food and if you give him duck food he'll have nothing to do with it." The part about Horatio flying away is not true, however. "He'll never fly away," she says.

Mahoney had 1000 copies of the book printed and so far they're selling well, he says. It's his first book for children, although he's a regu-

lar contributor to *Harrowsmith* magazine.

"I don't pretend to know very much about writing for children, but I'm a writer and I've raised four sons, so it comes out of experience," he says.

"I tried not to write down to the kids," he continues. "I tried to keep the language simple and yet not be patronizing to them."

The little lessons on friendship, hard work and loyalty among others are conscious, says Mahoney, as is the careful avoidance of sexist stereotypes. Mary Ellen (Muriel Hall's fictional counterpart) deftly constructs a dog house for Horatio, and Wynn the Maple Sugar Maker offers to 'whip up' some raised doughnuts without batting an eyelash.

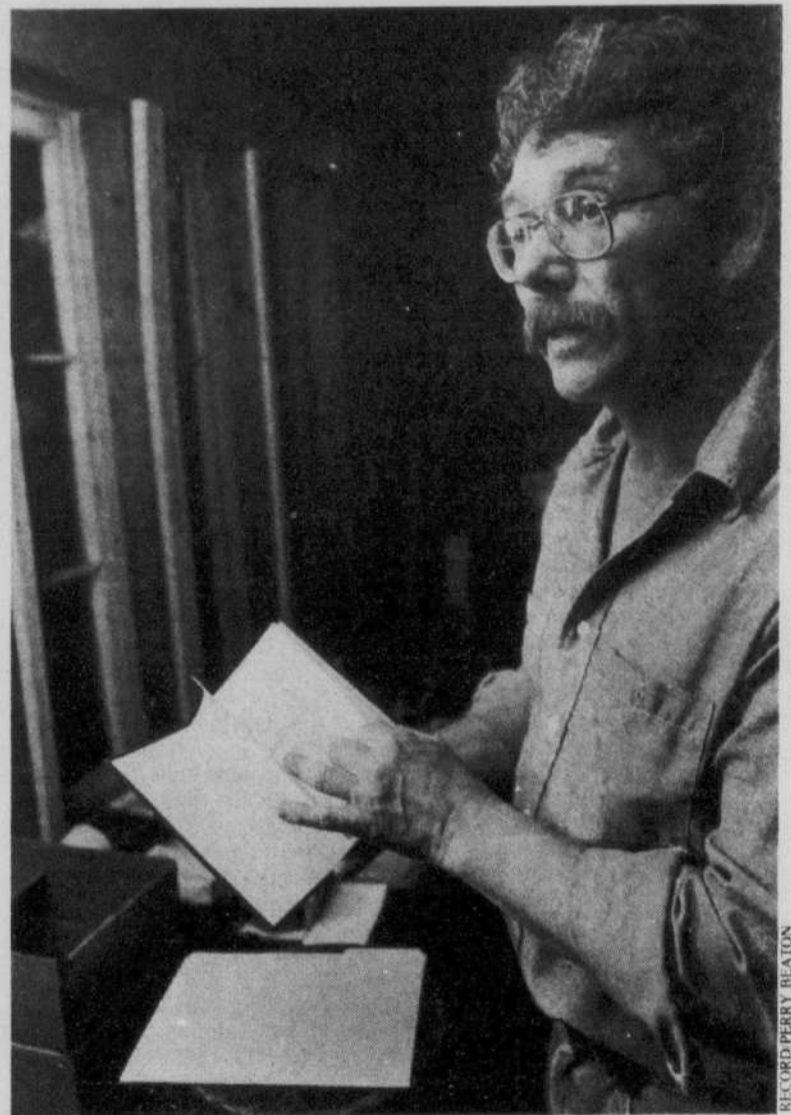
## WON'T LIMIT

Mahoney is planning to market the book all over North America and he says the story's good enough that geographical references won't limit the interest in it. He's arranging to have it translated into French, and possibly Japanese.

The book is particularly important to the local scene, however. "I think this is one way you can help keep local culture alive and perpetuate it," he says. This is the whole idea behind the small Pigwidgeon press operation.

Pigwidgeon Press has published facsimile editions of *Beautiful Waters* Volumes I and II, a book written by William Bullock and published in 1926 and 1938, including poetry, drama, mythology and history of Lake Memphremagog (an Abenaki word meaning beautiful waters).

The company has three more projects planned for this year. One is collected columns of Edwin Earle of Derby Line, who writes for a couple of local papers. Another is a bread and soup

cookbook, written by Mahoney's wife, Jane Goyette. The third is a collection of fiction and poetry by 10 members of a Quebec-Vermont writers' group which grew out of a writing course Mahoney taught.

## Animated short made in Montreal a technological breakthrough

NEW YORK (CP) — A Canadian film that tells a melancholy story of a bar-room piano player past his prime has gained a measure of fame that its character, alone and pining for the spotlight, would surely envy.

*Tony de Peltrie*, an animated 3-D short made in Montreal, has won numerous international awards and been featured at leading graphic art shows since its release a year ago.

Using a computer as their canvas and complex mathematical equations as their paint, four University of Montreal students spent three years bringing Tony to life for a mere seven minutes and 50 seconds.

The \$2-million handiwork of Philippe Bergeron, Pierre Lachapelle, Pierre Robidoux and Daniel Langlois — supported by groups ranging from the National Film Board to the University of Montreal — has earned them a

reputation as pioneers in animation.

"We knew what the evolution of computer graphics was — we knew Tony would make a breakthrough," Bergeron said after introducing the film recently at Electronic Theatre '86, the industry's top show in New York.

