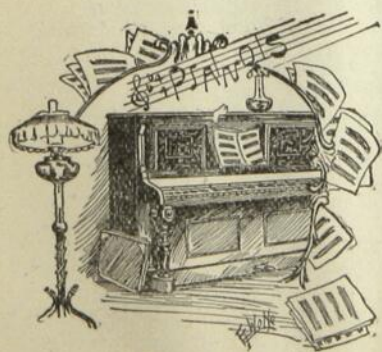

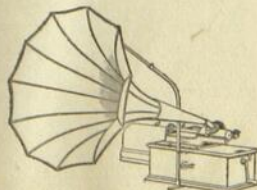

LACHINE, a city on the St. Lawrence and on Island of Montreal Seignory of Montreal), county of Jacques Cartier. It is the summer residence of many Montrealers and one of the most prosperous manufacturing centres of the Province of Quebec. Its works are very numerous, and thousands of men are employed yearly. The chief industries are the Dominion Bridge Co., the Allis-Chalmers-Bullock, Limited; Daly & Morin; Fisk, Limited; Asbestos Co.; Canada Flax & Fibre Co., the Dominion Wire Rope Mfg. Co.; McLaurin Bros., Limited; The National Breweries, Limited. In winter months, it is greatly frequented by pleasure parties, while in summer, thousands of tourists pass through Lachine to run the Lachine Rapids. Regattas and other sporting events take place every summer, and are largely patronized by visitors. A handsome public market has just been built at a cost of \$30,000, and it is opened daily from 5 a.m. to 9.30 p.m. It is provided with the most

modern refrigerators and coolers, and all perishable articles are constantly kept on ice. A new public weigh house has just been built for the accommodation of the traders. The leading citizens of the city have just provided a Board of Trade, where all important business matters are discussed. A new City Hall, to cost about \$100,000, will shortly be erected. The Ladies of Saint Anne have built an extensive convent, which will be known as Le Mont Sainte Anne. Messrs. Tooke Bros., of Montreal, have erected a large factory on Eighteenth av. and it gives work the year round to many employees. There are also three banks, viz., the Merchants Bank of Canada, the Molsons and La Banque Provinciale, all of which are doing good business. The Grand Trunk Railway runs several trains daily to Montreal. Montreal Park & Island Electric Railway have also a line of electric cars running from the City of Montreal to the Western limits of the city of Lachine. The Catholic church has been renovated and enlarged. The Lachine Methodist church has been rebuilt and enlarged. New granolithic sidewalks have been laid on several streets. A ship canal connects the navigable waters at Montreal with Lake St. Louis. Trees have been planted on all avenues, so as to give shade to the residential districts. The Great North Western Telegraph Co. have offices here. There are two post office branches, also the Bell Telephone Co. The City is lighted by electricity, and has a fire alarm system and a complete system of waterworks and drainage. There are, besides the convent, a first-class commercial college, two Catholic academies and two Protestant academies. Distant from Montreal City Hall, 9 miles. Mail three times daily. Population 9,780.

LACHINE LOCKS. See Lachine.

LACHUTE, the county town of Argenteuil co., Terrebonne district, Que., formerly formed part of the parish of St. Jerusalem, but was detached therefrom and erected into a town by special Act of Parliament in 1885, under the name of "Lachute Town." It is situated on the North River, which here washes the base of

the Laurentian range of mountains and runs through the town in a winding and picturesque course. The West River also runs through the north-west corner of the town. It contains the county registry office, is the place where the sessions of the Circuit Court are held and has also a Commissioners' Court for the trial of small causes and a municipal council composed of a mayor and nine councillors. The C.P.R. passes through the town, which is 44 miles west of Montreal, and 76 miles east of Ottawa, also the C. N. Que. Ry. from Joliette to Hawkesbury. It contains 6 churches (1 Presbyterian, 1 Methodist, 1 Episcopalian, 1 Baptist and 1 Roman Catholic, and the Brethern), a large and flourishing academy, capable of accommodating 300 pupils, 1 French school and a large convent, 1 very large and extensive paper mill, owned by Messrs. J. C. Wilson & Co., 1 pulp mill, 1 woollen and felt factory, and 1 handle factory, 2 carriage factories, 2 iron foundries, 2 furniture, sash and door factories, 2 grist mills, 3 saw mills, 1 bobbin factory, 2 bakeries, 2 post offices, money order office, 1 branch bank (Bank of Ottawa), a post office savings bank, 2 telegraph offices, and 1 implement depot, 1 telephone office, 2 electric light stations, 1 express office, a number of stores, 5 hotels, 4 livery stables, 1 printing office issuing a weekly newspaper, and possesses some water power. Pop. 3,500.

