*Much has been written — and said — about the meaning behind this play; Who is Godot? What is he supposed to be? When asked if he meant Godot to be God, the author, Samuel Becket, replied that if he had meant that, he would have said so. The point is, that Godot represents the one thing — anything — which we — you and I — want out of life. Our lives are spent in quest of this thing (spiritual beatitude, money, escape from political bondage, philosophical enlightenment, whatever it may be) and always it lies just beyond our reach.*

*Some are aware of this quest within ourselves, others cannot understand that such a thing exists, and there are those who, while yet acknowledging such human aspirations, recognize their own deficiencies and are content to search for no inner meaning to their lives.*

*We are on this earth, like it or not — so let us make the best of it, with the diversions of holidays, projects, work — that is the feeling behind this play. Because he has actually dared to hint at the possible futility of life, this play should be hailed as the grave philosophical work it is.*