## SEEN ON CBC

Not that three-dimensional computer graphics are new. The lead-in to CBC's *The National*, a visual roller-coaster ride into a stylized globe, is just one example of the form's proliferation on television.

What sets *Tony de Peltrie* apart, graphic artists say, is that the film conveys a range of emotion and a precision of body movement never before achieved in a computer-generated character.

The sadness and nostalgia expressively mirrored in Tony's face go far beyond the caricatures in the popular *Dire Straits*

video *Money for Nothing* or previous milestones in computer animation like the film *Sexy Robot*, they say.

"Tony is quite revolutionary in the computer-graphics industry," says Carol Chiani, organizer of Electronic Theatre.

The industry is a collection of strange bedfellows: those who see art as a way to advance their technology and those who see the computer — with its capacity to portray realities that don't exist — as a way to advance their art.

## SPARKS IDEAS

Some in advertising would use characters like Tony to sell toothpaste; after all, computers can dial up a 360-degree smile. Others dream of making the first full-length feature film from computer animation.

The latter group includes Bergeron, who at age 27 has become research and technical director of Digital Productions in Los Angeles, a leader in computer ani-

mation recently bought by Omnibus Simulation Inc. of Toronto.

"I don't think the audience is quite ready for it yet," he says of the feature-film idea. "I think they are ready for new (animated) heroes but there has to be some interaction with human actors."

Digital Productions created the Jupiter simulation for the movie *2010*, the Mick Jagger *Hard Woman* video and the owl sequence in this summer's release, *Labyrinth*.

Lachapelle, Robidoux and Langlois have formed Emotion Studios in Montreal. Neither they nor Bergeron plan sequels for Tony but all four are pursuing greater realism and complexity in computer animation.

## FAVOR SNOW WHITE

Bergeron says computer animators have not yet spun a story as compelling as the old Disney classics. Audiences, while feeling sympathy for Tony, are still like-

ly to be moved more by the two-dimensional Snow White, he acknowledges.

But Bergeron thinks the convincing personality of a Disney character can be equalled or surpassed by combining the expert storytelling of the traditionalists with the new techniques in lifelike 3-D animation.

"It will not replace traditional animation. But what we can do is describe an object in 3-D and specify the camera positions in ways impossible for normal animators to calculate."

Bergeron told the audience at the New York show about the two years of software development and year of production that went into Tony, a process he said might now be done in perhaps six months for a film of similar quality and length.

Tony started as a clay model upon which a grid was drawn and co-ordinates were entered into a sophisticated computer.

# Museum site changed for practical and aesthetic reasons

This is the fifth in a series of articles on Townships museums being featured in the Record over the summer months.

STANSTEAD — What are some of the first things you think of when you hear the word 'museum'?

Old stuff. Local history. Dust, perhaps.

A word which almost never comes to mind, however, is 'change'.

After all, Webster's Dictionary defines 'museum' as follows: a building, room, etc. for preserving and exhibiting rare, interesting or typical specimens of works of art, science, invention, etc., or of antiquities, curiosities, or objects of natural history.

Translation: museums aren't known for radical shifts in style, philosophy or appearance. By nature, they do a lot of staying the same.

But if there was ever a museum which could be described as being in transition, it's the Colby-Curtis Museum in Stanstead. Maintained by the Stanstead Historical Society (founded in 1929), the museum recently moved to downtown Stanstead after being located in an old Catholic School in Beebe since the early 1970s.

## IMPROVED SITE

One of the prime reasons for the move was basic location. Stanstead Historical Society President Donald Prangley claims people interested in visiting the old museum could be divided into two groups: the ones who couldn't find Beebe, and the ones who couldn't find the museum once they'd found Beebe.

The second reason for moving was more aesthetic.

"The old building was all right — but it just wasn't a museum," says

Prangley. "The rooms were much too big. The people who set up the displays had to try all sorts of crazy things just so the rooms wouldn't look naked. People walking in might swear to God they were entering a flea market or a second-hand store."

"It was like trying to make a silk purse out of a sow's ear," he adds.

The rooms in the museum's new location, an old RCMP building on Dufferin Street, are much more manageable.

## NOT IN FAVOR

"I was initially against the move, since the new building is very deceiving from the outside," Prangley says. "Once I had seen the inside, however, I quickly changed my mind. There's a lot of space, but the individual rooms are small."

The various rooms in the new museum are certainly anything but cluttered. Each has its own theme and is distinctly different from the other, as opposed to the unavoidable random set-ups of the old location.

The main lobby (known as the 'parlor'), for instance, is highlighted by numerous paintings and several pieces of rare furniture. There's a Lincoln chair (so named because it's the type of chair Abraham Lincoln was sitting in when assassinated, according to tour guide Claire Alger), which was in the Bice family for over 100 years; an intimidating portrait of Marcus Child (1793-1859), who founded the institution which later became Stanstead College; and an 1863 Putnam and Gray map of the District of St. Francis, which not only denotes towns and streets, but also individual residences and farms.

## ROOM TO ROOM

features nine ghostly mannequins attired in a variety of late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century dresses. All were donated by local families.

dest collection of old books, and a cemetery-files room, which Alger claims generates more interest than one might expect.

"A family from Texas named

most of the items in the museum — some because they actually feel their treasures have significant historical value, and others because they simply want to rid themselves of an attic filled with 'junk'.

But this doesn't mean the museum accepts everything it is offered.

"The only real requirement we have is that the item has some local historical value," says Prangley. "For example, it would be great to have a Ming vase, but exactly what connection would that have to the people of Stanstead County? Ex-

The photography room, which was put together by Doug Farrow, is full of, well, old photographs, mostly featuring the Stanstead region of the early 1900s — everything from extinct churches and bridges to old basketball and hockey teams is included.