MONTMORENCY FALLS, a post village in Quebec co. and district, Que. on the Montmorency & St. Lawrence Rivers, and on the Quebec Ry. Light & Power Co's. line, 1 mile from Montmorency Station and 7 miles from Quebec. The Falls of Montmorency present one of the most majestic spectacles in the province. The Montmorency itself, so called after Mgr. Francois Montmorency-Laval, first French Bishop of Quebec, is an inconsiderable stream. Its course lies through an almost continued forest over an irregular,

broken, rocky bottom, until it arrives at the precipice, where its breadth is from 16 to 20 yards. A little declination of the bed before it reaches this point gives a great velocity to the stream, which, in being impelled over the brink of a perpendicular rock, falls into an extended sheet of water into a rocky chasm 240 feet below. An immense spray rises from the bottom in curling volumes, which, when the sun shines upon it, displays bright prismatic colors, producing an effect inconceivably beautiful. The falls are a great source of attraction to visitors to the Ancient Capital. It contains 2 hotels, 1 saw mill and 1 cotton factory. It is a very interesting place, being full of historical points and views. The Falls supply Quebec with electricity for lighting, etc. Pop. 800.

Pop., about 2,000.

MONTREAL, a city of Hochelaga co.,
 Que., the commercial metropolis of Cana-
 ada, and the largest city in the Domini-
 on. It is situated on the south side of
 the Island of Montreal in lat. 45° 31' N.,
 and lon. 73° 34' W., at the head of the St.
 Lawrence ocean navigation and the com-
 mencement of inland navigation. It is, of
 course, connected by rail with all points
 of importance in America.

The Island of Montreal is situated at
 the confluence of the Ottawa and St.
 Lawrence Rivers, is 32 miles long and 10
 wide at the broadest part. With the ex-
 ception of Mount Royal, 750 feet high, the
 island is level and fertile, being especial-
 ly noted for apples. The city is situated
 between the mountain and the St. Law-
 rence River, here about 2 miles wide,
 and is 986 miles from the Straits of Belle
 Isle and 457 miles from New York by the
 Champlain system of navigation. It is
 274 miles by water from Port Arthur, at
 the head of Lake Superior, with which it
 is connected by the finest canal system
 in the world. It is divided into 29 wards,
 and has over 220 miles of streets and
 lanes. Some of the streets are narrow
 and ill-paved, but of recent years vast
 sums have been expended in enlargement
 and improvement, and now the principal
 streets will compare favorably with those
 of any other city on the continent. The
 principal streets have large well-built
 edifices, constructed chiefly of lime-
 stone quarried near the city. These
 buildings, combined with the effect of
 the lofty towers and spires, give the city
 a very imposing appearance when viewed
 from a distance. The chief business
 streets are St. James, St. Paul, Notre
 Dame, St. Lawrence, McGill, St. Cather-
 ine and Craig. There are in all 220 miles
 of streets, and the electric car lines have
 85 miles of tracks. The parks and
 squares have an area of 615 acres.

The principal public buildings are the
 City Hall, Court House, Post Office, Cust-
 om House, Seminary of St. Sulpice,
 Convent of Notre Dame, General Hospi-
 tal, Grey Nunnery, Montreal College,
 McGill University, St. Mary's College,
 Young Men's Christian Association, Pro-
 testant House of Industry and Refuge,
 St. Bridget's House of Refuge, Protest-
 ant Orphan Asylum, St. Patrick's Orphan
 Asylum, Deaf and Dumb Asylums (Pro-
 testant and Catholic), the Hotel Dieu,
 Ladies Benevolent Institution, Female
 Home, Protestant Infants Home, Mount
 Royal Club, Sailors' Institute, St.
 George's Home, St. Andrew's Home, St.
 James Club, Art Gallery, Royal Victoria