"Let his heart a thousandfold take the field again. Are you one of Kitchener's own?" growls the World War I recruiting poster as you enter the Struthers-McCannel military room. Old uniforms, medals, helmets, knives and bayonets are all featured here.

The Lady Banting room is full of old quilts, each with its own story. One of the most interesting is a 1929 creation which was made in order to raise money for the now-demolished Cassville Church, which lay between Massawippi and Stanstead. The pattern consists of 12 stars, with each line featuring a name. Local citizens paid 25¢ to have their names sewn on the quilt, while the star centres, or 'honor blocks', highlight the names of pioneer members of the community.

## ANTIQUÉ TYPOS

Upstairs in the museum there's a small archives room featuring samples of various E.T. newspapers, the oldest of which dates back to 1842.

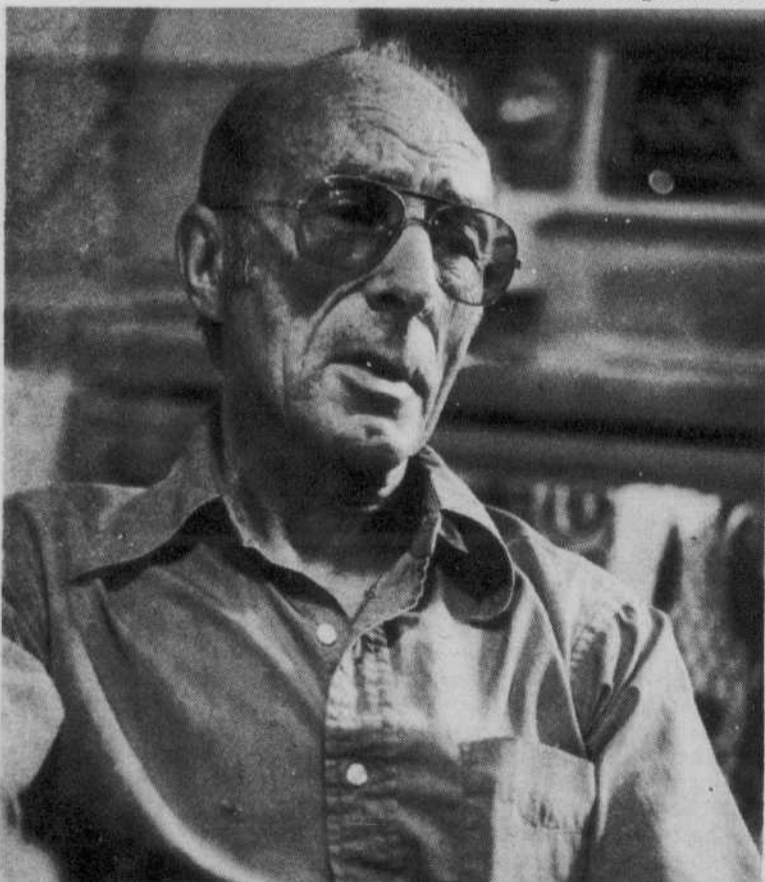
"Some are a little brittle, but most of our newspapers are still in good condition," says archivist Anna Gain. "We just don't have the money to store them the way they should be stored, in acid-free paper."

Also upstairs is the Austin T. Foster Library, which holds a mo-

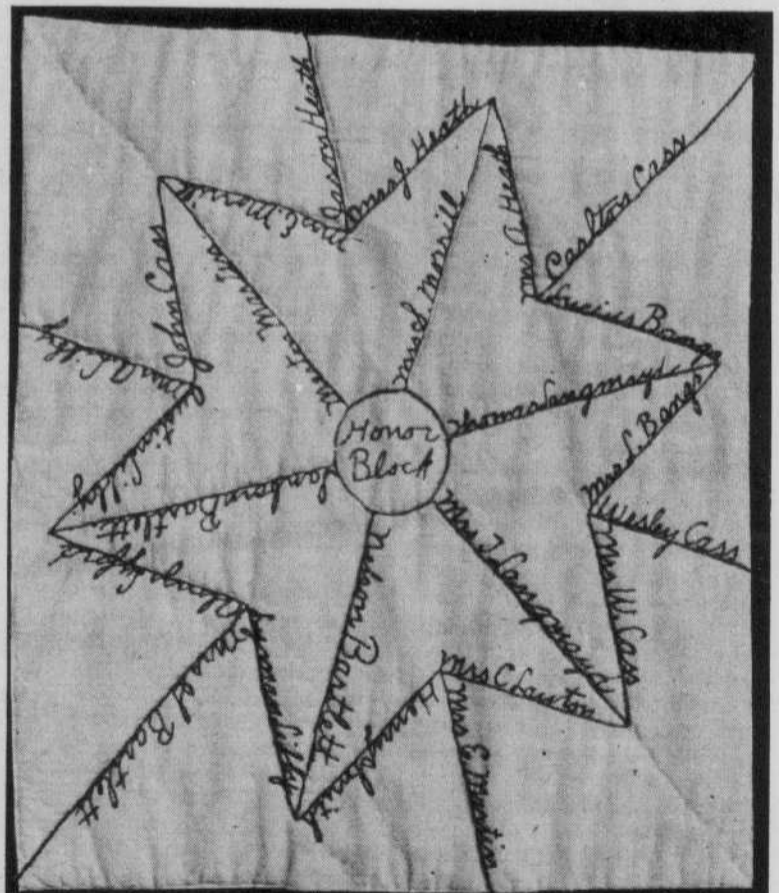
Beebe came up here last summer to see if they could trace any of their roots," she says. "They went through our cemetery files and came up with all sorts of information. They were in to see us practically every day."

ceptions can always be made, but for the most part we try to limit our collection to pioneer artifacts."

## RARE DOCUMENT

Does Prangley have one or two items of which he is particularly proud?

"We have a discharge certificate for a British soldier stationed in the U.S. named Michael Honsinger, issued in 1783," he says. "Organizations in other provinces have shown a great deal of interest in this item, since, apparently, it is extremely rare. The American revolution had such a big impact on this area, so such a document has a lot of value."

The museum also has a land grant contract issued to Honsinger five years later, in 1788. The conditions are all there in black and white — for the deal to stick, Honsinger had to build a house and clear three acres of land within

three months. This was no small task in the 1780s. How he made out is unknown.

What is also unknown is exactly where Honsinger's grant was.

## MYSTERY SITE

"The document refers to Caldwell Manor, lot number 18," says Prangley. "Unfortunately, nobody has any idea where that is."

Is there anything the museum needs?

"Money," Prangley answers quickly. Obviously, beating around the bush is not one of his weaknesses.

The 300-member organization receives some government funding, but is basically self-supporting, generating funds through investments and membership fees. The society also operates a barn museum in Stanstead, which, by all accounts, is on its last legs. A goal of the society is to construct a new home for all the

items currently in the barn — but it won't be happening soon.

## HANDS ARE TIED

"The situation is becoming desperate, but we just don't have the funds right now to do anything about it. The move to the new building from Beebe cost about \$30,000 all together," Prangley says.

"The carpenter ants are gnawing the old barn to pieces — each year the beams get a little weaker."

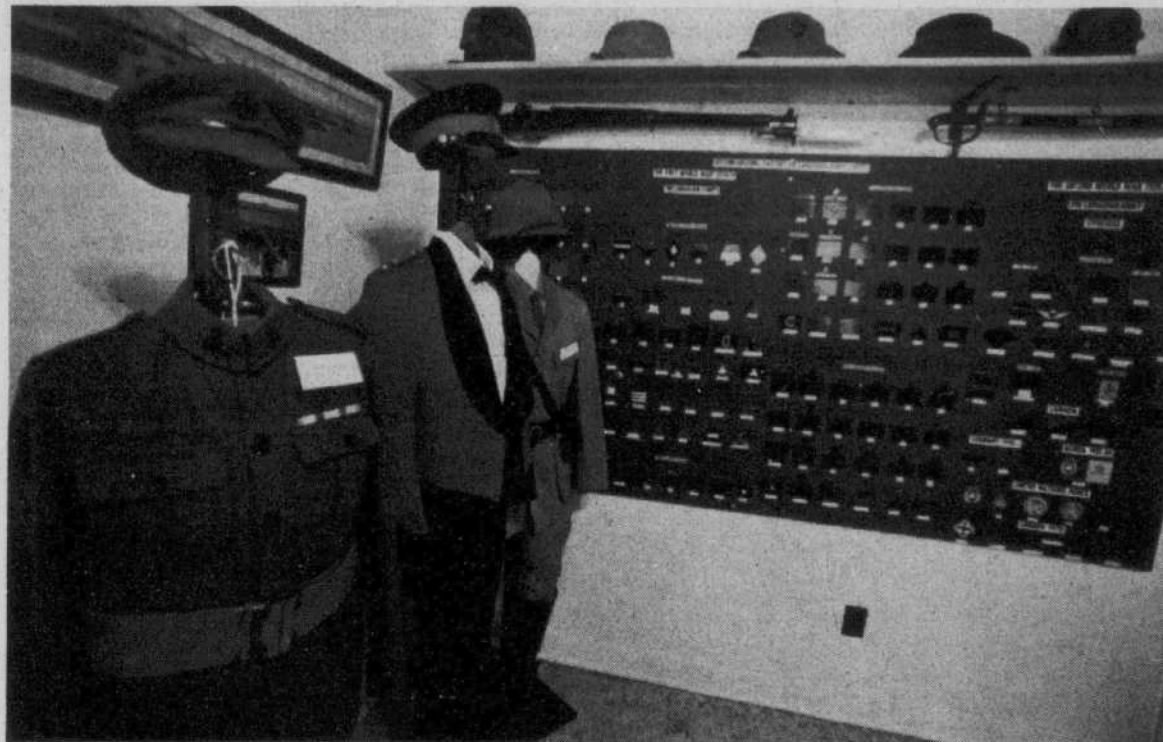

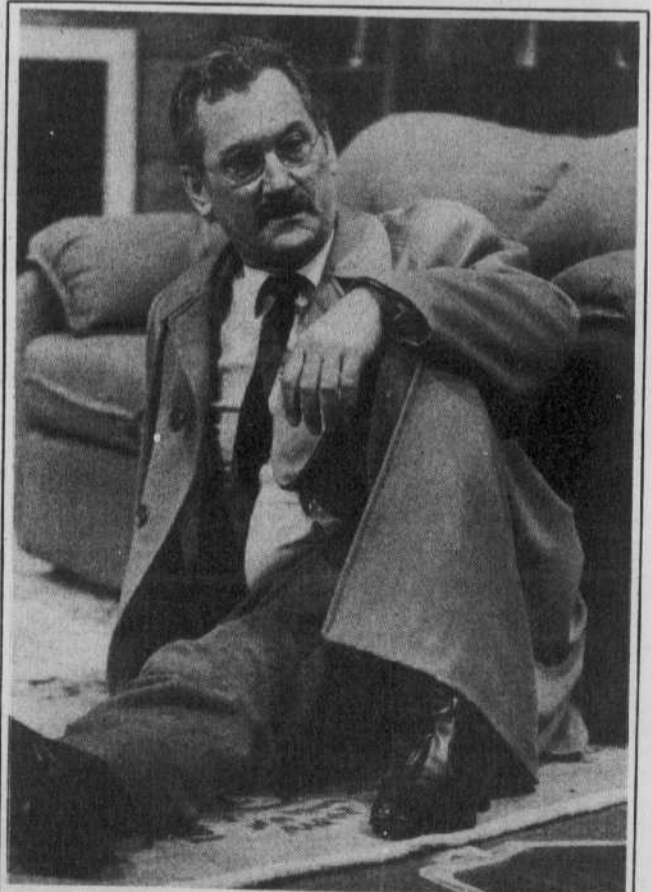

Daryl Hannah is a performance artist whose father, a painter, had given her a painting for her birthday when she was a child. That painting and others were supposedly destroyed in the fire which took his life, but she insists they were stolen. Redford's character risks his chances to become District Attorney by getting involved in the case. This is a suspenseful, action-filled movie, with some good, understated humor, which, somewhat misleadingly, has been advertised primarily as a comedy. *Legal Eagles* is showing Friday to Tuesday nights at 7 and 9:20 and there are bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 2:10.

*Ruthless People* is also playing at Merrill's, Friday to Tuesday at 7:20 and 9:30 with bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 2:15. Danny DeVito is a successful clothing tycoon who wants to be rid of his wife (Bette Midler). But before he can carry out his murder plans, an anything-but-ruthless young couple kidnap her. It seems they had given him their savings and some fashion ideas, which he proceeded to get rich on. No one's plans work out here, as DeVito refuses to pay the ransom, and the kidnapers can't bring themselves to kill their victim. The movie has some excellent moments — like when one of the kidnapers (Judge Reinhold) delivers a monologue about the need to be ruthless, as he scoops up a spider from the kitchen floor and sets it gently out the back door. But it is rated R for good reason; the vulgarity goes beyond what's necessary to portray the rich couple as crass people. A lot of it's there just for

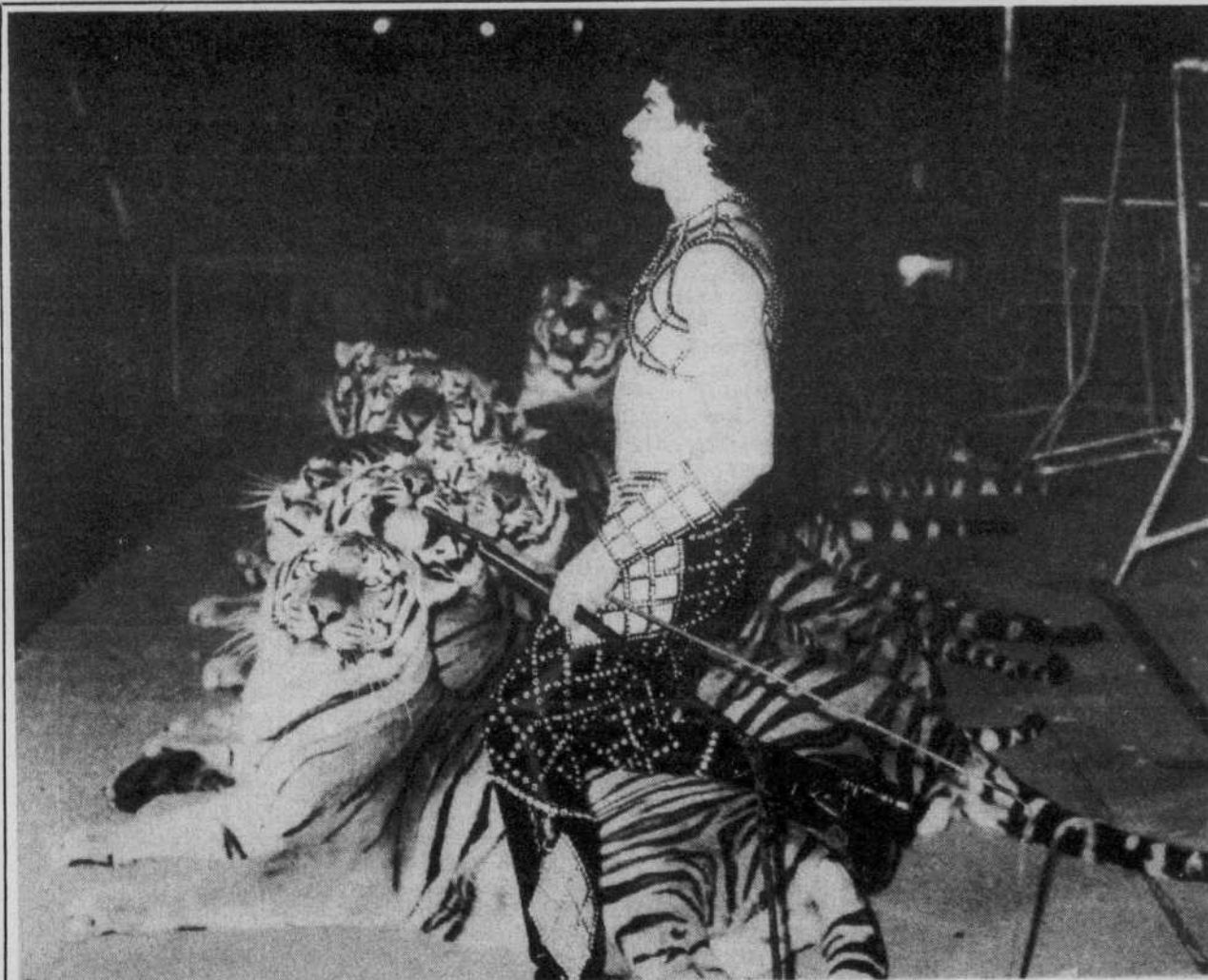
shock value and a few cheap laughs.

The third feature at Merrill's is *The Karate Kid II*, showing Friday to Tuesday at 7:10 and 9:15 with bargain matinees at 2 p.m. on the weekend. In the original *Karate Kid*, Pat Morita plans a peace-loving karate master who teaches a skinny kid (Ralph Macchio) to defend himself through the ancient art. In the sequel the two go to Japan, where the master has to fight for his first love, Yukia, who has been waiting for him for 40 years.

*The Karate Kid II* also plays this week at Cowansville's Cinema Princess, at 9:05, after *American Anthem* at 7:15. The only reference I have for the latter is David Sterritt of the *Christian Science Monitor*, who summarizes it as follows: "A troubled boy, an ambitious girl, and gymnastics. The movie falls apart long before the Big Meet and the overdue closing credits. Directed by Albert Magnoli, and accompanied by a grating rock score that just won't shut up."

I can't pass on any first-hand impressions, but I've been hearing that *Aliens* is about the scariest movie ever made. It shows nightly at 6:30 and 9:15 at the Cinémas Carrefour in Sherbrooke, and Sunday at 1, 3:45, 6:30 and 9:15. This is a science-fiction tale about an expedition to destroy a nest of vicious monsters on a distant planet. Sigourney Weaver is the heroine.

New over at the Cinéma Capitol is *Howard the Duck* (no relation to Horatio). This sounds like a possible cult hit to me; something about an extra-terrestrial duck who somehow ends up out of his element on earth. This stars Lea Thompson, Jeffrey Jones and Tim Robbins and it shows nightly at 7 and 9.

# Stratford pays rich theatrical dividends despite cutbacks

The 1986 season is supposedly a pared down one at Stratford — leaner, less wasteful than in past years — yet one would hardly know it. The most noticeable absence is a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta. For many seasons now, there has been one, if not two, spectacular G&S shows. But a Rogers and Hart musical comedy based on Shakespeare's *The Comedy of Errors* takes its place.

The Festival has obviously saved money by using its thespian retinue in *The Boys from Syracuse*. Broadway comedies can squeeze by using actors but G&S really do require singers. Even in *Boys*, some of the straighter actors fall short of the expected standard when they begin to chirp — Geraint Wyn Davies, a fine actor, is certainly weak in the singing department. But, thank goodness, the play is more comedy than musical.

*Boys* was the first transformation of a Shakespeare play for Broadway and the first of three adaptations of *Comedy of Errors*. (The Bard had himself built upon an earlier play.) The story is very accessible and this production reminds us teasingly of its debt to Shakespeare. As a tasty matinee morsel, it's great fun and will whet your intellectual appetite for more serious *après souper* fare.

## GREEK TO US

The first part of *The Winter's Tale* is no laughing matter. Labeled a Greek romance, it is in fact two plays and the first is definitely Greek to us. One has to abruptly accept the premise that a man becomes so jealous of the Platonic friendship between his pregnant wife and his best friend that he plots to kill the friend and actually engineers a trial and imprisonment for his wife. When a baby girl is born, he has her abandoned to the elements in a distant land. Having done all of this, he then sends envoys to the Oracle to confirm the justice of his actions. Of course, the Oracle tells him he's all wet, but by then it's too late.

This increasingly dark tragedy lightens progressively in the second part — a romance where everything comes right again. That, it seems, is the meaning of "a winter's tale". If you can swallow the initial premise, the play will put you through an emotional wringer. The characters are one-dimensional but well executed by a top-notch cast.

## UGLY AND SUBLIME

*Pericles* is another Greek romance. Our hero sets out on an odyssey in search of love and finds its ugly face as well as its sublime. Much like *Winter*, bad things happen, followed by good. But in *Pericles*, it is an emotional roller coaster ride. And it is our hero's very goodness which makes him a target.

This is not a play often seen, for the director must accept the challenge of the unpoetic, often humorously awkward opening acts. It is believed that the surviving versions of what is now the first act were the transcriptions of a bad plagerizer.

In contrast, the second part is eloquent, truly worthy of Shakespeare. But Richard Ouzounian (Festival Lennoxville's artistic director in the two penultimate years before its closing) confronts these initial problems by allowing his actors to laugh along with us at the cartoon classic and then pulls out all the dramatic stops in the second part.

Geraint Wyn Davies as Pericles, Kim Horsman as his daughter Marina, Nicholas Pennell as Boult and Maria Vaccratsis as Bawd are particularly notable for their strong performances.

## SOUL SINGING

What holds the play together and makes all of it enjoyable and exciting is the excellent soul singing of the talented and powerful Renée Rogers as the choric figure Gower. If the Festival has abandoned its operettas this year, Rogers' performance reaches the operatic.

Richard Ouzounian's direction of *Pericles* is imaginative and new.

Despite the play's difficulties, he has taken advantage of everything it has to offer and where the play falls short, he has used effective devices to put it all into perspective.

Not so the ever-popular *Hamlet* in the hands of the Festival's new artistic director John Neuville. In style, it is an Ibsenesque production — dark, very 19th century. But for all its late Romantic trappings, it tosses away the mystery. Festival Lennoxville veteran David Schurmann as the Ghost traverses downstage of the principals and below them on the ramparts like an insignificant midget. Horatio and the soldiers do a "life-with-Toppo" routine in an attempt to hold him and a snivelling Hamlet crawls after. Magic it ain't.

Brent Carver is a horrible Hamlet. Occasionally he'll attempt to make something of his lines but, for the most part, they are thrown away as if he were embarrassed by their familiarity. Unfortunately for Brent, we saw the best Hamlet ever this spring at Toronto Free Theatre. R.H. Thompson did something fresh with every single line, easily eclipsing even Sir Larry's classic celluloid interpretation. A couple of years ago, when we saw R.H. at Stratford, we were unimpressed by his dabbling in Shakespeare. His Hamlet washed all that away.

## BORING VERSION

There were some good performances in the Stratford production — Richard Curnock as Polonius and Lucy Peacock as Ophelia. Still, we are prone to wonder whether this boring version of Hamlet was meant to set off the Tome Stoppard comedy *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead*, also being staged in repertory. Many of the same actors appear as the same characters, albeit in a diffe-

rent play, which is, after all, a take-off on the behind-the-scenes story of Hamlet's unloved sidekicks.

Carver, who is a natural comic actor (his Pirate king in *Penzance* last year is a shining case in point) can do more justice to Stoppard's tongue-in-cheek. With the weight of gloomy tragedy lifted, everyone can have fun with it, actors and audience alike. We would recommend skipping *Hamlet* and viewing Elsinore through the eyes of Tweedle Dum and Tweedle Dee.

The most solid Shakespearean play and perhaps THE production of this season is Willie's last — *Henry VIII*. It is blatant propaganda which probably ensured a peaceful and happy retirement for the Bard. Yet it is so well written and so well produced here that it seems like a superlative episode of *Masterpiece Theatre*.

Done in splendid regal period costume, this spectacular show is not to be missed. In fact, it is very difficult not to be sucked in by Shakespeare's interpretation of history.

## FIRST RATE ACTING

The acting is uniformly first rate — from Leon Pownall's Henry VIII to Elizabeth Shepard's Katherine and a spunky Anne Boleyn by Lucy Peacock, to say nothing of the real live baby filling in as the infant Elizabeth I. William Hutt's villainous Cardinal Wolsey proves that even old actors continue to renew and develop. Not one of our favorites, Hutt has in the past few years come on strong as a character actor rather than star. He's found his niche. We look forward to his interpretation of Thomas Moore in Robert Bolts' *A Man for All Seasons* which opened last week.

Stratford's Third Stage is usually an injection of fresh blood for the Festival. Fine young actors like

Lucy Peacock have graduated to the main stages after arresting performances here. Risks are taken and often the productions are as worthy as those in the limelight. Certainly this is true of Bertolt Brecht's *The Resistible Riso of Arturo Ui* (rhymes with phooey), though not of the young company's attempt at *Macbeth*.

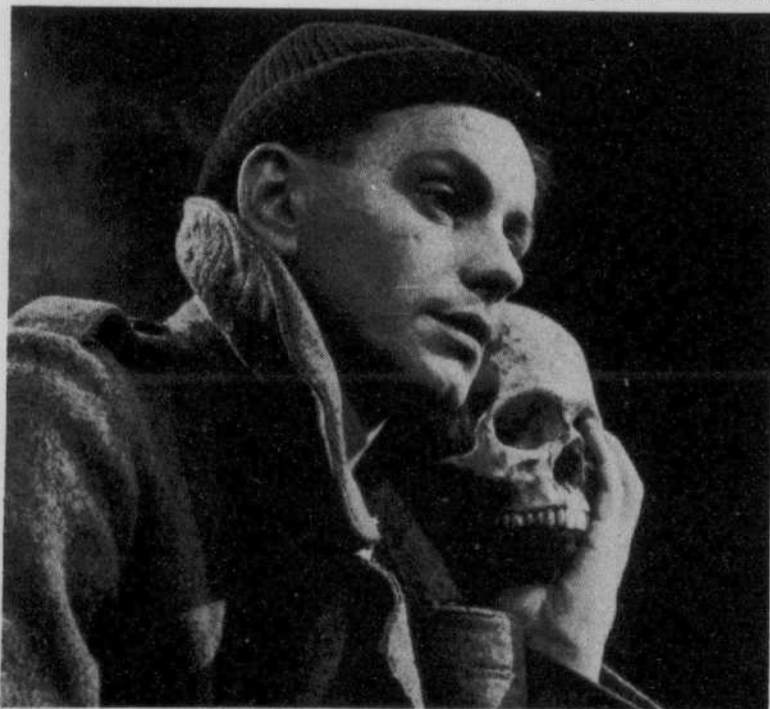
## THINLY DISGUISED

*Arturo Ui* is a thinly disguised black comedy about the rise of Adolf Hitler and his gang of thugs. Attracted by the gangster genre which Brecht feels is an essential ingredient of capitalism, he set the story in gangland Chicago. Al Capone rules the criminal roost but Arturo is making a play to corner the vegetable market, thereby paving the way to take over the city (Germany) and then the world.

The connivings of the city's more respectable businessmen give this bloody clown his break. He is portrayed by a gifted young actor — Maurice Godin — as a clumsy, indecisive but entirely ruthless egomaniac with a genius for the theatrical tastes of the masses. The supporting cast, Kim Coates in particular as Ernesto roma (Roehm, head of the S.A.) and Jerry Etienne as Giri (Himmler) give the production depth.

The story seems fantastic but, as the program points out, it closely parallels Hitler's ascendancy in the Weimar republic. The play is meant to be a warning. Brecht's final statement is: "We many have stopped the Bastard this time but beware, the Bitch that Bore him is in heat again."

Again Stratford has much to offer, something for most tastes. The budget cutbacks are relatively painless where the patrons are concerned and the theatrical riches are well worth dipping into one's vacation kitty.

# Bishop's is only Quebec stop for Samantha Taylor

SHERBROOKE — Samantha Taylor believes people don't like seeing too much of her.

That's because, as the host of CBC's *Video Hits*, she believes her viewers want less talk and more videos. "If I gave them another minute of talk, there would be less music," says the Canadian-born video jockey (VJ).

But fans will get to see more of her when she brings her touring video show to Memorial House of Bishop's University Friday night at 8:30. This is the only Quebec stop in her Hostess "Rip into Rock" tour.

The tour began July 26 in the Maritimes and will continue until September 1, moving all across Canada to the west and back to the east again.

Bishop's is the only Quebec stop because the tour had trouble making a date in Montreal. Taylor says the radio stations which were to promote the tour were uncooperative and she thinks they may feel video shows like hers are a threat to stations which play the songs.

### WORSE IN T.O.

"The barriers are starting to close," Taylor says but adds that things aren't as bad in Toronto. She gets some of her inside information

on bands from her friends at radio stations in that city.

At 29, Taylor is a familiar face with teenagers and video lovers across Canada. She was this country's first female VJ when she appeared as a fill-in host on MTV, a multilingual television station in Toronto. But her career in radio and television began before that.

Born in Toronto, Taylor and her family moved south of the border when she was four. She attended Pennsylvania State University and graduated with a degree in radio and television communications.

She worked for WAVA-FM in Washington, D.C. part time on week-ends. During the week, Taylor worked for New Era Concerts, in promotion. The company booked then unknown bands such as Joe Jackson, Dire Straits, the Police and the B-52s to play in the Georgetown area.

"They were bands no one would play on the air," says Taylor.

### INNOVATORS TOO

But New Era was more than just a booking agency. They were innovators too. Taylor says they received videos from the record companies for promotional purposes. New Era showed the videos in the clubs when the band wasn't on stage. The idea caught on, and soon videos were much more than just

promotional vehicles — they were art.

In 1980, Taylor holidayed in Toronto. "I was realizing the extent of the competition in Washington. I needed a chance to grow and to experience," says Taylor.

She got off the subway and happened to be near a radio station where she had applied for a job a few years earlier. She went in and the receptionist told her the program director could only give Taylor five minutes. Taylor and the PD met and ended up talking for two hours. She was hired to work in the library and on the air part time. The station was Q107-FM, where Taylor became the music director a few years later.

One day, she read an article about a new video show the DJs from Q107 would host. She decided she would lie and tell them she had tons of TV experience. (She had none). Her boss told her she could fill in when one of the regulars was sick.

### INSTANT HIT

As luck would have it, a regular was sick the very next day. Taylor took over and she was an instant hit. She was hired full time and the regular was let go.

The show, *Metro Music* was cancelled due to insufficient funding. A following show, *Video Singles*,

introduced in 1983, died for the same reason. But the second show was a launching pad for *Video Hits* which is now shown nation-wide in 37 cities. It's the number one video show in the country and there are two million weekly viewers in Quebec. Five million Canadian viewers watch the show weekly.

When she originally auditioned for the CBC show, one of the competitors was Miss Canada. Taylor says, "I was more real, not Miss Beautiful or Miss Gorgeous."

And that, says Taylor, has helped her become successful. "I play it very straight. I was always that

way on radio. I never told jokes or anything like that," she says.

"I treat music seriously. I think kids respect that."

Kids get a chance to give her more respect Friday at Bishop's where Taylor will give away t-shirts, albums, cassettes, posters, fan club memberships and scores of other goodies. Video enthusiasts may even get a chance to see what it's like to be Samantha Taylor when she gives them a chance to play VJ.

The three-hour presentation costs \$5 and tickets are available at the door.

## Festival features balloons and more

SHERBROOKE — The world's longest hot-air balloon festival takes place Aug. 8 to 17 at the St-Jean-sur-Richelieu municipal airport.

For its third year, the Haut-Richelieu Balloon Festival has expanded to 10 days from last year's four, and is expecting 150,000 visitors.

Eighty balloonists from Canada, the U.S., France and Spain will demonstrate their skills and take part in competitions, said Daniel Béland, president of the event.

"This edition will be the best and most eventful in our history," said Béland. It's the culmination of a year of planning, he said, featuring the Canadian championships and many fanciful balloons in the shape of trucks, houses and cartoon characters.

Visitors are asked to take note of the "strange" hours of balloon launches: 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. This is because the wind and atmospheric conditions are best at these times.

Organizers of the balloon festival, which won the 1985 National Tourism Grand Prix as best new

event, have applied to host the North American championships next year, said Béland. They should know the results by September.

Among the competitions are the "key grab" event, in which pilots launch 5 to 10 km. away from the St-Jean airport and try to manoeuvre close enough to a post in the middle of the airport to grab a key from the post. The winner takes home a new 1986 Ford Taurus.

In the "hare and hounds" event the hare balloon launches 10 to 15 minutes before the hounds and constantly changes altitude to try and outwit them. The hounds try to locate the hare and drop a marker as close to his landing site as possible before landing themselves.

In the "judge-declared goal" event, the balloonmeister marks a target with a large X several kilometres away and balloonists try to drop a marker as close as possible to it.

There will also be demonstrations of sky diving, ultra-light planes, stunt planes, hang-gliders and kites, and on the ground there will be exhibits about aeronautics, groups of entertainers, workshops for kids, musical breakfasts and brunches and nighttime entertainment.

Aug. 8 the grounds will open at noon, but thereafter activities will go on from the first balloon launching at 6 a.m. until late in the evening.
